Enjoy the game.



Of course, our own management vacancy is at the very top of our agenda at present and I'd like to take this opportunity to update you with our progress and process in this

Before I do however, I would like to go on record in thanking Alan Neilson and the coaching staff of Kevin, Dmitri, Harry and Key for their magnificent efforts in ensuring that the squad remain united over recent weeks and, most importantly, for collecting a very commendable 10 points out of 12 in the league.

Their focus, dedication, commitment and desire have been evident for all to see, in particular, our squad of players who have been rather outspoken in support of the temporary manager.

Players voicing their opinions in unison is a healthy thing and, if positive and constructive, is something we would encourage. It demonstrates there's an excellent team spirit in the camp and shows that they are happy about our progress.

The board of 2020 will always lend an ear to

any player who feels they have a positive input into the development of the football business, especially if it contributes to an immediate return to the Football League.

However, our process for recruiting a new manager has been very measured, meticulous and qualified with the final decision being made by the board.

We were so astounded by the response from a broad variety of applications we had to extend the deadline in order to attract the best applications.

After receiving an amazing 80+ CVs we began the process of filtering down to a long-list in the first instance.

It was heartening and entertaining to see the very professional application from an 11 year old girl who wanted to bring her Dad in as Assistant or the manager of a well known pizza house who managed the Hatters to success in Championship

Whilst I'm sure their dedication would have been admirable the list of senior candidates was impressive, to say the least.

In addition to the list of incoming applicants we also approached a few who we identified as ambitious and high calibre

candidates who would be very appropriate for our Club.

Our methodology for narrowing our selection and interviewing candidates was measured by establishing a list of key criterion we felt was most appropriate for the next manager of Luton Town to possess after consulting with a few trusted friends with immense experience in the game.

Candidates were then assessed on the factual elements of these qualities prior to being invited to an interview and then assessed on their character, aptitude and vision during the interview.

Whilst proven experience and a good CV may present a low risk option for us, we are insistent that the successful applicant would need to be the right character to take Luton Town forward consistently and steadily over the next few years with an instant positive

Having conducted numerous interviews to date, we are confident that we will soon be able to appoint a manager who matches our immediate need and our longer term ambition and a man who should be popular with you all.

Meanwhile. we greatly appreciate your patience while we complete this process.

Whilst this is not an appointment we wished to deliberate over, Alan's positive impact on performances has enabled us to take much more care in our selection.

Onto other matters.

It is sometimes hard to believe that it has been just 15 months since we effectively took control of the club and the list of tasks that faced us at that time was daunting

As a group we feel that we have made steady progress in nearly every area and in some areas, such as the Youth Department and the level of customer service from our ticket office, we have seen progress beyond our initial expectations.

The next area of focus for us now is the Club Shop and the retail side of the business which was poorly mismanaged under the previous regime.

As we have said many times in the past, the primary aim of Luton Town FC 2020 Ltd is financial stability and this has been at the forefront of our minds throughout the process of buying merchandise for the shop.

We were obviously very disappointed with the news we received from Carbrini that there would be a delay in receiving our replica kit for sale in the shop for which we apologise to you all.

It demonstrates there's an excellent team spirit in the camp and shows that they are happy about our progress.

We looked at every conceivable option in trying to obtain these items guicker and even replacing Carbrini altogether.

This is the main reason why we were unable to keep supporters updated on

However, we have now been given assurances that the training kit will be available within two weeks and the replica kit will be available within three weeks and are again pleased that these lines will be launched in time for Christmas

Additionally, a wide range of new merchandise has now been selected; products that vary in price and style so that we will appeal to the vast spectrum of our fan base.

RECENT HISTORY:

The Blues enjoyed several successful campaigns in the Isthmian Leagues between 1983 and 2004, winning Division Two in 1984/85 and finishing as runners-up in 1987/88 and in 1999/2000. Success continued when they joined and won the inaugural Conference South in season 2004/05 under manager Mark Stimson and completely the double by lifting the FA Trophy with a penalty shootout win over Hucknall Town.

Stimson guided the Blues to third place in their first season in the Conference only to lose out in the Play-Offs to Halifax Town but the club did however, retain the FA Trophy with victory over Woking at Upton Park.

A 10th place followed 2007/08 before last season's 19th place finish - eight points off t h e relegation places.

Former Hatters striker Dwight Marshall started his career with Athletic before being sold to Plymouth Argyle for £35,000 in

THE MANAGER

JULIAN DICKS

During his playing career Julian appeared at left-back for Birmingham City, West Ham (twice), Liverpool and Canvey Island. He had a respected reputation as one of his generation's hard men, hence he was affectionately know by teammates as "The Terminator".

A tough tackler in possession of a cultured left foot and a fierce shot, which was in regular demand as a penalty and free-kick taker. He scored 10 goals for West Ham in the 1995/96 season, which is the best return for a defender in the Premier League. He was voted as the Hammers' Player of the Year four times between 1990 and 1997.

After retiring as a footballer, Dicks

took up golf and soon turned professional, but was forced to give this career up due to his knee

In 2001 he made a brief return to football after signing for non-League Canvey Island, but played only four matches. After just under eight years out of the game, he returned to football on 5th January 2009 when he was appointed manager of Eastern Counties League side Wivenhoe Town but he left the club shortly after the end of last season by mutual

He wasn't out of the game for long though and was installed as in the Recreation Ground hot seat on 15th September.

The former Birmingham City and West Ham United defender is pleased with the start to his non-league managerial career and explains how he is looking forward to having a good season with the Blue Square Premier club.

"I've only been in the role for five weeks and it is different to what I've been used to but I feel we are slowly getting things right," he said.

"It's a learning curve for me and the players and we know it will take time but we will get there I'm sure.

"I'm really pleased to be involved with this club and hopefully I can improve the squad so that we can climb up the league table."

hoping his side can produce a good performance that will give the players a boost when they return to league action the following week against Barrow.


"Confidence breeds from winning football matches so we will want to get a result and then push on from there "

PRESTON EDWARDS

Shot stopper who made his first professional appearance for Millwall after coming on as a sub against Swansea City in the first round of the Football League Trophy in 2007.

In January 2009 he joined Isthmian League Premier Division club Dover Athletic on loan after an injury to the club's first-choice goalkeeper. Whilst at Dover Athletic, he helped them secure the title and promotion to the Conference South. This Summer he rejected a new one year deal from Millwall, and was therefore out of contract.

LLOYD ANDERSON

Standing at 6ft 2in tall, Lloyd is a former Brentford youth keeper who was promoted to their first team in November 2009 following an injury to Seb Brown

CSECIMENTAL CAMERON MAWER

Stevenage-born Cam was a graduate of Watford's Academy scheme, he has also represented England at Under 18 an Under 20 levels. This is Cam's second spell with the Blues having signed for Grays in the summer of 2005 he then left the Recreation Ground in 2008 to join Weymouth

GAVIN HOYTE

Centre back Gavin started his career at Wootton before moving to Bedford Town in 2005. He joined Cambridge United in 2007 then moved to join Weymouth towards the tail end of last season.

DANNY RUNCE

Former West Ham United trainee who has had spells with Oxford, Cambridge, Woking and Chelmsford City.

ANWAR UDDIN

Defender who began his career at West Ham United, working his way up through their youth and reserve teams where he was captain. He part of the Hammers victorious 1999 FA Youth Cup winning squad that defeated Coventry City.

In February 2002 he decided to move to Sheffield Wednesday for an undisclosed fee, however due to the collapse of ITV Digital, Wednesday couldn't afford to keep him and he was on the move to Bristol Rovers the following summer after only four months and no appearances for the Championship club. He was an almost ever present in the following season until the end of October. After making a couple of appearances the following season he was loaned out to Hereford United and Telford United and was released by the Pirates at the end of the season.

He then settled in the team Dagenham & Redbridge, where he was made skipper.

IACK OBERSTELLER

Left sided defender Jack started out at Millwall where he progressed from the youth set-up to become a regular in their second string. He had a short loan spell with Crawley before signing a one year contract for Wycombe Wanderers, joined Exeter City in the summer of 2008.

The Hackney-born left back is another to have started his career with Millwall, making 50 appearances by the end of the 2003/04 season. By this point, he had completed loan spells with Yeovil Town and Brentford, and subsequently left the New Den to join Grimsby Town. Ronnie stayed for a season, before moving to New Zealand to play for the Knights. On his return to England, he signed with Rushden and Diamonds. Ronnie has scored twice in his professional career - both with Grimsby and made 130 appearances. He has most recently played for Ebbsfleet United, Fisher Athletic and then Exeter City before signing for Athletic.

CRAIG BRAHAM-BARRETT

Pacev left-back who was recently released by Peterborough United, he was previously with Kettering Town and Welling United.

BILLY CROWTHER

After starting out as a youth player with Leyton Orient, Billy joined Dagenham & Redbridge before moving to AFC Hornchurch and then Brentwood Town. Whilst normally found plying his trade in defence Billy is also comfortable playing as a forward.

KENNY DAVIS

Previously a member of the Chelsea youth team. Kenny spent the 2004/05 season with Redbridge before joining Ryman Premier side, Harlow Town in the Summer of 2005, where he was voted as the Hawks Player of the Year 2007/08. Easy adept in both central defence or at right-back.

STEICLEIFICIIM ADRIANO RIGOGLIOSO

Talented midfielder/striker who started his career with his home club Liverpool playing in the same FA Youth Cup winning side as Michael Owen and Jamie Carragher. Adriano is nicknamed Celi by his family after the Italian opera singer Adriano Celetano. After playing for Marine in the lower leagues, he moved to Morecambe in the summer of 2000 where he made over 100 club appearances. He then joined Doncaster Rovers at the start of the 2003/04 season but returned to Morecambe in 2006 but joined his old boss Jim Harvey at Forest Green Rovers in October of that year, initially onloan. He guickly made a big impression on the fans and his good form during this period resulted in an early return to Morecambe but he was released at the end of the season and his transfer to the Rovers was later made permanent.

GLENN POOLE

Essex local Glenn was previously with Yeovil Town before joining Ford United (latterly Redbridge). He signed for Thurrock in July 2005 and then went onto join Rochdale on-loan from Grays Athletic in 2007 before signing for Brentford.

PAOLO VERNAZZA

Central midfielder Paolo started his career at Arsenal but struggled to break into the first team while at Highbury. He made his first team debut in a League Cup match against Birmingham City on 14 October 1997 and his performances in Arsenal's reserves resulted in him gaining a place in the England squad for the 1999 FIFA World Youth Championship. He had loan spells at Ipswich Town and Portsmouth, before leaving Arsenal for Watford in December 2000. He played 11 times for Arsenal, scoring one goal, in a 2-1 win over Coventry City on 16th September 2000. Paolo spent three-and-a-half years at Watford, making 96 league appearances, before moving to Rotherham United in the summer of 2004 for a reported £600,000. Following a successful trial, Paolo signed for Dagenham & Redbridge on 14th December 2006. He was part of the squad that helped Dagenham gain promotion to the Football League for the first time in the club's history, winning the Conference National in the 2006/07 season. After stints with Weymouth, Crawley and Woking he signed for put pen to paper at the Recreation Ground.

DARYL ROBSON

Started as a youngster with Middlesbrough, winning the FA Youth Cup while at the Riverside before signing with Galway United in July 2007. He spent a year with the Tribesmen before opting to sign for Bray Wanderers he then returned to England to join the Blues.

RICHARD GRAHAM

Gravesend-born striker Jack was a regular with the West Ham United Under 18 side throughout the 2007/08 season and has had several opportunities with the reserve side. He has also had loan spells with Hampton & Richmond, Leyton Orient and Cambridge United.

PETAR RNKOVIC Petar is one of the few players who can lay claim to having played in every position, including goalkeeper during their career. The Norwegian made his debut at senior level for Second Division Åssiden IF before being loaned to Icelandic KS where he scored eight goals in 13 matches. Petar got a contract with Hønefoss BK at the end of the 2002 season and was there until 2004. has a different format now, Luton have previously played nine FA Cup ties that have been classed as the

fourth qualifying round, with only four of these at Kenilworth Road. The Hatters have won every one of these ties scoring an incredible 55 goals and conceding just nine.

The first of these fourth qualifying round ties was played on 19th November 1898

and the Hatters beat Shepherds Bush 4-3 with goals from William Crump, Arthur "Jimmy" Durrant, James Kemplay and George Hewitt.



The least number of goals scored in a home fourth qualifying round game has happened three times. In November 1899 the Hatters

beat local rivals Watford 3-2 with goals from Roland Brown, John Brock and Walter Fairgrieve. In both 1912 and 1913 Luton beat their visitors 3-0 with victories Tunbridge Wells Rangers and Croydon Common respectively, with Wileman scoring in both games.



The Hatters have scored nine goals twice at this stage of the competition and both matches ended 9-1. The first was against Civil Service in

1900 and then in 1910 when Cambridge United were the visitors to Kenilworth Road. Five players scored in the first tie with three players scoring a brace, the remaining goal was scored by Johnson, a Civil Service player. There were two hat-tricks in the match against Cambridge with Smith scoring four and Moody netting three.



Luton have beaten Watford twice; the first time being in the match mentioned previously. The second occasion was in 1903 when

a brace from Turner, and further goals from McKee and Allsopp, gave the Hatters a 4-1

The Hatters hit five goals against Suffolk side Lowestoft Town in 1902 with the visitors replying with a just one goal. The Town beat Fulham by the

same scoreline in the next round, and after beating Kidderminster 3-0, Luton were finally knocked out in the first round proper by Millwall Athletic



A Club record FA Cup score came in the fourth qualifying round tie at Kenilworth Road on 21st November 1914 when the Hatters beat Great

Yarmouth 15-0. Two players, Simms and Rollinson, scored four goals, with Wileman netting a brace. Further goals were scored by F Hawkes, Frith, Roberts, Hoar and visiting player Housego. This score beat the previous record victory of 13-1 in 1901 when Apsley were the visitors in a first qualifying



It's 17 years since Luton last won on this date, although to be fair there have only been two matches played since the 3-2 win at Peterborough United in

1992 when Phil Gray scored twice and Paul Telfer added the third before half-time. Six years later Luton lost 1-0 at Gillingham, and then three years ago the Hatters suffered a 4-0 defeat at Everton in a League Cup third round tie.







The Hatters are settling well in their new surroundings of the Blue Square Premier this season and the front man thinks they can now look ahead to the remainder of the season with added determination.

"We have adapted well to life in the Conference because we have a strong squad of players. Now that we have had a recent good spell we will be looking to push on."

And despite league leaders Oxford United having a healthy points tally at the top of the table, the striker still thinks that Town can push for that automatic promotion place.

"It's only October so there is still a long way to go and if we are still up there come February and March then we will be determined to get to the top of the table."







Not since the Town were plying their trade outside the Football League 90 years ago have they had to qualify for the first round proper of the FA Cup.

Those nine decades have seen the Hatters reach the final in 1959 and the semi-finals three times in a nine year period with the last appearance in the last four just 14-anda-half years ago.

The Hatters have enjoyed their fair share of excitement in recent times, with three ties against Liverpool springing to mind at a time when thoughts of qualifying for the first round, let alone playing in it, were non-existent.

It's something that both captain Kevin Nicholls and midfielder and Town fan Andy Burgess can't get their head round either as the Hatters rub shoulders with some of non-league football's lesser-lights four years after leading Liverpool 3-1 at Kenilworth Road.

"It feels a bit strange but that's where we are at the minute," admits Nicholls. "We're in the qualifying round and we've to get on with it.

did in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy.

"A victory today and we could land up playing someone Southampton or Charlton. There are a lot of big teams in Leagues 1 and 2 and they'll be no doubt looking to avoid us."

Meanwhile Burgess, as a Luton fan, is still coming to terms with the fact that the club find themselves in the situation of having to play in the qualifying stage of the cup given their history in the competition.

"Almost 15 years ago I was at Wembley when we played Chelsea in the semi-final and to be playing Grays in the qualifying round today is quite surreal to be honest.

"All of the lads know the objective of this season is to win promotion back to the Football League so we don't have to play at this stage in the FA Cup again.

"There has obviously been a big change in the fortunes of the club and it doesn't

seem that long ago that we were playing semi-finals against Everton in 1985 and Wimbledon in 1988.

"It will come as a bit of shock to the diehard fans that were used to us playing the likes of Manchester United and Liverpool

"Although we are at our lowest ebb three wins in this competition and we're in amongst the big boys again and a fullhouse at Kenilworth Road or





a trip away from home would be fantastic."

Big games and the cracking cup-tie atmosphere that goes with them have been few and far between.

But two games against Liverpool at Kenilworth Road in the third round of the competition stick out, with the first in 2006 going down as one of the all-time

Nicholls looks back on the game with fond memories. He was a part of the team that night in front of the Match of the Day cameras who excelled in the pulsating clash that saw the skipper score from the penalty spot to put the Town 3-

"It's a game I will never forget," says the 30-year-old. "It was a fantastic occasion and an amazing game to be a part of.

"In hindsight we perhaps could have defended our lead a bit better but we still had to hold on against a team full of internationals.

"In many ways it was strange because we were delighted with the performance to come so close to beating the European champions but it later dawned on us that we should have won the game.

"Liverpool weren't scared again at all on their way to the final when they completed another comeback to lift the trophy against West Ham.

"The atmosphere inside Kenilworth Road was incredible that night and it will be a completely different kind of feeling today - no disrespect to Grays."

After appearing at this stage many times in his career so far, Burgess is guarding against complacency.

The 28-year-old was part of the Rushden & Diamonds team that were beaten by Southern League Evesham United last season but the midfielder is hoping the Hatters' home draw against Conference opposition can be a blessing in disguise.

"Last year with Rushden we turned up at Evesham expecting it to be a walk in the park," the midfielder says. "We were outplayed, didn't perform and were deservedly beaten.

"It was a horrible experience but we're at home against a team in the same league as us so we know what to expect and hopefully the game can be the start of a long run in the competition.

"I've had some good memories in the FA Cup and I now want some with Luton.

"I played against us for Rushden and that was the first time I'd played at Kenilworth Road so that was special.

"It's up to us now and hopefully we can beat Grays and go on to win another two matches where we could land up meeting one of the Premier League teams. That would be superb."

THERICAL PROPERTY OF THE PROPE

For a change today we are going back to the last time the Town played in the fourth qualifying round of the FA Cup - almost 95 years ago and three months after the Great War had been declared

The Hatters had just endured two seasons playing in Southern League


DAYSPAST

21ST NOVEMBER 1914 . LUTON TOWN 15 - 0 GREAT YARMOUTH TOWN

Division Two where their rivals were mostly from the depths of Wales, but had won promotion back to their rightful place in the top division at the end of the 1913/14 campaign.

Although the players had not set the world alight in the new season, losing eight of their first 15 games, they were less than happy to be forced into playing in the fourth qualifying round of the FA Cup when everyone else in their division seemed to have received a bve.

Their opponents were to be Great Yarmouth Town, the then reigning champions of the Norfolk and Suffolk League but nonetheless an amateur



GOAL PROVIDER SID HOAR.


On a cold day a crowd of 4,000, paid total gate receipts of £88, huddled together for warmth on the Kenilworth Road terraces with the attendance including 1,000 soldiers who had been admitted free

Yarmouth were missing three regulars who could not get away because they were in the Norfolk Cyclists Brigade whose duty it was to guard the coast, whilst the Town were at full strength.

There was always going to be a missmatch between the sides and this was soon apparent when the Yarmouth full-back, Housego, put through his own goal after 10 minutes and from then on it was one-way traffic as heads dropped.

Hugh Roberts scored number two with a hard shot which went over the head of the Yarmouth goalkeeper Gay who was 'handicapped by a lack of inches', according to reports of the game, with number three coming shortly afterwards when Ernie Simms was pushed in the area and converted the resulting penalty himself.

Frank Rollinson headed in number four from a Sid Hoar cross while Simms



The second-half was an embarrassment leaving the Luton News reporter Crusader to pompously comment afterwards, "this led to the sort of 'game' that can only take place when two sides are in such absolutely different classes that they ought not to be put together unless they both want a vacant date filled. Yarmouth, I can quite believe, are an excellent side among amateurs but when they come up against Southern League professionals they just provide amusement for the spectators."

The Hatters netted 10 in a one sided second period as the Yarmouth players seemed to stand back to allow the Luton forwards to attack at will. For one of the goals Simms and Arthur Wileman, who had netted 55 times between them the previous season, "ran through with the ball, shoulder to shoulder like a pair of horses attached to the same pole."

In the second half Rollinson scored a hat-trick with the first two of these efforts coming from Hoar centres while the third was simply walked in with the goalkeeper nowhere to be seen. Simms scored number nine, Wileman netted the 10th before Roberts fed Simms to make it 11-0.

As the scoring continued, Simms provided an opening for Robert Frith to get on the scoresheet with his first for the club. Fred Hawkes scored with a shot which went in off a post. Wileman ran in number 14 before Hoar forsook his provider role to bag the final goal.

Each of the forwards had scored, as well as two of the half-backs which left skipper and left-half Bob Hawkes as the only player not to join in the fun apart from the full-backs. Suffice to say that goalkeeper Joe Mitchell had a quiet afternoon!

The Luton supporters willed Yarmouth to score at least one goal and gave a big cheer every time they managed to cross the half-way line but apart from a couple of long shots and two early corners, they never looked like breaking their duck.

The result remains the Town's biggest victory in a competitive match although it did not do them much good as they eventually went out 3-0 at Southampton in the first round proper.

"I think once the team begin to gel then the quality of the players will begin to shine.

"In the next few months you will see a difference in the Grays Athletic team and you will see them moving up the table and away from the bottom.


"Results have been a bit up and down, we beat Mansfield Town at home which was a great result but overall we have been unlucky not to pick points elsewhere.

"The team is made up of a lot of young players who all work hard for each other so today will be an interesting game."

Australian, no-nonsense defender who would head a brick wall if asked to. Signed in 2001 and went on to make over 200 appearances for the Town and won two promotions. Was sold to Colchester in 2008 when we were in Administration. Chris is now playing in the A-League for Perth Glory but I'm sure he misses the freezing winter nights of football at Kenilworth

MATTHEW TAYLOR

Made the break-through into the Town team as a 17-year-old in 1999/00. Helped get Luton promoted from the basement division in 2001/02 before leaving for Portsmouth. Matt is now an established Premier League player for Bolton Wanderers

CARLOS IEDAWARIOS

Carlos was a great player. Bought in from Wrexham in 2005 he had pace in abundance. He flew Luton's colours on the world stage too when his Trinidad and Tobago side made the 2006 World Cup finals. His all-too-brief stay came to an end when he was sold to Sunderland in 2007, a sale that was pivotal to our relegation from the Championship that season.

KEMN NICHOLLS

Captain fantastic, Nicholls makes up at lot of ground in the middle of the park and gets the tackles in to break up opponents' attacks. Was originally signed in 2001 and was involved in two promotions, before signing for Leeds than Preston. Nico resigned in 2008 and lifted the Johnstone's Paint Trophy last season.

MATTHEW SPRING

A midfielder who could get the occasional goal from long range. Sold to Leeds then went off-the-rails a bit when he decided to ioin Watford before returning like a prodigal son who had sinned to Luton. Currently helping Charlton fly high in League 1.

COOMFICINULIUMS

Joined Luton in 2004 from Rushden & Diamonds and went straight into the team for his debut against OPR but only lasted 19 minutes before he was injured. Came back the following season and made the left-midfield spot his own as we won League 1. Played some games in the Championship but injury unfortunately brought his career to an end.

Scored over 100 goals for us after signing from Northampton in 2001, mainly from inside the six-yard box. Stevo could also fill in at centre-back when required.



Referee Kinseley played a superb advantage after his linesman had flagged for a foul on Claude Gnakpa and as the ball fell to Hall outside the penalty area he drilled a fine shot into the top corner of the goal.

Although the Town's tails were up, Martin Foyle's visitors weathered the storm and as the game swung from end-to-end in the final 15 minutes.

City almost snatched the three points at the death when substitute Adam Boyes failed to touch home Richard Brodie's cross in the fourth minute of injury time.

Luton are again at home next Saturday as they get back to league action when Rushden & Diamonds travel to Kenilworth Road in the Blue Square Premier.

The visitors last made the trip back in 2003 when both sides were in the third tier of English football with Town recording a 3-1 win against Diamonds thanks mainly to a double from former Hatters' player Tony Thorpe in front of almost 7,000 fans.

Like Luton, the Diamonds have experienced recent relegation from the Football League when they dropped out of League 2 in 2005 and have since spent the last five seasons in the Conference.

Going back to the early 90s Rushden & Diamonds were formed in 1992 when Rushden Town and Irthlingborough Diamonds merged and amazingly within four years they went from being a Southern League Midland Division club to playing in the Football Conference.

More success followed at the turn of the second millennium as they were promoted to League 2 in 2001 after winning the Conference title. Their most

successful season to date was in 2002/03 when they were again promoted after edging out Hartlepool United to the championship and with it promotion to League 1.

The joy was short lived though, and following a dismal run of results in the 2004/05 season they were relegated to the fourth tier and two seasons later they were again on the slide as they went out of the Football League in 2006.

After four successive seasons in the Conference Diamonds appointed former Tottenham Hotspur player Justin Edinburgh as the manager in April this year after he helped the side to finish the highest they have been since the 2002/03 season.

The start of the current Blue Square Premier season has seen them make steady progress so far ands currently sit ninth in the table.

Before taking the reigns at Rushden the former Pompey player cut his teeth at Billericay, Fisher Athletic and at Grays Athletic so the 39-year-old is sure to have an influence at Nene Park as he looks to use his short managerial experience to lift his side up the league.
