FLEETWOOD manager Micky Mellon hailed the Cod Army's finest hour as Luton's title hopes took a real

battering at Kenilworth Road.

News of AFC Wimbledon and Crawley winning compounded a rare off day at the mud-splattered office for Richard Money's Hatters. tasting defeat for the first time in 11 league outings and only the second occasion at home this term.
