WITH both penalised teams desperately needing victory to boost their bids against drop, this relegation dogfight somewhat unsurprisingly ended all square

New loan signing Mark Bower started in the heart of Hatters' defence, with Sol Davis named among the substitutes, and captain Kevin Nicholls returned to the Luton midfield

The hosts enjoyed most of the early pressure with Brett Pitman being caught offside on three minutes before winning a free-kick moments later that was blasted into Luton's defensive wall.

And Luton got a huge slice of luck to take the lead on 11 minutes.

A deep cross into the box was headed back across goal by Sam Parkin and, in no apparent danger, Danny Hollands bizarrely diverted the ball past his own keeper and into the back of the net.


Apart from the goal it was a largely cagey opening from both teams, with the Hatters happy to eat up time wherever possible.

Nicholls announced his return to first team duties when he was somewhat harshly booked for persistent fouling on 27 minutes, and out of the blue Bournemouth equalised two minutes later.

Pitman did well to burst past past Ed Asaf-Adjaye on the right and his dangerous cross had Town's defence

at sixes and sevens.

The ball almost fell to crowd favourite Steve Fletcher from Michael Spillane's attempted clearance and Conrad Logan could only scramble it away to Hollands on the



edge of the area where he atoned for his earlier howler by powering past the helpless keeper.

Luton made a sluggish start to the second half as Bournemouth looked the hungrier for victory.

And the Cherries should have taken the lead when Sol Davis' mistake put Jake Thomson in on the edge of Luton's area.

Thomson roled the ball to Fletcher, but he could only spoon the ball over the bar when well placed.

Town were riding their luck as the Cherries put a number of dangerous balls into their box that they struggled to defend.

But the visitors had a decent chance to take the lead on 67 when Waisu set up Gallen on the edge of the area, after a good flick on by Parkin, but the veteran hitman could only fire down into the ground and wide.

Waisu then did well to swivel on to Davis' throw on 73 minutes, but could only blaze over from the edge of the box.

Ragged passing from the Hatters severely limited their chances in the second half and going into the closing stages it was the Cherries who looked most likely to snatch victory, before Town took control as

the final whistle drew close.

A forceful run by Rossi Jarvis earned Luton a free-kick in a good position with nine minutes left, but a clumsy challenge from Parkin brought a premature end to Town's goal threat.

With just three minutes left, Town twice went close to snatching a winner. First Jake Howells' corner caused all kinds of problems in the Cherries defence and, after Hall had had his close range effort blocked, the ball ran loose to Gallen on the edge of the box.
