

THE BOSS

Good evening to you all and welcome back to the Kenny for tonight's Championship game against Queens Park Rangers.

Since my opening notes of the season we have played four games but yet to taste victory. Sitting here writing that makes me feel very frustrated but in all of those matches we have shown good levels of performance in all of those, particularly in our last three.

Burnley put us to the sword here with a ruthless display of finishing and on the night I thought we lacked fluency in the final third. We carried a greater threat into our game at Portsmouth and should have been a couple of goals ahead before being reduced to 10 men. We showed a different side of ourselves after that which was pleasing, as was the clean sheet.

Our trip to Preston saw us dominate for long spells and create numerous chances, the only disappointment being our failure to take our chances. Like at Fratton Park, we played some excellent football and looked solid at the back and I was really pleased with the debut of Mark McGuinness, who we signed from Cardiff City in the days leading up to the game.

Lastly, to wrap up my thoughts on our recent fixtures, the Carabao Cup tie at QPR saw us put in a good performance. I feel it was a game we should have won, but, the fact is, we didn't. As a manager you are of course frustrated, but the positive signs are there. It is still early in the season and we have shown glimpses of our quality in all four matches.

Tonight we face a QPR side who showed on Tuesday how much of a good side they are. I'd like to welcome Martí Cifuentes and his staff and players to Bedfordshire. Martí has been a great appointment for Rangers since he came in November last year and they will be hoping for a successful season this time around.

When you read these notes the transfer deadline will still be open for a few more hours. It's not an ideal time, juggling matchday preparation with the closing of a busy transfer period, but it is what it is. This window has come with its challenges but I'm delighted with our new arrivals. Together with Mark last week we also welcomed Tom Krauß and Liam Walsh to Kenilworth Road and I wish them, together with Reuell Walters and Shandon

Baptiste, the very best in their careers with us. The signs have been hugely encouraging so far and they are all going to improve as the season progresses.

Finally thank you to the supporters who have clocked up the miles at the past three away fixtures. We know it's an expensive time of year with summer holidays, and your loyalty – not to mention the decibel levels – is greatly appreciated.

Please get behind us once more tonight and bring the noise like you always do.

Good evening everyone and a very warm welcome to Kenilworth Road.

Sadly, it is another unconventional kick-off time, which in this case doesn't affect everyone too badly, but I wonder if the time will ever come when supporters' interests and travel arrangements are taken into account when timing of games is decided upon.

We saw during lockdown what the game is like being played behind closed doors without a crowd and it's not the same. TV and the money it provides is vital to the game, but supporters make it an event not a soap opera. A happy medium would be nice. We have 19 games before Christmas and only six of those are 3pm kick offs.

Fans are the lifeblood of the game and need more and better consideration. Our away support is bound to dwindle and away fans visiting the Kenny from distance likewise. We know how much extra we are getting from TV revenue for allowing all but 3pm Saturday games to be broadcast, but I wonder how much extra that is costing clubs and their fans.

Tonight, we welcome QPR, who as you will be aware beat us on penalties in the Carabao Cup on Tuesday. We played well and should have got a different result, but despite our superiority we could only find the net once. And what a strike that was from young Zack Nelson, an academy graduate, and what a game he had.

One of the most satisfying things for fans is to see the development of our young players and it is gratifying to see a number genuinely in and around the first team squad. Integration

is never easy and it's often simpler to bring in an established player than take the risk to give an emerging talent the time necessary. Football thinking is so short-term these days, but it is always so exciting when taking the risk works out.

Our season to date has seen one poor performance and three poor results, but there are a lot of factors behind that. It is understandable that fans who have never seen a relegation

or even a losing run get frustrated, but as someone who has supported this club for 66 years there is not much I haven't seen. We clearly have a more talented squad than the one that got us promotion to the Premier League.

Of course, we lost a couple of amazing talents in Ross
Barkley and Sambi
Lokonga, who would both understandably feel too good for the Championship but we had the joy of watching them for a season at little cost and wish them well in their new homes.

As Rob and Gary have said before, this is the most difficult window they have seen and it's still going. It started late because of the Euros, is fraught with Financial Fair play considerations and for us is affected by the fact that we have been in the Premier League with many believing we should be paying more for players given the parachute payment we receive.

Our whole philosophy is based upon the longterm future of this football club. We have had "fly by nights" in charge of club in the past and have learned that while "blowing your brains out" may have short term benefits, it is more than likely to lead to long-term decline. We see it all around us and won't get sucked in.

We love our football club and want future generations to love it too. We will stick to our principles so that it is here for them to enjoy. An impressive display of ruthless finishing from the visitors saw the Hatters' first game back since relegation from the Premier League end in defeat at Kenilworth Road.

The Clarets, who also came down with the Town from the top-flight, were ahead on six minutes when Josh Brownhill finished past Thomas Kaminski and eight minutes before half-time Wilson Odobert doubled their lead.

After the break the Hatters rallied, Elijah Adebayo saw an effort cannon back off the crossbar while at the other end Kaminski made a string of fine stops to keep the visitors at bay.

The Town did get back in it when Tahith Chong's close-range strike halved the deficit but with 20 minutes left to play Dara O'Shea restored Burnley's two-goal cushion with a header from a corner.

However as the Town looked to stage a late comeback the Clarets, in Scott Parker's first game in charge, stole a fourth goal on the counter attack when Vitinho slammed home after a pacey break from Lyle Foster.

After playing for over an hour with 10 men following the red card shown to Thomas Kaminski the Town had to settle for a share of the spoils in a goalless draw at Fratton Park.

The Hatters could count themselves unlucky not to be in front in a first half in which they created several excellent opportunities.

Tahith Chong swept a left-foot shot inches wide of the post in the opening minutes before Carlton Morris' low shot was well saved by the legs of Pompey goalkeeper Will Norris.

Elijah Adebayo's towering header following a wonderful cross from Chiedozie Ogbene was then kept out brilliantly by the fingertips of Norris before Kaminski's red card for a second bookable offence.

Having bizarrely been booked for time wasting by the referee despite Teden Mengi being the player taking his time to find a team-mate from a goalkick, Kaminski was shown a second yellow moments later after racing out of his goal and clattering an opponent.

Captain Carlton Morris made way for substitute goalkeeper James Shea but in truth the Town stopper was largely untroubled as the defence held the host at arms' length in the second period.

The Hatters fell short in the north west with a narrow defeat at Deepdale despite creating enough chances to win the game.

Elijah Adebayo headed narrowly over from an Alfie Doughty corner in the fourth minute before home keeper Freddie Woodman tipped a header from Carlton Morris over the bar on 36 minutes.

But the home side took the lead seven minutes before from the break, Will Keane scoring past James Shea following a cross from Emil Riis.

After the break Woodman then did well to prevent Jordan Clark's low shot on 57 minutes from creeping home and on the hour the Town felt they should have had a penalty when Adebayo went down under a challenge only for referee Whitestone to deem the offence to take place outside the area.

Doughty's low shot was blocked with 20 minutes to go before Teden Mengi's piledriver was deflected over yet the Town, for all their possession, could not force a leveller with Doughty slamming a right-foot shot high and wide when well placed with 14 minutes left - the pick of their half-chances in the closing stages.

QPR win on penalties 4-1

The Hatters' first penalty shootout since the Championship play-off final at Wembley ended in defeat as Queens Park Rangers booked their place in the next round of the Carabao Cup on Tuesday.

Cauley Woodrow and Tahith Chong missed their spot-kicks in the shootout and, with Rangers scoring all four, the Hatters were dealt a quick exit from the competition they won back in 1988.

An entertaining game went to penalties after a 1-1 draw in normal time. The Town, who made five changes to the side that lost at Preston including a first start since December for Marvelous Nakamba, were on top for large parts.


However, Rob Edwards' side were behind on 11 minutes when Hevertton Santos tucked home the rebound after Thomas Kaminski failed to hold onto Elijah Dixon-Bonner's shot but a stunning equaliser from Zack Nelson – his first senior goal – restored parity.


The Town went close to winning the tie with chances in both halves but after being denied by Rangers, the tie went to penalties where Rangers held their nerve to secure their spot in the third round.

The Hatters welcome Queen's Park Rangers to Kenilworth Road for what is bound to be an exciting Friday night under the lights.


Marti Cifuentes' team are looking like a new side under the Spanish manager and are looking to kick on in the Championship.

Second spell at QPR after success away at Leyton Orient. Started in the Hoops' opening day defeat to West Brom.

ELIJAH DIXON-BONNER

Came through the academy at Liverpool and joined QPR two years ago. Made his debut for the Hoops against Rotherham United.

FORWARDS MICHAEL FREY

Joined QPR in January 2024 from Royal Antwerp. Has previously played for Young Boys, Lille, Young Boys, Fenerbahce and Schalke.

ZAN CELAR

Previous experience with FC Lugano and joined the Hoops this summer. Made his QPR debut against West Brom earlier in the month.

KARAMOKO DEMBELE

Highly-rated winger who spent last season with Blackpool in League One. Came through the ranks at Celtic where he made his debut for them at just 16.

HOOPS KITBAG



1983-85

Guinness were busy brewing the Black Stuff in nearby Park Royal when they became Rangers' first ever kit sponsor for 1983/84. With Adidas in charge of putting together the kit, they came up with a classic, featuring the sponsor logo on the traditional blue and white hoops. The red trim is the icing on the cake.

A FOOT IN BOTH




DON SHANKS

An England youth international defender, Don signed after leaving Fulham, making his debut for the Hatters in 1971. A tough tackling marauding full-back, Don helped the Town to promotion in 1974 but was then sold to QPR for £35,000 in November of that year. Don enjoyed a successful seven years at Loftus Road before a period at Brighton followed by football in Hong Kong, USA and Malta.

HOOPS HERO

You could see there was still magic in his boots in the twilight of his career at Kenilworth Road, but QPR fans were lucky enough to see Kevin Gallen in his pomp across two spells. He signed pro forms on his 17th birthday and went onto score 36 goals in 171 league appearances for his boyhood club. Spells at Huddersfield and Barnsley followed but he returned to Loftus Road a year later and hit 54 goals in 194 league games, helping Rangers to promotion in 2003. He left Rangers for the last time in 2007, making the switch to Kenilworth Road in 2009 before winding down his career in local non-league circles.



FIXTURE FLASHBACK

TOWN 3-3 QPR 6TH JANUARY, 2001

The Town are two up in this cup tie and looking comfortable thanks to goals from Andrew Fotiadis (pictured) and Liam George – but Rangers come back to draw level. 



Preservating and appreciating the heritage and history of Luton Town Football Club

LONDON'S (NOT) CALLING

For many years an uncashed postal order hung in the Luton boardroom. It was for the princely sum of 1/8 (13p) and represented the Town's share of the gate receipts from the **Third Division (now** League 1) meeting with Thames on the 6th December 1930. With only 469 fans through the turnstiles, it remains the lowest recorded attendance in the history of the Football League.

The match was played at the West Ham Stadium. not to be confused with the modern stadium of the same name. It was built in 1928 as a greyhound venue and designed by the famous football ground architect Archibald Leitch, Situated at Custom House, near to the present day Prince Regent DLR station, it could hold 120,000 spectators and, ironically, remains the largest venue to regularly hold Football League matches.

Keen to maximise revenues at the weekend a group of local businessmen decided to start a football team based at the ground. Thus, in 1928, Thames

AFC were born, starting in the Southern League and being elected to the Football League for the 1930/31 season. In such a congested area they struggled to attract spectators and the nadir was reached when the Hatters visited a few months into that first campaign.

Though Thames had lost three in a row, and were second bottom of the table, the main reason for the especially sparse crowd was the weather. Local supporters, knowing how heavy the fog was and how close the ground was to the river, assumed the match would surely be postponed.

Those attending were not rewarded for their hardiness and optimism. With the space between the stands and the pitch so large, and the fog unrelenting, it was almost impossible to make out what was happening. Even the only goal of the game from Thames' striker Wilf Phillips, 20 minutes into the second half, was barely noticed until a group of players were seen celebrating. An attempt to improve visibility by lighting the arc lamps around the greyhound track only

made matters worse and they were quickly turned off again after cries of complaint from the stand.

Despite the inclement weather, 'Crusader' from the Luton News was very complimentary about the club and the ground in the match report but less so about the quality of the Thames side, writing "I am fairly sure they will be beaten comfortably at Luton if they do not have a better side." He was right. We would run out 8-0 winners at Kenilworth Road the following April.

Thames lasted just one more season before financial problems led to them being replaced in the league by Aldershot. The stadium fared better, continuing to host a range of events until its closure in 1972.

A Luton effort goes wide



Champions!

Over the course of the season we'll be looking back 20 years to the glorious League One championship winning season of 2004/05.

So many club league records were tumbled during a momentous campaign which was even more remarkable considering that the summer of 2003 saw the arrival of new 'owner' John Gurney and his crackpot ideas, which ultimately led to the Hatters needing to enter administrative receivership, with all its problems, to get rid of him.

This is the story of a season to remember.



2004/05 history

After opening the season with three straight wins next up were newly promoted Torquay at Kenilworth Road and the chance to make history and become the first Town side to win their opening four games.

The Hatters included both Keith Keane and Ahmet Brkovic in the side, for their first starts of the campaign, in place of Kevin Foley and Stephen O'Leary but the well organised Gulls made the Town huff and puff in the early stages by playing deep, before the deadlock was finally broken on 35 minutes.

A cross from Keane saw Steve Howard head home powerfully from 15 yards. This meant that Howard had scored in his last eight games to set up a Luton record of sorts. The previous record was seven games but these were consecutive and Howard had missed one match – the final game of the previous campaign – so the arguments started.

There was no doubt, though, that Howard was in a rich vein of form but try as he might he could not find a second goal to calm the nerves and, as the game wore on and with the Gulls smelling blood, it took all the organisational skills of skipper Kevin Nicholls to keep the Town goal intact. It was hearts in mouths time, though, when Ade Akinfenwa trundled through in the final minute, clear on goal, but rolled his effort wide.

Manager Mike Newell appeared quite relaxed about the shaky end to the game but was probably secretly relieved that his players had managed to hang on to a fourth win on the spin.

Next on the long road was a first time trip to Boston United in the League Cup. The area suffered two massive storms a few hours before kick-off and the referee had no option but to call the game off because the pitch was waterlogged. A great many Luton supporters had made the trip but then had to endure further storms on the way home. The game would need to be rescheduled but minus Paul Gascoigne, who had been on trial at York Road

A trip to Blackpool was the next game and with an unchanged side the Hatters got off to the worst possible start, conceding to a Scott Taylor snap shot after only four minutes.

The score remained the same until a two-goal burst in 60 seconds by the Town on the hour mark turned the game on its head. Firstly Howard nodded home a cross shot from Rowan Vine and then the clever feet of Brkovic saw him in the clear to net the second.

Two goals in a minute certainly sent the Town fans into raptures. Housed in a temporary stand the weight of the

jumping fans saw part of the wooden floor giving way and three supporters fell under the stand. Fortunately it happened on one of the lower rows meaning that the drop was not great and the only casualty was a man with a leg injury.

Part of the stand was cordoned off with the supporters moved elsewhere, but they all saw Brkovic net his second goal in the closing moments to make the game safe.

The players did not have time to rest on their laurels as they were back at Kenilworth Road two days later for a Bank Holiday clash against Bournemouth.

With Kevin Foley coming back in the side for Keith Keane the Hatters came up against yet another side clearly intent on earning a point. With five strung across the middle the Cherries made it difficult for the Town but, just as the game seemed about to end in a scoreless stalemate, skipper Nicholls stepped up to save the day.

The midfielder moved upfield with nine minutes left to curl a 25-yard shot past Neil Moss for a goal to win any game. This time the team was not left hanging on at the end and saw the game out comfortably to secure their sixth straight win which put them six points clear at the top.



Let's get the obvious out of the way; it's yellow. I know, what on earth were Pony and the club thinking at the time?

A yellow, outfield, Luton Town shirt? Maybe the designers were secret fans of the team down the M1?

Either way, here is the only yellow outfield shirt we've had. The 1996/97 away shirt, one that also came back the following season as a third shirt. At least there's bits of blue on it, right...

It's another Pony effort, and this shirt features the same collar structure as the previous season's home shirt, but this time has a much deeper, blue "v" with orange accents. At least there's a little bit of orange on there.

Universal Salvage Auctions were once again the sponsor, and their blue logo matches the colour scheme for this shirt nicely. We have blue panelling down the arms and the sides of the shirt too, with the same style on the collar being used for the cuffs on the sleeves.

The material is very pully, much like the shirts of that era. It is hard to find an example of this shirt without a pull or bobble, but if you do find one, they go for a surprisingly high amount of money.

The Town's first appearance in yellow came in a 3-2 defeat at **Brentford in August 1996** and Lennie Lawrence's side failed to record a win in these shirts all season (often choosing white or the orange and black striped kits on the road instead). However, in 1997/98, a 1-0 win at Carlisle was the first victory achieved in these colours - one of seven wins in yellow that season.

Hatters scout Cyril Beach recommended several Welsh youngsters to the Hatters with striker John Hartson another off the conveyor belt signing professional terms in December 1992.

Having scored goals for fun at youth level, Swansea-born John made his debut as a substitute in a 1-0 League Cup defeat to Cambridge in August 1993, going onto score on his league debut against Nottingham Forest.

Soon the Welshman's precocious talents came to the fore, none more so during our famous televised win over Newcastle in the FA Cup in February 1994, in which he scored the opening goal.

The big clubs came sniffing around and Arsenal paid a record fee for a teenager of £2.5 million for the powerful striker in 1995.

After three seasons and 14 Premier League goals he transferred to West Ham in 1997, scoring 15 times in 1997/98.

After spells at Wimbledon and Coventry the frontman - who was a regular for Wales - was a massive hit in Scotland with Celtic, scoring 109 goals in just 201 games, winning the title three times.



MY FAVOURITE GOAL...

Town fan Freya Nicholson chooses her favourite all-time moment the Hatters found the target

My dad took me to my first ever Luton game in May 2000, against Oldham Athletic. I was seven years old. I have been supporting Luton for 24 years since so there is plenty of choice when considering my favourite ever Luton goal.

Countless memories, from the Claude Gnakpa Wembley winner in the JPT, George Moncur's free-kick in the snow against Portsmouth in League One, Jordan Clark's strike at Wembley in the Championship play-off Final to Olly Lee's long-range effort from our own half against Cambridge.

However, my favourite Luton goal has to be Ahmet Brkovic's late winner against Hull City in League One. It was February 2005; a top of the table clash, with only one point separating us and the high-flying Tigers. I was nervous before the game, especially as we were without my favourite Luton player, Steve Howard, and wondering how much of a miss he would be.

We dominated the game and Brkovic could arguably have scored a hat-trick. A breakthrough felt like it was on the cards – anything is possible at Kenilworth Road. And in true Hatters style, the breakthrough came in the 88th minute. Kevin Nicholls passed the ball out wide to Steve Robinson, who crossed the ball from the right. The cross hung in the air for an age. Brkovic rose highest to head home the winner.

I had a great view of the goal sitting in the Kenilworth Road lower tier and I knew it was going in as soon as it left his head. At the time, I was 12 years old and I'd never experienced an atmosphere like it when that goal went in. The noise was deafening and almost took the roof off the Kenny. I remember leaving the game with such adrenaline, I'd never felt such elation after winning a game.

That goal cemented my love for the Town. The breathless late winner gave us a vital three points in this promotion tussle, putting us four points ahead of Hull. As fans, we knew this was a step closer to the Championship and a long-awaited return to the second tier of English football.

Being a third generation Luton supporter, I cannot wait to see what special moments my three-year-old son has to look forward to, supporting this amazing and historic club.

The ball fell to her at the back post, but incredibly the Stevenage keeper got down low and stopped her effort from yards out.

With seven minutes left to play, Stevenage were awarded a penalty after Sarah Hudson allegedly made contact with a Stevenage player. However the Hatters were let off the hook when the penalty was smashed over the bar.

A late surge of Stevenage corners were all defended well and the Ladies were able to claim all three points.

As we know the Hatters lost 1-0 on the road against Preston after a narrow defeat at Deepdale. West Brom picked up a 2-1 win away at Stoke thanks to first half goals from Karlan Grant and Josh Maja.

Sunderland picked up an impressive 1-0 win against Burnley after Romaine

Mundle's strike in the 26th minute to put the Black Cats top of the league. Derby also fell to a narrow defeat away at Watford.

Sunday also saw another huge game in the Championship as Swansea City and Cardiff City played out a 1-1 draw in the South Wales derby. Liam Cullen put the Swans ahead, but Callum Robinson equalised for the Bluebirds.

The Hatters are back on the road in our next match after the international break two weeks tomorrow when they head to south east London to face Championship side Millwall at the Den.

Last season the two sides were in separate divisions but come the end of the season both teams would be back in the same league with the Hatters narrowly missing out on staying up.

Spending 98 seasons in the Football League, the Lions had a two-year stint in the top division between 1988/90 before bouncing between the second and third tiers of English football, finishing runners-up in the FA Cup in 2003.

This is the seventh consecutive season in the Sky Bet Championship for the London side since their promotion to the second division in 2017 after winning the play-off final against Bradford City under Neil Harris.

The E14 side has seen several managerial changes with Gary Rowlett, Adam Barratt and Joe Edwards all taking charge of the club following their League One playoff-winning season in 2017.

With hopes of improving on their mid-table finishes, they reappointed former promotion-winning manager Harris but were only able to finish the 2023/24 season in 13th place 14 points behind the play-off spots.

However, all eyes would turn to the London side this time during the off-season when the sad news would come out that first-choice goalkeeper Matija Sarkic had passed away following suffering a sudden heart failure whilst on international duty for Montenegro. The 26-year-old had made 32 league appearances for the Lions and will be sorely missed by all at Millwall.

The Hatters will head to the Den for the first time since April 2023 when they were involved in a goalless draw in week 40 of the Town's play-off final winning season but will hope to improve their record away from home against Millwall.

In the last 40 league games, the Town have only won six with the start of this Sky Bet Championship season beginning with two losses and one draw the head-to-head form isn't much better with the Hatters beating Millwall six times in the last 20 meetings, winning at the Den three times.

You have to go back to the Championship season and October of 2021 for the last win against the Lions away from home with then striker Harry Cornick grabbing a brace in a 2-0 win as the Hatters took all three points in East London.

Here's hoping for a similar result for the travelling Hatters.
