For those of you who do not know about this project, Ian and Clive have dedicated many hours to hosting our Community visits, this is a scheme where we invite local groups of girls and boys along to be our guests to experience 'real football, real close'

Groups are usually no more than 15 children and recommended ages are 6 to 14 years, the children are invited to have a tour of the building, Ian then gives a skills and activities taster session and Tony Burman personally meets to have a team talk with them, then its off for a quick snack and drink before watching the game.

Further to this, the tour will take the children around the grounds and building, including the tunnel area and team area. They will then be given the opportunity to conduct a guard of honour, so this is a great privilege as the first team players enter into the main stadium.

Children are then invited to watch and cheer the players on throughout the game and are invited to sit in the 'family enclosure', they each receive a football programme. At the end of the game, the children are then taken to meet the first team players, where they eagerly await to get their cherished autograph.

This is a scheme operated by the club, this is something we feel is important to the community, visits have not only included local football clubs but also disabled children, girls football team ϑ school visit.

It was great to see that the club is willing to devote the time and resource to lay on such an impressive day and to give something back to the local community. At the end of the day Ian asked me for feedback and if I could think of anything that could be improved, but I genuinely struggled to find anything that could make it any better. I thought that was great and backed up a message that I think should be but often isn't the most important thing in football at this age group.

However, it wasn't just Ian, Steve, Great Uncle Clive and Sam that impressed me. The chats from Dave the physio and Tony the manager (a Phoenix legend as he is known at our club) were great. Everyone the parents or children spoke to was friendly and helpful. The players were patient and good humoured when signing autographs after the game. I am a long-time friend of Sarah Money who always speaks highly of the club but even taking this into account my expectations were exceeded.

What a game as well, a thriller. The team showed great character to come back from 2 down. No doubt I will be using this as an example in a team talk soon. As for the goal from Danny Harris. THESE football managers, they really don't have it easy sometimes. Dealing with players playing up, demanding chairmen always expecting more and often irate supporters having a moan. And that's before the referee turn up to ruin his day!

Their career path is certainly an acquired taste, especially as 'sacking season' now seems to be a weekly event. A job forever on the edge, with your prospects in the hands of so many others.

But the good ones are becoming somewhat of an endangered species. And the deadly predator? The growing trend of Football

League clubs taking the guick and, ultimately cheaper, option.

Now it seems "knowing the club" beats knowing your stuff and knowing how to control a dressing room and it's causing a serious bottleneck that is making life impossible for the experienced managers to get back in.

We've known for some time that Football League club seem to have a mental block when it comes to taking a chance on a Non-League manager. It's whispered around that the only way you'll get there is to take a team to the League yourself. Promotion without promotion? Forget it.

Clubs are now more keen on appointing the inexperienced caretakers, the captain who has helped out, or the player coming to the end of his career having rushed through a coaching course rather than someone who has earned an apprenticeship lower down the ladder.

And the problem with that? Once they get sacked, they need to find themselves another job. With a Football League club shining bright on their CV, what chance does the likes of Liam Daish or Gary Brabin have of getting back in

when you can drop in a big

Terry Brown was forced to look down to the Ryman Premier and lowly Margate to find a way back into management. It's becoming a growing trend.

So how did they all feel when Andy Thorn was given the Kidderminster Harriers job last week? Thorn was appointed Coventry City manager two years back with the club in turmoil after operating as their chief scout. They were relegated and he was sacked.

Kiddy see a famous football name on his wikipedia page and despite no knowledge of the Skrill Premier, he is selected over those with years of toe-totoe battling under their belt.

That's not a dig at Thorn you understand, but more the system that seems to exist in the sport.

As Joe Lolley's £250,000 move to Huddersfield Town represents, Football League clubs love to take a punt on the up-coming playing talent that the Non-League game has to offer.

So what exactly is wrong with our managers?





MATCH PREVIEW

Once again Dartford host a promotion chasing club this weekend when they take on an in form Luton Town side, unbeaten in the Conference Premier since the middle of September.

Earlier in the season the Darts were brushed aside at Kenilworth Road as the Hatters began their current run of 20 league matches without defeat. Paul Benson scored his first goal in a Luton Town shirt when his effort went in off the post. Elliot Bradbrook missed a great opportunity and within seconds Luke Guttridge scored at the other end. Alex Lawless who had just returned from injury made it 3-0 just after the hour when he took the ball round Alan Julian.

Last time out at Princes Park, Dartford completed a double over the Bedfordshire club with a 1-0 victory. The first half was guiet with Nathan Collier forcing Mark Tyler into a save and Andre Gray striking the post for the Hatters. The second half had its moments and was lit up by Ryan Hayes, who settled the match with eighteen minutes remaining with a delightful curler. Back in November 2012 the Darts came home from Kenilworth Road with a shock 2-0 win. Lee Noble's crossed free kick went straight in and Tom Bonner's close range header earned Dartford three points.

Similar to last weekend Tony Burman will be without two loan players. Luton Town players Jim Stevenson and Alex Wall cannot face their parent club just like Rory McAuley and Andy Pugh were unavailable against Cambridge United. Burman has used his connection with Hatters manager John Still, who managed the Darts between 1983-1986 when Burman was firing in goals for Dartford.

With the relegation form of the last three months it's been tough for Burman but the over the last week hope has been found. An excellent 2-1 away win at Kidderminster Harriers was followed up by an entertaining 3-3 draw with Cambridge United. The Darts boss spoke to kentonline.co.uk after the game and said: "After going 2-0 down in 15 minutes, I've got to give my guys a lot of credit, to fight back and get it back to 2-2 before half-time. We were playing against a very good side - they're not up in the top-two for nothing - but the spirit and the fight and the belief were back I'm really pleased"

After just two minutes a long ball bounced off the back of Kenny Clark into the path of Ryan Bird who scored on his Cambridge United début. Bird doubled his tally on sixteen minutes with a well taken finish putting the U's in command. Dartford's spirit shone through and when Alex Woodyard was nudged in the Cambridge United box the referee awarded a penalty, up stepped Elliot Bradbrook to halve the deficit. On the stroke of half time, Woodyard was involved again and his cross met the head of Max Cornhill who nodded in the equaliser. Princes Park erupted in the second half as a stunning Danny Harris volley went in off the cross bar and incredibly the Darts were in front. Cambridge United almost hit back moments later when Mat Mitchel-King conceded a penalty, Ashley Chambers took the spot kick and Alan Julian made the save. Another twist was still to come when Luke Berry, nine minutes after coming on, headed the U's level to tie an entertaining fixture.

Dartford's draw against Cambridge United and Luton Town's victory versus Nuneaton Town ensured the Hatters remain in Conference Premier's pole position. Andre Gray took his season's tally to 17 against the Boro as he netted a fine hat trick in a 3-0 triumph. The 22 year old slotted the ball through the legs Nuneaton Town's goalkeeper James Belshaw, flicked a header in for his second and completed his hat trick from outside of the box.

Unbeaten in last ten away matches. going back to 13 September, the Hatters have picked up five wins and five draws. They are not short of fire power either with Gray's hat trick taking the clubs tally on the league to 60, the highest scorers in the division. Luton Town manager, Still praised his strikers after the Boro match and ruled out any move away for Gray in this transfer window.

After coming close three times to a return to the Football League, reaching the playoff final on two occasions, Luton Town and Still's experience will certainly be yet another test of Dartford's recently found spirit.

Team News

Dartford will be without the impressive Alex Wall and Jim Stevenson for this weekend's match. Both players are contracted to Luton Town and are therefore illegible. Cambridge United pair Rory McAuley and Andy Pugh can now be considered for selection after Dartford's game against the U's. Ryan Hayes remains absent through injury but Kenny Clark, Lee Noble and Danny Harris all returned last weekend.

John Still gave débuts to two players in Luton Town's 3-0 win against Nuneaton Town. Cameron McGeehan was signed from Norwich City on loan and Ryan Inniss is on loan from Crystal Palace. Alex Lawless missed out with an eye infection.





AROUND The Skrill Premier

21st JANUARY

Tuesday's matches in the Skrill Premier saw three of the relegation-threatened teams earn vital points.

Dartford claimed their first league win in three months at Aggborough against play-off chasing Kidderminster Harriers, who lost for the first time under new boss Andy Thorn. The Darts got off to a great start when they went ahead inside 3 minutes when Max Cornhill headed home an Alex Woodyard cross. Twenty minutes later it was 2-0 as on-loan Andy Pugh scored after Harriers' keeper Danny Lewis could only parry another loanee, Alex Wall's, low shot. Michael Gash pulled a goal back for the hosts 4 minutes after half-time, scoring from close range, but the closest Harriers came to an equaliser was when he hit the bar midway through the half. And Dartford held on to record their first win since October 19th when they beat bottom-markers Hyde FC and Tony Burman's side are now six points adrift of the safety-mark.

However, Chester FC, now managed of course by former Kidderminster boss Steve Burr, have pulled out of the drop zone after a vital win at another side now being sucked into danger, Woking. The only goal of the game at Kingfield came on the half-hour mark through midfielder Jamie Menagh, who curled the ball past new Woking keeper Mason Springthorpe and in off the post after receiving a John Rooney pass. Springthorpe, signed on loan from Everton, did well later to deny Jamie Reed and Craig Linfield. But he watched helplessly as Jamie Reed had an effort cleared off the line. Chester held firm to record back-to-back wins for the first time this season.

And Aldershot Town were another of the sides near the wrong end of the table to earn a vital win and now sandwich Woking and Chester in the table. The Shots ensured it was a disappointing start to England `C` boss Paul Fairclough's fourth spell as Barnet manager as they came away from The Hive with a 3-1 win. The Shots took an early 3rd minute lead when Jordan Roberts' cross crept past home 'keeper Nick Jupp. Mauro Vilhete levelled for the hosts from 25 yards right on half-time. But the Bees were unable to capitalise on that and just 3 minutes after the restart Bradley Bubb fired the visitors back in front. And Mark Molesley made it 3-1 with a fine left-footed effort on 55 minutes, and although the home side huffed and puffed, they were unable to make any further in-roads into the deficit.

Those results meant that Southport's 2-1 defeat at the Merseyrail Community Stadium saw them slump into the bottom four. Southport got off to a great start when Scott Brown made it 1-0 in just the 4th minute following a poor clearance by Wrexham's Mark Carrington. But 10 minutes later the Dragons were back on level terms when Dave Artell headed in a Carrington corner. Andy Bishop came close to putting the visitors ahead in the second half when he struck the post and home keeper

Danny Hurst denied Theo Bailey-Jones. But 3 minutes from time Port crumbled and Joe Anyinsah scored what proved to be the winner from 25 yards.

Lincoln City have been pushed back towards trouble after they went down to a 3-1 defeat at the Moss Rose against Macclesfield Town. But it was the visiting Imps who broke the deadlock just a minute before half-time when Ben Tomlinson lashed the ball home from the edge of the area. The Silkmen eventually equalised on the hour-mark when Scott Boden slid the ball past keeper Paul Farman With 11 minutes left to play, Jack Mackreth fired a shot across Farman to put the home side ahead and just 2 minutes later Chris Holrovd made sure of the points when he found the top corner with a 20-vard effort.

Back at the top end of the table, Liam Hughes' second half effort earned Cambridge United a hard-fought three points - their fourth away win of the season to date - at The Lamb against Tamworth to move them to within a point of leaders Luton Town with a game in hand. Home goalkeeper Cameron Belford frustrated the visitors either side of the break, tipping a Hughes header over the bar and denying Matthew Barnes-Homer in a one-on-one. Hughes eventually beat Belford on 65 minutes with a 30yard free-kick to earn United their victory. The U's had a debutant keeper in 20-year-old Will Norris, who was called into the side late after John Sullivan was injured during the warm up.

Gateshead's play-off hopes took a blow when they had to be content with a point from their game against mid-table Welling United at the International Stadium. Joe Healy gave the visiting Wings an early 10th minute lead when he headed home a Ross Lafavette cross from close range. The on-loan JJ O'Donnell almost levelled for the Tynesiders, but his shot hit the bar. Five minutes after half-time the home side did pull back on terms when Marcus Maddison was brought down by Healy in the box and he got up to convert the resultant penalty. Gateshead had the majority of the play after that, but were unable to find a winner.

25th January

Luton Town increased their lead at the top of the Skrill Premier table to three points after they defeated out-ofform Nuneaton Town and second-placed Cambridge United were held at struggling Dartford. After a goalless first 45 minutes in difficult conditions, top scorer Andre Gray opened the scoring 5 minutes into the second period when he fired through the legs of Boro 'keeper James Belshaw, in to replace Kelle Roos, who was sold to Derby yesterday. Gray then flicked home the Hatters' second from close range on 64 minutes when he met a Scott Griffiths cross. And he added his third of the day and his seventeenth of the season 13 minutes from time





when latched on to a Steve McNulty through ball to slot home from just outside the box. Luton are now unbeaten in twenty league matches, while Nuneaton have now lost three of their last four and drop to ninth place.

Dartford came back from being 2-0 down to force a 3-3 draw at Princes Park. Ryan Bird, signed on loan on Friday, bagged a brace for the U's, taking only 2 minutes to net his first and his second came 14 minutes later. But an Elliot Bradbrook penalty on 26 minutes after Greg Taylor fouled Alex Woodyard reduced the arrears and then right on half-time Max Cornhill headed in a Woodyard cross to equalise. Danny Harris' quality effort on 69 minutes turned the game on its head to see the Darts now 3-2 up. The visitors didn't think it was to be their day as Ashley Chambers had his penalty saved by Alan Julian in the 75th minute after he had been fouled by Mat Mitchell-King, but Luke Berry 4 minutes later headed in a free-kick to earn them the U's a point.

Alfreton Town returned to action after an eighteen-day break with a 2-1 win at Park View Road against Welling United. Josh Law shot the Reds in front on 17 minutes and after the hosts had equalised through Kurtis Guthrie on 43 minutes, latest signing Shaun Harrad celebrated his debut for the club by notching the winner from the penalty spot on 57 minutes after Job Ayo Akinde had been fouled in the area by Connor McLaren.

The win strengthened Alfreton's grip on a play-off place and they are now seven points clear of the chasing pack. Lee Gregory scored his first away goals since the 2-2 stalemate at Macclesfield Town to earn FC Halifax Town an eighth point on the road this term at The Rec against Aldershot Town.

Aldershot's top scorer Brett Williams abvsmally stroked his penalty kick wide of goal on the half-hour mark after Marc Roberts was adjudged to have handled. Gregory scored the first of his brace on 33 minutes by wriggling clear and poking an effort past Glen Morris but the Shots equalised through a bundled Jordan Roberts goal in first half stoppage time. With the treacherous weather conditions hampering play, Craig Stanley's swirling freekick flew straight in to give Aldershot a 66th minute lead. However, Gregory to land his seventeenth league goal of the season by majestically chipping Morris to restore

Barnet are now level on points with FC Halifax and fifth-placed Grimsby Town after a 1-0 win against struggling Southport at The Hive. In management duo Ulrich Landvreugd and Dick Schreuder's first game in charge of the Bees, Southport keeper Danny Hurst looked to have earned a point for his side after making a number of excellent saves. Indeed, the visitors could have gone ahead late in the game themselves but home custodian Nick Jupp produced a fine double save from Osayamen Osawe. Then in the 4th minute of injury-time,

Mauro Vilhete headed in Luisma Villa's corner to finally break the deadlock and win it for the hosts.

Salisbury City's play-off hopes took a blow as they were also beaten by a single goal at Edgar Street by Hereford United. Hughes opened the scoring after 23 minutes from James Norwood's reverse pass. Norwood then made it 2-0 on 65 minutes before Hughes converted a close-range effort after good work by Alu Bangura. It brought an end to Chester's five-game unbeaten run was new manager Steve Burr's first defeat since taking over.

Guiseppe Sole was both hero and villain for Woking as the Cards shared the points at Sincil Bank against fellow strugglers Lincoln City. Sole scored his side's equaliser but missed a last-gasp penalty as the Imps held on for a draw. 





There was high drama at Princes Park when Dartford came from 2-0 down to draw 3-3 with Cambridge United in a Skrill Premier classic.

Darts conceded inside two minutes and again 14 minutes later to hand Richard Money's title chasers complete control. And with the visitors having only conceded 11 league goals all season, that looked to be that. But Dartford rallied, dragged themselves level by half-time and then took the lead courtesy of a Danny Harris wonder strike. When Alan Julian saved a Cambridge penalty at 3-2, the home fans were daring to dream of a remarkable win, only for the U's to snatch a late equaliser. But this was a performance which showed the Darts have the character required to escape relegation, even if they do remain five points from safety. There were two enforced changes to the Dartford starting line-up. Rory McAuley and Andy Pugh, both on loan from Cambridge, were ineligible for the game against their parent club, so Kenny Clark - returning from a groin injury - and Harris replaced them. Tom Champion started against his former side in the U's midfield and the visitors handed a debut to on-loan Portsmouth forward Ryan Bird. And Bird surely couldn't have dreamed of making a better start. With only 90 seconds on the clock, a high ball forward caught Clark in two minds. He thought about leaving it but the ball hit him on the back and completely wrong-footed Julian, allowing Bird to slide it into the empty net.

The huge travelling contingent rejoiced and Darts boss Tony Burman was left scratching his head. Cambridge could smell blood and they poured forward in search of a second goal. Tom Elliott powered two headers wide and the Darts defence looked shaky every time it came under pressure. And then it was 2-0. Bird's first goal had been a gift but he created the second through sheer strength and persistence. Lee Burns and Mat Mitchel-King allowed themselves to be bullied off the ball but Bird still had lots to do with the finish. No problem. He arrowed a shot with the outside of his right boot into the far top corner, giving Julian no chance. Dartford could have caved in at this point but to their credit, they fought back. Wall had already seen one free-kick clawed out of the bottom corner by U's keeper John Sullivan when he crashed a second squarely against the crossbar from all of 30 yards. Then the home side were thrown a lifeline when referee Rob Whitton interpreted Alex Woodyard's tumble in the box as the result of a foul challenge. He pointed immediately to the spot and Elliot Bradbrook slammed the penalty straight down the middle to make it 2-1. The men in

white shirts were throwing themselves into tackles and putting Cambridge under increasing pressure as the half drew to a close. And their probing paid off in the third minute of added time. Woodyard swung over a hanging cross from the right and Max Cornhill showed great desire to get to the ball first and power a header low past Sullivan. Cambridge boss Richard Money sent his players out early after half-time and the visitors started to monopolise possession at the start of the second half with some very slick play.

That said, it was Dartford who had the next chance, Wall heading Woodyard's corner over. Cambridge kept coming but Wall gave the Darts a real outlet on the break. He collected one ball wide on the right and side-stepped two defenders, although his shot cleared the stand. But then, out of nowhere, came a moment of magic. Harris connected sweetly with a bouncing ball on the angle of the 18-yard box, driving a magnificent half-volley over Sullivan's head and into the top comer via the crossbar and post. Dartford had turned the game on its head and Princes Park was in tumult. Cambridge, though, were bound to respond. And they duly did when substitute Josh Gillies burst into the box and was brought down by Cornhill.

Ashley Chambers took the penalty, arrowing it towards the bottom corner, only for Julian to guess right and claw the ball out. The home crowd roared even louder. But the game wasn't won. Gillies whipped in a dangerous free-kick with 11 minutes left and fellow sub Luke Berry applied a glancing touch which carried the ball into the net. 3-3. An already dramatic game ended against a backdrop of thunder and lightning, with rain lashing down and swirling around the stadium. Gillies almost scored a winner in stoppage-time, Julian diving to palm out his goalbound free-kick, before Mr Whitton brought proceedings to a close. The quality of the contest deserved a standing ovation from all four sides of the ground but the appalling weather conditions meant everyone simply ran for cover.



WHATS THE GROUND LIKE?

The Racecourse is a classic looking football ground with four prominent floodlight pylons and a large home terrace, which unfortunately is now closed. The stadium also has a great blend of the old and the new, with the Mold Road Stand, having a modern interesting design. To show how times have changed and the amount of all seated stadiums that there are now, the Kop Terrace at Wrexham was until recently the largest terrace in the League having a capacity of around 4,900, prior to it being closed. This stand is a throw back to when every ground had a similar kind of terrace and even the crowd barriers are painted in the club colours of red & white (rather than those dull metallic coloured barriers present in modern stands). The terrace which is located at one end of the ground, is partly covered (to the rear) and although no longer in use is still a great sight.

At the other end is the Glyndwr University Stand. This stand which was opened in 1978 is a two tiered stand, covered and all seated. It has a couple of supporting pillars, situated between the two tiers. It also has an electric scoreboard on its roof. On one side is the Yale Stand. This stand was opened in 1972 and got its name from the Yale College, which was situated behind this stand. It is a fair sized two tiered covered stand, which is now all seated, having previously had terracing at the front. The team dugouts are located in front of this stand. Opposite is the Mold Road Stand that was opened in 1999. This side of the ground has been unused for a number of years so its construction greatly improved the overall ground appearance. It is semi circular in design with a capacity of 3,500 seats and features an unusual roof design. The Stadium is shared with North Wales Crusaders Rugby League



A dramatic fall from the Championship to the Conference Premier in consecutive seasons had Luton Town in need of repair. Always keen to be an attacking force, the Hatters have registered three playoff spots in their four years at this level. Twice runners up in the finals, the Bedfordshire club continue to push for a return to League Two.

The Hatters finished in their lowest position since 1920 missing the playoffs for the first time in their current Conference Premier spell. Striker Andre Gray shined with a fine haul of goals and by the end of October, Luton Town were second in the table. Shock defeats at home to Braintree Town, Dartford and Hyde together with an inconsistent 2013 meant the Hatters slumped to outside the playoffs by the end of the season. In place of a decent league position was an incredible F.A Cup run to the fifth round. A Scott Rendell winner knocked out Premier League opposition Norwich City in round four. In a historic day at Carrow Road, Luton Town became the first non league side to defeat a top flight side since 1989.

The Summer

John Still's first summer in charge of the Hatters has brought Luton Town winger Shaun Whalley and defender Andrew Parry from Southport. Whalley won his former club's Player of the Year award scoring nine times from right wing. Jim Stevenson and Danny Fitzsimons signed from Histon FC. From the Hatters to the Hatters, via Hull City comes in Mark Cullen who spent time on loan at Stockport County last term. Still has used his non league knowledge by snapping up East Thurrock United goalkeeper Elliot Justham, the 22 year old kept 13 clean sheets last season in the Isthmian Premier League. Released from Plymouth Argyle, Anthony Charles is hoping for a third promotion to League Two after achieving this feat with Barnet and Aldershot Town. Former Northampton Town player Luke Guttridge has played over 400 Football League games and his experience in midfield will be welcome..

The Manager – John Still

Probably the most experienced manager in the division, John Still took a step down from League Two's Dagenham and Redbridge to take charge at Kenilworth Road in February. At the time of his move to the Hatters, Still held the title for the longest serving Football League manager with the Daggers. The 63 year old has tasted promotion six times with former clubs Leytonstone and Illford, Dartford, Maidstone United, Redbridge Forest and Dagenham and Redbridge. Promotion matches Still's ambition, however he is prepared to 'build a club' and in return fans will need to be patient.

Expectations

Always amongst the favourites at the start of the season because of the clubs pedigree and large support. With that comes pressure but there is no doubt the fans want promotion.




