DIRECTOR STEPHEN BROWNE LOOKS BACK ON LAST WEEK'S TRANSFER ACTIVITY



Welcome to Kenilworth Road. Since our last home game there have been a few personnel changes at the club. Andy Burgess has left for Mansfield Town, Steve Basham has gone on-loan to Hayes & Yeading until January and Ryan Charles has gone to gain some first team football at Kidderminster Harriers for a month.

We thank Andy for his efforts during his short stay at the club and we wish him the very best in his future career.

We also have two people who have joined us. Matthew Barnes-Homer is a huge signing for the club. He will help us convert more of the chances we are making as he is a proven goalscorer, so the lads are really pleased to have him at the club.

Ashley Cain has joined on-loan from Coventry City and is a highly rated and pacy winger. The 19-year-old will be with us for a month initially and we thank Chris Coleman at the Ricoh Arena for allowing him to gain some experience at Kenilworth Road.

Richard Money and his staff were really keen to get these two players in and the Board have fully backed his decisions. We are sure they will make an impact.

Tonight we play host to Kettering Town who have had a very good start to the season and are rivals for promotion. Lee Harper has just taken over as player-manager and we wish him the best of luck as he takes up the managerial reins.

This fixture was delayed by 24 hours after they had the chance to take advantage of a televised FA Cup slot against Leeds United.

We know tonight will be a tough test for our team, but like Kettering, we are in a rich vein of form, and we too continue to be very competitive against higher opposition in the FA Cup. We are sure that this top-of-the-table clash will be entertaining and vigorously fought.

The Club had bad news last week

that directly affects our youth department. Many fans will know that our total grant is halved this year as we are no longer in the Football League.

However, in addition to this funding, the Football League also give us a grant for two members of staff in the youth department to help everything work smoothly and give the youngsters the best possible chance of success.

In the spring of 2009 a Football League representative confirmed to the Club that this salary support would continue into 2010, albeit at half the rate we previously enjoyed as a result of our relegation.

Disappointingly, a few weeks ago we were told that this commitment was given in error and that we would lose a further £10,000 of funding. Of course we took advice and appealed the decision in the correct manner, citing all the correspondence we have received and the confirmation

of the commitment we were given over six months ago.

Unfortunately in recent days we have been informed that the appeal panel upheld the Football League's position and that the club would definitely lose this vital funding with immediate effect and backdated to the start of this season.

This is of course a huge blow to everyone at the Club. We have made no secret of the fact that our youth department is the future of our Club, and for clubs such as ours to continue to develop some of the best talent in the country, we need all the support we can get.

The authorities should remember that all the money they give is completely accounted for and 100% of it is spent on the youth department for the benefit of the kids – at the grassroots, just as Trevor Brooking wants.

The potential losers in this are the kids that not only hold the future for us as a club, but also will play a vital role in football higher up the pyramid in the future – just as Curtis Davies, Matthew Upson,

Matthew Taylor, Kevin Foley and Jack Wilshire are doing now, to name just a few.

It is wholly unacceptable that clubs like ours could have to look to sell young talent to the so called 'big clubs' before we would normally do so just to balance our books on developing talent – I can see how that helps the 'big clubs' but how does that help clubs outside the top flight?

How does that enable clubs with smaller financial turnover, and without TV money, to plan for the future and compete?

The footballing authorities should be proud to support clubs and youth departments that demonstrate excellent results, and it is mind boggling that they would rather refuse grants and instead pay for appeal panels, lawyers and the like to deny kids valuable support.

Fortunately, Supporters of Luton Youth Development (SoLYD), with the help of the supporters' groups and the club, have been raising money to help fund these lost grant monies. They are doing an

excellent job and we thank all of the people involved. The fantastic donations received from organisations and individuals, and those people who have set up direct debits – even if modest in amount – to show they are committed to donating in the future too.

This example of how the authorities have gone mad on youth funding shows that it is absolutely vital for you to continue to show your support for our youth department, however small.

We do not want to be in a position where players like Dave Moli could be snapped up against our wishes so it is down to us all to protect our youth – our future.

We were massively disappointed to land up drawing against Cambridge in our last game at Kenilworth Road.

Coming off the back of a superb result against Rochdale in the FA Cup we were all confident of securing three points and with 79 minutes on the clock we looked on course to doing so. However, after Tom Craddock's fantastic strike we then endured a mad final 10 minutes which enabled Cambridge to earn a point.

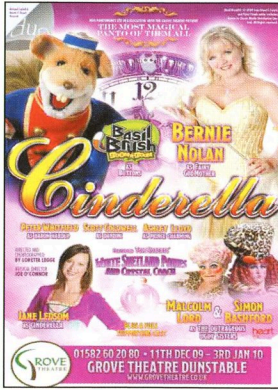

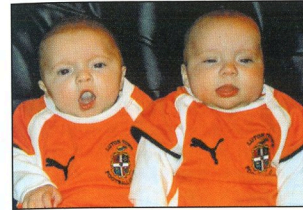

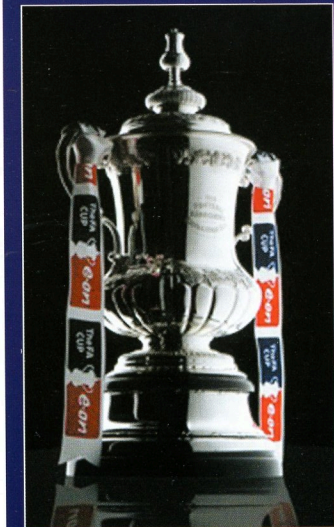

Tonight is the first meeting at Kenilworth Road between the two sides following last August's goalless draw at Rockingham Road.

RECENT HISTORY:

After winning the Conference North title in 2007/08 the Poppies started their first campaign back in the Conference Premier after a five year absence with a storm and landed up finishing in eighth position.

Their heroics in last season's FA Cup led them to the fourth round where

they gave Premier League Fulham a scare before losing 4-2 at Rockingham Road. They had seen off Lincoln City and the then League 2 leaders Wycombe Wanderers in the earlier rounds.

The Poppies faithful have certainly had plenty of ups and downs in recent years, with Paul Gascoigne installed as manager in 2005, Play-Off heartbreak in 2006/07 before winning the Conference North title at a canter collecting a division record of 97 points.

The club enjoyed several successful seasons in the non-league top flight during the 1980s and 1990s.

However, in the days where only one team was promoted to the Football League, the Rockingham Road faithful were denied promotion, finishing as Conference runners-up on four separate occasions in 1981, 1989, 1994 and 1998.

FACT:

Kettering were the first English side to have shirt sponsorship, when in 1976, they were sponsored by Kettering Tyres.

PLAYER/MANAGER

LEE HARPER

Lee was appointed player/manager of the Poppies in November, in succession to Mark Cooper, the man that brought him to Kettering.

An experienced goalkeeper, Lee had spells at Sittingbourne, Arsenal, QPR, Walsall, Northampton Town and MK Dons. He joined the Poppies two games into the Blue Square North season, making his debut in the 6-0 victory over Vauxhall Motors at Rockingham Road.

With a reliable stopper behind them, the defensive unit proved to be the best in the Blue Square North and a season later also the Blue Square Premier. Lee was voted the Club's Player of the Season for 2008/09.



Following the departure of Mark Cooper last month the Poppies now have goalkeeper Lee Harper in charge of the side and he believes his team can now push on from their little blip in the league.

"We've had a flying start to the season under Mark and are doing very well in the FA Cup," Harper said.

"I've got the job now and we've lost a couple of league games, which we were a little bit unfortunate to do but we'll try and put that right starting at Luton.

"Defensively we have been fairly solid for most of the season and we obviously want to continue what Mark started here but now just add a bit more flair."

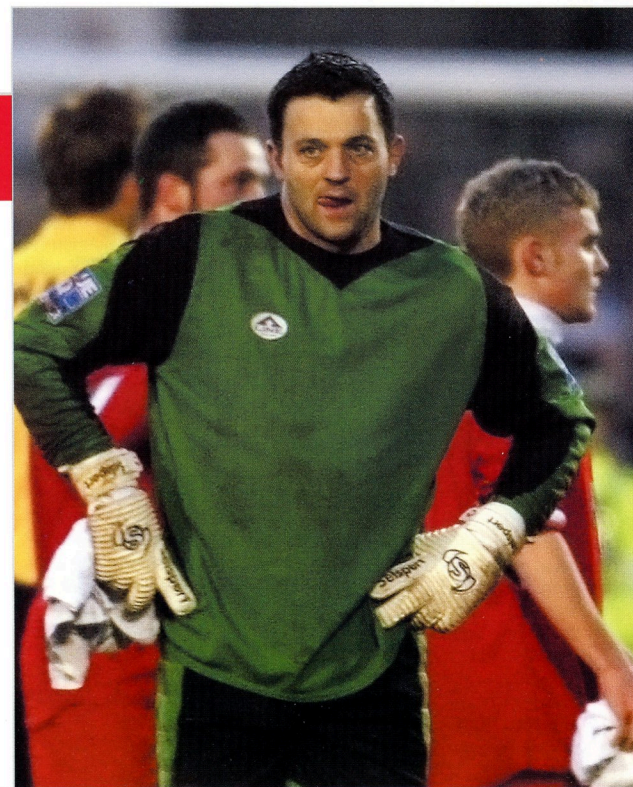
KETTERING'S PLAYER-MANAGER REFLECTS ON A CRAZY COUPLE OF WEEKS

exploits against Leeds United the former Queens Park Rangers stopper is remaining very calm about the chances of playing Premier League side Manchester United in the Third Round.

"It's a huge draw, probably the biggest club you can play in English football but we can't kid ourselves, we've got a huge task in trying to overcome Leeds United at Elland Road first," the 38-year-old said.

"Going to Leeds will be very difficult. I think they will walk League 1, they are an excellent side that we have to overcome before we even think about Manchester United in the Third Round."

With just two points separating the two sides going into the game tonight, Harper is expecting the



match to be very tight at Kenilworth Road with a good atmosphere.

"Luton are a rejuvenated side under the stewardship of Richard Money so we know it is going to be an extremely difficult game for us," he said.

"We will try and turn our recent league form around tonight and if we can take a few chances that

come our way we should get a good result.

"There will be a decent atmosphere at Luton which should inspire my players so on the whole I am looking forward to this fixture."

GOALKEEPER

Lee Harper

The current Poppies' player/manager is a vastly experienced goalkeeper who began his playing career with non-league Sittingbourne before being snapped by Arsenal in 1994. After three years with the Gunners, Harper made the short hop to Queens Park Rangers where he went onto make 119 league appearances for the Rs. A short stay at Walsall followed before he was on the move again, this time to Northampton Town, where the stopper enjoyed five years at Sixfields. In 2006 he signed for MK Dons, initially on-loan before he left to sign for the Poppies at the start of the 2007/08 season, helping them to lift the Conference North title in his first campaign between the sticks.

DEFENDERS

John Dempster

Kettering-born John originally joined the Poppies on loan from Oxford United. He became an instant hit with the home fans, coming off the subs bench to win

the man-of-the-match award against table toppers Droylsden on his debut. After his loan period expired the centre-half returned to United, but a day later signed on a permanent basis for the Poppies and ended the 2006/07 season with five goals. John became captain during the 2007/08 season and, leading by example, he had a brilliant season as the side won the Blue Square North at a canter and John's performances earned him the Supporters' Player of the Year, the Players' Player of the Season and the Vice President's Player of the Year, such was his dominance in the centre of defence.

Sol Davis

Tough-tackling left-back who signed on-loan from MK Dons in November. Sol needs no introduction to Hatters fans after enjoying a seven-year spell at Kenilworth Road that saw him win a League 1 championship winners' medal in 2005 and the Johnstone's Paint Trophy last April. He started his career with Swindon Town before Joe Kinnear brought him to Bedfordshire before a switch to Stadium:MK in the summer of 2009.

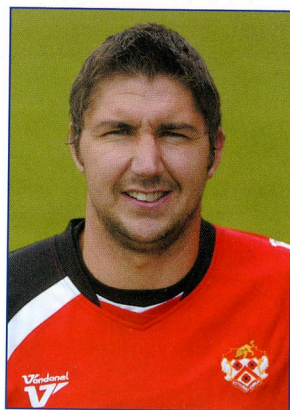
Greg Taylor

A Mark Cooper signing from neighbours Northampton Town, great things are expected of Taylor at Rockingham Road. He was given his chance when outstanding in the games against Barrow and Ebbsfleet United, so much so the youngster won the Man-of-the-Match award against the Fleet as the Poppies ran out 3-0 winners.

Ian Roper

Uncompromising and vastly experienced centre-half is another player that will be familiar to Town fans leaving Kenilworth Road to join the Poppies in July 2009.

Ian's performances have been so

impressive he has become the team captain, enhancing his stature within the club, a masterstroke signing by Mark Cooper. Roper scored the Poppies' goal as they drew 1-1 with Leeds United in Sunday's FA Cup tie.

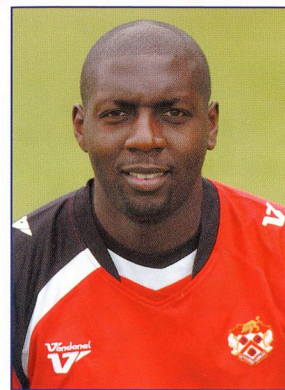
James Jennings

Young full-back blessed with pace, Jennings joined the Poppies from Macclesfield Town. He also had a spell on loan at Blue Square Premier side Altrincham during the 2008/09 season and is highly regarded by the Rockingham Road coaching staff.

MIDFIELDERS

Lee Fowler

A powerful and experienced midfielder who has previously played for Coventry City, Huddersfield Town, Scarborough, Burton Albion, Newport County and Forest Green Rovers. A former Welsh Under 21 international, Lee joined the Poppies from Rovers in June and has already shown his undoubted ability with solid, tough gritty performances in centre midfield. Lee opened his goalscoring account for the Poppies with a 25 yard wonder goal at Hayes

& Yeading as they came back from behind to win 2-1.

Andre Boucaud

A Morell Maison signing in May 2006 from Peterborough United, the stylish player with a deft touch, came on leaps and bounds during his first season with the Poppies, showing some real class. Andre scored his first goal for the Poppies in the 3-3 draw against Lancaster City at Rockingham Road. He left the club in June 2007 to join Wycombe Wanderers however after an unsuccessful time with the Chairboys, he made a surprise return to the Poppies in August 2008.

Darren Wrack

Experienced midfielder became Mark Cooper's third signing of the 2008/09 campaign. A legend at Walsall, he also played for Derby County, Grimsby Town and Shrewsbury, before making over 300 games for the Saddlers.

Patrick Noubissie

A powerful holding midfielder whose previous clubs include Crewe Alexandra, Swindon Town, Hibernian, Livingston, Dundee and Ayia Napa in Cyprus.

Patrick joined the Poppies in August 2009 scored his first goal for the club in the fine 2-1 away win at Wrexham.

STRIKERS

Damien Spencer

A towering no-nonsense centre-forward who has plenty of league experience with Bristol City, Exeter City, Cheltenham Town and Brentford. A Mark Cooper signing in July 2009, Damien scored his first goal for the Poppies in the 2-1 away win at Wrexham earlier this season.

Danny Thomas

The former Leicester City, AFC Bournemouth, Boston United, Shrewsbury Town and Macclesfield Town forward signed for the Poppies after impressing Mark Cooper during pre-season. A pacey forward who can turn a game on his day, Danny scored his first goal for the club in the 2-1 home defeat against AFC Wimbledon, and he added his second goal and the Poppies first in the 4-0 win against Gateshead.

Jean-Paul Marna

Former Paris St Germain, Berkhamstead Town and current French National futsal striker, who has created quite an impression during his first season at Rockingham Road. 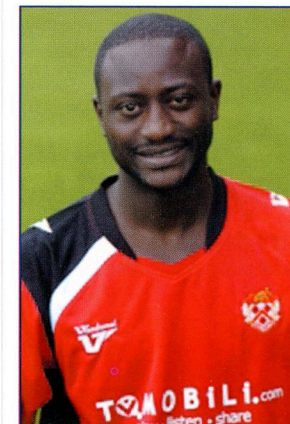
Moses Ashikodi

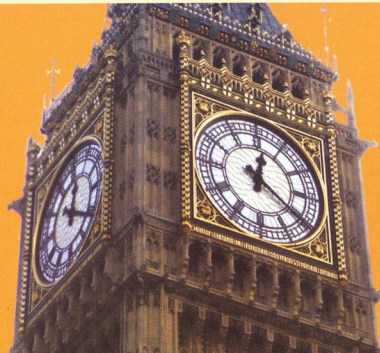

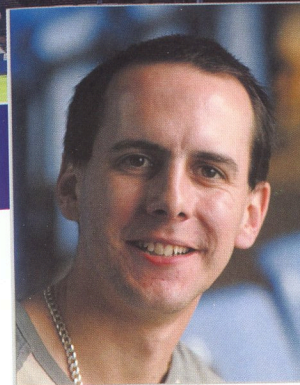

20 league matches. The visitors twice took the lead, but each time Marshall equalised, before Luton won it with Paul McLaren's first goal for the Club.



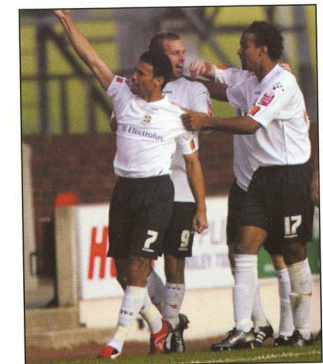

Despite saving a penalty from striker Chris Holroyd goalkeeper Kevin Pilkington's efforts were all in vain as the Town had to settle for a point after being pegged back in the last 10 minutes against Cambridge.

The on-loan stopper spoke of his frustration after seeing the Hatters let a two-goal lead slip.

The 35-year-old kept a clean sheet on his debut against Grays Athletic and despite saving one of two penalties he faced against the U's, only coming away with a draw was hard for the Notts County loanee to take, having beaten twice late on.

"I'm disappointed personally because it was my first home game and it would have been nice to keep a clean sheet in front of the fans," Pilkington said.

"For 80 minutes of the game they didn't test me at all and then all of a sudden for the last 10 minutes it is backs to the wall.

"At 2-0 you're thinking its job done. We should shut up shop but we haven't done that so we need to learn from it."

Despite the result the former Manchester United man believes the team will need to overcome this result quickly and push on: "We've played really well and done everything right up until the last few minutes of the tie," he said.

"The passing, the movement and the defensive shape was excellent. We have to build on that performance and not get too downhearted ahead of our next fixture."

TWO IN, THREE OUT AT KENILWORTH ROAD



It was two players in and three players out on a busy day for the Hatters last Thursday as the loan signing window closed.

Town boss Richard Money completed his first permanent transaction in the transfer market with the arrival of Matthew Barnes-Homer from Kidderminster Harriers.

Joining the striker at Kenilworth Road is 19-year-old winger Ashley Cain who arrives on a month's loan from Championship side Coventry City.

The Hatters' Ryan Charles joins Kidderminster on a month's loan as part of the deal that brings Barnes-Homer to Bedfordshire while fellow striker Steve Basham has joined Hayes & Yeading United for two months on-loan.

Also leaving the Town is midfielder Andy Burgess after he made the move to Mansfield Town.

Burgess joins the Stags initially on loan until 1st January at which point he will join the Field Mill outfit on a

permanent basis.

New man Barnes-Homer, 23, is a prolific goalscorer who joins initially on a month's loan but will make the move permanent when the transfer window re-opens on 1st January.

Birmingham-born Barnes-Homer has been in terrific form in front of goal for Harriers this season as we know only too well after his well-taken effort at Aggborough earlier in the campaign in the Town's 2-1 victory.

After notching 21 goals in all competitions last season, the powerful forward has scored nine times in 20 league appearances this term and, since arriving at the Worcestershire club in 2007, has hit an impressive tally of 34

goals in 77 starts.

Barnes-Homer also enjoyed a dream start to his international career when he netted the winner on his debut for England C in their 2-1 win over Poland earlier this month.

Lightning quick winger Cain is a product of the Sky Blues' academy and made his debut for City in the Championship at the tail end of the 2008/09 campaign.

Since then, the wide-man has gone on to make a further seven appearances for Chris Coleman's side and made his full debut against Hartlepool United in the Carling Cup in August.

Cain is highly thought of by the Sky Blues' coaching staff and his promise was rewarded with a one-year professional contract this summer.

New signing Matthew Barnes-Homer has vowed to continue his rich vein of goalscoring form and fire the Hatters back into the Football League.

The striker arrives on-loan at Kenilworth Road from fellow Blue Square Premier side Kidderminster Harriers and will join permanently on 1st January when the transfer window re-opens.

And after netting an impressive 33 goals in 77 starts for Harriers – including one of his nine strikes this season against the Town this season – the Birmingham-born striker is looking forward to being a part of Richard Money's plans for promotion this season.

"I was really impressed with what the new gaffer and the board had to say to," said the 23-year-old.

"The club wants to get back into the Football League and I like the ambition that comes with a big club like Luton.

"We want to be in the Championship in the not-too distant future and I'm really excited at being a part of it.

"I'm ready for the challenge and want to improve. Every player in the Conference strives to play in the League and I'm no different.

"I was pleased that such a big club like Luton were interested in signing me and I'm pleased that Kidderminster gave me the opportunity to speak to them.

"Hopefully I can keep scoring goals and push us up the table and catch Oxford at the top."

A successful period in front of goal at Aggborough had alerted the attentions of several Football League clubs interested in signing the big striker.

And Barnes-Homer paid tribute to this former manager Mark Yates for developing him into the prolific forward that impressed Richard Money so much.

"I must give massive credit to Mark Yates and his assistant for my form at Kiddy over the past two seasons," he added.

"Mark brought me to the club and helped me with so many things that I have added to my game.

"He would push me all the way which ultimately helped me score all the goals I did for Harriers. He believed in me and I think that's what helped.

"I spent some time in America which was good for experience but after I left Wycombe I really settled at Kidderminster which helped me concentrate and work on my game more.

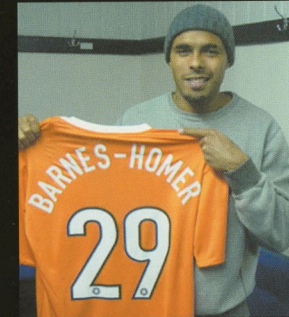
"I've definitely improved as a player since joining Kidderminster and I hope I can improve even more now I am with Luton.

"I wouldn't have come here if I didn't think Luton stood a chance of winning promotion and hopefully I can continue to score goals."

Not only does the striker's arrival at Kenilworth Road give the Hatters a new dimension in attack but also gives Money's side further experience of playing football in the Blue Square Premier.

Barnes-Homer believes he has all the attributes necessary to deal



with the hustle and bustle that comes with in non-league's top flight.

"I bring pace, power, strength, I score goals and I'm good in the air," the former Wolves trainee explained confidently.

"The Conference has a lot of quality players and good teams - as many have shown in the FA Cup this year and over the past couple of seasons.

"I have a lot of experience of playing at this level – it's a bit more aggressive than in the league, but I'm use to it now."

Of his new team-mates Barnes-Homer knows Rossi Jarvis and Jake Howells after the trio met on duty for England C against Poland.

The new signing enjoyed a dream start to his international career by scoring the winning goal as Paul Fairclough's side won 2-1.

"It was fantastic to get a call-up," he said. "I was disappointed I didn't earn one last season because I thought my form was good enough.

"But I scored the winner against a strong Polish side and it was a good experience in what was a difficult match.

"Hopefully I can continue playing well, keep up my form and score more goals."

Tonight's important clash with promotion rivals Kettering Town presents Barnes-Homer with an ideal opportunity to make an instant impact on the Kenilworth Road faithful.

The striker certainly has the credentials to do so after netting a goal against the Poppies in Kidderminster's victory at Rockingham Road last month.

"It's a big game for both sides and I've already played against them twice," Barnes-Homer acknowledged.

"I played against them recently and scored so I have happy memories of that game.

"But we will concentrate on our own game and I'm looking forward to making my debut.

"Hopefully I can continue my goalscoring form and get off to a good start to my career with Luton and show the supporters what I am capable of."

MONEY ON INS AND OUTS

THE HATTERS' MANAGER EXPLAINS THE REASONS BEHIND THE COMINGS AND GOINGS AT KENILWORTH ROAD



Hatters' manager Richard Money has expressed his delight at the double swoop of Kidderminster striker Matthew Barnes-Homer and Coventry winger Ashley Cain.

After taking over the Kenilworth Road hot seat last month, the Town boss was pleased with his first bits of business in the transfer market.

"I am thrilled to be able to bring both players to this club," Money said.

"Matthew is someone who I have been monitoring since he joined Kidderminster when I was manager at Walsall.

"I've always been an admirer of his abilities. He is quick and strong and gives us something different in attacking areas."

After 34 goals in 77 starts for Harriers, the Hatters have landed a striker in terrific form and Money

believes there is plenty more to come from his new signing.

He said: "Since I have taken over I have had someone watch every single Kidderminster match.

"He found his feet at Kidderminster and that has kicked-off his career. Now it's up to us to get more of out of him so he's a success with Luton Town."

As a former member of the Coventry backroom staff Money also knows plenty about the potential and ability of loan arrival Cain from the Ricoh Arena.

"He was only a young boy when I left Coventry," he said. "But I have followed his progress since and I am well aware of what a talent he is.

"When I heard that Chris Coleman was anxious to get him out on loan for experience we jumped at the chance.

"Ashley is an offensive player that can play on either wing and is what you'd describe as 'rapid'."

Andy Burgess left for Mansfield Town on-loan in a deal that will turn permanent in January while Steve Basham and Ryan Charles have joined Hayes & Yeading and Kidderminster respectively, also on-loan.

Explaining the departure of the trio, Money said: "In an ideal world I would have liked to have kept Burgess.

"I've said I want pace down either flank which means he would be competing for a place in central midfield. Five players into two positions doesn't go."

The manager had nothing but good words to say about the Aggborough-bound striker Charles.

He said: "Let me make one thing clear: Ryan Charles will be back at Luton Town on 2nd January. End of story.

"He's gone to Kidderminster to get games and we think it's a really good move for everyone's benefit.

"I've liked what I've seen of him. He's got pace and is a good finisher."

And after giving Basham a surprise start against Rochdale, in which he scored twice, Money is sending the striker to Hayes & Yeading for two months.

"He needs games. Steve has hardly kicked a ball or played a game this year and with the players we have here at the moment, its difficult to fit him in.

"It a short-term but sensible decision."

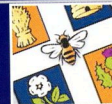

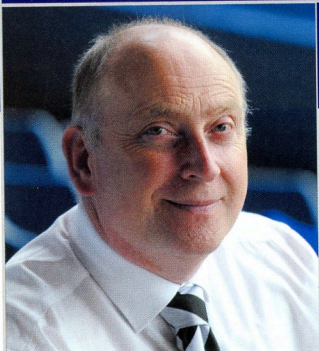

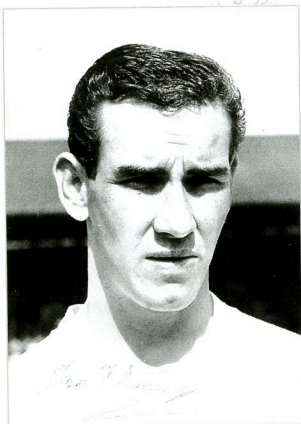
2ND DECEMBER 1961. LUTON TOWN 4 - 3 ROTHERHAM UNITED



With everyone at Kenilworth Road expecting the Town to bounce back to the top flight at the first time of asking following relegation in 1960, it came as a major disappointment when the team finished in 13th place in the 1960/61 campaign, only six points off a relegation spot.

Manager Sam Bartram thought that by adding ex-Manchester United centre-half Ron Cope to the side during the summer of 1961, he would solve the defensive problem that had existed since Syd Owen retired two years previously.

Sadly, Cope was not the answer

and supporters soon began to call for old stalwart Terry Kelly to be recalled to the heart of the Luton defence.

It had all started so well for new skipper Cope and the Hatters, though, when newly relegated Preston were hammered 4-1 at Kenilworth Road on the opening day but defeat at Derby followed this sparkling win as the season descended into an unpredictable mess.

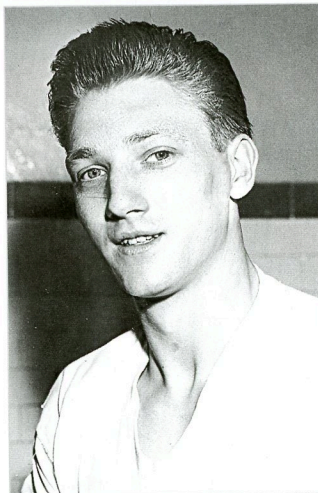
Over the first 15 games the Town hit four goals on five occasions but on the other side of the coin, they had conceded four goals three times!

The slow hand-clap reverberated around Kenilworth Road when Southampton soundly thrashed the Town 4-1 while a few weeks later the players were regarded as heroes when they returned from Norwich having won 4-0.

Supporters did not know which Luton team was likely to turn up each week with the team losing control of games when well in front one Saturday and then equalising in the final minute, as they did at runaway leaders Liverpool, the next.

Although there was no shortage of action at Kenilworth Road, crowds were down on the previous season and only 9,886 turned up in early December to see visitors Rotherham in third place take on a Town side only two points behind.

Torrential rain the day before the game had seen the pitch two inches under water in places but it had made a good recovery albeit still very soft underfoot.

The Town were missing the injured Gordon Turner and Roland Legate who were replaced by Alwyn McGuffie and Jim Fleming while the Millers, who had gone seven games unbeaten, were at full strength.

McGuffie, making only his second appearance of the season, made a spectacular return to the team when he calmly side-footed the ball home in the third minute. Roy Ironside in the Rotherham goal could only push out a fierce shot from Fleming leaving McGuffie to do the rest.

The Millers then went close three times before winger Harry Walden doubled the Town's lead on fifteen minutes taking an astute Fleming pass in his stride on the break.

The scoreline flattered the Town a little but no-one in the ground

could believe it when Rotherham netted three times in 12 minutes to lead 3-2 with the game still less than half an-hour-old.

Strikes from Brian Taylor and Brian Sawyer and an unfortunate own goal from Luton full-back Brendan McNally had turned the game on its head.

Back came the Town and, after a series of raids on the Rotherham goal, Tommy McKechnie deflected the ball past Ironside just before the interval whistle.

As if the excitement of a six-goal first-half was not enough for the fans they were then treated to the Luton Band who displayed the championship trophy they had

won at the Berkshire and Neighbouring Counties Band Festival the previous Saturday!

There was no let up to the end to end action in the second period but, as so often happens in games where the goals flow in the first 45 minutes, there is a drought in the second due to a tightening of defences.

Although no less exciting, there was only one goal scored in the second half with Alec Ashworth netting on 72 minutes, being in the right place to take advantage of a fumble by Ironside.

The goalkeeper was later heard to moan that the floodlights had blinded him when he failed to

collect a high centre from the Town's Dave Pacey.

As the Town moved up to fourth spot in the table Sam Bartram, now seemingly less bothered about shoring up the Hatter's defence, said: "I don't mind if the opposition score five goals so long as we get six."

A5117. After around one and a half miles you will reach a set of traffic lights where you need to bear left on to the A550 (signposted North Wales and Queensferry).

Then from the A550, take the A548 towards Chester. Head straight through the first set of traffic lights and after passing a Vauxhall and then a Renault garage on your left, turn right at the next lights (there is a Volvo Garage on the corner) into Sovereign Way.

Continue to the end of Sovereign Way and then turn right into Bumpers Lane and the entrance to the Club car park is just down on the right.

There is plenty of car parking available at the ground however if you use the club car park, it can be quite difficult to get away easily after the match.

TRAVEL INFORMATION

Both Town on Tour and the Bobbers Travel Club are running coaches to the Deva Stadium.

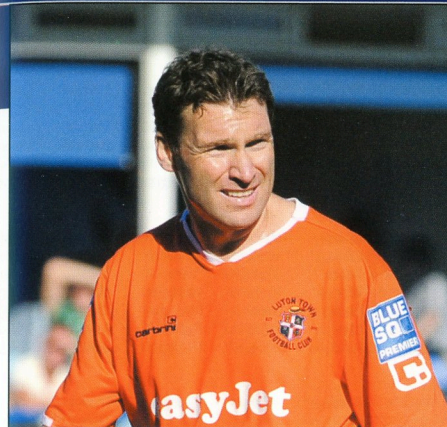

Following an equaliser from Town substitute Mark Nwokeji in Saturday's 2-2 draw with Rotherham United in the FA Cup second round, the Hatters will be in action at Kenilworth Road a little earlier than originally scheduled when they face the Millers in the replay on Tuesday 8th December.

Rotherham were founded in 1888 and currently play their home games at the Don Valley Stadium in Sheffield, which is more renowned for its athletics than its football, but recently it has been the ground that has seen the League 2 team pick up 19 points from nine games without losing.

The Millers' current Manager Ronnie Moore, who is in his second spell as boss at the club, is the most successful manager in their recent history, after guiding the team to consecutive promotions which saw them climb from the third division to the first division.

Added to the league success, they also had something to cheer about in the FA Cup in 2002 when they beat Premier League side Southampton – ironically the prize for the winners of the replay - 2-1 in the third round but

unfortunately they then fell at the next hurdle.

A highlight of the 2003/04 season saw Moore's side draw 1-1 with Arsenal in the League Cup to add to the successive promotions in the previous seasons, but it was a year later that the Millers were to taste relegation and the resignation of Moore came with it.

Only a few games into this season former Manager Mark Robins left the club to join Championship side Barnsley, having had one of the clubs most successful seasons in cup competitions last season reaching the last 16 of the League Cup and getting to the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Northern Final.

Rotherham currently sit comfortably in a top six position in League 2 and under the guidance of Moore again will be looking to gain promotion to League 1 at the end of this season.

Before travelling down to Kenilworth Road next week they face Shrewsbury Town away and Burton Albion at home in Coca-Cola League 2.
