FROM THE BOARDROOM

WITH CHAIRMAN DAVID WILKINSON

Today we welcome the officials, players and supporters from Barnsley for our first contest of 2019.

Having been relegated from the Championship last season, the Tykes began the campaign as one of the favourites along with Sunderland to bounce straight back, and watching them against us at Oakwell it was not difficult to see why. Although we were deprived of a possible point or three by a couple of dodgy decisions, we felt they were the better side on the day. Since that day in October we have been unbeaten, picking up 31 points in 11 games.

We follow the Evolution Stats, which have shown us at No.1 all season, so far, save for a small blip after the defeat at Oakwell.

It's not all about statistics or form tables though. We are playing exciting football, scoring spectacular goals and keeping impressive clean sheets. It has never been easy to pick ONE man of the match and quite often as I'm driving home I think to myself 'it's been everyone today', including the 'game changers.'

Influence

This month sees us mainly with a reverse of the fixtures in August, with Peterborough and Portsmouth at home and Sunderland away following today's game, not to mention a trip to Hillsborough to face Sheffield Wednesday in the FA Cup third round. A tough schedule in anyone's book.

In the history of the Club we have seen more ups and downs than any other. Momentum has been a major influence in both directions. We have been from the top to the bottom and the bottom to the top several times over. In the past we've had periods of rapid progress culminating in successive promotions and there is a sense that this may be happening once again.

We talk about present management in the same breath as Alec Stock, Harry Haslam and David Pleat and compare current players with stars from the past. Personality and character sometimes seem to be missing from the modern game, but we seem to have it in abundance starting with the boss.

Amazing

Then there's you, the passionate 'mad' Hatters. You stuck with us through the dark days of the Conference, occasionally letting your frustrations show, but that was nothing we weren't feeling too. Now we are taking maximum allocations and travelling in vast numbers – as I write, we have just announced that we have sold out for Walsall and filled our first release for Sheffield Wednesday. You are amazing. We on the board are never happier than when we get in amongst you to share in the enthusiasm and excitement.

We are told that January is also the month for LBC Planning Committee meetings to determine our applications at Power Court and Newlands Park. These are probably the most important decisions in the Club's 134-year history. We have what we need except for a stadium, which is fit for purpose. You continually demonstrate that we have the fan base. I believe we have the management both on and off the field. We are striving to be the best we can. We handle adversity, but now is our time and we can take our Town with us. The Board and its allies are a diverse group with knowledge and experience in



WELCOME BARNSLEY



The Hatters would like to extend a warm welcome to the visiting staff, players and supporters of Barnsley.

We've already pitted our wits against the Tykes this season, with Daniel Stendel's side running out 3-2 winners in a thoroughly entertaining afternoon at Oakwell back in October. A lot of Town supporters left that day saying Barnsley were the best side they had seen the Hatters face this season in league action – with that win moving the Reds up to third, whilst Town slipped down to tenth.

There's been quite a bit of movement in the table since that day – notably, the Hatters moving above Barnsley – their form waned with two consecutive defeats in the games that followed, recovering with three straight wins, but then found themselves on a run of four games without victory that saw them slip out of the play-offs all together before festive wins over Blackpool and Peterborough.

For a side that are aiming to get back into the second tier at the first attempt, they will be looking to put a winning run together. They boast a fantastic squad, with a particularly strong spine (which you can read about on our player profiles pages), including former Hatter Cameron McGeehan.

He needs no real introduction at Kenilworth Road – especially after scoring against us back in October

– after making 106 appearances for the Hatters, scoring 31 goals and helping win promotion back into the League in 2014. He joined the Tykes after missing the last six months for us with a broken leg, and he struggled to make an impact at Oakwell, heading out on loan to Scunthorpe United. However, he has broken into Stendel's side this campaign and is a shining light in their midfield, sure to receive a warm welcome back from the Kenny faithful this afternoon.

The club has bounced between the Championship and League One a couple of times over recent years, their relegation last season bringing an end to a two-season spell in the second tier. Once a Premier League side, albeit for a single season, the club have more recently won the Football League Trophy (2015/16) – with Danny Hylton heading in a superb goal for the side the Reds defeated that day, Oxford United.

This next month could prove to be of great importance to the Reds, as after today they face Oxford, Bradford, Wimbledon and Rochdale – all teams who find themselves either in a relegation scrap or down in the bottom half of the table.

THE GAFFER

Daniel Stendel | Age: 44

Took over: June 2018

A fairly successful striker during his playing career. Stendel spent his

entire career in Germany, with the likes of SV Meppen and Hannover 96, netting over 100 career goals. After hanging his boots up, he worked his way up the coaching ladder with Die Roten, going from Under-19 coach to first team head coach in April 2016. Although he had a fantastic record there, winning exactly 50 per cent of his 34 games, he was sacked 11 months later. He took over at Oakwell in June and has seen a bit of a revolution, his side playing an excellent brand of football as they look to go back up to the second tier at the first attempt.



GOALKEEPER JACK WALTON **AGE: 20**

Joined Barnslev aged 15 from Bolton Wanderers, going onto make his Championship debut for the club last season.

Signed from Rennes in the summer transfer window of 2017. A former France Under-20 who now represents Guadeloupe.




DID YOU KNOW?

CLASSIC CLASH WITH THE TYKES

CLUB HISTORIAN ROGER WASH DELVES INTO HIS ARCHIVES...

2ND OCTOBER 1993 • LUTON TOWN 5 BARNSLEY 0

After surviving a second successive relegation by the skins of our teeth at the end of 1992/93, we all gathered our breath and waited for a summer of comings and goings on the playing side as manager David Pleat made plans to make sure that seasons of struggle were a thing of the past.

Surprisingly the close season proved relatively uneventful. Phil Gray, desperate to move to the north-east for family reasons, got his dream transfer to Sunderland, but a large chunk of the £800,000 received by the Town had to be paid to Tottenham as part of the arrangement when he moved from White Hart Lane to Kenilworth Road two years previously.

Also on his way to Sunderland was goalkeeper Alec Chamberlain in a move which today would almost be called a 'Bosman'. League regulations stated that a player, at the end of his contract, could not be offered lesser terms otherwise he would be entitled to a free transfer.

Pleat was anxious to get the wage bill down, especially with many players still on Division One (now Premier League) terms, and with Chamberlain being one of these the goalkeeper accepted Sunderland's offer and left Kenilworth Road on a 'technicality'.

The opening game of the new campaign pitted the Town against their near neighbours Watford at Kenilworth Road and a crowd of 9,149 turned out on a sunny day hoping for better fare than had been served up over the past couple of years.

They were treated to a 2-1 win against a ten-man side, but although a victory over the old enemy was always gratefully received, most Luton supporters

were not convinced by the performance and predicted another season of struggle with the lack of a reliable goalscorer the main cause for concern.

A 1-0 defeat at Portsmouth was followed by reversals at home to Nottingham Forest and newly promoted Bolton before experienced campaigner Alan Harper was drafted in on a free from Everton. He was left shell shocked on his debut though as the Town went down 4-1 at Tranmere, although it must be said that the game was a lot closer than the scoreline suggests.

Draws at both Middlesbrough and Birmingham did little to appease the fans and there was talk of a major boycott for the next game, at home to Barnsley, as the Hatters slipped to bottom place in the league.

Amazing

Only 6,201 turned up for Barnsley's visit, the lowest league attendance at Kenilworth Road since 1979, and with Kerry Dixon still missing through injury, the Town were parading the youngest forward line in their history which naturally needed all the terrace support it could gather.

The game got off to an amazing start when, after three minutes, full-back Julian James intercepted a pass and broke over the halfway line before being clattered by Barnsley skipper and centre-half, Gerry Taggart.

After a long break, while both players were attended to, the referee sent Taggart off and immediately Luton supporters thoughts went back to the opening day of the season when the Town found it so difficult to overcome a depleted side.

This time, though, the Hatters
were not about to surrender the
initiative and aided by a superb performance from
Ceri Hughes tore into the Barnsley rearguard.

Still smarting from a last-minute miss at Birmingham the previous week, Hughes put on his best display for three years and set up Hartson for the opener after 28 minutes, although the big BARNSLEY PC

striker still had two players to beat before putting the ball in the net.

Another brilliant long ball from Hughes ended up with Oakes scoring the important second goal just before the interval, and when James burst through to smack in the third on the hour, the game was as good as over.

No supporter could remember the last time the Town had made a numerical superiority count and when substitute Scott Houghton and then Oakes again netted late goals to make the final score 5-0, thoughts of a further boycott rapidly disappeared.

THE LAST TIME BARNSLEY CAME TO TOWN

CLUB HISTORIAN ROGER WASH REPORTS ON THE TYKES' LAST VISIT TO KENILWORTH ROAD

20TH JANUARY 2007 • LUTON TOWN O BARNSLEY 2

CHAMPIONSHIP

Storm clouds were rumbling over Kenilworth Road in this, our second season in the Championship. Influential skipper Kevin Nicholls and top scorer Steve Howard had been sold over the summer of 2006 without adequate replacements, and during the January 2007 window Rowan Vine and Carlos Edwards had departed in exchange for £4 million.

Where had all the money gone, asked the supporters?

Yet, surprisingly, the season had started brightly and after 13 games, following a 5-1 home thumping of Leeds, the Town sat in fifth position. It all went horribly wrong after this though as the next 15 games yielded just nine points and by the time of the visit of Barnsley we were hovering just above the relegation places.

A lowest of the season crowd of 7,441 turned out to see a clash between two struggling sides with the Tykes having won only one in eight.

The game got off to the worst possible start as far as the Town were concerned with Barnsley taking the lead in the seventh minute. Having lost the ball

in midfield, the Hatters were rocked when a swift counter attacking move saw Brian Howard net from 16 yards.

The Town huffed and puffed after that with the loss of both Warren Feeney and Leon Barnett, both to knee injuries, not helping matters in a lifeless and listless performance.

Barnsley were content to sit on their lead relatively untroubled and got the bonus of a second goal right at the death when Martin Devaney rifled home after another fast raid on the Luton goal.

Luton manager Mike Newell was not too downhearted afterwards and confirmed: "It wasn't our day in any department but I don't worry about things, but just get on with it."




October 1965


December 1967

DEADLY DUOS

FOOTBALL HISTORIAN LEIGH EDWARDS PROFILES FOUR NOTABLE POST-WAR BARNSLEY GOALSCORING PARTNERSHIPS

LOL CHAPPELL & BOBBY BROWN

Centre-forward Lol Chappell was leading marksman in Barnsley's 1954-55 Third Division (North) title triumph. Born locally, he impressed with Birdwell Rovers before moving to Oakwell in May 1949. He formed a lethal partnership with Bobby Brown as Barnsley narrowly failed to regain Second Division status at the first attempt in 1953-54. Top scorer again in 1957-58 and 1958-59, he netted 94 goals in 218 League games for the Tykes prior to joining Doncaster Rovers in August 1959.

He later played for Bath City, Bideford and was Barnstaple Town's player-manager, then worked in insurance and died in February 1988.

Scottish inside-left Bobby Brown starred in Barnsley's 1954-55 Third Division (North) title success. Initially with Glasgow Perthshire, he served in the Black Watch regiment, joining Derby County in October 1947. He moved to Southend United in July 1948 and reunited with Sammy Crooks at Shrewsbury in July 1950. Leading marksman in 1950-51, he rejoined Tim Ward at Barnsley in July 1953. Twice top scorer, he netted 55 goals in 120 League games, moving to Rotherham in September 1956.

Later with King's Lynn, Scarborough and Selby, he worked at Rotherham and Doncaster power stations and died in January 2005.

TREVOR AYLOTT & RONNIE GLAVIN

Striker Trevor Aylott starred as Barnsley won promotion and reached the FA Cup fifth round in 1980-81. Starting at Chelsea, he moved to Barnsley for £50,000 in November 1979 and netted 26 goals in 96 League games.

He joined Millwall in August 1982 and moved via Luton Town to Crystal Palace in July 1984 and was top scorer in 1984-85. Moving to AFC Bournemouth in August 1986, he was a key figure in their 1986-87 Third Division title triumph and 1988-89 FA Cup run, moving to Birmingham City for £40,000 in October 1990. Later with Oxford United, Gillingham and Bromley, he is now a London black cab driver.

Scotland international midfielder Ronnie Glavin was Barnsley's leading goalscorer on three occasions. Starting with Partick Thistle, he joined Celtic in November 1974 and helped twice win the Scottish league title. He moved to Oakwell in June 1979 and starred as the Tykes won promotion and reached the FA Cup fifth round in 1980-81. Joining Belenenses in August 1984, he returned to Barnsley as player-coach in July 1985 and netted 73 goals in 182 League games overall for the Tykes before moving to Stockport County in August 1986. He has since had spells as manager of Frickley, Worksop Town, Emley and Wakefield.

NEIL REDFEARN & JOHN HENDRIE

Neil Redfearn was top scorer as Barnsley reached the Premier League in 1996-97. Signing professional for Bolton Wanderers in June 1982, he had spells with Lincoln City, Doncaster Rovers, Crystal Palace and Watford prior to joining Oldham Athletic in January 1990. He starred as they were FA Cup semi-finalists that season and won the Second Division title in 1990-91, moving to Barnsley in September 1992.

Scoring 71 goals in 292 League games before joining Charlton Athletic in July 1998, he then played for Bradford City, Wigan Athletic and Halifax Town. He has managed Scarborough, Northwich, Leeds and Rotherham.

Goalscoring winger John Hendrie was 'Player of the Year' as Barnsley reached the Premier League in 1996-97. Initially with Coventry City, he joined Bradford City in July 1984 and was ever-present three times including their 1984-85 Third Division title triumph, moving to Newcastle United in June 1988. He joined Leeds United in June 1989 and helped them to win the Second Division title in 1989-90, then moved to Middlesbrough in June 1990 and featured in their 1994-95 First Division title triumph. Joining Barnsley in October 1996, he had a spell as player-boss and netted 17 goals in 65 League games while at Oakwell.



CRAIG HIGNETT & NEIL SHIPPERLEY

Striker Craig Hignett was top scorer as Barnsley reached the First Division play-off final in 1999-2000. A former Liverpool apprentice, he moved to Crewe Alexandra in May 1988 and starred as they qualified for the Fourth Division play-offs in 1991-92.

He joined Middlesbrough for £500,000 in November 1992 and featured in two promotion campaigns, then moved via Aberdeen to Barnsley in November 1998. Scoring 28 goals in 68 League games, he was sold to Blackburn Rovers for £2.25m in July 2000. Helping them win promotion in 2000-01 and the League Cup in 2002, he later played for Leicester City and Darlington.

Former England U-21 striker Neil Shipperley starred as Barnsley were First Division play-off finalists in 1999-2000. The son of former Gillingham defender Dave Shipperley, he began with Chelsea and joined Southampton for £1.2m in January 1995. He was sold to Crystal Palace for £1m in October 1996 and helped win promotion in 1996-97. Following Dave Bassett from Nottingham Forest to Barnsley in July 1999, he netted 27 goals in 78 League games before joining Wimbledon in July 2001. He won promotion again with Palace in 2003-04 and Sheffield United in 2005-06, then played for Brentford.







Two of the Hatters' talented second-year scholars have moved into Non-League football for a month to gain valuable senior experience.

Striker Connor Tomlinson was the first to make the move, joining Vanarama National League South side Hemel Hempstead Town on a onemonth youth loan on Friday December 14th.

Tomlinson, who has 20 goals to his name so far this season for the Under-18s and Development sides, made his debut in their FA Trophy win over National League side Eastleigh and stands to gain valuable senior experience as the Tudors push to break into the play-off places.

A division below in the Pyramid, Drew Richardson has made a similar switch to Harlow Town as they look to climb out of the Bostik League Premier Division's relegation zone.

The 17-year-old joined up with the Hawks on Christmas Eve, after a pre-arranged move to Bognor Regis Town was not sanctioned by the governing bodies and these new opportunity became available.

He was in the Essex club's squad for their local derby against Bishop's Stortford on Boxing Day and will stay at the Harlow Arena for a month.

Academy & Development manager Andy Awford said: "Harlow is a good club for Drew to go to gain experience of men's football and playing for points on a Saturday, just as Hemel is for Connor.

"With both moves the lads have joined clubs where we know who they are going to be working with, and what kind of environment they are going into, which is crucial when we choose to send them out on loan.

"We'll be keeping a close eye on both players' progress as they enter an important stage in their career development, and they will continue to train with us at The Brache on a daily basis."

LUTON TOWN IN THE CONTINUETY

COMMUNITY TRUST ANNUAL REVIEW 2018

Another great year at the Trust which has seen further growth in both personnel and location, together with an increase in the number of varied football and non-football projects we deliver to our local community.

As a registered charity our role is to represent the Club in the wider community using the power of football to be at the heart of our community. We rely on raising our own funds through both our coaching activities and grant funding from the EFL Trust, Premier League and PFA with support from the Club, first team players and our main sponsor easyJet.

Additional partnerships with the Home Office, Heritage Lottery Fund, Luton Adult Learning, Wembley National Stadium Trust and the Laureus Foundation and has enabled us to both expand our existing activities and begin lots of new and exciting projects and collaborations locally.

We now provide over 70 free PE lessons every week to over 2,000 local school children as part of the Premier League Primary Stars Project and easyjet Free Schools Visit Project. Lessons include both reading and numeracy modules in the classroom

as well as PE lessons, and of course we offer mentoring support to school staff who deliver PE. Last year we celebrated a landmark with easyJet after reaching a staggering 50,000 individual children who have benefitted from our free schools project in this year we celebrated our ten-year partnership.

Our girls-only coaching continues to increase with support from our Premier League Girls funded project allowing us to appoint a full-time Girls Football Development Officer last year, with the number of girls taking part in football sessions growing as part of a five-year strategy of offering girls the same opportunity as boys to be involved with the Hatters.

Our involvement in Disability Football continues to prove hugely rewarding for both staff and participants, and as well as our two adult teams, the Hatters and Boaters, who had a successful season finishing runners-up in one of their leagues this year. Thanks to continued support from the Wembley National Stadium Trust and EFL Trust we continue to coach weekly sessions at many of the special educational needs schools in Luton and

Bedfordshire as part of our 'Every Player Counts' project.

Our Skills Performance and Development Centres also continues to perform well with over 600 recruited boys in the system attending 16 weekly centres. Boys trialling and now playing for the schoolboy academy are approaching double figures already this season and we continue to support the recruitment of talented local youngsters into the Club.

We also increased our football tournaments this year with the Hatters Cup involving 1,200 youngsters playing at Kenilworth Road in May, as well as also involving hundreds of additional youngsters in the national Girls U13 and Kids U11 Cups.

We also held our Luton Street League Integration Cup at the stadium as part of our Community Led Local Development project with the Council which forms an important part of our integration sport, training and employment project with the help of the European Social Fund.

Thanks to the Heritage Lottery Fund we began our task of taking the Hatters history into local schools. and with lots of research and development of this new project we are really excited about the potential results next year when we begin our delivery into schools.

We also received a major boost for our Over-50s walking footballers with a donation from Bedfordshire Masons, and this will allow us to open additional centres across the County. Our partnership with Luton Adult Learning continues to grow as we provide community learning opportunities to unemployed adults in Luton. 

WHO?

A club with such a rich history, they nearly made a Premier League return both in the 2015/16 campaign and the following year, missing out both times as they were defeated in the play-offs. They spent eight consecutive seasons in the top tier, before suffering relegation in 2000. Their slump continued and they have had spells in League One. They have won the FA Cup on three occasions, the most recent of those was in 1935, whilst they were runners up in 1993.

STADIUM - HILLSBOROUGH

An old ground with plenty of character, Hillsborough can host up to nearly 40,000 supporters. Their record attendance came when they played Manchester United in 2000, when 39,640 fans filled the ground. Even when they were in the lower reaches of the EFL, they still averaged crowds of over 23,000 – their League One campaign in 2004/05. Built in 1899, it was originally known as the Owlerton Stadium, before it was renamed after ground improvements.

HAVEN'T WE MET BEFORE?

Town have taken on Wednesday on 57 occasions, our last was a 3-2 win against them in 2007, when Bjorn Runstrom and Drew Talbot got on the

scoresheet, as well as a Tommy Spurr own goal. Of those 57 games, the Hatters have won 16 times, drawn 20 and lost on 21 occasions.

RESULTS SO FAR

The Owls' Emirates FA Cup journey for this campaign starts on Saturday, so there's not much to report on, on that front. Their league form has been a bit topsy-turvy – long runs without victory since October have seen Wednesday slip down the table, and a relegation battle appeared to be looming, until successive 1-0 wins over Christmas have followed the sacking of Jos Luhukay as manager on Friday 21st December.

KNOWING ME. KNOWING YOU

Midfielder Peter Holmes left Sheffield Wednesday in 2000, signing for the Hatters, where he spent seven years, playing 127 times in total and netting 12 goals. He departed for Rotherham United, before going into Non-League football, turning out for the likes of Dunstable Town and Hemel Hempstead Town. Jon Shaw was another Owls academy graduate – the striker failed to really make the breakthrough at Hillsborough and made a name for himself as a Conference striker, signing for the Hatters in 2012, going onto make 51 appearances and scoring ten times.
