




While we are all striving for success we need your backing more than ever. Make no mistake - there will be disappointments along the way. Take last Saturday's defeat for example.

It will also be Richard Money's first game in charge after he watched the Rushden game from the stands with chief scout Gary Brabin.


The manager will bring his own ideas and no doubt a different way of playing and doing things so today promises to be the start of an interesting period for

RECENT HISTORY

The recent history of today's visitors is a remarkable one given that Rochdale have spent the entire last 35 years in what today is known as League 2 since their relegation from the old Division

In more recent times the Dale have come close to finally breaking the run with two appearances in the end-ofseason Play-Offs and with the season reaching its climax, the Spotland faithful will hope the Play-Off lottery is kinder to them than in previous

In 2001/02 they missed out after a semi-final defeat to Rushden and Diamonds but in May 2008 they went one stage further and reached the final but they lost to Stockport County at Wembley after seeing off Darlington.

Hill's side were at the top end of the League Two promotion hunt again last season but following a sixth-place finish they succumbed to eventual Play-Off winners Gillingham at the semi-final stage.

After being released by Steve Parkin in the summer of 2001, Keith moved south for a brief spell at Cheltenham, before ending his playing career with spells at Wrexham and Morecambe

Keith's work in guiding Dale from the relegation places to the top half of League Two was rewarded with a three-year contract towards the end of April 2007. He showed the club how wise a decision this was by managing Dale to the League Two Play-Off Final at Wembley in 2008.

Twelve months later Keith again took Dale


to the play-offs where they lost 2-1 on aggregate to Gillingham at the semi-final

On the back of a tremendous 4-0 win away at Bournemouth in League 2 Rochdale Manager Keith Hill brings his side to Kenilworth Road knowing that the FA Cup First Round match will be a totally different challenge to the one his side faced a week earlier.

Speaking to the Rochdale Observer Hill spoke about his teams fantastic high-flying result against Bournemouth:

"It was certainly one of the best results we've had during my time in charge when you consider the context of the game - the injury problems we had going into an away game against the top of the table."

The side Luton face this afternoon. compared to the one Rochdale put out last week, may look a little

different with Hill forced to shuffle his hand due injuries and loan players not being available.

Those circumstances will though present the opportunity for some of Rochdale's younger and fringe players to impress in the FA Cup:

"We do not have permission to play any of the loan players and it's been confirmed they will not be available to us this weekend," he explained.

"In terms of goalkeeping alone that poses big problems because we are without Kenny Arthur and Matty Edwards, while we cannot use Josh

"On the positive side, it does represent an opportunity for our youth team goalkeeper, Danny Taberner.

"The likes of Adam Rundle, Kallum Higginbotham and Matt Flynn are also available and ready and waiting.

"Marcus Holness has been terrific for us this season and was unlucky to miss out on a starting place at Bournemouth last weekend, but he is integral to what we are doing."

The Rochdale boss expects his side to continue their good form despite the injuries to his squad and praises the whole club efforts so far this season from top to bottom:

"When a team has been winning as we have, the winning mentality spreads throughout the squad.

"The dynamics we have at the club this year are special and everyone in and around the squad is included in that."



KENNY ARTHUR

KENNY ARTHUR

Dale Manager Keith Hill swooped to bring Kenny in from Accrington Stanley in June 2009 when he heard the experienced goalkeeper had turned down new terms at the Crown Ground. The 30-year old had just completed his second season with Stanley, but jumped at the chance to join Dale who were without a goalkeeper after Sam Russell and James Spencer were both released. Kenny joined Partick Thistle from Possil YMCA in June 1997 and over the next ten years he was a regular for the Firhill side where he clocked-up 290 senior appearances for the Jags before deciding to try his luck in England.

MATTY FOWARDS

Young stopper who was signed from Leeds United in June 2009 as cover for Kenny Arthur.

DIEFENDERS

SCOTT WISEMAN

Hull-born Scott moved to Spotland from Darlington in the summer of 2008 having played for the Quakers in the two Play-Off Semi-Final matches against Dale. Also able to play on the right side of midfield, Scott started his career with Hull, where he had been since the age of six. He had loan spells at Boston and Rotherham during his time with the Tigers, before moving to Darlington in May 2007.

TOM KENNEDY

Nephew of ex-Liverpool left-back Alan Kennedy, Tom arrived at Spotland from Bury in June 2007 after turning down the offer of a new contract at Gigg Lane. The 24-year old progressed through Bury's youth system to make his full debut against Carlisle on Boxing Day 2003. He went on to play over 150 times for the Shakers and was their joint top scorer in the 2005/06 campaign with several strikes from the penalty spot.

NATHAN STANTON

After coming through the ranks at Scunthorpe United Nathan joined Dale from Glandford Park in July 2006, initially signing a 12-month contract with the club. However, he has since committed himself to staying at Spotland until the summer of 2010. Nathan made his 100th appearance for Dale in the 4-2 win at Aldershot in January 2009, although it wasn't an entirely happy occasion as he was sent-off in the second half! In October 2009, in Dale's 1-0 defeat at Burton, Nathan made his 400th career appearance.

RORY McARDLE

Northern Ireland under-21 international who signed from Sheffield Wednesday in 2007 after a successful loan spell. The defender had made just two substitute appearances for the Owls, but he did feature 20 times for Dale in 2005/06, scoring in a 3-1 win at Macclesfield. He has since gone on to make almost 150 senior appearances for the club.

CHRIS BROWN

Promising young centre-back who has been added to the first team squad this season after impressing in the reserves. He was on the bench for the final league match of last term against Gillingham and made his senior bow as a late substitute in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy tie at home to Bradford in September 2009.

MIDIFIEDLERS

SIMON WHALEY

Winger who joined Dale on an emergency loan deal from Norwich in September as Keith Hill boosted a squad that had suffered with injury problems. The 24-year old started his career as a trainee at Bury and spent three-and-a-half seasons in their first team before moving to Preston for £250,000 in January 2006. He was a regular in the North End side up to the end of last season when then-Norwich manager Bryan Gunn stepped in and took him to Carrow Road. Simon started this term in the Canaries' team, but a change of manager saw him fall out of favour and be made available for a loan move.

CIARAN TONER


Northern Ireland international who became

Dale's first signing in the summer of 2008 when he was brought in on a free transfer from Grimsby. He has since been rewarded for a good first season at Spotland with another 12-month contract. Toner started as a trainee at Tottenham, but got his first taste of league action in a loan spell with Peterborough in the 2001/02 campaign. A further loan period at Bristol Rovers followed, before Ciaran linked up with Levton Orient in May 2002. After two seasons at Brisbane Road, Ciaran appeared for Lincoln and Cambridge (loan), prior to ioining Grimsby in the summer of 2005.


IOF THOMPSON

Young midfielder who was given his Dale debut the final home game of the 2005/06 season against Carlisle United. Joe went on to make a handful of starts and further substitute appearances during the following campaign, as well as earning national recognition when he was named League Two Apprentice of the Year at the Football League's annual awards' ceremony. Joe scored his first goal for Dale with a fine header against Darlington in the first game of 2008. However, this was eclipsed in January 2009 when he hit a 17-minute first half hat-trick in the 4-2 win at Aldershot.

Dale's all-time record appearance maker after playing his 346th game for the dub at Mansfield in March 2008. Typically, he marked the occasion with two goals as Dale romped to a 4-0 win at Field Mill. Then, on the opening day of the 2008/09 season at Grimsby, Gary broke the club's league appearance record when he played his 318th Football League game for Dale, passing Graham Smith's record that had

stood for 34 years. Jones joined Rochdale on a free transfer from Barnsley in February 2004 having completed a three-month loan spell at Spotland. This move came just over two years after he left Dale for the Oakwell

ADAM RUNDLE

Pacy left-winger who joined Dale in June 2006 after being released by Mansfield after he had been at Field Mill for 18 months having returned to England following a spell with Dublin City. Adam started his career with Darlington, but was restricted to mainly substitute appearances during his time with the Ouakers. He moved on to Carlisle in January 2003 and one of his best moments in a Cumbrians' shirt came the following October when he scored a 30vard screamer against Dale in an LDV Vans Trophy tie. Adam's first season at Spotland was split into two distinct halves; he struggled to make an impact under Steve Parkin, but excelled when Keith Hill took over as manager. Finishing the campaign with five goals from the wing, Adam signed a new contract at Spotland during the summer of 2007, one which has since been extended to the end of the 2009/10 season

JASON KENNEDY

Midfielder who signed for Dale after experiencing highs and lows against the Spotland outfit. In May 2008 he opened the scoring for Darlington in the first leg of Dale's Play-Off semi-final meeting with a spectacular strike at the

Darlington Arena. However, a week later he was the only Quakers player to miss in the penalty shoot-out as Dale booked their place at Wembley. When the teams met again at Spotland in April 2009, Jason wowed the watching Sky TV viewers with another long-range effort to set Darlo on the way to a 2-0 win.

STEINISTS

CHRIS DAGNALL

A product of the Tranmere Rovers youth system, Chris joined Rochdale for £25,000 during the January 2006 transfer window and marked his second start for the club with the opening goal in a 3-1 win at Torquay United. After a slow start to his first full season at Spotland, Chris finished the campaign with 18 goals to his name. Chris made a good start to 2007/08 with three goals in the first month, before suffering a knee injury that kept him out of the team until Easter Monday. Remarkably, he came off the bench that day to score a hat-trick in nine minutes in the 4-1 home win over Rotherham. The club were so pleased with Chris's progress that they rewarded him with a contract extension that will keep him at Spotland until the summer of 2010.

SCOTT SPENCER

Striker who joined Dale on non-contract terms in the first week of the 2009/10 season. Originally a scholar with Oldham, the 20-year old joined Everton in 2006, but was limited to playing for their youth and reserve teams. He had a loan spell at Macclesfield in the 2007/08 campaign, making just three appearances.

MARC MANGA

Cameroonian striker who signed noncontract terms at Spotland in October 2009 after impressing Keith Hill in reserve matches during a trial period. The 21year old had been on trial at Hereford during the summer and was with French side Bordeaux earlier in his career. He made his debut for Dale as a late substitute in their 2-0 win at Grimsby.

KALLUM HIGGINBOTHAM

Young striker who arrived at Spotland in June 2007 after being released two years into his YTS contract at Oldham. The 20year old scored a hat-trick against Dale for the Latics in the Lancashire FA Youth Cup Final just before his departure from Boundary Park. Kallum impressed so much in his first season in the first team that the club gave him an extended

contract that will run until 2010. He celebrated by scoring Dale's first goal in their 2-1 win at Accrington just before Christmas. In November 2008 he spent a month on loan at Accrington, but returned to Spotland at Christmas time, ironically scoring against Stanley in the first game of 2009.

CHRIS O'GRADY

Chris joined Dale on Joan from Oldham in August 2009 in a deal that will see him stay at Spotland until the end of December. The 23-year old started his career as a trainee at Leicester, but struggled to make an impact with the Foxes, who loaned him out to Notts County and Rushden & Diamonds during his time at the Walkers Stadium. In January 2007 Chris joined Rotherham for £65,000, but he was on the move again 18 months later to Oldham. However, he found his chances limited at Boundary Park and Latics sent him out on loan three times last season to Bury, Bradford and Stockport.

WILL BUCKLEY

Young forward who made his debut for Rochdale as a second half substitute in the 4-2 home defeat by Hereford in February 2008. He finished the campaign as a late substitute in Dale's play-off final defeat by Stockport at Wembley. After several impressive performances in preseason, Will signed a contract tying him to the dub until the summer of 2010. He went on to score his first career goal in the 2-2 draw at Rotherham in mid-September and finished the campaign as second-top scorer with 11 strikes.


GIRLS GO TO REGIONALS.



WE WELCOME RICHARD MONEY AND GARY BRABIN





The Hatters were thrilled to unveil Richard Money as the successor to Mick Harford the Friday before last as well as appointing former Cambridge United manager as chief scout.

With the Town looking to bounce back to the Football League at the first attempt the club plumped for the former Walsall boss after sifting through over 60 CVs.

After both new appointments watched last Saturday's 2-0 defeat to Rushden and Diamonds, Money takes charge of the Hatters for the first time this afternoon against Rochdale looking to earn a place in the second round of the FA Cup.

On the arrival of the new duo, managing director Gary Sweet said: "We're delighted.

"We fully stand behind our vision for the Club, and to have the knowledge, experience and achievements of these two men is fantastic for Luton Town, Luton, and Bedfordshire.

"The fact that these guys have agreed

to come and be part of that vision shows what we can have if we get behind them."

"Along with Alan Neilson we have combined experiences of the league we are in, the league above and all the way to the top.

"We already know what the players are capable of. Everyone has their part to play so now we have to push on and focus on that top spot.

"We have the team to do that in all departments now and we have two thirds of the season left. There's a lot of football to be played yet and we know what we want.

"We, as a team, decided on our vision for the future. That's the views of quite a few people as 2020 is not just about one or two people. We are all common in our emotions for the dub so we came to a swift and detailed agreement.

"However, good and appropriate people do not grow on trees and it was right to advertise properly and then do the serious applicants the professionalism of proper consideration.

"We have said we were delighted by the quality of applicants, so a shortlist was discussed by the board and investors.

"Where appropriate we discretely sought advice from trusted colleagues and friends in the game. The hard part was the final shortlist as the competition was fierce.

"With the full support of the investors, we decided to make offers to two candidates. We thank Newcastle United for their help in allowing Richard to join us and lead the attack on that top spot - that was a magnanimous decision by their Chairman, Mike Ashley.

"Gary's experience in this league is huge but led to heartbreak in last season's final by coming so close, so he will help us in ensuring he is part of the celebrations at the end of this season!"

IN PROFILE

Lowestoft-born Richard became the Hatters' 24th post-war permanent manager to succeed Mick Harford.

Dubbed "Dicky Dosh" by Walsall fans after he guided the Saddlers to the League 2 title in 2006/07, Richard played 49 times during his seasonlong stay at Kenilworth Road in 1982/83.

He scored once – in a 2-2 draw at Rotherham – and made his final appearance in a Luton shirt at Old Trafford as the Town went down 3-0 to Manchester United just days before the famous victory at Maine Road which kept the Town in the top-flight.

Richard cut his managerial teeth at Scunthorpe United – who he also served as a player, before going continuing his education overseas with two clubs in Sweden.

After a brief stint in Australia it was to the Bescot where he enjoyed his most successful spell before joining Newcastle United as academy director prior to returning to Bedfordshire.

The 54-year-old, who put pen to paper on a two-and-half year deal, is confident he can bring the good times back to Kenilworth Road but admitted this season's test of escaping the Blue Square Premier is going to be a tough challenge.

"The biggest step in this club's progression is getting out of this league," Money exclusively told Talk of the Town.

"I read the mission statement from the board in the business plan and I think a return to the Championship by the year 2020 is a genuine possibility.

"I'm sure it's been said before but I will say it again. Doncaster Rovers won this league in 2003 and I saw them play at St James Park last week against Newcastle and should have won.

"There is no reason why this club can't follow suit but it won't be easy."

Money, who will be remembered by supporters as a cultured right-back who signed for the dub under David Pleat in 1983, admitted the opportunity to return to Bedfordshire as the boss was "too good to turn down".

"Only a few opportunities as good as these come around," he said. "I'm delighted to be here.

"I was impressed how professional the people here were during the

interviewing process.

"They sold me the vision and the mission they have to me and that was a crucial factor.

"I think the club has a sensible business plan that shows sporting ambition and financial security. That is the key."

Money left his position as academy director at Newcastle United to take up the post and he praised Alan Neilson and Kevin Watson's efforts that have put the Hatters back on track with four wins from five games during their spell in temporary charge.

"Alan and Kevin have done a fantastic job," he said. "They've done brilliantly to get to the team back into the contention.


"On paper we have one of the best squads in the division.

"I know quite of few of the players having come up against them when I was manager at Walsall and there is a lot of ability in the squad. There is no doubt about that.

"But we're there to be shot at. We are the team everybody wants to beat which means we have to be prepare, plan and perform 100 per cent every week.


"We've not only got to be the best team on paper but the best team on the pitch - and that's what counts the most."

Together with new manager Richard Money and assistant manager Alan Neilson, the 38-year-old Liverpudlian will put his eyes to good use by scouting the Hatters' forthcoming opponents while keeping tabs on the emerging talents of those players plying their trade in the Blue Square Premier.

After applying for the manager's job himself, the reigning Conference Manager of the Year admitted he was "gutted" to miss out on the post but could not hide his delight with his new role with the Hatters.

"I am honoured to be considered for this role," the former Doncaster Rovers, Blackpool and Hull City midfielder exclusively told Talk of the Town following his appointment last Friday. I was delighted with the professionalism of the club during the interview process which made me sit up and think what a big club it really is. There is massive ambition here and they like to do things properly.

"I am looking forward to being a part of the team here and help this great club win promotion back to the Football League.

But Brabin - who also guided Southport to the Conference North play-offs in 2008 - is hoping to go one better this season with the Town. "Last year was gutting for me," he said. "I thought that we were going to get promoted and we had a great chance to go up automatically but lost out on the final day of the season.

"Then we went to Wembley and it wasn't to be, it was always going to be a one-off game but I'm looking to bounce back and achieve that with Luton this season."

Appointed to role of chief scout for of his knowledge of the non-league scene, Brabin listed what he believes a team needs to have to be successful in the BSP.

"First and foremost you need to respect the other teams," he said.

"That's a mistake a lot of teams make, especially those that fall out of the Football League.

"There are good sides all the way through the league and it is a major culture shock for some clubs.

"The sooner you realise that and concentrate on your own game and respect the opposition you stand a great chance of success.

"Richard Money has come in and I can't wait to learn things from him. It's a great appointment and we have a good manager with a good pedigree and that's what appealed to me the most about the position.

"It really excites me."

After a playing career which spanned 19 years taking in 16 dlubs, Gary took the first step into management at Haig Avenue, Southport guiding the Sandgrounders into the Conference North Play-Offs.

Despite losing to Stalybridge Celtic in the end-of-season lottery on penalties, Cambridge United soon spotted his potential as a manager.

He was appointed at the Abbey Stadium in June 2008 and guided the U's to finish runners-up in the Blue Square Premier in his first season in charge but lost in the Play-Off Final to Torquay United at Wembley.





The summer of 2003 had been the most amazing and bewildering in the history of the club.

It started with the change of ownership from Mike Watson-Challis to John Gurney and was followed with the dismissal of manager Joe Kinnear and his number two Mick Harford as well as the bizarre proposal to change the name of the dub to London-Luton and build a new 70,000 capacity stadium to include a Grand Prix racing circuit on stilts over the M1 and a 20,000-space underground car park.

A new manager was chosen by a phone 'vote' and, as the Hatters increasingly became a national laughing stock, Trust in Luton, a supporters group, beavered away behind the scenes and brokered a complex deal to place the club into administrative receivership.

The mad reign of Gurney had now ended but then came the stark reality that major cuts needed to be made and with a transfer embargo enforced it was likely to be a tough season.

New manager Mike Newell was faced with a difficult start. Not only had he to win over supporters who did not want him but he was subject to severe financial restraints.

Newell quickly succeeded in winning over the fans with three straight victories at the start of the new campaign and although the loss of Tony Thorpe to Queens Park Ranagers was likely to be felt, the Town were

allowed to bring in Gary McSheffrey on-loan and his goals ensured a solid base for the rest of the season.

By the time of the FA Cup first round, which paired the Town away at Ryman League high flyers Thurrock, a comfortable mid-table position had been achieved which was rather more than the supporters had expected at the start of the campaign.

The game at Thurrock went down as one of the most dismal in recent times. In front of a live TV audience, the Hatters were never comfortable and were fortunate to escape with a draw - especially as ex-Luton misfit Tresor Kandol missed a sitter in the closing minutes.

In the replay the Town welcomed back big striker Steve Howard after a sixweek absence but it was Adrian Forbes who stole the show, bagging a hattrick in a 3-1 win.

Forbes was certainly a man in form having netted 10 goals in 10 games but overall it was an unimpressive Luton

display in front of a crowd of 3,667 who saw little to keep them warm.

The reward for this victory was a trip to Rochdale of Division Three who the Town had a score to settle with as they were the only side to have achieved the double when promotion had been won from Division Three in 2001/02.

Rochdale had won at Bury to earn their clash with the Hatters and a crowd of 2,807, including 562 from Luton, gathered at Spotland to see if the Hatters could fight through to the third round and hope to get a draw against the big boys.

The Town were without the suspended Matthew Spring and the injured Kevin Nicholls while Howard was only given clearance an hour before kick-off to play with a cast protecting his broken hand.

The first to show were the Town with Peter Holmes cutting inside on 12

minutes to rifle a shot over the bar but the opening goal was not long in coming with Steve Robinson firing home from the spot after 19 minutes.

Forbes had been played in by Holmes only to be clattered by Dale's Simon Grand for what looked a stonewall penalty that was not contested by any of the home players.

Seven minutes later the Town were awarded a second penalty when Forbes, at the end of a 30 yard run, was brought down by Michael Simpkins. The spot-kick from Robinson was identical to the first but this time Rochdale goalkeeper Neil Edwards pushed the ball round the post.

The miss gave Rochdale the confidence to drive forward but they were constantly thwarted by a resolute Town defence in which Christophe was outstanding. In the second period substitute Kevin

Townson was lively and forced a good save from Luton goalkeeper Marlon Beresford but at the other end, after Emmerson Boyce had headed a chance over the top from point blank range, the tie was wrapped up on 77 minutes when Lee Mansell took advantage of an Edwards fumble to lash the ball home from close range.

The Town won at Championship side Bradford City in the next round but were disappointingly knocked out by Tranmere Rovers at Kenilworth Road in round four.



ALAN WHITE - I've never really been that intimidated but perhaps the most aggressive atmosphere I've played for Colchester at Millwall on New Years Day. I remember we got beat and that the atmosphere was frightening. The noise inside the ground was immense you could almost feel the aggression.

GEORGE PILKINGTON - Manager Colin Harvey, my first youth team manager at Everton, was very intimating. He was a legend at Goodison Park and although he didn't say too much you sure knew about it when he did.

After dominating the opening stages a mistake from Town goalkeeper Shane Gore enabled Posh to take the lead on 21 minutes when his attempted catch rebounded inadvertently off Ryan Charles and Carl Pierganni and over the line.

Coach Kevin Watson fielded a strongside including Andy Burgess, Freddie Murray, Callum Reynolds, Ryan Charles and Shane Blackett, who was named captain against his former club.

The goal had come against the run of play but Posh grew in confidence once they were in front as the Hatters struggled to establish their authority on proceedings.

With James McKeown in the visitors' goal rarely troubled it was no surprise when Peterborough doubled their lead six minutes into the second half when the Town failed to clear their lines and the Posh midfielder Jamie Day lashed home an effort past Gore from eight yards.

As the Hatters continued to tire, the visitors – who brought on striker Ben Wright who had scored for the Hatters while on-loan at Kenilworth Road last month – made the game safe with 14 minutes left.

Dominic Green who had tormented the hosts' defence all afternoon down the left-flank slipped striker Josh Simpson in one-on-one with Gore and with all the time in the world the Peterborough man coolly slotted the ball home for the visitors' third of the afternoon.

Only some last ditch defending and a good save from Gore to prevent Wright scoring on his return, kept the score at 3-0.

The defeat means the Hatters have lost all three of their fixtures in the totesport.com Combination so far this season but Watson was pleased with the performance of the players involved despite the defeat.

He said: "In the first half I thought we played some good football, passed the ball well and looked lively.

"Some of the young players put in decent displays. Taylor Nathaniel's done well on the right and Alex Lacey was superb when he came on at centre-half.

Rowan's best form for the club coincided with the beginning of the end of our League status. We all thought we'd struggle without Steve Howard but he picked up the mantle of goal scorer before his form alerted the bigger clubs. We all know how many relegations we've had to watch since we sold him.

STEME HOWARD

The best centre forward since Big Mick. And not a bad centre half either! He scored more goals than anyone else in the decade by a long chalk. All from a pretty inauspicious start. I thought he might never play for us again after the York game. He's the player that best epitomizes our greatest period on the pitch since the '80s.

These are just a few of the questions we ask pupils who we work with at the study centre and at local schools through our Who Wants to be a Millionaire?' quiz.

We have adapted a power point template to ask a series of mathematical problems based on Luton Town.

The idea behind the quiz is to try and make maths fun through the 'Who Wants to be a Millionaire?' format in a football context. When we disquise the mathematical problems this way. pupils forget the fact that they are actually carrying out school work.

See how you go with a few of the questions from the quiz:

The length of the Kenilworth Road pitch is 102 metres and the width is 60 metres. What is the perimeter of the

96m? 104m? 324m? or 304m?

Kevin Nicholls has made 217 league appearances for Luton Town. He has also made 12 appearances for Charlton, 28 for Wigan, 13 for Leeds and 18 for Preston. How many league appearance has he made in total?

282? 290? 302? or 288?

During a training session Tom Craddock has to sprint between two sets of cones that are 12 metres apart eight times to help him with his fitness. Running there and back counts as one turn. What distance will he run when he has finished?

96m? 192m? 196m? or 404m?

The questions require the pupils to use problem-solving skills to work out what operation they have to employ to come up with an answer.

If you have ever helped your child with their school work, then you may well be familiar with the difficulties children face trying to work out what they need to do to find the answer.

The best tip I can give you is to break the problem into steps, work out what operation you are being asked to carry out and if necessary, draw a picture.



The Town Ladies returned to FA Northern Premier League action having previously been given special dispensation by the FA to postpone their last fixture due to a horrendous injury list.

The lack of a loan system in womens football meant that we were without a recognised keeper but the extra week gave 17 year old Sian Hall sufficient opportunity to recover from a long term ankle injury to make her first team debut. The injury jinx struck again pre match when striker Candice Davies was ruled out with a back problem as Luton travelled to Derby County for what was a real six pointer.

The game was just 16 minutes old when a superb passing movement ended with Amy Summerfield finding Micky Taylor on the edge of the box and her first touch took her away from the Derby defender and she fired the ball past the advancing Derby keeper to give Town a 1-0 lead.

However, whilst Taylor was scoring her first goal of the season she pulled her hamstring and had to be replaced. Hall then made an outstanding double save pushing a shot one handed onto the post and saving with the follow up shot with her feet to maintain the lead. After half an hour the almost unthinkable happened as a Derby defender deflected a misdirected Rebecca Kane pass into the

path of Laveena Betts and she coolly finished to give Luton a 2-0 lead.

County were unable to respond and really get a foothold until the last two minutes of the game when Hatters were effectively reduced to 10 players having used their substitutes when Nicola Henman got a knock on the ankle and then became a virtual passenger.

In the 88th minute a cross shot was deflected in at the far post by an alert Rams striker and it almost seemed inevitable as the game moved into injury time that all was not yet over. An unmarked Derby player then converted at the far post to equalise and it could have been worse though as there were 6 minutes of injury time and another County effort flew back off of the post to safety.

A disappointed Dave Baker said "Although we gained an away point it feels like we lost as we were again so close to taking all three points but our overall fitness and players having to turn out not quite 100% fit is taking it's toll". "At Premier League level there is no hiding place and any weakness is quickly seized upon and punished".

"A win here would have brought us to within four points of Derby but now we have to do it all again and must get something from our next two matches at home to Curzon Ashton and Newcastle United".

In the London and SE Regional League the Reserves pulled off their biggest ever win at this level thumping Brentford's First Team 7-0. With an average age of under 18 they played some superb flowing football and the strike force of Steph Anes and Laura Day were too much for the visitors to handle with Anes helping herself to a first half hat trick. Second half goals from Day and Kirstie McIntosh looked to have completed a fine win but Anes had other ideas and punished a tiring Bees defence with two further strikes in injury time to grab herself a five goal haul.

It was only five years ago that Brentford knocked out the Town in an FA Cup tie at Kenilworth Road and this young Reserve squads win is a marker of just how far we have progressed as a Club in that time.

The Under 16's entertained a strong West Bromwich Albion team midweek and the match was a real credit to the abitity of two fine young sides many of whom will undoubtedly be pushing for senior squad places in the very near future. Katie Davis opened the scoring for the Town after 10 minutes but were quickly pegged back when the Albion striker headed home at the near post. Davis was again on target when she swivelled to strike a left foot volley high into the top corner of the net to make it 2-1 at half time.

Shanice Jiminez extended the lead from fully 25 yards after 55 minutes but Baggies again replied to keep themselves in touch at 3-2. Jiminez was causing the Albion defence all sorts of problem with her probing runs and she added her second with another long range effort which took a deflection en route into the bottom corner. Another fine move and run saw Jiminez complete her hat trick with her shot just too hot to handle for the visiting keeper.

Davis almost completed a hat trick of her own when her first time culing shot flew back into play off the foot of he post and there was still time for the visitors to score again with another fine shot from the edge of the box.

This was the latest in a run of testing fixtures for this squad as they prepare to move forward into seniro football and Manager John Wyatt was pleased with his teams 5-3 win and performance warming up for their toughest test of the season when they visit Spurs this Sunday.

HOW TO GET THERE AND WHERE TO PARK?



CAMBRIDGE UNITED



Town are next at home in two weeks time when Cambridge United visit Kenilworth Road on Saturday 21st November.

The visitors will make the journey down the A505 from Cambridgeshire for the return fixture in the Blue Square Premier, after the first meeting back in September ended in a narrow but thrilling 4-3 victory for Luton at the Abbey Stadium.

The last time the sides met at Kenilworth Road was during the 2000/01 League 1 season with the Hatters' winning 1-0 thanks to a goal from a then 19-year-old Matthew Taylor.

Cambridge have had their fair share of ups and downs over the years with disappointment coming after a succession of relegations in 1984 and 1985 and add to that a couple of forgetful league records of 31 games without a win in 84 and then the following year they equalled the record for the most games lost in a season with a total of 33 defeats.

The nineties heralded a change in fortune for the U's and their fans had plenty to smile and shout about after they reached the first ever Play-Off Final at Wembley Stadium in 1990 and thanks to a goal from United's more notable players in their history Dion Dublin they were promoted to the Third Division.

Under the guidance of John Beck

Cambridge not only gained promotion from the Fourth Division but they also went onto win the Third Division title and reach two successive FA Cup Quarter-

Beck took them as far as the Division 2 Play-Offs in 1992 after they finished fifth, which to date is their highest league position in their history. That season they narrowly missed out on promotion and becoming one of the founding member clubs of the then newly formed Premier

Since the heights of the early nineties Cambridge have experienced a run of life in the lower divisions and more recently in 2005 after 35 years in the Football League they were relegated to the Football Conference.

The 2007/08 and 2008/09 seasons saw them narrowly miss out on promotion back to the Football League after finishing second in the Conference two seasons in succession. They reached the Play-Off Final both times only to be beaten by Exeter City and Torquay United respectively.

Current United boss Martin Ling will be looking to go one better than the previous two seasons and after a steady start to their Blue Square Premier season it looks like they will be one of the challengers for a Play-Off place.
