

SMART START By Dave Stringer UTON had an awful February taking just two points from the 21 on offer. But John Still answered the call to

take up the reins and worked the magic with a win from his first match in charge with a goal seconds from the break by Jake Howells.

Howells had seen an effort from the corner of the penalty area blocked just moments earlier. But when Stuart Fleetwood picked the midfielder out for a second time there was no mistake as he drilled a low shot across the face of the keeper and into the far corner.

The win sees the Hatters nine points from the play-off positions and Still said: "I know we have a hard task and the players know it too. If we show that level of performance and consistency then we will do OK.

Fleetwood's part in the winner made some amends for his earlier failure to convert a penalty. Andre Gray was a thorn in County's side for much of the first half and drew a foul

from Sean Newton for the spot-kick. But Fleetwood opted for placement rather than power and saw Richard

from Gray at the near post. But the home keeper needed his defenders to work hard in front of him as Luton had long periods of pressure around his box.

Stockport struggled to get into the game with Ion Nolan making space but scuffing his shot wide and Matty Mainwaring blazing a half-cleared corner wide.

A double substitution gave the home side some impetus in the second half. Newton did well to get in a cross from the left that Hattersley was unable to put away. Then a corner from Newton was missed by the keeper but swung harmlessly beyond the far post.

But it was Luton who continued

to dictate play. And Gray remained prominent until limping off after 75

O'Donnell twice had to be alert to keep the Luton star at bay before Gray almost turned provider. A deft flick put Howells clear but the effort was hit beyond the far post with sub

Scott Rendell's despairing lunge just failing to make contact. And there were two further chances for Luton to put the game to bed with Steve McNulty failing to head home a corner and Howells

firing over a free kick from 18 Stockport assistant manager Stuart Watkiss laid his side's prob-

lems on the line, "We failed to work their keeper," he said. "When you're on a run like we are you could see the belief drain from our players' faces when we conceded. "We have a massive seven eeks ahead of us and we have to

make sure that the worst-case scenario doesn't happen.'
