

BOARDROOM WELCOME

It was a fantastic victory away at Kettering, with a strong performance from the team and I felt very proud of all our players. Every game counts from now until the end of the season and I know our management team are working hard with the players to ensure we get as many points as possible in the coming weeks to assist our league campaign. Also, well done to the team for reaching the quarter finals of the FA Trophy. We can't underestimate this competition, as success last year enabled the Board to work with Martin to build the team we have today. I wish the players the best of luck away to Barrow on 20th February.

I would like to personally extend a warm welcome to the Club's special guests this evening. Tonight we have invited key individuals from local football to Bootham Crescent for the match to help to strengthen the Club's relationship with the wider football community in York and North Yorkshire. It is important that we encourage positive relationships to further our community aspirations, especially when the prospect of a new community stadium is getting closer. Welcome to Gary Limbert, Tim Atkins, Ellie Hutchinson, Barry Casterton, Dave Winterburn, Steve Wade, Bob Grainger, Mark Coulson, Gordon Staniforth, Rob Wadsworth and John Stockton. I hope you have an enjoyable, informative evening.

Clearly the ground situation is at the forefront at present for the York City board of directors. Last week, in *The Press*, we made our position quite clear. Our preferred option is a new community stadium for the city of York with extensive community facilities to benefit York residents. However, if this is not supported by the Council, we fully encourage the expansion and redevelopment of Bootham Crescent. What we are not prepared to support is moving to a refurbished Huntington Stadium and I'm sure this would not be acceptable to our supporters, whom we represent. We are a Club that needs to be sustainable in the future and we need income generating facilities, that we don't currently have, to survive and prosper. The City of York Council has the opportunity to make a difference to sport in this city. Let's hope the Council members are ambitious and forward thinking enough to recognise the tremendous benefits sport has to a community. Come on Mr Waller, Mr Scott and Mr Gillies, put your political differences aside, get behind this project and do something positive for our city.

The Council has stated publicly that they will commit £4 million to the community stadium project, as well as the cost for relocating York Athletics from Huntington Stadium. These funds will come from the sale of Huntington Stadium for development, so there will be no impact on the York taxpayer in these difficult financial times. Indeed, one could argue the Council would be saving money by investing in a new stadium or the redevelopment of this site, as over the coming years, the decaying Huntington Stadium will require improvement and costly maintenance. This afternoon the stadium report will have been presented to the Council Executive for consideration. Stadium project manager, Tim Atkins, has collated all the key information and the funding proposals going forward. The next key date after today is Thursday 25th February, when it is the Council budget meeting and the stadium will clearly be part of the discussions.

The issue of the stadium has been dragging on now since 2003 and we need to move forward. We are frustrated by the situation and I'm sure our fans are too. However, please be assured that the directors are working hard behind the scenes to push this project forward. On Saturday 13th February, prior to the Ebbsfleet game, Jason and Rob McGill had the opportunity to meet with the Football Foundation. They have been very supportive and will continue to work with us to ensure we achieve the best possible facilities of our supporters. We have also received support from York MP Hugh Bayley this week, who discussed the issue of the community stadium in the House of Commons.

Tomorrow night, Jason McGill and I will be meeting with our various supporter groups at one of the regular fans meetings I host. The focus of the evening will be the stadium and we will be asking representatives from our fan groups to help the Club in our campaign to progress the community stadium project. Through our supporter groups we will then communicate to our wider fan base how you too can help and ensure we have a sustainable home for the future. Together we have achieved great things in the past. We have saved the Club and bought back own ground from the previous Chairman when the situation looked impossible. Now it's time to fight for our future and the facilities this Club deserves.

On a different note, please visit our community page in tonight's programme to read more about the positive work we are doing in the area and the coaching courses we will be holding during half-term and the Easter holidays. Also, the Supporters' Trust will be holding their AGM in the Social Club on 29th March. Please try to attend this event if you can.

Finally, good luck to the team tonight. I wish you all the very best.







A nostalgic look back this season at City's six promotion campaigns – by DAVID BATTERS.

Following their Fourth Division championship success of 1983/84 City spent five seasons in the third tier of the Football League. In the first two campaigns in the Third they finished 8th and 7th and twice reached the fifth round of the FA Cup losing to Liverpool in a replay at Anfield on each occasion. In 1986/87 the club's fortunes dipped and they just avoided the drop back to the Fourth and in May 1987 the managerial team of Denis

managerial team of Der. Smith and Viv Busby, who had brought so much success to Bootham Crescent, left for Sunderland. Other departures included Andy Leaning, Steve Senior, Keith Walwyn and Gary Ford. Bobby Saxton was appointed the new boss and he was faced with the almost impossible task

club finished 11th, 13th, 21st and 19th under the managership of firstly John Bird and then John Ward who was appointed in November 1991. Bird had assembled a strong defence with promising youngsters 'keeper Dean Keily, fullbacks Andy McMillan and








AN INTERVIEW WITH THE BY MAX BENSON SHOP OF YORK

The Archbishop of York, Dr John Sentamu, is a self-confessed football fanatic who, despite his lofty and time-consuming position as the second most senior cleric in the Church of England, has never failed to retain a passion for the beautiful game.

"I think football is a great sport," he says. "Not only is it exciting to watch, but it can bring whole communities together.

"That sense of shared identity is really important. When the team wins it gives a real lift to everyone in the area."

Despite having a past allegiance in the English game – and we'll get to that later - Dr Sentamu insists it has been the Minstermen that have stolen his heart in recent years, saying: "I became involved soon after moving to the area in 2005, I was invited


to a match and from that point on I was hooked.

"I love being able to go to a game with thousands of other fans from the city, sharing the ups and downs together.

"I am patron of the club, but I am honoured to be considered an ordinary supporter – I am incredibly passionate about the team."

The Archbishop, who was "more of a rugby player" in his youth, has more in common with the club than meets the eye, particularly when it comes to the subject of the next generation of football players and fans.

"The club have been fantastic in realising the importance of



young people locally," he adds. "They have nurtured many young players from the area who have gone onto great things as a result of the grounding they got at York City."

Obvious examples are youth team graduates from the recent past like Jonathan Greening and Richard Cresswell, both of whom have progressed to enjoy long careers in the highest echelons of English football. Teenage striker Adam Boyes' emergence and transfer to Championship side Scunthorpe last year further highlighted the importance of the Centre of Excellence after six seasons deprived of a place in the Football League and the £138,000 annual funding that comes with it.

Dr Sentamu is also keen to recognise the expanding role the club is playing in the development of young people in the wider community.

"Some say that young people are the leaders of tomorrow,

but they're not. They are the leaders of today," he says. "Young people often get portrayed quite badly in the press, and I think that's unfair when the vast majority of young people are working hard and doing wonderful things in their community.

"We need to support and encourage our young people, who are very talented individuals on the whole, and I am proud that our local football club wants to be involved in that."

City's ongoing work with local charities is another thing not unnoticed by the Archbishop.

"The club have also supported my charity, the Archbishop of York's Youth Trust, which gives vital funding to youth projects across the north of England," he explains. "York City, and [City Chairman] Jason McGill in particular, was really kind to donate the Wembley strip [from City's appearance in the FA Trophy

Final last May] to help raise funds for the Youth Trust. "

The Archbishop was also keen to point out the wider benefits of such a gesture, saying: "The auction of the shirts raised £2,171 and that money will help support young leaders who are making positive contributions to the areas they live in across the north of England.

"In many cases the young people who will benefit from this funding come from the most deprived areas in the region.

"It says a lot about the club that they were prepared to give away such a large potential revenue to help those who are trying to make a difference in difficult circumstances, rather than to keep the money for themselves."

Supporters of York City are well aware of the importance of the proposed new community stadium for the City of York - it is integral to

the club's long-term survival for a start. With Council officers set to meet soon to announce the preferred sites, Dr Sentamu is optimistic about the future of sport in the area, adding: "It is a real opportunity to provide a brilliant new ground for the whole community - not just for football, but for rugby league as well as new facilities for athletics... it's a very exciting time. "I understand many people will be sad to leave Bootham Crescent because it is a fantastic ground with a wonderful history. We all have memories of great games here, but the truth is that the club needs to look to the future." It may not come as a surprise that, having grown up in his home country of Uganda, York City were not the Archbishop's first love when it came to the beautiful game. "When I was growing up I always supported Manchester United and I still have a soft spot for them," he confesses. "I realise that's not a popular thing to say to most football supporters outside of Manchester, but its true! "I still follow United in the big games, but there is something different about supporting a small club in the heart of a local community because you really feel you are part of something. "I really have never experienced anything quite like being at Bootham Crescent cheering on City!" After an outstanding first half to the season, which has seen Martin Foyle's side gain a strong grip on the play-off places as well as reach the Third Round of the FA Cup for the first time in eight years, the possibility of a much-anticipated return to the Football League is very much on the mind of the Archbishop. "It would be amazing for the Club and the whole city if we could get promotion back to the Football League," he enthuses. "It would be great if League football came back to Bootham Crescent and at the moment we have a team who look capable of taking us back there. "I just hope we can hold on to our best players, at least until the end of the season, so we can make the dream of League football a reality."

At the time of writing, the sad situation at Chester City is still rumbling on. With the game against Forest Green called off at late notice after the players refused to play because they'd not been paid, and then having the game against Wrexham called off because of costs not paid to the police, and then the match against Kidderminster called off because of a league ruling, it's hard to see where



the club will go from here. More to the point, it's hard to see what the Conference can do

Supporters Direct has called for Chester to be closed down.
According to BBC Sport, the organisation says support is already there to back a reformed club and they'd like that to happen. It seems harsh, doesn't it? Above all, is it the right thing to do?

If York City had gone under in 2002, and not had groups fighting off all the problems the club faced, it could have been a similar story at Bootham Crescent.

York would have had to re-start from a lower league, and the quest to get back into the Football League would have been even harder than it has already been. Keeping the club alive certainly seemed at the time – and has proved to be since – to be the best option. It takes a long time for a new club to reach the same level as it's previous incarnation may have reached. Just looking through the lower leagues shows that.

But sometimes losing a club, as sad as it is, can be for the best. Debts are wiped, and a new regime can learn from the mistakes the old regime made in the past.

If the support is there for a new Chester – as Supporters Direct suggest – rather than a club that is merely a shadow of what it used to be, then perhaps it's the right option in this case. But I think it's still a tough decision to make.


Thankfully for York, it never quite came to having to make that decision.

After the huge victory against Mansfield last week, we went into the game against Notts County full of confidence, the result and performance however were below par and we were sent back to York with a 1-0 defeat.

The game was in doubt to begin with, as the pitch was very hard and in some places frozen, this meant for a horrible surface to play on and didn't allow us to ever get our passing game going, the pitch itself was also very narrow and it didn't make for a very good spectacle. Take nothing away from the break and the finish from the County striker but from our point of view it was a poor goal and left us with a mountain to climb to get back in the game.

With five minutes remaining Tom Richardson nearly levelled things up and if not for one of the saves of the season from the County keeper we would have been going back home with a point, Richardson met Hopcutt's free kick with a bullet of a header but the County keeper somehow clawed it over the bar and won the game for Nott's County.

This was a disappointing display considering last week's fantastic performance but we need to put it

behind us and show a good reaction next week. Credit must go to centre halves Ryan Qualter and Dean Lisles who did perform very well at the back for York and limited County to very little chances.



GOALKEEPERS Mark TYLER

Hugely experienced goalkeeper who signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road in June 2009 to become Mick Harford's fifth signing of the summer following his release from Peterborough United. Mark made 483 appearances in 15 years at London Road. After falling down the pecking order at Posh he found first team opportunities hard to come by and in 2008/09 he was loaned out to League 2 Bury where he made 11 appearances for the Shakers. A former England Youth international, Tyler was

handed the number one shirt by the Hatters boss.

Shane GORE

Former Wimbledon stopper who arrived at Kenilworth Road on a short-term deal on the eve of the 2009/10 season. He came through the ranks at Selhurst Park but could only make one substitute appearance before leaving for Peterborough in 2003. Shane has also had spells with Barnet and Stevenage and featured for Maidenhead United in 2008/10 prior to joining the Hatters.

DEFENDERS Claude GNAKPA

A Marseille-born defender capable of playing centre back or full

back, who joined on a free transfer in August 2008. Having plied his trade across Europe with Montpellier HSC, Racing de Santander, Deportivo Alaves and FC Vaduz of Liechtenstein, Claude moved to Swindon Town for a brief spell. He was then off again in July 2007 to Peterborough United and was a regular in the League 2 promotion winning side, starting 25 league games. A favourite with the Kenilworth Road crowd the Frenchman scored the Hatters' winning goal in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final against Scunthorpe United in April 2009.

Keith KEANE

Having made his debut as a 16year-old in November 2003,

LOOKBACK / Luton Town

A big welcome this evening to LUTON TOWN on this their first visit to Bootham Crescent since September 2001.

In total the clubs have met 14 times in the Football League (1966-2002) in the old Divisions Two, Three and Four and the Hatters can boast an excellent record in the series. City have recorded just one league victory over Town and that was in March 1967 in the first ever meeting. Andy Provan (2), Les Collinson, Tommy Spencer and John Goodchild netted in a 5-1 success. City were in the bottom four of Division Four and on the last day of that season lost 5-1 at Kenilworth Road and had to apply for re-election. Scorers for Town that day included Bruce Rioch (2) with David Pleat making his last appearance for the club.

The following campaign Luton won 3-1 at home and the game at Bootham Crescent ended 1-1 and Town went on to gain promotion. The clubs next met in the old Second Division (Championship) in 1975/76 and Luton completed the double winning 4-0 at home and 3-2 here. Ian Holmes (pen) and Brian Pollard scored in this latter match. Paths were not to cross for 20 years and then in 1996/97 City went down 2-0 at Luton with the game at York finishing 1-1. The next season Town did the double winning 2-1 at Bootham Crescent and 3-0 at home in a game which saw City finish with nine men having Mark Tinkler and debutant Graham Rennison sent off. In 1998/99 the match here was a thrilling affair and ended 3-3 with Gordon Connelly and Richard Cresswell (2) on target. Luton won the return fixture 2-1. The clubs last met promotion, 3rd.

in the Football League in 2001/02 and Town again did the double winning 2-1 here with City suffering their usual fate at Kenilworth Road going down 2-1.

This term marks the first season of City and Luton meeting in non-league football and in October City ended their sequence of seven straight defeats at Luton by drawing 1-1. Neil Barrett opened the scoring with Asa Hall netting the equaliser.

In 1978/79 the sides met here in the 3rd of the FA Cup and 4th Division City beat Second Division Luton 2-0 with Gordon Staniforth and Kevin Randall on the scoresheet.

Highly experienced defender who joined the club on a free transfer in August 2008. Having began his career as an Everton trainee, Pilkington joined Port Vale in June 2003, after a loan spell at Exeter City. Having started 223 league games for the Valiants, the highly regarded defender was named player of the year twice and club captain.

George BEAVAN

A highly promising central defender Beavan was was spotted by former Youth Team coach Marvin Johnson, who initially gave him a trial at the club. He impressed tremendously and soon became a consistent member of the Luton Town Youth team during the 2006/07 season. George is predicted to have a bright future in the game by many at Kenilworth Road. Sent on-loan to Salisbury City in 2008 he is currently enjoying his second loan spell with Gravs Athletic.

Lewis EMANUEL

Lewis Emanuel arrived at Kenilworth Road in the summer of 2006 after deciding to leave his home town club Bradford City, the place where the defender started his career. Lewis is a pacy full-back but can also play on the left side of midfield, a position where he started on his league debut for the club. Lewis made over 150 appearances for Bradford in sixyears at the club, scoring four goals. In his first season at Kenilworth Road he made 40 appearances, scoring twice. Out of contract at the end of the 2008/09 campaign, Lewis signed a new contract in July 2009.

Ed ASAFU-ADJAYE Capable of playing in any

position across defence, Asafu-Adjaye has made significant progress through the Club's youth set-up. Sent on on-loan to non-league side Walton & Hersham, he made the breakthrough into the first team under former boss Mike Newell. Ed went on-loan to Salisbury City where he earned rave reviews and when Mick Harford arrived as manager at Kenilworth Road one of the first things he did when he was in charge was to recall the young defender. Janos KOVACS

Giant Hungarian-born defender who signed for the Hatters in January 2010 from League 2 side Lincoln City. A cult hero in Lincolnshire he joined the Imps following a successful spell with Chesterfield where he spent two years. Had a spell on loan with City in 2006/07.

Luton-born Shane became Mick Harford's sixth summer signing of 2009 after penning a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road from Peterborough United. Equally adept at centre-back or at left-back, Shane began his career with Dunstable Town before a switch to Arlesey Town in 2003. His form with the United Counties side alerted the attentions of Dagenham & Redbridge who signed the 6'3" defender in May 2004. He made 83 appearances during his time at Victoria Road and helped the

Previously with Northampton Town, Stevenage Borough and Cambridge United Freddie began his career as a trainee with Blackburn Rovers.

MIDFIELDERS Adam NEWTON

Ascot-born Adam became Mick Harford's second summer signing after agreeing a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road following his release from Brentford. Predominately used as a right winger, the pacy wide man is equally as comfortable at right-back. Adam started his career at West Ham United, coming through the Hammers' respected academy before signing for Peterborough United in May 2002. The former England Under 21 international went onto make a name for himself with the Posh making 249 appearances in six years at London Road going onto win promotion at the end of the

2007/08 campaign. After leaving Peterborough at the end of the 2007/08 season. Adam was snapped up by Brentford where he helped the Bees to the League 2 title. A St Kitts and Nevis international, he has spent time on-loan at Portsmouth, Notts County and Leyton Orient.

Rossi JARVIS

Adaptable player who can play on the left or right hand side of defence or midfield. Jarvis came through the Norwich City youth system. He went on to spend loan periods at Torquay United and Rotherham United and joined Luton Town in August 2008 on a free transfer.

Asa HALL

Versatile player capable of playing in midfield or defence. Hall began his football career in Wolverhampton Wanderers youth system, before signing his first professional contract with Birmingham City in 2004. While at the Blues he was a regular in the reserve team and was named young player of the year in the 2004/05 season. He also received caps for England at Under-19 and Under-20 levels and went on to have loan spells with Boston United, Ashford Town and Shrewsbury Town.

Kevin NICHOLLS

The hard-working midfielder enjoyed six successful seasons at Kenilworth Road between 2001 and 2006, captaining the side to the League One title in the 2004-2005 season. Nicholls began his career at Charlton Athletic, before moving to Wigan Athletic in 1999, where he made 28 appearances in two years. He moved to Luton in 2001, and in the next six seasons went on to appear 175 times, scoring 30 goals. He moved to Leeds United for £700,000 in July 2006 and was made club captain by then boss Dennis Wise. An energetic striker who has made a huge impact at Kenilworth Road since making his debut in 2007. Charles, who has been at Kenilworth Road since the age of nine, has worked his way through the ranks.

Tom CRADDOCK

Originally a defender, Tom developed into a promising forward who did well at youth and Reserve team levels with Middlesbrough. He joined the Hatters on-loan from the Riverside in October 2008 and scored twice on his debut in a 2-2 draw with Grimsby Town. Two further goals followed in the games against Bury and Chesterfield and once his loan expired Mick Harford moved quickly to snap up the striker on a permanent basis. A £80,000 bid was accepted by Middlesbrough and Tom signed a two-and-half year contract in January 2009. He has previously spent spells on loan with Wrexham and Hartlepool United.

Promising young forward who became the youngest ever player to feature for the Hatters. Kevin GALLEN

A Shepherds Bush native. Gallen established himself as something of a legend at OPR. He notched up over 400 appearances and hit 97 goals for the R's in two spells spanning nearly 14 years. Gallen joined Huddersfield 2000 and after 10 goals in 30 starts for the Terriers, Gallen moved across

DRAGONS CHAIRMAN ISSUES QUIT THREAT

Wrexham chairman Geoff Moss has stated he is "deadly serious" about quitting the North Wales side after receiving a number of threatening and abusive messages criticising his leadership of the club.

Moss is the majority shareholder at Wrexham and since the club plunged into administration five years ago has invested more than £4m of his own money into the club. However, the growing criticism from fans has led him to review his position at the club.

"There comes a point when you think, do I need this any more? What the fans should ask themselves is 'who's been funding the wages over the past two months when we've had no games because of the bad weather'."

After suffering a disappointing second season in the Blue Square Premier, the possible departure of Moss along with his funding, will be a further blow to both fans and management, but he has stressed that he has no intentions of leaving the club "in the lurch" but instead will "retreat over the next few months".

CHESTER CITY SUSPENDED

The ongoing troubles at Chester City have taken a new twist after the club was suspended from the Blue Square Premier for seven days after failing to fulfil their matches against Forest Green Rovers and local rivals Wrexham.

After the third month of not receiving pay, the clubs players went on strike

shortly before the planned departure to the New Lawn for the game against Rovers, leading to the game been postponed just two hours before kick-off. Further outstanding payments to local police has seen Chester Council placing a prohibition notice on games at the Deva stadium until policing resources can be paid for.

At the time of writing the future looks bleak for City with no investment forthcoming and certain relegation only weeks away from being confirmed. Tomorrow night's game against Kidderminster Harriers has also been postponed and unless the clubs officials can give the Blue Square league board assurances they can fulfil their games until the end of the season, it looks likely that all results involving the club will be wiped out giving a new dimension to the fight for promotion and relegation.

SHAW HOPING TO PROVE HIS WORTH

Mansfield Town striker Jon Shaw is hoping to prove his worth to his new team after netting his first goal for the club in the recent defeat to Stevenage.

The former Rochdale striker, who had an eight game spell on loan with the Minstermen in 2003, joined the Stags in early January but injury has forced him to sit out a number of recent games. Now back to full fitness and with his team hovering around the play off places, he is determined to help his team into a top five spot and repay the faith shown in him by boss David Holdsworth.

"To come into the side for players who are working hard and who deserve their place, you've got to show something. Hopefully I've done that and given the gaffer a lot to think about."

Shaw is no stranger to life in the premier division of Non League football after making over 100 appearances for last years champions Burton Albion and making a further 30 appearances during loan spells at Gateshead, Crawley and Barrow.
