



Dressing Room Dialogue

Matt Hill

Matt Hill is thankful that, after an enforced absence following an Achilles injury, he is now at the end of a long road to recovery...

The 34 year-old former Wolves and Sheffield United defender arrived at Prenton Park at the start of the season and made eight appearances for the Club.

But 10 minutes into his eighth game in a Rovers shirt, at home against Newport County, he had to be replaced after injuring his Achilles tendon.

Hill has recently returned to full training after six months on the side lines and he reveals that it has been a tough period for him because he's not had such a bad injury in his career before

He said: "It's been a long road. Obviously tearing your Achilles is a very unfortunate thing, it was something which just came out of the blue and was very disappointing. It's been difficult but I've been fully focussed on trying to get back.

"It's the most serious injury I've had in my career in terms of the length of time and I've never had to have surgery before so it was all new to me.

"It's been tough going on my partner too having to put up with me full-time at home! It's one of those things but I've been focused on trying to get back and finish the season well.

"In the early stages of the rehabilitation, I was at home because I couldn't drive so I was doing a lot of physio and ball work back in Preston so I hadn't really been around the club.

"As soon as you're back in, you desperately



want to be out there on the pitch and get amongst it with the lads, so I'm glad I'm fully into it and hopefully things will go well.

"There's not too many reserve games left so it might be a case of being thrown in the deep end possibly, but it's something I'm willing to do but we'll see what the gaffer decides to do.

"I've been working hard on my fitness. In terms of games to build up match fitness, it's going to be tough, but hopefully I can play some part in the run-in."

From his experience of over 500 appearances as a professional, Hill knows what the squad needs to do and the important role that the supporters can play in the remaining games of the season.


He added: "We've got six games left, we've got to take one game at a time. We have to forget what's gone in the past and focus on what we need to do now.

"We all have to be united, fans alike. We all have to stick together. During the 90 minutes, everybody needs to be together and everybody needs to be fighting to get ourselves out of this position.

"When you say about the 12th man, it's true, it's so important. When you've got that momentum and the fans are behind you, it gives the lads a boost to keep pushing on. "We all want to perform and send the fans home happy and we can do that if we work

From The

Press Perspective



"When Billy Bingham scored Dagenham's third goal here early last month I couldn't help but reflect on how an outstanding footballer of the same name would have been very proud of such a strike. William Laurence 'Billy' Bingham, MBE has local links with Everton and Southport and the former Northern Ireland manager also has an association with today's visitors, Luton Town."

"When you describe a footballing man as 'old school' for some reason these days it seems to attract a negative connotation. As 'old school' myself it's more a case of being disappointed at how some of the best values in football have been lost to the modern game. Bingham began his career with Glentoran in 1948 before moving to England and spending eight years at Sunderland, From there he moved to Luton making nearly 100 league appearances during a three year spell. Following their relegation from the Football League in 2009 a list of the 50 best Luton Town players of all time was compiled by the 'Times' iournalist Denis O'Donoghue and 'Billy' was quite rightly amongst them. It was from Luton that his association with Everton began – again making close to 100 appearances scoring 23 goals - before finishing his career at Port Vale after breaking his leg at the age of 33. A fine career in which he won 56 caps for Northern Ireland also saw him play at the 1958 World Cup and for once a notable playing career would also become an excellent managerial one!

Starting from modest beginnings at Southport in 1965 he became manager of his birth country just 2 years later - this after leading the 'Sandgrounders' to promotion out of the Fourth Division, A spell at Plymouth while also in charge of Northern Ireland followed and in his only



season in charge of Linfield led them to a quadruple success. Manager of Greece is also on his CV as is a 4 year spell in charge at Goodison Park. He was always in demand and in 1980 he was re-appointed as Northern Ireland boss a position he would hold for 13 years. He led his country to the finals of the World Cup in 1982 and 1986 making him one of a select group to have both played and managed at the FIFA tournament. A glittering career then for a man who grew up alongside another Irish legend Jackie Blanchflower on the streets of Belfast. His first professional wage was f6 a week when he made his senior debut in 1949 and left for Sunderland for a fee of £8,000. Like many of his age he continued

as an apprentice while playing, working on the Sunderland shipvards - how times have changed. Coincidentally Luton also paid £8,000 for his services - money well spent because he scored the winning goal in their 1959 FA Cup Semi-Final with Norwich, They lost 2-1 to Notts Forest in the Wembley final but it was his corner that set up Dave Pacey for the consolation. While at Kenilworth Road Bingham scored a 35 yard volley against Liverpool at Anfield - I wonder if that's what persuaded Everton's Johnny Carey to pay £15,000 for him in October 1960. The Blues won the league title in 1962-63 but after the arrival of Alex Scot Bingham fell down the pecking order and moved on. He returned to Goodison in May 1973 to take over from Harry Catterick signing such players as Bob Latchford and Martin Dobson and despite looking certain title winners in 1975 fell short in the final weeks to finish 4th - 3 points behind champions Derby County. He was sacked in January 1977 after a run of 8 games without a win. Gordon Lee took over and they finished 9th.

Billy Bingham was made an MBE in 1981 for services to football and in 1984 received the PFA Annual Merit Award - putting him on the same managerial pedestal as Shankly, Paisley, Clough and Sir Alex Ferguson. Thanks to Billy Bingham for reminding me of Billy Bingham and taking me on a trip down memory lane. "





There were a number of players missing from the Rovers line-up and The Saddlers took the lead early into the proceedings when striker Tevin Shakespeare found the net.


Tranmere responded well to that early setback and brought the game level on the stroke of half time with Darren Askew getting himself on the scoresheet.

Roots Hall is located on Victoria Avenue in Southend-on-Sea (post code SS2 6NO for Sat Navs) and can be reached via Junction 29 of the M25 and the A127. On the A127 continue towards the town centre, going ahead through the traffic lights neat The Bell pub. Then, at the next roundabout, continue on the A127 (third exit) and the stadium will be on the right past the next set of traffic lights.

There is no on site parking at the ground and there are strict restrictions in the surrounding streets. The pay-and-display car park at the Civic Centre on Victoria Street (SS2 6ER) is recommended, costing £5 for up to five hours (smaller charges for smaller stays also available). Alternative parking at Southend High School on Prittlewell Street (SSO ORG), costing £5 per car, is also available. Both are approximately a five minute walk away.

For train travellers. Prittlewell - served by London Liverpool Street - which, again is approximately a five minute walk away. From the station turn right and go past the Fish House chip shop then turn right. The ground is tucked away approximately 100 yards along on the left.



Luton Town is one of the oldest clubs in the Football League having been founded in 1885, in fact, they will be celebrating 130 years of existence this coming Saturday.

They have had their fair share of ups and downs during that time with arguably their biggest success coming in 1988 when they beat Arsenal 3-2 at Wembley to win the League Cup, their one and only major honour to date.

More recently, they have suffered from some financial difficulties which resulted in them dropping from the Championship in 2006/07 to the Conference Premier in 2008/09 after three successive

The club has bounced back into the Football League this season as John Still's side won the Conference Premier title at the end of last season with over 100 points, 19 points clear of second-placed Cambridge United.

They have enjoyed their return into League football and have been in the upper echelons of the League Two table for the majority of the season and they are currently sitting in 8th place at time of writing. However, their current form has not been great. March was a tough month for The Hatters as they were defeated in each of their six league matches, although the majority of those games were against top half of the table sides. They faced Exeter City at Kenilworth Road on Good Friday.

Those recent results have come without their influential goalkeeper Mark Tyler. The 37 year-old shot-stopper, who has almost 750 career appearances to his name, has been absent with a knee injury and The Hatters have had 24 year-old Elliot Justham in between the

Another influential figure in the Luton defence is 31 year-old Steve McNulty. The commanding centre-back has mostly plied his trade in non-league football with the likes of Barrow, Vauxhall Motors and Burscough before helping, first, Fleetwood Town and then Luton into the Football League in recent years.

Their midfield is packed with experience with 32 year-old Alex Lawless at the heart of Luton's side. He will likely be joined in the centre of the park by Nathan Doyle, Jonathan Smith and Andy Drury who all have well over 200 career appearances to their names. Up front, their main source of goals this season has come from striker

Mark Cullen, who has scored 12 times in all competitions, while they recently acquired 20 year-old Eliot Lee (son of former England international Robert Lee) on loan from West Ham United who has 3 goals to his name so far.

A number of players have represented both clubs over the years including George Yardley, Steven O'Leary, Alec Chamberlain, Paul McLaren, John Lornie and Dino Seremet.





A managerial legend with more than 1,600 games under his belt, John Still guided Luton to a longawaited Conference championship last year, and has since masterminded the Hatters' fourth tier promotion charge this term.

As a player in the early-70s, Still spent time with Leyton Orient, Bishop's Stortford and Dagenham, but persistent injuries forced him to hang up his boots prematurely at the age of 26.

Soon thereafter. Still became a part-time salesman, but maintained a deep love of football. Accordingly, he delved into the world of coaching, and was soon appointed manager of Leystone, a job he balanced with his professional work selling industrial cleaning supplies.

Still maintained control for seven years, guiding the club to its first Isthmian League title in 1982, and setting a precedent of success and longevity for his career ahead.

A successful three-year stint at Dartford followed, before Still returned to Leystone for a solitary season, en route to Maidstone, whom he steered into the Football League as Conference champions in 1989.

However, at that point, Still had no desire to become a full-time manager, and he subsequently resigned, only to accept a new challenge with sixth-tier Redbridge. In a five-year spell. Still oversaw the club's promotion into the Conference, and it's later merger with Dagenham. In 1994, second division Peterborough appointed Still

as manager, an arrangement that was truncated after just a year following poor results, yet nonetheless marked the beginning of his transition to a full-time football career.

Later, Still became a coach at Lincoln, before a turbulent five-year spell as Barnet manager and Director of Football.

However, it would be a move to Dagenham in 2004 that defined Still's career; the experienced coach building a lower league dynasty against all the odds. In nine years at the helm, he transformed the Daggers from a middling Conference club to a highly-competitive League One outfit.

He now hopes to do the same with Luton, arguably the largest club on his extensive CV.

Last year. Still plotted the Hatters' Football League return with the seventh promotion of his managerial career and, with a few weeks remaining, will no doubt be looking to work the magic yet again this time around.


























FUTSAL IS THE FUTURE!

Tranmere Rovers in the Community are launching a Futsal and Education Scholarship programme for girls aged 16-18 years old.

It's all been happening

The scholarship will offer 16 and 17-year-old girls the chance to play Futsal at a competitive national level, train full-time with professional coaches and work towards a BTEC in Sport.

The full-time course will run for two years, allowing the scholars to study using state-of-the-art computer platforms and take part in valuable work experience opportunities with Tranmere Rovers in the Community.

The work experience element of the Futsal and Education Scholarship has set Tranmere Rovers in the Community apart from the other courses that are offered locally. It has hugely proved popular with other Football League clubs.

The Futsal and Education Scholarship Programme will give girls the unique opportunity to develop their technical. tactical, physiological and social skills within a sporting environment whilst also gaining a BTEC qualification.

Futsal is a five-a-side indoor game, originating in South America. It is played on a hard surface with hockey-sized goals and a size four ball with reduced bounce. Matches are played over 40 minutes and to a stop-clock (like basketball), with time-outs allowed.

The sport naturally develops all the skills and techniques required for traditional 11-a-side football but also helps to develop a more rounded player. The small sided nature of the game requires competitors to be equally competent in both attack and defence as well as showcasing close ball skills, increased number of touches, quick decision making. creativity and tactical nous.

Futsal is a fantastic sport in its own right whilst being an invaluable development tool for football.

Tranmere Rovers in the Community manager Steve Williams said, "This is a fantastic opportunity for girls to play an exciting and fast-paced sport as well as developing and learning new skills while also working towards a BTEC



With tensions likely to surround Prenton Park this afternoon, a strong start could be imperative for Tranmere if they are to claim three crucial points...

Three years ago to this day the stakes were much lower, with the club's League One position looking safe going into April, but two early goals against Stevenage made the job ever easier.

Wolves loanee Jake Cassidy struck twice in the opening 11 minutes at Prenton Park, once with a bullet header and the other a close range tap in.

Lucas Akins wrapped up the win with the third after the break, as Stevenage's play-off hopes took a knock - similarly to Luton, should Rovers claim three points

Unfortunately there was no similar joy in 2013, as The Whites continued their downward spiral away from the promotion pack after a 1-0 defeat at Doncaster Rovers.

11 years ago they were similarly unlucky, as second-placed QPR clung onto a point on Merseyside. Eugene Dadi's successful

penalty was chalked off due to an encroachment, before he slammed his second strike against the post in the 0-0

That evening the likes of Paul Hall, Graham Allen and Gary Jones were all in the Rovers side, as The Whites secured a fifth successive clean sheet.

Other past victories on 6 April include against Swindon Town (3-1 in 1993), Darlington (3-0 in 1985) and Plymouth Argyle (3-1 in 1970).

Between 1928 and 1935 Rovers won their four consecutive 6 April fixtures, as Rochdale, South Shields, Gateshead and Crewe Alexandra all left Prenton Park empty handed.

The club's first fixture on this date according to recent records was against Halifax Town in 1926, and the two sides played out a 1-1 draw in West Yorkshire.



PRENTONIAN NOSTALGIA

Rovers Run the Wirral 100

With the Wirral District Football Association currently celebrating its 125th anniversary this season, our nostalgic backtrack this time around has unearthed a mid-season friendly fixture, used predominantly as a backdrop to celebrate the Wirral and District Football Association's Centenary twenty years beforehand in 1984...

Prenton Park staged the on Tuesday 16th October 1984, with just over 500 spectators turning out to watch the 'away' side, a near-Rovers first team sporting their all-red away strip, take on a collection of household names drafted from the local non-league scene such as Poulton Victoria, Cammell Laird and West Kirby.

While history will record that Tranmere Rovers spoilt the Wirral FA's celebrations. the beaten Wirral side were at least consoled by the thought that the damage was inflicted by local league player Chris Camden, who was guesting for Rovers on

Camden's brace of neatly executed goals, the first an overhead shot at the near post courtesy of Doug Anderson's corner in the 36th minute and the second a 57th minute header, again set up by Anderson.

The Wirral FA side though could have well shared the honours or even won, during a late rally which saw ex-Rovers striker and current Morecambe assistant manager Kenny McKenna and Heswall's Jimmy Kelly spurn some gift wrapped opportunities.



McKenna though did get it right after 66 minutes when he was first to react having won a contest of courage for a through ball with substitute 'keeper Ian Douglas.

While the NSPCC, who were also celebrating their centenary, benefited from the gate receipts, the now rich and rare programmes were a simple four-page issue costing 10p which was produced in two different colours of which the 'white' issue was made available to supporters and the 'vellow' edition solely to the committee, directors and their guests.

As it would turn out in later seasons, Chris Camden went on to appear for Rovers under more inauspicious circumstances, when a short-term 'loan' from local Sunday league side The Avenue propelled him into the spotlight for the three final games of the 1986-87 season. Taking to the field early as a substitute, he then scored Rovers' only goal in a 1-3 home defeat to Leyton Orient,

while wearing the number 9 shirt away to Wrexham and our famous last-gasp victory over Exeter City to help retain our Football League status.

Connections with the Wirral District Football Association though headed in another direction, as sadly, the Association's main Blue Riband showpiece, the Wirral Senior Cup Final is no longer a feature at Prenton Park.

Moved from Birkenhead Park Rugby Club's Upper Park ground at the end of the First World War, it was then became one of the post-season attractions at Rovers, even drawing crowds in at one stage of between 8-10,000.

Even Tranmere Rovers themselves were involved a good spread of final appearances, lifting the trophy on nine occasions and under the guise of the first team, reserves and even their 'B' team in January 1941.

The last final was held at Prenton Park at the close of the 2006-07 season when West Kirby defeated Ashville 4-2 after extra time after the two sides had drawn 1-1 in normal

This seasons' final is being staged at Cammell Lairds MBS Stadium on Wednesday 6th May at 7.00pm, with two West Cheshire League Division One sides, Mallaby FC and Vauxhall Motors, both contesting the trophy.

Although our league form had been patchy, a second leg Coca Cola victory at Oldham in the previous midweek had seen us safely through to Round 3, as goals by Ged Brannan and Gary Jones (2) helped us to a 3-1 victory to add to a 1-0 win at Prenton Park.

WHAT ABOUT THE PROGRAMME?

Manager, John King, criticised his team for what he described as "five minutes of sloppiness" which had cost us valuable points in the previous weekend's 2-3 home defeat against Watford. While Rovers were creating more FA Cup giant killing headlines by beating First Division Huddersfield Town, Coventry were 3-0 winners over Second Division Charlton Athletic in the Third Round at Highfield Road.

Coventry's league season left little to cheer, with a dour record of just three wins from eight games, and occupying second from bottom in going into the game with Rovers, this despite beating Chelsea 2-1 at Highfield Road.

Tranmere overcame First Division Coventry City the hard way by battling to a 1-1 draw at Highfield Road, then finishing the job in front of a 20,996 crowd paying record receipts at Prenton Park just four days later - where Royers ran out 2-0 winners and set up a Fifth Round tie with Everton at Goodison Park.

Matt's Monologue

"The European U21 championships are just a few months away, and already there is a battle simmering away between club and country."

"Several managers are concerned about their players going to compete in the tournament after a long, hard season.

Roberto Martinez is amongst them, calling on Everton's Ross Barkley to be given a break after traveling to Brazil for last summer's world

For England boss Roy Hodgson, the shoe is on the other foot. Having used Barkley at senior level for the last two seasons, he's made him available for Gareth Southgate to pick, and also stated that Harry Kane WILL go to the tournament, despite recently making

So what are the benefits of the youngsters going to the Czech

The obvious thing is it gives them some valuable experience of playing in a major tournament.

This is something that could help England in the future. If any of the squad continue their development and go to a world cup, they might not be as overawed by the tournament

They will know, to a certain extent, what it is all about, how to handle living away from home for six weeks at a time and so on. But on top of that, there are surely benefits for the club too.

Their young stars, who have the honour of being called up to such a big competition, get to test themselves against the best under-21s that the rest of Europe has to offer.

That, in turn, may help them learn new techniques, or if they come up against one of them a few months down the line in a Champions League match, it is possible that they will be better equipped to handle facing said player.

Of course, these are just a handful of examples of what is good about playing in the tournament.

And there is a flip side. After a long season, the players may well be a little tired and therefore more susceptible to injury

But take Barkley or Harry Kane. These are two lads who barely feature for the opening few months of the campaign.

Kane, whilst playing in the Europa League and cup competitions, did not start a league fixture until November, whilst Barkley was out until mid-October through injury.

They should be a little bit fresher than others who may have played every match since August, people who may be mentally tired as well

For me, then, the question should not be about the clubs pulling the players out of the tournament.

If they feel they are able to go, then they should. Who knows what will happen in the future? They might never get the chance to go to another World Cup or European Championships.

What should be being asked is do they deserve a place in the squad? Kane has actually featured regularly for the under-21s, he has helped them book their place in the finals.

But for Barkley or a Raheem Sterling, they have not been part of the squad. Both instead have been a more important part of the senior

And therefore, I actually think it would be wrong to take one of these lads over a campaigner who has genuinely earned his place in the
