Defiant Luton boss Mick Harford believes they gave the Grecians too much space, but roared that he and his side would "never give up" in their bid to beat the drop. He said: "It was difficult to come back from two goals down, which I was disappointed with – a cross into the box and a free header and a midfleid runner.
