



Kenilworth Road is a special place to be under the flood-lights, so raise the roof tonight and let the world of football know that Luton Town will not give up the fight.



I am confident that this evening we will turn a corner and start an unbeaten run that will see us through into the new vear.


Your support at Southend on Saturday was brilliant and the lads really appreciated it.



The number of previous league meetings between the sides at Kenilworth Road. Luton have 13 victories, Bournemouth seven and there has been six draws. Luton have scored 42 goals and conceded 27.

The number of players to have moved from Bournemouth to Luton. The first, Foster Robinson, made only one first team appearance for Luton in 1925/26, and he scored in a 2-0 win against Southend. In the 1930's Robert Bryce, Joe Coen, Tom King, Eddie Parris, and Jack Russell all made the move, although only goalkeeper Coen made a notable number of appearances, over 150. After the break for WWII Harry Cooke joined the Hatters for the 1946/47 league season. and he passed 200 appearances for the Club. but scored just four goals, and all of those were from the penalty spot! Another Cooke, Richard, made just 6 substitute appearances at the end of the 1988/89 season after his move, and a further 13 appearances were to follow the following season before a transfer back to Bournemouth. In the summer of 2000 then manager Ricky Hill took two players from the South

Coast Club, with goalkeeper Mark Ovendale and former Hatter Mark Stein coming to Kenilworth Road. Ovendale made 55 appearances for Luton before moving to Barry Town, whilst Stein made over 100 appearances in his two spells, scoring 27 goals.

8 The number of players to have moved from Luton to Bournemouth. Alex Forbes had made only one appearance for Luton at the end of the 1928/29 season before his move. Tommy Tait fell four short of 100 appearances for Luton, but he averaged over a goal every other game as he finished with 57 during his time with the Hatters in the early 1930's. George Duke



Russell Perrett made the move from Luton to AFC Bournemouth last season

and Billy Gripton both moved in the 1940's, but they had made only 21 appearances between them whilst at Kenilworth Road. John Groves played over 250 times for the Hatters in a career that spanned ten seasons starting in 1953/54. Tommy McKechnie played in the same Luton side as Groves in the early 1960's and he made the same move a couple of years later, after 146 appearances and 34 goals for the Hatters. As mentioned above Richard Cooke returned to Bournemouth after a couple of seasons with the Hatters, and it wasn't until last year that another player made the same move. Russell Perrett made 109 appearances and scored nine goals in his six seasons for the Hatters.

The number of players to have made their Luton league debut in this fixture. Svd Neal was the first in the 2-o defeat in January 1925, but the scores were reversed when Sam Bell made his debut in the final game of the 1933/34 season. Bell certainly made an instant impact as he scored both goals that day! Mark Crook made the first of just five appearances for Luton in the goal-less draw in 1935/36. George Beavan replaced Keith Keane after just eleven minutes in this fixture last season. Beavan started his first senior match the following week at home to Leyton Orient.

AFCBournemouth

The present football club can trace its roots as far back as 1890 when Boscombe St. Johns Institute Football Club were playing in local football. They disbanded in 1899 and from the remains of that club, Boscombe FC were formed at a meeting under the streetlights in Gladstone Road, Boscombe.

The Club competed in the Bournemouth and District Junior League playing at a ground in Castlemain Avenue, Pokesdown. They moved to Kings Park, adjacent to the current stadium in 1902 and were soon emerging as the top team in the town.

After enjoying many local successes, they joined the Hampshire League and were attracting large crowds. In 1910, Mr. J.E. Cooper-Dean granted the club a long lease on some wasteland next to Kings Park.

With their own ground, named Dean Court after the benefactor, the club continued to thrive and dominated the local football scene.

It was around this time that the club gained the nickname, 'The Cherries'. There are two main stories as to why the club would be called such a name. Firstly the Cherry Red striped shirts the side wore and secondly, Dean Court was built next to the Cooper-Dean estate which included many Cherry Orchards.

After three years in the Southern League, the club applied for membership of the Football League. The application was accepted and Boscombe would be

Dean Court, also known as the Fitness First Stadium for sponsorship purposes, is a stadium in Bournemouth, England.

Primarily used for football, it is the home of League Two team AFC. Bournemouth.

Dean Court is named after the Cooper-Dean family of Bournemouth, who granted the land to the football club in 1910.

One of the stands had previously been used in the Wembley Exhibition of 1924.

The ground's attendance record of 28,799 was set at an FA Cup against Manchester United in 1957.

The ground was completely rebuilt in 2001, with the pitch rotated ninety degrees from its original position.

The stadium was also moved away from adjacent housing.

Although it was rebuilt as a three sided stadium, seats were placed on the undeveloped South End in the autumn of 2005.

The club sold the stadium in December 2005 in a sale-andleaseback deal with London property company Structadene

The stadium has also been used for music concerts, hosting Elton John in 2006.

playing in the Third Division (South) in the 1923-24 season.

Since then the Cherries have had many managers, including record appearace maker Sean O'Driscoll who took over as forest team manager in 2000.

O'Driscoll left the club after 22 years service to the club, making way for manager Kevin Bond who steered the club to League One survival.

On July 21, 2008 the club unveiled a three year sponsorship and kit supply deal with JD Sports brand Carbrini Sportswear.

The team's future in the Football League was put into doubt before it even began playing, when on 6 August—three days before the start of the season—the league threatened to block Bournemouth's participation in League Two, due to problems with the team's continuing administration and change in ownership.

It had ordered both Bournemouth and Rotherham to demonstrate that they can fulfill all of their fixtures and find a way out of administration.

The next day the Football League confirmed that AFC Bournemouth would start the season on a 17 point penalty for failing to follow the Football League insolvency rules and the new company will have to pay unsecured creditors the amount offered at the time of the original C.V.A (around 10 pence in the pound) within 2 years.

On September 1, BBC Radio 5 Live reported that Bond and his manangement team (Rob Newman and Eddie Howe) had been sacked.

At midday on September 2nd, it was announced former player Jimmy Quinn would be the new manager with former player Jason Tindall as his assistant.

The duo's first game in charge was a 1-1 draw at Notts County.


The Manager

Cherries' boss Jimmy Quinn joined as manager in September 2008, replacing Kevin Bond.

A former Northern Ireland international, Quinn's playing career saw him play for clubs such as Blackburn Rovers, Swindon Town, West Ham, Bournemouth and Reading.

The Cherries are the fifth club the former striker has both played for and managed having been in charge at Reading, Swindon, Shrewsbury and Northwich Victoria.

At his previous club, Cambridge United, Quinn transformed the side from a relegation threatened team in 2006 to a promotion chasing one in 2007, reaching the National Conference Play-off final, narrowing losing out to Exeter, 1-0.

Born in Baghdad, Shwan began his professional career as a trainee at Tottenham, but never made the grade at White Hart Lane. He moved to Woking in 2004 before joining Peterborough. He has spent loan spells at Morecambe and Sheffield Wednesday.

RYAN PRICE

A young goalkeeper who made his senior debut for Bournemouth last season, coming on as a substitute against Southend. Three days later he started his first game against Luton Town, a match which the



Cherries won 4-3.

WARREN CUMMINGS


Highly rated defender, who began his professional career with Chelsea. Although he never made a first team appearance at Stamford Bridge, he did win a Scotland international cap in 2002 and has gone on to make over 150 appearances for Bournemouth.

SCOTT GUYETT

Although born in England, this promising defender is of Australian nationality and was on the books of Brisbane City. Has enjoyed distinguished careers at Yeovil Town, Oxford United and Chester City. He also played 13 games for Aldershot Town during a loan spell.

IASON PEARCE

This highly-rated, nononsense defender shot to promise at Portsmouth who, in 2006, offered him a professional contract. He showed further promise during a loan spell at nonleague Woking and is a fans favourite with Bournemouth supporters.



MARVIN BARTLEY

A player who can play in either midfield or defence, Marvin Bartley has spent most of his years in nonleague football. After starting his career at Reading, he then moved on to play for Burnham, Hayes and Hampton and Richmond.

DANNY HOLLANDS

A product of Chelsea's youth-team, Hollands is highly regarded at Bournemouth. He was captain of Chelsea's youth-team and later went on to skipper the reserve side. He enjoyed a loan spell with Torquay in 2006.

DARREN ANDERTON

Former Tottenham, Portsmouth, Birmingham

and England midfielder, who is now in his third season at Bournemouth. He made 30 appearances for England and played in the 1996 European Championship and 1998 World Cup Finals in France.

SAMMY IGOE

A midfielder who started out with Portsmouth. before moving to Reading where he enjoyed a successful career. He spent a short loan spell at Luton, before moving to Swindon Town and Bristol Rovers.

JOSH MCQUOID

Promising midfielder who has made most of his appearances for Bournemouth this season as substitute. The Southampton born player was recently called up to the Northern Ireland Under19 squad.

MARK MOLESLEY

A recent addition to the squad from non-league side Grays Athletic. He also spent time at Stevenage Borough and Aldershot Town.

BRETT PITMAN

Was spotted as a 16-yearold by Bournemouth and he immediately put pen to paper on a contract with the club. He has gone on to make over 80 appearances for the Cherries since making his debut in 2005.

LEE BRADBURY

Experienced striker who first made his breakthrough in 1995, where he blossomed at Portsmouth. Moves to Crystal Palace and Manchester City

followed before he returned to Portsmouth for a second spell. During his second spell at the club. he made over 100 appearances during five years. He went on to enjoy success at Oxford United and Southend United before moving to Bournemouth.

IEFF GOULDING

Has played for a number of non-league outfits including Aldershot. Clapton, Croydon, Molesey, Haves, Yeading, Fisher Athletic and Grays Athletic. Moved to Bournemouth earlier this year and scored on his debut during a 3-0 win in the Football League trophy against Bristol Rovers.

about that," said Gnakpa, bearing his trademark beaming smile.


After plying his trade in



lust as the fans were beginning to like the idea of being part of a buying club for a change came the news that 'golden boy' Bruce Rioch and his younger brother Neil were to be transferred to Tommy Docherty's Aston Villa for a combined fee of £110,000, a divisional record.

The bid from Villa had been too good to turn down and Stock immediately pledged to spend the money for the good of the team, but in his own time. He would not be

hurried and only used up £17,500 of the windfall initially when buying another unknown full-back from Fulham, 19 year old Malcolm Macdonald.

Macdonald suffered the worst possible baptism when he, along with the other Luton defenders. were given the complete run-around by Fourth Division Aldershot at the Recreation Ground in a preseason friendly.

The 2-5 defeat sent Stock back to the drawing board as he prepared for the next friendly, against an Italian Under-21 XI at Kenilworth

Road.

This time the Town put up a much more spirited performance with Macdonald catching the eye with some surging overlaps down the left wing. An injury to left winger Mike Harrison in the next game, at home to Clyde, gave Macdonald the chance to move upfield, a position he kept as the Town beat Gibraltar 10-0 in the final preseason game.

lust before the opening League clash of the campaign. against Barrow at Kenilworth Road, Stock finally loosened the purse strings and bought John Collins from Reading for £10,000.

Collins, who had played for Stock at QPR, was regarded as a 'utility' forward and was purchased to bring more competition to the front line. Despite the addition of a new face to the side. Macdonald was picked at outside left again but switched to inside right in the second half to earn more rave reviews as the Town comprehensively beat Barrow 3-o.

Unfortunate not to get on the scoresheet. Macdonald was a constant thorn in the side of the Barrow defence with his aggressive power, ability in the air and fierce shooting.

Stock now realised that he had a find on his hands and so did the fans and 15 coachloads were prepared to make, which was in those days, the awkward trip to Bournemouth on the following Saturday to see if the Town could keep up their winning start to the campaign.

They were not disappointed as the Hatters put in a professional performance that the Cherries had no real answer to, despite the best efforts of the much talked about Ted MacDougall in their forward line.

It was Luton's own Mac who finally broke his goalscoring duck when, after 28 minutes, he shot between two careless defenders to chase an astute

pass from skipper Mike Keen. Finding himself in splendid isolation he calmly rounded Cherries goalkeeper Roger Jones before slipping the ball into the net.

Although the Town needed to

withstand a bit of a battering for a spell in the second half the defence stood firm and long before the end the Bournemouth forwards had run out of ideas.

It was left to new found terrace hero Macdonald to have the last word in the final minute on to another



What's the Ground Like?

On one side of the ground is the impressive looking Frank Adams Stand, opened in 1996. This was named in memory of the man who originally donated to the club their previous ground at Loakes Park. It is a large two tiered stand, complete with a row of executive boxes and it dwarfs the rest of the stadium. The other three stands are smaller affairs, but are at least all covered. Only the Valley Stand at the home end remains as terracing. Opposite is the Dreams Stand, housing away supporters, a medium sized single tiered stand, with windshields to either side.

What Is It Like For Visiting Supporters?

Away fans are mostly located at one end of the ground in the Dreams Stand, where just over 1,800 supporters can be accommodated. The club has a relaxed friendly feel about it. The ground is situated in a nice setting with a wooded hill over looking the ground (this normally has a small contingent of supporters watching the game for nothing) and with green fields surrounding the other sides. The standard football ground fayre of burgers (£2.30), pies (£2), pasties and hot dogs are available from the refreshments area.

Where To Eat & Drink?

As the ground is on the edge of an industrial estate, there aren't many pubs around. The nearest pub to the Causeway Stadium, is the Hourglass in Sands (about a 15 minute walk, from the end of the road up to the ground). Away fans are normally okay in small groups except for big games or local derbies. If you arrive early you may be able to go into the Supporters Club at the ground, which cost £2 to enter. The Club is one of the suites at the far end of the Main Stand.

How To Get There By Car?

Join the M1 motorway (signposted London). Leave the M1 at junction 6a, then join the M25 motorway (signposted Heathrow Airport). Leave the M25 at junction 16, then join the M40 motorway (signposted Birmingham, Oxford). Leave the M40 at junction 4, then at roundabout take the 5th exit onto the A4010 (signposted Aylesbury, A4010). Continue on the A4010 (signposted Aylesbury). Turn right onto Hillbottom Road.

Car Parking

There is a fair sized car park located at the ground which costs £3 per car, or some of the industrial units provide match day parking.



After a torrid opening to their 2008/09 Coca-Cola League Two campaign, Barnet eventually managed to secure their first three points of the season following a 1-0 win against Grimsby at the end of September.

Before their win over the Mariners, the north London club had only managed to amass a solitary point in their first seven league matches.

However, since then, the Bees' form has steadily improved and several impressive away performances have seen them climb to relative safety in the league.

Barnet manager Paul Fairclough's future at the club was the subject of media speculation before the match against Grimsby, but it appears that the man who guided the Bees to the Football League in emphatic fashion three years ago still has the full support of the club's board.


