In terms of the performance, I thought we were outstanding from start to finish. We'd been on a difficult recent run in terms of results, but I thought we were excellent in both the QPR and Forest games, and were unfortunate to only have one point to show for it.

We knew we had to defend our box better than we had against Cardiff, and the lads did that superbly with Sheasy making a couple of terrific saves when he was needed and we then took our chances when they came along to head into today in a good place.

As this is our last home game before Boxing Day, I would like to wish you all a Merry Christmas. Hopefully we can all enjoy it a bit more than last year, together with our families, but please stay safe and we look forward to seeing you for another sell-out against Bristol City.

NOTES FROM THE BOARDROOM

Good afternoon, and it's a warm welcome on a cold day for Fulham supporters and Marco Silva and his staff and players.

Today we take on the table-toppers, the highest scorers, and the meanest defence. That is some record after 21 games and I'm sure we will see an end-to-end game full of excitement.

The league remains extremely tight where any score predictions are impossible. This is proper competition and we wouldn't have it any other way. We may be seen as a minnow by many, but your support bolsters us to be able to punch far higher than our ability to spend would suggest.

Talking of expenditure, some of you will have seen the next steps being taken by Tracy Crouch MP in her drive (in conjunction with some clubs and most fans) to ensure the stability and security of our national sport. Of course there is a long way to go, but it is heartening to see real discussion on things like parachute payments and the division of monies to the grass-roots of the game. These issues have always been of concern to clubs like ourselves.

We have never had an issue with clubs being able to spend large sums on transfers and wages, because there are some clubs that have those means through their very large supporter bases and commercial revenue streams. Where a club has excelled at maximising their income, then of course they should be able to use those monies to further their ambitions.

The issue we have always had is where clubs spend money they simply do not have, or when money is generated by selling key 'community' assets like a stadium - often for inflated and unrealistic sums. This fiddling of rules, this exploitation of loopholes, is what destroys their long-term future.

Some clubs have made it their mission to utilise financial trickery to gain an unfair advantage on the pitch. Not only is that bad for their own supporters, but it also places huge pressure on clubs like us when supporters do not fully understand why we will not follow those same paths, or compete in the same way in things like the transfer market.

As we have seen at Bury, the mindless actions of one or two people can destroy a club, and as Derby County fans now see, no-one is immune. We have been there ourselves and fought our way back, but it's a very long road when the roof caves in. And who always suffers? Supporters. We must call time on such idiotic behaviour and ensure it never goes unchecked again. Many of us will remember our years in the lower leagues where even smaller clubs copied this type of mismanagement.

We do not know how, if, or when any reforms will take place, but what we do know is that they are vital. The train is rolling and we hope that this time it cannot be stopped and we find resolutions that are sensible, fair to all, allow genuine competition, and do not stop clubs with real and sustainable income streams from using that money to reach their ambitions.

Fans too have to play their part. They/we cannot expect to have disproportionate control when their respective custodians have often put huge sums on the line as well as immense effort, time and energy. Many custodians forgo family responsibilities because football is 24/7. Many custodians deal with high stress situations because after all, you do not win anything without 110% effort. There are many genuine and hardworking people in the sport who give everything and we should respect this - we cannot tar everyone with the same brush.

is an extremely powerful force. This can only be achieved when supporters, custodians, and governing bodies work together. We know this has been sadly lacking, but we do feel that the current pathway is positive.

We feel that as a club we have been leaders in this field for over a decade now - in 2007 we all came together as fans and set out our stall of how we would operate and be unified. We agreed our core values and none of us have wavered. At that time all supporters came together, led by all the Supporters' groups and 2020, and we have doggedly maintained our way is the right way, even in the face of severe criticism and unfair competition.

Today, that is still the case and we all have complete respect for each other. Of course we do not always agree (although I have to say that 99% of the time we do) and different views and debate are very healthy. But one thing is for sure - every single one of us, every single representative of a supporters' group, and every single person that is part of 2020, bleed orange. We are arm-in-arm, together, and act as one.

That is what makes us special and unique. We can look at our neighbours in the seats around us and immediately we know we have the same belief and core values. We can travel the world, see an orange shirt, and know we have a friend. We can stumble, we can doubt, but we know there are a thousand to stand by us and support us should we need. If we see someone fall, we reach out our hand. We are tied together, we are united, we are one.

Our thoughts and prayers go out to Brian Rourke. Whilst money is so futile in this tragic situation, again you have all shown how united we are. We are all praying, although it feels like we are helpless. None of us can know what he and his family are going through.

Brian has a long road to recovery. We also pray for his family that they can remain strong is such a terrible situation.


may not fancy it as much, and as a unit, we coped with the weather, stayed in our shape and had plenty of defensive discipline.

THE OPPOSITION

Table-toppers Fulham come to Kenilworth Road on the back of ten games without defeat, following their 1-1 draw with fellow pace-setters Bournemouth last Friday night, when a late equaliser from Tosin Adarabioyo rescued a point for the Cottagers and kept the west London side on top of the Sky Bet Championship.

Scott Parker's first return to west London looked like being a successful one after Dom Solanke's earlier effort, but the ex-England international midfielder had to go back to the south coast with just a share of the spoils.

Parker left the club following relegation from the Premier League, and Marco Silva was the man tasked with the role of a swift return to the top flight. And so far, the Cottagers have been in impressive form. Out of their first 21 games, the side have won 13 times, drawing five and losing three. They've also been emphatic in front of goal, scoring 50 times so far in the league.

The draw to Bournemouth last Friday meant Fulham haven't lost in ten Championship fixtures, a run in which Silva's side won seven of those fixtures. During the run, they recorded impressive wins, including wins over QPR, West Brom, as well as a 7-0 thrashing against Blackburn Rovers away at Ewood Park.

One man who knows how to find the back of the net is Aleksandar Mitrovic. The Serbian has scored

21 times for Fulham in the Championship so far this season, and will be an obvious threat to the Hatters' back-line.

In their last visit to the Kenny, Fulham scored an injury-time equaliser to claim a point in a 3-3 draw on Boxing Day in 2019. Kazenga LuaLua put the Hatters ahead, before Bobby Decordova-Reid made it one apiece. James Collins restored Luton's lead, before an equaliser from Mitrovic. Harry Cornick netted to give Luton the lead, with Decordova-Reid scoring in the fourth minute of injury time to save a point.

Nathan Jones' side come into this fixture on the back of a trip to Blackpool, where the Hatters were 3-0 victors last Saturday - a win that lifted them up back up to 12th in the table.

We welcome the Fulham supporters who have made the trip from Craven Cottage this afternoon.

THE GOALKEEPER: MAREK RODAK

Slovakian international Rodak has managed to keep his place as Fulham's first-choice keeper, despite the summer signing of Paulo Gazzaniga. Having started his career with Fulham, he spent time on loan with Non-League Farnborough and Welling before making his EFL bow at Accrington. He spent 18-months on loan at Rotherham, before returning to be Fulham's first-choice in 2019-20, then playing back-up to Alphonse Areola during their Premier League campaign. Back in the Championship, the 24-year-old has been battling Gazzaniga for the number one spot, with Rodak favoured in recent weeks.

THE DEFENDER: TIM REAM

Born in St Louis, Missouri, Ream spent time at St. Louis Scott Gallagher in his youth, before going onto play for Saint Louis Billikens while at Saint Louis University, and had a spell with Chicago Fire Premier. He was drafted by New York Red Bulls in the MLS SuperDraft, and became a regular in the side. Across the 2010 and 2011 seasons, Ream made 58 MLS appearances, scoring once. In January 2012, he signed for Bolton, then of the Premier League, spending three-and-a-half years at the club. In August 2015, he joined Fulham. Since his move to Craven Cottage, the USA international has made over 230 appearances.



THE MANAGER: MARCO SILVA

The man brought into replace Scott Parker this summer, Silva is no stranger to English football, having had previous spells at Hull, Watford and Everton. Silva began at Estoril Praia, winning the Segunda Liga and promotion to the Portuguese top flight. After three seasons, he moved onto Sporting CP, but his time in Lisbon lasted just a year. He later managed Olympiakos, winning the Greek Super League, then Hull, although he was unable to keep the Tigers in the Premier League. A spell at Everton followed between May 2018 and December 2019, before joining Fulham this summer.

THE MIDFIELDER: JEAN MICHAEL SERI

Seri began his career at Africa Sports d'Abidjan, before moving onto ASEC Mimosas. After impressing in his native Ivory Coast, Seri joined FC Porto on Ioan, featuring for the reserves. He joined fellow Primeira Liga side Pacos de Ferreira, with his impressive performances in Portugal earning him a move to Nice. Across three years with the club, Seri made over 100 Ligue 1 appearances. The Ivorian international signed for Fulham in 2018 and made 32 Premier League appearances, before spending the next two years on Ioan at Galatasaray and Bordeaux. The 2021/22 season saw Seri return to the Fulham side.




THE ATTACKER: HARRY WILSON

Wilson joined Liverpool as an eight-year-old, joining up with the U9s squad. His professional debut came out on loan at Crewe, where he played seven times during the 2015/16 season. Wilson made his debut for Liverpool in an FA Cup game against Plymouth in January 2017. He later spent time on loan at Hull, scoring seven times in 13 Championship appearances. He spent the 2018/19 season on loan at Derby, scoring 15 times in 40 games. The Welshman had later loan spells at both Bournemouth and Cardiff, before eventually leaving Liverpool permanently in the summer of 2021, signing for Fulham.

WATCH OUT FOR... ALEKSANDAR MITROVIC

With 24 goals to his name already this season, Mitrovic is in prolific form. He began his career at Partizan Belgrade, and made his debut for their affiliate side FK Teleoptik. He returned to the Partizan first-team and finished his debut season as the club's top goalscorer. His performances earned him a move to Belgian side Anderlecht. After two seasons in Belgium, the Serbian later moved onto Newcastle before joining Fulham on loan midway through 2018/19. He scored 12 times in 17 games, and signed permanently that summer. In total, he now has 74 goals in 148 games for Fulham.





A HAT IN Words: Roger Wash BOTH CAMPS

Going nowhere at Fulham, Malcolm had made only fleeting appearances for the Cottagers but after a recommendation from Luton Entertainments Manager Harry Haslam, who had managed him at Tonbridge, Town boss Alec Stock took the plunge.

The signing of the little known full-back for £17,500 in the summer of 1969 raised no more than a couple of column inches in the local newspapers, but a move to the forward line in pre-season, due to an injury crisis, unleashed a goalscoring phenomenon on to the football world.

With Luton supporters still sobbing over the sale of Bruce Rioch, it was not long before they had a new hero to worship with Macdonald seemingly able to score at will, netting 25 times in his first season as the Hatters secured promotion to Division Two (now the Championship).

Fast and strong, Macdonald showed self determination to the point of greed but his teammates knew that if they knocked a ball over the top, a goal was the likely outcome. Macdonald was, at times, simply unstoppable. Playing at a higher level Macdonald became, if anything, even better and the big clubs started to take notice after he notched a hat-trick during a televised 5-1 win at Sheffield Wednesday.

Financial problems at Kenilworth Road meant that it was one of football's worst kept secrets that Macdonald would be sold at the end of his second glorious season at the club and, after signing off with a hat-trick, he slipped off to Newcastle for £180,000 where he, unsurprisingly, became an instant hero once more.

After five years on Tyneside the by-now England international signed for Arsenal, but knee problems eventually brought his playing days to an end at 29. In a second career, Malcolm went back to Fulham, this time as manager, for an initially successful spell in which promotion was achieved.

The Town had found life difficult on their return to the Championship, after 12 years away, and by the time of the Boxing Day clash at Kenilworth Road against high-flying and promotion favourites Fulham, they were at the wrong end of the table without a win in four.

The game got off to a blistering start when Fulham's Alfie Mawson cleared the ball against James Collins, leaving Kazenga LuaLua to fire home the rebound. Fulham were soon level though when Bobby Decordova-Reid was left in acres of space to head home a cross from Cyrus Christie.

Another defensive error saw the Hatters retake the lead on 28 minutes when Collins took advantage of an attempted clearance to fire home, but the game was all-square again with 13

minutes left when the previously quiet Aleksandar Mitrovic nodded in a corner from close range.

The game then swung back in the Town's favour when, with six minutes to go, Harry Cornick was the beneficiary of another mix-up to slot home a pass from Pelly-Ruddock Mpanzu.

With the seconds ticking down, and an unlikely victory in sight, Decordova-Reid struck in the fourth minute of added time to break Luton hearts.

Fulham boss Scott Parker said afterwards: "When it gets that late, you're thinking this is not going to be our day", while Luton manager Graeme Jones felt inspired by the performance irrespective of the result, and said that six weeks previously the Town would have been beaten.

After the traumas of 1978-79, when the Town narrowly avoided relegation to the third tier, it was hoped that the team could push on without the restraints of long term injuries to influential players which had be-devilled the club the previous campaign.

David Pleat's first full season in charge certainly had its issues, but he was determined to see his stated aim of 'top-flight football within three years' back on track.

The summer of 1979 brought with it the normal merry-go-round of players departing and arriving. Centre-half Mick Saxby came in from Mansfield for £200,000 and Irish international midfielder Tony Grealish was signed from Orient for £150,000. The 'O's originally wanted £350,000 but the




astute Pleat, in one of the earliest transfer tribunals, exploited the system as he was to do many times again over the years.

Leaving the club were Chris Turner, Steve Taylor, Gary Heale, Alan Birchenall and David Carr, but Pleat now had a more streamlined squad which, barring injuries, had the makings of a top side.

The season surprisingly started with a whimper as Gillingham knocked the Hatters out of the League Cup and only a point was gained from the first two League games which did not auger well, but three straight wins followed to catapult the team to the top of the table.

The Town continued to bubble around the top few places, but the home form was beginning to become a stumbling block preventing the team from putting daylight between themselves and the chasing pack. Dropped points at Kenilworth Road, especially against teams at the wrong end of the table, became a frustration for the Hatters especially when compared to the

excellent record on their travels.

By the time of the visit of relegation-threatened Fulham in mid-February the Town had dropped a couple of places with a shock defeat at Oldham the latest setback. Pleat demanded that the team be more ruthless in front of goal, and that is what he got!

In the third minute, left-back Mark Aizlewood surged down the wing and after taking a return pass from Bob Hatton hammered in a shot which Fulham goalkeeper Gerry Peyton pushed on to the underside of the bar. Whether the ball had crossed the line or not, top scorer Moss tapped it in to the empty net to make sure.

On 29 minutes, Hatton was fouled on the edge of the box by Geoff Banton and after a clever free-kick routine involving Alan West and Ricky Hill, Moss was allowed a clear sight of goal and he hammered the ball home. Four minutes later Moss was left in the clear by a superb cross-field pass from Hill to complete his first hat-trick in Luton colours.

Moss almost added to his tally before the half-

time whistle when he volleyed a cross from Aizlewood only inches wide.

Fulham showed more in the second period and on a rare attack Saxby had to clear an effort from future Hatter Richard Money off the line. This seemed to wake the Town, who had been cruising, out of their lethargy with Hatton shooting narrowly wide after turning Banton inside out.

The cherry on the icing on the cake came on 71 minutes when Moss sent over a long corner which was headed back into the box by Saxby to Stein who, with his back to goal, volleyed a spectacular overhead kick into the net.

Fulham boss Bobby Campbell said afterwards: "We were out-powered by Luton but I am confident that we can get out of trouble," as his side dropped to the bottom of the table.

Pleat who saw the Town move back to top spot refused to be drawn on the possibility of promotion back to Division One, but was quietly pleased with the ruthlessness shown in the penalty area.




The match sponsor today is David Stronell who celebrates his 40th birthday on the 21st December. All he wanted to do to celebrate this milestone was to sponsor a match.

Last Saturday's win against Blackpool was coming – despite the run of four games without a win leading up to Luton's trip to face the Tangerines, unlike the weather, it wasn't all doom and gloom.

The defeat to QPR two weeks before was a very good all-round performance decided by the fine margins that define the Championship. The tie three days later at the historic City Ground a similarly tight affair with the Hatter's missing a penalty after Forest went down to ten men.

So, it came as no surprise when the Hatters turned in a resilient away performance coupled with three moments of quality to win the game and end their winless run, courtesy of goals from Sonny Bradley, Elijah Adebayo and Jordan Clark.

Despite the recent good performance levels (barring the 2-1 defeat to Cardiff), Nathan Jones opted to tweak Luton's starting system and personnel. For most of the season, Luton have operated with two out-and-out forwards, usually Elijah Adebayo and Harry Cornick, with three central players behind them, often with one of these operating behind the forwards.

In an attempt to turn the tide, Jones switched to using Adebayo as a lone striker with two players behind him in Jordan Clark and Carlos Mendes Gomes working in slightly wider spaces, with only two central midfielders. How did this change the dynamic of Luton's attack?

Using Mendes-Gomes and Clark as opposed to Cornick gave Luton additional cleverness in the final third. Rather than a game plan that looked to primarily exploit space behind the hosts' backline,

Luton's two wide 'roamers' provided the technical quality to receive in pockets of space and create opportunities in and around the box. It's what Mendes-Gomes did so well at Morecambe last term – dropping his shoulder, playing clever passes into forward areas and executing final deliveries.

Using Kal Naismith through the middle of the back three, as opposed to the left, gave Luton the ability to build from central positions because Blackpool allowed the Town's central centre-back to have space on the ball, much like Middlesbrough back in early November.

Out of possession, Luton began with a slightly wider press that emphasised forcing Blackpool to their right by pushing Clark high and dropping Mendes-Gomes and Amari'i Bell deeper to funnel Blackpool away from their left.

Once again, Jones showed his in-game tactical nous and flexibility, switching to a 5-3-2 at half-time to ensure that Blackpool stopped creating 3v2s against Henri Lansbury and Allan Campbell. Pelly Ruddock-Mpanzu was introduced to deal with the mobile Keshi Anderson as Luton's manager re-organised his side's press to stop Blackpool building through central areas. Tactically, it was a very solid performance and Luton largely controlled their opponents.

Despite the recent dip, Town are in a good place – 12th in the Championship after 21 games, underlying metrics that show high volume chance creation and a sturdy defence, and a young squad that will continue to blossom. Long may it continue.



TRUST BTEC FOOTBALLERS TACKLE SCHOOL UNIFORM POVERTY IN LUTON

As part of our BTEC student's National Citizen Service (NCS), our U17/18 footballers, who all study at Chalk Hills Academy 6th Form, organised a used uniform collection across The Shared Learning Trust's two Academies as part of their social action project aimed at tackling school uniform poverty in Luton.

NCS is a voluntary personal and social development programme for 16–17 year-olds delivered by the Trust which features three phases. Phase 1 saw the students make the short journey to Action4Youth activity centre in Milton Keynes for three days of physical challenges and team building activities. Phase 2 involved three days of workshops at the stadium with local groups meeting the students to talk about many of the challenges facing different communities in the most deprived areas of Luton as part of helping our students understand their local community.

Out of phase 2, the students started phase 3 with a 'Dragon's Den' presentation to decide which ideas would be part of their Social Action Project and from all of the ideas, the vote went to tackling school uniform poverty. Many families rely on charitable donations to make sure all of their children turn up for school in the right uniform and the students linked in with our friends at local charity Level Trust's Uniform Exchange. Over 3

days, more than 100 items of school uniform were collected and delivered to the Uniform Exchange, who will distribute the uniform to families referred by each academy.

CEO of The Shared Learning Trust, Cathy Barr said 'how proud they were of their footballers', and Head of Trust, Kevin Thoburn said: "As well as providing a first class education and excellent football coaching, we want to develop young people with an awareness of the issues facing their local communities, and to also empower them to make a difference which is a core aim of the Trust's strategic aims – the NCS programme provides this."

The away side took a first half lead, but Olivia Abraham netted her 14th of the season with a stunning free-kick in the 80th minute to earn her side a deserved point.

That was until McKay was brought down 25 yards out and Abraham stepped up, once again superbly hitting a free-kick into the top corner.

Once back in the game the Hatters were going for the win and Henman was unlucky seeing her shot saved.



ELIJAH ADEBAYO

Top scorer Elijah Adebayo and his team-mates will take confidence from last week's victory against Blackpool as they head into today's game against the current league leaders.

In conditions at Bloomfield Road that manager Nathan Jones described as "apocalyptic", the Hatters took the lead just before half-time with a Sonny Bradley header, with Adebayo later nodding in his ninth goal of the campaign soon in the second period.

Man-of-the-match Jordan Clark added a third in injury-time, with the victory ending a run of four games without success to lift the Town back up to 12th in the Sky Bet Championship table.

After a month without taking maximum points, it was the victory Elijah and the rest of the team were craving, with the striker saying post-match: "Goals win games. Forget the 3-0 scoreline. Any win today would have been perfect to stop the rot.

"We've had a few disappointing weeks of late, but we know we are a good team, it's just about putting those things together and being clinical in both boxes, which we haven't been over the past couple of games.

"Today, with the conditions, we've had to ride our luck at some stages of the game, but if you defend properly and do the basics right, like the gaffer says, you've got every chance of winning a game.

"The first goal is always important. If we score the first goal, then it's very rare that we lose games, so we know how important those two factors are – and yes, it's been a good day."

He continued: "With football, especially in this league, you get loads of chances to try and put

things right and I know exactly what I'm going to do.

"If I miss a chance, I know I'm going to get another one and I'm going to make sure I'm even more focused on that next chance to make sure I put it away and help the team. I haven't had many chances of late, but today I had a couple."

The task at hand was made much harder on the day due to the icy winds and rainfall, to which the 23-year-old understandably added: "It affected me, I don't know if it affected everyone else! Listen, you can't control the weather. It is what it is, you just have to play what's in front of you.

"I felt like the boys dealt with it fantastically well today. Sheasy did fantastic coming in with some key saves, some good saves, coming and collecting things. Outstanding from him and the back five, and yes, I'm incredibly proud of the boys today given the conditions, and we took our chances when they came, so all good."

Elaborating on the impact James Shea has made since returning to the starting line-up twice in the last three matches, Adebayo admitted: "He is an excellent pro. He knows when he comes in that he has a job to do and we can trust him because everyone in the team trusts each other.

"As long as he's confident, then we're confident and we believe in him. I'm delighted for him today because he deserved the clean-sheet."

Ahead of today's meeting with Fulham, who have strong aspirations of making an immediate return to the Premier League, the striker knows just how tough the match will be having come through the ranks at Craven Cottage.
