The four-nil win last time out here was great, I think we could've won by more. We then went to Carlisle and I don't think anyone played particularly well, myself included.

It was a great hat-trick from Jamie Cureton to secure our three points last Monday against AFC Wimbledon. He's close to 20 goals now and he's been a good signing for us and been fantastic all season, I hope that he can reach the 20 goal mark this season as he deserves it.

Our home form has been picking up since the turn of the year, we've got two more home games left of the season - including tonight's game - and it'd be great if we could finish the season with two home wins to follow up our four-nil victory against Wimbledon.

We then went to Carlisle and we were all very disappointed as no one played very well individually or as a team. They deserved to win and showed more hunger and fight than us, which in the end was one of the most disappointing things.

Despite the result on Saturday we are mathematically safe in League Two for another season, which is good news. We must continue to push on, the gaffer did mention to us not to take the foot off the gas now, which is what happened on Saturday. It's important to learn from Saturday and not take the last few games of the season for granted; we still want to finish as high in the table as possible.

It is pleasing to be in the position we are in with games to go, we did make an aim at the beginning of the season and we haven't quite reached that. It does now give the gaffer the opportunity to give players who haven't had much game time a chance to get a run out. It's nice to be safe, you don't want to go into the final games with relegation looming.

I'm looking forward to tonight's game and to play against my old manager John Still. I didn't get to play in the reverse fixture, so this will be the first time I will be playing against his side. He was the one who brought me to the club and made me Captain.

The reverse fixture at Luton was a poor result on our part and we'll be looking to make up for that today. They aren't on the best of runs and suffered a defeat as well at the weekend. They're fighting for the play-off places but we are fighting for a high as possible league position and we won't make it easy for them. We are at home and Stilly is coming back to his old team and the fans will be up for it, he'll want to win and so do we so it should make for a good game.

WAYNE BURNETT

It's been a challenging year. What were your expectations on how we would perform?

We set targets on where we wanted to finish and we had objectives for the season, but there were no expectations as such. The first aim is to stay in the Football League. Last year we finished 9th, although there were very few points between that and 15th. That maybe clouds people's judgments. Every season is different and everybody has different expectations. We're not too far off our points total for last year so we've maintained some consistency.

The league table often reflects team's budgets. Using that as a measure, some could say that we're over achieving?

It doesn't always work like that because if it did we'd have been relegated in the past two or three seasons. I think it works more at the top end of the table. Look at the top teams in the Premier League, Bournemouth, Watford, Derby in the Championship and Bristol City in League one. If we finished 22nd, would I be doing my job? Absolutely, but I wouldn't be happy as I want us to finish as high as possible.

Leading up to Christmas, we were knocked out of the cup against Southport and went four games without scoring which landed us in the bottom two.

What were your thoughts then about where the club was going?

I never lost faith in my group of players. We weren't playing great but we weren't that bad either. Personally, losing to Southport was a very low point for me, because I did expect to beat them and we then had a home tie to Eastleigh to look forward to. Along with the players, we were gutted to go out in the first round as we know how important to the club a cup run means. Football is unpredictable though, which was proven by Bradford and Middlesbrough beating Chelsea and Manchester City respectively.

We've lost a lot of home matches this season and were booed off in some of them. Do you feel the supporters were justified and how did that make you feel?

I'm all for freedom of speech which means the fans have a right to voice their views. I haven't a problem with that as that's the line of work I'm in. What I found difficult was when it became personal and being told by people that they wanted me to die. This club means a lot to me and I share everyone's disappointment and frustrations. We have a young group of players here and some of the things shouted out weren't nice and this affects them.

Did you consider resigning or feel any pressure from above regarding your position?



I never wanted to throw the towel in. These players have given me time out from their careers and I felt that I owed it to them to give everything I have back to them. The only time I would have walked would be either because they had given up on me or if I'd lost the changing room. Regarding the board, it's a results driven industry so of course you're under pressure to deliver. Most of the sides that changed their manager are sitting below us so sometimes it works, sometimes it doesn't.

Since the turn of the year, we've turned the corner, looked defensively strong and delivered some excellent performances. What's changed?

We've cut out a lot of the individual errors and people have made the right decisions at the right time. Our work ethic, training and intensity hasn't changed, but people have to understand that we are going to get beat in matches. Why? Because other teams have better players than us. The average wage bill in this league is 50% above ours and there are about ten clubs with budgets around twice as big as ours.

After changing the formation and personnel several times during the season, you seem to have found a system that is paying dividends?

We started with a 4-3-3 and then moved to a 4-4-1-1 and back again. If things don't work, you have to try something else, but we've found a little bit of consistency more recently and you can see the improvement in results.

Your philosophy is to play attractive football. With hindsight, do you think that you have to vary your approach in this league?

We're mindful that we're not the biggest team. I'd like to have more big, physical players but they cost money. What disappoints me is when we're up against sides that maybe are a bit more direct, we don't always impose ourselves as much as I'd like upon them. Sometimes it's about playing the conditions like how we did at Stevenage recently. I dropped our top scorer because I felt that the pitch didn't suit him and we got a result.

Some supporters feel we play too many long or high balls up to Jamie Cureton, who's often the lone striker.

Yes I agree. I'd like us to play a little more football and it isn't for the want of trying. We set up to play a certain way but it doesn't always turn out like that. Wycombe at home was a horrible game and because we couldn't play how we wanted to, we tried to play how they did. Against teams like Plymouth and Exeter, we played well as it was a proper football match. I'm not criticising Gareth Ainsworth who's done a fantastic job as you have to play to your strengths.

As stated, it's been a hard season. What players have impressed you?

The little fellow up front has done alright! He's surprised me, not in how good a footballer he is, but how many games he's played and how well he's performed in them.

Of late, Billy Bingham and Andre Boucard have formed a good partnership and Mark Cousins has done well. Scott Doe didn't have a great start but of late has played some of the best football he's done at this club.

With several players and yourself out of contract this summer, how does the club plan for next season?

I think we have to start looking at things now. There will be some players that the club won't keep, some they will want to keep that may want to leave and others that they will retain. These decisions need to be made soon as it's important that the club keeps it's best assets.

Tonight it's impossible to ignore the John Still factor. What does his contribution to the club mean to you?

I worked under John for several years, so as well as admiring him as a manager, I regard him as a good friend. We certainly wouldn't be where we are now without him. I learnt so much from him. We didn't always agree on things, but it was good that we had a healthy relationship which allowed us to discuss various matters, whether it be on playing individual or adopting certain styles. I'd also include Terry Harris as being a major part in what John achieved as together they formed a great partnership.

It's been five years since he took us into League one. Do you think that's a realistic target for this club again?

We all aspire to that and if we didn't have such ambitions, what are we all doing here? You always believe that we can be successful but you have to be realistic too. It's not impossible because as you say, it's already been done but you need a few things to go your way. You need a group of players that gel, you need everyone to be playing at their maximum and you need to avoid injuries.

You've been our manager for two full seasons now. Where do you think you have taken the club?

We've really established our academy now and are starting to see some players coming through. We've also earned a reputation for developing young talent and giving them an opportunity to progress. What has really impressed me is how fantastic everyone at the club works so hard for the cause. That extends from the excellent coaches to the ground and match * day staff, the supporters and the players who have all done brilliant to keep this club in the Football League. John used to say, every year this club stays in the league is an unbelievable achievement and I believe that. It's difficult to put a measurement on where I've taken the club because I'm just a small part of what we do. Anything we achieve here is down to everyone involved with the club.



INTRODUCING LUTON TOWN

After an excellent return to life in the Football League, after being away since 2009, John Still's side have slipped in recent weeks, although they still remain just about in touch with the play-off places which many expected them to occupy at the start of the season.

LEAGUE FORM - LAST TEN YEARS 10th 15th =League 1 =League 2

The former Daggers manager reshaped his squad in the close season, in the aftermath of his third promotion into the League. Golden Boot winning striker Andre Gray headed for Championship new boys Brentford for a £500,000 fee, whilst defender Ronnie Henry moved back to Stevenage having joined from there in 2012

Arriving at Kenilworth Road were defenders Luke Wilkinson, Paul Connolly, Curtley Williams and Mark Onyemah from Dagenham, Crawley, Lowestoft and Thurrock respectively, whilst in midfield, Andy Drury returned to the club for a second spell from Crawley alongside Bradford City's Nathan Doyle, who

joined with the campaign underway. A number of new forward options included former Dagger Paul Benson, who joined permanently after a loan move from Swindon, whilst Ross Lafayette arrived from Welling, Lee Angol signed from Wycombe Wanderers, Charlie Walker switched from Peacehaven & Telscombe and Ricky Miller moved from Boston

Permanent activity in the New Year saw Solomon Taiwo and Dave Martin leave the club, whilst midfielder Ryan Hall signed from Rotherham. Loan captures have included Queens Park Rangers' defender Michael Harriman, as well as strikers Jayden Stockley, Nathan Oduwa and Elliot Lee from AFC Bournemouth, Tottenham Hotspur and West Ham United respectively, Norwich midfielder Cameron McGeehan and Aston Villa defender

The return to the Football League saw a 1-0 win at Carlisle, where Mark Cullen got the only goal, but ensuing results were mixed, as the return to the League Cup brought a 2-1 home loss to Swindon. A further home loss was suffered to AFC Wimbledon, ahead of a home draw with Bury and a point at Accrington, but the early struggles continued in defeats at Shrewsbury and at home to Plymouth. However, the Hatters surged into form in mid September,

unbeaten in eleven matches, and winning nine of them, duly hitting the summit in late October. The run began with a 1-0 home win over Cheltenham, and took in a draw at York, then seven straight wins, as away wins at Cambridge United, Stevenage and Hartlepool dovetailed with home successes against Oxford United, Southend, Dagenham and Northampton. A draw at Exeter broke the winning sequence, before a home win over Tranmere. Defensively strong, they kept seven clean sheets in the eleven matches.


Luton's sustained run of form came to an end as they drifted out to fourth after defeats at Burton and Morecambe sandwiched a 3-0 home win over Mansfield in early December. However, another spell of ten matches without defeat kept the Bedfordshire side firmly inside the play-off zone. The sequence began with a 3-0 home success over Newport County, prior to a trio of draws at Wycombe and at home to Portsmouth and Shrewsbury. A win was collected at Plymouth before a draw at Cheltenham and 3-2 home win over Cambridge United. Two more points were secured at Oxford United and at home to York, whilst the unbeaten spell was concluded by a 1-0 home victory against Carlisle.

However, in the two months

since that win. Luton have been in miserable form, winning two and losing ten of their last twelve ninth place, and undoing some of the good work of the autumn. Losses were suffered in February at Mansfield and AFC Wimbledon ahead of a home victory over of seven straight reverses took in defeats at Bury, home to Morecambe, Portsmouth, Newport County, home to Wycombe. JOHN STILL (MANAGER)

Still joined the Hatters in March 2013 having enjoyed a hugely successful 10-year spell at Dagenham & Redbridge where he guided the Daggers to the Conference title as well as promotion to League One. In his first season in the Hatters' hot-seat he guided the club to the Conference title with 101 points. It was the third time he had won the division in his career having also won it with Dagenham and Redbridge and Maidstone.

TERRY HARRIS (ASSISTANT MANAGER)

Terry was with the Daggers from 1999, first with Garry Hill then John Still, before following John to Luton Town. As a player he scored for the original Dagenham FC at Wembley in an FA Trophy final and has also coached at Dartford, Enfield and St Albans

GOALKEEPERS

Mark Tyler joined the Hatters in the summer of 2009. Prior to his move to Kenilworth Road Mark had made almost 400 appearances whilst with Peterborough United. The 2013/14 season was Tyler's fifth at Kenilworth Road and he crowned it by playing every match in the 46-game title-winning campaign. He kept clean sheets in exactly half of those games and has now made 232 appearances in total for the Hatters.

Eliot Justham was signed from East Thurrock on a two-year deal in May 2013. The 6ft 3in stopper kept 14 clean sheets in 31 matches for the Rocks in the 2012/13 season. He made his Town debut in an FA Cup tie at Woking, keeping a clean sheet in the process, and went onto feature in all of the Hatters' cup-ties in 2013/14.

DEFENDERS

Fraser Franks signed for an undisclosed fee in January 2014 from Welling United. He began his career as a youngster at Chelsea and then Brentford before moving to AFC Wimbledon, winning promotion in 2011. Fraser left Kingsmeadow for Welling and helped the Wings secure the Conference South title in 2012/13.

Danny Fitzsimons is a former Millwall and QPR defender who followed team-mate Jim Stevenson to Kenilworth Road from Histon on a two-year contract in the summer of 2013. He has over 100 games experience despite only being 22-years-old. An injury kept him out of the Town side for the entire 2013/14 campaign but he's back to full fitness now.

Stephen McNulty is a Liverpoolborn defender who led Fleetwood

Town to the Conference title in 2011/12 as the Cod Army captain. He has also played for Barrow, Vauxhall Motors and Bursough. McNulty enjoyed a fantastic season at the heart of the Hatters defence after joining in February 2013 and was an ever-present as the Hatters lifted the Conference title. He won the Club's Player of the Year and goal of the season for last term.

Alex Lacey made his first team debut as a 17-year-old in the FA Trophy first round tie against Welling in 2009. He spent the 2012/13 season on loan at Conference South side Eastleigh but broke into the side in August 2014. Lacey scored his first goal for the club in the 4-0 win at Woking in September 2013 and went onto make 22 appearance as the Town lifted the title.

Scott Griffiths joined Luton at the end of the 2012/13 season after initially joining on loan. The former Dagger was released from his previous club Peterborough. He won the Conference with the Daggers in 2007 and lifted the League 2 title with Chesterfield in 2011. Scott was an ever-present for the Town in the title winning campaign of 2013/14.

Michael Harriman is a Republic of Ireland Under-21 international on loan from QPR till the end of the season. He made his R's debut as a teenager before joining Wycombe on-loan for the 2012/13 campaign. Michael was again out on loan last season, playing 38 of Gillingham's 46 matches in League 1 last term.

Curtley Williams is a former Ipswich scholar who joined the Hatters last summer. Curtley spent time in Spain at the Glenn Hoddle Academy before spells in non-league. He helped Lowestoft to the Play-Offs in his first season before enjoying another successful campaign in Suffolk last term, with the club winning promotion through the Play-Offs.

Luke Wilkinson was the Daggers play of the year two seasons ago. The former Bristol City and Portsmouth defender enjoyed a spell on-loan at Dartford before nailing down a place with the Daggers. He transferred to the Hatters in July 2014.

MIDFIELDERS

Jonathan Smith signed from York in January 2013 for £50,000 following a successful loan spell. Originally with York he moved to Swindon where he helped the Robins win the League 2 title in 2011/12 before he switched back to Bootham Crescent. Smith enjoyed a terrific first half of 201314 but his season looked to have been over following a

leg-breaking injury sustained on Boxing Day. However, four months to the day after the incident, he made an emotional comeback as a substitute in the final match of the title-winning campaign.

Alex Lawless won the clubs Player of the Year in 2013. The 29-year-old has made 156 appearances for the Hatters since signing from York City in November 2010 and has scored 18 goals. He began his career as a youngster at Fulham and has also played for Forest Green. Scored six goals in 32 matches as he helped the Town lift the Conference title in 2013/14.

Nathan Doyle signed for the Hatters in September 2014 after leaving Bradford City in the summer. Derby-born, he came

through the Rams' youth ranks before signing for Hull and then Barnsley. He joined Bradford in 2012 and helped the Bantams win the League 2 Play-Offs in his first season, a campaign that also saw the Yorkshire outfit reach the final of the League Cup.

Adam Drury returned to Kenilworth Road in the summer of 2014 from Crawley Town. He first signed for the Hatters from Stevenage in 2010 and caught the eve of Ipswich Town who signed him in January 2011. He was a regular at Portman Road in the Championship until a change of manager saw him find first team opportunities limited. Drury signed on-loan for Crawley before making that move permanent in the summer of 2013. He started his career with Sittingbourne before spells at Gravesend and Lewes.

Jake Howells came through the ranks at Kenilworth Road and made his first team debut as a second half substitute in May 2008. Capped at Under-21 level by Wales, he surpassed the 200-appearance mark for the club as a 21-year-old. In 2013/14 Howells then broke the 275-game barrier in Town colours and netted eight goals as the Town romped to the title.

Andy Parry signed from Southport on a two-year contract in the summer of 2013 having had two season's worth of Conference football under his belt. He began his career as a youngster at Blackburn. Andy appeared 26 times for the Town in his debut season of 2013/14 and scored four goals.

Pelly Ruddock Mpanzu signed on a permanent deal from West Ham in January 2014. He made his debut for the Hammers in August 2013 in the Capital One Cup but was loaned to the Hatters in December, making his debut against Staines in the FA Trophy. He scored his first goal for the Hatters in the 7-0 win

over Hereford and picked up a championship winners' medal after string of impressive performances in central midfield.

Shaun Whalley joined on a twoyear deal from Southport in the summer of 2013. Whalley scored 10 goals for the Sandgrounders in 2012/13 winning the player of the season award. After beginning last season with the Town, Whalley was loaned to AFC Telford who he helped win the Conference North title.

Luke Guttridge has over 450 senior appearances to his name and signed for the Hatters in August 2013, He twice won promotion at Southend and also helped Northampton reach the League 2 play-off final last season. Luke enjoyed a fine debut season with the Hatters, scoring an impressive 13 goals in 33 matches before a foot injury curtailed his season in March.

Matt Robinson made his Town debut in a 2-0 win at Kidderminster Harriers in August 2012 and scored his first goal for the club in the 3-1 win at Southport on the final game of the 2012/13 season. He made 31 appearances for the Town in the title-winning campaign and scored twice – both vital goals against Chester and Grimsby.

Jim Stevenson joined in May 2013 from Histon. He made his full debut as a 17-year-old at Kenilworth Road for Histon in a game the Hatters won 5-1. He made six appearances for the Hatters in his debut season but impressed out on a loan spell with Dartford.

Ryan Hall signed an 18-month contract with the club in January 2015. He started his career as a youngster at Crystal Palace and had a loan spell with the Daggers but resurrected

his career in non-league circles at Bromley. Southend took a punt on the pacey wideman and he went onto enjoy an excellent two seasons at Roots Hall in League 2. A move to Leeds followed before a spell with Rotherham at the start this season.

lan Rees penned his first professional contract midway through the 2013/14 season having impressed the coaching staff. He made four appearances last term including a full debut in the 2-0 FA Trophy win over Wrexham.

FORWARDS

Paul Benson signed permanently last summer after a long loan last term. Benson started out with Essex Intermediate League side White Ensign but shot to prominence with Dagenham & Redbridge helping the Daggers to win two promotions and scoring over 75 goals. He signed for Charlton Athletic in August 2010 but moved to Swindon Town in January 2012, helping the Robins win the League 2 title. He was loaned to Portsmouth and Cheltenham last season before he was reunited with John Still at Kenilworth Road.

Alex Wall signed in the summer of 2013 following a loan from Maidenhead United. He joined Maidenhead from Thatcham Town but burst onto the scene last season with a dozen goals for the Magpies. In 2013/14 he scored a fine winning goal in the 4-3 win over FC Halifax before going out on loan to Dartford where his form in front of goal continued. He was credited with the final Luton goal in the Conference following his strike in the 1-0 win over Hyde.

Mark Cullen joined the Hatters following his release from Hull City in the summer of 2013. He made a goalscoring debut for Hull in the Premier League. In his first full season with the Town Cullen netted an impressive 10 goals. Mark scored a hat-trick against the Daggers in the meeting at Kenilworth Road earlirt in the season.

joined from Welling
United having scored 39 goals in
90 matches with the Wings, who
he helped win the Conference
South in 2012/13. A regular scorer
further down the pyramid he also
has experience of coaching in the
United States.

Ricky Miller was the 2013/14 Conference North player of the year and top goalscorer who ended the campaign with a haul of 28 goals for Boston. Previously on the books of Rothwell and Stamford, he began his career on the books at Charlton as a youngster.

MACCOM MACCONALD

Striker Malcolm Macdonald was capped 14 times by England after leaving Luton Town. Initially with Tonbridge, he joined Fulham in August 1968 and moved to Luton in July 1969. He was twice top scorer including their 1969-70 promotion success when 'Player of the Year' and netted 49 goals in 88 League games before sold to Newcastle United for £180,000 in May 1971. An FA Cup finalist in 1974 and League Cup finalist in 1976, he joined Arsenal for £333,333 in August 1976 and was an FA Cup finalist again in 1978 before injury ended his career. He managed Fulham and Huddersfield and now works in the

CHRIS NICHOU

Northern Ireland international central defender Chris Nicholl was Luton Town's 'Player of the Year' in 1970-71. A former Burnley apprentice, he moved via Witton to Halifax Town in June 1968 and starred in their 1968-69 promotion success. He joined Luton in August 1969 and was a promotion winner in 1969-70, netting six goals in 97 League games before joining Aston Villa in March 1972. Helping win promotion in 1974-75, as well as featuring in two League Cup final triumphs, he joined Southampton in June 1977 and was a promotion winner again in 1977-78, then played for Grimsby before managing Saints and Walsall.

PAUL FUTCHER

Former England U-21 central Town's 'Player of the Year' in 1976-77 and 1977-78. He turned professional with his twin brother Ron at hometown Chester in January 1974, moving to Luton in a joint £100,000 deal in June 1974 and scoring once in 131 League outings. Sold to Manchester City for £350,000 in June 1978, he Athletic and Derby County prior to joining Barnsley in March 1984. He starred as they reached the FA Cup sixth round in 1984-85, moving to Halifax Town in July 1990. Later with Grimsby Town, he managed

KIRK STEPHENS

Attacking right-back Kirk Stephens was ever-present in Luton Town's 1981-82 Second Division title triumph. Initially with Nuneaton Borough, he helped them finish Southern League runners-up in 1974-75 and followed David Pleat to Kenilworth Road in June 1978. He was voted Luton's 'Player of the Year' in 1978-79 and 1983-84, scoring twice in 227 League games for the Hatters before moving to Coventry City in exchange for Ashley Grimes in August 1984. Later rejoining Nuneaton as playermanager after a knee injury ended his top-flight career, he also had a spell at Barnet and has since run the family building firm.

RICKY HIU

England international midfielder Ricky Hill was 'Player of the Year' when Luton Town won the Second Division title in 1981-82. Signing professional at Kenilworth Road in May 1976, he was also 'Player of the Year' in 1980-81 and starred as Luton were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85. He also featured in two consecutive League Cup finals including the Hatters' 1988 Wembley triumph and netted 54 goals in 436 League games before moving to Le Havre in July 1989. Reuniting with David Pleat at Leicester City in August 1990 and later as a coach at Sheffield Wednesday and Spurs, he briefly rejoined Luton as manager.

PAUL WALSH

England international striker Paul Walsh was capped five times while at Luton Town. Signing professional for Charlton Athletic in October 1979, he starred in their 1980-81 promotion success and moved to Luton in July 1982. He was 'Player of the Year' in 1982-83 and leading marksman in 1983-84, netting 24 goals in 80 First Division games for the Hatters before joining Liverpool in May 1984. Helping to win the League Championship in 1985-86, he joined Tottenham Hotspur in February 1988 and was an FA Cup winner in 1991. He later played for Portsmouth, Manchester City and Pompey again until injury curtailed his career.

MAL DONAGHY

Northern Ireland international central defender Mal Donaghy gained a club record 58 caps while at Luton Town. He moved to Kenilworth Road from Larne in June 1978 and was everpresent as Luton won the Second Division title in 1981-82 and were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85. Voted 'Player of the Year' in 1985-86, he was an FA Cup semi-finalist again in 1987-88 and starred in that season's League Cup final triumph. He netted 16 goals in 410 League games prior to joining Manchester United for £650,000 in October 1988, then returned on loan, moving to Chelsea in August 1992. He has worked for the Irish FA.

BRIAN STEIN

England international striker Brian Stein was Luton Town's 'Player of the Year' in 1987-88, scoring twice in that season's League Cup final triumph. Moving to Kenilworth Road from Edgware Town in October 1977, he was leading marksman in Luton's 1981-82 Second Division success and also starred as they were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85 and 1987-88. He joined Caen in July 1988 and moved via Annecy back to Luton in July 1991. Voted 'Player of the Year' again in 1991-92, he netted 130 goals in 427 League games overall before joining Barnet in August 1992. His younger brother Mark also played for Luton.

DAYID PREECE

England B international midfielder David Preece was 'Player of the Year' when Luton Town reached the FA Cup semi-finals in 1993-94. Signing professional for Walsall in July 1980, he helped them reach the League Cup semi-finals in 1983-84 and joined Luton for £150,000 in December 1984. He appeared in two consecutive League Cup finals including the Hatters' 1988 Wembley success and was also 'Player of the Year' in 1991-92, netting 21 goals in 336 League games while at Kenilworth Road prior to joining Derby County in August 1995. Later player-coach at Cambridge United and Torquay United, he died in July 2007.







DAGGERS ACADEMY

Looking back on the academy victory over AFC Wimbledon....

An energetic start saw Darren Foxley's 25-yard effort drop into the Don's keepers gloves before they took the lead with a dipping volley that rendered Daggers stopper Joe Carter helpless on his line. Daggers responded to the early goal with a display of firsthalf dominance that saw Alfie Moulder beat the offside flag with an unmarked Foxley in front of a gaping goal, but the forward's cross was intercepted before Hackett-Fairchild hit the base of the post with a placed effort shortly after having the ball clipped away from his feet as the Daggers number nine was about to try for goal. The hosts' dominance was eventually rewarded when Hackett-Fairchild collected a through ball and chipped over the Dons keeper, Alfie Moulder making sure putting the ball into empty net.

Frustrations with the Daggers equaliser caused recklessness amongst Dons players with one being booked for dissent before a foul on Jimmy Nottage in the area saw the Daggers awarded a penalty that was taken and saved, but the defender managed to force in the rebound to give his side the lead.

The second half saw Hackett-Fairchild have a goal disallowed for handball before he curled a left-footed shot into the keepers gloves from eighteen yards and Alfie Moulder clear the crossbar after a delightful turn and shot. AFC Wimbledon made their next chance count as their player lifted the ball into the top corner from close range to level.





LEAGUE TWO NEWS

Bury have offered free entry to all fans for their rearranged League Two game against Southend on 21 April. The original fixture was abandoned a month ago after just six minutes after torrential rain left the pitch at the JD Stadium unplayable. The Shakers had asked fans who had been at that game to collect a voucher for the rearranged game, but have now opened it up to all supporters. Bury have said it could cost them up to £9,000 to stage the rescheduled game. Before the original game, heavy rain leaving left puddles on the surface but referee Tony Harrington opted to start the match. Following further downpours, the players were called off the pitch and when it was clear that the surface would remain unplayable, the game was called off.

Stevenage have extended the loan of QPR midfielder Bruno Andrade until the end of the season. The 21-year-old has played nine times for Boro this term, scoring once. He is in his second spell with Stevenage, having made 19 appearances for the club as they were relegated from League One last season. Andrade, who has played four times for Premier League side Rangers, has also had loan stays with Aldershot and Stevenage's League Two rivals Wycombe.

Exeter City striker Clinton Morrison says he would only consider extending his career if he could play for the Grecians. The 35-year-old former Republic of Ireland international joined Exeter in November on non-contract terms and committed to a deal until the end of the season in January. Morrison had been playing local non-league football in the Midlands earlier this season after his contract at Colchester ended at the end of last

term. Morrison has scored 172 goals in a career which has seen him play for clubs such as Crystal Palace, Coventry City and Birmingham City, as well as make 36 international appearances and go to the 2002 World Cup. But he has yet to hit the back of the net for Exeter.

AFC Wimbledon do not expect defender Deji Oshilaja to suffer any lasting effects from a neck injury after he was stretchered off against Oxford United. The 22-year-old needed lengthy treatment after falling to the ground head first after an aerial challenge. Oshilaja, on loan from Cardiff, was later taken to hospital, but boss Neal Ardley said it was just a precaution.

Harrold has been recalled from his

Nosworthy has played three times since arriving on loan in March and has been impressed by what he has seen at Fratton Park

BAD SEASONS

Having started the season with no players, it came as a shock to no-one that Blackpool ended it by becoming the first club in England's top four divisions to be relegated.

Rotherham United's 1-0 victory over Brighton on Easter Monday condemned the Seasiders to League One on April 6th, still with six games to play. Incredibly, that's eight days less that this evening's opponents Luton Town lasted in 2008 - and they started that campaign with a 30-point deduction! It's a sorry state of affairs for fans who just five years ago cheered their side into the Premier League...

DERBY COUNTY 2007-08

but it could be worse.

Still the benchmark by which Premier League competence is measured, the Rams weren't so much out of their depth as 20,000



leagues down with a lead weight on each ankle.

Promoted through the play-offs in 2007, Derby went down on March 29, a Premier League and post-war top-flight record.

Along the way, they smashed records like plates at a Greek wedding. Their tally of 11 points was an all-time worst, beating Sunderland's haul of 15 set two years earlier. So too was a record of one win (a 1-0 victory over Newcastle, with whom they also drew at St James') in 38 games and a goals against column of 89. They conceded six goals on four occasions, five twice, four three times and scored just 20 of their own - another Premier League low. On top of that, the Rams failed to win any of their last 32 games which meant manager Paul Jewell appointed to replace Billy Davies in November - didn't win any of his first 24 in charge. It was a ten-month nightmare from which they have only just recovered.

LANCASTER CITY 2006-07

It takes some dedication for parttime players who aren't being paid to pitch up and make them take a hiding every week - but that's exactly what the lads at Conference North Lancaster did in 2008. Having started the season with two wins and three draws, the Dolly Blues' promotion bid collapsed amid financial meltdown.

Missed transfer payments to Crewe Alexandra and Moor Green, plus Football Association fees including a bill for 100 footballs, resulted in a transfer embargo. Bailiffs changed the locks, players walked out due to unpaid wages. By December, Lancaster were in administration and had been docked ten points, leaving them on -1.

And there they remained, right until

the day they were relegated on

In 1961, Third Lanark - also known as the Hi-Hi - finished third in the Scottish top flight, scoring 100 goals in the process.

Yet just four years later the Scarlet-shirted Glaswegians would go down in history as one of Scottish football's worst-ever teams.

From November 1964 to the season's end in April, they failed to collect a single point, a remarkable - and still unsurpassed - run of 21^{straight} defeats. Though these were the days of two points for a win, the end still came early, with a 2-1 defeat to Dundee United on February 17th sealing their relegation.

Just two years later, amid accusations of boardroom corruption, the Thirds went bust, never to be seen again.



Today's visiting fan in focus is Luton Town supporter, Dave O'Flanagan. A Hatter for 20 years, Dave has also appeared on Channel 4 show. Countdown:

How long have you supported Luton and what are your first memories?

I moved to Luton as a young child and lived near the ground and was intrigued by the atmosphere and the buzz. My first game was against Tranmere in December 1995 (in what was then Division 1) and we won 3-2, although that season did ultimately end in relegation. Unfortunately being a first generation fan I didn't get too many opportunities to visit our fortress when I was younger but regularly attend home and away games nowadays.

John Still guided you to promotion from the Conference last term, just how vital was he in that success? And how vital was it for you as a club?

It's difficult to say. We were a big fish in a small - but expanding - pond and even the most pessimistic Luton fan didn't think it would take us 5 years to get back after our relegation from League 2 in 2009. Getting us promoted in his first full season was a good achievement but it's worth pointing out that we didn't have to compete with a side like Fleetwood/ Crawley spending "silly" money last year. In terms of long term progress - I'd like to think we could even compete in the Championship if/ when we ever get a new ground. Last year's promotion will probably go down as a massive turning point in our revival.

After a good start you've stalled in League Two in recent weeks, why do you think that is?

Injuries to key players. I know every side has them and there's no reason why we should be any different. Nathan Doyle was arguably our player of the season until he picked up an injury against York and he was missed more than most. As for getting promotion, it'll be tough after Saturday's defeat but a win tonight and against Hartlepool on Saturday would give us fresh hope of sneaking in there.

You have several former Daggers at Kenilworth Road, how have they performed?

Benson's partnership with the nowdeparted Andre Gray was key to our success last season. The partnership clicked well and allowed Gray to score 30 goals and deservedly earn himself a move to Brentford. Benson's not been as successful this season after a nasty injury against Mansfield but his Football League experience has been vital in our front line. Luke Wilkinson formed an impressive partnership with Steve

McNulty, and although this hasn't been quite as good in recent weeks. Wilkinson will push Nathan Doyle close for player of the season. The third and final ex-Dagger is Scott Griffths who is Mr Reliable. There's nothing spectacular about his game but you know you're going to get a good shift out of him every week.

Aside from those three, who should Daggers fans look out for in the Luton team this evening?

Steve McNulty is quite literally unmissable, and as alluded to earlier, although recent games haven't been too good, his reading of the game and leadership has helped us a lot this season. Dagenham fans will know all about Mark Cullen after his hat-trick at Kenilworth Road earlier in the year but if he doesn't start then West Ham loanee Elliott Lee should partner Paul Benson up front and will look to show his class.

What are your recollections of past clashes between Luton and Daggers?

I've not had the pleasure of visiting the London Borough of Barking & Dagenham Stadium (it's still Victoria Road to me) so my only memories of the clashes are the game earlier in the season when Cullen scored a "perfect" hat-trick in a 3-1 victory, and then there was a 2-1 scoreline in the 2008/2009 season as we battled against a 30 point deduction.

What do you think the final score will be and how many Hatters fans can we expect to see?

With Dagenham looking comfortable in mid-table, I'm hoping you'll roll over and let us ease to victory as a way of thanks to John Still for everything he did for you! Seriously though, my heart thinks we'll nab a win to keep alive our play-off hopes, but my head is slightly less optimistic/more realistic and says the spoils will be shared. With it being a fairly local game, we'll bring a decent following, around 750-800.

THE 1914 CHRISTMAS TRUCE WAS NOT THE LAST!

The one hundredth anniversary of the First World War ultimately appears to have captured the imagination of the general public.

There appears to be a genuine and sincere desire on the part of many to ensure that the bravery and sacrifice of those involved should not only be remembered but honoured. This was clearly reflected in the massive public response to the poppy display at the Tower of London with thousands paying their respects.

Undoubtedly, one of the major events in the War, which captured the public imagination, was the truce on the trenches on Christmas Day, 1914. The playing of football in no-mans land seems to have been a key element of the day. The peace was an example of the inner peaceful desires of men on both sides of the conflict. The exchange of gifts, photographs. Cigarettes, drinks etc was indication of man's humanity to fellow men. Soldiers were trapped in the circumstances of War whereas perhaps in ordinary times civilised peaceful behaviour may well have prevailed. The horror of officers at such acts of "fraternisation" meant that "normal" wartime arrangements would apply the next day with the slaughter resuming. Many accounts written at the time suggest that the Christmas truce was to be a "one-off".

Bertie Felstead was born in London and had joined the Royal Welsh Fusiliers early in the War. Towards the end of Christmas Eve, 1915, he and his comrades were occupying a stretch of frozen snow covered trench near the village of Lavennte in Northern France. One hundred yards away, across no-mans land, were German troops from a Bavarian regiment. Felstead recalled that the Germans started signing and the British troops responded with "Good King Wenceslas". The next morning the troops started shouting to each other "Hello Tommy, Hello Fritz".

It was early on Christmas Day morning that the German troops made the first move. Felstead recalled, "Nobody decided for us - we just climbed over our parapet and went over to them – we thought nobody would shoot at us if we all mingled together. Some of them were smoking cigars and offered us cigarettes. We offered them some of ours and we chatted. We weren't afraid."

The men on both sides in no-mans land communicated by speaking and using a mixture of language (English, French and German) and sign language. They exchanged gifts – German beer, sausages and spiked helmets were given or bartered in return for bully beef, biscuits and tunic buttons.

Then, just as twelve months previously, a football suddenly appeared. An impromptu football match began in the scarred shell-torn stretch of ground between the opposing trenches. It was a moment that Bertie Felstead remembered for the rest of his life. "It wasn't a game as such, more of a kick around and free-for-all. There could have been 50 on each side and nobody was keeping score." Another colleague recalled how it ended. "After 30 minutes a vociferous Major appeared yelling 'you came out to fight the Hun not to make friends with them', so our lads reluctantly returned".


Indeed British officers had tried to ensure that the fraternisation of 1914 would not be repeated. Many had ordered artillery bombardments to take place on Christmas Eve together with the threat of wholesale cancellation of leave for the troops.

Nonetheless, the festive spirit still prevailed, although on a far more isolated and reduced scale than the year before. Wilfred Ewart, an officer in the Scots Guards. also recalled a meeting with a Bavarian Infantry Regiment in no-mans land. However, as Sergeant James O'Brien climbed up and out of the trenches onto the parapet, a single shot rang out and O'Brien collapsed and died instantly. Nonetheless, the mingling of the two-sides continued. After an exchange of cigars it was the German Officers who intervened. They announced, "You will have five minutes to get back to your trenches before our artillery will open fire". The Germans were true to their word and the bombardment resumed. For Ewarts unit, the second Christmas truce had ended. He said, "For ten brief, all too brief, minutes there had been peace and goodwill amidst the trenches".

Perhaps in one way the second truce was particularly significant. By Christmas, 1915, the War had been going on for well over a year. The horrors, killing, waste and suffering were firmly established on the Western Front. However, the deep rooted desire for peace still emerged from men on both sides.

Welcome everyone to The London Borough of Barking & Dagenham stadium for today's fixture against Luton Town.

Bowel cancer is the UK's fourth most common cancer, 41,000 new cases each year. It's also the second biggest cause of cancer death. Every 90 minutes three people die of the disease. That's 44 people each day – the equivalent to four football teams – but it needn't be that way.

- If you've had bleeding from the bottom of a persistent change to looser or more frequent bowel movements for the last 3 weeks, tell your doctor. Other symptoms include a pain or lump in your tummy; feeling more tired than usual; losing weight for no obvious reason.
- You're not wasting anyone's time by getting it checked out. If it's not serious, your mind will be eased, but if it is bowel cancer, research suggests that over 90% of patients will survive the disease for more than 5 years if diagnosed at the earliest stage. Hello and welcome back to the treatment room on a very special occasion I suppose, with three old employees coming back to the football club.

They come back in the disguise of Mr Still, Mr Harris and Mr Richardson and I'd like to welcome them back to the home of the Daggers and hopefully they'll be going away empty handed.

On the injury front we have progressed with Zavon and Liam. With Zav, what we've done is put him on a two session course, which involves one day doing specific work, mainly resistant work and on another he'll be doing balance and co-ordination work. Obviously, those days will alternate as we go along. Over the coming week we'll be looking to get his quad tested, in regards to how the strength is coming along and maybe having to adjust his programme accordingly depending on the results.

In Liam's case, he went for an injection into his abductor – where he's been having the problems. This normally works quite well and helps settle it down and he has improved a lot in the last couple of weeks as his symptoms have subsided a lot. He still has got some discomfort in and

around the area that have been troubling him. He'll now have a few days off to rest and then we'll be able to kick on.

Jon Nouble, who had a knee problem went to see Mr John Island who advised us at this moment in time an operation wasn't necessary. Again, he's progressed very well and we have increased his resistance work and his weight programme that he's been on in the last few weeks. Hopefully in the next few days we'll be looking to get him up and running and being more mobile before taking him back to see Mr Island to get him checked out once more.

That's the injury front and it's progressing quite well, and in terms of other things going on around the ground it's been quite quiet again! Even our groundsmen have kept their heads down, they obviously know it's coming to the end of the season and they don't want anything written about them.





Newport County AFC moved to Rodney Parade, the home of Newport Gwent Dragons Rugby Club at the beginning of the 2012/13 season after spending eighteen years at Newport Stadium. On one side is the Bisley Stand that was opened in 2011. This covered all seated stand has a capacity of just over 2,500 seats. Opposite is the much older Hazell Stand which has seating to the rear and terracing to the front. The North End was rebuilt in 2010 and is a small open terrace. At the South End is a small open temporary stand of seating, which is located on one side and runs for only half the width of the pitch. The dressing rooms are situated in the corner of the ground.

DAGGERS FANS

Daggers fans will be housed on one side of the Bisley Stand, where around 580 fans can be accommodated. This stand is all seated and covered and being a relatively new stand the facilities inside are good. The stand is shared with home supporters who are separated by a portion of green netting, draped over the seats. The entrance to the away supporters section is at the opposite end of the stadium to the home areas and is accessed along Corporation Road.

It is literally a small pathway situated in-between some residential houses.



DIRECTIONS BY ROAD:

Leave the M4 at Junction 24 and take the B4237, signposted Newport (E). After approximately 2.5 five miles turn left at a set of traffic lights. signposted B4237 (there is also the George pub on a right hand corner). Go under a bridge and at the next set of traffic lights turn right into Corporation Road. After passing an ATS garage on your right, you will see the away supporters entrance on your left. For the stadium main entrance take the next left into Grafton Road. There is no parking available at the ground for supporters and there is a 'residents only' parking scheme in operation in the street around the stadium. Some street parking is possible but please pay attention to any parking restriction signs. Alternatively you can use one of the city centre car parks which are around a 15 minute walk away.

BY RAIL

Newport station is around a quarter of a mile away from the stadium and is a relatively short walk. The station is served by trains from London Paddington. As you come out of the



main station entrance turn left along the main (Queensway) road. Follow this road until you reach a large roundabout. Take the pedestrian underpass down underneath the roundabout and at the centre turn left towards Clarence Place/River Usk. After you have come back up to street level you should see a bridge in front of you going across the river. Cross the bridge and then take the first right hand turn into Rodney Parade and the stadium is down this road on the left.

BY SUPPORTERS CLUB COACH:

The Supporters Club will be running a coach to this fixture departing Victoria Road at 9am. The price for members is £21 and the coach will be making a 45-minute comfort break on both legs of the journey.
