

Good evening and welcome to all supporters to Kenilworth Road for tonight's Blue Square Premier match with Forest Green Rovers.

I would like to extend a warm welcome to David Hockaday, his players and staff, directors and supporters of Forest Green.

It has been a while since our last home fixture which ended in defeat against AFC Wimbledon on 20th February.

It was a hugely disappointing result - all defeats are, and all defeats hurt - but I thought we did not deserve to be on the losing side following such a performance.

Unfortunately, we failed to take the positives from the game against AFC Wimbledon to Crawley a week later when I thought we let ourselves down.

There were no excuses for what was a poor performance - a rarity for us given the record on our travels and thankfully we bounced back from two straight defeats by earning a valuable point from a tough trip to Mansfield last Tuesday.

It was a game that I thought we could have edged and it was frustrating to see a perfectly good goal from Jake Howells harshly ruled out for offside.

To keep a clean sheet at one of our Play-Off rivals was also pleasing all things considered coming off the back off the results against Wimbledon and Crawley.

From Mansfield to Hayes & Yeading where,

although we got back to winning ways, I had mixed reactions about.

While it is obviously pleasing to come away from any away match with three points I was angered at our inability to convert our chances into more goals.

The sheer fact that we were holding on to the win in the final minute was farcical. We need be better and, as I have said many, many times before, we need to be putting teams to the sword more convincingly that we are at

I have challenged the players to score more and improve our goal difference and with a bit of luck and endeavour that will start tonight.

We know Forest Green are capable, just like any side in this division, to cause us problems and we need to be wary that they will raise their game tonight.

We want to get out of this division while they are fighting for the lives to stay in it. Their result against a York side in the mix for promotion along with ourselves on Saturday just goes to show that we cannot afford to underestimate tonight's opponents.


This evening's game is the first of three consecutive home games and with eight of our last 12 games here we have a superb opportunity to further cement our position in the

DIRECTOR ANTONY BROWN LOOKS AHEAD TO THE FIRST OF THREE CONSECUTIVE MATCHES AT KENILWORTH ROAD

This evening we extend a warm welcome to our friends from the west of England in Forest Green Rovers and we wish them well for the remainder of the season.

Having just completed our third away game in succession it's nice to get back to Kenilworth Road as we approach the business end of the campaign.

It would be inappropriate not to praise the squad and the management staff for our excellent recent record on the road. Since we travelled to Kidderminster on the 10th October, we hadn't conceded a league goal in over four months - some eight games - prior to the defeat at Crawley.

Since then, the players have responded with another clean sheet in the draw at Mansfield last Tuesday and another away win at Hayes & Yeading on Saturday, which all adds up to nine clean sheets in 11 away games and only one defeat in the last 13 away games. Promotion form indeed!

The game at Mansfield on Tuesday demanded a resolute and professional performance as we had to withstand not only the physical aspect of the game, but as a team, we had to work hard and concentrate for 90 minutes.

It's ironic that FIFA, in conjunction with IFAB Football (International Association Board), last week decided against introducing technology into the English game. I raise this point because we have studied the video of the Mansfield match and the Jake Howells "goal" that was ruled out for offside was in fact on

Jake timed his run perfectly to get on the end of Liam Hatch's flick-on for what would have been the winning goal.

When the margin between winning and losing is so fine, I really do believe the sooner some sort of technology is introduced, the better for the good of the game.

Looking forward, we now have five of the next six and eight of the remaining 12 games at

With the majority of the squad fit we have to believe in ourselves to be good enough to accumulate enough points to achieve our goals come the end of the season.

I cannot stress enough what an important role you, the fans, will play over the coming two months or so.

We appreciate teams come to Kenilworth Road and tend to sit a bit deeper and get bodies behind the ball, which makes it difficult for us to break teams down, but as we approach the very important run in the end of the season, it's crucial we all stick together and make Kenilworth Road a fortress.

Much has been made recently about the condition of our pitch and the resulting games which have been postponed.

The real issue we have is the distinct lack of drainage and under-soil heating. Naturally we are addressing this for next season and beyond, but as this is a legacy of the lack of investment in this particular area over the past few years and the resulting costs involved to eradicate this problem are very significant.

As we make demands of the manager and the coaching staff to play the game the Luton way, we have a real dilemma.

Needless to say the process has already started and we will explore every possibility open to us in order to give the manager and players the best possible surface next season.

I would like to thank the volunteers who very kindly offered to help in our quest to clear the pitch of snow recently. Your help is appreciated.

The world of football was saddened last week by the death of Keith Alexander.

Keith was one of the true gentleman in the game and always found time to talk to anybody he came in contact with. I spoke to him last season about one of his players and he came across as

articulate and knowledgeable individual.

His managerial record at Lincoln was incredible, having been the only manager to lead his team to four Play-Offs consecutive appearances.

An achievement I doubt will be equalled in the modern game.

He also had an eye for talent, and when manager at Peterborough he signed George Boyd, Aaron McLean and Craig Mackail-Smith all from non-league football and who have all progressed significantly since.

A sad day indeed and our thoughts go out to Keith and his family.

The Town suffered their fifth defeat of the season at Kenilworth Road after promotion rivals AFC Wimbledon earned a 2-1 victory in the Blue Square

Nathan Elder put the Dons ahead but the Hatters hit back a minute later when Tom Craddock fired past visiting goalkeeper James Pullan to equalise.

However, despite dominating the game for long periods, the Town fell to their second defeat in three home fixtures when Wombles' striker Danny Kedwell netted from a tight angle to seal the points.

SATURDAY 27TH HEBRUARY

A run of 10 games without defeat away from home and a run of eight successive clean sheets on the road came to an end at Crawley.

Ben Smith opened the scoring for the Red Devils before substitute Matthew Barnes-Homer levelled things up with 12 minutes to play.

However, Smith scored his second of the game three minutes from time to end the Hatters' fine run of form away from Kenilworth Road.

TUESDAY 2ND MARCH

Play-Off rivals Mansfield hold the Town to a goalless draw at Field Mill.

In a game of few chances the Hatters have the better of the play and feel hard done by come the final whistle as Jake Howells sees an effort harshly ruled-out for offside.

SATURIDAY 6TH MARCH

The Town get back to winning ways after four matches without a victory with a 3-2 away day success at Hayes and Yeading United.

First half goals from Liam Hatch and Claude Gnakpa - from the penalty spot - put them in command at the break.

Despite the hosts rallying and cutting the deficit, Tom Craddock makes it 3-1 and although Hayes score a late second, the Town held on to secure all three points.



NEW DATE FOR HISTON CLASH

Our last scheduled fixture at Kenilworth Road, against Histon on 23rd February, was postponed only hours before kick-off due to a waterlogged pitch.

Barring any freak adverse weather

RECENT HISTORY:

Rovers' 18th place finish in the BSP last season could conceivably be recognised as a disappointment to the New Lawn faithful after Jim Harvey's side had topped the table at the end of August.

However, Harvey led the club to fine runs in the FA Cup - losing 4-3 in a thrilling tie against Championship Derby County - and the Setanta Shield, where they finished runners-up after a penalty shootout defeat to AFC Telford United.

The 2007/08 season saw Rovers finish eighth - their highest ever league position since their elevation to the non-league top flight in 1997/98.

Rovers have twice visited Wembley, winning on their first trip in the FA Vase in 1982 and losing in the FA Trophy final to Kingstonian in 1999.

At the beginning of the 2006/07 season the club swapped their Lawn ground for their New Lawn ground which held their highest attendance of

4,836 for Derby's visit last season.

MACT Forest Green are based in the small Gloucestershire town of Nailsworth which has a population of just over 6,000 people

THE MANAGER

DAVID HOCKADAY

As a player Hockaday clocked up over 650 appearances during his playing career with Blackpool, Swindon Town, Hull City, Stoke City and Shrewsbury Town, including five promotions with three as actual champions.

In 1995 he used his coaching skills to establish the Cirencester Football Academy, which turned out to be the forerunner of many similar schemes in the country and as a result was headed hunted by Graham Taylor in 2000 to take over the academy at Watford.

His time culminated in assisting the club to promotion to the Premiership in 2006 with a team constructed from a small financial base with half the team having come through the club's academy.

In 2007 he had a brief spell with MK Dons, before joining Southampton in the Championship, who he left at the end of the 2008/09 season.


Following the departure of Jim Harvey, Hockaday was quick to take his first managerial role at the New Lawn on 9th September.

Little did Ollie Thorne realise at the time but his match winner for Forest Green Rovers at the weekend was as welcomed in Northamptonshire and Bedfordshire as much as it was in Gloucestershire

While the Hatters were edging out Haves & Yeading on Saturday, Rovers' win over the Town's promotion rivals York City meant Rushden moved up to third with a win over Tamworth and the Hatters were able to draw level on points with the Minstermen.

Rovers' win over York was their third success in 10 matches in 2010 and the 2-1 victory took them to within two points of Gateshead, who currently occupy the spot above the relegation zone and who they face at the weekend following tonight's game at Kenilworth Road.

Danny Powell gave them the lead

with a cross-cum-shot midway through the first period and although Levi Mackin levelled for York in the 34th minute, Rovers were able to claim all three points 10 minutes into the second period thanks to substitute Thorne's header.

Forest Green will obviously arrive at Kenilworth Road buoyed by that result and it sends out a clear message to Richard Money's men of what tonight's visitors are capable of on their day.

And that's something that Rovers boss Dave Hockaday was keen to stress speaking after the York win.

He said: "We've looked all along for togetherness and a team spirit and we got that today for the whole match. We've put in a great team performance, we worked hard,

showed passion and we need another 12 of those.


"We can only control what we can control; we have to go out now and do it again. We've set the standards in terms of effort, endeavour and passion and that's what we need to do at Luton.

TERRY BURTON

GOALKEEPERS Terry Burton

Joined Rovers in August 2007 having previously played for Wantage Town and the Army. After proving what a good reliable goalkeeper he was, Terry left the Army and moved his family to the West. Claimed the number one shirt during last season with some fantastic saves, becoming a fans' favourite with his sense of humour.

Gavin Carlin

Left West Bromwich Albion during the close season to take up studies at Hartpury College. Born in Londonderry he has represented the Republic of Ireland between the posts at all age groups. Yet to make his first team appearance for Rovers since signing in September but at 6' 5" you will not miss him when he is there.

IDIEIFENIDIEIRS Lee Ayres

Joined Rovers around this time last season and his performance in the centre of defence was one of the main reasons why the club moved clear of the relegation zone. Born in Birmingham, he joined Walsall's youth academy and was spotted by Kidderminster Harriers playing in the Football League. Strong defender who can also score goals from corners and free-kicks, he was handed the captain's armband at the beginning of the campaign.

Jared Hodgkiss

One of the few players in the Blue Square Premier who can boast having made appearances in both the English and Scottish Premier Leagues. Jared has had experience with West Bromwich Albion and Aberdeen in his favoured position at right-back. Keen to get forward he is speedy and capable of delivering quality crosses from wide positions.



CURTIS McDONALD

Curtis McDonald

Cardiff-born defender who has represented Wales at youth level and at Under-21 and this season earned a callup to the Under-23 squad. Started his playing career in his home club academy and moved up through the ranks, playing first team match against Coventry City. After a loan spell with Accrington Stanley he played full time with Welsh Premier League club Carmarthen Town. Moved to Poland with MKS Swit before coming back to Britain.

loe O'Cearuill

London-born but qualified to play for the Republic Ireland, Joe he started his career at Watford and was then signed by Arsenal. Whilst at Highbury he went on to play two full internationals for his country before he went on loan to Brighton. Following a spell in the Irish Premier League with St Patricks, he returned to England this season and was snapped up by Rovers when they learned of his availability.

Mark Preece

Now one of the Rovers' longest serving players, Preece was recently awarded for completing 100 league matches for the Gloucestershire side. He started with his home club Bristol Rovers, last season was a turning point in his career as he has proved to be a stalwart in defence and started to build up a great partnership with Lee Ayres.


Ionathan Smith

Preston-born midfielder who came through the youth set-up at Morecambe. Jonathan had loan spells in his early playing career with Fleetwood Town and Bamber Bridge before moving south to Forest Green. Now in his third season with the club, he scored a tremendous FA Cup goal against Derby County last season.

Born in Bolton, David started his football career with Oldham Athletic but signed as an apprentice with Manchester United. He made a name for himself with Hull City where he made over 100 appearances. Short periods with Torquay, Chester and Telford followed before his career became more settled with Hereford United where he became a prolific striker. Another move saw him join Accrington Stanley where he helped them to promotion to the Football

League before he signed for Rovers last January from Barrow and he soon became the perfect partner for Andy Mangan.

Michael Fowler

Born in Barry, South Wales, Michael has had the honour of representing his country up to Under-21 level. He started his career at Crystal Palace and had loan spells at Stevenage Borough and Wrexham. He joined Rovers at the beginning of the season from Salisbury City and was earmarked as club captain only to be seriously injured in the final preseason match against Exeter City.

Conal Platt

Preston-born Conal has represented both English Schools and Republic of Ireland Under-19s. He was given a scholarship with Liverpool where he gained experience with both their youth and reserves and then joined Bournemouth. He started to show his full potential at the then Blue Square Premier club Weymouth, followed by a stint Rushden & Diamonds prior to joining Rovers in May 2008.

Craig Rocastle

Another recent recruit by David

Hockaday and a player he knows well. His first professional club was Chelsea and since then he has gone on to play for a number of Football League clubs, which included a Division One Play-Off win whilst at Sheffield Wednesday in 2005.

Paul Stonehouse



round second replay match. Wayne Turner scored the only goal of the game, on his 24th birthday, to secure a sixth round tie against Millwall.



The Hatters have played just three league games at Kenilworth Road on this date,

winning twice and losing once. In 1968 Luton beat Port Vale 2-0 with Ian Buxton and Bruce Rioch scoring the goals. It was 25 years later before another fixture at Kenilworth Road on 9th March when Oxford were beaten 3-1 in 1993. David Preece opened the scoring, before Nick Cusack equalised for the visitors iust before half time. Phil Gray restored Luton's lead, before Scott Oakes wrapped up the victory late in the game. In 1999 Fulham were comfortable 4-0 winners, with Alan White being sent off for the Hatters during the first half.



The only goal-less draw came in the first league meeting on this date, at Walsall in a Division 3 South game in 1929.

ON THIS DAY IN THE HATTERS' HISTORY



and it's happened three times. The first was in 1957 when the Hatters won 3-1 at Arsenal, Allan Brown netted a brace, and Gordon Turner scored from the spot in Luton's first ever win at Arsenal, a feat they repeated in December 1959 but haven't in 12 subsequent league and cup visits. The Town won by the same score-line at Hull in 1974 with Alan West, Peter Anderson and John Aston all scoring. The third occasion was at Kenilworth Road and the visit of Oxford in 1993, as detailed above.



Luton won 2-0 at Bristol City in 1935, with goals from Jack Ball and Frederick Roberts, but lost by the same score-

line at Huddersfield Town in 1963. The only scoring draw on this date was 2-2, when the Hatters travelled to Bolton Wanderers in 1960 for a First Divison match. Joe McBride and Gordon Turner netted the Town goals.



Mark Pembridge's first goal for Luton was scored at Villa Park on

this date in 1991. Derek Mountfield had put the Hatters into the lead when he headed into his own net, before Pembridge netted a second just before half time. Tony Cascarino scored for the home side, and Alec Chamberlain also saved a David Platt penalty as Luton held on for all three points. Coincidentally Pembridge's sixth, and last, goal for Luton was scored on 25th April 1992, against Villa.

The lowest attendance for a fixture played on

this date came when Luton travelled to Nene Park to play Rushden and Diamonds in 2002. Dean Crowe and Steve Howard scored in a 2-1 win, after Paul Hall had given the Diamonds the lead.

MATTHEW BARNES-HOMER CELEBRATES HIS EQUALISER

A goal three minutes from time from Crawley's Ben Smith condemned the Town to their first away defeat since September at the Broadfield Stadium.

The Red Devils' midfielder was first to meet Eddie Hutchinson's header across goal to give the home side all three points to break Hatters' hearts.

It had looked like the Town were going to earn a share of the spoils after substitute Matthew Barnes-Homer drove home Liam Hatch's cross with 12 minutes remaining.

Barnes-Homer's effort had equalised Smith's earlier strike - 10 minutes into the second period - when he robbed Kevin Nicholls of the ball inside the penalty area and poked home from close range from an acute angle.

Smith's first goal ended Towns' run of eight consecutive clean sheets away from home and 852 minutes without conceding.

The second half was much more

entertaining than a drab first with both sides struggling to test either goalkeeper in the opening 45 minutes.

In truth it was much the same at the beginning of the second period half until Smith popped up on the rightside of 18 yard box to fire the hosts ahead.

With the Town frustrated as they went in search of an equaliser, Richard Money introduced Claude Gnakpa, Barnes-Homer and Hatch to fray which eventually saw them level.

At that stage the visitors were in the ascendancy and a minute later they should have taken the lead when Gnakpa saw a shot saved at the bac post and Tom Craddock was denied by a deflection as he followed-up.

That chance ultimately proved costly as with three minutes on the clock a dubious free-kick awarded against Rossi Jarvis eventually led to the Red Devils' winner.





Paul joined Luton from Charlton and immediately his class and command at the back became apparent. He immediately formed a good partnership with Mal Donaghy. Sadly his Town career was shortened by a bad injury.

Lea Manor's finest. A raw young talent when introduced by David Pleat in 1982, Mitchell was an energetic full back who was a wily tackler and a real threat to the opposition when going forward. He was a quick learner - you had to be if you played in front of Sealey and alongside Foster.

Ricky Hill

Class, class and more class. From his debut in 1976 through to his departure in 1989, Ricky showed skill, speed and strength. His ability on the ball was awesome. 
Brian Stein

CLUBSTATEMENT

The Hatters have issued the following statement in the wake of the home fixture against Oxford on 9th February



There has been a large amount of press coverage in relation to crowd behaviour during the game at Kenilworth Road against Oxford United on Tuesday 9th February.

In the days after the event, the Club declined to comment on the events in the media as we felt it unwise to speak publicly until we had conducted our post-match debrief, viewed the CCTV footage and had discussions with Bedfordshire Police.

During this time, we have also sought the views of a number of supporters who were sat in the area in question to give us a rounded and wellbalanced view of what actually occurred, which in turn will allow us to make decisions as to any actions that the Club may need to take.

Our post-match debrief found that over 140 seats were broken or damaged in Main Stand blocks E, F and G and the in the Oak Road stand. Damage included cracked seats, backs of seats ripped off, and the wooden benches on which the seats are mounted, snapped in two. Toilet blocks in the Main Stand were also vandalised, with water pipes and toilet cisterns ripped from the wall.

Potentially, this could cost the club between £7,000 to £10,000 to complete all the necessary repair works to allow the ground to comply with it's safety certificate. Should the ground not comply with the safety certificate, the local council has the power to close all or part of the ground.

This extra cost, coupled with the Police and stewarding bill of over £15,000, meant that even though this was the highest gate of the season, it was one of the lowest in terms of net income.

When you consider that this loss of income comes on the back of three games lost over the Christmas and

new year period, and during the present economic climate, it is money that the Football Club can barely afford to lose.

As mentioned above, the Club has reviewed CCTV footage of the incidents and sought the views of Club staff, stewards, Bedfordshire Police and, most importantly, supporters who were in the vicinity. This has clearly identified to us a number of issues.

Vandalising Club property and attacking Club staff and Police Officers for any reason is not acceptable and those supporters who participated in this sort of behaviour are not welcome at Kenilworth Road.

We are therefore working closely with Bedfordshire Police in an attempt to identify those responsible and we are receptive to Bedfordshire Police's requests to take action against individuals if necessary.

However, some of the information that has been released to the press through various outlets is both incorrect and inflammatory.

Whilst there was an element of friction between a relatively small group of supporters and Club stewards, the Club categorically deny that Club stewards were under attack from supporters and similarly there were no reported incidents of Luton fans fighting amongst themselves.

As a Club we were therefore disappointed to see Police Officers, some in riot uniform, entering into the Main Stand which appeared to inflame, rather than calm, an already tense atmosphere.

Since the game the Club have met with representatives of Bedfordshire Police to discuss how any such situations can be handled more effectively in the future. As a Club we believe that there are lessons that can

be learnt by all parties from this game and we are committed to working with the Police to ensure incidents such as this never occur inside Kenilworth Road again.

The Club have also met with representatives of supporters' groups to discuss their thoughts on the incidents that occurred on the night.

On the whole they felt that the relationship between supporters and both Club stewards and Police was a healthy one that had improved significantly over the period of time that 2020 had been in control of the Club.

They felt it was a positive move on the Club's behalf to look to convene a meeting with Bedfordshire Police and representatives of the various supporters' clubs to ensure that all parties are aware of how their actions impact on the Football Club and looking at agreeing a way

forward which benefits all parties. This will be arranged in the very near

Unfortunately, these incidents have overshadowed what was an thrilling game and one that will live in the memory of Hatters fans for many years to come.

The vast majority of supporters from both Luton and Oxford behaved impeccably and witnessed a wonderful advert for football at this level and an attendance and atmosphere that would not have been out of place three leagues above our own.

However, it was a small minority who not only give the Club and it's supporters an unwanted and undeserved reputation, but also cost the Club a significant amount of money through increased police and stewarding costs and repairs.

The Town then went on an unbeaten six-game run before experiencing a 2-0 reversal at Orient just as new £80,000 signing from Burnley, Alan West, made his Luton debut.

From that point, results were patchy but surprisingly the Town remained up with the leaders as, apart from Middlesbrough who were running away with it, the chasing pack was rather mediocre.

Several teams moved up in to second spot but were then overtaken the following week by some other side with great aspirations only for the positions to change yet again seven days later.

The Hatters were content to sit outside the top three before taking over second spot just before Christmas following a 1-0 home win over Aston Villa. Naturally, they slipped back to third when

Third place was then maintained until late February when goals from Jim Ryan, from the spot, and Barry Butlin secured a narrow 2-1 win over Crystal Palace at Kenilworth Road and with it second place in the table.

A 2-0 victory at doomed Swindon in midweek cemented the position and, although the Town went down 2-1 at Fulham in the next game, no-one now seemed capable of mounting a strong enough challenge to make life difficult for a Hatters side that was limping its way to promotion.

Next up was a trip to Hull, and on a miserable day, 7,027 were spread around Boothferry Park to see a home team that had been beaten only once at home that season - and that was against champions-elect Middlesbrough. Given the Town's erratic away form this was seen as a stern test.

The Tigers started the stronger side and Jeff Hemmerman saw two efforts well blocked by Hatters defenders John Faulkner and Alan Garner.

After Stuart Pearson caused more panic in the Luton defence, the action moved to the other end of the field where the





Town netted the opener completely against the run of play.

Hull's Stuart Blampey was penalised for a high and dangerous tackle on Jim Husband with the free-kick fisted clear by Jeff Wealands to West who coolly lobbed it back past the stranded goalkeeper.

The Town now started to turn on the style, which the supporters always knew they were capable of.

Long sweeping moves along the floor threatened to carve the Hull defence open but the final ball was always missing leaving the more direct Tigers side to continue to cause occasional problems in the less than secure Luton

Hull almost levelled in the 52nd minute when a poor back header from Faulkner was latched on to by Pearson with Garner putting in a last gasp tackle before clearing the ball upfield to Husband who fed winger John Aston.

From his cross Peter Anderson got in a header which lacked power but even so squeezed under the distraught Wealands.

The Hatters' third goal came with 15 minutes to go when full-back John Ryan collected the ball on the right and smashed it across the field.

Butlin nodded it on to Aston who unleashed a corker past Wealands.

Hull netted a consolation through substitute Paul O'Riley a couple of minutes after, following some slack play in the Luton defence, but the Hatters were able to play out the remainder of the game with the minimum of fuss for two more valuable points on the way to eventual promotion to Division One.

A point at the home of one of their promotion rivals should be looked on as a point gained but the Town will look back on what might have been following a goalless draw at Mansfield.

The Hatters' overcame a strong opening from the Stags to control and dominate the game and could have pinched all three points had the linesman not judged Jake Howells' 43rd-minute effort to be offside.

That 'goal' came about after some terrific build-up play from Richard Money's side: Liam Hatch nodded down Matthew Barnes-Homer's leftwing cross into the path of the young left-footer who fired an expert finish beyond home goalkeeper Alan Marriott.

Showing four changes from the 2-1 defeat at Crawley, the Town played some confident, flowing attacking stuff and managed to contain David Holdsworth's side for long spells whilst dealing with the hosts' threat from set-pieces and long throws.

The Hatters came close to opening the scoring before Howells' disallowed effort when centre-half George Pilkington found the side netting after Keith Keane's corner was glanced goalwards by Asa Hall.

It was Hall who had the visitors' best effort of the second period when he got above the Mansfield defence again on 49 minutes when he headed inches wide of the target after Howells had swung in a superb curling free-kick into the penalty area.

The game swung from end-to-end in a frantic final five minutes with both sides trying to break the deadlock in a late quest for the points.

But the nearest the Town came was in the third of four additional minutes when substitute Mark Nwokeii came within a whisker of turning home fellow sub Craig Nelthorpe's left-wing





The Hatters had to settle for a point at Filed Mill after battling it out with fellow Play-Off hopefuls Mansfield Town in the Blue Square Premier fixture.

Despite leaving Nottinghamshire without maximum points defender George Pilkington thinks the players responded well after suffering defeat in their last fixture just three days earlier.

"We would have loved to have nicked it at the end but it's not an easy place to come and we were up against a really tough and strong side."



In the last match day programme I posed a few mathematical questions based around football.

I don't know how difficult you found the questions but I know that I often need a pen and piece of paper handy if I have to work out numeracy based tasks.

Most people find it challenging trying to solve a mathematical problem in your head, especially if it involves more than one step.

This is one of the reasons why schools are now placing quite a bit of emphasis on metal arithmetic. I can remember completing pages and pages of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division problems when I went to school many years ago now.

The style of teaching back then required the learner to understand how to carry out an operation. If the question was posed another way, say in a written form, as opposed to the standard sum form, where the numbers were neatly arranged in columns, then the learners could quite easily become stumped.

For those of you who have children you may very well have experienced this problem when attempting to help your child with their homework.

When speaking with parents I am often told the same thing: "When I go to help my son/daughter with their maths, they tell me that I am doing it wrong!"

This is because, as a parent, most of us have been programmed to carry out a calculation using one strategy.

Today, schools are trying to give children a broader understanding

of numbers as a whole. By doing this, the young learners will be able to use a variety of strategies to work out a problem.

To help parents gain a greater understanding of how they can help their children with their school work, we have set up a Family, Football, Fun and Fitness course, in partnership with Adult and Community Learning at our Ely Way classroom.

The purpose of the course is to demonstrate to parents how they can use some of the new teaching strategies used in schools, to help their children with their school

The AGM will be an opportunity for members to learn of the various activities we have been involved in over recent months and also to hear of our plans for the future.


We are in regular contact with the Club on various matters so this will be an ideal opportunity to put questions to the Trust Board. We also hope that at least one director from the Club will be present.

The two sides met earlier in the season at the Racecourse Ground with the Welsh outfit winning 3-0 thanks to a double from Gareth Taylor and a goal from Mark

Founded in 1873. Wrexham are the oldest professional football club in Wales and are also one of the oldest clubs in the United Kingdom.

The Red Dragons have been in the Conference National for two consecutive seasons after they were relegated from the Football League in 2008 after an 87year run spanning from 1921.

During their lengthy stay in the Football League they have enjoyed many memorable years competing in various cup competitions and are renowned for their giant-killing.

In 1972 after entering the European Cup Winners Cup for the first time, they faced FC Zurich away from home in the first leg and earned a 1-1 draw before beating them 2-1 on home soil to reach the second round but were then beaten by Hajduk Split.

Probably their most famous night in European football came at the Estádio das Antas in Portugal in 1984 when they faced FC Porto in the second leg tie after winning the home leg 1-0. Amazingly after being 3-0 down after only 38 minutes in the game Wrexham hit back with three goals and the Portuguese side won 4-3 but Wrexham went through on away goals.

Closer to home they also had their fair share of FA Cup delights with a memorable 2-1 wins over Arsenal in 1992 with goals from Steve Watkin and Wrexham legend Mickey Thomas.

During their best FA Cup run in 1997 they reached the Quarter Final stage after beating West Ham United in the third round and also defeating Peterborough United and Birmingham City along the way before being knocked out by Chesterfield.

This season Dean Saunders' side have encountered inconsistent performances resulting in the team's mid-table position but Saunders will be hoping to end the season on a high and break into the top

Before arriving at Kenilworth Road the Red Dragons face a tough mid-table clash with Altrincham at the Racecourse Ground tonight.
