

Livermore: We will give Hatters a fight

DAVID Livermore believes Histon can make life difficult for promotion-chasing Luton Town when they visit the Glass World Stadium today.

The Stutes ended a run of six and a half games without a goal in Saturday's 2-1 defeat to Bath City with one of their best recent attacking displays.

After Marley Watkins put the hosts in front early on, Daniel Sparkes netted in the second half to level the scores.

Lewis Hogg scored the winner for City but Histon boss Livermore was delighted with his team's attacking play.

He said: "Luton are a top side. They're a team that are going for promotion so they will be going all out to take some sort of form into the play-offs.

"We're expecting a tough, tough game. But if we can take the game to the opposition like we did (on Saturday) then we'll cause them problems. It's just important that we try to keep that back door shut."

Livermore is likely to be without Omer Riza for the rest of the season after the striker limped off with a groin injury in the 69th minute.

Lewis Taaffe is also a doubt after picking up a knock in training at the end of last week.

Livermore continued to look at the positives in his assessment of the Bath match.

"For large parts we controlled the game, especially in the second half," he added.

"Some of our passing was fantastic and what was pleasing was that it was passing with a purpose and had an end product.

"It's what we've been asking for all season and what we've been working hard on in training. It was nice to see that finally it all clicked into place."
