

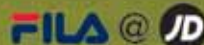

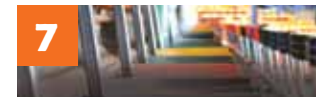

NOTES FROM THE MANAGER

Good evening and welcome to Kenilworth Road for this Johnstone's Paint Trophy first round tie between ourselves and Leyton Orient.

A big welcome to Ian Hendon and his staff and players as well as the directors and supporters of Orient.

Due to the Bank Holiday printing deadlines, I'm writing these notes on Friday afternoon before our game with Portsmouth, but hopefully we have registered an important three points against tough opponents.

Talking of difficult opposition, we face another test tonight in the shape of a Leyton Orient team who have begun the season very well. As I pen this they have won all four of their League 2 matches with a number of eye-catching performances.

Ian has done well to recruit some very good players for this

level and I am sure they will continue their excellent form throughout the campaign. As I always say, though, we want our players playing against good opposition because that in the long run is always beneficial.

Please get behind the lads on duty tonight and I look forward to seeing a packed away end when we go to Cambridge on Saturday. Enjoy the game.

TOWN RECEIVES ANDRE GRAY SELL-ON BOOST

Everyone associated
with Luton Town felt
a sense of pride when
former striker Andre
Gray made the latest
move in his career
when signing for
Burnley last week.

The 24-year-old only left
Kenilworth Road a just over a year
ago for Brentford and capped his
debut season in the Championship
with 18 goals which helped the
Bees reach the Play-Offs.

We had, of course, our own
interest in Andre's next move,
having agreed a sell-on clause in
the transfer that originally took him
to Griffin Park.

Burnley have paid an undisclosed,
record sum to take Gray to Turf
Moor, but we are keen to inform our
supporters of the income we are set
to receive as part of the deal.

We are guaranteed to receive
a shade over £1.1m from the
fee which will be spread over
three seasons; an initial figure
approaching £300,000 followed by
two of just over £400,000 each.

Should Andre contribute to
Burnley's success, resulting in a
successful Premier League spell
then we will also benefit further - to
the tune of up to £700,000.

Hatters chief executive Gary Sweet
told lutontown.co.uk: "Everyone
at the Club takes huge pride in
seeing players who have developed
with us blossom in their careers;
we're absolutely thrilled for Andre



in this case - he's a very honest,
ambitious and hard-working player
who deserves every success.

"We also take great heart from the
kind things he has continued to say
about our Club since his departure.

"Naturally we welcome the
additional income that we have
benefitted from as a result of
Andre's talents, and this will be
utilised in areas that will further
enhance the stability of the Club.

"We would also like to personally
thank those people who played their
part in the scouting and recruitment
process of Andre, as well as those
who have helped develop him into
the player he now is, a development
that I'm sure will continue under
Sean Dyche and alongside former
Hatter Matthew Taylor.

"We wish Andre the very best
of luck at Turf Moor and Burnley
the best of luck in their promotion
campaign."

THE BOSS

IAN HENDON

Head Coach Ian was appointed in May, signing a two-year deal. Hendon had previously been first-team coach at West Ham United during Sam Allardyce's spell with the Hammers. Hendon enjoyed a four-year spell as a player with the O's and also skippered the side during that time.

BETWEEN THE STICKS

ALEX CISAK

Polish stopper Alex was Orient's ninth summer arrival when putting pen-to-paper on a two-year deal. Began his career with Leicester before moves to Oldham. An Australian under-20 international.

IN DEFENCE

SEAN CLOHESSY

Full-back Sean penned a two-year deal with the O's in June 2015 following his departure from Colchester. Started his career at Arsenal before spells at Salisbury and Southend.

FRAZER SHAW

Young left-back joined Orient this summer having been released by West Ham, where he worked under Ian Hendon. Spent 2013/14 season with Dulwich Hamlet, earning an England C call-up.

CONNOR ESSAM

Towering centre-half Connor made the move to Orient in July 2015 following a successful trial at the Club. Started at Gillingham, spent

a short spell on loan here on loan before joining Dover.

ALAN DUNNE

Irish defender Dunne signed a two-year deal with Orient in the summer of 2015, bringing a 23-year relationship with Millwall to an end. Made 388 appearances for the Lions.

MATHIEU BAUDRY

French centre half Mathieu was added to the O's defensive ranks in June 2012 when he joined on a two-year contract following his release by AFC Bournemouth.

THE MEN IN THE MIDDLE

DEAN COX

Attacking midfielder Cox is now Orient's longest serving player having joined in summer 2010 from Brighton. Scored 17 goals in 2013/14, seven last year and already has two this term.

LLOYD JAMES

Former Wales Under-21 international Lloyd penned a two-year deal with the O's in the summer of 2012 after he turned down the chance to stay with fellow League 1 outfit Colchester United.

SAMMY MOORE

Midfielder Sammy joined Leyton Orient in June 2015 as he signed a two-year deal with the club. A youngster at Charlton, Chelsea and Ipswich he then served Stevenage and AFC Wimbledon as a pro.

BLAIR TURGOTT

Former West Ham United winger Blair signed a one-year deal with

Orient in June 2015. An England youth international, he has enjoyed loan spells at Bradford, Colchester, Rotherham and Dagenham.

BRADLEY PRITCHARD

Zimbabwean midfielder Pritchard signed a two-year deal with Orient in June 2014. Made his name in non-league with Hayes & Yeading and Tamworth before joining Charlton, who he helped to promotion.

JOBI McANUFF

Experienced Jamaica international Jobi signed a two-year deal with the O's in July 2014 following his release from Reading. Also served Palace, Cardiff and Watford.

UP FRONT

OLLIE PALMER

Powerful forward Ollie became Orient's fifth summer signing of 2015 when he put pen-to-paper on a two-year deal. Came to prominence with Havant & Waterlooville before joining Mansfield.

PAUL McCALLUM

Striker with three goals to his name already this term, Paul signed a two-year deal with Leyton Orient in June 2015 following his release from West Ham United.

JAY SIMPSON

Tricky forward Jay signed a three-year deal with the O's in July 2014. Another with three goals already this season, he joined Orient following a spell in Thailand with Buriram United.

Club historian ROGER WASH tells the story of the match behind today's programme cover

LUTON TOWN 2 LEYTON ORIENT 1

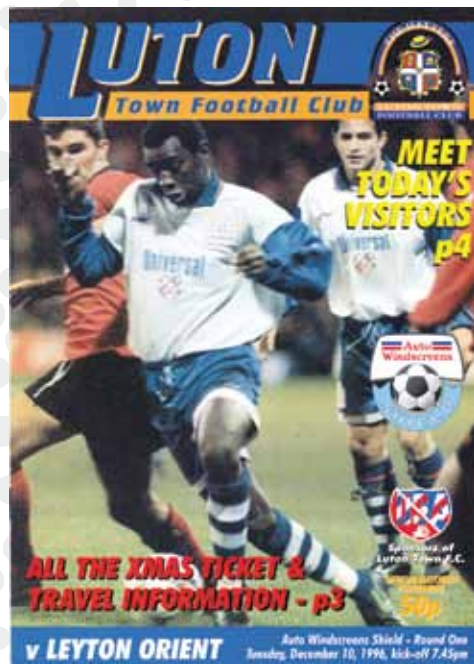
AUTO WINDSCREENS SHIELD
10th DECEMBER 1996

Following relegation from Division One (now the Championship) in 1995/96, the Town were now back in a division they last left in 1970.

After a summer of pruning the wage bill and getting rid of players who had failed to shine at Kenilworth Road, manager Lennie Lawrence felt he had a side, mixing youth and experience, that could make an instant return.

Sadly, his immediate dreams were shattered as the first three League games were lost and it was only after a complete change of tactics that the team began to slowly climb the table.

By early December the team was handily placed in fourth spot, only one point off the top with a game in hand, and it was now time for cup ties to come to the fore with two

home clashes to look forward to.

The Hatters made hard work of overcoming Boreham Wood in the FA Cup with only a late Dwight Marshall strike seeing off the Isthmian League side with the reward a home third round tie with Bolton at Kenilworth Road to set the pulses racing.

Straight after the Boreham Wood clash came our first ever tie in the Associate Members Cup which was now sponsored by Auto Windscreens.

ENTHUSIASM

With Lennie Lawrence letting it be known that this particular competition was way down the pecking order when compared to the League, his lack of enthusiasm caught on and only 1,594, the lowest for a first team competitive game at Kenilworth Road since September 1931 when 1,450 were present to see the Town beat Exeter in torrential rain, were sprinkled around the ground for this low key affair.

The Town made a number of changes to the side, including the return of Kim Grant who had become the target of abuse for his apparent lack of effort, and the first half of the contest was uninspiring stuff with Orient, from the division below, intent on stifling the game with a packed defence.

Against the run of play, and with their first meaningful attack, the O's took the lead on 26 minutes, when a deep cross from the right by Justin Channing was met by a looping header from Colin West. It bounced off the bar and Martin Ling converted from close range.

TOILED

The Hatters attempted to make a fist of it in the second half although Grant and Bontcho Guentchev toiled against the strong Orient rearguard. After a succession of corners it was left to skipper Steve Davis to show his forwards how to do it when he headed in Ceri Hughes' flag kick at the far post after 51 minutes.

The Town went all out for the winner to put us out of our misery and the prospect of extra-time on a cold night, but glaring misses from Grant and Guentchev failed to warm anyone's hearts.

However, just as the game was drawing to a close, up stepped Grant with a winner when he expertly headed home a cross from Paul Showler to send us through to a second round tie at Northampton – which we lost.

"We were delighted to see it go in and remove the possibility of extra-time," said Lawrence afterwards, a thought echoed by 1,500 others!

THE PROGRAMME



The Town produced an eight-page, severely truncated programme for the visit of Orient, priced at 50p.

There was nothing to keep the supporters entertained apart from ticket news, a list of forthcoming matches in Division Two and a page of Orient pen pictures.

My favourite subject – Clubcall – now charged 45p per minute cheap rate and 50p per minute at all other times. What was I thinking of, paying out all that money?

ORIENT, THE HATTERS AND THE JPT IN NUMBERS

FIVE OF THE BEST

When the Hatters recorded a 5-3 win over Orient in December 1935, Bill Boyd scored all five goals. Boyd only played 13 times for the Town in his career but still managed to score 11 goals.

The Town's biggest win over Orient came in an FA Cup first round tie in 1927 at Kenilworth Road. In front of 9,639 the Hatters recorded an emphatic 9-0 win with Jimmy Yardley on target four times.

1906 YEAR OF FIRST MEETING

The two sides met for the first time when Orient were known as Clapton Orient in the 1900s. In what was the Hatters' 456th match, the game ended 1-1 at Kenilworth Road.

1

Number of times the Hatters have lifted the Johnstone's Paint Trophy. The Town won the competition in 2009 with a 3-2 win over Scunthorpe in front of 42,000 Luton fans.

2005

The Town last beat Leyton Orient in a League Cup first round tie in August 2005. The Hatters, then in the Championship, prevailed 3-0 thanks to goals from Chris Coyne, Warren Feeney and a Gary Alexander own goal. Since then Orient have won the last two meetings, which both came in League 1 in 2007/08.



1

The Hatters' meeting with Orient in this competition in December 1996 was also the Town's first match in the competition. The attendance of 1,594 remains the lowest home gate in the Trophy at Kenilworth Road.

The Town were technically the holders of the competition between 2009 up until last year's exit. Why? Well, after the Hatters lifted the JPT they were unable to defend their title following relegation to the Conference

QUICKFIRE

Ahmet Brkovic holds the Luton record for the fastest hat-trick and it came in a 4-3 LDV Vans Trophy win over Stevenage in November 2002. His treble came in just six minutes.

21,312

The largest ever attendance to watch a game between the two clubs came at Brisbane Road when over 20,000 watched a goalless draw in April 1962. That was the season Orient were promoted to the top flight for the first time in their history.

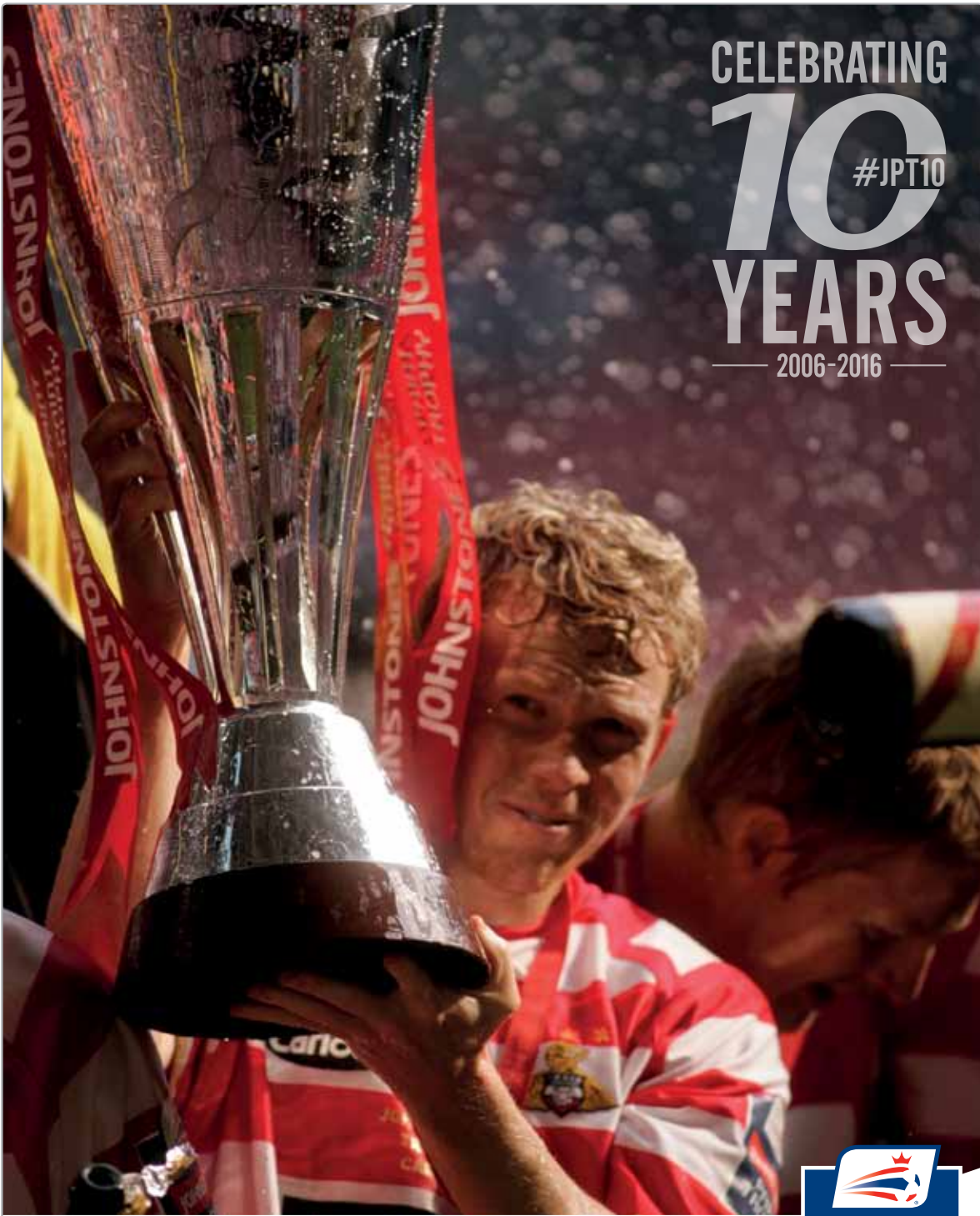

LET'S GO

WHO? Cambridge United, aka The U's, from Cambridge, Cambridgeshire, England. We know plenty about United having constantly watched their results each week as they battled with the Town for the Conference title two seasons ago. A Play-Off final win over Gateshead at Wembley saw the U's join the Hatters back in the Football League and last season their first campaign back in the League saw them finish 19th.

WHERE? The Abbey Stadium – Cambridge's home since 1932 – is under an hour's journey from Luton and approximately a 40-mile trip along the A505. Cambridge is a damn nice city, so why not take time before or after to explore what the streets have to offer? Then again, you could just take it easy, put your feet up and let a coach driver take you there. The Bobbers leave at midday from the Luton Town train station and the fares is £17 for adults and £15 for concessions.

TICKETS PLEASE. Those familiar with the Abbey Stadium set-up will know that the Hatters faithful will be allocated seats in the South Stand, that offer an obstructed, raised view of the action behind the goal.

Remember this tie is all-ticket will no tickets available on the day at Cambridge.

THIS TIME ROUND.

United have recruited well this summer, bringing in the Bury Corr former Hatter Keith Keane – more of him latter – as well as midfielder Luke Berry for a second spell. They started their League 2 campaign well, winning 3-0 on the opening day against Newport and then drawing 4-4 at Carlisle. The U's then won impressively at AFC Wimbledon but in their last home game they were beaten 3-0 at home to Crawley.

HAVEN'T WE MET BEFORE?

Of course! There were no less than four meetings during our title-winning campaign the season before last, with the two clubs also meeting in the FA Trophy, and then three last season. Although the Town finished 19 points clear of United in the title season, the Hatters didn't win any of those four matches. Last season the Town were 1-0 victors in the League 2 meeting back in September last year at the Abbey but then lost in the FA Cup meeting in January. Cambridge were subsequently drawn away to Manchester United!

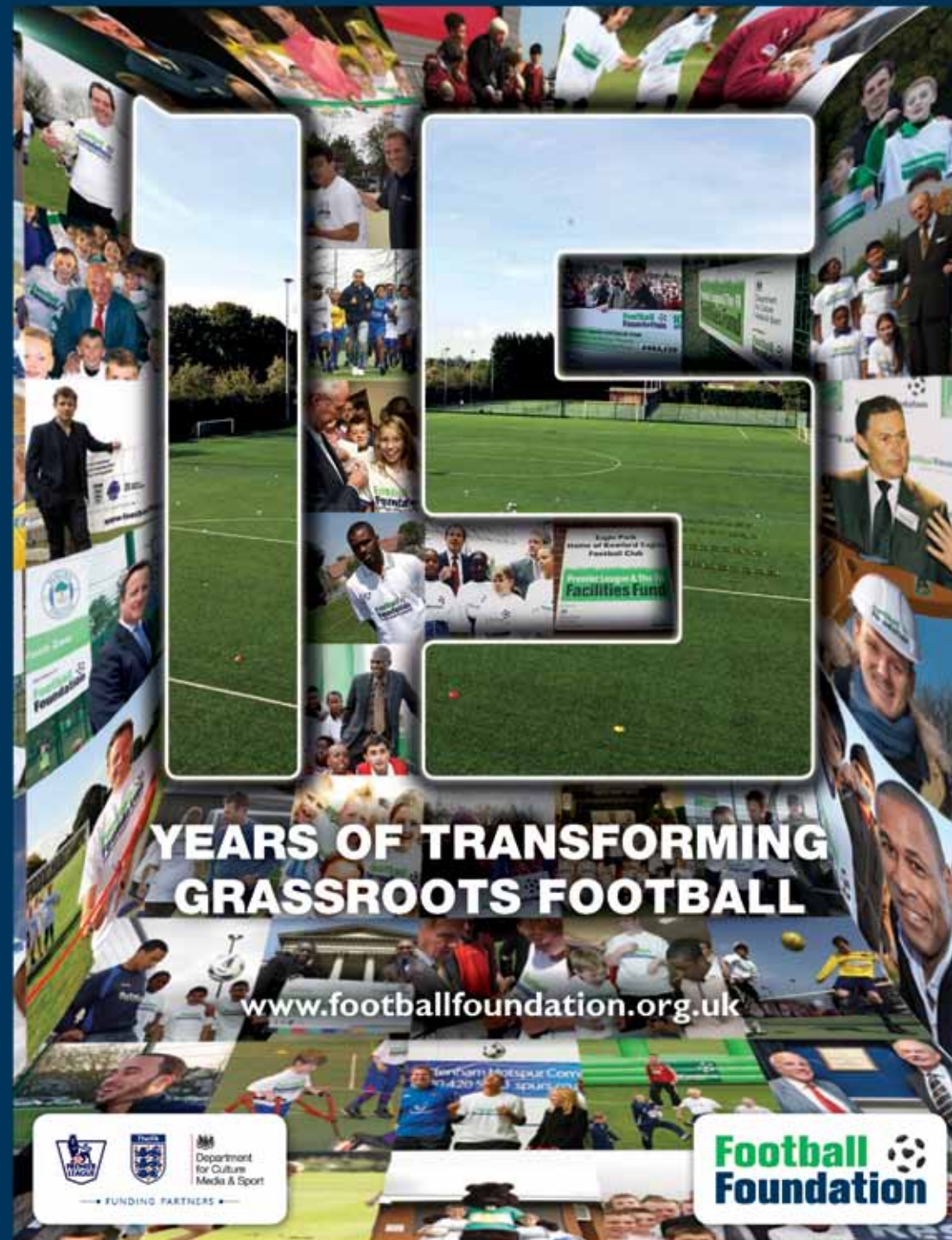
The Hatters gained a modicum of revenge in the second league meeting, winning 3-2 in a thrilling match four weeks later.

OLD BOYS NETWORK.

Plenty of players have appeared for both the Town and Cambridge down the years (almost too many to remember), but one familiar face occupies the Cambridge dugout. Manager Richard Money spent time playing and managing the Town. United also have former Hatters Greg Taylor and Keith Keane in their ranks. Keane joined the U's this summer but is best remembered for his loyal service here at Kenilworth Road where he made 285 appearances. His last game at Kenilworth Road came against the Town for Crawley in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy this time last year.
