

Welcome to John Still and everyone connected with Luton.

Obviously Luton have had an excellent season. They may already be promoted by the time you read this but regardless, they've been the best club that we have played against this year.

They have a good squad of players that have been consistent throughout the campaign. We're not going to roll over this afternoon and make it easy for them but they are worthy champions in my eyes. Obviously we lost Fraser Franks to Luton in the last transfer window.

Fraser was excellent for us over the period of time that he was here, and his attitude was first-class. When we signed him two years ago, we felt that he could develop further with us and move on, that's how I sold coming to Welling to him. Now, he has gone to a big club that is going into the Football League and is working with an experienced manager in John who will help him further.

I'm pleased to see him back here and to win a Conference South and Premier title medal in successive season is an

excellent achievement. Fraser was a young player who I think it is fair to say was at a bit of a crossroads when we signed him. He was in the AFC Wimbledon side, but then suffered from injuries and a loss of form. We felt that we had a good chance of promotion with him, and other good players in our squad last season, and so it proved. In our last home game against Hereford, I felt that we played pretty well and our passing was quite good.

For me, it was the end product in both boxes that was the stumbling box. We had five really good chances - not just half-chances - and then we made one mistake and got punished. In fact, Lee Butcher only had one other save to make in the second half.



Today we welcome all from Luton Town to Park View Road. The number of followers they are expected to bring means that Wings supporters who would normally be watching from the cricket ground side, or the road end, will need to find an alternative viewing area. Those in the stand have become used to it this season, as they have been moved for a few segregated games this season. It's the first time I can ever remember the road end being given to away supporters. Hopefully, all those inconvenienced can enjoy the game from their alternative vantage points aware of how much the financial boost from the big crowd will help the club we support. There have been games segregated under instruction from the police force that probably didn't need to be but today's is certainly not one of them. Congratulations to the Hatters on a memorable season. After five years the return to the Football League, something for which they have been

striving, looked to be

a certainty at the time of writing, despite their surprise defeat against Braintree Town last Saturday with the trophy ready to be awarded. When the prize is presented, Fraser Franks will receive his second championship medal in two years having been a Welling champion last year. It will be great to see him again and I hope he enjoys his return to Park View Road. This is the point of the season, with safety guaranteed, that we have started looking at 2014-15 and what adventures await us. We will not have trips to Luton. Tamworth or Hyde, and whilst it would be inappropriate of me to say who I hope also leaves this league, I can consider who might be joining us. Torquay United are bottom of the second division, and even though they won at Bristol Rovers last Saturday, they still have a lot to do to escape relegation. That would be an away game that would appeal to many as a potential weekender. Rovers' defeat hasn't done them any favours and they are one of seven teams

who have not reached the 50 points mark often considered to be enough for safety. Could it be a Devon double with Exeter City just two points above the relegation zone? Eastleigh need four more points from four games to guarantee the Conference South title but who will join them through the play-offs is anyone's guess. Sutton United are the form team but Dover Athletic are also enjoying a good run and will have momentum with them should they have extra games to play. Concord Rangers are the surprise team but their defeat at Havant and Waterlooville last week may give them just too much to do to make it into the playoffs.

In the North, the league title is still wide open. It would appear that AFC Telford or North Ferribly United will claim the championship but Hednesford Town and Altrincham still have an outside chance. Boston United and Guiseley look the most likely to claim the other play-off place.






The Wings welcome the Hatters to Park View Road for the thrid time today after an FA Trophy loss and an FA Cup win for the Wings. The Wings have given good accounts of themselves in the games against the Hatters.

A narrow FA Trophy defeat, after a draw at Kenilworth Road plus a tremendous FA Cup win this season at Park View Road as goals from Clarke and Healy put the Wings two up before Paul Benson got what proved to be a consolation for Town certainly put the Wings in credit.

The Wings will feel unfortunate to have lost at Kenilworth Road in the league this season when Fraser Franks was sent off harshly. The Wings had more than matched the Hatters on their own patch during that game. The Hatters have a good record in the FA Cup. They

The Hatters have a good record in the FA Cup. They have reached the semi-final of the greatest cup competition in the world on three occasions, the last being only 20 years ago. Town had perhaps their greatest day 25 years ago when they beat Arsenal 3-2 in the League Cup final at Wembley in front of a staggering 95,000 people. Two late goals again saw

LUTON TOWN



Luton's most recent successful period began in the early 1980s when the club won the Second Division and were promoted to the top flight. They remained there until they were relegated at the end of the 1991/92 campaign, just as the Premier League was formed.

Between 2007 and 2009, financial difficulties caused the club to fall from the second tier of English football to the fifth in successive seasons. The last of these relegations came during the 2008/09 season, when 30 points were docked from Luton's record for various financial irregularities. This ended the club's 89-year spell as a member of the Football League.

Since being in the Conference, Luton have unsuccessfully contested the promotion play-offs three times in four years while last season they won 1-0 at Premier League Norwich in the FA Cup fourth round. It was the first time a non-league team had beaten a side from England's top division since 1989.

The Hatters have been head and shoulders the



best team in this league this season and stand on the verge of winning the title (results may have gone their way midweek and they may be champions before we kick-off).

The Wings will be looking to spoil the party today and keep the Hatters' champagne in the chiller. With a huge away following here, there is sure to be a loud atmosphere and a big crowd to add another notable occasion to the list of games between the two clubs.

There are some past players who have featured for both clubs. Dean Standen was a prodigy in the Wings youth team and was snapped up by Luton. but then released by Joe Kinnear when not making the grade. At that same time in 2001-02, Keith Rowland made 12 appearances on loan for Luton and he would go on to play for the Wings in the twilight of his career. John Still will be aware of the task his side face today. at Park View Road having crossed swords with the Wings back in their last spell in the Conference and seeing his tropps put in a below-par performance this season here in the FA Cup. Today could be a historic day for Luton or a day to remember for Welling in front of their largest league crowd for many years.

Just one away match remains after a thoroughly entertaining eight months of travel, fantastic football and many new real ales and interesting public houses.

On Monday we head to Salisbury City in Wiltshire after which the 2014 Good Beer Guide can go back onto the shelf until preseason friendlies start in July. As Monday is Easter Monday it may be wise to check on opening times. Unlike many places Welling have visited this year. Salisbury is a city that many supporters will know well but there are seven pubs in the guide that may be worth a return.

Deacons (SP2 7QT) is conveniently located close to the station selling Hop Back GB, Summer Lightning and Sharp's Doom Bar.

Also very close to the station is the Duke of York (SP2 7AS) This pub has an ever changing range of five real ales and two ciders. It only reopened in 2011 following a long period of closure but has become popular with locals and visitors alike.

Salisbury railway station is also very convenient for the Village Freehouse (SP2 7EF) selling Downton Quadhop and four ever changing guest beers including at least one dark ale. The pub sells fresh rolls but has no objection to bringing in your own food.

Rai d'Or (SP1 2AS) is another true free-house with a beer range that changes regularly. CAMRA members can enjoy discounted beer on production of a membership card.

The Winchester Gate (SP1 1JA) was awarded local CAMRA pub of the year in 2013 and sells Hop Back Crop Circle and three guest ales.

Nearby is the Wyndham Arms (SP1 3AS) which was the birthplace of Hop Back Brewery, a leader in the introduction of blonde beers in breweries portfolios. Although the brewery has now moved out to larger premises, they have retained ownership of the pub and their full range of ales is available over the bar,

JD Wetherspoon owns the final pub listed in the guide. The King's Head (SP1 2ND) is part of their Lloyds No.1 mini chain and sells four ever changing guest beers, many from local breweries.

Other pubs that may be worth a look are New Inn, Cosy Club, Wig & Quill, White Hart Hotel and Cloisters. None of these feature in the Good Beer Guide, but all were included



the local CAMRA branch in March so may be under consideration for inclusion in the next edition. When the Hop Back brewery moved out of Salisbury to nearby Downton, there was nothing like the number of breweries that now exist and there are now two other breweries in the area. Also in Downton is the Downton brewery whilst there is also now a Salisbury brewery, although production actually takes place in nearby Dinton. Red Shoot brewery in Linwood, Hampshire is also close and pubs selling local ales may well source beers from Keystone in Berwick St Leonard, Plain in Sutton Veny and Wessex in Longbridge Deverill.
