

### **WELCOME TO THE MATCH**

Good afternoon and welcome to the supporters of Crawley Town FC and Luton Town. Crawley Town Football Club is committed to helping the campaign to kick Racism out of Football. Many fans, players, clubs and leagues have adopted a policy of Zero Tolerance and that includes us here at Crawley Town Football Club. One incident is an incident too many! Anyone found to be racially abusing fans, players or others will be reported to the police and banned not only from the Broadfield Stadium, but from all stadiums in this country. The following are arrestable offences under the Football (Offences) Act 1991, as amended by the Football (Offences and Disorder) Act 1999

- a) The throwing of any object within the ground without lawful authority or excuse
- b) The chanting of anything of an indecent or racist nature
- c) The use of threatening behaviour, foul or abusive language
- d) The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse

Anyone who uses insulting or improper conduct towards the Match Officials will be removed from the Ground. CCTV cameras are in use around and in the Ground and the Club may itself use or pass to the Police or any Football Authority, any recordings for use in any proceedings. The Club reserves absolutely the right to eject from the Ground any person failing to comply with any of the Ground Regulations or whose presence within the Ground is, or could, reasonably be constructed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to any other person. This could lead to further action by the Club including, but not limited to, the withdrawal of any season ticket (without reimbursement) and other benefits.

# This afternoon Luton Town are the visitors to The Broadfield Stadium and may I on behalf of everyone here at Crawley Town welcome them.

They are led here today by manager Richard Money, he has taken on the role of getting the pre-season favourites promoted back to The Football League at the first time of asking, but he will have learnt very quickly The Football Conference is no easy league to get promoted from. My teams have come up against those managed by my opposite number today when he was manager at Walsall and it would be fair to say they were excellent matches with nothing given by either team.

Today does resemble a David and Goliath situation given the history and size of both clubs but we all know how that story finished. I read recently that Richard Money believes his team will give a team a good hammering shortly and having watched a DVD of their match last week with Wimbledon that does not really surprise me at all. Today's opposition have quality all over the pitch, from goalkeeper Mark Tyler, to Nicholls, to Gallen they are a side who have it all. Young Asa Hall has been in excellent form for them and I know how talented he is as it was myself who gave him his debut in The Football League when I signed him as a youngster on loan from Birmingham City.

My team selection options are fairly limited versus that of my opposite number today; we really do not have many permutations to select from when you consider we have fifteen players in our first team squad and two of those are goalkeepers. Yes I accept we have two or three youngsters backing that up but they are a long way away from being ready to play in The Blue Square Premier never mind against the likes of Luton Town. Take a second and consider that Luton Town have thirty-one players in their first team squad, that is over twice what we have but all that will count for nothing come kick-off this afternoon, as it will be eleven men from Luton Town versus eleven men from Crawley Town!

In my career as a manager I have come up against today's opponents on two

occasions. Earlier this season we got well beaten when we travelled to Bedfordshire and no excuses can be offered for a team who were far superior to ourselves. My previous match against them was a Carling Cup match when I was manager at Boston United; we won that match 4-3 after extra time in a classic of a match that had Premiership Fulham waiting for the winners in the next round. I recall from that night the wonderful support Luton Town supporters gave their team and having watched them on a few occasions this season I would expect more of the same today, so our own supporters here will need to be in full voice.

After today we are back on our travels in midweek when we travel to face an in-form Salisbury City. That is never an easy place to go, the playing surface is never good and you need to be ready for a battle from the first whistle. To follow that we travel to face Stevenage Borough next Saturday, so it would be fair to say this is the start of a tough week for us. It will be very important that we get the preparations right to ensure our players are fresh, hungry and ready to play. In an ideal world we would have a few more options within the squad to freshen the team up but without going over old ground that is not an option. This football club has a strategy to be totally debt free by the summer and that is on

course to happen. I cannot think of many clubs, including today's opponents, who would not love to be in that situation.

I genuinely believe that next season will be even more difficult as everyone continues to be more careful with the money they have to spend. Players at this level and perhaps one or two leagues higher, will realise that the monies they have earned in recent years is not going to be available. When we all read that a Premiership club can go into Administration then it really is time for all to understand what we are all facing.

As a manager I would just love the opportunity to build and develop a squad without the best players repeatedly being sold but sadly I have had to work like this to enable my clubs to survive. I do believe that Luton Town manager Richard Money would have more concerns about playing here today if we had the likes of Steve Fletcher, Jon Paul Pittman, Danny Bulman, Jamie Cook and Jake Wright on top of what I have available to select from but maybe one day I will have the luxury of that.

This football club has been in existence well over one hundred years and this afternoon we face the highest calibre of opposition ever in a competitive league fixture. We should all enjoy the occasion but I know full well it will only be truly remembered by our supporters if we pull off the shock result of the day.

#### CUVIACEDEBG

#### MARK TYLER

Hugely experienced goalkeeper who signed a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road in June 2009 to become Mick Harford's fifth signing of the summer following his release from Peterborough United.

Mark made 483 appearances in 15 years at London Road and was rewarded for his loyalty with a testimonial against Liverpool in 2007.

After falling down the pecking order at Posh he found first team opportunities hard to come by and in 2008/09 he was loaned out to League 2 Bury where he made 11 appearances for the Shakers.

A former England Youth international, Tyler was handed the number one shirt by the Hatters boss who admitted he'd failed in an attempt to sign the stopper the previous summer.

#### SHANE GORE

Former Wimbledon stopper who arrived at Kenilworth Road on a short-term deal on the eve of the 2009/10 season.

He came through the ranks at Selhurst Park at a time when Mick Harford was a coach with the Dons but could only make one substitute appearance before leaving for Peterborough in 2003.

Shane has also had spells with Barnet and Stevenage and featured for Maidenhead United in 2008/10 prior to joining the Hatters.

#### DEFENDERS

#### **CLAUDE GNAKPA**

A defender capable of playing centre back or full back, who joined on a free transfer in August 2008.

Having plied his trade across Europe with Montpellier HSC, Racing de Santander, Deportivo Alaves and FC Vaduz of Liechtenstein, Claude moved to Swindon Town for a brief spell.

He was then off again in July 2007 to Peterborough United and was a regular in the League Two promotion winning side, starting 25 league games.

#### KEITH KEANE

Having made his debut as a 16-year-old in November 2003, Keith Keane went on to enjoy an extended run in the side from February onwards whilst Kevin Foley was out injured.

Such was the contribution he made that the return of Foley didn't signal the end of his involvement at first-team level and he finished the season with 14 appearances under his belt, all this whilst still in the first year of his scholarship.

Another of the youth team who regularly appears for the Republic of Ireland at schoolboy level, he joined the Hatters at the age of nine having been scouted in local football, and has made a rapid progression through the club's centre of excellence and youth teams, demonstrating enough potential to convince Mike Newell to give him his first taste of senior action.

Keith has featured most prominently on the right of midfield, bursting forward to great effect to provide many goals for himself and his team-mates.

Capable of playing right the way across the back four or in midfield the only positions he's not featured for the Town (yet) are in goal and up-front.

#### GEORGE PILKINGTON

Highly experienced defender who joined the club on a free transfer in August 2008. Having began his career as an Everton trainee, Pilkington joined Port Vale in June 2003, after a loan spell at Exeter City. Having started 223 league games for the Valiants, the highly regarded defender was named player of the year twice and club captain.

#### **JAKE HOWELLS**

The young left back came through the ranks at Kenilworth Road and made his first team debut as a second half substitute in May 2008. He made his full debut in the Hatters colours away at Bradford City in October 2008.

After making 36 appearances for the Hatters in the 2008/09 he was rewarded for his efforts with a professional contract in May.

#### **JANOS KOVACS**

Giant Hungarian-born defender who signed for the Hatters in January 2010 from League Two side Lincoln City.

Kovacs enjoyed 18 months at Sincil Bank before being placed on the transfer list by boss Chris Sutton.



A cult hero in Lincolnshire he joined the Imps following a successful spell with Chesterfield where he spent two years.

#### SHANE BLACKETT

Luton-born Shane became Mick Harford's sixth summer signing of 2009 after penning a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road from Peterborough United.

Equally adept at centre-back or at leftback, Shane began his career with Dunstable Town before a switch to Arlesey Town in 2003.

His form with the United Counties side alerted the attentions of Dagenham & Redbridge who signed the 6ft 3in defender in May 2004.

He made 83 appearances during his time at Victoria Road and helped the Daggers win the Conference title and earn promotion to the Football League in 2006/07.

His reputation as a pacey defender alerted the attention of Peterborough who snapped him with Dagenham team-mate Craig Mackail-Smith in January 2007 going onto make 38 appearances during his time with the London Road outfit.

#### FREDDIE MURRAY

Left-footed versatile defender who joined the Hatters on a six-month loan deal from Blue Square Premier side Grays Atheltic in August 2009 and was made permanent in January 2010.

Murray only signed for the Essex club in August before making his debut for the Town in the 4-1 victory over Mansfield Town just hours after putting pen to paper.

Previously with Northampton Town, Stevenage Borough and Cambridge United Freddie began his career as a trainee with Blackburn Rovers.

#### MIDFIELDERS

#### ADAM NEWTON

Ascot-born Adam became Mick Harford's second summer signing after agreeing a twoyear contract at Kenilworth Road following his release from Brentford.

Predominately used as a right winger, the pacy wide man is equally as comfortable at right-back.

Adam started his career at West Ham United, coming through the Hammers' respected academy but could only make three substitute appearances during his time at Upton Park before signing for Peterborough United in May 2002.

The former England Under 21 international went onto make a name for himself with the Posh making 249 appearances in six years at London Road going onto win promotion at the end of the 2007/08 campaign.

After leaving Peterborough at the end of the 2007/08 season, Adam was snapped by Andy Scott and Brentford where he helped the Bees to the League Two title.

A St Kitts and Nevis international, he has spent time on-loan at Portsmouth, Notts County and Leyton Orient.

#### **ROSSI JARVIS**

Adaptable player who can play on the left or right hand side of defence or midfield. Jarvis came through the Norwich City youth system, becoming the youngest player to appear for the reserve team at the tender age of 14. He went on to spend loan periods at Torquay United and Rotherham United and after finding first team opportunities hard to come by Jarvis joined Luton Town in August 2008 on a free transfer.

#### ASA HALL

Versatile player capable of playing in midfield or defence. Hall began his football career in Wolverhampton Wanderers youth system, before signing his first professional contract with Birmingham City in 2004. While at the Blues he was a regular in the reserve team and was named young player of the year in the 2004/05 season. He also received caps for England at Under-19 and Under-20 levels and went on to have loan spells with Boston United, Ashford Town and Shrewsbury Town, starting 13 games for the latter.

#### KEVIN NICHOLLS

Kevin Nicholls needs no introduction to most Hatters fans. The hardworking midfielder enjoyed six successful seasons at Kenilworth Road between 2001 and 2006, captaining the side to the League One title in the 2004-2005 season.

Nicholls began his career at Charlton Athletic, before moving to Wigan Athletic in 1999, where he made 28 appearances in two years. He moved to Luton in 2001, and in the next six seasons went on to appear 175 times, scoring 30 goals.

Following Luton's successful first-season in The Championship and the spirited FA-Cup performances, Nicholls was a player very much in demand.

He moved to Leeds United for £700,000 in July 2006 and was made club captain by

then boss Dennis Wise. However, his very public fall-out with Wise saw him fall down the pecking order at Elland Road, and the following summer he moved to Preston North End for a fee of £750,000.

His time at Preston began encouragingly, however a change in the management team saw his first-team opportunities limited. Kevin was delighted to re-sign for Luton, signing a three-year deal in August 2008 and being named as club captain.

#### FORWARDS

#### TOM CRADDOCK Originally a defender, Tom

developed into a promising forward who has done well at youth and Reserve team levels with Middlesbrough. He was the eighth member of Boro's 2004 FA Youth Cup-winning side to progress to first team level, following James Morrison, Tony McMahon, Andrew Taylor,

Johnson and Jason Kennedy.

David Wheater, Matthew Bates, Adam

He joined the Hatters on-loan from the Riverside in October 2008 and scored twice on his debut in a 2-2 draw with Grimsby Town. Two further goals followed in the games against Bury and Chesterfield and once his loan expired Mick Harford moved quickly to snap up the striker on a permanent basis.

A £80,000 bid was accepted by Middlesbrough and Tom signed a two-and-half year contract in January 2009. He has previously spent spells on loan with Wrexham and Hartlepool United.

#### LIAM HATCH

The 6ft 3in Striker signed for the Hatters on a season-long loan from Peterborough United in June 2009.

Hatch started his career with Herne Bay before a move to neighbours Gravesend & Northfleet in 2001.

A successful spell at Stonebridge Road saw him transferred to Barnet for £17,500 where he helped the Bees to promotion to the Football League with 11 league goals in the 2004/05 campaign.

His form at Underhill alerted the attention of Peterborough United who paid £150,000 for the striker's services.

With first team opportunities limited at London Road Hatch was sent on-loan to Darlington during the 2008/09 campaign where he hit nine goals in 29 league and cup appearances at the Darlington Arena.

#### MARK NWOKEJI

Lightening quick striker with superb goalscoring record at non-league level who

signed on loan until January from League Two outfit Dagenham & Redbridge.

#### MATTHEW BARNES-HOMER

Prolific striker who joined the Hatters initially on a month's loan from Kidderminster Harriers and has agreed a two-and-a-half year contract to move permanently when the transfer window re-opens on 1st January.

After notching 21 goals in all competitions last season, the powerful forward has scored nine times in 20 league appearances this term and, since arriving at the Worcestershire club in 2007, has hit an impressive tally of 34 goals in 77 starts.

Barnes-Homer also enjoyed a dream start to his international career when he netted the winner on his debut for England C in their 2-1 win over Poland in November.

An energetic talent, the front man began his career as a trainee at Wolves before going on to lead something of a nomadic life prior to finding his feet at Kidderminster.

After leaving Molineux he tried his luck in the United States before returning to England and, following success with a clutch of non-league sides, Barnes-Homer was snapped by Wycombe Wanderers.

He struggled to make an impression at Adam Park but, after being released at the end of the 2006/07 season, Harriers manager Mark Yates beat off competition from a host of sides to capture his signature.


His form in front of goal at Kidderminster had alerted the attentions of a number of Football League teams but Barnes-Homer was suitably impressed by the Hatters' vision and became Richard Money's first signing for the club.

#### KEVIN GALLEN

A Shepherds Bush native, Gallen established himself as something of a legend at QPR.

He notched up over 400 appearances and hit 97 goals for the R's in two spells spanning nearly 14 years. Gallen joined Huddersfield 2000 and after 10 goals in 30 starts for the Terriers, Gallen moved across Yorkshire to join Barnsley the following summer, but the call of West London saw him return to QPR within a few months. He scored nine goals in 16 league starts for MK Dons before joining Luton on loan.

After a successful loan spell Gallen joined permanently in January 2009, signing until the end of the season before agreeing a one year contract extension with the club in May keeping him at Kenilworth Road until June 2010.


There will be a great atmosphere at The Broadfield today so get behind the lads and make plenty of noise for Crawley Town!



#### GOALKEEPER Simon Rayner has had an outstanding season, his second at the club, thanks to performances of a consistently high standard.

In this exclusive interview, he reveals that the targets he set himself at the start of the season and have already been exceeded and looks ahead to today's big game against Luton

#### Are you enjoying this season so far?

Yes of course, why wouldn't 1? This is the best job in the world.

#### Last season you received quite a lot of criticism from Reds fans, how did you deal with that?

Personally I try not to get involved too much with negative comments whether that be from fans or anybody else.

Negativity is pointless, constructive criticism yes but blatant negativity like that I just ignored.

## This season you have put in some outstanding performances, fans awarded you player of the month for September and player of the match last Saturday at Wrexham. Are you feeling more confident?

I feel better in myself, I feel that I am having a decent season so far. At the start I set myself a target of 10 clean sheets and I have achieved that now I will try for 15. To be honest I am just happy to be playing more than anything else.

### You put in an outstanding performance against Wrexham, was it disappointing to lose the match after playing so well?

We are always disappointed to lose any match but Saturday was particularly frustrating after we played so well. In the first half we did very well, we controlled the tempo of the game and dictated to them but in the second half it was just a completely different game. The old cliché 'a game of two halves' springs to mind and it couldn't have been more true on Saturday, we just didn't get going.

#### Has it helped having Nick Jordan train with you this season and pushing for a starting place?

Yes, definitely. I didn't have anyone really pushing last season and my training partner was one of the youth team players. When you have a number two there is a constant threat and earlier in the season it was proved that if I don't perform as well as I know I can then I will find myself sitting on the bench. Nick is a great training partner and a good lad. We

support each other well, he picks up on things during matches and points them out to me afterwards and I can do that for Nick when he plays in reserve-team matches.

#### Are you looking forward to today's match against Luton Town?

Definitely. I look forward to every game that's why I do this job. I didn't play at Luton and that was a big game to miss out on. It doesn't matter if it was Luton or Farsley Celtic, I want to play every game. They are a big club with big support and we need the three points — that's what is comes down to more than anything else.

#### Do you look for any other football results come 5pm on Saturday?

I am more concerned with what's going on with us, I look for the results of teams who are around us in the table, I look at what points we have and where we need to be. Every now and then I will speak to my dad and he will keep me informed as to how all my old teams are doing. I can't lie, I like to see Torquay lose but that is more to do with the manager than anything else. I am very focussed on Crawley Town and what we are doing.

### How did you come to be playing professional football in England when you were born and brought up in Canada?

My father is from Essex so he was more aware of soccer than any other sport. I started playing soccer when I was four, mainly to keep me fit for baseball. In Canada soccer and baseball took place during opposite seasons, Soccer was from fall to spring and Baseball from spring to fall. So it was really to keep me busy during the off season but I was betterplaying football than I was baseball and it was my ambition to play professional soccer from a very young age. My parents always said it wasn't going to happen and told me to pay attention in school but I concentrated on playing soccer and came over to England when I was just 16 and was lucky enough to land a professional contract with Bournemouth. I was playing men's football at home at 15/16 but it was a big step for me to leave home at such a young age. I do miss home, I miss my mum and dad but I wouldn't have had the same opportunities over there as I

I plan to play over here for as long as I possibly can and then if I want I can move back there.

#### Where do you see yourself in ten years time?

Ten years time, I'll be 36/37 – I don't know. I'd like to still be playing.

#### Does management interest you?

Not at all to be honest, I don't think I am cut out to be a manager. I would like to coach and I could see myself coaching but if you'd asked me that two years ago I would have said no to coaching so maybe the idea of managing will grow on me as I get older. If I was to stay in football I would be more inclined to get involved in physiotherapy - that would interest me.

#### What do you think you would be doing if you didn't make it as a professional footballer?

I would have been a chef, I just enjoy cooking, it's a passion of mine so I would've definitely chosen a career in cooking.

#### What is the most important match you have played in or most important save you have ever made?

The most important save that stands out was a very long time ago when I was in Wales, it was the Welsh FA Cup final, I saved a penalty when the score line was 2-1 and we went on to win it 4-1 so that was pretty crucial. The most important game – there have been a few, when I was at Torquay there were the play-offs they were important and the season before we were fighting for survival and they were also tough matches. My first match for Canada was a big one – there have been lots of games that have been equally big.

#### Where do you think Crawley Town will finish this season?

I would hope that we could still make the play-offs, but I am a realistic person and I understand that is a tall order but I would like to see us finish higher than we did last season. There is still the belief in the dressing room that we can reach the play-offs. The lads know there is a chance but if we can finish a couple of place higher than we did last season it would still be an incredible achievement. It has been well documented that Crawley Town has a small budget and a small squad and that does make it hard for us to compete with the big clubs in this tough league.

#### Would you like to stay with Crawley Town next

Yes, definitely. I have said it many times in the press and I will say it again - I want to stay, I am happy here, I like the area, I like the club and I like the people here.

## SLEEPINGGIANT



THIS is not the most important game in Crawley's history. The promotion clinching games in the old Southern League, the FA Cup game at Brighton and the home cup tie against Northampton have all carried more significance. It's up to you in what order you place them

#### writes Bruce Talbot.

But have Reds ever been involved in a bigger match than today's tussle with Luton Town? I would suggest not.

Be honest, what was the first fixture you looked up when they came out last summer? Eastbourne Borough? With all due respect to our 'local' rivals probably not. No, it would have been the visit of the big clubs, the ex-Football League outfits like Oxford, Cambridge, AFC Wimbledon and, the biggest of them all, Luton.

I don't necessarily think you have to be a Hatters' fan to have a Luton Town memory. They are one of those clubs whom the average football fan knows a fair bit about.

Those of us who are old enough will

remember the last day of the 1982-83 season when Raddy Antic's late goal secured their first division place. I can still remember watching Match of the Day and seeing David Pleat (pictured), looking particularly fetching in his brown jacket and matching slacks, doing a jig of delight on the Maine Road pitch after they had beaten Manchester City. It's got to be worth re-visiting on You Tube.

Then there were Luton's two League Cup final appearances at the end of the 1980s – Brian Stein's last-minute winner and Andy Dibble's penalty save as they came from behind to beat Arsenal and the defeat to Nottingham Forest two years later in 1989.

Your memory of Luton might just be the riot during the game against Millwall in 1985 which led to a ban on visiting fans at Kenilworth Road or, more recently, a couple of cracking FA Cup ties against Liverpool.

Hard to believe now, but Luton were a Championship side just four years and not one bumping along at the bottom. Under Mike Newell they took some considerable scalps in the 2005-06 season including Birmingham.

I mention that as a Blues fan because in October 2006 we lost 3-2 at Kenilworth Road in front of 9,275 fans. I was talking about that game last week with an old friend of mine who has followed Luton all his life and is still a season-ticket holder. As he filed out of Kenilworth Road that afternoon and you'd told him that threeand-a-half years later his team would be playing non-league football he'd have thought you were as deranged as that dance David Pleat did back in 1983. But here they are at the Broadfield Stadium today playing Crawley Town and with no guarantee that their exile from the Football League will only last for a

A club of Luton's size brings massive expectation among the fan base. When Reds visited Kenilworth Road in September they had a host of players missing through injury and on the way to the game Steve Evans discovered that Jamie Cook had been sold back to Oxford.

Reds did a good job of frustrating the home side and you could sense a growing unease among the Luton fans before they broke the deadlock. They ran out comfortable 3-0 winners but there have been lots of similar games at Kenilworth Road this season which haven't always ended with a home win.

Crawley will be a lot stronger today, providing Charlie Ademeno and Glenn Wilson are fit, but they will still be slight underdogs and there is every possibility that the home support will be outnumbered. That shouldn't make too much difference providing the Crawley fans who are here get behind their side. What is guaranteed is a decent atmosphere at the Broadfield for a change. As for the game itself, Crawley never seem to have any problem getting 'up' for matches against the big clubs. Steve Evans' team-talk will be on his briefest of the season.

Personally, I hope Luton do go straight back up. Their fans have had to put up with a lot in recent years, not least last year's 30 point deduction which seemed to have been imposed with no regard as to who it would hurt most – their fans. They are probably going to have to do it via the play-offs but after all their recent problems a day out at Wembley (and victory over rivals Stevenage in the final) is the least they deserve.

#### SALISBURY CITY

Next Tuesday is the re-arranged fixture away to Salisbury City at the The Raymond McEnhill Stadium. Crawley have already achieved a fairly comfortable 2-0 victory over them at home this season, and have a reasonable chance of collecting another three points when we travel to the South Coast.

Although, like nearly every team in the Conference, Salisbury have proven that they are no walkover. Since promotion to Non League's premier division during 2006/07 after beating Braintree Town in the Play Off final, they have looked very comfortable playing at a higher level. Despite all odds, they managed to consistently flirt with the play offs in their debut season, in the end missing out due to a loss of form in the final stages. In 2008/09 they topped the table in September and expectations were high, however, like so many in this league they ran into financial difficulties in late 2008. The clubs appeal for fans to raise £100,000 was not achieved and the squad that had been so successful up until that point was ripped apart in order to pay spiraling debts. Unfortunately since then things have got worse. The club was put up for sale for £1 and a buyer could still not be found, this



meant that they had to be placed into administration in the Summer of 2009, resulting in the standard 10 point penalty. The club are still in administration so it is perhaps not suprising that they find themselves battling relegation this year. Although it is a fight they are currently winning, Salisbury are eight points of the bottom four and look like they will beat the drop, however they are not safe yet.

In both of Crawley's previous visits there we have suffered defeat, the last being a dour 2-0 loss in front of the Setanta Sports cameras. Most Crawley fans will be aware of their very talented striker Matt Tubbs, who

was linked to a move to the Broadfield in August. Doubtless he will be looking to add to his impressive tally of 21 goals next Tuesday.

Any supporters travelling will have a hard job accessing the ground from a rail station, as the nearest is over two miles away. The best bet would be the Supporters Club coach, departing from the stadium 4.00pm and costing £20. Please contact Alain Harper for more information.

#### STEVENAGE BOROUGH

Road. They are particularly strong at home and Crawley will have an incredibly tough task on their hands when they play there.




