Tonight we welcome the directors, players and supporters of Luton Town who have made the long journey north, especially for an evening game. I hope they enjoy their stay with us and that we all enjoy an entertaining game similar to the one down at Luton. where we came back to win the game 4-3.

Everyone should be aware that next season there will big changes to the loan system, and whilst work is still going on in the background to keep things similar to the situation at the moment, we can't be too hopeful for a result. Next season we will only be allowed to bring in players when the window is open, and that will only be for season and half-season periods. The only emergency loans I am aware of will be for goalkeepers, so managers and recruitment personnel will have their skills tested to the full as they hunt for loan players.

I do feel that our loan players this season have showed a distinct improvement of those brought in by the previous regime, and so I look forward with confidence to the future. Four players - Hallam Hope, Alex Gilliead, Macaulay Gillesphey and Brandon Comley - have in my opinion all given excellent service to the club and have featured in many games. I do feel they must have benefited from the experience of being with us and I'm sure their clubs will be grateful to us for giving them this invaluable opportunity as they progress their careers.

Progress is being made to bring the stadium and the facilities back to where we were prior to the floods, but probably not as quickly as we would like. However, we are getting there. The structural work on the Neil Centre should be near completion as you read this programme. The final work will be to lay the new surface which, incidentally, is manufactured in West Cumbria. We will inform everyone of its availability at the earliest possible opportunity.

This week we saw the equipment being delivered to the player's gym, so that should be another area complete. Work is being carried out on the two club houses on Warwick Road and they should take approximately four weeks to dry out. I think this should have been done some ago but, unfortunately, the way the insurance company has worked this time round meant the houses were put into phase two - hence the delay.

It was really disappointing to lose the Mansfield game especially after the number of chances we created. This has been the story of some of our recent games and I'm sure Keith and his staff will be looking for improvements in that department otherwise they will be looking for new faces to improve.

I would like to add one special item to my report. A few weeks ago a supporter called Ray Graham gave me a medal and asked me to keep it in the club. I will do that by putting it into the Boardroom trophy cabinet as soon as we have

that room back up and running. The medal was won by united legend Jimmy McConnell, who played 149 games for Carlisle United and scored 124 goals. If anyone can help to solve the mystery of the medal it would be greatly

Meet the Manager

NATHAN JONES





The 42-year-old joined Luton Town as Manager early in January 2016, signing a two-and-ahalf year contract. He joined the Hatters from Championship Brighton & Hove Albion where he had held the position of first team coach. Although this is Jones' first full managerial position, the Welshman has forged himself a fine reputation as a coach and assistant manager. Jones holds a UEFA Pro Licence and last summer helped England Under-21 boss Gareth Southgate prepare the Young Lions for their UEFA Under-21 championship campaign in the Czech Republic. A defender as a player, Jones began his professional career at Kenilworth Road 20 years ago, when David Pleat signed him for £10,000 from Merthyr Tydfil in 1995. After a year at Kenilworth Road Jones left for a 12-month spell in Spain, playing for Numancia and Badaioz, but on his return to the UK Jones went on to enjoy success at Southend, Brighton and Yeovil, making over 500 appearances and winning promotion three times. Success continued to follow after he hung up his boots.


It was with his final club as a player. Yeovil, that Jones began his coaching badges, and in 2009 he became the Glovers' assistant manager. During his time at Huish Park, Jones helped nurture future England internationals Andros Townsend, Steven Caulker and Ryan Mason all of whom had joined Yeovil on-loan from Tottenham. After a brief spell as Under-21s manager at Charlton, Jones was appointed assistant head coach to Oscar Garcia at Brighton in 2013. In his first season at the Amex the Seagulls reached the Championship Play-Off final. Following Garcia's departure, Jones was then named as new boss Sami Hyppia's first team coach but after the Finn's exit in December last season, Jones took over as interim manager and helped the then-struggling Seagulls to four points from two games in the Championship. Despite another change in manager at the Amex, Jones was kept on by the newest man in the hotseat and became Chris Hughton's first team coach - a position he has held until his arrival at Kenilworth Road.

A double substitution after the break provided the spark for Carlisle United which took them on to an amazing victory which saw them come from two goals behind to grab three dramatic matchwinning goals.

The Hatters looked bright from the off as they passed the ball on the edge of the United box but it was the visitors who created the first opening when Asamoah tricked his way behind the back line. His cross was met by Miller but he couldn't keep his header down and it flew

Luton used their goal kick to good effect when Lawless picked the loose ball up in midfield. He fed it to Marriott and the former-Carlisle loanee made no mistake as he took a touch, spun and thumped an unstoppable shot into the back of the net.

Green was next to try his luck with a long range rasper which zipped over the target, but Carlisle

almost grabbed an equaliser courtesy of a long throw from Ellis. A ricochet invited Miller to shoot but Tyler dived low to complete a fantastic save.

The visitors suddenly looked the better side and a glancing header from Raynes found Ellis with time at the back post. He put his head in his hands as he lobbed the ball into the stands as Tyler crept off his line. It was one-way traffic and the Luton keeper had to use quick feet to beat another Raynes head from under his bar as it threatened to creep over the line.

Carlisle kept the momentum up and a run from deep from Hery allowed Asamoah to go on the overlap. It was more good defending as Cuthbert dropped low to stop Wyke from applying the finishing touch.

For all the good work, Carlisle were almost undone again when Marriott showed good close control from a precise through ball. His left-

> But it was the Cumbrians who had the last say of the half when a long ball over the top from Joyce found Wyke with just one man to evade. His first touch set it up and he left Tyler with no chance as he picked his spot in the bottom corner with a well executed finish.

The visitors were rocked back on their heels with just 56 seconds on the second half clock when a measured ball from Green which fell into the box was allowed to go unchallenged. Josh McQuoid sprinted between two defenders and the slightest of touches was enough to take it past Gillespie.

An intricate free kick routine involving Grainger and Joyce resulted in the latter

drilling a low shot at Tyler, but it was disaster at the other end when Green was felled by Hery just 22-yards out. The lively wide man picked himself up to take the free kick and he got a second bite at the cherry as his first effort spooned up off the wall. A hopeful volley took a slight deflection and it spun awkwardly as it dropped in off the post.

It took substitute Alex Gilliead just three minutes to make his mark

when the Cumbrians battled for the ball inside the Luton area. It eventually broke free and the youngster kept his cool to gain his bearings before smashing his shot past Tyler to bring his side right back into the game.


The away pressure levels increased and Ibehre crunched a header from a Grainger free kick over the bar, and he also had one ruled out for offside when he reacted first to beat Tyler as he palmed a Grainger volley back into the mix.

Patient build-up play brought a cut back from Kennedy and Joyce let fly with a shot which hit a

defender and went behind for a corner. A half clearance followed from the delivery and the second equaliser of the night arrived when Jabo Ibehre kept his eye on a bouncing ball to snatch his eleventh of the season with a fine strike.

The game was turned on its head just 60 seconds later when Derek Asamoah went on a run across the edge of the area. He had only one thing in mind as he sent a wonderful effort past Tyler's full length dive.

Good evening and welcome to today's match.

This evening's visitors are Luton Town who recently have had goalkeeper Jonathan Mitchell recalled from Derby County. Mitchell made five appearances for the Hatters this season after joining the club on an emergency loan at the beginning of March. Meanwhile, 18-year-old goalkeeper Craig King, who has yet to make a senior appearance for Luton, has subsequently been recalled from his loan spell at Bishop's Stortford.

Luton have signed centre-back Glen Rea from Championship side Brighton & Hove Albion on loan until the end of the season. The twenty-one year-old made his senior Albion debut in August's League Cup tie against Southend, for whom he went on to play 16 games for on loan earlier this term." Glen is somebody we've had on our radar," Luton boss **Nathan Jones** told the club website: "Obviously he's someone who I know very well having worked with him for the best part of two and a half years."Rea and Jones were colleagues during the latter's spell as first-team coach at the Amex Stadium.

At the beginning of the month, Northampton Town chairman Kelvin **Thomas** spoke of the need for patience as the Cobblers move towards promotion. "We have to be patient and we feel it will come," Thomas told BBC Radio Northampton. "It just feels like the line has been there a long time and we just want to get over it." Talking about the clash with Bristol Rovers, he continued, "We know this is a massive game. It's probably a bigger game because of the run Bristol Rovers are on. That (winning the league) is what the goal is. It would take a momentous effort from two or three other teams now, who would basically have to win every game. I pinch myself every day when I wake up," he added. "Football always takes a bit of luck, but in reality there has been a lot of hard work behind it as well."

Yeovil Town manager **Darren Way** has signed a new three-year contract with the club. He was appointed on 31 December after six games as interim boss, when the Glovers were the Football League's bottom club, having taken over following the departure of former manager Paul Sturrock. At the time of writing, Way's side had lost just three of their 16 league games since and had climbed to 19th in the table, 14 points clear of the relegation zone. Way, whose previous contract had been due to expire this summer, was part of the Yeovil team that reached the Football League in 2003 and he went on to total 273 appearances for the club. His career, however, was ended after a car crash in February 2010 and he subsequently joined the Somerset club's coaching team. "We have found an extraordinary leader and manager in Darren, who has the full backing of everyone at Huish Park, not only to build a squad, but a club that will achieve and sustain League One status within the next five seasons," chairman John Fry told the club website. Way added: "I feel very proud and honoured to have signed a new contract. I have a vision for the club where I can nurture the future talent; this is a fantastic football club to build a future for and I will take 100% responsibility in making sure I do that."


