



MANAGEMENT STAFF

MANAGER - Richard Money

Lowestoft-born Richard became the Hatters' 24th post-war permanent manager to succeed Mick Harford.

Dubbed "Dicky Dosh" by Walsall fans after he guided the Saddlers to the League 2 title in 2006/07. Richard played 49 times during his season-long stay at Kenilworth Road in 1982/83.

He scored once — In a 2-2 draw at Rotherham — and made his final appearance in a Luton shirt at Old Trafford as the Town werl down 3-0 to Manchester United just days before the famous victory at Maine Road which kept the Town in the top-flight.

Richard cut his managerial teeth at Scunthorpe United - who he also served as a player, before going continuing his education overseas with two clubs in Sweden.

After a brief stint in Australia it was to the Bescot where he enjoyed his most successful spell before joining Newcastle United as academy director prior to returning to Bedfordshire. FIRST TEAM COACH

ALAN NEILSON - Born Wegburg, Germany - 26.10.72

Alan joined the Kenilworth Road coaching staff in the summer of 2008 as youth team coach but was appointed first team coach alongside Kevin Watson in January 2009.

Neilson was once a player with the Hatters when his experience and versatility made Neilson him valuable member of the Hatters' squad between 2002 and 2005 and filled any role asked of him with dependable consistency - anywhere in the back four or in midfield.

The former Welsh international was signed from Grimsby in 2002 as part of a cost-cutting exercise.

His international career began with appearances for Wales at youth and Under-21 level, followed by five full caps, and be enjoyed a good career in the Premiership, with his first club Newcastle and then with Southampton and Fulham.

Following the departure of Mick Harford on 1st October, Neilson was appointed as caretaker manager.

KEVIN WATSON - Born Hackney - 03.01.1974

Kevin joined the Hatters coaching staff as first team coach in January 2009.

He originally signed for the Town on a free transfer in August 2008 after being released by Colchester United but only managed 11 appearances in the Luton first team before taking his first coaching role.

He started his career with Tottenham, making a handful of first team appearances and spending time on loan at Brentford, Bristol City and Barnet.

In 1996 he moved to Swindon Town, where he helped assure their Division 1 status, from the County Ground Watson went on to spend three successful years with Rotherham United, where made 109 appearances and captained the Millers to two successive promotions.

His influence was noted by then Reading manager Alan Pardew who took him to the Madejski Stadium for a £150,000, where he won yet another promotion.

He then joined Coichester United where he started 132 league games and added a fourth promotion to his list of achievements. PLAYING STAFF

GOALKEEPERS - Mark Tyler - Born Norwich 02.04.77

Hugely experienced goalkeeper who signed a two-year contrat Kenilworth Road in June 2009

Kenilworth Road in June 2009 to become Mick Harford's fifth signing of the summer following his release

Peterborough United.

Mark made 483 appearances in 15 years at London Road and was rewarded for his loyalty with a testimonial against Liverpool in 2007.

After falling down the pecking order at Posh he found trist team opportunities hard to come by and in 2008/09 he was loaned out to League 2 Bury where he made 11 appearances for the Shakers. A former England Youth international, Tyler was handed the number one shirt by the Hatters boss who admitted he'd failed in sectional to him he decored the previous numbers.

Shane Gore - Born Ashford, Kent 28.10.8

Former Wimbledon stopper who arrived at Kenilworth Road on a short-term deal on the eye of the 2009/10 season.

He came through the ranks at Selhurst Park at a time when Mick Harford was a coach with the Dons but could only make one substitute appearance before leaving for Peterborough in 2003. Shane has also had spells with Barnet and Stevenage and featured for Maidenhead United in 2008/10 orfor to loining the Hatters.

DEFENDERS - Gavin Caines

Centre-half who signed on-loan from Kidderminster Harriers in March 2010 to give further competition for places in the season's made.

Gavin begun his career as a trainee at Walsall but joined Chetenham Town in 2004 helping the Robins to win promotion in his first season in which he also won the Young Player of the Year award.

After over 150 appearances five years at Whaddon Road he fell out of layour and signed in the summer of 2009 for Harriers scoring five times from central defence before his switch to Retfirstship.

Claude Gnakpa - Born Marseille - 09.06.83

A defender capable of playing centre back or full back, who joined on a free transfer in August 2008.

Having plied his trade across Europe with Montpelller HSC, Racing de Santander, Deportivo Alaves and FC Vaduz of Liechtenstein, Claude moved to Swindon Town for a brief spell.

He was then off again in July 2007 to Peterborough United and was a regular in the League 2 promotion winning side, starting 25 league games.

A favourite with the Kenilworth Road crowd the Frenchman scored the Hatters' winning goal in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final against Scunthorpe United in April 2009:

Keith Keane - -Born Luton - 20.11.86

Having made his debut as a 16-year-old in November 2003, Keith Keane went on to enjoy an extended run in the side from February onwards whilst Kevin Foley was out injured.

Such was the contribution he made that the return of Foley didn't signal the end of his involvement at first-team level and he finished the season with 14 appearances under his belt, all this whilst still in the first year of his scholarship.

Another of the youth team who regularly appears for the Republic of Ireland at schoolboy level, he joined the Hatters at the age of nine having been scouled in local football, and has made a rapid progression through the club's centre of excellence and youth teams, demonstrating enough potential to convince Mike Newell to give him his first taste of senior action.

Keith has featured most prominently on the right of midfield, bursting forward to great effect to provide many goals for himself and his team-mates.

Over the course of his career at Kenilworth Road Keane ha

proved to be one of the, if not the most, versatile players to pull

Capable of playing right the way across the back four or in midfield the only positions he's not featured for the Town (yet) are in goal

George Pilkington - Born Rugeley - 07.11.81

Highly experienced defender who joined the club on a free transfer in August 2008. Having began his career as an Everton trainee, Pilkington joined Port Vale in June 2003, after a loan spell at Exeter City, Having started 223 league games for the Valiants, the highly regarded defender was named player of the year twice and club capitalin.

George Beavan - Born Erith 12.01.90

A highly promising central defender Beavan was was spotted b former Youth Team coach Marvin Johnson, who initially gave hir a trial at the club.

He impressed tremendously and soon became a consister member of the Luton Town Youth team during the 2006/0 season.

Good in the air and strong in a tackle, George was promoted into the reserve team and a combination of injuries and player sale saw him given an unexpected debut against Bournemouth when after just six minutes, he came on as a substitute as Keith Kean hobbled off injured. George is predicted to have a bright future if the game by many at Keniliworth Road.

Sent on-loan to Salisbury City in 2008 he is currently enjoying his

Lewis Emanuel Born Bradford 14.10.83

Lewis Emanuel arrived at Kenikvorth Road in the summer of 2006 after deciding to leave his home town club Bradford City, the place where the defender started his career. Lewis is a pacy full-back but can also play on the left side of midfield, a position where he started on his league debut for the club. Lewis made over 150 appearances for Bradford in six-years at the club, scoring four goals. In his first season at Kenilworth Road he made 40 appearances, scoring twice. Out of contract at the end of the 2008/09 campaign, Lewis signed a new contract in July 2009.

Ed Asafu-Adjaye Born London 22.12.88

Capable of playing in any position across defence, Asafu-Adjaye has made significant progress through the Club's youth set-up. Sent on on-loan to non-league side Walton & Hersham, he made the breakthrough into the first team under former boss Mike Nawell, when the Club was stretched to the limits through injury and suspension.

Although the youngster was an unused sub for three matches Youth Coach Marvin Johnson gave Ed a glowing reference to incoming boss Kevin Blackwell, who gave him a one-year contract.

However with first team opportunities still blocked, Ed went onloan to Salisbury. City where he earned rave reviews and when Mick Harford arrived as manager at Kenilworth Road one of the first things he did when he was in charge was to recall the young defender.

Making his full debut in March 2008 at Kenilworth Road against Crewe Alexandra he has gone from strength to strength and was part of the Town tearn that won the Johnstone's Paint Trophy at Wembley in 2009.

Jake Howells - Born Hemel Hempstead 18.04.91

The young left back came through the ranks at Kenilworth Road and made his first team debut as a second half substitute in May 2008. He made his full debut in the Hatters colours away a Bradford City in October 2008.

After making 36 appearances for the Hatters in the 2008/09 t

Janos Kovacs

Giant Hungarian-born defender who signed for the Hatters in January 2010 from League 2 side Lincoln City.

Kovacs enjoyed 18 months at Sincil Bank before being placed on the transfer list by boss Chris Sutton.

A cult hero in Lincolnshire he joined the Imps following a successful spell with Chesterfield where he spent two years.

Shane BlackettBorn Luton 03.10.82

Luton-born Shane became Mick Harford's sixth summer signing of 2009 after penning a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road from Peterborough United.

Equally adept at centre-back or at left-back, Shane began his career with Dunstable Town before a switch to Arlesey Town in 2003.

His form with the United Counties side alerted the attentions of Dagenham & Redbridge who signed the 6ft 3in defender in May 2004.

He made 83 appearances during his time at Victoria Road and helped the Daggers win the Conference title and earn promotion to the Football League in 2006/07.

His reputation as a pacey defender alerted the attention of Peterborough who snapped him with Dagenham team-mate Craig Mackail-Smith in January 2007 going onto make 38 appearances during his time with the London Road outfit.

Freddie Murray Born Clonmel 22.05.82

Left-footed versatile defender who joined the Hatters on a sixmonth loan deal from Blue Square Premier side Grays Atheltic in August 2009 and was made permanent in January 2010.

Murray only signed for the Essex club in August before making his debut for the Town in the 4-1 victory over Mansfield Town just hours after putting pen to paper.

Previously with Northampton Town, Stevenage Borough and Cambridge United Freddie began his career as a trainee with Blackburn Rovers.

MIDFIELDERS

Adam Newton - Born 04.12.80

Ascot-born Adam became Mick Harford's second summer signing after agreeing a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road following his release from Brentford.

Predominately used as a right winger, the pacy wide man is equally as comfortable at right-back.

Adam started his career at West Ham United, coming through the Hammers' respected academy but could only make three substitute appearances during his time at Upton Park before signing for Peterborough United in May 2002.

The former England Under 21 international went onto make a name for himself with the Posh making 249 appearances in six years at London Road going onto win promotion at the end of the 2007/08 campaign.

After leaving Peterborough at the end of the 2007/08 season, Adam was snapped by Andy Scott and Brentford where he helped the Bees to the League 2 title.

A St Kitts and Nevis international, he has spent time on-loan at Portsmouth, Notts County and Leyton Orient.

Rossi Jarvis - Born Fakenham - 11.03.88

Adaptable player who can play on the left or right hand side of defence or midfield. Javris came through the Norwich City youth system, becoming the youngest player to appear for the reserve team at the tender age of 14. He went on to spend loan periods at Torquay United and Rotherham United and after finding first team opportunities hard to come by Jarvis joined Luton Town in August 2008 on a free transfer.

Asa Hall - Born Sandwell - 29.11.86

Versatile player capable of playing in midfield or defence. Hall began his football career in Wolverhampton Wanderers youth system, before signing his first professional contract with Birmingham City in 2004. While at the Blues he was a regular in the reserve team and was named young player of the year in the 2004/05 season. He also received caps for England at Under-19 and Under-20 levels and went on to have loan spells with Boston United, Ashford Town and Shrewsbury Town, starting 13 garnes for the latter.

Kevin Nicholls - Born Newham - 02.01.79

Kevin Nicholls needs no introduction to most Hatters fans. The hard-working midfielder enjoyed six successful seasons at Kenilworth Road between 2001 and 2006, captaining the side to the League One title in the 2004-2005 season.

Nicholls began his career at Charlton Athletic, before moving to Wigan Athletic in 1999, where he made 28 appearances in two years. He moved to Luton in 2001, and in the next six seasons went on to appear 175 times, scoring 30 goals.

Following Luton's successful first-season in The Championship and the spirited FA-Cup performances, Nicholis was a player very much in demand. He moved to Leeds United for _700,000 in July 2006 and was made club captain by then boss Dennis Wise. However, his very public fall-out with Wise saw him fall down the pecking order at Elland Road, and the following summer he moved to Preston North End for a fee of _750,000.

His time at Preston began encouragingly, however a change in the management team saw his first-team opportunities limited. Kevin was delighted to re-sign for Luton, signing a three-year deal in August 2008 and being named as club captain.

EUBMARUS

Ryan Charles - Born Enfield - 30,09.89

An energetic striker who has made a huge impact at Kenilworth Road since making his debut in 2007. Charles, who has been at Kenilworth Road since the age of nine, had worked his way through the ranks at the Club before scoring 17 goals in his debut season for the Luton Town youth team. He followed that form up by scoring 12 goals for the youth team last season and his exploits during those two campaigns earned him his first team debut as a second half substitute at Southend in March. He was given his full team debut in the following game against Carlisle before scoring on his home debut against Oldham. Charles had turned down the chance to join local rivals Watford as a youngster.

Tom Craddock - Born Darlington - 14.10.86

Originally a defender, Torn developed into a promising forward who has done well at youth and Reserve team levels with Middlesbrough. He was the eighth member of Boro's 2004 FA Youth Cup-winning side to progress to first team level, following James Morrison, Torny McMahon, Andrew Taylor, David Wheater, Matthew Bates, Adam Johnson and Jason Kennedy. He joined the Hatters on-loan from the Riverside in October 2008 and scored twice on his debut in a 2-2 draw with Grimsby Town. Two further goals followed in the games against Bury and Chesterfield and once his loan expired Mick Harford moved quickly to snap up the striker on a permanent basis.

A £80,000 bid was accepted by Middlesbrough and Tom signed a two-and-half year contract in January 2009. He has previously spent spells on loan with Wrexham and Hartlepool United.

Jordan Patrick - Born Luton - 14.10.92

Promising young forward who became the youngest ever player to feature for the Hatters.

Patrick made his first team bow when appearing as a substitute at Grimsby Town in October 2008 aged 16 years and seven days and set-up Tom Craddock for 90th minute equaliser.

With pace to burn the striker is tipped to have a big future ahead of him and is a regular for the Town's Under 18s. Kevin Gallen - Born Hammersmith - 21.09.75

A Shepherds Bush native, Gallen established himself as something of a legend at OPR. He notched up over 400 appearances and hit 97 goals for the R's in two spells spanning nearly 14 years. Gallen joined Huddersfield 2000 and after 10 goals in 30 starts for the Terriers, Gallen moved across Yorkshire to join Barnsley the following summer, but the call of West London saw him return to QPR within a few months. He scored nine goals in 16 league starts for MK Dons before joining Luton on loan.

After a successful loan spell Gallen joined permanently in January 2009, signing until the end of the season before agreeing a one year contract extension with the club in May keeping him at Kenilworth Road until June 2010.

Liam Hatch - Born Hitchin 03.04.82

The 6ft 3in Striker signed for the Hatters on a season-long loan from Peterborough United in June 2009.

Hatch started his career with Herne Bay before a move to neighbours Gravesend & Northfleet in 2001.

A successful spell at Stonebridge Road saw him transferred to Barnet for $\mathfrak{L}17,500$ where he helped the Bees to promotion to the

Football League with 11 league goals in the 2004/05 campaign.

His form at Underhill alerted the attention of Peterborough United who paid £150,000 for the striker's services.

With first team opportunities limited at London Road Hatch was sent on-loan to Darlington during the 2008/09 campaign where he hit nine goals in 29 league and cup appearances at the Darlington

Steve Basham - Born Southampton 02.12.77

Experienced striker who joined the Hatters on a one-year deal in August 2009 following his release from Exeter City.

The forward began is career with home-town club Southampton but only made one start during his time at the Dell.

With first team opportunities limited on the South Coast, Basham was sent on-loan to Wrexham and Preston North End and, following a second successful spell at Deepdale, he signed permanently for the Lancashire outfit for £200,000 in the summer of 1999.

However, after making 61 appearances – and winning a promotion with North End in 2000 – he signed for Oxford United in August 2002.

Basham scored 43 goals in 139 league starts at the Kassam Stadium and was best remembered in Oxfordshire for his ability to link the play and create opportunities for his team-mates.

The striker was on the move again in 2007, moving south to Exeter City where – in his first season at the club – he helped the Grecians win promotion back to the Football League.

After winning promotion again last season from League 2, he was released from St James Park this summer after making 27 league starts and scoring seven goals.

Mark Nunkeii

Lightening quick striker with superb goalscoring record at nonleague level who signed on loan until January from League 2 outfit Dagenham & Redbridge.

Matthew Barnes-Homer

Prolific striker who joined the Hatters initially on a month's loan from Kidderminster Harriers and has agreed a two-and-a-half year contract to move permanently when the transfer window re-opens on 1st January

After notching 21 goals in all competitions last season, the powerful forward has scored nine times in 20 league appearances this term and, since arriving at the Worcestershire club in 2007, has hit an impressive tally of 34 goals in 77 starts.

Barnes-Homer also enjoyed a dream start to his international career when he netted the winner on his debut for England C in their 2-1 win over Poland in November.

An energetic talent, the front man began his career as a trainee at Wolves before going on to lead something of a nomadic life prior to finding his feet at Kidderminster.

After leaving Molineux he tried his luck in the United States before returning to England and, following success with a clutch of non-league sides, Barnes-Homer was snapped by Wycombe

He struggled to make an impression at Adam Park but, after being released at the end of the 2006/07 season, Harriers manager Mark Yates beat off competition from a host of sides to capture his sionature.

His form in front of goal at Kidderminster had alerted the attentions of a number of Football League teams but Barnes-Horner was suitably impressed by the Hatters' vision and became Richard Money's first signing for the club.

Taiwo Ateno

Kenyan international striker Taiwo signed in March 2010 until the end of the season after returning to the UK after a spell playing in Puerto Rico and America.

Starting his career as a scholar at Walsall he failed to make the breakthrough at the Bescot and was send out on loan gain first team experience to a number of Football League sides.

After failing to make the grade with the Saddlers he was snapped up by Tamworth and scored 12 goals in his first season with the Lambs before signing for the Puerto Rico Islanders in 2007.


Shortly before half-time Lee Tomlin was replaced by Cliff Akurang, having picked up a twisted ankle.

There was still time for Sam Smith to go close as he tried to flick a Curtis Osano cross towards goal, and Cliff Akurang shot from a narrow angle towards an empty goal go narrowly wide, after Lance Cronin had slipped when trying to clear outside his area.

The final whistle sounded to confirm the Diamonds place in the playoffs, with the players saluting the fans who had got behind the team so well, paying particular attention to those in the North Stand who will be relocated for the Diamonds final home game of the regular season.

Mansfield Town 3 Rushden & Diamonds 2

Rushden & Diamonds unbeaten run ended in controversial fashion at Field Mill after they had twice taken the lead. After seeing three solid penalty claims for the Diamonds turned down, the Stags were awarded what looked the weakest claim of the night as the game entered injury time.



This was the 1000th game in the Diamonds history, and their performance deserved more from the game, which also ended their unbeaten record at Field Mill.

The first half belonged almost entirely to the Diamonds, as they completely dominated midfield, with ex-Diamonds Mills and Burgess looking well off the pace.

Louis found his way past Andy Nicholas to get a low cross that Aaron O'Connor couldn't quite reach, and then a Diamonds corner saw Curtis Osano find plenty of room for an unchallenged header that Alan Marriott pushed around the post. Another Louis cross went over Marriott, but dropped

narrowly over the bar. All three Diamonds strikers threatened to break through the shaky looking home defence, and it was no surprise to see the Diamonds take the lead after 16 minutes when Jefferson Louis picked up the ball near the centre circle and threaded a ball that dissected the home defence for Aaron O'Connor to run onto and fire home a well-hit low shot from just outside the area for his fourteenth goal of the season.

Pattison set up O'Connor for a chance on the half-hour mark that forced ex-Diamonds keeper Alan Marriott to make a fine save, and then Louis blazed over before a rare Stags attack saw Louis Briscoe tackled by the impressive

Further chances fell to Mark Byrne and Matt Pattison before half-time and it looked like that chance was to be from the penalty spot, as cross from Mark Byrne was clearly handled on the edge of the six yard box by Gary Silk, but no penalty was awarded.

After the Diamonds had dominated the first half, it was important that they continued in that vein in the second half. Unfortunately a routine long ball towards the left hand corner of the Diamonds half saw Jamie Stuart lay the ball back to Dale Roberts. Roberts wasn't in a position to kick upfield, so



passed it back to Stuart, but the skipper chose to take two touches, second of which was intercepted by Kyle Perry, and he quickly passed to Jake Speight who fired past Roberts for the

The Diamonds were still finding holes in the home defence and one of the major controversies of the night came on the hour mark when Aaron O'Connor tricked his way past two defenders before hitting a shot that Marriott could

only parry. As Cliff Akurang went after the loose ball

there was clear contact with Marriott, but, rather than awarding what looked a clear penalty, referee Simpson booked Akurang for an alleged dive.

Shortly afterwards Sam Smith was brought on for Akurang, and within three minutes he had restored the Diamonds lead Jefferson Louis had an



"assist" for the first Diamonds goal, and he had a part in the second when he worked a Mark Byrne pass into the path of Sam Smith, whose first touch took him past his marker, and his second fired the ball high into the net past

The Diamonds had their third solid penalty claim of the night waved away by the referee when another run by Aaron O'Connor was slowed by an attempted trip but the striker 's attempts to keep on his feet allowed referee Simpson to wave away the claims.

The Diamonds were continuing to close down the ineffective Stags midfield, and they did this to such an effect they were forced to retreat all the way back to Marriott after an attack broke down midway into the Diamonds half. Marriott's long ball deceived Jamie Stuart, who could only deflect the ball into the path of the breaking Jake Speight who ran forwards and lobbed the advancing Roberts for the second equaliser.

Jefferson Louis had been supporting the Diamonds midfield all evening, but a challenge on Luke Foster in front of the dugout earned him a yellow card, and then a challenge on Briscoe saw referee Simpson decide to give him a second vellow card.

There was still time for the final controversy of the night, when Mark Byrne challenged Kyle Nix in the Diamonds box and referee Simpson pointed to the spot. After a delay Rob Duffy hit a penalty just to the left of centre of the goal that Roberts came close to stopping, but the Diamonds had seen their unbeaten run come to an end.




Manager Justin Edinburgh commented – "They're both thoroughly deserved, both have made excellent progress throughout the course of the season.

Wrexham 0 Rushden & Diamonds 1

A much-changed Rushden & Diamonds showed great spirit and determination to defeat Wrexham at the Racecourse Ground.



The Diamonds goal came after 17 minutes when a Matt Pattison corner was flicked on to Aaron O'Connor at the far post, and his over the shoulder effort squeezed in from a very narrow angle. The main concern though, was the injury sustained by O'Connor in the second half, as he had to be stretchered from the field with a twisted ankle after being tripped by Aaron Brown. The Diamonds had to constantly reorganise in the second half, with Aynsley McDonald given his league debut as a substitute, after Joe Day was similarly given his first start, as the Diamonds held firm with a final back four of Porter, Huke, Osano and McDonald,

In front of a big crowd on a sunny afternoon in Wales the home side had the better of the early possession, but it was the Diamonds who created the first good chance, with a Matt Pattison cross being shielded back to Aaron O'Connor by Sam Smith, and the Diamonds skipper forced a good low save from keeper Maxwell.

Sam Smith had a run down the centre which forced another save from Maxwell before the Diamonds took the lead after 17 minutes. Mansour Assoumani fouled Cliff Akurang just inside the Wrexham half, and the Matt Pattison free-kick was deflected away for a corner. Pattison also took the kick, and it was knocked down by Curtis Osano towards the far post, to where Aaron O'Connor had made a clever run, and the Diamonds stand-in skipper flicked the ball over his shoulder and into the net despite the efforts of Maxwell and two defenders. O'Connor pointed to his captain's armband as he celebrated the opening

The Diamonds had a scare at the other end when a corner from Mark Jones was fired towards goal by Mansour Assoumani but it was scrambled clear by Simon Downer, and as half-time approached a low ball across the area from Adrian Cieslewicz eluded everyone and went away for a goal kick.

The second half started with the Diamonds still looking the most likely to convert the chances

created, and Aaron O'Connor went close to scoring his 16th of the season when he showed excellent ball skills to bring an Akurang cross under control, but his shot was blocked.

With less than 10 minutes of the half gone, the Diamonds made their first change, with Aynsley McDonald making his league debut at right back, when Shane Huke moved to centre back to replace Simon Downer as the Diamonds management took the sensible step of bringing off Downer knowing that a second vellow card would mean a three match ban given his earlier dismissals this season. Huke was following up his impressive game at Mansfield with an assured performance at both right back and centre back. The Diamonds defence had several permutations during the half, as later on in the half Kurt Robinson was also replaced, he too having picked up an earlier yellow card. That meant McDonald moved to his more familiar position of left back, with Max Porter entering the action at right back.

After 56 minutes the Diamonds appeared to be denied what

looked a certain penalty as he was clattered into by keeper Maxwell when about to "pull the trigger" on a shooting chance. Referee Bond was not able to make a decision in the face of the protests of the home crowd behind the goal that Smith had exaggerated what looked like solid contact.

Just after the hour mark the Red Dragons won a corner on their left, with Aaron Brown forcing debutant McDonald to concede the kick. As happened several times, a poor corner was easily cleared, and Aaron O'Connor set off on a run with only Brown preventing him getting clear on goal. A very poor challenge from Brown saw O'Connor brought down, and he had to be stretchered from the field with an ankle injury. It was a surprise that Brown was only shown a vellow card, especially as this meant that such a poor challenge was equated with some fairly innocuous challenges that had earned yellow earlier.

Following O'Connor's injury Mark Byrne came on, and he was given a more forward role than usual, and his clever runs in the centre helped create more space on the flanks for Matt Pattison who was having one of his most impressive games for the club. after having started the game as the most experienced midfielder in the side. A Pattison cross from the left eluded the home defence, but Smith and Byrne appeared to get in each others way in their eagerness to finish what looked an excellent chance. Byrne also went very close with a well-hit shot that shaved the left-hand post with Maxwell beaten.

The one real scare for debutant Joe Day in the second half occurred when he came to the edge of the area to clear up a loose ball, and some confusion with Huke and McDonald meant he knocked the ball towards striker Gareth Taylor, whose attempted lob towards an empty net went just over the bar. Stoney's Tutorial

This is a quick and easy session to get started when you may only have one goal or one goalkeeper at your disposa

How do I organise the session?

Mark out an area that starts along the penalty spot and moves outside the penalty box. Players are divided into one team of 7 (red) and one team of 5 (blue). The red players, as shown in the diagram, have one target player on the outside at either end of the grid. The red team should have a restriction on the number of touches they are allowed to take when in possession of the ball.

So how does the session work

The goal of the red team is to try and pass the ball from their target player at one end of the grid to the target player at the opposite end without any blue player intercepting. If a blue player wins possession of the ball then his objective is to try and score or set up a teammate to shoot at the main goal. If the blue team score then play is re-started by the coach from the back of the grid. Red players are allowed to try and re-gain possession of the ball.





Can I move from this session into a shooting exercise?

Mark out two triangles on the corner edges of the penalty box. Players are divided into 3's. Player A passes to Player B, Player B passes to C and C sets up Player A who has made a run around B to cross the ball. As soon as Players B and C have touched the ball, they make runs into the penalty box to attack the incoming cross. Players rotate positions and switch to opposite triangle.

That should I be looking to coach?

Quality of passes and crosses (low ball across near post or high ball to far post); Timing of runs; Decision-making when shooting and quality of shots;


