
us heart going into this evening's game.

BOARDROOM DAVID WILKINSON



Good evening everyone and welcome to Kenilworth Road. I hope that those who are here for the first time enjoy the experience.

Most of us on the Board have spent decades visiting the Kenny and still feel the emotion we felt when we first heard the click of the turnstiles.

Tonight, West Brom are our guests. Since our first meeting way back in 1897, which we lost 1-0, we have played each other 50 times. We last met here in our Championship promotion season in January 2023, incidentally losing 3-2 after having led 2-0 thanks to goals from Elijah and Carlton...

I'm writing these notes the day after our disappointing defeat to Coventry so, as with a lot of you, my feelings are a bit raw. However, it's only a week since we played extremely well to beat Watford.

There was a lot to be frustrated about at Coventry. Of course, nothing is worse than seeing your team surrender a two-goal lead and lose in the last minute while sitting in the directors' box. Believe me, it can be difficult to keep your cool when you witness certain decisions going against you.

While I won't go into detail, as I run the risk of getting in hot water from the powers that be, all I can say is I believe you would share my exasperation if, for example, a player of ours was ever cautioned for, what it might seem from the stands, taking a free-kick too quickly. I could write an entire programme on this subject, including the use

of VAR, but I've learned in life to quickly get over the irritations and frustrations that football gives you and focus on the positives.

Which leads me on to something special that gave me much pleasure last week when, for the first time since the play-off final in May 2023, the whole Board were together in the same room.

Therefore, we arranged a get together last week for the day after the Sunderland game.

Our first trip was to The Brache where, despite playing the night before, all the players were in for training. Normally only injured players would be in for treatment and recovery but they were there preparing with just two days before leaving for Coventry.

It was good to see them around at breakfast and feel the atmosphere and morale, which was excellent. Even those of us who visit regularly found something new, and we were all able to see recent additions and improvements, such as the new academy accommodation, offices and laundry room.

We were also impressed by the work done on the first team training pitches and the new high-tech medical equipment acquired to improve treatment and recovery. There was also time to meet those in the medical team and discuss what they are doing to improve our injury record for our vulnerable players in order to get more minutes on the pitch.

To a man, the Board were impressed with what has been created, and we all noted the positive energy around the place.

We then went on to our headquarters for lunch which gave directors, seldom seen, to introduce themselves and put faces and job specs to those staff they hadn't met. As with The Brache, it was a spirited, fun event and we all left with a comfortable and positive feeling that we are being well looked after.

In the afternoon we met club historian Roger Wash and Brian Webb from Hatters Heritage to join a tour of the club's early history. We started in High Town, where the club was first conceived, and finished at the site of our first ground on Dallow Road. None of us had done this before and it was fascinating. We would recommend those

of you who like history to listen to Brian's talk and certainly check out the Hatters Heritage website, where they are close to finishing digitising all club data back to its formation in 1885.

We then moved on to Power Court, Most of us had not been on site since groundwork began. For years now we have been looking at plans, models and computer-generated images of the proposed stadium and associated developments, but it's only by being there and seeing the people and machines at work that make it feel alive. It is a huge project, and a cornerstone of the 2020 vision is now a reality.

The day ended with an enjoyable dinner. There

At the end of a pulsating second half that had seen Sunderland come out victorious, the Town players

were deservedly applauded off the pitch by their supporters who had urged their heroes along for 90

For the neutral, this was a good one. The Hatters pressed and pushed high up the pitch but just could not find a way past a stubborn Sunderland defence that dealt with almost everything that was thrown their way. At the end, the visitors registered 42 clearances to the Town's four.

For all the forward momentum the Hatters could not force visiting goalkeeper Anthony Patterson into a save in a first half that ended when Carlton Morris' finish – reacting quickest to Daiki Hashioka's flick-on from an Alfie Doughty corner – was harshly ruled out for offside.

Goalless at the break, three minutes after the restart the Town almost led only for Patterson to throw up a strong hand to brilliantly keep out Elijah Adebayo's close range header following Jordan Clark's cross.

On top and looking for the opener, the Hatters then suddenly trailed on 55 minutes. Tahith Chong's touch fell invitingly at the feet of Chris Rigg who, after holding off

However, the Hatters responded well and were level just eight minutes later. Doughty's free-kick from the right was beautifully volleyed goalwards by Morris at the back post and Adebayo was on hand to nod home from close range for his first goal of the season.

Sadly for the Hatters that noise was muted as Sunderland regained the lead in style three minutes later. Romaine Mundle dashed past two challenges on the left-hand edge of the box before finding the perfect low finish beyond Kaminski.

Up went the decibel level from the Town faithful with their side trailing once more, and on 72 minutes, it was almost 2-2 when Patterson blocked Doughty's left-foot drive after being teed up by substitute Jacob Brown.

As time ticked down the Hatters continued to push for an equaliser only for half-chances to fall at the feet of manof-the-match Tom Holmes, Morris and Clark.

In the dying moments and with the Town getting desperate, birthday boy Kaminski went up for the latest of late corners but Sunderland – who had cleared cross after cross after cross all night – dealt with the final one and that was that.

Unchanged from the 2-1 defeat to Sunderland in the week the Town rode their luck early on with a combination of good defending and profligacy from the hosts keeping the score blank.

But the Hatters got their noses in front from the spot on the quarter-hour mark when Tahith Chong was upended in the box by Tatsuhiro Sakamoto and Carlton Morris converted the penalty.

Five minutes later it was almost 2-0 when Chong saw a shot on the turn turned away well by Oliver Dovin but in truth the Town were under the cosh as Coventry continued to dominate.

But the Hatters held firm, defending well and on 37 minutes it was 2-0 when Elijah Adebayo struck his second goal in two games to double the lead finishing well after taking Tom Krauß's slide-rule pass.

Coventry began the second half on the front foot. Haji Wright should have done better with a header from close range on 53 minutes before Thomas Kaminski got behind a shot from Ben Sheaf two minutes later.

With the Town pinned back, Coventry's pressure finally paid dividends on the hour when Ellis Simms sent a thumping header from a right-wing corner past Kaminski to halve the deficit.

Now with their tails up, the hosts upped the ante further and with 14 minutes left the Sky Blues were level when substitute Victor Torp curled home a beautiful first-time finish past Kaminski from the edge of the box.

The Hatters had barely had a sniff in the second period with Coventry enjoying almost three-quarters of the ball but they had a chance out of nothing to snatch a third with six minutes left. Jacob Brown chased a lost cause to nip in behind the home backline, nodding the ball into the path of fellow substitute Cauley Woodrow. However, the ball bounced up awkwardly and Woodrow could not divert his shot past the keeper.

It would prove to be a crucial moment.

Then, as six additional minutes were indicated by the officials, the Town were then reduced to 10 men when Tom Holmes was shown a second yellow card.

And within a minute of being a man light, the Town fell behind. Simms' header from a right-wing cross fell into the path of Wright whose initial header was stopped by Kaminski but the striker was quickest to the loose ball to bundle home and spark celebrations among the home crowd.


Trailing at the death he Town couldn't conjure an equaliser and that was that.

The Baggies have started the season well and sit in fifth place but come into the game this evening without a win in six matches.


Carlos Corberan's side came up short in the play-offs last season and were beaten in the semi-finals by Southampton, who were eventually promoted to the top tier.

West Brom got off to an electric start to the season and picked up five wins and one draw in their first six matches. Since then, form has dropped off slightly and they are yet to win a match since September.

Interestingly, Albion have drawn their last four fames in a row. Out of these draws against Millwall, Oxford United, Blackburn Rovers and Cardiff, three of these games finished goalless.

West Brom striker Josh Maja has had a great start to the season so far and sits on seven goals out of the first twelve games and is one of the top scorers in the league.

A warm welcome to Kenilworth Road to all those associated with West Bromwich Albion, who have fond memories of their last visit – a 3-2 win in January 2023 that saw the Baggies overturn a 2-0 deficit.

Norwegian defender who signed for Albion in the summer on a three-year deal from IF Brommapojkarna.

MASON HOLGATE

Previous experience at the likes of Everton, Barnsley, Southampton and Sheffield United. Now on his second stint at the Hawthorns on loan.

MIDFIELDERS

ALEX MOWATT

Box-to-box midfielder with years of Championship experience. Amassed over 100 appearances for Leeds and Barnsley and nearing that for West Brom.

UROS RACIC

Serbian midfielder who joined West Brom on loan this summer from Sassuolo. Already played eight times and registered two assists.

JOHN SWIFT

Chelsea academy product who has been a regular in the second tier since 2016. Joined the Baggies in 2022 after leaving Reading.

TOM FELLOWS

West Brom academy graduate making a name for himself in the second tier. Scored at Kenilworth Road for England Under-21s in September.

CALLUM STYLES

Hungarian international who started off at Bury before becoming a



highly rated midfielder at Barnsley. Signed for West Brom in the summer after multiple loans away.

FORWARDS

JOSH MAJA ▲

Former Sunderland frontman who is back in the Championship scoring goals. Has scored seven goals in 12 games so far this season.

GRADY DIANGANA

Technical winger who signed for West Brom permanently in 2020 following a successful loan spell. Scored two goals at Kenilworth Road against Luton in 2019.

MIKEY JOHNSTON

Former Celtic man who enjoyed a successful spell on loan with the Baggies last season. Has since signed on permanently and been a regular so far this term.

KARLAN GRANT

Striker with vast experience in the second tier. Has scored over 20 goals in around 100 games for the Albion.

2020/21 HOME

As recent shirts go, Albion's iconic navy and white striped effort from 2020/21 takes some beating. The 'barcode' design is a nod to the Baggies' 1992-94 home shirts. Puma take the credit making a crisp effort, complimented by sponsors Ideal Boilers (minus the mascot).

A FOOT IN BOTH



CURTIS DAVIES

Academy graduate Curtis joined the Town as a 16-year-old and broke into the first team at 18. helping the Hatters win League One in 2004/05. In August 2005 he made a £3m move to the Hawthorns where he was a mainstay in central defence before joining Aston Villa. After spells at Birmingham, Hull, Derby and Cheltenham he retired this summer.

HAWTHORNS HERO

Dutchman Richard Sneekes rocked up the Hawthorns in 1996, a £400,000 signing from Bolton after helping the Trotters reach the Premier League in 1994/95.

Then-boss Alan Buckley claimed the midfielder would take time to make a difference but he almost immediately became a cult hero. So much was the impression he made on the Baggies faithful that many of them were seen sporting long blonde wigs.

Sneekes scored 10 goals in his last 13 games in

his first season in the West Midlands, helping them to avoid the drop in the process, before going on to spend

seven seasons at the Hawthorns. In total he made 253 appearances for the Baggies, scoring 34 goals.

Defender looks back on his involvement in our past two home fixtures

It's fair to say it's been a rollercoaster last few weeks for defender Tom Holmes.

The former Reading centre-half was given his first start in the local derby triumph over Watford, produced a man-of-the-match performance against league leaders Sunderland and then was sent-off last weekend at Coventry.

After the defeat to Sunderland, the 24-year-old said: "I've had to be quite patient. Unfortunately, there's been some injuries but it's meant there's been an opportunity there, so I'm just enjoying it, taking each game as it comes."

Having just featured 14 minutes for the Town prior to the Watford victory, Holmes was then frustrated to be forced off at half-time against the Hornets but was glad to make it back for the midweek clash with Sunderland.

"It was quite a heavy impact. I was unsure whether it might be concussion," he explained. "I didn't feel comfortable going out to play the second half, so I came off and then recovered on the Sunday, felt a lot better on the Sunday and then managed to train, so I felt all right."

On being involved in derby day victory, the centre-half said: "I'd say it was the best atmosphere that I've been a part of in football, it was incredible. I've seen bits, seen previous derbies, seen bits in games, so I kind of had a feel of what it was going to be like and then to play it was electric.

"The crowd is vital, it really adds 10, 15 per cent to

our game. I think they're definitely the 12th man. It's like no other place in the English league, so we can really use that to our advantage."

However after the highs of beating the Hornets the Town were brought back down to earth against the Black Cats, despite an encouraging performance that saw the team applauded off the pitch at the end by the Hatters faithful.

"From start to finish I think we were the better team," said Holmes.

"In the second half there was a little spell where we didn't quite match the

energy. They capitalised on their chances, but on the whole I think we really deserved at least a point from the game.

"Performance-wise, the last two home games, I think the energy and the intensity, the way we're playing, that's typical of Luton teams that I've played against in the past, so I think that will stand us in good stead moving forward.

"Now it's just the standard cliché, recover the wounded soldiers in there and just attack them, keep the intensity, keep the energy to our performances."

Morris has faith in Town squad to move up the Championship table

Carlton Morris found the target for the fourth time in his last four games at Coventry last weekend but the striker would happily trade those goals for league points with the Town finding themselves in the Championship's bottom three.

And the frontman, who took his tally to 35 in Luton colours since joining from Barnsley two years ago, believes the Hatters have what it takes to turn their fortunes around.

"If I'm honest, I haven't given scoring goals

much thought until right now – I'm just incredibly frustrated with the results at the moment, said the team captain.

"However, I look around the changing room and I see my team-mates, I see the squad, I see the staff and I have faith that we can turn this around, and with the crucial players that we are going to get back in the coming weeks, there's absolutely no reason why we can't go on a run in this division of picking up a lot of points throughout the Christmas period.

"We know exactly what we're capable of and we're not even at full tilt yet, we know we've got a lot more to give going forward, it's just about executing it, not just talking about it. Against West Brom we'll have another opportunity to go out there and show it."

After beating local rivals Watford, the Town have lost back-to-back games. Despite an impressive performance against Sunderland and leading 2-0 at Coventry, they were left empty-handed.

And Morris refused to make any excuses.

"It's been a big week, we've had three massive games, it just shows the importance to win when you're on top and it makes the Sunderland game even more frustrating because the performance was there and the points weren't.

"At Coventry the performance nor the points were there, but that usually balances itself out, so it just shows the importance of winning when you're playing well.

"I'm not going to stand here and make excuses, we know we ultimately we need to be better. We've got enough experience and strong players at this level to do even more, so it's just a lot of frustration at the moment, but we're not just going to lie down and take it, we're going to come back fighting.

"I think we felt like a threat going forward in the first half even though sometimes we are going to be under it. But credit to Coventry they put us under pressure in that first half, but we dealt with it really well and even showed threat going forward.

"This could have been one of those textbook away performances where we dig in, but we weren't able to do that and we're in there having a conversation as players after and we put that on ourselves. We know we need to do more, at 2-0 up at this level we had enough to see that out."

On Friday night, Sheffield Wednesday piled more misery on Portsmouth and picked up a 2-1 win at Fratton Park. This was thanks to a Michael Smith screamer in the last 20 minutes.

The following day, Bristol City and Leeds played out a 0-0 draw at Ashton Gate. The Hatters lost 3-2 to Coventry on the road and Burnley and QPR also drew 0-0. Derby drew 1-1 at home against Hull after two second half goals meant the points were shared; Watford meanwhile beat Blackburn 1-0.

Plymouth completed a remarkable comeback at home against Preston.
The Lilywhites were 3-0 up at Home Park but three second half goals, including an injury time equaliser from Morgan Whittaker, meant that the Pilgrims managed to salvage a point.

Sheffield United beat Stoke 2-0 thanks to goals from Kieffer Moore and former Stoke striker Tyrese Campbell. Leaders Sunderland also picked up a 2-0 win at home after beating Des Buckingham's Oxford side at the Stadium of Light to five points clear at the top of the table.

Millwall got a big three points away at Swansea City after a last-minute winner from Casper de Norre. The Lions have now won four, drawn four, and lost four.

Today's opponents West Brom played out a 0-0 draw at the Hawthorns against Cardiff City. This was quite the opposite to the game at Carrow Road the next day between Norwich and Middlesbrough which finished 3-3 in what was a remarkable game that saw Boro lead 3-1.

Preserving and appreciating the heritage and history of Luton Town Football Club

There's no point sugarcoating it. Luton have a terrible record against West Bromwich Albion.

In fact, of all teams played 10 times or more, only Manchester United have beaten the Hatters a higher percentage of times (73%) than the Baggies (57%).

Wins can be found though. In December 1957 Gordon Turner struck twice in a 5-1 thumping, leaving home fans even more convinced that Turner should be in the England team given he looked a far more complete inside-forward than the Baggies' internationals Bobby Robson and Derek Kevan:

Then, in 1975, the visitors player-manager Johnny Giles was sent off after just 20 minutes for a foul on Ron Futcher, helping Town secure a 2-1 win over their promotion chasing rivals on a day when 2,000 extra supporters swelled the gates as part of the 'Save our Town' campaign.

Fast forward to 1983 and the Albion played their part in an historic event at Kenilworth Road – the first league match to take place on a Sunday in the 98-year history of the club.

The thinking was pretty straightforward. With the match originally scheduled for the last shopping Saturday before Christmas, the Town's always innovative commercial department felt moving the game back 24 hours would give a boost to flagging attendances, caused in no small part by the wildly unpopular Milton Keynes location plans. Just a few weeks before, 2,000 people had attended a rally opposing the move, marching from Pope's Meadow to Kenilworth Road at a funeral pace.

The shift to a Sunday posed problems. With restrictive trading laws to consider the club were forced to offer a 'free entry' turnstile to the game, an option which around 400 fans took up. Still though, an attendance of 11,566, a reasonable uptick of around 1,000 from the previous home game, was likely higher than it would have been if played on Saturday.

On the pitch it was the Baggies in far more strife. Injury hit, not even the return of Cyrille Regis and the signing of Tony Morley could inspire them. When Ray Daniel was brought down in the box four

minutes before half-time Brian Horton made no mistake from the spot, and the result was in little doubt even before Trevor Aylott's fine goal just after the hour.

The visitors' misery was compounded moments later by the sending off of future Spurs manager Martin Jol. The West Brom press were unsympathetic. "'Jol was lucky," one said, "I wish I could have gone home 20 minutes early..."



In a miserable game, Rangers' Warren Neill scores the only goal with a back pass which beats his advancing goalkeeper, David Seaman.

Ashley Grimes and Tim Breacker both miss the match through injury for the Hatters and this gives a perfect opportunity for 17-year-old Richard Harvey to make his Luton debut.

At the end of the season the Town finished in their highest position of seventh in the topflight while Rangers ended the season in 16th.

Champions!

Over the course of the season we'll be looking back 20 years to the glorious League One championship winning season of 2004/05.

So many club league records were tumbled during a momentous campaign which was even more remarkable considering that the summer of 2003 saw the arrival of new 'owner' John Gurney and his crackpot ideas, which ultimately led to the Hatters needing to enter administrative receivership, with all its problems, to get rid of him. Club historian Roger Wash tells the story of a season to remember.



2004/05 history

After two straight defeats the message from manager Mike Newell was simply "Don't panic".

He indicated that he was not too excited when the team had won 10 and drawn two of their first 12 games and was not going to get excited now, following two below par performances.

Next up was a first ever visit to the new K-Com Stadium at Hull. The Tigers were in a play-off position and a crowd of 18,575, including a good number from Luton, gathered to see Stephen O'Leary replace the suspended Ahmet Brkovic in an otherwise unchanged side.

It was O'Leary who came closest in the opening exchanges when his glancing header brought the best out of Hull goalkeeper Boaz Myhill. Straight after this let-off Hull went straight down the other end to take the lead in bizarre fashion.

Out on the left, winger Stuart Elliott swung over a hopeful cross which sailed over Dino Seremet to nestle in the top corner of the net. "Brilliant goal" said the Hull fans – "Complete fluke" said everyone else.

Steve Howard went close at the other end before the second goal came on 22 minutes which again had an element of fortune about it. Myhill punted a long ball forward, Seremet and Paul Underwood got in a tangle leaving Delroy Facey to nip in to net from an angle.

The Town did not give up and thought they had reduced the deficit when Kevin Foley smacked the ball in from 20 yards only for referee Trevor Parkes to disallow the effort because a Luton player was in an offside position, supposedly in line with the goalkeeper, and interfering with his view.

The lead was increased further before the interval when a long throw from Facey caused havoc in the Luton defence leaving Elliott with time and space to nudge the ball over the line with his knee.

The game was as good as over on the hour mark when Kevin Nicholls was dismissed for, according to the referee, leading with his arm in an aerial duel with Elliott. Hull stroked the ball around after this but seemed satisfied with their afternoon's work and did not really trouble the 10 men.

Newell was very annoyed after the game with his rant directed at the referee. "If you have never played the game before, and it's clear that the referee never has just by looking at him, you'll never know that by challenging for a 50/50 ball your arm will come up.

"The referee was arrogant and refused to speak to me but I can't blame him solely for our defeat. We've had a bad week, lost three in a row and need to get out of it as quickly as possible."


The Town now had a week to put the defeats

behind them and prepare for the visit of second placed Bradford City who had won their last five games in a row.

Before doing so the players and supporters had a chance to see a BBC2 documentary entitled 'Trouble at the Top' which exposed the short reign of unpopular former managing director John Gurney – he of the 80,000 seater stadium on stilts and building a Formula One race track.

With first choice goalkeeper Marlon Beresford still a couple of weeks away from full fitness it was decided to take his deputy Dino Seremet out of the firing line and bring in the experienced Simon Royce on loan from Charlton for a month.

Putting their previous week's disappointment behind them the Town put on a superb display and were on the front foot from the first minute.

It was no surprise when the returning Brkovic put the Hatters ahead on 14 minutes but what a goal. Adjusting his feet following a Howard knock back in the area, the 'Croatian Sensation' sent in a perfectly flighted overhead kick which beat Bantams goalkeeper Paul Henderson all ends up.

Howard doubled the lead shortly after the half hour mark when he took advantage of a low cross from Paul Underwood to convert at the far post. Underwood turned from provider to scorer four minutes later when he drilled the ball home following a clever pass from Brkovic.

With their tails up the Hatters continued to attack in the second period and the game was made completely safe on 69 minutes when Henderson fumbled a Howard shot leaving Brkovic to sneak n for his second goal of the afternoon.



Controversy reigned after the final whistle with Hull's Dean Windass dismissed for a second yellow card for confronting the referee Joe Ross. Apparently a frustrated Windass said something to the official only to be greeted with '4-0, 4-0.' Windass took exception and continued to get in the referee's

ear leading to his sending off. Naturally Ross denied goading the visiting striker!

Mike Newell was very pleased. "They showed their belief and ability and there's no doubt that on their day they can beat anyone in the league," he said.

Town shirt collector, David Foxen, aka @lutontownkits, goes through his selection of shirts in orange, white, blue – and all colours in between.

Typically our goalkeeper shirts are a lovely blue, green, pink, black, or even yellow, so this shirt is a rarity given it is a shiny silver! I will accept any arguments for saying this is a light grey too, but I am going with silver!

We did have a similar shirt the previous year, but we will save that one for another article...

Made my Diadora, the 2006/07 silver goalkeeper shirt follows the same template as the classic home and away shirt from that era. We have the Diadora spots on the shoulder, the Electrolux sponsors across the front, the centralised badge and, of course, a splash of orange across the right shoulder.

Where this shirt did differ from its home and away compatriots is in the collar. The home and away shirt featured an orange block on the righthand side, whereas this shirt features two black blocks on the collar, either side of the neckline. Not exactly groundbreakingly different, but a useful fact for you all!

We typically wore this shirt during away games, with the green version being used for home fixtures as the silver and white combo was a bit of a clash.

This shirt really reminds me of Marlon Beresford, but there were three goalkeepers who wore this throughout the season, one of which you may have forgotten about.

Marlon was the main man between the sticks for most of the season, but injury saw Dean Brill step in to make 11 league appearances and Ireland international Dean Kiely who joined us on loan from Portsmouth. I remember him making several top saves, and I think most Luton fans

would have taken him permanently if that were possible! After his spell with the Town Dean would go on and serve our visitors West Brom with distinction, helping them win the Championship the following season.

Off the pitch, the 2006/07 season for the Hatters was full of uncertainty, with players being sold, change in club ownership and, ultimately, relegation to League One.

That might be a reason as to why we haven't had a silver or grey goalkeeper shirt since!

LESSONS LEARNED FOR YOUNGSTERS

The Town Under-18s slipped to their first defeat in the Youth Alliance since the opening day after going 2-1 down against Bromley on Saturday morning.

Joe Deeney's side got off to the perfect start by going ahead after just 34 seconds. Matthew Takawira sped down the right flank and unselfishly cut the ball back for Tate Xavier-Jones to finish superbly from the edge of the box.

Ahead, the Hatters went on to dominate, creating several chances and winning the ball high up the pitch.

However, for all their dominance, the Town

youngsters could not punish Bromley and a minute before half-time the visitors were level when their centre-half nodded home following a corner.


Bromley almost snatched the lead in first-half stoppage time but they did find the net just four minutes after the restart. After conceding possession high up the pitch the Town were backpedalling as the host attacked. Charlie Booth made an excellent save to deny one effort but the hosts regained the ball and Booth could do nothing about an excellent strike.

It was all the Town after that but the home side defended superbly to keep the Hatters at bay as they chased an equaliser.

Despite the pressure, Deeney's side could not find a way through the Bromley backline and the Ravens held on to secure all three points.

A frustrated Deeney told lutontown.co.uk afterwards: "We couldn't have got off to a better start but after not taking our chances you always felt, watching from the sidelines, that we were going to get punished and so it proved.

"Credit to Bromley, they put bodies on the line and defended for their lives at times but we couldn't find an equaliser.

"My message to the lads afterwards was that the basics need to be outstanding. For large parts of the game we did that really well: our ball speed, minimum touches, forward progress, closing down, one-versusones were all excellent. If anything I think the lads felt the game had become too easy.

"That meant we allowed Bromley back in the match and they managed the game well to take the points.

"There's loads of lessons for our players and hopefully they've been humbled a bit by that. All the stats – regains, chances – pointed to a good performance but, and I know it's a cliché, it's what happens in both boxes that matters the most and where games are decided. Bromley did that and we didn't.

"There were positives but, when you lose, it's important to focus on the areas in which we need to improve."

Town coach John Moore first spotted Tringborn Julian playing in a county schools match at Hemel Hempstead and he eventually signed professional forms in June 1988.

Julian had a debut to forget when he was sent-off for a supposed professional foul when making his full Hatters bow in a Littlewoods Cup tie at Leeds the following season, but his evening was not completely ruined as the Town did go on to win the tie.

First and foremost a defender, James could play anywhere along the back and his versatility became a godsend to a succession of Luton Town managers.

Capped twice for England at under-21 level, he became a regular in the Hatters side in 1991/92 and apart from injuries was a feature in the team until a badly broken leg suffered at Bristol Rovers in April 1998 effectively ended his career.

The game at the Memorial Ground would prove to be one-club Julian's final game for the Town after sterling service which saw him score 14 times in 335 games.

Other participants are much newer to the game and use the TIPS sessions to learn basic skills and techniques whilst developing their confidence in playing the game.


Those that excel within the TIPS programme

South Asian Football Programme

My favourite goal came along on 14th May 1983, that famous afternoon at Maine Road when Luton beat Manchester City 1-0 to stay in the first division and relegate City at the same time.

The goal was scored by Raddy Antic and is remembered by me but not just because of David Pleat's pitch dance.

I am sure this is many a Hatters favourite moment but I have a slightly different reason for it being my personal highlight.

My cousin lan and I were following in our father's footsteps as Hatters fans and season ticket holders. My best friend then and now, Andy Jones, and lan's best mate Brian were both Man City fans.

I borrowed my mum's mini metro with the Hatters fans in the front and the City fans in the back as we embarked on our journey north, with much optimism and banter on the upward journey from all sides of the car, as you can imagine.

I had no idea where we were going but managed to park in a terraced side street. We went our separate ways: they went to the Kippax and we went to our corner of the ground, swelling with orange and white pride (much as today).

The game as I remember was nothing to write home about with few chances to either side. City only needed a draw to stay up and seemed content to sit in but Luton couldn't create many openings.

Until, as we know, with about five minutes to go some pressure down the right and a cross from Brian Stein was punched half-clear by the keeper, it fell to our creative Serbian midfielder Raddy Antic who obliged with a volley into the bottom corner. It seemed to all happen in slow motion as if it were a dream but what a goal, what a moment, it was real. The Town are staying up.

As anyone who went to Maine Road will know, we were kept in the ground for about an hour for our own safety, eventually with our scarves well-hidden and not really knowing where we were going we found the car with two forlorn friends standing beside it waiting in silence.

I will let you imagine the atmosphere on the 170mile journey home. No talking in the back!

I am still best mates with Andy and now that City have won everything I clearly have to bring him back to earth with memories of 1983 every so often!








Five-star Hatters progress to League Cup third round

Less than two minutes on the clock and Luton should have took the lead, a darting run on the right-hand side from Spillman saw her progress into the box and set up Amber Leighton, but she was unable to keep her shot down.

It took the Hatters five minutes to open the scoring. After the ball fell kindly for Spillman, she made no mistake, firing the ball into the back of the net, from close range.

Despite taking the lead, Luton showed no signs of slowing down and almost added a second on the next attack. Swarres cut the ball back across the box, in the direction of Partridge, who was readied for the tap in, but a Hertford defender produced a vital piece of defending, clearing the ball off the line and out for a corner.

After 25 minutes Swarres almost doubled Luton's lead. She found herself in space about 20 yards out and fired the ball goalwards, but just as the ball appeared to be dipping in it crashed against the crossbar.

However eight minutes later Swarres got her goal. An out swinging corner from Buttigieg, was met again by the head of Swarres to make it 2-0.

With five minutes of the half to play, the Town scored their third. Partridge got onto the ball just past the halfway line. She played the ball into Leighton, who flicked it on with her head, playing Fensome through on goal and with the keeper rushing out, she expertly lobs the ball over the keeper and into the net.

A fairly quiet start to the second half was interrupted when Partridge got on the scoresheet on the hour mark. After some quick feet, she found herself one-on-one with the keeper and with the aid of a deflection, slotted the ball into the net.

Moments later, Hertford's shot stopper produced another fine save, this time to deny Spillman. A perfectly weighted pass from Partridge set Spillman off on a run, she took aim at the near post, but no way past the keeper, who was equal to it.

In the fourth minute of additional time, Fensome wrapped the game up with her brace. She found space in behind the defence and with the keeper off her line, she curled the ball into the net with her left foot, to wrap up a perfect performance.







Last night's Halloween ghosts may be gone, but the spectre of a haunting month lingers as November dawns, fresh from an October that gave us some genuine chills.

Tonight, Town face West Bromwich Albion, with few hopes for an easy night. Remember, remember their last visit here, when Carlton Morris and Elijah Adebayo scored in the first half, only to lose 3-2. Sound eerily familiar?

Luton's October was a tale of treats, but many more tricks. The high point? A thrilling 3-0 derby day romp against Watford, and a spirited but albeit defeated fight against Sunderland.

These games showed glimpses of the intense, gritty Luton we know and love.

Yet, the rest of the month was something

of a spooktacular. Dare I remind you of leading Oxford 2-0 only to battle for a draw? And then there was Sheffield United — a performance best left buried — but then rivalled by the painful 3-2 reverse at Coventry on Saturday.

If there's a harrowing pattern here, it's Luton's struggle with holding results, and Coventry's second half surge reopened old wounds.

West Brom arrive tonight in form that could be favourable — which I write while observing any and every superstitious nonsense that will stave off the screams at that prediction.

The Baggies haven't scored much, with just one goal in the last

month, but they're as stubborn as they come at the back, coming to Kenilworth Road from two of three October goalless draws.

Right now, I'd welcome a boring stalemate if it means seeing out a clean sheet.

However, it's trickier tonight with the absences of Alfie Doughty and Tom Holmes due to suspensions. Doughty has been pivotal for Luton's attacking output, while Holmes, despite his red card at Coventry, is carving out the early signs of cult hero status.

Their absence, along with a growing injury list, largely in defence, leaves gaps to fill. So, it's a time for heroes, on and off the pitch.

The stakes only rise from here, and a craving for consistency of a less ghoulish type has rarely been greater. Defeats leave scars, and they're especially deep and fresh from the Coventry loss, but you have summoned a fighting spirit in the last two Kenilworth Road clashes and that will be needed again.

You've spooked the Harry Potter lot and rattled Sunderland, with a night time tale that will frighten most opposition into submission.

If you can keep the Kenny a scary place, that alone could prove a starting point in Town's search for stability because we've all had our fill of tricks. Treats from here on in?
