
Tonight is an important game with Stevenage playing Oxford this evening at Broadhall Way before we go there on Saturday.


To follow that with another



SATURDAY 27TH MARCH

The Hatters made it six wins on the spin with a stunning 8-0 victory over Hayes & Yeading United at Kenilworth Road to make it 14 goals in two games.

There were braces for Claude Gnakpa, Kevin Gallen and Tom Craddock while Keith Keane and Jake Howells were also on target as the Town ran riot.

It was 7-0 at the interval but they could only find one in the second half to hit eight for the first time since 1955.

Meanwhile, Martin Prickett's Under-18s went down 2-1 at home to Millwall in the Youth Alliance.

Striker Liam Toomey fired the Hatters ahead before two goals from the Lions sealed victory.



LES HALL 01/10/1921-20/03/2010

The sad news arrived at Kenilworth Road earlier this week of the death of Les Hall, a stalwart defender for the Town throughout the 1940s and 1950s.

Although on the books of the Hatters for 13 years, making 79 League appearances, Les never signed a full-time professional contract for the club, preferring to play part-time whilst retaining a job in his native St Albans.

Starting out with St Albans City, where he continued to train throughout his career, Les turned out for Luton during the war years but was overlooked on resumption of peacetime

football until called up to replace the injured Horace Gager in a cup-tie at Plymouth in 1948.

Such was his display at centre-half that Gager was unable to regain his place and was transferred. Les was eventually replaced by Syd Owen but continued to give sterling service to the reserve side as well as bringing on the young players in the 'A' team.

Les remained a season ticket holder at Kenilworth Road with his daughter until fairly recently before finding the trip too difficult.

Our condolences are with Les' family and friends at this time.

GOAL-HUNGRY HATTERS

It was six last weekend against Ebbsfleet but the Hatters went two better to hammer Hayes & Yeading United to score eight goals for the first time since 1955.

Sunderland were the last team to concede eight against the Town back on 19th Novemeber 1955 at Kenilworth Road.

That game took place in the topflight and a match that the visitors went into top of table.

However, they headed back to the North East on the receiving end of a 8-2 thrashing as the Hatters ran riot.

It's been 79 long years since an 8-0 victory has been recorded by the Town when Tharmes were given a footballing lesson back on 11th April 1931.

Saturday's victory over Hayes & Yeading is the eighth time the Town have finished up scoring eight times.

However, one record has been broken:

After scoring six in the second half at Ebbsfleet and seven in the first half on Saturday, 13 goals have been scored across 90 minutes, beating the 12 managed by the Town in the full '90 minutes against Bristol Rovers in April 1936.

It was on the 14th December 1996 the last time the Town hit six when beating Crewe Alexandra 6-0 at Kenilworth Road

Away from home, it's been 46 years since the Hatters have scored as many.

That occurred during in a 6-2 win at Griffin Park against Brentford on 8th February 1964.

The incredible turnaround at Stonebridge Road mirrors a

result back in August 1978 when the Town were a goal down at home to Oldham Athletic before scoring six times in the second 45 minutes to triumph 6-1.

The victory over Ebbsfleet was sixth time the Town have scored six times or more on the road.

A 6-3 win over Southampton occurred in October 1937 while, going back further, they hammered Caerphilly 9-0 in 1914, Wellingborough 8-0 in 1897 and won 6-0 at Clapton in 1896.

Meanwhile Claude Gnakpa became the first Town man to score a hat-trick since Steve Howard's treble in the 4-1 win at MK Dons in November 2004.

NIEW FACIES

Before sections of our programme with Hayes & Yeading went to press, the Town confirmed the signings of striker Taiwo Atieno and defender Gavin Caines on-loan from Kidderminster.

We would like to welcome both Taiwo and Gavin to Kenilworth Road.

The two sides met for the first time

back in September at the Raymond McEnhill Stadium.

Kevin Gallen put the Hatters ahead before Matt Tubbs equalised shortly after half-time for the hosts.

The game kept up the Town's unbeaten start to the campaign but that was duly ended three days later when they were defeated at Oxford United.

RECIENT HISTORY:

The Whites have steadily cemented themselves in the Conference over the past couple of seasons with two respectable mid-table positions since winning promotion to the non-league top-flight in 2006/07.

After their Play-Off final defeat of Braintree Town in Conference South that elevated Nick Holmes' side, the Wiltshire outfit finished 12th in their maiden season and followed that up by finishing 16th in 2008/09 – after originally leading the division in September.

In April 2009 year the club was put up for sale for £1 to encourage investors to help the club survive.

THE MANAGER

TOMMY WIDDRINGTON

The 38-year-old Newcastle-born boss took over the reigns at the Raymond McEnhill Stadium last summer after Nick Holmes moved into role of General Manager at the club.

Widdrington originally joined the Whites as a player in February 2005 after arriving from Port Vale and is still registered on the playing staff.

He has worked his way up through the coaching staff and his role, together with Holmes, helped the club reach their highest league position.

As a player Widdrington was known as tough and no-nonsense central midfielder, and started his career at Southampton before Grimsby wrote a £300,000 cheque for his signature in 1996.

After leaving Blundell Park for Port Vale in 1999, Widdrington went on to enjoy spells at Hartlepool and Macclesfield before arriving at the Ray Mac via a second spell at Vale Park.




Salisbury City General Manager Nick Holmes has had a long and illustrious playing career.

He made 543 appearances for Southampton Football Club scoring 64 goals over a fifteen-year career, helping the Saints to lift the FA Cup in 1979.

Holmes took over as General Manager in 2002 and soon guided the club to the Conference National, earning successive promotions by winning the Southern League Premier Division in 2006 and then the 2007 Play-Off final.

However, Salisbury have had a difficult season this year, after being handed a ten point

deduction in September for entering into administration but Holmes is not looking to relax his ambitions:

"If we can get into that real mid table then I think it has been a real successful season. Our main aim is to stay in the League. It is a pretty tough league. You have really got to work hard to get out of it."

The Whites' boss was delighted with the win over Kidderminster on Saturday, which ended a three-match losing streak: "It was an

important one, because we have had some reversals of late.

"The games are coming thick and fast at the moment, you might lose three or four on the bounce but it is really only a couple of weeks in history. It was good to get back to winning ways and we fully deserved to get the three points."

Salisbury have won nine away games this season already and their Manager is confident that they can get a result despite the in-form Hatters thrashing of mid table Hayes & Yeading on Saturday.

Holmes added: "We certainly know that going to Luton after they won by eight on Saturday is going to be a tall order, but we are prepared for it and I think Luton know they are going to be in for a tough time.

"Three weeks ago we went up to York and we beat them. It shows it doesn't matter which part of the league we go to, we still go there to get three points if we can."





COALKIERS

IAMES BITTNER

James signed on a full time basis for the Club from Woking in June 2007. His career includes spells with AFC Bournemouth, Exeter City, and Torquay United. He was ever-present during the 2008/09 campaign and was voted Player of the Season after a series of consistent performances.

RYAN PRYCE

Signed during the January 2010 transfer window. Salisbury-born stopper who was previously with AFC Bournemouth.

SSEICINEFIEICI

STUART ANDERSON

Stuart started his career at Southampton, and had spells at Blackpool, Ross County, and Livingstone. He joined the Whites at the beginning of season 2009/10 from Scottish Second Division Peterhead.

SEAN CLOHESSY

A quick, young defender originally signed on-loan from Gillingham, for whom he made 43 appearances in League One. Sean joined the Gills in 2005 following his release from the Arsenal Academy, having spent three years with the Gunners.



SEAN CLOHESSY

He was a regular first team member and consistent performer while on loan to Salisbury during the 2008/09 season and then signed forms for Salisbury after being released from the Kent side.

PATRICK COX

Young defender who joined Salisbury in 2008, having started his career with Crystal Palace's youth set-up before moving to Reading. He was a member of the Glenn Hoddle Academy before joining the Whites.

LUKE RUDDICK

Luke started his career as an apprentice at Brentford, and is equally at home at full back or in midfield. He joined the Whites in the 2008/09.season from Blue Square South side Hampton & Richmond and has been a regular first team member ever since.



LUKE RUDDICK

RYAN TAFAZOLLI

A tall central defender, Ryan progressed through the Youth and Academy set ups at League One side Southampton, and is in his fifth year with them. He joined Salisbury on work experience in October 2009.

JAMIE TURLEY

Another young defender who was attached to Wycombe Wanderers before joining the Whites in July 2009.



JAMIE TURLEY

Has made the central defender's position his own after impressing in preseason friendlies.

CHRIS BUSH

The Brentford youngster joined on a work experience deal in January 2010 having been a regular in the League 1 side's reserves.

CHRIS GILES

Chris joined the Whites in January 2010. He is a Welsh-born player who brings a wealth of experience to the side having played for Yeovil Town, Aldershot, Forest Green Rovers and Crawley Town.

DANIEL WEBB

Joined Salisbury in November 2008 after a short spell with Havant & Waterlooville. Began his career at Southampton before moving to Southend United in 2000. He played for Hull City, and had spells at Brighton & Hove Albion, Lincoln and Yeovil before spending a season at AFC Wimbledon. After joining the Whites initially as a striker, he is now adapting to a new role in central defence.

RONNIE BULL

Vastly experienced full back, signed in January 2010 who played 50 games for Millwall before having a loan spell at Yeovil Town. Ronnie has also played for

Brentford, Grimsby Town, Rushden & Diamonds, Grays Athletic, Crawley Town and Ebbsfleet United.

SEICLEIFICIM

BEN ADELSBURY

Ben earned a contract with the Whites in February 2010. His career includes spells with Plymouth Argyle and Swansea City. After a number of reserve team appearances, he has progressed to Salisbury's first team.

DARRELL CLARKE

Current first team captain, the experienced midfielder started his career at Mansfield Town where he became a first team regular. He also played for Hartlepool United, and had loan spells at Rochdale and Stockport County. Signed for the Whites in June 2007, and has a major role in Salisbury's Football in the Community project.

CHRIS FLOOD

Highly-thought of young midfielder who joined the Whites after spells with Brentford, QPR, Winchester City and Farnborough. During the 2008/09 season he played for Salisbury's reserves in the totesport.com Combination before establishing a first team berth this term.

ROB SINCLAIR

Midfielder who initially signed on a short term loan from Luton before making the switch permanent in July 2008. Rob is comfortable in any position across the midfield.

STRIKERS

BRADLEY GRAY

A promising young striker, Bradley was with Leyton Orient during seasons 2007/08, and 2008/09. He has also had loan spells at St Albans City and Blue Square Premier Grays Athletic.



CHRIS FLOOD

TOBY OSMAN

Joined the Whites on loan in March 2009 from Exeter City, at the same time as his brother Ben. He was with the Youth Academy at Birmingham City before joining Exeter as a first year pro and re-joined Salisbury at the start of season 2009/10.

REECE CONNOLLY

Attack-minded youngster who signed in January 2010 on work experience from Aldershot Town where he is highly regarded having impressed in their youth and reserve teams. Began his career at Crystal Palace.

IAKE DEID

Signed from Weymouth in March 2010, Jake had scored regularly for the Dorset side. He also had spells in the Blue Square Premier League with Grays Athletic.

MATTHEW TUBBS

Now one of the club's all-time leading goalscorers having netted more than 100 goals for City since signing from Dorchester Town in October 2003. Matt, who began his career at Bolton Wanderers before moving to AFC Bournemouth, was the first of the promotion winning squad to commit to a full-time contract in season 2007/08.

Some notable goals have included an equaliser in the FA Cup against Nottingham Forest in front of the BBC Match of the Day cameras, and the all-important play-off goal against Braintree Town to secure the Whites' place in what is now the Blue Square Premier.

He had a loan spell back at AFC Bournemouth in 2008/09, but in January 2010 again committed himself to the Whites, signing a new contract.

The number of league matches previously played on this date at Kenilworth Road. Luton have won six, lost four and drawn twice.

The Hatters have scored 24 goals and conceded 18.



The most goals scored by the Town on this date back in 1929 when Swindon Town were the visitors in a Division Three (South)

match, Jimmy Yardley and Andy Rennie both scored twice with Tommy Roe netting the other in a 5-3 victory for the Hatters.



Luton beat Clapton Orient 3-0 in 1935 and this was the first of three matches where the Hatters kept a clean sheet on this date at

Kenilworth Road. Jack Ball scored twice and George Stephenson netted in this game. The other clean sheets came against Notts County in 1964, when the Hatters won 2-0 courtesy of a brace from John O'Rourke, and a 2-0 victory against Orient in 1982. David Moss netted from the penalty spot against Orient and Ricky Hill added a second.



Luton have played against Chelsea and Ipswich twice on this date. In 1956 a record crowd for this date, 24,276, saw the Hatters draw 2-2





The Hatters' mauling of Hayes & Yeading combined with results elsewhere further cemented their position in the Blue Square Premier Play-Off places.

While both Stevenage and Oxford recorded victories above them, it was a different story below them as Kettering, Mansfield, York and AFC Wimbledon all dropped points.

The Town have a 13 point cushion over the sixth placed Poppies after Lee Harper's side were held to a 2-2 draw against fellow Play-Off Mansfield contenders Rockingham Road.

AFC Wimbledon's chances of a top five finish were dealt a blow after losing at home to Rushden & Diamonds thanks to Craig Farrell's solitary strike.

That enhanced the Diamonds' position in the Play-Offs but York missed the chance to really punish the dropped points by their rivals by also drawing.

Martin Foyle's side were on their way to three points following Lee Graham's header but Chris Smith levelled matters - against his old club - with eight minutes left to secure the Lambs a priceless point in their battle against relegation.

The point meant the Staffordshire outfit are now four points above the drop-zone.

However, teams below them continue to hit form with Barrow and Forest Green both picking up vital weekend victories.

Barrow came out on top in a fivegoal thriller against fellow strugglers Eastbourne Borough at Holker Street, becoming behind to win 3-2.



There was plenty of goals and a comeback to boot at the New Lawn as Forest Green recovered from going 3-1 down to Altrincham to win 4-3 with a three-goal eightminute burst in the second half securing Dave Hockaday's side a priceless victory and with it lift them out of the relegation zone.

At the bottom of the table, Grays Athletic look doomed to the Blue Square South after a 3-0 defeat at Cambridge United leaving them 16 points adrift of safety.

Ebbsfleet dropped into the bottom three as they didn't play and, worryingly for the Stonebridge Road outfit, they have played more games than any other team in the division and have the second-worst goal difference.



The Town had been given a fighting chance of staying in the top flight, after a miserable start to the 1984/85 campaign, when new chairman David Evans allowed the purse strings to be loosened just before Christmas.

After declaring that the Hatters would not be relegated even though they were second bottom when he said it, the supporters clung on to his words as they waited for the new recruits to be introduced.

Manager David Pleat did not need to be told twice and immediately went after ex-England centre-half Steve Foster who was languishing in Aston Villa's reserves.

The signing of Foster was quickly

followed by tiny left-sided midfielder David Preece who immediately won over the crowd when scoring the Town's goal in a 1-0 home win over Aston Villa.

The spending had not stopped and a massive, by Luton standards, £250,000 was handed over to Birmingham for striker Mick Harford and to further bolster the spine of the side, holding midfielder Peter Nicholas was prised away from Crystal Palace.

Due to bad weather and the start of an FA Cup run that would see the Town win through to the semi-final stage, all four newcomers played together for the first time in early February after a month without a league game.

Second placed Tottenham were the visitors to Kenilworth Road and a best of season crowd of 17.511 saw a new. more determined and physical Luton take the game to a powerful Spurs outfit who were extremely fortunate to escape with a point following a last minute equaliser.

Gradually results began to turn their way, and by the end of March, the

team had managed to advance one position in the table to 20th. Although still in the relegation zone at least supporters could see a chink of light at the end of the tunnel whereas before Christmas Division Two looked a nailed on certainty.

Looking back, the Town's progress was no doubt hampered by the long FA Cup run which included three gruelling games against Watford.

David Pleat was privately worried about this although the supporters wanted the best of both worlds - an FA Cup final appearance and Division One status to be maintained!

With Millwall seen off in the quarterfinals, and the next round not due until mid-April. Pleat breathed a sigh of relief as the Cup could finally be put to one side for a time.

The crunch league meeting with fellow strugglers Ipswich at Kenilworth Road at the end of March was far more important and demanding of 100% attention and focussed minds.

The club decided to hand out vouchers at the turnstiles before the Ipswich clash which would entitle the holder

to a ticket for the upcoming FA Cup semi-final. This meant that the crowd was 3,000 better than for the corresponding fixture the previous season which potentially promised a far better atmosphere than normal.

Neither the heightened carnival atmosphere, or the supposedly focussed minds of the players, showed themselves in the opening minutes as Ipswich tore into the Town rearguard.

The Blues, who although were below the Town in 21st spot, had drawn at Arsenal in their last away game and were showing that the result was no fluke as they came close to completely humiliating the Hatters.

Trevor Putney, Eric Gates and Romeo Zondervan carved through the Luton defence at will but heroic saves from goalkeeper Les Sealey and a trio of misses from Kevin Wilson meant that, after 20 minutes, Ipswich only had one effort from Gates to show for their superiority.

Six months before, the Luton players would have caved in but the new breed were made of sterner stuff.

The Ipswich goal seemed to shake the lethargy away and suddenly the Town's midfield trio of Ricky Hill, Nicholas David Preece took control

Brian Stein moved back into the 'hole' behind front players Harford and Emeka Nwajiobi and Ipswich were swept away.

Harford reduced England centrehalf Terry Butcher into a bag of nerves and the big striker lost his marker on 30 minutes to nod in a cross from Preece at the far post.

Nwajiobi toe-poked a Stein pass past

Paul Cooper in the Ipswich goal just before the interval with Harford making the points safe on 66 minutes when he took advantage of a Butcher stumble to run on and crack home an unstoppable shot.

From then on it was one way traffic and the score should have been more emphatic but Pleat was relieved at the final whistle, mighty pleased that the players could shut out thoughts of Wembley glory from their minds when League points were at stake.



The day proved to be a huge success. We are lucky to have the


classroom attached to the Club's training facility as it has provided many informal opportunities for young learners to mix with their local footballing heroes.



WHAT'S THE GROUND LIKE?

Broadhall Way, or the Lamex Stadium as it is now known, is one of the better grounds in the Blue Square Premier and one which would not look out of place in the Football League.

On one side is the all seated covered, Main Stand, that looks quite impressive. It is unusual in so much that at the back of the stand on either side of it, there are large gaps between the back of the roof and the stand below. Opposite is the fair sized East Terrace, that is covered and is quite steep.

At one end is the South Stand, which is another single tiered all seated covered stand. This stand given to away supporters. There is an electric scoreboard on the roof

of this stand. Opposite at the North End of the ground, is a small covered terrace.

WHAT'S IT LIKE FOR LUTON FANS?

Town fans have been allocated seating in the South Stand and terracing on the East Terrace. As you would expect from a relatively new stand the facilities and views of the playing action are good. Inside the ground a selection of pies and pasties are available.

HOW TO GET THERE AND WHERE TO PARK?

Leave the A1 (M) at Junction 7 and take the A602 towards Stevenage. Go straight across the first roundabout and as you approach the next roundabout you can see the floodlights of the ground over on the right. However, if you go

straight across the roundabout then you will see the entrance on the left to the large official car park which is free

For those supporters with satellite navigation systems the postcode for Broadhall Way is SG2 8RH.
