

Troubled Whites hit back to bag a point

SALISBURY put behind them a week in which they had lost ten points through going into administration and produced a superb performance against promotion hotshots Luton Town, earning a creditable 1-1 draw.

It was looking like a story of recent games as the Whites dominated early play and had chances, but then fell behind on 27 minutes when Adam

Newton slipped past Danny Spence before crossing low for **KEVIN GALLEN** to net easily at the far post.

Before that Salisbury could have been ahead, with Mike Tyler in the visitors' goal being forced into a brilliant save from Chris Flood's close-range effort, and on 22 minutes when Matt Tubbs went very close with a glancing header.

After Luton took the lead it was Tubbs again who screwed a chance wide on 34

minutes and then, four minutes later, saw his effort deflected by a great block from Luton defender Alan White.

Salisbury's equaliser came on 42 minutes when Flood burst through the left channel before feeding **TUBBS**, who belted an unstoppable shot past Tyler.

The second period opened with Luton applying pressure and missing three chances through Gallen, Newton and George Pilkington in the first five minutes after the

break. But on 57 minutes Danny Webb was unlucky to see his shot on the turn float just clear of the bar.

Tubbs again threatened just after the hour with a header which drifted wide. But Luton, in a final effort, saw Tom Craddock send an effort at James Bittner.

Salisbury continued to attack until the final whistle with Luke Ruddick sending a right-foot shot over the top as the referee blew.
