All eyes on leading marksmen Gregory and Gray

The two hottest properties outside the Football League go head-to-head tomorrow when FC Halifax Town host Luton.

Lee Gregory and Andre Gray have both bagged 26 league goals this campaign - a total only bettered by Luis Suarez in the top five divisions of English football.

Gray, who has been linked with a move to Arsenal, is going through a relative drought by his high standards with only one goal in his last five appearances.

Gregory, meanwhile, has six goals in his last five matches and has scored 60 per cent of Town's goals since the turn of the year.

Gregory has also scored in nine of his last 10 outings at the Shay, notching 16 in total in those matches, while Gray has only scored three times in his last seven away games.

Gray was on target for Luton in October when they beat

Halifax 4-3 at Kenilworth Road and is set to make his 100th appearance for the Hatters tomorrow, having scored 51 goals for them.

The 22-year-old started his career at Shrewsbury but caught Luton's attention after a prolific spell at Hinckley before joining the Hatters for a bargain fee of £30,000 in 2012.

One goal for Gregory tomorrow will see him equal James Dean's record as top scorer for the reformed Halifax Town, which was set in 2009-10.

But Gregory needs seven more league goals to equal Albert Valentine's old club record total of 33, which was set in 1934-35.

In the Shay half-time schools' competition, Salterlee beat Holywell Green to reach the final. The second semi-final is between Savile Park and St Chads tomorrow.
