a tribute to norman penny

I received a phone call from Terry Owens on Saturday driving up to Bradford City. It was a call I was dreading but knew it was going to happen at some stage over the weekend. During the conversation I learnt of the passing of Norman Penny. A tremendously loyal and kind hearted man who taught me so much in life. Many of you will recall Norman. He was involved in football in Aldershot since the 1960's and endured many duties including spells within the youth team, commercial and lottery. In the Football League days though he was the face of Aldershot FC. Everybody knew Norman Penny.

My first dealings with Norman came in the 1980's. As a teenager who thought he knew it all I would argue about anything to do with Aldershot FC, usually in the Sportsmans Club. My passions for the football club would often boil over into frustrations. I would often put pen to paper criticising some aspect of the club that I wasn't happy with (mind you always adding my name to the letter unlike the case so often these days). Norman approached me after one of those letters in the Sportsmans and explained to me that whilst I was entitled to write a letter I should consider the consequences and the damage that such letters do. It made me think. It made me think a lot.

That was Norman. So often would be the case that a word in the ear, here and there would be so beneficial to me. He always talked sense with experience.

Through the bitter days of the old club Norman was there trying to save the club like we all were. We often travelled to the away matches and I always enjoyed his company.

I can honestly say that the role that he played for me behind the scenes as the new Aldershot Town was formed was immense. Although he had lost his job in 1992 as AFC folded Norman was quickly snapped up in the commercial department at Woking. His spiritual home was here though and we would talk constantly about the new club. Whenever he could he would be here and eventually we were able to offer him a position again at the club and he was there straight away. He was buzzing with enthusiasm

and that is when he really played a big part in my life.

As a novice Secretary in a club with so much expectation and demands Norman was there as somebody I could talk to, confide in and learn from. Indeed the values I learnt from Norman and his dear friend, Richard Aggett, will always remain with me. They had the simple, old fashioned values of decency, politeness, courtesy and respect that is so lacking in our society nowadays.

Norman became a great friend of my Dad, Tony. They always talked about their army days with such fondess and had so much in common. My Dad spent his last days in the Phyllis Tuckwell Hospice and Norman visited him every morning without fail.

A true battler Norman recovered from a serious illness himself about five years ago and lived his final years back in Farnham. Terry and I would take him out to lunch every now and then and he would be immaculately dressed as he always was. Norman would always have his photo albums and memorabilia ready to reminisce. He was also a great collector of military items.

When I joined the Army Football Association just over a year ago Norman presented to me a book all about sport in the Army that emanated from the 1950's. He was proud to present it and I was honoured to receive it. He made a similar presentation in 1992 when the club started. As Chairman of the Supporters Club Norman gave to me the original minute book of Aldershot Town Supporters Club and how it was formed in 1927. Norman loved his history.

Fittingly the last time he visited the Rec was in April 2008 as the Blue Square Premier trophy was presented at the match v Weymouth. We invited Norman because we wanted him to be there. We weren't sure if he would be able to attend due to his frailty but he was determined and he was able to attend. A carnival evening and plenty of faces from the past invited that Norman enjoyed meeting.

I am so glad that Norman was there to witness the final chapter in the return to the Football League. I know it meant so much to him.

We have lost a fine man in Norman Penny and a truly wonderful person who was a tremendous ambassador to football in Aldershot. A great influence to me I am proud that he was a special friend.

Norman's funeral will be at the Garrison Church in Aldershot on Friday 27th March at 2pm. Family flowers only and donations to be made to Help For Heroes charity. There will be a reception held at the Potters Hotel on the Farnborough Road in the Tavern Bar.



football matters with Jack Rollin



There I was idling away conjugating the odd verb or two - as you do - when I glanced at Saturday's edition of The Times and an interview with Michel Platini written by Paddy Barclay one of my old Sunday Telegraph colleagues. He is the latest to jump ship to the rival newspaper which for the first time in history has overtaken the other's sales figures. Not that either of them have much to crow about. Come to think of it, the Daily Star at 20p is the only one putting on circulation.

Anyway, Platini is still on the track of digging at the Premier League and the money it has generated from a variety of sources, chiefly Television of course. Now he wants clubs to get back to their local communities and chuck out the money men mostly foreign investors who are responsible for the current situation.

He quietly forgets that as a mercenary professional footballer himself he guit his native France having succumbed to the then lira lure in Italy. The article also referred to the fact that one of his heroes was Napoleon. Don't mention the retreat from Moscow or Waterloo of

Granted Platini was an outstanding footballer in his day, part of that memorable midfield the French possessed in the 1984 European Championship when they were ultimate winners 2-0 against Spain, the current holders of that trophy. Pity he has produced so much controversy since he retired from the game to become a meddling football politician.

What he should be focusing on if he wants to get his teeth into something which is clearly not right in our football is the cavalier attitude taken by Premier League teams in European competitions.

Having scrapped to qualify for either the Champions League or UEFA Cup, once in it and with little prospect of reaching the final, many of these teams change their priorities and they are forced to alter tack. Suddenly they put out scratch teams in Europe and keep their elite in cold storage to concentrate on the scramble for a place in the following year's competition and away from

relegation from the PL! If that is not actionable, what is? But the bottom line is they should not be allowed to get away with it. Fielding weakened teams in Europe could be sanctioned if the number of players previously registered to play in European tournaments at the start of the season was cut down. This is quite a simple operation even allowing for genuine injuries which might affect numbers. Independent medical supervision would be available for arbitration if necessary.

In the 17 years since it was founded in 1992, the Premier League has been able to sustain continuous membership for only seven clubs. No fewer than 41 different ones have had a go at mixing with the best in the country during this time.

Over the years there have been rumours that the PL wanted to have a Second Division of its own. Had this happened it would have finished off the Football League. (Scotland is thinking about the same idea now). Also if there was to be legislation cutting down the number of teams in the Premier to say, 18, that would almost surely cause problems for the Football League who would be put into a situation with just two choices.

They would either have to relegate two into the Blue Square Premier and not accept any promotion - or demote four and give two a lift up, or form another division taking in what used to be the Conference. This would result in enormous upheaval to the pyramid

Sepp Blatter at FIFA is not happy with the Premier League having 20 clubs. Only Spain has the same number in La Liga, but there is never the same criticism levelled at this organisation. But he only wants more time to organise his national tournaments. The only club competition of which he is in favour is the Club World Championship, which a European team is guaranteed first a bye, then has to negotiate a semi-final to meet almost certainly the South American champions in a final game. Can't wait for the next one to start!

uelcome to the Hatters



Season 2008-09 is proving a difficult one for Luton, starting the season on an unprecedented -30 points. Following last Saturday's defeat at home against Exeter, they were on 10 points but with only 11 games left and 16 points from safety, the situation is bleak. It means a third consecutive relegation - only this time agonisingly out of the Football League for the first time in Luton Town's history. It represents an unbelievable slump in fortunes for the Hatters - just two years after playing in the Championship, Luton Town would be a Non-League club.

The club has got something to celebrate – with an appearance at Wembley in the final of Johnstone's Paint Trophy against Scunthorpe United on April 5th 2009.



Mick Harford - Manager



Mick Harford's return to Kenilworth as manager in January 2008 was his third time on the coaching staff at Luton. He had first joined the Hatters as Joe Kinnear's first-team coach in 2001 and more recently as Director of Football for Mike Newell. He came to

Kenilworth Road after spells as Caretaker Manager at Nottingham Forest and Queen's Park Rangers and as a permanent manager of Rotherham United.

As a player, Harford joined Luton in December 1984 for £250,000 from Birmingham City, scoring 81 goals in 186 appearances, before joining Derby County for £450,000 in January 1990. He rejoined Luton from Derby in September 1991, scoring 12 goals in 31 appearances as Luton were relegated from the old First Division. He then moved to Chelsea.

He also represented Lincoln City, Newcastle United, Birmingham City, Bristol City, Chelsea, Sunderland, Coventry City and Wimbledon in a career that saw him make a total of 707 appearances and appearances and score 233 goals, as well as being capped for England.

Dean Brill - Goalkeeper

Luton-born Dean is a tall, commanding goalkeeper standing at six foot three, Brill is a great organiser whose voice will always be heard throughout a game.

Claude Gnakpa - Defender

Capable of playing centre back or full back, Claude joined on a free transfer in August 2008, having plied his trade across Europe with Montpellier HSC, Racing de Santander, Deportivo Alaves and FC Vaduz. Moved to Swindon Town for a brief spell, before being taken on in July 2007 by Peterborough United and was a regular in the League 2 promotion winning side.

Sol Davis - Defender

Signed from Swindon Town for the 2002/03 season. Made a miraculous recovery after suffering a stroke on the team bus on the way to lpswich town and, despite being told by doctors it will take months for him to return, he was back in action in the game against Cardiff City on New Years Day, 2007.

Keith Keane - Midfield

Joined the Hatters at the age of nine having been scouted in local football, and has made a rapid progression through the club's centre of excellence and youth teams. Keith has featured most prominently on the right of midfield, bursting forward to great effect to provide many goals for himself and his team-mates.

Ian Roper - Defender

Central defender with bags of experience who signed a contract at Luton in August 2008. Roper climbed up the ranks while at Walsall, gaining a reputation of being a tough, no-nonsense defender.

George Pilkington - Defender

Highly experienced defender who joined the club on a free transfer in August 2008. Began his career as an Everton trainee, Pilkington joined Port Vale in June 2003, after a loan spell at Exeter City. Having started 223 league games for the Valiants, the highly regarded defender was named player of the year twice and club captain.

Ian Henderson - Striker/Midfield

Joined the Hatters December 2008 following his release from Northampton Town. Henderson is a product of the Norwich City youth academy where he made the grade to make 79 appearance for the Canaries.

Kevin Nicholls - Midfielder

The hard-working midfielder enjoyed six successful seasons at Kenilworth Road between 2001 and 2006, captaining the side to the League One title in the 2004-2005 season. After stints at Leeds United and Preston North End, was delighted to re-sign for Luton, signing a three-year deal in August 2008 and being named as club captain.

Sam Parkin - Striker

An ex-Chelsea trainee, Sam's career at Kenilworth Road took a while to get going after a serious injury but now regularly on the scoresheet.

Ryan Charles - Striker

An energetic striker who has made a huge impact at Kenilworth Road where he has been since the age of nine. Worked his way through the ranks at the Club before scoring 17 goals in his debut season for the Luton Town youth team. Made first team debut as a second half substitute at Southend in March 2008 and given his full team debut in the following game against Carlisle before scoring on his home debut against Oldham.

Lewis Emanuel - Defender

Arrived at Kenilworth Road in the summer of 2006 after leaving home town club Bradford City. Pacy full-back but can also play on the left side of midfield, a position where he started on his league debut for the club

Asa Hall - Midfield/Defence

Versatile player capable of playing in midfield or defence. Hall began his football career in Wolverhampton Wanderers youth system, before signing his first professional contract with Birmingham City in 2004.

Ed Asafu-Adjaye - Defender

Made significant progress through the Club's youth set-up and made the breakthrough into the first team under former boss Mike Newell

Rossi Jarvis - Defender/Midfield

Adaptable player who can play on the left or right hand side of defence or midfield. Jarvis came through the Norwich City youth system, becoming the youngest player to appear for the reserve team at the tender age of 14. However, after finding first team opportunities hard to come by Jarvis joined Luton Town in August 2008 on a free transfer.

Chris Martin - Striker

Currently on a season-long loan from Norwich City, Martin is a young striker who has played 30 times for the Canaries, scoring five times. He burst into the first team in 2007, and his performances quickly saw him become a fans' favourite at the club. Strong for his age and technically gifted, his early promise saw him win call-ups for the England Under-19 squad, scoring on his debut against Turkey in March 2007.

Michael Spillane - Defender/Midfield

The Irish youngster joined the club on a season-long loan from Norwich City in August 2008, and is equally at home in defence or midfield, having playing in both positions in recent seasons for the Canaries. The Republic of Ireland U19 international is tipped to have a bright footballing future ahead of him.

Mark Bower - Defender

Bradford-born Mark joined the Hatters from his home-town club on a month's loan in January 2009.

The centre-half made his Luton debut against Bournemouth at Dean Court on 27th January, just three days after being on the bench for the Bantams against the Town..

Tom Craddock - Striker

Originally a defender, Tom developed into a promising forward who has done well at youth and Reserve team levels with Middlesbrough. Joined the Hatters on-loan from the Riverside in October 2008 and scored twice on his debut in a 2-2 draw with Grimsby Town. Two further goals followed in the games against Bury and Chesterfield and once his loan expired Mick Harford moved quickly to snap up the striker on a permanent basis.

Paul McVeigh - Striker

The ninth and final signing of Kevin Blackwell during pre-season. McVeigh started his career at Tottenham Hotspur where he made three appearances, before he enjoyed a successful career with Norwich. During his spells at Tottenham and Norwich, he was capped by Northern Ireland 20 times in total.

Kevin Gallen - Striker

Paul Ince's first signing in the summer of 2007 when he joined the club from Queens Park Rangers in early July. A Shepherds Bush native, Gallen established himself as something of a legend at Loftus Road. He notched up over 400 appearances and hit 97 goals for the R's in two spells spanning nearly 14 years.

Jake Howells - Defender

The young left back came through the ranks at Luton Town and made his first team debut as a second half substitute in May 2008. This season he has pushed on and has been an important part of the first team squad.







We are going through a period at the moment that the new generation of Shots supporters will not be used to. It's a welcome back to the Football League with a bang. It is not easy but it is a time for being level headed and focussed. For many years we have been the team that our opponents have wanted to beat. We were the "scalp"- we were playing in their cup final. You only had to be at Valley Parade last Saturday to realise what we are now up against. It is a fact that Bradford City are punching below their weight at the moment and are a club that needs to be at a higher level of football. However we have come across plenty of opponents this season who are seasoned campaigners at this level and, as I have stated before in these notes, we are playing catch up at the moment both on and, especially, off the pitch.

It is a serious issue because there are plenty of matters that need addressing at the football club with a view to the "bigger picture". A detailed structure and focus is paramount as the club must produce a vision of how it can approach the future with a long term plan of where it wants to go in a sustainable fashion that makes the future productive. It is essential.

On the pitch we must be realistic too. In the past four seasons the highest the previous season's Conference champions has finished is 18th and that was Barnet in 2005/06. Indeed Chester City, who were powerful champions when they won the Conference in 2003/04, finished two places below the following season, Accrington Stanley and Dagenham and Redbridge last season were also 20th. Indeed during the last five seasons the only side of the ten that progressed from the Conference who were instantly successful in the Football League were Carlisle United and they were backed powerfully financially and also had a 30% increase in attendances as they rose to average over 7000. We are not in that category.

We all wanted to return the name of Aldershot to the Football League. You never know what is around the corner but we are learning that it is going to be a concentrated effort as we look to the future. The competition in this league is immense but I am glad that we are getting the opportunity to compete and learn at the same time.

For any doubters just look at this afternoon's opponents. Barring a miracle the name of Luton Town will not be in the Football League next season, a competition they joined in 1897. This is a club that won the League Cup in 1988 and were playing top flight football until 1992. Just four years ago I saw them demolish Brentford on the final day of the season at Kenilworth Road as they won Division One in emphatic style finish. They were 12 points clear of second placed Hull City. Whatever the reasons of the downfall is not our business as sad as it is to see but it is a clear message of what can occur in football.

Sometimes you have to count your blessings. We have made great strides at this football club and, of course, we want to make more. However the strides we make in the future will be that much harder to earn.

shot-light on . . . Jake Robinson

Enjoying his second spell with the club, Jake Robinson is ensuring that this spell will be just as successful as the previous one. He can very rarely be seen standing still, rather chasing the ball constantly with the one obvious sole aim of getting that ball in the back of the net. And so far that doesn't seem to be a problem scoring in his first match followed up by an impressive striker's double against Accrington Stanley.

Meeting up with Jake following the Morecambe match and his enthusiasm just bounces around as do his words! So I took the opportunity to find out his thoughts on the loan move, what he hopes to achieve during his spell here and the all-important question of just how many goals he will score...

Having played at Brighton for over 10 years now, Jake has battled his way through an array of managers, scoring goals and gaining confidence along the way. However, after some time in the reserves Jake decided it was time to gain some match fitness - a decision that he explains, '... It's been a really frustrating season for me; I just wanted to get out and play some games so I had the word put about that I wanted to go on loan. I asked Brighton - they said it was ok. I had a little bit of interest from a few clubs... and then the opportunity to come to Aldershot came about. I came up here to meet the manager. He said really good things, really impressed me. From then on it was an easy decision to come here for the rest of the season'.

Jake can definitely be happy with his appearances so far which have done wonders for his confidence, '1'm feeling confident in my ability. I've felt it all season; I felt it in training at Brighton and I was playing well in the reserves, I've been frustrated that I haven't been given the chance so I'm appreciative of Aldershot that they've brought me in here to allow the chance to show that'. And he has shown that in abundance, which can be put down to his excellent settlingin period which he explains, 'I trained for a whole week before the first game which is good because I got to know everyone a bit better. They're a young bunch of lads here so it's quite easy for me to fit in - they've made me feel very

And with his first goal coming in his first game, that would have definitely helped - 'Obviously scoring on my debut helped settle a few nerves - expectations if you like. It was the perfect start for me except for the result' (3-2 away to Exeter).

With the unfortunate result at Exeter saw an Aldershot side down on their luck and some would say heads were down... so what does Jake expect to achieve to help to turn that around? 'Before today's game (vs. Morecambe) I said they were creating a lot of chances and they need someone to put them away. I think that's what I can do. I can get on the end of the ball and put the ball in the net for them'.

And on a personal level? 'Personally I've always wanted to have a position locked down in the team. I've never really had that position of my own... I just really want to score goals to be honest. As a striker I'm a bit greedy and that's all you ever want to do really - it's how you make your name as a striker. If I can continue to score goals and get a few more this season, impress a few people'.

In his first few games Jake has shown this hunger in abundance which no doubt will help to make him a favourite with the Shots' faithful. He is a player who can only be described as a terrier - someone that chases down as many balls as possible whilst sticking a few away at the same time. Asking his thoughts on his style however, Jake is perhaps more realistic. 'Ideally you want to play all over the place like Thierry Henry picking the ball up, running hundreds of yards with it and scoring but it doesn't work like that unfortunately. In this league you need to take your chances when you can. And that's the player I want to be'.

So looking ahead to the season and all is bright for Jake - so how many goals does he have in him? 'I don't like giving totals - I did that before and it caught me out a bit! I've got a target in my head and I'd like to keep it there but more than once!' Well with 3 goals in three games at time of writing I reckon that target is there for the taking!





welcome back Roper Joslyn

The official guest of honour for today's match against Luton Town is the scorer of the most famous goal in Aldershot F.C.'s history, Roger Joslyn.

All at Aldershot Town are delighted to welcome Roger back to the EBB stadium.

Roger Joslyn was born in May 1950 in Colchester, Essex and began his career with his hometown club, signing as a professional in May 1968. In two and a half years at Layer Road, Roger made 92 appearances, plus a further seven as substitute, scoring four goals.

Roger arrived at The Recreation Ground in October 1970 and quickly earned a reputation as a brave, tough tackling midfielder with a playing style that endeared him to The Rec faithful, many of whom still talk of Roger in endearing terms to this day. A hugely popular player, Roger was voted the clubs player of the year in 1970/71 (his first season) and in 1971/72.

The moment that earns Rogers name a place in the club history occurred on May 4th 1973. Going down 1-0 after four minutes, Shots pressed for an equaliser and in the 38th minute Roger slammed home after a flick from Steve Melledew to make it 1-1. There were no further goals that evening, and it meant that Aldershot FC were promoted for the first time in their history.

In total, Roger made 186 appearances in the Red and Blue, scoring 17 goals, and in his spell with the club missed only six league and cup games.

In November 1974 Roger joined the Graham Taylor revolution at Watford and became an integral part of a side which fought its way from fourth to first division in successive seasons, playing alongside such legends as Luther Blissett. During his time at Watford Roger became (probably) the only ex Aldershot player to be awarded with a gold disc for album sales when the whole Hornets first team squad collaborated on an album with the then club chairman Elton John! In total Roger made 178 appearances for Watford, scoring 17

Roger moved to Reading in 1979 and played 67 games for the Royals before retiring from the game to forge himself a successful career as a furniture maker.

The Army Football Association is based in Clayton Barracks in Aldershot and administers football worldwide. We are a County Association within the Football Association (FA); one of 52 counties within the country committed to advancing football at all levels of the game. As County Secretary and the Army's representative on the FA council I serve on a number of committees. I am currently Vice Chairman of the England "C" team, a member of the Football Development Committee and a Judicial Panel member too.

From the Army FA perspective we are here directly to further football within the British Army throughout the world. There are vast opportunities too. There are players at unit, corps and representative level; a wide range of coaching courses administered in Aldershot by our Football Development Officer (FDO), Steve Stone or through refereeing of which there are over 200 registered Army referees.

The Army FA is steeped in history and we are rightly proud of this. We were formed in 1888 and the most prestigious competition is the Army FA Challenge Cup which was first competed for in 1889. Last season's competition was won by the 9 Regt AAC at the home of Army football, Aldershot Military Stadium. This season's final will be played on Wednesday 22 April with a 3pm kick off, at the Military Stadium.

We also have representative teams at men's senior, women's and Under 23 development level. Women's Inter Corps League which concludes with the 6 A Side competition staged at Queens Avenue, Aldershot.

It is not all about playing football though. As stated above we have tremendous opportunities through our Coaching and referees department. Our Football Development office is always busy. Courses are available throughout the year covering FA certificates at various levels of coaching in addition to First Aid, treatment and management of injuries too. Courses are available to both military and civilians. (Please feel free to contact us). It is an extensive programme.

Referees are always required, a quarter of our registered officials are level 4 or above. All our referees started out attending a Basic Referees Course. Captain Danny McDermid is a Football League referee whilst WO1 Andy Halliday is a Premier League Assistant and Blue Square Premier Referee. There is an undeniable enthusiasm within our Army referees and an eagerness to ensure that new recruits are encouraged to become referees.

As you can see already there is plenty to be positive about within Army football and we are keen for this to grow. We have an enthusiastic staff of six in Aldershot including Graham Brookland, who is a former Secretary at Aldershot Town.



Craip Mattheus talks to John Dunpworth PART2

FC between 1977 and 1980. earning himself cult status among Shots fans which he still enjoys to this day. He came to prominence during the 1978-79 season when The Shots enjoyed a run to the fifth round of the FA Cup, where they went out after a replay to Shrewsbury Town, for whom John signed for £75,000 upon leaving the club in 1980. Since retiring from playing John has enjoyed a fine career as a coach, holding a EUFA A licence, and has recently joined Sheffield Wednesday as assistant first team coach and reserve team manager, having previously worked for the Owls in a scouting capacity for several months. In this, the second part of his interview with Craig Matthews, John reflects further on his time

If Aldershot had been promoted in one of the seasons when they just missed out while you were at the club, do you think you would have remained at the club for longer?

with Aldershot.

I'm sure I would have, because I could have envisaged us going up a couple of leagues, the squad was good enough.

The home FA Cup game against Shrewsbury seemed to be won when you scored in the 88th minute to put The Shots 2-1 up, what were your feelings when they scored an even later goal to equalise?

We were all bitterly disappointed but that's the way football is. Shrewsbury were a good team and were top of their league at that time. We had done really well.

How did your move to Shrewsbury come about? I think it basically came as a result of those two games. I had done quite well individually and I think that's when the manager Graham Turner first saw me. Luton Town came in for a late bid for me when David Pleat was their manager, and I did know that they had been watching me for a while, but I had already spoken to Shrewsbury and agreed to sign for them. Luton were a little unsure because of the money and Shrewsbury

were happy to go to the tribunal. At the time I just wanted the opportunity to play at a higher level. I didn't want to leave Aldershot but when the opportunity came to player at a higher level I had to take it.

When you went to Shrewsbury you weren't quite as prolific as you were at Aldershot, why do you think that was?

In a lot of ways I think I picked the wrong club. Their style of football was completely different, the role that I was asked to play was different, and also it was two stepped higher. I thought I was playing well, but I didn't get the opportunities to get the goals I had been getting while I was at Aldershot

Which other clubs did you play for after you left Aldershot?

I went to Mansfield for 18 months and then I ended up at Rotherham which was my home town and ended my career there. I played there for four years while Norman Hunter was the manager and I started playing as a defender at the end of my career, which I enjoyed.

Do you think it stood you in good stead for your coaching career, that you had two careers really, one as a striker and one as a defender and saw the game from both sides?

Yes definitely.

Who were the players you used to admire when you were growing up?

Jimmy Greaves first, and then Tony Currie when I used to watch Sheffield United.

Since retiring from playing you have stayed in football as a coach, which clubs have you worked for as a coach?

When I left Rotherham I joined Sheffield United part time for a year then I became full time on the youth development side. I actually played a few reserve games for them. I finished playing in 1988 and was with Sheffield United until 1997. Then I went to Leeds United for three years. When I first went there the likes of Alan Smith, Paul Robinson, Jonathon Woodgate and Stephen MacPhail were in the Leeds youth team. It was an outstanding team.

Which of the players you coached at Leeds has given you most satisfaction as you have watched them develop?

I think that Jonathon Woodgate was outstanding even at that age. Things just came so easy to him. Stephen MacPhail was good as well. He never really played that many games in the Premiership, he's at Cardiff City at the moment. Alan Smith had a tremendous attitude he's just been unfortunate with his injuries over the last couple of years.

And after Leed's.....

Well then I moved to Huddersfield, and had seven and a half years and coached a lot of kids through there. I was the youth and reserve team coach up until about 2006/7. Terry Yorath was the assistant manager and he became ill so I stepped up to become assistant manager to Peter Jackson. Peter left and Andy Ritchie came on board so I remained in that position. The Andy got the sack in April 2008 and I went with him. Since then I've been scouting part time for Sheffield Wednesday, and recently was appointed as assistant first team coach and reserve team manager on a full time basis. My scouting job involved going to watch the team who Wednesday were playing the following week. There was a lot of travelling involved.

Do you have any ambitions to be a manager or do you prefer coaching?

Sometimes you get opportunities when you least expect them. You might be a youth coach, and then the manager or coach leaves and you take over on a caretaker basis and then you get the job. I had aspirations to become a manager but things never worked out in that respect. I more or less see myself as a coach these days though.

Do you think that when you apply for jobs its more a case of who you know, not what you know?

Exactly, but that's football. Everybody who's in the game appreciates that that's the case and it is who you know getting jobs. You might have worked with somebody before and you get respect in that way. I think most jobs are lined up now. If somebody leaves they've got somebody in mind and they more or less step in straight away.

What were your feelings when Aldershot went bust in 1992, were you aware of what was going on?

Yes I was gutted, really disappointed. I've been following their progress since they reformed as well and Gary Waddock has done a really good job.

What are the best and worst stadiums you've ever played in?

Probably Highbury is the best and the worst is Barking in the F.A. Cup.

When you were playing for Aldershot who was the worst trainer at the club?

Ha ha, I don't really want to drop anybody in it!

Thanks to John for taking the time to answer the questions. Clearly he is one of the most popular, and remembered players ever to play for Aldershot FC, and we hope he is able to come to a game as the club's guest very soon.
