HATTERS boss Gary Brabin felt his side took the foot off the pedal during their home win over rock bottom Bath City on Saturday.

note. After the break, there remained precious little goalmouth excitement at either end.

Neither side looked like scoring until 70 minutes when Willmott's deflected cross was palmed on to a post by Garner and Crow's follow up was cleared off the line by a mixture of keeper and defender.

Victory was secured on 81 minute though when Watkins completed a fine individual week, finding the bottom corner with a left foot volley.
