

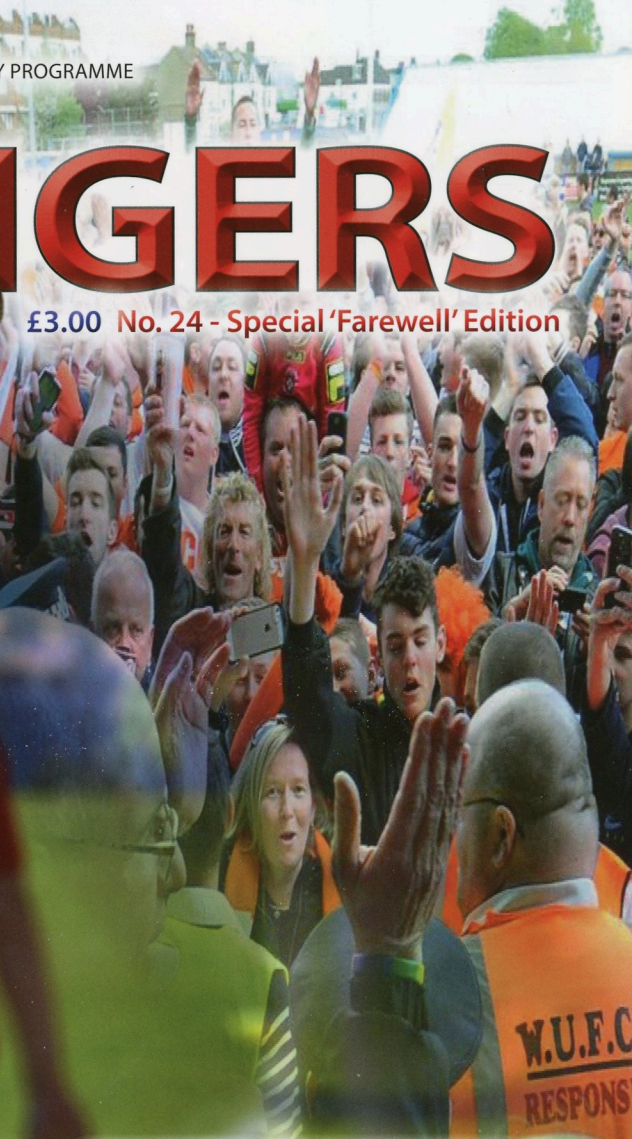

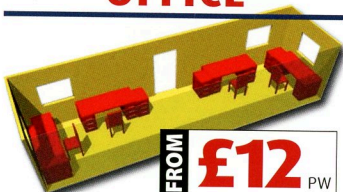

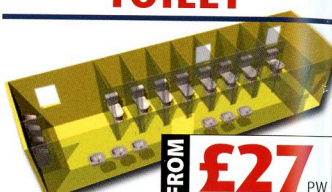

# FROM THE SECRETARY

Good afternoon everyone and a warm welcome to Ewen Fields for today's final match of the season, and both teams last in the Skrill Premier

It is our pleasure to welcome the Directors, Players and numerous Supporters of Luton Town to Hyde, and we hope that everyone connected with the Hatters enjoy their brief stay with us. We also offer a cordial welcome to the match referee and his assistants.

Today we welcome the newly crowned Skrill Premier champions, Luton Town, to Ewen Fields for their final match in non-league football. Without a doubt, it is a mighty relief to everyone at Kenilworth Road that they have finally made it out of the Conference, as no doubt many today will still be irritated at the 30 point deduction dished out to them as a punishment for two offences in 2008. At the time, it was regarded as harsh, as it was ultimately a punishment dished out for mistakes made by the previous regime. Luton finished bottom of League 2 that year, even though their actual position would have been a safe 15th. To this day, their 5 year 'exile' in the Conference has been seen as unjust, and you can tell the current regime quite simply just wanted to get back to where they were in League 2 and build from there. Luton are one of the biggest sides to play at this level, and were the team many Hyde fans spoke of when talking about sides we were looking forward to facing when we won Conference North two seasons ago.



This has been a tough time for everyone involved with Luton Town, and I am not surprised Gary Sweet recently described it as the end of an unjustified jail sentence. The people now in place at Luton are real servants to the club, and have been brilliant with Hyde, even after the quite incredible victory on that Tuesday night last March where we were applauded off the pitch by the Luton faithful after putting in one of the best performances I have ever seen from a Hyde side. John Still rightly deserves the plaudits for building a third side to be promoted to the Football League, following previous success at Maidstone United and Dagenham & Redbridge. John was kind enough to lend us JJ O'Donnell earlier in the season, who made quite an impact on the Tigers faithful, especially after scoring a quite audacious goal from 40 yards out just 3 minutes into his debut against North Ferriby United. Overturning a large point deficit from nearest challengers Cambridge United was no mean feat earlier in the season, especially

to go on and win it so comprehensively with a few games to spare.

Luton have been one of the best sides we have faced this season, and rightly deserve to go up, especially for their second half performance against Hyde down at Kenilworth Road earlier this season. At the time, I thought we did well to go in level, though definitely not undeserved. However, in the second half they went up a gear, and rightly ran out 4-1 winners. At that game, I was fortunate enough to chat at length to Chairman Nick Owen, and you could see how evident his passion was to get back into the league as soon as possible.

Personally, I'm pleased to see him and his team finally manage it this season, and for a club the size of Luton Town, the only way is up, especially for a side competing in the Championship as recently as the 06/07 season. Gary Sweet talks of reaching the Premier League, which would certainly be an incredible feat to return to the heights of 91/92, but I will be watching with interest to see if they manage it. Good luck Luton, we hope you enjoy what promises to be a great party at Ewen Fields today, and all the best for next season and the future.

Back to Hyde, and there is a free coach to Gigg Lane on Monday, so book on with Phil Chadwick today or give him a ring. You can buy your tickets today in the club shop for the final against Trafford, priced £10 adults, £5 concessions and £1 for accompanied kids under 16. Monday is our day, so get down and give your always wonderful support to the lads as we try to finish off the season with some silverware and attempt to win our seventh Manchester Premier Cup, and our first since 2006. Also, there is a beer festival at Ewen fields on 16th and 17th May, so come and support what promises to be a great event, and hopefully the first of many.

Thank you all for your fantastic support this afternoon, and to all the volunteers for helping out to make today a success. Have a wonderful summer, enjoy the match and see you for pre-season in July.

# SKRILL PREMIER ROUNDUP

Richard Scott looks around the League one last time

Hyde's chances of winning a home game this season looks slim as they lost 3-1 to Kidderminster Harriers who kept up their chances of a play-off place finish alive. The Harriers took the lead through Amari'i Bell on six minutes, before Adam Blakeman equalised for the Tigers. But second half goals from Amari Morgan-Smith and an Adam Thurston own goal gave Harriers the win.

Kiddy's local rivals Hereford United were plunged into deeper trouble with a 1-0 defeat at already relegated Tamworth. Lloyd Kerry scored with an hour gone to give Dale Belford's side all three points.

Dartford missed out on the chance to climb above Hereford as they went down by the same score line, a 1-0 loss at Braintree. Kenny Davies' 24th minute goal was enough for Braintree who are chasing a place in the play offs.

Halifax all but confirmed their place in the top five with a 2-1 win at home to Macclesfield. Goals from Marc Roberts and Chris Smith put the host 2-0 up, before Scott Boden scored for the Macc on half-time.

An interesting day at the Impact arena saw play-off chasing Alfreton and Grimsby meet in a game which was delayed for nearly an hour after the Grimsby players arrived late. But it didn't stop Mariners striker Ross Hannah netting a hat-trick. Josh Law, John Akinde and Paul Clayton scored for the hosts.

Fifth place (at the time of writing,) Gateshead had to settle for a 2-2 draw at home to Southport whose place in next season's Skrill Premier was all but confirmed. The Sandgrounders took the lead on two

minutes through Luke George, before Jamie Chandler leveled it up. Jason Walker restored Southport's lead but Chandler netted again to make it 2-2.

Cambridge look set to take second place despite a second loss in a week as they lost 1-0 to Lincoln City. A 32nd minute penalty from Ben Tomlinson gave the Imps all three points.

Luton started life as Skrill Premier champions with a 2-1 win at Welling. Goals from Mark Cullen and Andre Gray put the visitors 2-0 up, before Welling's Ross Lafayette pulled one back for the hosts.

Aldershot are now three points clear of the bottom four after a 3-2 win over Salisbury on Good Friday. The Shots scored through Brett Williams (2) and Joe Oastler while Ryan Brett and Charlie Sheringham scored for the visitors.

Forest Green and Woking played out a 2-2 draw at The New Lawn stadium. FGR scored through Jamie Norwood and Lee Hughes. Meanwhile the Cards netted through Brett Johnson and John Goddard. Both teams were reduced to 10 men with Al Bangura shown two yellows, while Mark Ricketts was sent off for Woking.

Nuneaton's play-off chances appear to have gone after they lost 1-0 at home to Barnet in new manager Brian Reid's first match at the helm. Valentin Gjokaj scored just before the hour mark to give the Bees all three points.

Both Kevin Wilkin and Steve Burr got their first taste of a cross boarder derby as Chester and Wrexham played each other. But neither side were able to break the deadlock in a tense game which ended in a goalless draw.

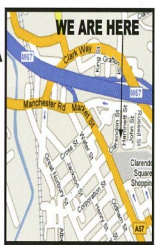

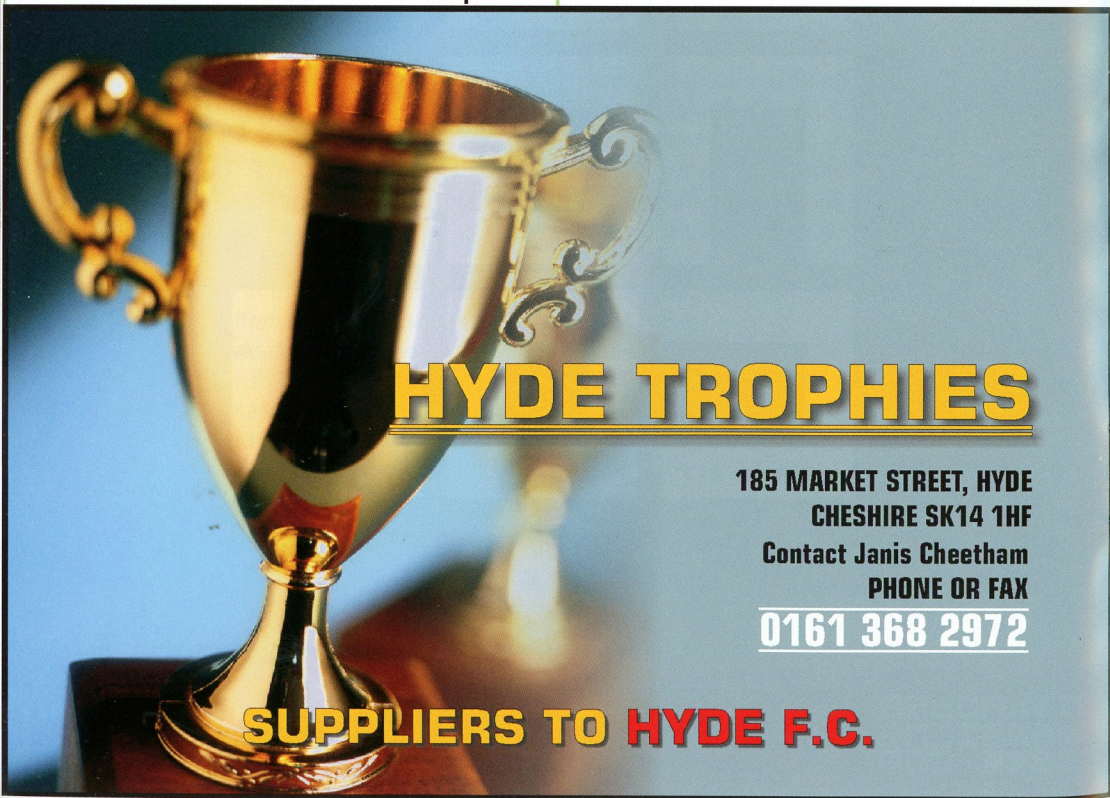

# PAV'SPATCH

## Two seasons of a task too big

Twenty years ago my phone rang. I was greeted by familiar tones: "Pav, it's Wraggy. I want you to come to Bower Fold. I need to have a word with you."

It was a sunny, summer afternoon and I didn't need much reason to leave the office. I enjoyed my walk through Cheetham's Park and quite quickly found myself in the manager's office in the main stand at Stalybridge Celtic.

What could Peter Wragg want? I found out straight away as he told me: "Pav, I know we pulled off a great escape by winning nine of the last 12 games but because of that there are people here who think we're going to win the Conference title next season. You've got to put something in your paper to tell them that's not going to happen."



The reason I recount this little story is because I believe it has parallels with our situation here at Hyde. I don't think anyone ever expected us to challenge for the Skrill Premier championship but I do think a similar lack of realism has been on show because there were times last year when we punched well above our weight.

We got carried away when the fact is we were always going to struggle. Fair enough, I never believed we'd have a season as horrible as the one we're finishing today but I did expect us to be relegation candidates. Life in Conference National is extremely difficult for a club like ours - off the field as much as on it.

Our guests today, Luton, regularly attract crowds of around 8,000. We struggle to get 800. The fact is, unpleasant as it may be, the people of Hyde aren't bothered about their team. Tameside isn't. Add up the attendances of all six clubs in the borough and they still wouldn't amount to much. Two years ago, when we were winning Skrill North, the crowds were hardly anything to shout about. Hyde can't be a force in Conference National when only 350 people from a borough of around 250,000 can be bothered to pay to watch.

I have two sons and both were brought up to watch non-league football in general and Hyde in particular

but neither comes anymore. One watches Sky and the other plays Fifa 14. I asked the younger one if any of his schoolfriends fancied coming to a game and he laughed at my naivety. "They watch United or City on telly dad." Give schools as many free tickets as you like but the kids won't come.

Even the local press isn't interested. Six senior non-league clubs in Tameside and The Advertiser has reduced its sports coverage from seven pages to three. Hyde hasn't featured at all over the last week or two. It's nothing new. In the late 1980s, when I was sports editor at the North Cheshire Herald, I faced a continual battle with editors. So did my predecessor Martyn Torr.

So let's look back on our two years in the Conference as something to be proud of. We lasted two years and we racked up some great results. We tried but ultimately we came up short. We'll bounce back. We always do. Just bear in mind that we're a non-league football club - not a Football League club.

Finally, as I bid you goodbye until August, I want to sincerely thank all those of you who have supported me in my ups and downs of the last few weeks. I really do appreciate it.

This isn't the place to rake over old coals but I've been badly let down and in some cases by people who had professed to be my friends. I can honestly say I did my very best in terms of reporting local football and I don't think anyone would disagree that my efforts were much better than what has followed.

Anyway, I'm still around. I've been reporting on the Tameside non-league football scene for almost 40 years and I'm not going to stop now. You can still read or listen to my stories at [pavspatch.tumblr.com](http://pavspatch.tumblr.com) Follow me on Twitter @CharlieBunyan

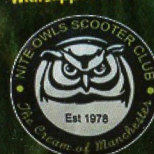

# BRING ME SUNSHINE

George Corrin asks, "What do you think of it so far?"

A very warm welcome today to the Skril Premier Champions Luton Town who after five years in non-league have finally won promotion to the Football League. As many people know, Luton have fought their back out of the financial hell that is administration and have assembled a team well worth its weight against any Football League opposition. Here is wishing the Hatters a successful return and that both teams today put on a show for this packed out Ewen Fields crowd.

The Hatters were originally formed on the 11 April 1885 following the merging of two local teams, Excelsior and Luton Wanderers. In 1891 the club became the first team in the south of England to become a fully professional outfit.

Luton soon became founding members of the Southern Football League in 1894-95 and quickly began to dominate the championship as the Bedfordshire outfit amassed two runners up finishes in the opening two seasons.

A move to the United league followed before the Hatters made the giant leap into the Football League for the 1897-98 season. However, Luton had not prepared for the high costs and numerous long trips to the mostly northern Football League opposition and eventually the club returned to the Southern League in 1900-01 due to their spiralling debts.

In 1905, Luton finally adopted their current home and one of the most iconic grounds in England, Kenilworth Road. The Hatters soon became stuck in a period of footballing wilderness for the next few decades as despite having some of the most highly rated talents of that era such as England Internationals Bob Hawkes and Ernie Sims, the club remained in the in the Third Division south for much of that time. Finally in 1937 Luton secured promotion to the Second Division thanks to the help of their talismanic striker Joe Payne who scored 55 goals that season.

Under Dally Duncan, the 1950's proved to be a prosperous time for Luton and in 1956, the club won promotion to the First Division. Duncan's new side featured the likes of Syd Owen, Roy Baynham, George Cummins and Gordon Turner and this exemplary line up helped Luton finish as runners-up to Nottingham Forest in the 1959 FA Cup final. Inexpensively, England International Owen was also named as the FWA Footballer of the Year for that season.

However, as the saying goes 'what goes up must go down' and sure enough a state of a rapid decline was to befall Luton as the next campaign saw the club relegated into the Second Division. Astonishingly by 1964, the Bedfordshire side had dropped all the way down to the Fourth tier of English football.

Luton eventually put an end to their free falling form and players such as John Moore and Bruce Rioch helped the club lift the 1967-68 Fourth Division championship. Manager Allan Brown and new Director Eric Morecombe oversaw a new wave of success and thanks to goals from Malcom Macdonald, the Hatters were back in the First Division by the 1973-74 season. Unfortunately the club suffered relegation back to the Second Division in just their first season back.

Luton later appointed former player David Pleat as first team manager in 1978 and under their new coach the club reached the First Division once again in 1982. During this period, the Hatters were seen as

footballing innovators as they were renowned for having a high number black players in their side, despite many other teams being entirely white at the time.

The club narrowly staved off relegation on the final day of the 1982-83 season after Yugoslavian defender Raddy Antic scored a late winner at Manchester City to save Luton at City's expense. In 1986-87 the Hatters under John Moore, sealed their highest ever league finish in eighth.

The very next season Luton would achieve arguably their greatest feat as under the leadership of new manager Ray Hartford, the club lifted the Football League Cup after winning a thrilling 3-2 final against Arsenal. The game itself became famous for the Hatters late comeback as with just ten minutes remaining, Arsenal were 2-1 ahead and subsequently awarded a late penalty. Amazingly stand in goalkeeper Andy Dibble made an iconic penalty save and Luton quickly sprang back into life. Danny Wilson grabbed the equaliser before Brian Stein snatched a winner with the last kick of the game.

Luton would once again reach the League Cup Final in 1989 but the Hatters could not repeat their earlier heroics and lost 3-1 to Nottingham Forest.

The Hatters moments in the spotlight would soon become a distant memory as the club suffered another relegation in 1992. Luton eventually dropped into the fourth tier of English football in time for the 2001-02 season. The arrival of Joe Kinnear helped kick start a classic Luton revival as the club won promotion at the first attempt.

Then owner John Gurney, sensationally sacked Kinnear at the end of the season and replaced him with former Luton and Blackburn Rovers striker Mike Newell. This new change proved successful as Newell and the Hatters won promotion to the Championship after winning the 2004-05 League One title.

The club later hired Kevin Blackwell and later Mike Hartford as first team managers as the Bedfordshire side began to drop down the Football League. The club soon suffered back to back relegations and by the 2007-08 campaign the Hatters had entered administration.

Things only got worse for Luton as the full extent of their financial woes became common knowledge and the club were sensationally hit with a 30 point deduction during the 2008-09 League Two season. The FA's punishment proved to be too much for Luton and the club were inevitably relegated into the Conference National. Although on a positive note that season, the Hatters did win the Football League Trophy for the first time in its history after beating Scunthorpe United 3-2 in extra time.

The 2009-10 season was the start of the Hatters first ever spell at the top tier of non-league football and the harsh reality quickly became apparent to many Luton fans as the club suffered three play-off defeats in four seasons.

After five long years in the wilderness, Luton under the management of John Still, finally won promotion back to the Football League as they finish this season as Conference National champions. No doubt about it, this current team is one of the finest ever to appear at this level and this new confident Luton side will certainly make a big impression in their long awaited return to the Football League.

## Fun Facts about Luton

**In 1936 Joe Payne scored 10 goals against Bristol Rovers, a Football League record that still remains to this day!**

**Luton's 1-0 win over Norwich City in the 2012-13 FA Cup fourth round helped them become the first non-league side to beat top tier opposition in the competition since 1989.**

**Famous people from Luton include musician Paul Young and England cricketer Monty Panesar.**

Tyler originally rose to prominence during his 15 year stay at Peterborough United which saw him feature 485 times for the Posh.

**Elliot Justham**



The 6ft 3in stopper moved to Kenilworth Road in May after impressing at East Thurrock.

**Fraser Franks**



The 23-year-old has proved to be a fantastic January purchase from manager John Still. Despite his young age, Franks arrived at Kenilworth Road with an abundance of footballing pedigree as the defender has previously won promotion to the Football League with AFC Wimbledon and also lifted the Conference South title with Welling United in 2012-13. Impressively Franks was also included in the Conference South 'Team of the Year' during Welling's title success.

**Danny Fitzsimons**



The Irish 21-year-old has certainly won over many fans with his versatile style of play as the defender can play at both left-back and in the centre of defence.

**Steve McNulty**



The 30-year-old Liverpoolian has taken the proud honour of winning both Luton Town's 'Player of the Year' and 'Goal of the Season' awards this season. Like most of his Hatters teammates, McNulty arrived at Kenilworth Road with several promotions already to his name including two Conference North promotions with both Barrow and Fleetwood Town, and a Conference National title with the Cod Army in 2011-12. Charles won several accolades throughout his 15 year career such as two Conference National titles with both Barnet and Aldershot Town. During the defender's two spells at the Shots, Charles picked up several individual awards for his excellent performances, most notably in 2007-08 season where he featured in the Conference National's 'Team of the Year'. The following year, the former Hyde player also scooped the players and supporters 'Player of the Year' awards for Aldershot.

**Scott Griffiths**



The vastly experienced full-back has been an assured acquisition for the Hatters since his purchase from Peterborough United in March 2013. Griffiths gained a lot of attention at Dagenham & Redbridge after playing over 200 times in six years, winning the 2006-07 Conference National title. After moving to Peterborough in 2010, the 28-year-old began a series of loan spells most notably at Chesterfield where he featured 29 times during their 2010-11 Football League Two title winning season. The Westminster born defender has appeared for the England 'C' team twice between 2006 and 2007.

**Andy Parry**



The versatile 21-year-old can play in both the centre of defence and midfield. Parry originally started his career as a member of the Blackburn Rovers youth academy.

The versatile 29-year-old signed for Luton from York City in 2011 and since then, Lawless has gone on to make over 120 appearances for the Hatters. The striker moved to Kenilworth Road in the summer of 2012 after enjoying a successful two year spell at Gateshead where he scored 45 goals in 80 games. Shaw has appeared for Sheffield Wednesday, Burton Albion, Halifax Town and Rochdale during his 11 year career. The 30-year-old has also won six England 'C' teams caps between 2006 and 2008.



## Alex Wall

Wall was snapped up by John Still last summer after excelling during his previous loan spell at the Hatters from Maidstone United.



## Mark Cullen

The 21-year-old former Hull City striker signed for the Hatters in the summer. Cullen has made a solid start to life at Kenilworth Road as he has notched seven goals in 27 games including a last minute equaliser against second placed Cambridge United.



## Paul Benson

Like a fine wine Benson, has only gotten better with age as the 34-year-old has fired in a crucial 18 goals this campaign during his year-long loan spell from Swindon Town. Benson has also played for the likes of Dagenham & Redbridge, Charlton Athletic and Portsmouth during his highly successful career. The striker has most notably won promotions with both Dagenham and Swindon.



## Andre Gray

This year's break out player, Gray has simply been outstanding for the Hatters and has deserved all the plaudits thrown his way. Hyde fans may remember his hat-trick at Kenilworth Road early this season and no doubt Scott McNiven will make sure his defence won't let the striker out of their sights. ## Au Revoir Conference!

Football's fixture list tends to throw up various quirks during a season, and this is certainly the case today as the team with officially the worst record in Conference Premier history take on the newly-crowned champions in the final game of the 2013-14 season.

For Tigers fans, as we bid farewell to non-league's top division there is certainly a sense that our brief two-year stay in Conference Premier has come full circle with today's visit of the Hatters.

Although our first fixture against Luton last season on 17th August 2012 wasn't our first game at Conference Premier level – it was actually our third after an opening day trip to Braintree followed by a home game against Barrow – it certainly felt like the first time we'd stepped up a level. This is meant as no disrespect to Braintree or Barrow, but a trip to Braintree's Amlin Stadium is never a fixture that's going to set the pulses of a newly-promoted team racing and we'd locked horns with the Cumbrians many times before at Conference North level. However, the visit of Luton on that memorable Friday evening really felt like we'd arrived with the big boys.

In front of the TV cameras and a big crowd – by Hyde's standards, not Luton's – we not only held our own but took a 2nd half lead against our illustrious visitors with a Matty Blinkhorn screamer before Town responded in clinical fashion with two goals in 10 minutes to take the three points. Despite the defeat, that game gave us the confidence to believe

that we could compete against, and beat, the giants of non-league football, and those dreams became reality last April as we survived to play a second term at this rarefied level.

Fast forward 12 months, and the heady days of last season seem like a lifetime ago. Coming into Conference Premier having gained promotion so unexpectedly, the general consensus amongst Tigers fans at the time was that we'd enjoy the ride whether we won, drew or lost. Whilst we were hoping to beat the odds and survive, most of the Ewen Fields faithful were expecting relegation at the first time of asking and were just hoping we weren't embarrassed along the way.



For a club the size of Hyde to defy the odds and stay up last season was an incredible achievement, one that probably wasn't fully appreciated at the time and possibly still isn't to this day. What that fantastic season created, however, was a raising of supporter expectations for this term, although there can be little argument that we've spectacularly failed to come close to even the most realistic of expectations this campaign.

The inquest into why this season has gone so badly wrong started long ago, and despite the claims from fans after our promotion that we'd enjoy our time in the Conference Premier whatever happened, the reality has been that this season has been far from enjoyable for Hyde fans.

Even allowing for the fact that we're playing at the highest level in our history, it's difficult to take any positives out of this season. Most Hyde fans would be able to accept relegation – a lot of us realistically expected it anyway – but it isn't so much the fact that we've been relegated but rather the manner of our fall that has been so disappointing. If we'd have battled for every point but came up just short in the end, most Hyde fans would have been more than happy with this. However, the lack of any discernible fight during this campaign has been hugely disappointing and starting with our 8-0 reverse at Forest Green on the opening day this season has never truly got going.

So, was our brief adventure into Conference Premier worth it? The answer is a resounding yes. And would we want to do it all again? Of course we would.

Despite this season's performance, just the fact that we even made it into football's 5th division is a tremendous achievement and to stay in it for two seasons is arguably even more impressive. If someone had said to a Hyde fan when the club was nearly liquidated in 2009 that within a few years we'd be playing against and beating the likes of Luton Town, Stockport County, Wrexham and Grimsby Town, you'd have taken them to the nearest lunatic asylum. But that's what we've done, and every Hyde fan will treasure the memories of our time in this league.

Ewen Fields could have been a depressing place to be this afternoon had the fixture list not paired us with Luton, who quite rightly arrive in celebratory mood having won the league at a canter to earn promotion back into the Football League. Not for

the first time over the past two seasons, Tigers fans will be heavily outnumbered today as thousands of Hatters supporters converge on Ewen Fields to say goodbye to non-league football.

Unlike Hyde fans who are leaving Conference Premier with a heavy heart, Luton's travelling army will be delighted that this is their last trip to a non-league ground and fully deserve their celebrations today. Playing football in the right way, the Hatters have swept all before them this season and could end the campaign with a tally of over 100 points and goals to underline their dominance.

For Hyde fans, the fact we're playing Luton in league competition is still difficult to comprehend.

Unquestionably the biggest club to compete at this level of non-league football, it's easy to forget that Luton were in the First Division up to 1992, beat Arsenal to win the League Cup in 1988 and were champions of League 1 as recently as 2005.

Any Luton supporters who have been following our travails this term will no doubt consider them to be trivial in comparison to the fall from grace they have experienced over the past decade. However, these on and off-field problems can now be consigned to the history books as the Hatters reclaim their rightful place in the Football League after a 5-year absence. Hopefully the glory days are about to return for Luton in the full-time game, whilst Hyde try and battle back for another taste of Conference Premier football in the near future.

Halifax were promoted last season and nobody gave them much chance of making it past 18th in the league table but they are currently the league's form team.

Andy Thorn's tenure at Kidderminster Harriers. What former Harriers chairman Mark Serrell was thinking when he sacked Steve Burr, I do not know. A man who guided them from bottom of the table to the runners-up last season and earned an FA Cup replay against Peterborough
