



I'd like to welcome Leam Richardson, his staff, their players and all officials and supporters who have made the journey south today. Wigan are a club with whom we have a good relationship, having loaned Glen Rea to them last season to help in their bid for promotion from League One. It was a shame that Glen picked up his injury and couldn't play more of a part up there, but we congratulate them on their success and a solid start to life back in the Championship.

FROM THE BOARDROOM

DAVID WILKINSON Chairman



Good afternoon everyone and a very warm welcome to Kenilworth Road for another Championship match.

Today we face recently promoted Wigan Athletic. The Latics have sold out their allocation so we can expect another lively atmosphere today. Their only defeat so far was 5-1 at home to Burnley, who are showing early signs of being promotion contenders. Anyone can beat anyone in this fantastic competition, so yet again we look forward to a tense and challenging afternoon.

After a slow start we have begun to put together some impressive performances, which have resulted in seven points from the last nine available. When we first saw the early fixtures, we couldn't believe that the schedule had given us three long trips down the M4 in just two weeks, shortly after a trip to one of the fancied parachute clubs, Burnley.

Sandwiched in between was the brilliant game here against Sheffield United, with two teams going toe to toe against each other. Physical, but not dirty – no time wasting or feigning injury – played in the right spirit throughout. It was an example of how football should be played and what we should continuously aspire to.

Six points gained in South Wales from our last two away games. It is gratifying that we seem to be beginning to earn the respect of more established Championship clubs, who are being more gracious in defeat. It's no longer such an embarrassment to lose to "little old Luton."

We are also delighted to hear that players are coming back from injury and it seems that apart from our two long termers, Glen Rea and James Shea, everyone is back on the grass and nearing availability for selection. We all know that the injury list played havoc to our options at the end of last season, so we hope that we have a bit more luck this time.

We have strengthened our squad in this window, which when you read this will have closed, so all those involved will get a bit of a break from what seems like perpetual game-playing over transfers and loans

Gary tells us that it gets harder the higher we go. However, we have had a good one and our thanks to all those who have lived through the frustrations and irritation to bring in some wonderful players. In my last notes I welcomed all our newcomers, some of whom have already made a significant difference to the quality on the pitch and recent results. We hope that as they all find their feet we'll all be able to enjoy their talent first hand.

Football finances continue to be a basket case. You've probably had enough of us flogging to death the enormous canyon between the Premier League and the Football League, but we can't afford to let it lie because if we do, this beautiful game will never recover.

The 2022 Deloitte Annual Review of Football Finance has just been published and is well worth reading in full, but I thought it might be of interest to extract some facts relevant to the Championship.

The report covers 2021/22, a year in which the Championship received £456m, of which £236m went to seven clubs by way of parachute payments

ranging from £16m to £44m. Five of the clubs receiving parachute payments finished in the top eight. By way of comparison, the Premier League had £4.9bn of revenue compared to £600m for the Championship. Strip out the parachute money and the Championship gets about 7.5% of Premier League income and has net debt of £1.8bn.

The revenue range for the year reported clearly skewed by parachute payments is from Bournemouth £72m to Sheffield Wednesday £11.6m. Highest wage bill was Norwich £66m, who were promoted as champions, and lowest was Rotherham £8.2m who were relegated in 23rd place. It looked as though Brentford broke the trend because their revenue was reported as £16m, but their wage bill was £41m.

In that season Bournemouth and Stoke underperformed their budgets, but aside from them the three biggest payers – Norwich, Watford and Brentford – were promoted. At the other end the lowest payers Rotherham and Wycombe were relegated along with Sheffield Wednesday, who suffered a points deduction.

The average wages to revenue ratio is 125% with the worst being over 200%, which without continuing investment by owners or successful player trading, cannot be sustainable.

The fans led review has come to the obvious conclusion that a level of redistribution down the pyramid is required, a lower percentage of income should go on wages and clubs should be encouraged to use extra funds on capital projects improving facilities.

The government seemed to be prepared to act in the event that the Premier League didn't, but in the current political hiatus, who knows? Let's hope that the beautiful game wins over the self-interest of the few





JORDAN CLARK

Jordan Clark spoke of a return to the form of last season for the Hatters after last Friday's 1-1 draw with Sheffield United – no more so in midfield, where he, Allan Campbell and summer signing Luke Freeman dominated for large periods against the Blades.

The 28-year-old former Shrewsbury and Accrington man has excelled in a deeper lying role this season, and after the draw that proved a great advert for the second tier in front of the Sky cameras, he said: "We knew of their quality, probably one of the best midfields in the Championship, so we knew we had to be on our game.

"I think when me, Luke and Allan are all at it, we are a tough three to stop. Obviously we are all dead small, but we've got high energy, we get about players and we make it hard for teams. We are doing all right at the minute, we've just got to start chipping in with more goals and more assists, but I'm sure that'll come as the season goes on."

That proved prophetic with Freeman opening his account for the season, and indeed the Town, four nights later in the 2-1 win at Cardiff.

"Since Luke's come in, he's been a great lad," said Clark.
"He's lovely off the pitch, he's fitted in so easily and his
performances have been really good so far. Hopefully he can
chip in with a couple of goals and assists, which is what the
midfield need.

"He's a quality player, he's got a lot of experience, he's always talking in the game. I think he adds to what me and Allan bring already, with his energy and his work-rate. He's left footed, which balances it out as well, but I just loving playing with those two.



Gabe Osho labelled the Hatters' victory against Cardiff as a 'typical Luton away performance' as they secured backto-back wins in Wales this season!

The 24-year-old came off the bench to great effect and despite admitting the opportunity was 'so scary', he put the finishing touch to a delicious James Bree cross to score his first Luton goal.

"That is the second of my career, and I think the combined distance of those goals is about six yards, but you take them whatever way they come," he smiled.

"It was an amazing ball. I just had to tap it in, and it was so scary! It was good to score my first goal for the club. The coaches are always on to me about not scoring enough, so hopefully now I've scored one they can all start coming."

Ten days after recording their first win of the season at Swansea City, Nathan Jones' side moved into the top half of the Sky Bet Championship for the first time this term courtesy of what Osho described as a 'typical Luton away performance'.

"We had a lot of those last year, if you can win away from home, you always have a good chance especially with our home record. Everyone is happy. Everyone wants to keep the momentum going, it was a bit of a slow start to the season, but I think we're now just picking up again and everyone is excited.

"The performances in the first three games weren't too bad, obviously we had a little blip against Bristol City and the manager just said let's get back to where we were and the quality, we have brought in will show and I think that has been what has been showing the last three games."

Ahead of today's meeting with Wigan Athletic at Kenilworth Road, the versatile former Reading man insists is keen to help out the team in any way he can.

He added: "Wherever I can help the team is important for me



because the team comes first so I'm happy to play wherever the manager puts me.

"It is going to be another tough game against Wigan, but at home we always back ourselves to go on and win. We need to get that first home win this season. Obviously the fans will be on our side and raring for us to, so everyone is buzzing now."

ZAC NEAL

Wigan Athletic were founded in 1932 and are back in the Championship after a two-year absence, winning promotion as League One champions last term.

The Latics have been climbing the Football League since 1978, when they were elected as members from the Northern Premier League. They gained promotion to the Third Division for a second time in 1997, having previously gone up in '82 and back down to Division Four in '93, and their steady rise truly started.

After promotion to the second tier, they finally got to the Premier League in 2005 and spent the next eight years there, finishing 10th in their first season. They were relegated in 2013, but just three days before the drop was confirmed, Roberto Martinez's side won the FA Cup in a famous final where Ben Watson scored a last-minute winner to beat Manchester City at Wembley, earning them a place in the UEFA Europa League.

They have been yo-yoing between the Championship and League One since then, and Leam Richardson's side arrive at Kenilworth Road with seven points from their opening six matches back at this level.

LEAM RICHARDSON

MANAGER | Richardson's managerial career started at Accrington Stanley, before spells as Paul Cook's assistant then followed, with roles at Chesterfield and Portsmouth, before Cook took over at Wigan in May 2017. Cook departed in August 2020, with Richardson taking over as caretaker. John Sheridan was named as Cook's successor, but would only last 15 games. Richardson was eventually installed as permanent boss and led the side to the League One title last season.



JAMIE JONES

GK | Born in Kirby, Jones signed his first pro deal at Everton before joining Leyton Orient, where he enjoyed a six-year spell before joining Preston. He failed to establish himself with the Lily-whites, and had loan spells at Coventry, Rochdale, Colchester and Stevenage, eventually joining the latter permanently. After his spell with Stevenage, the 33-year-old joined Wigan in August 2017. This season, Jones has shared goalkeeping duties with Ben Amos.





TENDAYI DARIKWA

DEF I Zimbabwe international Darikwa began his career at Chesterfield, and gained first-team experience on loan in Non-League at Barrow and Hinckley United. He featured in over 120 league games for the Spireites, before joining Burnley. Chances with the Clarets were limited, and he moved onto Nottingham Forest in July 2017. Darikwa spent three-and-a-half-years at the City Ground, before making the switch to Wigan in January 2021.

JAMES McCLEAN

ONE TO WATCH I Into his second spell at the DW Stadium, McClean made his senior debut for Institute in Northern Ireland, before joining Derry City. After impressing for Derry, McClean made the move to Sunderland and went onto make 59 Premier League appearances. He later joined Wigan, spending two seasons at the club. Three-year stints at both Stoke and West Brom followed for the Republic of Ireland international, before his return to the Latics in August 2021.



ATHLETIC DCUS





MAX POWER

MID I Joining the Tranmere Rovers academy at the age of eight, Power progressed through the system at Prenton Park and went onto feature in over 100 league games for the club. He made the switch to the DW Stadium in July 2015, and was a regular in the Latics' midfield. Power would later join Sunderland on loan, a deal which would be made permanent. In 2021, he re-joined Wigan and won his third League One title with the team last season.

WILL KEANE

ATT | A product of the Manchester United academy, Keane a handful of first-team appearances for the Red Devils and had loans at Wigan, QPR, Sheffield Wednesday and Preston. Hull City was Keane's first permanent move, where he made 22 league appearances, before a loan spell at Ipswich, who he would later join on a permanent basis. In October 2020, the 29-year-old signed for Wigan and last season he netted 26 goals in League One.

LUTON TOWN V PRESTON NORTH END SATURDAY AUGUST 13th 2022 | KENILWORTH ROAD

Under the spotlight is a player with a connection to both the Hatters and today's visitors, as club historian ROGER WASH looks back at Emmerson Boyce's first and last appearances for the Town.

Aylesbury born Emmerson was one of the many players to come through Luton Town's schools and youth development programme prior to signing YTS forms in the summer of 1995.

After making an appearance in an Auto Windscreens Shield game against Walsall in January 1999, he made the breakthrough into the Hatters' League side at home to Lincoln three months later before becoming a regular and a crowd favourite during the following season. A fast and reliable overlapping right back, 'Boycie' saw an offer from Premiership Crystal Palace in the summer of 2004 as too good to turn down, and where he found himself catapulted into the first team earlier than expected following a series of injuries to established regulars, a place he held on to.

Emmerson made a big money move to Wigan in 2006 and skippered the side to the 2013 FA Cup final win over Manchester City. After a short spell at Blackpool, Emmerson rejoined Wigan as an academy coach.

The Barbados international is owner and ambassador of the Emmerson Boyce Academy and Foundation.

FIRST GAME: LUTON TOWN 0 WALSALL 3 AUTO WINDSCREENS TROPHY (5/1/99)

Manager Lennie Lawrence made numerous changes to the side that had drawn 2-2 at Colchester the previous Saturday and brought several players back in from the cold as well as handing debuts to Emmerson, Tresor Kandol and loan signing Sean Dyche.

Walsall, who had won 1-0 at Kenilworth Road earlier in the season, were virtually full strength and overwhelmed the Town, winning easily - although a penalty miss from Herve Bacque may have warmed the hands of the 1,870 present.

The last game of the season saw the mid-table Hatters with nothing to play for while their opponents needed a win to escape relegation at the death.

With the game drifting to a scoreless draw, a route one clearance from Spireites goalkeeper Carl Muggleton was inadvertently back-headed by Sol Davis into the path of Chesterfield's Glynn Hurst, who scampered through to net and cue a pitch invasion.

Following their first appearance in an FA Cup final in 1959, the Town made a dramatic drop through the divisions and by the spring of 1965 were destined to be relegated to Division Four (now League Two).

Manager Bill Harvey had resigned in November 1964 and with no-one looking to steer this sinking ship, it was eventually left to chief scout George Martin to very reluctantly take up the reins three months later.

Martin had previously managed the Town, but that was almost 20 years before, and he had not been in charge of a side since leaving Aston Villa in 1953. He was by now 64 and looking forward to retirement but the persuasive tongue of chairman Tom Hodgson made him take up the position no-one else wanted.

Martin could do little to prevent the club being relegated, but with a clean slate was tasked with earning first time promotion and return the club to former glories. Using his contacts he brought in Matt Woods, the dominating centre-half the Town had missed since the retirement of Syd Owen six years before, tough defender Bobby Thomson and a certain John Moore

With striker John O'Rourke fully fit following an injury ridden 1964-65 campaign, supporters could see a chink of light at the end of the tunnel with a solid defence at one end of the pitch and a goalscorer at the other.

The first hint of trouble between the 'modern day footballer' and a manager and Board probably a little out of touch came when Martin, a renowned disciplinarian, demanded that all players should live in Luton, or close by. O'Rourke, Ray Whittaker and Billy Harber commuted from London while Ted Phillips lived in Colchester.

All four were reluctant to accept this 'draconian' measure but the reasons for the demand were made clear when O'Rourke, Harber and Whittaker were late for a pre-season friendly at Colchester having made their own way to Essex. They were each fined £10, which was a considerable sum in those days, and although they

agitated and complained to the FA, the matter was eventually smoothed over as they fell into line. Phillips was the only one who continued to dig his heels in and was unceremoniously packed off to Colchester United.

After six dismal years of turgid football, season 1965-66 turned out to be a breath of fresh air with the forwards, particularly O'Rourke, banging the goals in for fun and the team always in the mix at the top of the table.

Following a tough, but unbeaten, Easter the Town remained in the top six, but with either three or four games in hand on the teams above them. One of those games in hand came at Chester on 11th May where, in torrential rain, the players put in a blistering first half performance and were two goals up at the break. With the rain continuing to fall 'at almost tropical intensity', the referee abandoned the game shortly after the start of the second period. This abandonment was to have significant implications as we shall see.

With three games left, four points were needed to be certain of promotion at the first time of asking. Barrow were seen off 3-2 in the final match at Kenilworth Road leaving re-arranged away games at Newport on 25th May and Chester three days later.

The players had asked as to bonuses for winning promotion and, after a Board discussion, it was agreed that £10 would be paid on top of the normal £4 win bonus. This seemed to satisfy the players until they found out that an un-named club, but probably Colchester, were offering £300 a man.

The Town's Board reluctantly increased their offer to \$50 and then \$60 with the players paying their own tax, but this was still not enough, for when the party stopped at Chepstow 'for tea' on the way to Newport, a major row broke out.

Chairman Tom Hodgson said: "The manager told the players of the decision but they were not happy and just before the match I went into the dressing room because it had been said that the chairman was afraid to show his face."

Hodgson went on: "Matt Woods immediately confronted me to say that the players were not satisfied and that they wanted £300. I asked them where they thought the money was coming from and John O'Rourke described the offer of £60 as an insult. Woods then asked when the next Board meeting


was and after I replied that it was not until the following week and that I could not offer them £300 each, he said 'That's it'."

Out on the pitch the Town were well beaten 3-1 by a Newport team with little to play for. Whether the pre-match 'discussions' had anything to do with the defeat, where we showed 'no form, no fight' according to Martin, is anyone's guess. But one wonders that if £300 had been on offer then the result would have been different.

Woods immediately asked for a freetransfer which was granted, and with Harber, O'Rourke, John Reid as well as Woods 'unavailable' for the final game at Chester, it was a makeshift side that took to the field at Sealand Road in bright sunshine this time.

A good number of Luton supporters travelled to Chester as a win would have confirmed promotion. A goal after five minutes from Billy Stark settled the nerves but 19 minutes from the end, with John Moore down injured, a Chester break ended in an equaliser. Try as they might the winner would not come and the Town ended up falling short on goal average.

The repercussions were loud and long with eight players being given free transfers, another five released and O'Rourke being sold to Middlesbrough. George Martin lasted until November 1966 before, tired and disillusioned, he resigned to be replaced by Allan Brown and the start of another era in our rich history.







PREMIER LEAGUE YOUTH SUMMIT ENSURES YOUNG PEOPLE FROM LUTON TOWN COMMUNITY TRUST HAVE THEIR VOICES HEARD

Hundreds of young people from across England and Wales have been empowered by the Premier League and professional football clubs to share their views on the issues that are affecting them and their communities, as part of the Premier League Youth Summit 2022.

Held at BBC Media City in Salford, and delivered in partnership with BBC Children in Need, the virtual summit encouraged 11-18-year-olds, representing 61 professional football club community organisations, to engage in discussions around equality, diversity and inclusion.

The Summit brought together young people from across the Premier League Kicks community programme – including those taking part in one-on-one Kicks Targeted support sessions and the female empowerment activity of Changemakers. The participants involved also contributed to discussions on community safety and youth employment in their area.

One person who has benefitted from their involvement in the Premier League Youth Summit is Hafizul, who has been involved in Luton Town Community Trust Premier League Kicks Program activity for 2 years.

"This was an amazing opportunity to break down barriers with local police

and the community. I have never had the chance to sit down and talk to a police officer before, especially someone who represents the Muslim background. Having the chance to ask questions gave me a better understanding of what it is like to police in Luton and how to become a police officer myself."

25 young people from Luton Town Community Trust Premier League Kicks activity took part in this year's Premier League Youth Summit, having regularly attended our Kicks sessions at either Lea Manor, Beds FA or Stockwood Park. As part of the event, Bedfordshire Police delivered an interactive workshop with the participants, offering the young people an opportunity to voice their concerns and suggestions around local issues.

Premier League Head of Community Nick Perchard said:

"The Premier League is committed to promoting equality and giving young people from different backgrounds the opportunity to have their say. The Premier League Youth Summit offers young people from across England and Wales the chance to come together to discuss the topics that matter to them, to help shape their communities."

Never in doubt, was it? Despite a slow start, the gears are starting to click and the sense that there's still plenty more to come is ever more evident.

Victories in South Wales are now becoming the norm and, barring a frustrating flag failure against leaders Sheffield United, we should be basking in a nine-point end to August. But that performance against the Blades should give real hope that Luton will be operating at the higher end of the Championship table once again.

I write this with relief after exhibiting a rare, uncharacteristic and unexplained bout of extreme optimism in a Luton Town Supporters' Trust Podcast pre-season prediction of nothing but Ws to start the season

Yet, as a recovering curmudgeon, humble pie can in hindsight taste sweet. Other than the Bristol blip, all the ingredients were there, just not necessarily added in the right order. And to wilfully over-egg the pudding with this food-based analogy, there's ice cream and sprinkles still to add to the recipe.

Take, for example, a promising back three of Reece Burke, Tom Lockyer and Dan Potts. The latter is experiencing a wonderful revival as a centre-half and leader, as predicted last season by Nathan Jones, who also insisted Jordan Clark's destiny lay in central midfield, even to the bewilderment of the former winger. That prophecy was extended, after the Sheffield United draw, to a comparison as a Championship Thiago Alcantara. Alongside, Luke Freeman and Allan Campbell, Luton have an exceptional midfield, with Pelly-Ruddock Mpanzu still to return.

With Carlton Morris settled in nicely and firing up front, there's a solid and exciting spine to the team. And despite some social media murmurings, there's no need to worry about Elijah Adebayo.

He's back to being a nuisance, he's finding space and he's getting into good positions. His goals will come and, if not for these reasons and the players already outlined, then here are two more words for you - James Bree.

If no one else has, allow me to propose a new and entirely unoriginal but suitable nickname of The Postman.... because of his special deliveries. They went unconverted against Sheffield United, but not in Cardiff for Gabriel Osho's winner. If those supply lines are there for a defensive midfielder to open his Hatters account, then it's only a matter of time before Adebayo benefits too.

And just as Osho returned at Cardiff, so did Fred Onyedinma, straight into a game-changing personification of that Instagrammed training ground Deliveroo prank. The wide man has been missed, but his cameo contribution for Freeman's opener emphasises just what a force Luton can be when injured players return, others take their chance and everything clicks.

Let's not get carried away, but the good times are here to stay if this impressive class of 2022/23 fulfils their potential.
