

elcome to the New Bucks Head for this game against Luton Town, who are undoubtedly the biggest club in this league.

I've seen Luton and had reports on them. They've got pace, energy and can play three in the middle so we need to ensure we don't get outnumbered in there. They're probably the biggest spenders, full-time and they get the biggest crowds so we're under no illusions that it's going to be a tough test this evening and we'll need all hands to the pump.

Reflecting on Saturday, I was delighted with how we responded after Southport. I don't want to dwell on that but we've picked holes in it individually and as a team and I felt that Saturday's performance was more like us. We were solid, on the front-foot and tried to stop the opposition playing but were also creative as well. We might have won the game with a bit more luck - fine lines again make a difference at this level. However I've got to be pleased and the crowd were great again.

They stuck with us because they saw the players having a go.

It was testament to our performance that I was a little disappointed we didn't win but it's another brick in the foundations against a side I would expect to be there or thereabouts. Six months ago that would have been a League side against a Conference North team and we'd have treated it like a cup final. Just because we're in the same league now we still need to treat it like a cup final and we went about our business well. The boys deserve a big pat on the back.

I changed the team around and I don't think anyone can have any qualms. It was great to have Shane Killock and Carl Rodgers back and we saw how valuable Bruno is in that role. As for Dan Preston, he's been one of our best players but he'd had flu all week and I'd got the quality and depth to rest him, which is what I did with Richard Davies too.


I know the players because I see them more than anybody. We've strength-in-depth all over and for everyone I please I have to disappoint someone; that's my job.

Overall I've got to be pleased with how the seven games have gone and we're more than holding our own. Another big test tonight

FC Telford United will be looking to build on another positive performance against Stockport to secure three points tonight against in-form opponents Luton Town.

The Buck's will feel disappointed at claiming only a point from the game, where a combination of better finishing and a string of fine saves from Hatter's keeper Matt Glennon denied Telford all three points.

Telford boss Andy Sinton was optimistic of the performance on Saturday claiming the performance was more like "us" and "we might have won the game with a bit more luck" and citing that this is the difference at Conference level.

Sinton may again ring the changes for tonight's game as the boss continues his rotation policy. Saturday's game saw five changes to the first team, and Sinton may look to recall Dan Preston and Richard Davies as both were left out of Saturday's squad as precautions.

Adam Proudlock will be in contention for a place in the squad on Tuesday night after completing ninety minutes last week.

The Buck's will need to be on the top of their game as the team face arguably their greatest test of the season in Luton Town, Conference play-off finalists last season.

Since the original fixture was postponed on the opening day, Luton remain unbeaten in their first seven games which has seen three wins and four draws.

Luton is another full-time club who have undergone a decline in recent

Under Mike Newell the club won League One in 2004/05, following two seasons in the Championship the Hatters then suffered consecutive relegations from both the Championship and League One.

At the end of the 2007/08 season, Luton entered administration just before their relegation from League One; where severe consequences followed into the next season.

The club were docked 30 points for the start of the 2008/09 season by the FA and the Football League for the clubs financial irregularities and despite many appeals, the decision stood and the club were relegated at the end of the season.

Both teams collected silverware during this season with Luton claiming the Johnstone's Paint Trophy and AFC Telford United won the Setanta Shield.

Luton Town reached the Play-off final in May facing AFC Wimbledon at The Etihad Stadium, where after a goalless draw they were defeated on

A win tonight for AFC Telford will see the club move into the top half of the table, where a success for Luton will move them up to third.

On reflecting on the opening seven games of the season, Andy Sinton believes the club need to be wiser and calls for improvement on fitness levels and understanding, if the club are to acclimatise to the Conference.

AFC Telford United would like to announce some changes to current roles and responsibilities at the club.



back


change in system which saw Telford deploy five in midfield as he started alongside Phil Trainer and Nathan Rooney in the middle of the park.





fter 89 years in the Football League, Luton Town began life in the Blue Square Premier for the first time in 2009.

In their first season in non-league football the Luton finished second behind champions Stevenage but lost in the Play-Offs at the semi-final stage to York City.

During that campaign Richard Money took over from Mick Harford where the Town also reached the third round of the FA Cup.

The Hatters again suffered Play-Off heartache in 2010/11 and again there was a change in manager - Gary Brabin taking over from Money in March.

After finishing third this time around and beating Wrexham in the semi-finals the Town lost on penalties to AFC Wimbledon in the Promotion Final at the City of Manchester Stadium after the game ended goalless after 120 minutes.

THE MANAGER

riginally brought to the club as Chief Scout at the time Richard Money was appointed manager in October 2009, Brabin was reassigned in the new role as assistant manager in the summer of 2010.

Following the departure of Richard Money in March 2011, Brabin took control of the Hatters until the end of the 2010/11 season.

After playing over 275 times in League football as a toughtackling midfielder, Brabin moved into management firstly with Southport - guiding them to the Conference North Playoffs - before moving south to manage Cambridge United in 2008.

In his first - and eventually only - season at the Abbey Stadium he guided the U's to the Blue Square Premier Play-off final after finishing runners-up to champions Burton Albion, but lost to Torquay United at Wembley.

Despite that set-back Brabin was awarded the BSP Manager of the Year award before behind the scenes differences at the Abbey led to him leaving the club in July 2009 before arriving at Kenilworth Road.

Jordan Patrick

16 years and 7 days was how old Jordan Patrick was when he made his Luton debut in 2008. This made him the youngest player to play for Luton in a 2-2 away draw against Grimsby Town. His assist for Tom Craddock secured the point. He made his second and last 1st team appearance a month later in a 3-0 defeat to Shrewsbury town. He was released at the end of the 2010-11 season.

£3,000,000

Curtis Davis

That is how much West Brom paid for Curtis Davies in 2005 from Luton. This is the joint record fee that the Hatters have received for a player. Davies went on to play 73 times for the Baggies before making the switch to near neighbours Villa after a successful loan spell. 66 games at Villa and a short loan spell with Leicester last season saw the defender to join Birmingham in January 2011.

Mark Tyler

Hugely experienced goalkeeper who signed a two-vear contract at Kenilworth Road in June 2009 to become Mick Harford's fifth signing of the summer following his release from Peterborough United.

Mark made 483 appearances in 15 years at London Road and was rewarded for his loyalty with a testimonial against Liverpool in 2007.

After falling down the pecking order at Posh he found first team opportunities hard to come by and in 2008/09 he was loaned out to League 2 Bury where he made 11 appearances for the Shakers.

A former England Youth international. Tyler was handed the number one shirt by the Hatters boss who admitted he'd failed in an attempt to sign the stopper the previous summer

After a hugely successful two years between the sticks at Kenilworth Road, Mark signed a new contract in the summer of 2011.



Kevin Pilkington

Vastly experienced goalkeeper who joined the Hatters in May 2010 after his release from Notts County

Pilkington began his career with Manchester United playing six times in the Premier League under Sir Alex Ferguson.

After 23 league appearances for the Valiants, he planned on Aberystwyth Town and Wigan Athletic being his next two ports of call.

However, he found stability at his next club. Mansfield, joining the Stags in 2000 and went onto feature 167 times in league action over the next five years.

Pilkington joined the Hatters on-loan in November and went onto make 11 appearance between the sticks whilst at Kenilworth Road before injury curtailed his stay.

But when the Magpies released him in the summer of 2010, Money was quick to snan up the veteran permanently, giving the Town the choice of two excellent goalkeepers



Dan Gleeson

Tall and athletic defender, primarily a right-back. Gleeson signed for the Hatters in the summer of 2010 from his home town club Cambridge United

A product of the U's academy, Gleeson made his debut at 18 and soon became a regular at the Abbey Stadium making 61 league appearances before Notts County snapped up his signature in 2006.

Gleeson only lasted a season at Meadow Lane, featuring 17 times before he was back at the Abbey, firstly on-loan before resigning permanently in 2007.

Recognised as one of the best right-backs outside the Football League, Gleeson's performances have seen him rewarded with seven England C caps.



George Pilkington

Highly experienced defender who joined the club on a free transfer in August 2008. Having began his career as an Everton trainee, Pilkington joined Port Vale in June 2003, after a loan spell at Exeter City. Having started 223 league games for the Valiants, the highly-regarded defender has been named Player of the Year

Injury frustrated the centre-half in his first season at Kenilworth Road in 2008/09 but he still managed to pick-up a Johnstone's Paint Trophy winners' medal.

Pilkington hit the headlines for his goalscoring exploits in the Town's first season in the Conference, twice scoring braces in early season victories over Mansfield and Crawley.

His impeccable form on the pitch led to him winning a string of end-of-season awards and underlined his loyalty to the Hatters by signing a new contract at the end of the 2009/10 campaign



Keith Keane

Having made his debut as a 16-yearold in November 2003, Keith Keane went on to enjoy an extended run in the side from February onwards whilst Kevin Foley was out injured.

He joined the Hatters at the age of nine having been scouted in local football, and made a rapid progression through the club's centre of excellence and youth teams, demon strating enough potential to convince Mike Newell to give him his first taste of senior action

Over the course of his career at Kenilworth Road Keane has proved to be one of the most versatile players.

Capable of playing right the way across the back four or in midfield the only positions he's not featured are in goal and up-front.

Out of contract at the end of the 2009/10 campaign the winner of the Hatters' Goal of the Season award delighted everyone at Kenilworth Road by penning a two-year deal to keep him at the club until 2012.



Charlie Henry

Winger Henry signed from Blue Square Bet Premier rivals Newport County in November 2010, signing initially on-loan until January when the England C international will complete a permanent switch.

Henry is no stranger to Kenilworth Road as he came through the youth ranks at the Club.

Now 24, Henry came back to Bedfordshire with a bang when hitting a superb goal when Newport were the visitors earlier in the campaign.

That strike was one of two the Stevenage-born flyer has hit this term as the Exiles have adjusted to life in non-league's top flight with ease.

Henry also netted nine times as Dean Holdsworth's side plundered over 93 goals last season to romp to the title.

From South Wales via after spells with a host of non-league sides since leaving Kenilworth Road he's back when it all began and ready to help the Town back into the Football League.



Matthew Barnes-Homer

Prolific striker who joined the Hatters initially on a month's loan from Kidderminster Harriers before agreeing a two-and-a-half year contract in 1st January 2010.

Capable of playing in any position across defence, Asafu-Adjave has made significant progress

After a loan spell with non-league side Walton & Hersham, he made the breakthrough into the first team under former boss Mike Newell, when the Club was stretched to the limits through injury and suspension.

Although the youngster was an unused sub for three matches, Youth Coach Marvin Johnson gave Ed a glowing reference to incoming boss Kevin Blackwell, who gave him a onevear contract

However with first team opportunities limited. Ed went on-loan to Salisbury City where he earned rave reviews and when Mick Harford arrived as Manager at Kenilworth Road one of the first things he did was recall the young defender.

Making his full debut in March 2008 at Kenilworth Road against Crewe Alexandra he has gone from strength to strength.



Shane Blackett

Luton-born Shane became Mick Harford's sixth summer signing of 2009 after penning a two-year contract at Kenilworth Road.

Equally adept at centre-back or at left-back, Shane began his career with Dunstable Town before a switch to Arlesey Town in 2003.

His form with the United Counties side alerted the attentions of Dagenham & Redbridge who signed the 6ft 3in defender in May 2004.

He made 83 appearances during his time at Victoria Road and helped the Daggers win the Conference title and earn promotion to the Football League in 2006/07.

His reputation as a pacey defender alerted the attention of Peterborough who snapped him up with Dagenham team-mate Craig Mackail-Smith in January 2007. He went on to make 38 appearances during his time at London Road.



Freddie Murray

Left-footed versatile defender who joined the Hatters on a six-month loan deal from Blue Square Premier side Grays Athletic in August 2009 and the deal was made permanent in January 2010.

Murray only signed for the Essex club in August before making his debut for the Town in the 4-1 victory over Mansfield Town just hours after putting pen to paper.

Previously with Northampton Town, Stevenage Borough and Cambridge United the Irishman began his career as a trainee with Blackburn



Jake Howells

The young winger, who can also play at left-back or in central midfield, came through the ranks at Kenilworth Road and made his first team debut as a second half substitute in May 2008. He made his full debut in the Hatters colours away at Bradford City in October 2008.

After making 36 appearances for the Hatters in the 2008/09 the England C international was rewarded for his efforts with a professional contract in May.

In his first season as a pro. Howells made huge strides with impressive performances on the leftside of midfield, ending the 2009/10 campaign with six goals, including his first senior goal in the incredible 4-3 win over Cambridge in September 2000



Amari Morgan-Smith

Striker or wide man who arrived at Kenilworth Road as a free agent following a two-year spell at Ilkeston

pressive form for the Robins earned him a call-up to the England C squad at the end of last season, earning his first cap against the Republic of Ireland in May

Earlier this season his former boss Kevin Wilson hailed the striker. who scored 23 goals last season, as the "hottest property in non-league football"

With huge interest in the forward, Town boss Richard Money was delighted to beat off competition from a number of Championship and League One sides for Morgan-Smith's signature.

And, hours after completing the paperwork. Morgan-Smith was thrust into action for his debut against Mansfield and scored in the 2-0 victory.



Aaron O'Connor

Striker, who picked up a plethora of end-of-season awards at Nene Park arrived at Kenilworth Road after signing a two-year contact following The fast and skilful frontman's imthe expiry of his deal with Rushden &

> Diamonds He scored 27 times in two seasons at Nene Park after arriving from Mansfield Town and went onto be a huge favourite at the Northamptonshire club.

Between 2004 and 2007 he scored 80 goals in 127 games which saw him pick up the Player's Player of the Year, Manager's Player of the Year and Supporter's Player of the Year awards two seasons in succession.

Aaron went from Gravs to Mansfield in 2008 where he scored eight times in 39 games at Field Mill prior to his switch to Rushden in the summer of 2009.

Known for his strength and turn of pace the Nottingham-born front man can also play wide.



Danny Crow

A nippy poacher of a striker, Crow joined the Hatters from Cambridge United in May 2010 following the expiry of his contract at the Abbey Stadium

The front man started his career as a trainee with Norwich City and made his senior bow in the Premier League for the Canaries in December 2004.

A loan spell at Northampton followed towards the end of the 2004/05 season before he was released by Norwich and signed for Peterborough in the summer of 2005, notching 17 goals in his debut season at London Road.

Following a short loan spell at Notts County, Crow was released by Posh and was snapped up by Cambridge in September 2008.

The energetic forward's strike-rate of 22 goals in 43 league starts won him many admirers and his 19 goals during 2009/10 saw him scoop the U's online Player of the Year award.

ormer Wales Under-21 midfielder who signed in November 2010 initially on-loan from York City before a permanent deal went through in January 2011.

A star of the Minstermen's campaign last season which saw them lose in the Promotion Final to Oxford United, Lawless featured prominently in all four of the meetings with the Hatters last term at the heart of midfield

He only joined York at the start of last season, impressing then boss Martin Foyle enough to prise the 25-year-old away from Forest Green Rovers where performances in a variety of positions - in defence and across midfield - had also caught the eye of Football League scouts.

It's not just the 150 games experience in the Conference that Lawless has with Forest Green and York that he has on his CV. A former Cardiff City scholar he took-up non-league football in Wales before he was snapped up to earn his first professional contract with Premier League Fulham in 2003.

Without featuring for the Cottagers t was off to South West to Torquay United for the young Lawless but after just a year and 16 appearances at Plainmoor he was on the move again, to Forest Green in 2006 and in his three seasons he helped the Gloucestershire consolidate in the Conference.

Arriving at Bootham Crescent in the summer of 2009, local media announced him merely as a "utility player" but that was far from the case, and alongside Neil Barrett he forged a formidable partnership in the centre of City's midfield, changing the Yorkshire club's relegation worries from one season to mal ing them just one game away from promotion the next.

AFC Telford United secured another point against draw-specialists Stockport County at the New Bucks Head this afternoon, although the Bucks' performance was worthy of all three points as they created most of the chances against their former Football League opponents.



oss Andy Sinton rang the changes following last week's disappointing defeat at Southport, with Carl Rodgers, Shane Killock, James Reid, Dwayne Samuels and Nathan Rooney all being introduced to the starting line-up. Perhaps the most notable omission from the side was recent signing Chris Sharp, with Andy Brown preferred as the lone striker in a 4-5-1 formation.

Telford had a fantastic opportunity to take an early lead after just 6 minutes. Phil Trainer's pass released both Andy Brown and Dwayne Samuels behind the County backline, but Samuels lifted the ball onto the roof of the net with only goalkeeper Matthew Glennon to beat. As for County, their first sight of goal came on 14 minutes when Nick Chadwick laid the ball off to Chris Blackburn and his drive from the edge of the box flew just wide.

With clear chances few and far between Trainer's shot was comfortably held by Glennon on 32 minutes and James Reid's floated cross landed on the roof of the net on 37. Brown – who was getting little protection in the face of some physical Stockport defending - was booked on 34 minutes after voicing his frustration to referee



Wigglesworth but the striker nearly set up an opener on 39 minutes. Rodgers' ball to the back-post picked out Brown and his back-heel found Reid whose left-foot drive zipped just wide.

Telford came desperately close again on 44 minutes after a good forward move. Centre-half Shane Killock found himself with the ball at his feet in the Stockport area and he showed vision more akin to an attacker by squaring for Salmon who had found space in the inside-right channel. Salmon had time to take a touch and pick his spot, but his shot – which appeared to be arrowing into the net – was superbly blocked by the diving challenge of Carl Piergianni.

The half-time break brought a significant change in the weather as

driving rain descended on the New Bucks Head from an increasingly black sky. Telford, however, started brightly and Brown tested Glennon in the first minute of the second-half before the Bucks surged into a deserved lead. Brown again was at the centre of the action with the striker being hauled down in area as he attacked a high ball. Sean Newton then stepped up to banish memories of last week's penalty miss at Southport, confidently smashing the ball past Glennon on 49 minutes.

The lead was no more than Telford deserved after forcing the best of the first-half chances. Sadly, though, the Bucks' advantage didn't last long as County pulled level almost immediately through Antonio German on 51 min-

utes. The County man – who had also tested Young with a shot just minutes earlier - was allowed too much space to advance on goal and drive a left-foot strike into the bottom-left corner of Ryan Young's net from just outside the area.

As the rain started to fall within increasing vigour Trainer's left-foot drive was beaten away by Glennon on 55 minutes and Newton's corner also struck the near-post on 67 minutes as Telford refused to let the shock of County's equaliser affect them. As for County, Sean McConville's strike was easily-gathered by Young on 80 minutes and substitute Tom Elliott's header from McConville's centre also forced Young into action on 83 minutes.

However it was Telford who continued to look stronger and, after forcing a series of comers, the Bucks nearly sneaked a deserved winner on 87 minutes as substitutes Greg Mills and Craig Farrell combined. Mills did well down the right and Farrell's header from Mills' cross looked destined for the top-right corner of Glennon's net until the goalkeeper intervened with a superb diving save to push the ball around the post for yet another corner.

"We arguably might have won the game with a bit more luck but fine lines again make a difference at this level. We've made half a mistake and been punished but that's the learning curve
















ust half a mile away from the Bucks Head lives an extraordinary young man. He was born without the last seven vertebrae in his spine leaving him in a wheelchair. He has a condition called Lumbar Sacral Spinal Agenesis Congenital Paraplegia.

Just four years ago he suffered a serious kidney infection which lead to him having a major operation.

Despite these set-backs. Telford's Mickey Bushell is a name many will associate with the world

of the Paralympics. As tickets went on sale last week for 2012, Mickey has been busy preparing for his biggest challenge yet.

Mickey hopes to better the success he had in the Paralympics in Beijing three years ago. He won a silver medal in the T53 100m wheelchair race, finishing runnerup to gold medallist Josh George from the United States.

But the British youngster went on to set a new world record in Switzerland in 2009

"I haven't had an operation this year and it's all sorted now, I want to stay fit and healthy. I'm just looking forward to the Paralympics and my goal is to win the gold medal." he told BBC Radio Shropshire.

Bushell will start as one the favourites to win the T53 100m in 2012 and fingers crossed he'll fulfil his lifetime ambition!





Unbeaten Hatters find the net

combination of Saturday's 2-0 win at Kenilworth Road over Darlington and defeats for early pace-setters Wrexham and Gateshead means that tonight's visitors Luton Town currently boast the only unbeaten record in the Blue Square Bet North. Their three wins to date have all come at home, whilst all three of their away games have ended honours even.

The Hatters have found the target in every one of their seven games to date, suggesting the Bucks' defence will need to show their mettle this evening. However, until they blanked Darlington on Saturday the Bedfordshire side had also conceded in every game, five opponents breaching their defence once each whilst Hayes and Yeading managed it twice in a 2-2 draw on 30th August.

Probably the stand-out result from Gary Brabin's men to date was their 5-1 home thumping of Southport. However it may be worth noting that the Sandgrounders were level at 1-1 until central defender Steve Akrigg was dismissed on 68 minutes, after which Luton ran riot with four unanswered goals in seven minutes.

Southport led in that game, and indeed the Hatters have found themselves behind in four games so far. Other than eventually overcoming Southport, they drew the three other games in which they trailed, and they have twice conceded a lead, most notably to a second-half injury time goal by Stockport County.

Gary Brabin has rotated his starting

XI regularly; twenty-four players have featured in total, with nineteen different players starting games and five players restricted to being a named substitute.

Brabin has selected an unchanged side only once, that being for the trip to Hayes and Yeading which followed a 3-1 home win over Braintree Town. The former Southport and Cambridge United boss has for the most part tended to make around three changes per game. As a consequence, defender Will Antwi is Luton's only ever-present player this season, featuring in the starting line-up for every game.

Close behind him with six starts each are goalkeeper Mark Tyler. defender Dean Beckwith and midfield duo Keith Keane and Alex Lawless, suggesting it is the forward line that is most frequently shuffled. Luton's top scorer is a player familiar to Bucks' fans: former Ilkeston Town frontrunner, Amari Morgan-Smith, who has four of their fifteen goals to date. None of Luton's goals are yet to come from the penalty spot, a record Bucks fans will be keen to see continue tonight.

Don't be surprised if striker Danny Crow features from kick-off tonight but fails to last ninety minutes; as Luton's most substituted player he has been withdrawn in four of his five starts.



triker Spencer Weir-Daley has been brought to AFC Telford United for one reason - to score goals. And the 26-year-old is relishing the challenge ahead after agreeing an initial deal that will keep him at the club until at least the end of September.

Weir-Daley enjoyed a goal-laden spell at Boston United and featured high in the Blue Square Bet North goal charts last season.

The move to Telford represents a step up in class but the confident hotshot has the CV that suggests he can take it in his stride.

"I've played League football and I've scored goals in the League, I've been around a bit, considering my age, and I'm anxious to get going again.


"I'm getting to that age where I know the game and I need to be kicking on.

"We were talking quite a while back but, for one reason or another, it didn't materialise," he said.

"We got back in touch after a time of not talking and now I'm here I'm delighted to get going again and I want to try and establish myself.



"I'm trying to find my feet," added Weir-Daley, speaking after the August Bank Holiday fixtures.

"I've been joining in training sessions and gradually building up my fitness.

"It's quite an exciting season for the club and I'm hoping to play a part soon.

"From the game's I've seen, the team doesn't really look out of place in this division. I know it's still early but they've competed in every game."



Weir-Daley also feels he can work with manager Andy Sinton, having been impressed with what he has seen from the Bucks chief - both in negotiations and on the training field.

The plain-spoken Telford boss has told the new recruit exactly what he expects from him when he gets his chance in the starting line-up.

"I've had slightly different roles in different teams but he sees me best as playing off the shoulder of the striker and I like that as well," said Weir-Daley.

Press Officer Steve Humbles previews next Saturday's visit of Bath City

FC Telford United face a third home game in seven days on Saturday as Bath City are the visitors in the Blue Square Bet Premier. In 1979 Bath City and the former Telford United were both founder members of the Alliance Premier League which became the Conference National Division, meaning that Bath and Telford were regular opponents at the summit of non-league football. The Romans did slip to the Southern League following relegation in 1997 but two promotions in four years culminating in a 1-0 win over Woking in the Conference South play-off final in 2010 - have seen City return to the non-league elite. A highly successful period in the club's history then continued last season as the Romans secured a top-ten placing in the Conference National - their highest league finish since 1993

City still play at Twerton Park, the club's home since 1932. The ground - which has a ground capacity of 8,880 - has hosted Football League matches having previously been shared with Bristol Rovers whilst Team Bath also used the ground during their spell in Conference South prior to their resignation from the league in 2009. In recent years there has been speculation that the club may move to the Recreation Ground and share with Bath Rugby, although this is yet to come to fruition.



Bath manager Adie Britton strengthened his squad during the summer as the Romans look to build on last year's excellent performance. Midfielder Alex Russell - who has made 566 career appearances for clubs including Rochdale, Cambridge United and Torquay United - has rejoined City on a one-year deal whilst Britton has also signed striker Jamie Cook and goalkeeper Glynn Garner. Cook was released by Blue Square Bet Premier champions Crawley Town after making 27 appearances last season. whilst Garner is best known to Bucks'

fans for his spell at Shrewsbury Town. However, Bath have lost highly-rated full-back Sido Jombati who joined Cheltenham Town for a nominal fee.

Despite high expectations at Twerton Park following last season's top-ten finish, City have had a difficult start to the new campaign and currently sit in the lower reaches of the Blue Square Bet Premier table.

Indeed Britton's men have failed to win any of their opening six matches with just two draws against Mansfield and Hayes and Yeading to show for their efforts.
