

Mansfield Town

Just four years ago, Hayes and Yeading, as separate entities, were battling for Conference South survival. Yeading, having just been promoted from England's seventh tier, were finding their feet somewhat better than Hayes, who were in the middle of a slump which saw them take just 10 points from 24 games, meaning only Michael Bartley's 89th minute winner on the final day meant Church Road hearts could beat a little slower. In stark contrast to the delight at Church Road that afternoon was the feeling of Luton Town supporters - disappointment at missing out a place in the play-offs for a place in the Premier League, our visitors today having just finished 10th in what is now known at The Championship - and so officially ended the season as the 30th best team in the English league. Some distance from the 20th place in Conference South being celebrated here at Church Road!

Today, however, the three sides meet (albeit with two now as one merged entity) and here's hoping everyone present can enjoy the game in the spirit it ought to be played in. No matter your bias, enjoy the game, and have a safe journey home after.

Fixtures All-Change

After the demise of Chester City, United found themselves with a three week gap in the fixture list, as the already re-arranged home game against Kidderminster had fallen by the wayside.

However, the gap has now been filled with the away game at Grays Athletic, which will now take place next Saturday, 13th March, 3pm kick-off. Also moving is the home game with Oxford United which has been moved forward 24 hours, and will now take place on Good Friday, 2nd April with a 3pm kick-off.

Also re-arranged again is the home Chester City's record in the game with Kidderminster Harriers, which will now be played on Thursday 22nd April, with a 7.45pm kick-off. The unusual Thursday date is due to the Harriers' fixture congestion, where they are now playing on every Tuesday through to the end of the season.

FOOTBALL CONFERENCE

Member clubs of the Football Conference, at a general meeting held today (Friday 26th February), voted in support of the Board of Director's recommendation to erase Chester City (2004) FC from membership in accordance with Article 5.2 of the Football Conference Ltd.

Chester City FC, although having the right to make a presentation to the member clubs against the recommendation, did not attend the meeting.

Following the general meeting the Board of the Football Conference convened and declared in line with Football Conference Rule 13.9 that

competition this season will be expunged. The resultant changes to the table which will affect other club records will not be activated until any right of appeal process has expired or such appeal dealt with.

For avoidance of doubt, Chester City FC can only appeal against the original decision of the Board in relation to Football Conference Rule 8.6 which relates to their recommendation to member clubs. There can be no direct appeal via the Football Association in respect of the decision by member clubs relating to Article 5.2.

Today's events are unparalleled in the history of our national sport and it is with much regret these circumstances have evolved.

The Football Conference are saddened that any club should meet such a fate and we sympathise with those who hold the club dear to their hearts, especially after a proud heritage of 125 years.

Whilst the decision of member clubs was taken in respect of the club failing to fulfil fixtures, behind these failures is a lesson to every club at whatever level they participate. Clubs have to live within their means and financial prudence can be the only way forward.



Luton certainly have a league club set-up and have all the infrastructure to make the step back into their rightful position into the Football League - and I expect them to do so before too long.






The Bjorn Supremacy...





Born on 10th December 1980, Ram represented Norway at youth level but may also have apparently qualified for Nigeria. We were originally going to celebrate this



achievement in the matchday programme for the postponed Kidderminster Harriers game back in December, but better late than never!

Ram began his English football career as a trainee at Leyton Orient in 1997, but didn't manage to break into the first team so in 1998 he joined Erith & Belvedere of the Southern League Eastern Division. As programme editor Brian Spurrell says "We knew he would play at a higher level. It was

quite a buzz to have our team selection affected by international call-ups."

Ram started the 2002-03 season at Ilford in the Essex Senior League, but soon moved to the other side of the world to join Tauranga City United, who had been formed by the 2001 merger of Tauranga City FC and Mount Maunganui FC.

Tauranga is in the Bay of Plenty on the North Island of New Zealand, and a photo from their extensive tourist board website is shown above. Quite why anyone would swap the delights of East London for Tauranga is unclear. On his return to sub-tropical Essex, Ram spent a season in the Isthmian Premier with Grays Athletic. He then joined St Albans City in the newly formed Conference South, before spending a few months in Conference National with Dagenham & Redbridge.

Ram then returned to St Albans City in Conference South for promotion via the play-offs, and their subsequent relegation from Conference National.

Ram made his debut for Hayes & Yeading United (his third merged team) on 17th November 2007 in a 3-3 home draw against Sutton United. He initially signed on loan but made the move permanent in early 2008. He made his 100th appearance for us in our 1-1 draw at Barrow on 5th December.

A trainee at Wolves he lead something of a nomadic life prior to finding his feet at Kidderminster. After leaving Molineux he tried his luck in the United States before a clutch of nonleague sides in England then Wycombe Wanderers.



Jordan Patrick

Promising young forward who became the youngest ever player to feature for the Hatters. Made his first team debut as a substitute at Grimsby Town in October 2008



... and their history

Following a merger between local clubs. Wanderers and Excelsior, 'Luton Town Football Club' was formed on April 11th

Early games consisted of friendlies, apart from annual excursions into the English Cup as it was then named. They became founder members of the Southern League in 1894 and finished runners-up to Millwall in each of the first two seasons. An initial bid for election to the Football League failed and saw a season in the United League before acceptance into Football League Division Two in 1897. Predominantly northern based, the high travel costs become too much and after three years they re-joined the Southern League.

After several seasons of mid-table obscurity they suffered relegation to Division Two where most of the teams were based in Wales. Promotion back to Division One came two years later, in

After hostilities ceased, the Southern League formed a new Division Three of the Football League which Town enjoyed for 17 seasons before promotion to Division Two. Two seasons later over Easter 1939, a series of good results forced the team into promotion positions, but a draw and two defeats from the final three games meant that they missed out. Unfortunately, no-one will ever know how far this squad could have progressed as in September 1939, with Town sitting top of the table, war broke out. After a seven-year break, it was back to a few seasons of mid-table mediocrity. Town just missed out on promotion in both 1953 and 1954 but the following season clinched runners-up spot on goal average.

The Town swept all before them early in the following season and were the talk of the football world after beating Newcastle, Blackpool, Wolves and league leaders Sunderland in quick succession, and all by big scores with mid-table their final finish.

Eighth position in 1957/58, their highest ever, was followed by an FA Cup run the next season seeing off Leeds, Leicester, Ipswich and Blackpool before Norwich in the semi-final. The final itself was a massive disappointment with ten man Nottingham Forest winning comfortably 2-1.

A 1959/60 bottom finish saw relegation after five years at the top and a bottomhalf finish the next season. 1961/62 saw mid-table before another relegation to Division Three at the end of 1962/63. Only a 9game unbeaten run prevented a further drop the next season but the stay of execution was only temporary as the Town, only six years from their FA Cup Final appearance, slumped to the football basement in 1965 amidst apathy and crowds of less than 3.000.

It was not until Town secured the title ion 1968 that they began to move up again. In 1969/70 aided by the goalscoring exploits of a £17,500 signing from Fulham, Malcolm Macdonald, a further promotion was attained.

After financial problems it took until 1973/74 before promotion from Division Two was achieved. Yet after one season at the top they were back down and the brief stay at the top had more financial repercussions and by the middle of the following season only the eleventh hour sale of midfield favourite Peter Anderson prevented the club from folding. In early 1978 reserve team coach David Pleat took first team charge. After near misses of a return to Division One in 1980 and 1981 promotion came twelve months later. The installation of an artificial pitch in the summer of 1985 was warmly greeted initially by the footballing press but gradually mutterings of discontent grew and by the time the Town went back to grass in 1991 they had reached a crescendo. Also unpopular was the decision to ban away supporters in the wake of damage caused by so-called Millwall supporters in an FA Cup match at Kenilworth Road. Perversely, it was during this period that the Town enjoyed the most successful period in their history. A position of ninth in the table was reached in season 1985/86 at the end of which David Pleat joined Tottenham. His replacement, John Moore - a stalwart defender from the Fourth Division days - led the Town to their highest ever placing in Division One of seventh in 1986/87 before resigning for his assistant, Ray Harford, to preside over

a 1987/88 season which included three trips to Wembley as well as an FA Cup semi-final. Defeat in the Simod Cup final, the Mercantile Credit Centenary Tournament and the FA Cup semi-final were forgotten on 24th April 1988, when an army of 35,000 Luton supporters saw the Hatters win their first major trophy beating Arsenal 3-2 at Wembley in the Littlewoods Cup Final.

The Hatters were defeated in the Littlewoods Cup final the following year and only a last gasp home win saved Town from relegation. Relegation did come in 1992 after 10 years at the top. Another FA Cup semi-final was reached in 1994 but the following season another relegation.

Two periods in the hands of receivers as well as a season in the football basement were to follow in the next period before promotion as Runners up in the Third Division in 2001/02 then the League One Championship in 2004/

However, amid more financial problems relegation followed in 2006-07 and 2007-8 (after another administration, In 2008 with new owners set to take full control of the club in the summer, The Hatters prepared themselves to begin their League 2 campaign with 15 points deducted for failure to agree to a CVA (Company Voluntary Agreement).

However the Football League decided that administration for the third time in nine years, required further punishment another five points. Worse still a Football Association investigation for past financial irregularities saw a further 10 points docked by the FA which meant the club had to start the season with an incredible 30 point penalty.

With almost a whole new squad the club battled hard to overcome the deficit. The season was also brought to life by the club's run in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy which was won at Wembley with a 3-2 victory over Scunthorpe United in April. However, the burden of the points deductions proved too much and the club began this season in the Blue Square Premier after 89 years in the Football League.

Around the grounds...

Last Saturday Luton Town suffered their first defeat on their travels in the league since losing at Wrexham in September. Ben Smith hit two goals to keep Crawley Town's outside play-off hopes alive as they beat our visitors today at the Broadfield Stadium. Matt Barnes-Homer's first goal in two months looked to have rescued a point for the Hatters when he smashed home fellow sub Liam Hatch's low cross. But Smith, who had put Crawley ahead with a welltaken shot from just inside the box, his first goal in three months, added a second from close range with just 3 minutes left. The thousand-plus travelling Hatters following made up more than half the gate - they'll improve on that this afternoon I'm sure!

With leaders Oxford United and the second-placed contenders Stevenage Borough without games, York City had the chance to close the gap at the top on Saturday. However, Liam Enver-Marum scored the only goal as Eastbourne Borough stunned the Minstermen, ending their tenmonth unbeaten home record in the process. The goal came against the run of play, although City had failed to create many clear-cut chances beforehand. City's last home defeat came on 11th April 2009, a 2-1 reverse against Northwich, and 'Boro had won just two of their away games in the league this season. The victory moves Boro two points clear of the relegation zone and leaves York nine points behind leaders Oxford United, having played a game more.

Kidderminster Harriers, the latest in-form club, stretched their unbeaten run under new boss Steve Burr to eight games as they strolled to a comfortable home win against Histon at Aggborough. Brian Smikle put the Harriers ahead from close range inside 4 minutes and two goals in 3 second-half minutes from John Finnigan and Darryl Knights settled the game. Harriers' fourth straight home league win moves them to within seven points of the play-off zone.

Ten-man Grays Athletic's winless run extended to thirteen matches, but they battled to earn a point in a 1-1 draw with Altrincham at Moss Lane. Grays started the better of the two sides and they nearly took a shock lead when Duran Reynolds latched onto Jordan Wilson's corner to rattle the crossbar. The warning brought Altrincham into life and Chris Denham tested the handling of debutant 'keeper Glyn Garner with a 20-yard drive. But against the run of play, Grays looked like ending their baron run when Alsseny Cissoko converted Wayne Gray's left-wing centre in the 61st minute. Chris Senior rescued his side from embarrassment, though, linking up with Clee after 73 minutes to salvage a point as Harlee Dean was dismissed late on for Grays after picking up his second yellow card.

Play-off rivals Rushden & Diamonds and Kettering Town shared the points in a goalless draw in front of a crowd of just under 3,000 at Nene Park. Aaron O'Connor came closest to breaking the stalemate just before the hour mark but the home striker's 12-yard shot struck the post. The Diamonds had the better chances in the game with Lee Tomlin twice going close from the edge of the box early on. Kwesi Appiah's shot which flew wide was Kettering's best opportunity of the first half.

O'Connor then struck the post before James Dance threatened twice is as many minutes for the Poppies. His first shot flashed just wide while his second effort stung the palms of home keeper Dale Roberts.

An 89th-minute Matty Tubbs penalty salvaged a point for tenman Salisbury City. Christian Smith put Wrexham ahead with 20 minutes to go, deflecting in a Curtis Obeng shot that was going wide. Moments later Patrick Cox was sent-off for bringing down Andy Mangan when he was clear on goal. With minutes left Obeng fouled Chris Flood in the box and Tubbs stepped forward to all but end Wrexham's fading play-off hopes.

Former Chester City and Everton striker Nick Chadwick hit a hattrick as Barrow moved out of the relegation zone with a comfortable win over fellow strugglers **Ebbsfleet United** at Stonebridge Road, Jason Walker crossed for Chadwick to score from six yards to give the visitors a 27th minute lead. Chadwick scored again from close range almost immediately afterwards and completed his hat trick on 68 minutes when he nodded in a Paul Rutherford cross. Moses Ashikodi headed in to give Fleet hope 14 minutes from time but Leon Crooks handled in the box and Walker scored from the spot with 7 minutes remaining.

Gateshead's match with Forest Green Rovers, another sixpointer for both the clubs, was postponed. The relegationthreatened Tynesiders will now have only one home game next month after the clash with titlechasing Stevenage Borough had to be rescheduled - but potentially have 5 home games in April.





The eighth minute of the game was to prove pivotal for United's keeper Clark Masters who did well to dive and gather at the feet of an incoming Kyle Perry who in trying to get to a Jon Shaw centre clattered into the United stopper and despite continuing after treatment Clark had to be replaced on 20 minutes by Simon Overland.

With Masters still trying to recover it was good to see the ball being held high up the field by United. Dale Binns made it to the bye-line on the left before picking out James in the area, his shot striking the outstretched leg of Kyle Nix before flying over. The resultant corner saw a partly cleared ball fall to Binns whose volley bobbled

around before finding it's way to Matt Ruby who could get enough force on his shot and keeper Alan Marriott was able to save at the foot of his post.

Masters goal was threatened just before he was replaced when a long Marriott punt was helped on by Perry to Nix but the Stags midfielder sliced his effort wide from the edge of the area.

With Overland now in the United goal we move forwards to the final nine minutes of the half before the next chance worthy of comment. Binns with space on the left chipped the ball in towards the penalty spot, a scramble on the floor saw the ball run to Ram Marwa who was

denied from 8 yards as his drive was blocked away by Foster.

While dealing comfortably with the Stags forays towards the United goal, the home side continued to push back the Stags defence, on the counter-attack. Ed Harris headed clear for United and James picked up the ball before commencing a mazy run that saw him turn Jon Challinor inside out before switching the ball to his preferred right and hitting a shot that Marriott did well to grab diving to his left.

The breakthrough for United was just five minutes away though. Stags defender Scott Garner was a little too casual in possession, Steve Basham took the ball off his toes and played a neat interchange with Binns which saw the wide man advance into the box and fire across Marriott into the far corner of the Stags goal.

Stoppage time almost brought an equaliser for Mansfield, Challinor, Gary Silk and Shaw combined down the right flank and as the latter's cross was met at the near post by Harris, the ball seemed to spin off his shin and fly just wide of Overland's upright.

It was all change at the start of the second half, assistant referee Carl Brook took over the whistle from the referee Ian Cooper who was feeling unwell and Stags boss David Holdsworth made two changes by throwing Ryan Williams and Blair Sturrock into the fray in place of Perry

and Nix.

Chances in the second half were to be very few and far between. The half was just a few minutes old when United appeared to have a real let off as the ball struck Green's arm in the area but this seemed to go unnoticed by the officials, much to the defender's relief.

The next opening came with an hour played when Marriott was required to keep out and Adam Green freekick which he did with little concern. Minutes later at the other end, Nicholas tried his luck from a wide left position, hitting a rasping drive that just cleared Overland's crossbar before Challinor met a Willaims freekick only to be denied by a superb Overland save as he clawed away his point blank header.

Fifteen minutes of play that really lacked any creativity followed and we

moved into the final six minutes before either goal was threatened again. One of several long throws from Nicholas finally found it's target as Duffy flicked the ball on the Sturrock who could not get a good connection and Overland dived down to save at the foot of his post.

The 90th minute arrived and an error by Overland saw the Stags finally brake the resolute United defence. Williams, who had been a thorn in the side since his introduction, chipped the ball into the six yard box where Overland, who was surrounded by bodies, appeared to get both hands to the ball before letting it slip through his fingers and onto the toe of Silk who forced home an equaliser for Mansfield.

An occasional look back to times past in Yeading & Hayes' history - We go back 5 years

It is very hard to find words to describe a Hayes performance that saw the Missioners suffer their worst home defeat since September 2001 when Doncaster Rovers returned home with the same victorious scoreline in the National Conference, all I will say is that this time "unlucky" is not one of them.

The Missioners had Yiadom Yeboah and Stuart Goodall playing after passing fitness tests, and manager Willy Wordsworth also gave a debut on the right side of midfield to Richard Harris while leaving the experienced Jon Case on the bench.

It was in fact Hayes who could have taken the lead with just six minutes played, a high ball forwards was controlled by Kieran Knight before hitting a shot that deflected wide off Neil Sharp. Within five minutes the visitors breached the Hayes defence for the first time, a Robbie Pethick free-kick into the box was well controlled by Dean Holdsworth

and his lay off to David Town saw the ex. Hayes loanee fire past Kevin Davies The Hawks were then just off Hayes FC

target with a dipping Robbie Pethick drive before a Knight run at the other end saw him feed David Warner only for Gareth Howells to save well in the visitors goal. The Missioners then had their best chance of the half. Stuart Tanfield hooked the ball back from right on the bye-line Knight took a touch before shooting past Howells only to see his shot come back off the left upright.

As the break neared, the Hawks were to take a two goal lead, Adam Everitt slid in to make an excellent blocking tackle in the middle of the box but then having followed the play to the right, the cross struck his arm and a spot kick was harshly awarded but duly dispatched by Holdsworth.

Hayes did have a chance to reduce the arrears a minute before the break but David Warner's chip towards Knight was tipped by Howells and hooked clear by Jordan.

Early in the second period a fine Tanfield cross found David Warner but the strikers effort was weak and failed to trouble Howells while at the other end James Mackie dragged a shot wide when well placed. The respite was to only last a couple of minutes however, a right wing cross by Pethick being totally misjudged by an obviously struggling Yeboah

leaving Town to slam the ball into

Just after the hour Tanfield was somewhat surprisingly replaced by Shaun McAuley while six minutes later the ineffective Harris was replaced by Case. In between the two substitutions both sides had good chances to add to the score. Davies allowed a cross to go straight through his hands but thankfully Everitt was there to clear off the line while for Hayes David Warner and Knight scrapped for the ball outside the area with keeper Howells, only for Knight's chip to sail over the bar.

McAuley saw an effort fly across goal and wide before Havant slotted home their fourth just as Yeboah had limped off injured. Davies did well to push away a 20 yarder from Robbie Pethick before blocking a Holdsworth header from the resultant corner, the loose ball fell to Tom Jordan whose first

attempt was blocked on the line by Kevin Warner only for the Hawks centre-half to net with his next

Worse was yet to come for the dishevelled Missioners defence as an 87th minute cross from the impressive Pethick on the right saw Hawks substitute James Taylor tuck the ball past Davies virtually unchallenged.

A 90th minute Knight goal after an excellent pull back by Case could not calm the small but very disgruntled home crowd who were very vocal in their disapproval at Missioners totally unacceptable performance.
