

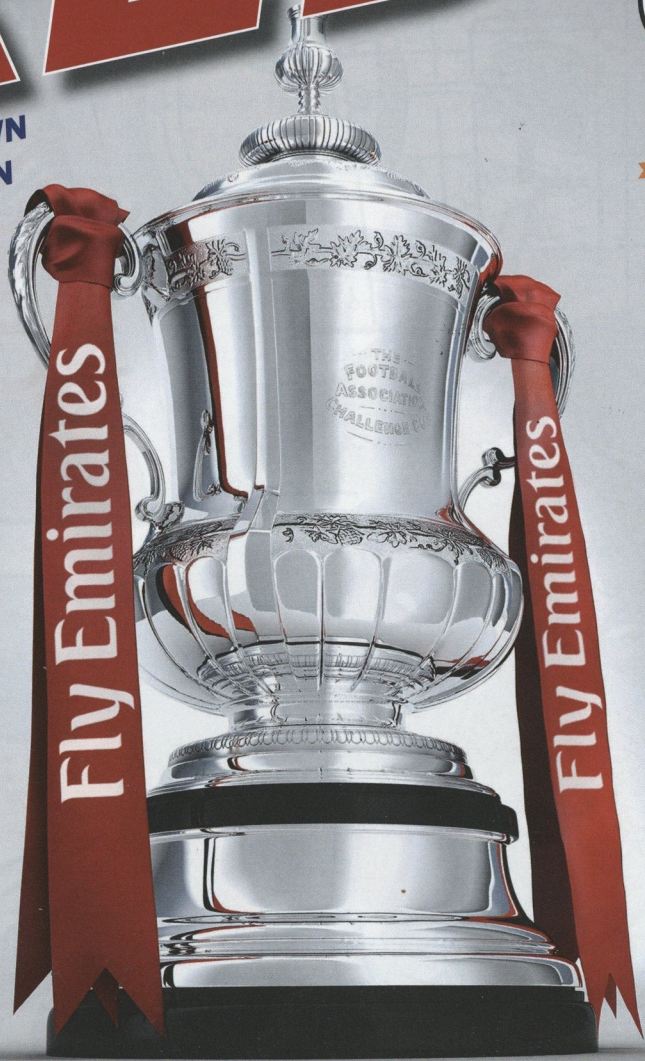

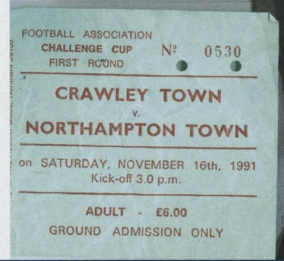
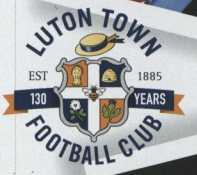

The FA Cup is a great competition. The fans get excited, the players get a break from the league campaign and clubs can make significant sums of money which can help in so many ways.

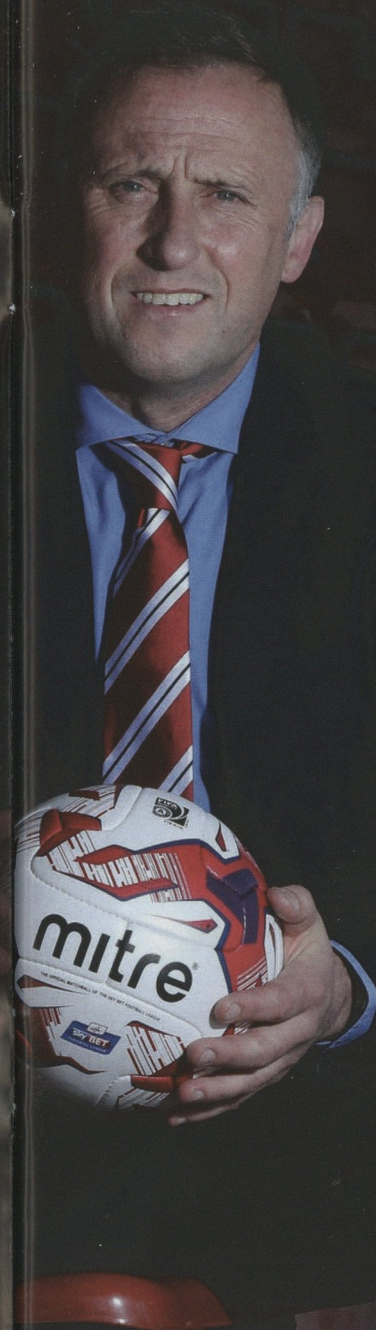

RED LEADER



Good afternoon and welcome to today's FA Cup tie against Luton Town.

To be honest, I didn't know what to feel when the first round draw was made. The priority, of course, was to be at home but there is going to be a familiarity about today's game having played Luton just three weeks ago. That afternoon we turned around a half-time deficit to win 2-1 but I guess Luton will come here today feeling they have a good chance of making progress.

They had a little blip but got a solid 2-0 win at Dagenham & Redbridge in the league last Sunday. Both sides will be well aware of the threats posed by the opposition so it could be quite cagey today, we'll see.

None of the lads were at the club back in 2011 when we played Manchester United in the fifth round but reminders of that day are all around the stadium and rightly so.

In the tunnel area there is a big picture of the two teams walking out in front of a packed Old Trafford and I can't imagine just how much of a buzz the Crawley players had that day. The opposition players always look at that picture as well, imagining what it must be like to play at such a fantastic stadium.

What's sometimes forgotten, of course, is that the club reached the fifth round again the following year. To get that far as a non-

league club and then a League 2 side was a fantastic achievement. A couple of years ago Luton did it when they were in the Conference too. So it is possible, if you work hard, take your chances and get the bounce of the ball, to go far and enjoy those big occasions which everyone - players, management and fans - relish and look back on with fondness for a long time afterwards. That has to be our aim.

Confidence in our camp is high at the moment after five wins in seven but we're certainly not complacent. We only played well in spells against York last Saturday but kept a clean sheet for only the fourth time this season. That was crucial because in tight games you always have a chance of nicking the result as we did with Walts' penalty at the end. As a back five we set a standard last Saturday that we have to maintain if we want to keep progressing, whether it's in the League or the FA Cup.

As always, I'd ask you all to get behind the boys today. Bang the drum, shout and sing and help us get another good result.

Simon sent Scott Flinders the wrong way from the spot and had plenty of time to re-live the moment with his former Hartlepool team-mate after as he was driving Flinders back to Leeds! Former Reds' loan player Scott Griffiths sees today's game as an opportunity to "put things right" after the Hatters lost here in Sky Bet League 2 just three weeks ago.

The 29-year-old (pictured), who played six games on loan at Crawley for Steve Evans in 2011, when he was a Peterborough player, made his first appearance since October 6 in Sunday's 2-0 win at Dagenham & Redbridge, a first win in five which lifted Luton to 13th and within six points of the play-offs.

Dan Potts was in the left-back role for Luton when we played them in the league with Griffiths watching on as goals from Rhys Murphy and Matt Harrold sealed our 2-1 success.

"It didn't look pretty," said Griffiths. "I thought we could have taken more from the game than we did and Saturday is an opportunity to put things right."

Goals from Luke Gutteridge and Alex Lawless – his first for the club – and a first clean sheet since April got Luton back on track against the Daggers last Sunday.

"It was an important game. After not winning for four matches we needed to get three points at Dagenham. The clean sheet was just a bonus for me," said Griffiths.

"We targeted a first clean sheet away from home. We haven't done well enough defensively, considering our clean sheet record last season which was quite good.

"It keeps us in touch. I want to be in a team that earns the right to up straight away, not through the play-offs. The feeling that you get going up as champions is unmatched and that's what I want.

"But, to be honest, I haven't looked at the table yet. I won't do that until the second half of the season. There's no point putting pressure on yourself until the league settles down and that hasn't happened yet."

Griffiths played his part in the clinching second goal for Lawless, whose first start came after seven substitute appearances this season. "I am really pleased for Alex," added Griffiths. "He has worked so hard in training and reserve team games. When I mark

him in training, he never stops running." Manager John Still should be back in the dugout today after watching the second half of last Sunday's match from his old office at Dagenham after he suffered a migraine.



One to Watch

Prolific Luton midfielder Cameron McGeehan is aiming for another goal against Reds today

With seven goals already from midfield this season, and some eye-catching displays as well, Luton schemer Cameron McGeehan is getting the rewards for his brave decision to drop down the leagues to get his career back on track.

The 20-year-old had spells with Chelsea, Norwich and Fulham as a youngster and captained the Canaries in 2013 when they won the FA Youth Cup, beating Chelsea.

Last season he played six games on loan at Cambridge United, including an FA Cup tie against Manchester United, before joining Luton in February when he netted three goals in 15 appearances.

Already this campaign he has scored seven times in 17 games, including Luton's effort in the 2-1 defeat here when the teams played in League 2 three weeks ago.

He has turned down the chance to win more caps at under-21 level for Northern Ireland so he can play for England and Southampton are

among the clubs who are believed to be scouting a player valued at around £1.5 million.

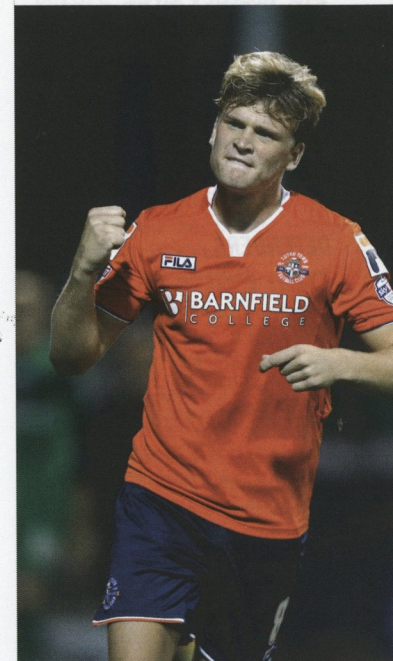
Last season's successful loan spell was his second at Kenilworth Road. In Luton's Conference promotion winning campaign in 2013-14 he played 18 times for the club and scored three goals.

John Still paid an undisclosed six-figure fee for McGeehan when he signed him in July. He didn't make a first-team appearance at Carrow Road.

Still said: "We knew what Cameron is capable of because we'd seen it for the past two seasons. When he signed he wanted to come to Luton, he gets the club, and the fans have really taken to him."

The value of a goalscoring midfielder in League 2 cannot be underestimated and McGeehan admits he may have to revise the target he set earlier in the season of 15 goals.

"The goals are coming, which is nice," he told *Luton on Sunday*. "I want to add a few

longer efforts and a few more smarter goals and we'll see where we are at the end of the season. I said my aim at the beginning was 15 so I'm slowly getting there. If I get to that then I'll have to revisit it and re-evaluate it."

Five of the best

Leigh Edwards profiles five of the biggest names associated with today's visitors

Ricky Hill

England international Hill was Player of the Year when Luton won the Second Division title in 1981-82. He joined Luton in May 1976, was Player of the Year in 1982-83 and starred as Luton were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85. He featured in two Littlewoods Cup finals including the 1988 Wembley triumph and netted 54 goals in 436 games before moving to Le Havre in July 1989.

Brian Stein

England international striker Stein scored twice in Luton Town's 1988 Littlewoods Cup final triumph. He moved to Kenilworth Road from Edgware Town in October 1977, was leading marksman in Luton's 1981-82 Second Division success and also starred as they were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1985 and 1988. After a spell in France he moved back to Luton in July 1991. Voted Player of the Year for the second time in 1992, he netted 130 goals in 427 League games for Luton.

Mick Harford

England international striker Harford played for Luton in consecutive Littlewoods Cup finals including the 1988 Wembley triumph. He signed for Lincoln City in July 1977 and had spells with Newcastle United, Bristol City and Birmingham City prior to joining Luton in 1984. He starred as the Hatters were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1985 and 1988, moving to Derby County in January 1990 and returning to Luton in September 1991. He has since managed the club.

Paul Walsh

England international striker Paul Walsh was capped five times while at Luton Town. After signing for Charlton Athletic in October 1979, he starred in their 1980-81 promotion success and moved to Luton in July 1982. He was 'Player of the Year' in 1982-83 and leading marksman in 1983-84, netting 24 goals in 80 First Division games for the Hatters prior to joining Liverpool in May 1984. After helping them win the League Championship in 1985-86, he joined Tottenham Hotspur in February

1988 and was an FA Cup winner in 1991. He had spells at Portsmouth and Manchester City before injury ended his career and he is now a football agent.

Malcolm Macdonald

Ace marksman Macdonald (pictured below) was capped 14 times by England after leaving Luton Town. After starting out at Tonbridge he joined Fulham in August 1968 and moved to Kenilworth Road in July 1969. He was Luton's top scorer in two consecutive seasons, including the 1969-70 promotion success, and netted 49 goals in 88 League games before joining Newcastle United for £180,000 in 1971. An FA Cup finalist in 1974, he joined Arsenal for £333,000 in 1976 and was an FA Cup finalist in 1978 before injury ended his career.

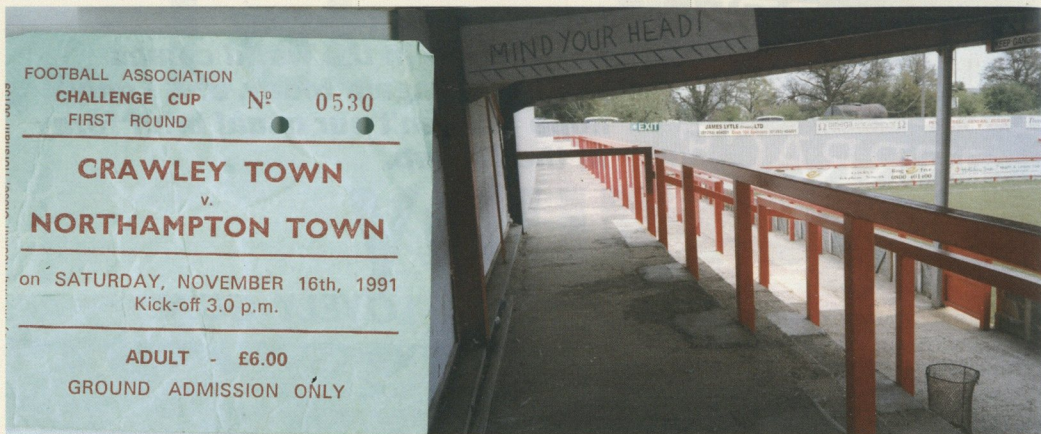

Crawley 2 Hastings United 2

GRAB the ice-packs and aspirin, you Crawley selectors —you've got a grade one headache now.

● The man who drew the cheers as Crawley held the soccer might of Hastings United to a 2-2 draw on Saturday was Roy Stringer, the centre-half who has been given the brush-off by Crawley's team bosses this season.

Roy returned to the senior side on Saturday because Robin Kent the wing-half the selectors have converted into a pivot, was unavailable.

And for a while it looked as if Roy, the only man to play in every Crawley game last season, was going to justify the selectors' move in giving him the first team chop. The golden touch of last season was missing.

In the opening minutes Stringer struggled desperately to regain his timing, his speed and his anticipation. But he struggled successfully. By half-time Roy had turned the corner, and in the second half he commanded the goalmouth with all his old confidence.

Moving on - and with an upcoming Sussex Senior Cup tie against Hastings next week in mind - **I HAVE ADDED A CUTTING (left) THAT ILLUSTRATES HOW OUR CLUBS' FORTUNES HAVE SWITCHED AROUND, WITH US HOLDING THE "MIGHT OF HASTINGS UNITED" TO A 2-2 DRAW IN AUGUST 1957 IN A MET. LEAGUE GAME THE WEEK BEFORE WE LOST 6-1 TO DIDCOT.**

In fact Hastings - as a strong Southern League side in the 1950s - enjoyed some fine performances in the FA Cup including a 4-1 win over Swindon in 1953 before losing to Norwich after a replay. The next season they reached the third round and only lost 2-1 at Sheffield Wednesday before losing 2-1 at home to Notts County, after beating us after

a replay in the third qualifying round, in 1959.

To finish off I have included another **SUSSEX SENIOR CUP CUTTING (above) FROM BY ALL ACCOUNTS A FAIRLY BRUTAL QUARTER-FINAL REPLAY AGAINST HOLDERS WORTHING AT TOWN MEADOW.** Aside from the topical nature of the clip I also wanted to show our "pitch" reverting to its Florida Everglades state (minus the heat and alligators), although that didn't stop Bill Halford from scoring our first goal after good work from Ernie Randall (far right). The report in the Crawley Courier makes this match sound like the worst of a Premier League or Champions League game of today with, according to reporter Mick Honey, "90 minutes of wicked tackling, blatant fouling, skulduggery, skill-less

soccer that must have sickened one of the largest crowds to visit Town Meadow this season". It all sounds pretty exciting fare to me and probably the crowd of around 1,000 enjoyed the blood and thunder but after being 2-0 up at half time we lost 3-2. That's all for this ramble through the past. Come on you Red Devils!

Reds' big striker talks about how Mark Yates have rejuvenated his Reds' career

Look across Mark Yates' side and you can see an even blend of youth and experience. And when you talk about experience in football you don't necessarily mean a 36-year-old with 400 games under his belt. As Mark has pointed out, Mitch Hancox has brought nous to our defence since his arrival on loan from Birmingham even though he has only played around 50 League games.

The manager has worked hard to create an experienced spine in the team and Matt Harrold is relishing his role as the figurehead of the attack after a frustrating first season with the club when his most memorable contribution was arguably as emergency goalkeeper during the second half of the 2-2 draw against MK Dons in January!

"I didn't really play much last season and had a lot of injury problems, plus Izale (McLeod) was played as a lone striker for a large part of the season," said Matt. "It was frustrating as I hadn't had many seasons like that in my career but I feel this season is a turning point for me as I'm performing well and the goals are coming."

Matt, 31, came through Southend United's youth system and played in non-league for Grays Athletic, Wingate & Finchley and Harlow Town before Brentford signed him in 2003. Since then a nomadic career in the lower leagues has seen Matt play for Yeovil Town, former club Southend United and Wycombe Wanderers.

His time with the Chairboys was one of the best of his career. He scored 22 goals before moving on to Shrewsbury Town and then Bristol Rovers, where he notched 18 in the 2011-12 campaign. His hopes of building on that were wrecked by a knee injury the following season and when he was released after Rovers dropped out of the league John Gregory made his move back in July 2014. Returning to the south-east - Matt still lives in Essex - appealed too.

Neither Gregory nor Dean Saunders, who sent Matt out on loan to Cambridge in February, gave him many opportunities but Mark Yates' arrival has reinvigorated his career.

"I think the biggest difference from last season, particularly in recent weeks, is the competition for places we have now. Since joining the club I can't remember this many players missing out on a place for games," he said.

"You come to a game and you see good players sitting in the stands. If that's you it's hard to take obviously, but it leads to everyone pushing each other harder so those of us who are in the team know they have to perform to keep the shirt. There's not been enough of it recently so it can only be healthy for the club and performances."

There is also growing evidence of a good partnership between Matt and Rhys Murphy, who have been paired together in eight games now and scored five goals between them, including one each in our meeting with Luton three weeks ago.

"Building that understanding does take time, but I think we're gelling pretty well now," said Matt. "The way we play is fairly simple. I try and win the ball in the air or bring others into play with my back to goal and Rhys is great at finding pockets of space around me and he's also a very good finisher, although if my goal against Luton doesn't win goal of the month I'll be amazed!"

A repeat of their League exploits in the cup today against the Hatters would not go amiss. "I don't imagine Luton were that delighted when the draw was made, having played them not so long ago," added Matt. "But I think it's a game both teams will feel they can win. We're on a good run at the moment and want to continue that and we know how important an FA Cup run is to a club of our size. I think it's got the makings of a decent cup tie today."

In September we received an email asking for our help in casting a short television documentary for the BBC's Inside Out programme.

They were looking for a couple of Crawley Town football fans, with personality, who would like to go on a theatrical experience for free! They would be taken to a top show and theatrical event in the area to see what they really thought about the UK theatre industry. They didn't have to have a strong interest in theatre but just be willing to try new things and air their opinions. The first name on the list was Joe Comper!

Recent research has shown theatre attendances outnumber football attendances in the UK. Around half the population will visit the theatre at least once a year. Live entertainment is alive and kicking and theatre is a key part of the way many people spend their leisure time from going to the local amateur production to a comedy night, pantomime or a special trip to the West End.

But exclusive data

reveals that while some types of shows are thriving others are struggling to survive, this is despite many theatres changing the way they operate to get "bums on seats" to ensure their own survival. Data taken from 180 theatres over three years showed, amongst other things, that ticket prices are rising above the rate of inflation. This research was now going to be tested to see if Joe could be prised away from football in favour of attending live theatre entertainment.

The producer and camera crew came to Crawley on the 10th October and, firstly, filmed Joe and his wife, Fay on the morning the CTSA football team were playing a home fixture against Leyton Orient Supporters. Joe managed to score a last minute equaliser in front of the cameras and that set the tone for the rest of the day. Joe was then filmed with his brother Ashley and dad Paul at the Leyton Orient game on the afternoon where it couldn't have gone better - what a win that was! A great bit of film showed the



Bruce Winfield Terrace celebrating together! Joe was then taken to Margate, with Fay, to watch a stage show and later in the week, with Dan Palmer, to Lewes to watch the opera. Although Joe enjoyed the stage shows he is not quite willing to give up watching Crawley in favour of them just yet.

If you didn't get chance to see it, you will find the show on BBC iPlayer and it's well worth a watch.

Manager Paul Tisdale has been in charge of the Grecians since October 2008, making him comfortably the longest serving boss in all four divisions.

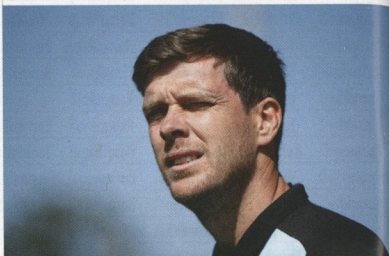
