DENNIS WISE DUNNE ME UP LIKE A KIPPER

Alan dreams of Wembley.. to make up for final heartbreak

ALAN DUNNE is desperate for another crack at the FA Cup final with Millwall after revealing Dennis Wise badly let him down last time.

Irish full-back Dunne, 30, is the Lions' sole survivor from their squad who reached the 2004 final at Cardiff.

The defender is now dreaming of the showpiece again after helping Millwall into the quarter-finals at Kenilworth Road.

He still feels aggrieved that nine years ago then Millwall player-boss Wise (inset) played himself ahead of Dunne at short notice against

Manchester United. And Dunne did not even get on the pitch as he was an unused sub in the 3-0 loss at the Millennium Stadium.

Dunne rued: "I was in the starting line-up until two nights before the game.

"Wisey then came back from seeing a specialist in France on the Thursday and said he was going to play.

"I was heartbroken but he told me he was only going to last 50 minutes and then I would come on.

"So after half-time I started warming up thinking I was going on - and ended up spending the whole half running up and down the touchline.

"When he decided to

come off near the end he chose to send on Curtis Weston so he could become the youngest player to appear in an FA Cup final.

"It was tough to take. But I was only a young boy and looking back it was all part of growing up. I had a few words

with Wise afterwards but he was a friend as well as a manager and he looked after me, so there are no grudges.

"It would be lovely to get into the semi-finals or even the final, and be involved. That would make up for Cardiff."

Millwall's superiority quickly told at non-league Luton as James Henry slotted an early opener before Rob Hulse doubled their lead with a hooked volley.

Luton had chances but Dany N'Gnessan made it 3-0 off a rebound from John Marquis's shot late on.

Goalscorer Henry also has an extra incentive to ensure the Lions get back to Wembley.

He helped Millwall to successive League One Wembley play-off finals in 2008/2009 and

2009/2010 while on loan from Reading, but played in neither final.

They lost 3-2 to Scunthorpe in 2009, Henry's loan expiring 12 hours before the final.

Millwall then got promoted the following year with victory over Swindon after Henry was with them from September to December.

Henry, who joined the Lions permanently in July 2010 following promotion, explained: "We are one game away from Wembley now and that is the aim. It would be nice to go especially for me.

"I was on loan both seasons they went to Wembley. Unfortunately my loan finished 12 hours before the first one.

"We were unlucky not to win as well in 2009 against Scunthorpe. It was disappointing but the season after they bounced back."

HENRY: FOCUS ON GOING UP
