EXCITING on-loan Middlesbrough striker Tom Craddock made an instant impact on his return to Luton's starting line-up at Chesterfield on Boxing Day, writes Mark

The Hatters battered the Spireites throughout, but got caught with two Roper header deep into injury time to salvage a draw after Craddock, 22, had cancelled out Chesterfield's first.

Chesterfield were also aided by referee Dave Webb's controversial decision to book Craddock for a dive rather than give the Hatters a stonewall penalty midway through

And Craddock, who is delighted to finally be fit again after a long lay-off with a groin injury, was adamant he should have had a spot kick.

He said: "It was really frustrating being injured but it was important to get myself back fit and come back 'We've done well in the last couple

of games and we've picked up four points in the games I've been back.

"To be fair I felt pretty fresh on Boxing Day and I felt a little bit tired against Lincoln.

"I got booked for diving but he defi-nitely caught me on Boxing Day. But it's just that type of thing in football and hopefully next time I will get it."

Luton produced a beautiful move on 12 minutes that should have allowed Paul McVeigh to give Town the lead. Kevin Gallen and Craddock opening, but McVeigh could only thunder straight at Tommy Lee

Asa Hall's firm header was then beautifully threaded by Gallen on 20 minutes, but Craddock could only drag his effort horribly wide with only Lee to beat.

Craddock and Gallen combined well again on 37 minutes later, but again the Middlesbrough man could only hammer well wide of the mark.

With two minutes of the half left

Town went close again. Rossi Jarvis dug out an excellent cross on the right but Michael Spillane could only send his header straight at the sprawling form of Lee.

Totally against the run of play Chesterfield snatched the lead on the stroke of half time.

Centre-half Roper stumbled and Ward managed to shrug off Emanuel to race on to a long ball over the top before firing home past the exposed

the edge of the area straight at Chesterfield's defensive wall three minutes into the second half, before lively Luton deservedly levelled on 56
