



orby Town striker Leon McKenzie became the latest footballer to switch sports when he announced he was to follow his dad Clinton and uncle Duke into the ring by becoming a boxer.

Fellow former million-pound man Curtis Woodhouse did it a few years ago, of course, becoming a fighter while still playing full-time for Rushden & Diamonds in 2006.

The ex-Sheffield United midfielder recently stood down from his first

managerial post at Sheffield FC so he could concentrate on training for his next fight against the unbeaten Shayne Singleton on February 22 – he does have a national light welterweight title to defend, after all.

Whether McKenzie can keep up the family tradition for winning belts remains to be seen.

He has a lot to live up to, with Clinton having been British and European number one and Duke a three-time World champion, but hopefully he'll pack as much of a punch as he did in front of goal.

Sport switching is nothing new, but we still marvel at how a person can be so athletically talented to take up a different set of skills and rules with such success.

I was amazed earlier this year, for example, to sit with York City

manager Gary Mills and discover that as a 15-year-old, he not only scored a goal for England schoolboys at Wembley, a month later he registered a try for the national rugby team against Portugal at Twickenham.

In a tale of sporting brilliance that could run and run, if you excuse the pun, Mills also

finished sixth in the all-England schools' crosscountry in his glorious summer of 1977!

However, my favourite sport switcher – and most appropriate considering



the recent temperatures – has to be my old Ware team-mate James Hoad.

Hoady came to us in the 2007-08 Ryman One North campaign as a young goalkeeper released by Watford. He was decent – especially for champions-inwaiting Dartford when he threw one in at Princes Park as we waited for him to clear with a drop-kick after claiming a high cross!

Seriously, he was a good lad who clearly had talent. At 20, he had time on his side to get back into the League, too.

But in August 2008, Hoady attended a Pitch2Podium initiative run by UK Sport, where footballers were analysed over a series of tests and advised on other nonmainstream sports their body and skills might suit.

Hoady swapped goalkeeping gloves for ones that would keep his hands warm on his new ice surface as he joined a fast-track programme designed to turn him into a bob skeleton champion.

He came sixth in the World Junior Championships in February 2011 and was tipped to be a Winter Olympic medal contender, but retired last summer soon after becoming a dad.

I used to tell all the young Ware boys that once babies start arriving, you're on a slippery slope to the end of your career.

Having already reached speeds of up to 130 kilometres per hour in the sport more popularly known as tobogganing, that clearly that didn't apply to Hoady!





Introducing... Luton Town

he Hatters travel to Blundell Park having ... created history at the weekend; their 1-0 win over Norwich City in the FA Cup Fourth Round marking the first time a non-league side has won at a top-flight side in the competition since Altrincham defeated Birmingham City 2-1 back in 1986.

Tonight's FA Trophy Quarter Final is the Hatters' 36th game of what has been a marathon season already, with Paul Buckle's men battling on three fronts for much of the autumn and winter months.

Back in September, the 2012/13 Blue Square Bet Premier season was just moving into double figures when the Mariners hammered tonight's visitors 4-1 in a Friday night clash for live TV.

Goals from Joe Colbeck, Andy Cook, Ross Hannah and a Dean Beckwith own goal eased Rob Scott and Paul Hurst's side to victory and since that day the Hatters have largely been playing catch-up in the Conference.

But tonight's game is all about the FA Trophy and Luton's cup form this season has been exemplarily. In the Trophy, the Hatters have disposed of Dorchester after a replay. Matlock and Skelmersdale, leading in to tonight's quarter-final clash.

It is in the FA Cup that the Hatters have caught the eye though. Buckle's side started their run back in October with a 2-0 win at rivals Cambridge, a replay win over Nuneaton, before defeating Dorchester in a match that sandwiched the two sides' FA Trophy clash.

That victory booked a Third Round tie against Championship strugglers Wolverhampton Wanderers at Kenilworth Road in front of a bumper crowd of nearly 10,000. The Hatters won the tie 1-0 thanks to Alex Lawless' second half strike the result costing Wolves' boss Stale Solbakken his job.

The win earned the Hatters that Fourth Round trip to Premier League Norwich and they now face another mouth-watering clash in the Fifth Round as they tangle with old rivals Millwall.

The Hatters' league form has suffered slightly though and they have earned just one win from their last four Conference outings, which included a heavy defeat at promotion

rivals Newport County, a surprising loss at Woking and a frustrating draw with AFC Telford United.

Manager Buckle has tried to address those slips by adding to his already burgeoning squad. Versatile performer Simon Ainge completed a permanent move from Blue Square North side Guiseley, having been on loan at Kenilworth Road since September.

Another temporary signing who made a permanent move earlier this month was York City midfielder Jonathan Smith. The former Swindon man had been on loan with the Hatters during November and December and completed a move for a fee of £50,000.

Of course one of the major talking points of the January transfer window has been the Hatters' pursuit of the Mariners' successful series of loan signings, which were brought to Blundell Park during the early parts of the season by managers Rob Scott and Paul Hurst.

Scott Neilson was the first, and so far only, player to swap the East Coast for Bedfordshire when he opted to move from Crawley to Luton, having been on loan at Blundell Park since September. The winger later conducted an interview with a Bedfordshire paper questioning the Mariners' ambition to win promotion this term.

The papers insisted that manager Buckle was actively seeking the signatures of Ross Hannah and Nathan Pond but the Bradford striker completed his permanent switch to Grimsby on 10th January and the latter has worked his way back into the Fleetwood starting XI.

Then came the Marcus Marshall transfer saga; the Bury man signed for Town on a long-term loan at the start of January but was surprisingly recalled to his parent club

last Monday with media reports suggesting that this was to sell the player permanently to Luton.

When that move failed to materialise, the Mariners correctly pointed out that Bury could only recall the player to sell him permanently to another club and that he should now return to Blundell Park, which he did in time for Saturday's draw at Cambridge.

The above ingredients will surely make for another exciting cup clash as both these teams look to advance to a two-legged semi-final. which would take place next month.




