Good afternoon ladies and gentlemen and welcome to today's match. I would like to welcome the players. officials and supporters of The Hatters to The Lamb on their first visit and hope they enjoy their brief stay with us and have a safe journey home at the end of the game. In the not too distant past playing a club of the size and stature of Luton Town at The Lamb was something most would only have dreamt of and we are all relishing the challenge this afternoon.

With a big crowd expected today, bigger than we are perhaps used to, I know that you will all do your utmost to get behind the lads and if we can play as we have done over the season and work hard once again then there is no reason why we can't give a good account of ourselves once again, against one of the sides vying for promotion this season.

Looking back over the past few games and after some good results against the likes of Oxford United, Mansfield Town and York City we knew going into the Easter break that it was important for us to continue picking up points against two sides who were with us in the bottom six of the table at the time.

And so to have completely dominated the game against Barrow last Saturday and record a fine 3-0 victory was superb. Goals were something we had been struggling to find consistently all season and so to then go to Forest Green and score four away from home was more than welcomed and guite rightly celebrated.

Following the earlier six point deduction which definitely knocked us all back mentally, having to work hard again for something we lost through no fault of our own but with

that firmly in the past, it set us a challenge and the lads rose to it, and then some, to push us back away from the relegation zone and to a position of relative safety as we enter the final couple of weeks of the season.

We are not safe yet as there are still games to play and points to be won and so the dressing room atmosphere is now one of wanting to finish the job by continuing where we have left off in the past few games.

I spoke to my players about how good they have been so far this season and so the attitude is that we want to continue in the same vein and try and make it three out of three ahead of our next two long away trips.

There is a positive feeling in the dressing room and I have told the squad to try and build on it, by going out and playing on the front foot to make it difficult for the opposition, by playing our football how I think it is supposed to be played and how we know we can and how we have shown we can.

On the playing front it is good to be able to select from a virtually fully fit squad for the final matches. Michael Blackwood has had trouble with his knee which ruled him out against Forest Green but will hopefully be available for selection today and it is also very encouraging to have Nick Wright back training again. Although Wrighty may not make it into the squad today, we are extremely hopeful that he will take some part in the final three games of the season as we strive to ensure of our league status for next season on our own terms and not have to rely on the fate of others.

Luton Town Football Club was formed on April 11, 1885 with the merger of two local clubs, Wanderers and Excelsior, With a strong committee behind them, the club began to attract stronger opposition, better players and more spectators, such was the growth in industry in Luton at the time.

The foresighted decision to pay three players was taken in 1890 with the remainder being included the following year. Because of this expense friendly matches were not enough to keep finances straight and an invitation to become a founder member of the Southern League in 1894 was grabbed with both hands.

Their initial bid for election to the Football League failed and a season had to be spent in the United League before they were accepted into Football League Division Two in 1897.

It was a predominantly northern based competition with the subsequent high cost of travel gradually becoming a burden. After three years of increasing struggle the club took the decision to rejoin a, now much stronger, Southern League.

After hostilities ceased, the Southern League, en bloc, was asked to form a new Division Three of the Football League and Town then enjoyed 17 seasons at this level.

With the population growth of the town and surrounding area, the board, in the mid-1930s, decided to make a concerted bid to achieve a higher status. Players were brought in to help achieve this objective and in 1936 when they finished runners-up to Coventry in the days when only one side was promoted. The next season promotion was

Over Easter 1939, good results forced the team into the promotion positions but a draw and two defeats from the final three games meant they missed out. Unfortunately, no one will ever know how far this squad could have progressed as in September 1939, with the Town sitting proudly at the top of the table, war broke out

After a seven-year break, it was back to a few seasons of mid-table mediocrity until, in 1954/55 a Division One spot came when Town clinching the runners-up spot on goal

They swept all before them early in the following season, beating Newcastle, Blackpool, Wolves and league leaders Sunderland in quick succession. They finished eighth in 1957/58 and early the following campaign actually hit top spot before dropping back to mid-table.

The Hatters had never progressed beyond the quarter-finals in the FA Cup but, in

1958/59 the Wembley band wagon took off as the Town fought their way past Leeds, Leicester, Ipswich and Blackpool before seeing off Norwich in the semi-final. The final itself was a massive disappointment compared to the run up, with Town not performing on the day, leaving ten man Nottingham Forest to win comfortably 2-1.

From that moment, the Hatters' fortunes went into a steady decline. They sank to Division Three at the end of 1962/63 and only six years from their FA Cup Final appearance, they slumped to the football basement of Division Four in 1965 amidst apathy and crowds of less than 3,000.

Gradually things improved with manager Allan Brown's enthusiasm and astute playing of the transfer market. They went to the top of the table in February 1968, never looked back and walked away with the title.

The Hatters seemed capable of walking through Division Two back to a top flight they had left in 1960, but the March 1970 announcement of the collapse of directors Reggie Burr and Tony Hunt's Vehicle and General business reverberated around the corridors at Kenilworth Road for some time and made the club sellers rather than buyers

In 1973/74 promotion from a very average Division Two was achieved and new manager David Pleat led a return to Division One in 1981

Pleat found the call of Tottenham too great and he departed amid much acrimony. His replacement, John Moore, led Town to seventh in Division One of seventh in 1986/87. But they sank back down in 1992 and did not find life much easier at the new level and in 95/96 the loss of talismanic goalscorer, Dwight Marshall, with a broken ankle, knocked the stuffing out of the side with relegation the inevitable consequence.

On April 12, 2005, the club celebrated gaining a place in the Championship after 10 years in the bottom two divisions of the Football League. However, the success of the team was always under scrutiny from rival managers and it wasn't long before the club was receiving substantial bids for the team's top performers. A £3m bid from West Bromwich Albion for centre-back Curtis Davies was too good to turn down.

Season 2006-2007 was largely dominated by the Hatters' off-the-field problems beginning with manager Mike Newell blowing the whistle on underhand transfer activity that he knew of within the game. The Hatters then went on to equal their all time record of eight consecutive defeats and relegation was

Kevin Blackwell signed eight players during the summer of 2007 in preparation for a tilt at promotion

But form began to tail off and worse news followed when the club were deducted 10 points for falling into administration in November and the New Year saw the beginning of player sales which affected the team's performances. Town lost their final six matches and were relegated to League 2.

With the new owners - a consortium headed by famous Hatters fan and TV presenters Nick Owen - set to take full control of the club in the summer the only problem the Hatters prepared themselves for was beginning their League 2 campaign with 15 points deducted for failure to agree to a Company Voluntary Agreement.

However the Football League decided that because the club had been in administration for the third time in nine years, they would punish them by deducting a further five

Worse news followed. The club were still being investigated by the Football Association for the past financial irregularities made public during Mike Newell's time at the club two years previously and as a result the club had a further 10 points docked by the FA which meant the club had to start the season with an incredible 30 point penalty.

The burden of the points deductions proved too much to shoulder and relegation out of the Football League came, meaning the club starting life in the Blue Square Premier this season after 89 years in the Football League.





Lowestoft-born Richard became the Hatters' 24th post-war permanent manager to succeed Mick Harford. Dubbed "Dicky Dosh" by Walsall fans

after he guided the Saddlers to the League 2 title in 2006/07. Richard played 49 times during his season-long stay at Kenilworth Road in 1982/83.

He scored once - in a 2-2 draw at Rotherham - and made his final appearance in a Luton shirt at Old Trafford as the Town went down 3-0 to Manchester United just days before the famous victory at Maine Road which kept the Town in the top-flight.

Richard cut his managerial teeth at Scunthorpe United - who he also served as a player, before going continuing his education overseas with two clubs in Sweden.

After a brief stint in Australia it was to the Bescot where he enjoyed his most successful spell before joining Newcastle United as academy director prior to returning to Bedfordshire.

FIRST TEAM COACHES -Alan Neilson

Alan joined the Kenilworth Road coaching staff in the summer of 2008 as youth team coach but was appointed first team coach alongside Kevin Watson in January 2009.

Neilson was once a player with the Hatters when his experience and versatility made Neilson him valuable member of the Hatters' squad between 2002 and 2005 and filled any role asked of him with dependable consistency - anywhere in the back four or in midfield.

Adaptable player who can play on the left or right hand side of defence or midfield. Jarvis came through the Norwich City youth system, becoming the youngest player to appear for the reserve team at the tender age of 14. He went on to spend loan periods at Torquay United and Rotherham United and after finding first team opportunities hard to come by Jarvis joined Luton Town in August 2008 on a free transfer.

Asa Hall

Versatile player capable of playing in midfield or defence. Hall began his football career in Wolverhampton Wanderers youth system, before signing his first professional contract with Birmingham City in 2004. While at the Blues he was a regular in the reserve team and was

named young player of the year in the 2004/05 season. He also received caps for England at Under-19 and Under-20 levels and went on to have loan spells with Boston United. Ashford Town and Shrewsbury Town, starting 13 games for the latter.

Kevin Nicholls

Kevin Nicholls needs no introduction to most Hatters fans. The hard-working midfielder enjoyed six successful seasons at Kenilworth Road between 2001 and 2006, captaining the side to the League One title in the 2004-2005 season.

FORWARDS -

Ryan Charles

An energetic striker who has made a huge impact at Kenilworth Road since making his debut in 2007. Charles, who has been at Kenilworth Road since the age of nine. had worked his way through the ranks at the Club before scoring 17 goals in his debut season for the Luton Town youth team. He followed that form up by scoring 12 goals for the youth team last season and his exploits during those two campaigns earned him his first team debut as a second half substitute at Southend in March. He was given his full team debut in the following game against Carlisle before scoring on his home debut against Oldham. Charles had turned down the chance to join local rivals Watford as a youngster.

Tom Craddock

Originally a defender, Tom developed into a promising forward who has done well at youth and Reserve team levels with Middlesbrough. He was the eighth member of Boro's 2004 FA Youth Cupwinning side to progress to first team level, following James Morrison, Tony McMahon, Andrew Taylor, David Wheater, Matthew Bates, Adam Johnson and Jason Kennedy. He joined the Hatters on-loan from the Riverside in October 2008 and scored twice on his debut in a 2-2 draw with Grimsby Town. A Shepherds Bush native, Gallen established himself as something of a legend at QPR. He notched up over 400 appearances and hit 97 goals for the R's in two spells spanning nearly 14 years. Gallen joined Huddersfield 2000 and after 10 goals in 30 starts for the Terriers. Gallen moved across Yorkshire to join Barnsley the following summer, but the call of West London saw him return to QPR within a few months. He scored nine goals in 16 league starts for MK Dons before joining Luton on loan.

Liam Hatch

The 6ft 3in Striker signed for the Hatters on a season-long loan from Peterborough United in June 2009.

Steve Basham

Experienced striker who joined the Hatters on a one-year deal in August 2009 following his release from Exeter City.

Mark Nwokeii

Lightening guick striker with superb goalscoring record at non-league level who signed on loan until January from League 2 outfit Dagenham & Redbridge.

Matthew Barnes-Homer

Prolific striker who joined the Hatters initially on a month's loan from Kidderminster Harriers and has agreed a two-and-a-half year contract to move permanently when the transfer window reopens on 1st January.


Taiwo Atieno







We now had two months to achieve this before the trophy had to be returned to Conference Headquarters.

At Edingale we also had the opportunity to present one of our Junior Lambs with a belated Christmas gift from the club! The two schools are so small that they share a headteacher, who unfortunately we never managed to meet, but both schools, like all those we visited, made us extremely welcome. The February half term break also saw the trophy at the clubs soccer school for a photographic opportunity with the footy mad girls and boys.

The trophy then had two final events to attend before leaving us but one other job had to be done. We took the trophy down to Ron Cheney at his shop on Bell Corner in the town where "TAMWORTH 2008-09" was finally engraved onto the trophy base. Once engraved it attended the February meeting of the Tamworth Probus Club where some of the towns more senior members were able to get a few photos with the trophy.

The trophy then had one more public event to attend and it was quite

a fitting end to its ten month stay in the Borough. In May 2009 the Mayor had invited the team and the trophy to a civic reception just a few days after we had won the Blue Square North league title and now, in February 2010, the trophy took centre stage at the Mayors Civic Dinner at Drayton Manor Park — a fitting end to very good and proud year.

A few days into March saw us head off to Conference HQ in Birmingham to return the trophy. Dennis Strudwick and Dave Boddy (pictured right) happily took it off our hands and we photographed the occasion just to confirm we had returned the trophy to its temporary custodians before new winners come along.

Despite the disappointment that we had failed in our aim to visit every school we were very pleased that the majority of children in the Borough had seen the trophy "up close and personal".



It seems an age since the trophy made it's home in Tamworth following that wonderful April evening after our victory over Hinckley United. The decision to take the

> trophy out into the community in the ten short months since then means it has been seen by thousands of people and has brought admiring looks from one and all. The trophy had been won by Gary Mills' squad of Tamworth FC players and witnessed by a few thousand fans along the way but the whole town has now shared and seen the trophy and we are delighted that we had been a part of making this possible. It was also great to read that one school visit had converted an entire family to becoming followers of the Lambs and we hope that it will encourage many more youngsters to The Lamb in the future.

It had been an amazing experience – thanks for the memories!

BUY A PROGRAMME OR GIRLS MAGAZINE



- Being drunk or under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- Making vulgar or obscene gestures
- Carrying any offensive objects or throwing any article onto the field of play
- · Smoking in prohibited areas

The club reserves the right to refuse admission to, or eject from the ground, any person who refuses to be searched by a steward or the club or other agency.

- No bottles, cans, drinking glasses, poles or other such article / object are permitted and stewards / other agency will have the right to refuse entry if any such item / article considered to be a danger to others is not surrendered.
- No flags or banners are allowed to be draped over the pitch perimeter hoardings but may be hung from rear fencing / walls where they do not cover advertising boards.
- The Football Club reserves the right to take photographs of the general public within the confines of the club's property in relation to club publicity or public safety.
- The consumption of alcohol is limited to the Social Club, sponsors lounge and boardroom.
