Asa is a rare commodity in football: a midfielder who is capable of scoring plenty of goals from that position whether it be arriving late in the box to score with his head or shooting from outside the area like he has done with success in our last two

The victory and performance against Grays saw us rewarded with a another home tie when against Rochdale.

They are going well in League 2 and will provide us a stern test but that is for us to worry about next week.

Finally I'd like to thank all the players for their effort on my five games in caretaker charge.

I also couldn't have done it without the help of Kevin Watson, Harry Scott-Stackman, Dmitri Kharine, kitman Kevin Sanson, video analyst Tony McCool, all those involved in the youth set-up, the directors and supporters for making my tenure as caretaker manager so enjoyable.


All the players have given me 100 per cent effort and that's all a manager or a coach can ask for.

The Hatters have met the Diamonds four times in the Football League, winning three and drawing one. Our last clash was in 2003/04 when we drew 2-2 at Nene Park. We have also been paired in the FA Cup in 2000/01 and the LDV Vans Trophy in 2003/04, winning both.

Prior to this, we played both Rushden and

Irthlingborough Diamonds during our formative years in Victorian and Edwardian

RECENT HISTORY

It was 1992 when Irthingborough Diamonds and Rushden Town merged to form to Rushden & Diamonds.

Diamonds climbed the pyramid within years of their inception, firstly winning the Southern League Division One Midlands title

After a season in the Southern League Premier, the club were soon on the move again when winning the title the following season earning the club a place among the non-league elite.

The ambition of Chairman at the time Max

Griggs soon saw the success at Nene Park continue when they won the Conference title in 2000/01 earning promotion to the Football League for the first time in the club's

Diamonds' were not intent on staying up in Division 2 and in their first season in the League they came close to another promotion but lost to Cheltenham Town in the Play-Off Final at the Millennium

However the Nene Park faithful didn't have long to wait to get over the heartache as the following campaign in 2002/03 they pipped Hartlepool United to the Division 3 title.


Despite hopes of a further promotion the Diamonds' couldn't adapt to the step-up to the League's third tier and were subsequently relegated back to Division 3 after one season

And worse was to follow when the club slid out of the Football League the following season leaving them to face Conference football again for the first time since leaving the division four years previous.

Since heading back into non-league t h e Diamonds have finished 12th, 15th and 11th in their last three campaigns.



After three wins on the bounce, including victories away at Chester and Workington understandably confidence is high at Nene Park but Stone is realistic about the task facing them at Kenilworth Road:"We've had our eye on the Luton fixture for some while and there is some genuine excitement amongst the players.

"We know that they are a great football club, with tremendous support and hopefully we'll thrive in that atmosphere and we'll go there looking to continue our good

THE DIAMONDS' ASSISTANT MANAGER EXPECTS A TOUGH GAME THIS AFTERNOON

"We should be full of confidence, we've had three good wins but we know that Luton were strong favourites pre season and remain right up in that pack."

I have been to watch them twice in the last month, I saw them play York City and Crawley Town and I can see they are a very strong team. I think maybe their biggest challenge has been the expectations around the club, having dropped into the Conference.

People expected them to be top of the league and bounce straight back up but possiblye they have found things slightly more difficult than they would have imagined.

"We'll be looking to go there in a positive frame of mind and be looking to come back with something in our pocket.

"Oxford United may have already picked up 40 points from just 17 games and opened up quite a lead from the chasing pack the rest of the table is still pretty compact with just six points separating sixth position to 14th place and although there are still plenty of points still to play for this weekend could make things a bit clearer:

"There are some interesting games on Saturday - Mansfield have Histon, Crawley play York and Kettering are playing Stevenage, a lot of those top eight to 10 sides are actually playing each other so whichever teams grasps the chance and gets the right result could find themselves catapulted right up there."

TI-IEMANAGER

JUSTIN EDINBURGH

As a player Edinburgh started his career with Southend United before moving to Tottenham Hostpur in 1990 for £150,000.

A defender by trade he made over 200 appearances for Spurs in a 12 year period that saw him win the FA Cup in 1991 and the League Cup two years later.

Portsmouth was his next port of call before dipping into non-league football with Billericay Town going onto become the Essex outfit's Player-Manager.

In January 2006 he left New Lodge to take over the reigns at Fisher Athletic where he

guided the Fish to a third place finish in the Isthmian League that eventually saw the London outfit promoted via the Play-Offs.

After leaving Fisher by mutual consent in November 2006 he became Assistant Manager at Grays Athletic going to become first team boss at the Recreation

Edinburgh then left the Blues by mutual consent in February 2008 and following a brief scouting job with Nottingham Forest he joined Rushden & Diamonds as Assistant Manager to Garry Hill in October 2008.

Then, following Hill's departure, Edinburgh took over as Caretaker Manager before landing the job permanently at Nene Park in April 2009

CCALKEEPERS

Dale Roberts

Former Nottingham Forest stopper who signed a two-year deal for the Diamonds in January 2009 after two successful loan spells. Roberts initially signed on-loan from Forest in the 2007/08 season, making 19 appearances, including the Setanta Shield Final, before returning to the City Ground as that season drew to a dose. In the 2008/09 season Roberts signed on loan again in October 2008. His impressive performances during the 2008/09 season included an appearance for the England C team in their 4-0 victory over Malta. His performances also won him the Rushden & Diamonds Travel Club Player of the Season award.

Nathan Abbey

A familiar name to Hatters fans, Abbey was signed by the Diamonds in mid-September 2009 following his release by MK Dons. He started his career at Kenilworth Road before joining Chesterfield in 2001. He has also played for Northampton Town, Stevenage Borough, St Albans City, Hayes, Boston United and Bristol City.

DEFENDERS

Curtis Osano

Kenvan-born defender Osano signed for the Diamonds on a two-year contract, following his release by the Championship side Reading at the start of the 2008/09 season. Osano spent the 2007/08 season at Nene Park on work experience after joining Reading's Academy as a schoolboy. He had previous spells at Aldershot Town in October 2006 and Woking in January 2007. He showed his flexibility by moving to a role in the centre of defence for a period in the middle of the season, before reverting to his right back role. His performances won him the Diamonds Supporters' Player of the Season award, and the Diamond Minors' Player of the Season award.



CURTIS OSANO

Kurt Robinson

Another player who signed for the Diamonds following a successful loan spell. Robinson joined on a permanent basis prior to the start of the 2009/10 season from lpswich Town. An initial one month loan in January 2009 was extended for the remainder of the season, and when he was released by Ipswich at the end of the season, Diamonds boss Justin Edinburgh wasted no time in snapping the defender up in May 2009. He made his Diamonds debut in the FA Trophy game at Torquay United on 10th January 2009 before making his league debut in the Blue Square Premier the following weekend in the 1-0 defeat by Ebbsfleet United.

Jamie Stuart

Experienced defender who was announced as the Diamonds' Captain following his arrival at Nene Park in June 2009. The former England Under 21 international started his career with Charlton Athletic and later went onto to play for Millwall, Bury, Southend and Hornchurch. From Hornchurch he moved to Gravs Athletic where he spent recent years as the club's captain and also having a spell as joint-Assistant Manager of the Blues early in 2009.

Simon Downer

Former Leyton Orient defender with a wealth of non-league experience who signed for the Diamonds at the beginning of 2009, from Sutton United. Downer started his career at Brisbane Road where he stayed between 1998 and 2004 before moving to Weymouth for the 2005/06 season, he then moved to Grays in 2006 and then joined Wivenhoe two years later. He made his Diamonds debut in the 1-1 draw with Stevenage Borough on New Year's Day 2009 and after impressing during the remainder of the 2008/09 season, he signed a one-year deal with the club at the end of May.

Michael Corcoran

Versatile Northern Irish youth international who signed for the Diamonds midway through the 2007/08 season from Oxford United. Corcoran started his career at Cardiff City, working up through the youth system before moving to Oxford, initially on loan, and then signing permanently at the Kassam Stadium in May 2007. During the 2008/09 season Michael played 38 times for the Diamonds in the League, including seven as substitute. He played in midfield early on in the season before reverting to full back, playing both left and right back, as well as enjoying a spell at centre back.

Young defender who joined Diamonds from Boston United in July 2007 having previously been with Crewe Alexandra as a trainee Higgins was chosen as the Diamonds' Young Player of the Season for 2008/09, and his

performances were rewarded when he was offered a professional contract to keep him with the club

MIDIFIEDDERS

Max Porter

Midfielder who signed from League 2 side Barnet in May 2009 on a one-year contract to become Justin Edinburgh's first summer signing. Porter started his career with Southend United, later moving to Cambridge United and then Bishop's Stortford. At Underhill he made 63 appearances and scored twice in two seasons with the Bees where he also featured at right-back.


Rob Wolleaston

Midfielder who joined Rushden from fellow Blue Square Premier rivals Cambridge United on a two-year deal for an undisclosed fee prior to the start of the 2008/09 season. Rob began his career at Chelsea and joined the U's from Oxford United, making over 90 appearances, including scoring both the goals in the second leg of the Blue Square Premier Play-Off Semi-Final against Burton Albion which took his side to Wembley.

He made his debut by appearing as a substitute for the Diamonds in their 1-0 opening day victory over Eastbourne Borough in August 2008 and scored his first goal for the club in the Diamonds 1-0 victory over Burton Albion just a month later. After helping Yeovil to promotion to League 1, Paul signed for Levton Orient where he played over 70 games, before moving to Grays at the start of the 2009/10 season.

Aaron O'Connor

Striker who signed for the Diamonds from Mansfield Town in June. O'Connor started his career at Ilkeston Town, having spells at Scunthorpe and Nuneaton Borough before returning to Ilkeston. Aaron played for Gresley Rovers between 2004 and 2007 where he played 127 games and scored 80 goals earning him the Player's Player of the Year, Manager's Player of the Year and Supporter's Player of the Year awards two years running. In 2006, O'Connor nearly signed for Rushden & Diamonds, under Manager Paul Hart at the time. He played in pre-season friendlies, however he returned to Gresley, later moving to Grays Athletic, where he played under Justin Edinburgh. O'Connor signed for Mansfield in 2008, playing 39 games and scoring eight goals before being reunited with Edinburgh at Nene Park this summer.

Craig Farrell

Striker who joined the Diamonds in the summer from York City in a deal that saw Michael Rankine move in the opposite direction. Farrell started his career as a junior with Middlesbrough and later Leeds United, before moving to Carlisle after a loan move was made permanent. After scoring 20 goals in 80 appearances for the Cumbrians he signed for Exeter City before moving to York.

Lee Tomlin

Following his release from the Leicester City youth scheme Tomlin signed at Nene Park in 2005 and in October that year he made Diamonds history as the Club's youngest ever player when he came on as a substitute in an away game at Wycombe Wanderers. After a number

of substitute appearances he made his full debut for the club at Nene Park in the First Round FA Cup Replay against Halifax Town in November 2005, and his full league debut against Peterborough United while he was still aged 16. Capable of playing across midfield and in attack, Tomlin also became the club's youngster ever goalscorer. Having played in a wide-right role in midfield he was given a more conventional striking role when Justin Edinburgh took charge. His efforts and commitment meant that he also won the Players' Player of the Season award for that season.

Sam Smith

After just over a year in the youth ranks at Nene Park, Sam Smith was rewarded with a place in the first team squad in spring 2008. He had joined the club early in 2007 after being spotted playing by ex-Diamonds goalkeeper Shoemake, playing for Corby Town Under-18s. Sam made his league debut with a substitute appearance against Cambridge United on 8th April 2008, then went on to make his first League start against Oxford United later that month, and scored his debut goal in the final game of the season against Aldershot. He was then offered and signed a contract, prior to the start of the 2008/09 season, until the end of the 2010/11 season.

Cliff Akurang Former Luton trainee Akurang joined Rushden & Diamonds on a season long loan from Barnet in July 2009. The forward started his career with Chesham United, later playing for Thurrock, Heybridge Swifts, Dagenham & Redbridge (in the season they won the Conference), Histon, Weymouth (on loan) and Barnet.

Ten sides in the Blue Square Premier bit the dust as their participation in the FA Cup ended at the fourth qualifying round stage.

Four all-Conference ties meant that a quartet of sides would be guaranteed to fall by the wayside.

That fate meant Crawley, Chester, Altrincham and Grays are now left with free a Saturday a week today following defeats to AFC Wimbledon, Barrow, Altrincham and the Hatters respectively.

There were six BSP sides that were knocked out of the competition with defeats to sides below them in the pyramid.

The biggest shock of the round was Ryman Premier League Tooting & Mitcham United's pulsating 4-3 extra-time win over Eastbourne Borough in a replay following a 3-3 draw at Priory Lane.

Three sides from Blue Square North edged out top division opposition with Fleetwood Town overcoming Kidderminster Harriers after a replay while there were home victories for Hinckley United over Histon and

Ilkeston Town who beat Tamworth. There was also joy for sides from the Blue Square South as Staines Town and Bromley eliminated struggling Hayes & Yeading and Ebbsfleet United with 1-0 and 3-0 wins respectively.

Conference leaders Oxford needed two goals in the second half in their tie against Blue Square South side Thurrock at the Kassam Stadium while second place Kettering Town needed a replay to get past Redditch United.

Fellow promotion chasers Stevenage Borough needed a last-gasp Peter Vincenti goal to earn their place in the hat for the first round proper as Graham Westley's side came from a goal down to beat Chelmsford City.

Another late goal earned Dean Saunders' Wrexham their place in the next round with a Wes Baynes strike at Unibond League Division One North side FC Halifax Town at the Shav.

Other Blue Square Premier sides that made it through against lower league opposition included Salisbury City who got past Farnborough after a replay with a 4-2 victory at the Raymond McEnhill Stadium that included a hat-trick from striker Matt Tubbs.

Cambridge United came from a goal behind to see off Unibond League Division One South side Lincoln United 3-1 at Ashby Avenue.

Gateshead beat Southport at the International Stadium with a comfortable 3-0 win while the Tynesiders' fellow BSP relegation rivals Forest Green earned a 2-1 victory at Mangotsfield United.

Today's visitors Rushden & Diamonds came back from their long journey to Workington with a 3-0 victory while York – our last visitors in the league at Kenilworth Road – eased by Bedworth United at KitKat Crescent

Three sides from the division were rewarded with ties against League 1 opposition.

Oxford host Yeovil, Gateshead welcome last season's League 2 champions Brentford while Kettering make the long journey to Hartlepool.

HANE BALL SILE

After netting the opening goal against Grays, Shane Blackett is hoping the victory will be the start of a long run in the FA Cup for the club and, personally, he's hoping he can crack on with cementing himself in the first team.

The left-footed defender opened his Hatters' account in the 10th minute of the match last weekend after finding himself in the right place at the right time to turn home George Pilkington's parried effort.

The pair picked to keep goals out at the other end, have both found themselves in positions already this campaign where they are as much of a threat in the opposition's penalty area as any other player in Luton colours, But the local lad was keen to play down the goal, for a few seconds at least.

He said: "It was a simple tap-in; I just played it well and got something on the end of it. I'm back now and getting the goal was delightful.

"It was a great time to score. It has always been a boyhood dream of mine to score at Kenilworth Road, so I'm delighted about that, no matter how it went it

"I had a lot of support in the crowd, all of the family were there, as were some friends and it was nice to score in front of them; hopefully it's the first of many, I want to get some more under my belt this season to help us push on.

"I'm pleased to get back in the team because I've had a bout of flu lately which forced me out of the squad."

Games, just as goals, are something the



defender admits he'll readily take, having appeared as many times from the bench as he started since his summer move from Peterborough United.

With plenty of defenders at Town's disposable, forcing your way into, and staying, in the team is a challenge so having the advantage of being flexible enough to fill two of available positions is something he hopes will strengthen his cause of becoming a regular in the side.

"I've been used quite a lot at left-back this year," he says.

"I believe my best position is centre-half because I feel more comfortable there but I'm happy to do the job for the team as a left-back after all it's a team game at the end of the day.

"Half-way through the second half I felt a bit leggy but we had a good cushion by then and I managed to finish the 90 minutes and felt good. I just want to build up now for next week, and get another 90 minutes.

"I wanted to stay on, I always want to stay on because you never know it could be your last time on the football pitch. The legs felt a bit achy but you get through it mentally. I suffered a bit that night but it's fine. It's all worth it."

The Town's win last week earned them the opportunity to once again pit their wits against Football League opposition when Rochdale come to Kenilworth Road next Saturday in the first round proper and Blackett was pleased to come off the pitch on the back of a job well done.

He added: "I think it could've been more comfortable. In the first half we had a lot of good chances but the lads played well and at the end of the day, we turned in a professional performance.

"In the second half I don't think they had many chances, they might've had two or three opportunities but we created a lot more than them, and could have scored five or six.

"Whenever a team goes a couple of goals up it always looks like they take the foot off the gas but we like to keep going, get the goals and give the young lads confidence. Taylor Nathaniel came in and did really well on left-wing, Ryan Charles is improving every day in training; he's going to be a real handful.


"That's four wins out of five now, we're still unbeaten. You can see how we're playing on the pitch, we're getting the ball down and the lads are clicking really well so long may it continue.


With the Hatters side against Julian Dicks' side showing five changes following the draw with York the result against the Blues side further highlighted the strength in-depth at the club.

At last Luton Manager Dally Duncan was seeing his plans come to fruition.

His team of youth and experience had finally come good, after a couple of seasons of dicing with relegation, and had finished third in the old Division Two in 1952/53 in the days when only the top two sides were promoted.

In an attempt to go one better the Club's board decided to loosen the purse strings and paid out £9,500 on free-scoring Johnny Downie from Manchester United and £12,000 to Everton for scheming inside-forward George Cummins.

DAYSPAST

31ST OCTOBER 1953 . BRISTOL ROVERS 3 - 3 LUTON TOWN

This was an astounding amount of money for the Hatters to pay out at the time.

The Town started off the new season without three influential players – all injured.

Skipper Syd Owen, leading goalscorer Jesse Pye and goalscoring winger Bert Mitchell would all be sorely missed as the campaign got off to a slow start.

Downie, however, became an instant hero, bagging a hat-trick in the opening game at home to newly promoted Oldham, but only a point gained in a 4-4 draw was a major disappointment.

It was not until the sixth game of the campaign that the Hatters first tasted victory but a 2-0 home win over Swansea was followed by defeats at Birmingham and Rotherham in quick succession

The low point in the season came in early October when Fulham won 2-1 at

Kenilworth Road leaving the Town only two points off a relegation spot.

Although under no obligation, it was accepted at the time that if a player was called-up for international duty he would be released.

The Hatters had readily released fullback pairing Seamus Dunne and Bud Aherne to play for the Republic of Ireland while Fulham had refused a similar request to let Robin Lawler travel.

The Cottagers were quite within their rights but it caused a few mutterings of discontent at Kenilworth Road especially as two points were dropped!

The following midweek the Town became the 22nd League club to switch on floodlights, winning 7-4 in a friendly against Turkish side Fenerbahce and from then on the season appeared to turn for the better.

Three successive wins, at home to Hull and Lincoln and away at Notts County prefaced the Town's first trip to Bristol Rovers since 1937 and a confident Hatters team, which included the fit

again Pye and Mitchell, looked to continue their rise up the table.

Unfortunately, Owen had suffered a fractured little toe in the previous game and so his place at centre-half went to Les Hall, making his first appearance since the opening day draw with Oldham.

On a wet day a crowd of 20,021 gathered on the Eastville terraces to see Pye, back to his best, threaten the Rovers goal with two fierce shots in the opening minutes and also appeal for penalty when he went headlong in the area after a tackle from Pirates centrehalf Ray Warren.

Despite this early pressure it was the hosts who took the lead when their policy of using their wingers George Petherbridge and Josser Watling bore fruit.

It was from a centre that centreforward Geoff Bradford headed past Bernard Streten in the Luton goal on 23 minutes. Not to be outdone, the Town levelled four minutes later when Pye fired in a shot from an impossible angle which passed through the legs of Downie and beyond the unsighted Pirates goalkeeper John Anderson for his first goal of the season.

The play continued end-to-end with Bradford forcing a miraculous save from Streten and Bob Morton going close just as the half-time whistle sounded.

The Hatters were quickest out of the blocks in the second period and it was Pye who put the away side ahead with a bullet header from a Mitchell cross after 55 minutes.

Confidence was now flowing through the side and it therefore came as a great shock when Rovers levelled on the hour with an unstoppable Bradford shot from the edge of the area which left Streten clutching at thin air.

The game was now becoming the

Bradford and Pye show with both players straining to hit hat-tricks on the greasy surface and it was the former who succeeded with 10 minutes left when he got the better of Hall to hammer the ball past Streten from close range.

Never giving up, the Town continued to press and were rewarded with an equaliser in the 87th minute when Mitchell blasted home through a crowd of players.

Even then there were chances at both ends before the referee brought the breathless contest to a close.




We will update supporters via lutontown.co.uk, through the matchday programme and in the local press when we have exact delivery dates.

UNDER18sUPDATE

WITH MARTIN PRICKETT



One of the biggest challenges when faced with a new group of players is trying to find out what makes them tick, how to motivate them, who you can trust to just get on with it and those who you need to keep on top of constantly.

Now I finally know my characters!

This is important as we try to build the future professionals of Luton Town, picking out the strengths in each player and trying to make them even better.

I believe in finding what players do well and base each development plan around

Of course weaknesses need to be worked upon so they are not found out in matches. After all I'm sure Paul Scholes hasn't spent a lot of his development time on defending one versus ones.

He has worked on finishing, movement, range of passing and has done just enough to get by on the defensive side of the game - and that is where we are heading.

To be a professional footballer you have to be exceptional at one of the following: stopping goals, creating goal or scoring goals. Therefore if we have a good defender at Under 17 level we need to make sure he is an exceptional defender but then be able to create as well.

Becoming a young professional is a learning process and I have had to learn about the players along the way

We have changed our playing shape three times to try and suit personnel, adapted to the way we play to be more expansive and expressive and challenged each other to give nothing less than their best each day.







The Town Ladies returned to FA Northern Premier League action having previously been given special dispensation by the Football Association to postpone their last fixture due to a horrendous injury list.

The lack of a loan system in ladies' football meant that we were without a recognised goalkeeper but the extra week gave 17-year-old Sian Hall sufficient opportunity to recover from a long term ankle injury to make her first team debut.

The injury jinx struck again before the game though when striker Candice Davies was ruled out with a back problem as Luton travelled to Derby County for what was a real six pointer.

The game was just 16 minutes old when a superb passing move ended with Amy Summerfield finding Micky Taylor on the edge of the box.

Her first touch took her away from the Derby defender and she fired the ball past the advancing goalkeeper to give Town a 1-0 lead. However, whilst Taylor was scoring her first goal of the season, she pulled her hamstring and had to be replaced.

Hall then made an outstanding double save pushing a shot one handed onto the post and saving with the follow up shot with her feet to maintain the lead.

After half-an-hour the almost unthinkable happened as a Derby defender deflected a misdirected Rebecca Kane pass into the path of Laveena Betts and she coolly finished to give Luton a 2-0 lead.

County were unable to respond and never really got a foothold until the last two minutes of the game when the Hatters were effectively reduced to 10 players having used all their substitutes after Nicola Henman got a knock on the ankle and then became a virtual passenger.

In the 88th minute a cross shot was deflected in at the far post by an alert Rams' striker and it almost seemed inevitable as the game moved into injury time that all was not yet over.

An unmarked Derby player then converted at the far post to equalise and it could have got worse for Town as, during six minutes of injury time, another County effort flew back off the post to safety.

A disappointed Dave Baker said: "Although we gained an away point it feels like we lost as we were again so close to taking all three points.

"Our overall fitness together with players not quite 100% fit is taking its toll

"At Premier League level there is no hiding place and any weakness is quickly seized upon and punished.

"A win here would have brought us to within four points of Derby but now we have to do it all again and must get something from our next two matches at home to Curzon Ashton and Newcastle United."

WHAT'S THE GROUND LIKE?

Although Grays have played at the Recreation Ground since 1906, the ground itself is fairly new having been completely re-developed in recent years.

WHAT'S IT LIKE FOR LUTON FANS?



We're at home again next Saturday after the draw for the FA Cup First Round pitted us against League 2 Rochdale here at Kenilworth Road.

Keith Hill's side are no strangers after meeting them twice in the league last season but while we now find ourselves in the Blue Square Premier, Dale have continued where they left off last season.

The Spotland outfit have reached the Play-Offs for the last two seasons but after one trip to Wembley where they suffered defeat at the hands of Stockport County, they then lost out to Gillingham in the Semi-Finals last season and this year Hill and the Dale faithful are hoping to go one better and finally escape the bottom tier of the Football League.

They are the division's longest serving club with this their 36th season at that level but currently sit third in the table, just five points behind leaders Bournemouth, and recently took 19 points from 24 available before losing to Accrington Stanley last weekend.

By the time the two sides met at

Kenilworth Road last season Rochdale were looking for the double after securing a 2-0 win at Spotland in November. Lee Thorpe opened the scoring with just two minutes on the clock before Adam Le Fondre doubled the lead from the penalty spot after lan Roper bought down Rory McArdle.

Neither goalscorer will be on show next weekend after Thorpe moved to Darlington on a free transfer in the summer, while Adam Le Fondre signed for League 2 rivals Rotherham in August.

Tom Craddock opened the scoring at Kenilworth Road in the return match in April, when he converted a penalty, after Chris Martin was fouled by McArdle. Adam Rundle earned the visitors a point though when he equalised on 56 minutes.

Dale have won three, drawn two and lost just twice away from home this season, those defeats coming at Rotherham and Burton, while they have beaten Northampton, Darlington and Grimsby.
