

GOOD: Ryan Donaldson scores United's second goal

JOHN STILL could not have been more proud of his players but was left ruing the absence of a little bit of FA Cup 'sparkle'. Richard Money's

Cambridge squeezed through to round four thanks to goals from Robbie Simpson and Ryan Donaldson.

Luton gave themselves a lifeline with a Michael Harriman strike 16 minutes from time but could not find the equaliser their efforts deserved. Still (right)

Dunn also did well to deny Harriman before Cambridge took the lead in a madcap moment when Tyler went from villain to

hero and back again. The Luton keeper brought down Donaldson in the box and then saved Simpson's penalty only to see the Cambridge striker slam home the rebound. Jim Stevenson wasted a

golden opportunity for the visitors, but his miss was only half as embarrassing as John Coulson's air shot. Another Luton chance

went begging after the break when Andy Drury fired over, and the Hatters were made to pay. Cambridge wide man

Donaldson, having just ruffled the side netting, made no mistake with his next attempt which he converted with a flourish and in some style. Luton gave

themselves hope after 74 minutes when Harriman headed in from close range.

But Cambridge survived a late onslaught, and Money said: "It's often the case when we play each other that the better team doesn't always win.

"A big money draw would be nice now!'
