


Westley's Words



Well, has a Borough game ever been set up more tastily than this afternoon's feast on offer? As well as being keenly anticipated for many years by Borough fans - admittedly we were expecting it to be in the Football League and not the Blue Square Premier – it also has the added spice of a top v second place flavour. A feature that Borough have not encountered since, erm well since last Tuesday's game with Oxford. Both sides today enter the game not only in fine form

but in amazingly superb form. Luton to their credit have really found their feet and their scoring boots in the last few weeks and have recorded seven straight wins knocking in 27 goals and conceding just five times. Today they come across a team with, incredibly, a slightly better record of eight straight wins with a goal record of 20 for and just a solitary and a tad fluky goal in the game with Grays against.

One of these records will have to be stopped today, perhaps both with a stalemate. Both teams will be absolutely brimming with

confidence and it really does make for a juicy encounter. I don't think it is overstating matters to bill this game as possibly the biggest single game to take place in the Blue Square Premier, it's that big. If Borough can notch up a win today then maybe an eight point deficit will be too much for Town to make up with only five games remaining in their season. If the Hatters can win then it too may still be too little too late but it would make for a far more interesting finish to the season. But for me personally it's one I could do without.


The Gaffer – Richard Money


Lowestoft-born Money became the Hatters' 24th post-war permanent manager when succeeding Mick Harford earlier this season. Ironically Harford was sacked due to growing unrest amongst the fans and poor performances on the pitch. Quite how that can be so when they now find themselves in with a good chance of winning the title is a debate for another time. Dubbed 'Dicky Dosh' by Walsall fans after he guided the Saddlers to the League Two title in 2006/07. Money actually played 49 times for Luton during his season-long stay at

Kenilworth Road in 1982/83. He cut his managerial teeth at Scunthorpe United - who he also served as a player, before continuing his education overseas with two clubs in Sweden. After a brief stint in Australia it was back to the Bescot where he enjoyed his most successful spell before joining Newcastle United as academy director prior to returning to Bedfordshire. As a player Money was an unused substitute in the 1981 European Cup final whilst playing for Liverpool. A game in which they defeated Real Madrid 1-0.

Players to watch

With the current form that Luton find themselves in it would be fair to say that we have to keep an eye on all 11 players on the field but I have picked three that are really firing on all cylinders at present. 26 year-old Frenchman Claude Gnakpa has scored six times in the last three games - not bad for a defender turned midfielder. Indeed not bad for a Wayne Rooney. Claude joined the Hatters on a free transfer in the summer of 2008 having played for various clubs across Europe including FC Vaduz in Liechtenstein. He moved to England in 2007 joining Swindon Town before settling at Peterborough United and becoming a regular in their promotion winning side with George Boyd. 34 year-old striker Kevin Gallen is also a player to watch today. Five goals in the last four games is a sign of a player bang in form and the ex QPR legend also has a fine footballing pedigree. Playing over 400 times for Rangers he has also plied his trade in the league with Huddersfield Town, Barnsley and MK Dons. Incidentally, the name may seem familiar to Borough fans. Back in the 1997-98 season Kevin's elder brother Joe played for Borough a few times before moving on to a career in coaching. Another player bound to feature today is 23 year-old forward. Tom Craddock - with eight goals in seven league games how could he not? Tom started his career at Middlesbrough and loan spells whilst he was developing saw him name Wrexham and Hartlepool amongst his sojourns before joining the Hatters on loan in October 2008. In January of 2009 he joined the club permanently in a deal worth £80,000. Other names familiar to Borough fans will be returning ex-Stripes Shane Gore and Fred Murray.





All change at the top

Graham Venables takes a look at Luton's rise to second spot in the Blue Square Premier

o back just a few weeks and the race for the title of Blue Square champions was seen as between two teams only; Stevenage Borough and Oxford United. As is often the way in football, things have changed and changed dramatically.

A number of slips and a midweek defeat here at the Lamex have seen Oxford slip to third whilst preseason favourites Luton have now snatched second place. After a tough period of acclimatisation, the tail end of the footballing year has seen the Hatters in the form expected of them at the start of the season. Having now notched up seven successive wins, including an 8-0 victory against Hayes & Yeading and 4-0 against Sailsbury City in their last two games, Luton are now emerging as a very serious threat to Borough's title challenge.

Despite the run of good form and the encouraging score lines Luton manager Richard Money is not underestimating today's opponents. Speaking to a local newspaper about Borough's vital win against Oxford and today's clash Money said: "We've got no control over what Stevenage can do. The title is Stevenage's to lose.

"They've beaten Oxford and fair play to them, there was nothing we could do. Even if they hadn't won we'd still need to go there and win. But we're really pleased that we can go there on Saturday in really good form.

"I've always said that we need to win as many points to try and finish as high as possible and if we can

challenge for first place then we will. We're all looking forward to it. We couldn't go into it in better form.

Stevenage are a tough nut to crack and I'm sure they'll be pleased with their result against Oxford. But we're scoring lots of goals and it will be an interesting encounter."

No matter the outcome of today's clash it is quite clear that both teams will be pushing themselves to the limit in the season's final games and both teams are deserving of their postions at the peak of the Blue Square Premier.

Fitness first

Barry Rust talks to Borough fitness expert Neil Withington

eil Withington can often be found on a matchday putting the players through their paces as they prepare for the upcoming game. For those in the dark, Neil works with the backroom staff at the Lamex Stadium to keep our players fit and strong.

Having spent eight years in nonleague football working with the likes of Gravesend, Margate, Eastleigh and Welling, Neil also works one-to-one with players and the general public alike. During the off season he works with some Premiership and Championship players to maintain or regain their fitness levels.

Off the pitch he runs his own fitness club where he teaches classes like spinning, step aerobics and body pumps whilst also dealing with personal clients. Helping bring people back from injury is one other string to his bow as he helps people who have had hip replacements, knee operations or back problems.

But what happens when he is with the team? Usually at training he will work on flexibility, stretching out the muscles because "After they have been playing, muscles are tight and stretching them improves the range of movement and posture alignment, which reduces injuries."

Then after a good warm up they work on strength and power, which unsurprisingly is weights and 'explosive work'. This essentially



gets the players moving quicker and as Neil says, "That would be the reason we have a reputation for being strong and quick." All of this would be topped up with a little bit of quick feet work.

Matchdays are a different prospect. "Players that are injured or who are not in the side will spend ninety minutes at the training ground. Then I would prepare the drinks so they can fuel themselves before, during and after the game." He says. Neil would then take the warm up with the players, before warming up the substitutes at half time, and then after the game giving the players that haven't been involved a half-hour workout.

Why? "If they just sit on the bench and don't do much then they could lose fitness levels. If nine players play the full ninety, two do thirty, it knocks it out of shape. So it keeps fitness levels up on a par."

By now everybody has noticed the pre-half work on the side of the pitch. Some players huddle, some just walk onto a pitch, but Stevenage quickstep! "It just fires them up again. If they have warmed up, they then go in and sit down and focus. After a half they have a twelve minute break, and so again it gets them going again. They are fit and their body recovery is quick, so it helps bring them on their way."

So if you were a professional footballer, what would your matchday menu look like?
"Breakfast could be scrambled egg and toast, or cereal, fruit and a yoghurt. Usually about four hours before kick off some people would have cereal and toast again.
However it could be pasta, chicken, jacket potatoes. After the game we provide pizza which is good and dinner later may be pasta and protein like a lasagne."

Lawrie returns

Lawrie Wilson speaks about his return to action with the reserve team



When Lawrie Wilson was carried from the field on a stretcher against Rushden & Diamonds back in late August it was a cruel blow for the Stevenage player. The 22-year-old was in the best form of his career and had made the right berth his own.

Now seven months later and after a gruelling fight back to fitness he has taken to the football pitch again in anger, playing 76 minutes against Ipswich reserves. "It feels great to put a shirt back on and go out there and play with the boys," he says. "It was really nice to know that people came to watch, to show their support; when you've been out for such a long time and you come back and you've got people looking out for you. Everyone has been around me helping since I've been back in training. It's made it an easier ride to recovery."

A reserve team outing against a footballing side such as Ipswich would seem to be a perfect opportunity to ease back into action. "Ipswich are a good team,"



he says. "They get the ball down and are known for passing the ball, considering we had a few young lads out there I thought we did quite well and gave a good account of ourselves really.

"I think towards the end we sort of lost our way in the second half. A bit of fitness may have come into it, a bit of a lapse in concentration but with the young lads towards the end of the game you're going to get that but you've just got to carry on really."

However, it was far from a halfhearted return for the Stevenage man. The match was littered with full-bloodied tackles that tested both his strength and resolve.
"You've got to in these situations. If
it's going happen it's going to
happen, so for myself to get over
that hurdle is a big hurdle and I've
done it and come out alright."

Even before taking to the pitch Wilson had a scare when he went over on his newly mended ankle in a training session. "I went over on it and at the start I thought not another setback, but it ended up being a good thing really, it went out and came back again so it showed it was strong enough and from then I've played the game and we'll see how it reacts."

There were several reminders for

Wilson of his own injury woes when both Peter Vincenti and Charlie Griffin were carried off on stretchers during Wilson's comeback. But he was adamant that it was not playing on his mind. "Not at all," he says. "It's unfortunate that the two boys have got injured, first team boys as well so it's a big blow to us especially with Charlie scoring the goal that won the game for us the other week.

"I've just got to knuckle down and get some games under my belt. Hopefully towards the end of the season I might be able to come in and help the lads to go up and win all the trophies."










From The Treatment Room

Culture Shock- BBC Three Counties Radio's Ian Pearce muses on life In the Blue Square Premiership.

irstly I'd like to say what an honour it is to be asked to contribute to today's matchday programme. In fact I get more abuse on Stevenage message boards than Luton ones even though I have been warning you lot about Luton's promotion chances all season.

To be honest, the season before with the massive points deduction had been a disappointment with only a Wembley win to lift the gloom. Simon Travis

Barry Rust talks to Simon Travis about playing for Borough and representing his country at C level

Simon Travis played football from an early age. As a Liverpool fan who grew up watching the likes of McMahon, Hansen and Rush, the desire to play football was always there. As a schoolboy he was with Preston North End before playing with Coventry and finally signing YTS papers with Torquay.

"At sixteen I signed onto the YTS scheme with a year professional.

It's hard as a voungster moving away and going into a man's world as a boy. It's hard to adjust, but I did and I still have some great friends down there" He recalls.

However, his time first season with Torquay was spent near the bottom of the table and a new manager spelt the end for Simon at Torquay. "He wanted experienced players and got rid of the younger ones. I

left just after Christmas but it is needed old heads to help them through."

Simon moved to Stockport eventually, and whilst there received devastating news. "My having cancer. I was offered near to my Dad and Telford gave me the chance to do that."

University

Simon also combined his time in non-league football with University studies. Before long, having moved to Bristol, the commute was too much and so Travis joined Forest Green Rovers where he won his first England C Cap. "I believe I was the first ever player to get a C cap at Forest Green so it was a tremendous achievement for me." He remembers.

But Forest Green didn't offer him what he needed and soon Simon was at Stevenage. "I wanted bigger and better challenges and Stevenage offered me that. It was a great set up and they had facilities in the pipeline that obviously now

understandable. I didn't appreciate it at the time but a situation like that

Father fell ill and was diagnosed as another contract, but I wanted to be exist at Shephalbury Park. It was a great club, with a good surface for the conference, fantastic fans and was a great time for me. Perhaps my best memory was the five-one win away to Woking. I loved it so I am sure the fans enjoyed it too."

Torn

Travis eventually moved on and was torn between two clubs when the time came. "I had Barnet and Hereford come in for me and there wasn't much difference between the two. Hereford were top of the league though and had a good set up so I went there. It was a good move, where I spent four very good seasons and got back into the league with a play off final win at the Walkers Stadium against Halifax. It was great to be involved."

Simon broke his ribs and suffered a collapsed lung in a game against the Republic of Ireland in a C team game for England, but Simon

doesn't believe that affected his decision to quit league football. "It was an unfortunate, but severe injury. I always planned to leave the game when I reached thirty. Salaries weren't that great and you did live hand to mouth so I needed to provide for the future. I decided to play semi-pro and get a decent career outside of the game."

Job done for Travis as he now has his own beat with the West Midlands Police Force and currently plays for Brackley Town, where ex-borough winger Jon Brady is now the manager. As for the future, Travis is unsure. "I could get back into the game. Coaching could interest me, but now I am still fit and running up and down a wing and play football.



I get asked my opinion more and more nowadays and it is right to use that. It could be good to try my hand at it, but I love being with the police. It's different every day and has variety."

And variety, we all know, is the spice of life.





A superb goal from Scott Laird five minutes from time was enough to earn Borough the three points on their first visit to Kenilworth Road in a league competition.



Loan signing Michael Brough lined up at left back with Byrom partnering Darren Murphy in a combatative central midfield partnership.

The tension was palpable, the crowd boisterous and a 15 minute delay for crowd congestion only intensified the atmosphere. When the game did eventually get underway the opening exchanges were probing rather than penetrating; like two heavyweight fighters testing each other's defences before launching an offensive.

Borough had the best of the opening half hour, but the best chance went to the home side. Adam Newton cut in from the right, slid a ball into the area and although Chris Day got a touch, the ball fell to Rossi Jarvis, Day recovered to save his goalbound effort.

With five minutes remaining Borough had what appeared to be a cast iron penalty turned down as Cole jinked into the area and appeared to be hauled down by Ed Asafu-Adjaye. The referee waved play on and when the ball went out of play showed the yellow card to Cole for his protests. With the scoreline blank at the interval Borough would have been satisfied, considering it a job half done.

Cole and Drury tested Mark Tyler early in the second half, but it was Luton who were in the ascendancy without causing the resolute Borough rearguard any great alarms. With Luton pressing forward there were gaps beginning to appear at the back and when Drury broke clear Tyler did well to deny Beardsley.





BARRY RUST REPORTS ON BOROUGH'S MIDWEEK GAME AGAINST OXFORD UNITED

This encounter was one where something had to give. Stevenage had not lost in league or FA Trophy action at the Lamex Stadium since November 2008. On the other hand, Oxford had not lost to Stevenage since their relegation from the football league.

Perhaps all signs pointed to a draw, but if they did, nobody had given the script to the hungry Borough players who worked their socks off all evening to earn a deserved one-nil win.

Yes the goal came from the penalty spot, where Scott Laird stepped up to show his credentials of scoring from twelve yards, but Borough had again created chances against a surprisingly lacklustre Oxford side.

For the first forty-five minutes Oxford were unrecognisable as the side that had stormed to such a hefty lead at the summit of the Blue Square Premier a mere matter of months ago. Borough perhaps should have been ahead when Mitchell Cole sent his shot just wide of the goal with only a few minutes on the clock.

Cole did not last long after a nasty challenge from Mark Creighton ended any hopes the pacy wideman had of continuing. An act that went unpunished by the referee.

Borough were without doubt the better of the two sides and Michael Bostwick came close with an effort that skidded just wide of the post from thirty yards out. Andy Drury was working hard and almost created the opening goal.

At half time Borough ran straight into the changing rooms, the desire to get straight back out and carry on the fight clearly evident.

Fight they did, as within five minutes of the restart Borough were awarded the penalty that would ultimately gift wrap the three points for Borough, although the present was not handed over until the final whistle.

Chris Hargreaves was the villain of the piece as he clattered into David Bridges from a corner. The referee didn't have to think about it and awarded the spot kick. Up stepped Scott Laird, to the bemusement of some, but certainly not to the players. As cool as you like the left back slotted the ball home and the Lamex erupted.







This very day -100 years ago...

Lloyd Briscoe continues his look at the history of football in Stevenage



100 years ago, Easter Saturday fell on March 26th. Stevenage Town played away that day to St Ippolyts in the Herts Junior League. St Ippolyts were the league leaders, and they thrashed Stevenage 5-1.

Not much joy there then.

Luton Town FC however, plied their trade in the Southern League, having taken occupancy of their Kenilworth Road home just four years previously. Times were hard at Luton as the club struggled with its finances.

The following extract appeared in the Hertfordshire Express, on Saturday February 26th 1910:

LUTON FC IN TROUBLE AGAIN

The Luton Town FC (as is usual at this time of the year) is in serious financial difficulties. This has occurred so often in recent years that the annual appeal for help meets with little response, but the fact, however, remains that the financial affairs of the club are in very low water. It is stated however that the club will fulfil all its engagements this season.

It cannot be complained that the directors are spending too much money on the wages bill. The present team is about the cheapest one they have run for many seasons, and it is said that not one player has received the £4 limit.

A Luton contemporary suggests that it is of little use to send the hat around again, as the help usually comes from the same few men every year, who are getting tired of "shelling out". They suggest that Lutonians may have to go to Watford to see Southern League football. What a catastrophe!
