

Good evening and welcome back to Kenilworth Road to you all for this important Championship clash with Cardiff City.

I'd like to extend those greetings to Omer Riza and his Cardiff side who arrive here in Bedfordshire in great form. They have improved considerably since Omer has gone in, so congratulations to him.

Therefore tonight represents another difficult game as they come thick and fast, especially here at the Kenny where our performances have been to a very good level recently.

Welcome back everybody, to Kenilworth Road, where we find ourselves a little over a quarter of the way through this season and now well and truly reminded of the relentless nature of Championship football, with yet another midweek fixture under the lights about to kick off.

It's fair say, that even as the squad has adapted back to the packed schedule, they have yet to hit the heights of which we all know they are capable. There are though encouraging signs that better form is just around the corner. I am no football expert but, like every other fan, I've never let that stop me giving an opinion on exactly what has just gone right or wrong out on the pitch. One thing I do understand

is that there is a degree of randomness to the game, a 50-50 call from the officials that goes in the opposition's favour, a deflection that loops agonisingly over the bar when it could just have easily dropped into the net. And it does feel to me as though right now our luck is not in.

As a finance professional, the other thing I obviously understand are numbers. Some people will tell you that the only statistic that counts in football is the final score. and you can't argue that they have a point, in this industry you live and die by results. Thankfully the squad is now nearing full strength, with several key players welcomed back from long term injuries on Friday and a number of others serving suspensions over the last few games, it will be interesting to see what starting line-up Rob and his staff go with tonight.

Whichever way they go, they will have strong options on the bench.

It always takes new player a significant amount of time to fully hit their stride at a new club, but we are happy with the progress being made by all of our recent signings. Mark McGuinness is looking more assured with every game, Tom Krauß's high energy pressing and eye for a killer pass are showing us exactly why he was a regular starter in the Bundesliga, and Victor Moses is displaying all the versatility that has made him such an elite player, whilst still putting in some serious minutes for us.

There were some big milestones hit against West Bromwich Albion

last Friday night with Tahith Chong scoring on his 50th appearance for Luton, whilst Jordan Clark not only made his 350th career start, but also his 150th for us. Unfortunately, despite creating the better chances, the match ended in stalemate, which makes this another big week for the club. Given we came from a goal behind and it lifted us out of the bottom three, we can still view that draw as a point gained. But we must now look to back it up with more points and good performances tonight and on Saturday, so let's hope for more fireworks!

The first of those tasks will not be an easy one as we welcome a Cardiff City team who are currently top of the Championship form table. Their squad includes a familiar face from our promotion winning team of 2022/23, goalkeeper Ethan Horvath, who we look forward to welcoming back to Kenilworth Road and thank for the part he played in that historic campaign, although we all hope he leaves with less fond memories on this occasion.

In the wider world, the Football Governance Bill and independent Regulator, are high on the political agenda once again. You can rest assured that it remains very much a part of the club's DNA to operate sustainably and we will continue to support this process.

There was great news for the Luton Town Ladies team as they progressed into the second round of the FA Cup and remain on course to emulate last season's achievement of reaching the fourth round, where they eventually lost to WSL outfit Brighton. We have

The Town had to settle for a share of the spoils in a scrappy draw against draw-specialists West Brom.

Showing two changes to the side that lost at Coventry the previous weekend with Amari'i Bell and Teden Mengi replacing the suspended Tom Holmes and Alfie Doughty, the Town started well.

But both sides struggled to find their passing accuracy in a turgid first half.

Carlton Morris' shot on the turn on 24 minutes was held by Alex Palmer in the Albion goal before the visiting keeper then stopped Elijah Adebayo's shot moments later

But just when it looked as though both sides would go in at the break level with the score blank, the Baggies led in the fourth minute of added time at the end of the half. Karlan Grant's low cross from the left was back-flicked goalwards by Josh Maja and his effort bobbled through the legs of Jordan Clark and rolled agonisingly into the net.

At the start of the second half, the Town made a change, Shandon Baptiste replacing Victor Moses and shortly before the hour mark, a double change saw Adebayo and Tom Krauß make way for Liam Walsh and Jacob Brown.

And the changes had the desired effect as the Hatters began to reassert the pressure and on the hour it was level. Tahith Chong pounced on a loose ball 25 yards from goal, raced forward and swept a fine, low, left-foot finish past Palmer's out-stretched hand.

Four minutes later the Kenilworth Road end appealed in vain for a penalty after the ball appeared to bounce off the arm of Albion's Callum Styles only for referee Dean Whitestone to wave away the shouts.

It was then Albion's turn to press and the Hatters were thankful to some strong defending from Mark McGuinness to get in the way as the shots from the visitors headed goalwards.

Chong came mighty close to putting the Town in front with 15 minutes left only for Palmer to get a glove on the midfielder's deflected effort.

Half chances came and went for the Town. Walsh whizzed a shot wide and Baptiste's header at the backpost was cleared by the Albion back-line as the Hatters pushed for a late winner.

Then, with six minutes left, the Town thought they'd got all three points when Daiki Hashioka's header from a Baptiste corner crashed off the woodwork.

The final chance fell to the visitors and the Hatters had Thomas Kaminski to thank for pushing away Devante Cole's overhead kick with a minute left and it proved to be the final chance.

Goalscorer Tahith Chong paid tribute to boss Rob Edwards for his reaction at half-time as the Hatters came from behind to earn a point against West Brom in our last match here on Friday.

The Town conceded a goal against the run of play against the Baggies to go into the interval behind.

But Chong, on his 50th appearance for the club, levelled the score on the hour with a superb low shot to give the Hatters a share of the spoils.

And afterwards the Dutch youth international had nothing but praise of the manager for his calm pep-talk during the break.

"The manager made his adjustments so it's compliments to him as well and compliments to the boys for taking it on board," said Chong.

"He's positive and still being critical, and we knew we had to give more. We knew we had to come out flying in the second half and give more energy and press more and kind of go after the game and that's basically what he said to us.

"The boys took that on well, but we're still slightly disappointed as we really wanted to win the game.

We felt like we deserved to win but sometimes that's football and you don't always get what you deserve.

"We felt very unlucky to concede right before half-time.

"It's kind of been a season this year where sometimes we play well and then, for the first time or second time, they get into our box and they score and you go in at half-time 1-0 down.


"But I've got to give compliments to the manager as well, the way he came in and made adjustments and the calmness but still motivated us to go back out there.

"The way he spoke to us, he knew we didn't deserve to be 1-0 down, so he was very calm and tried to motivate us to give that same energy again and try and get that last bit of quality."



CARDIFF 1-2 TOWN 20TH FEBRUARY 1994

After beating Newcastle after a replay in the fourth round, the Town headed to Ninian Park for a FA Cup fifth round tie in 1994.

Ahead the Hatters are looking good but the Bluebirds level thanks to Phil Stant's well-struck equaliser.

All of a sudden the momentum is with the hosts but the Town regain control and David Preece races through on goal and calmly slots home to send the Hatters into the

quarter-finals. The home support are enraged, claiming offside, but there were no arguments at the final whistle.

The Town would go on to beat West Ham after a replay in the last eight before losing to Chelsea at Wembley in the semifinal.



Preserving and appreciating the heritage and history of Luton Town Football Club

Who's the most skillful footballer you've ever seen in a Hatters' shirt?

The answer will likely depend on your age. We've been spoilt by Ross Barkley. Marveled at Jean-Louis Valois. Thrilled by Ricky Hill.

For Brian Swain, legendary Town journalist, the answer was clear, "ask 100 fans of my generation to name the most complete footballer...I'll bet you would get the same answer at least 90 times: George Cummins."

On his day, according to Swain, "he could do the sort of tricks George Best produced at the height of his career". Roger Wash, writing in 1993, was equally as effusive, "he was capable of carving open a defence with a single touch. A player of skill and vision".

Cummins was born in Dublin in 1931. He'd won schoolboy honours while playing for St. Patrick's Athletic and took a summer holiday to Merseyside at the age of 19 for a trial at Everton.

Though returning home thinking he hadn't

made the grade, the next day brought an offer from Toffees manager Cliff Britton. Everton were chosen ahead of Manchester United because of their stronger Irish contingent.

His time at Goodison Park was not without its high spots, including an appearance in the 1953 FA Cup semi-final, but it proved a struggle to hold down a first team place. Approached by Town chairman Charles Jeyes, he had no hesitation about moving south. The fee was £12,000, a record for Luton, but it would prove to be a bargain.

Immediately, second division defences

struggled with his perceptive play and natural ability and promotion to the topflight came in 1955.

"There has always been a good spirit at Luton. It was that, plus excellent football, that won us promotion," he said in a 1959 interview.

Speaking later in life to Roger Wash, he marked out the big wins against Sunderland (7-1 and 8-2) as particular highlights and, like everyone else of that great 50s team, the 1959 FA Cup final as the low point.

He would prepare for home games by visiting the cinema the night before with Billy Bingham. George played 19 times for Ireland while at Kenilworth Road, a club record until passed by Mal Donaghy.

A family man, he settled in Aintree after retirement and worked as an electrician, though his ties to Luton were maintained by his son Brian, who lectured at Luton Sixth Form college.

George passed away in 2009, one of the very finest of any generation to wear the shirt.

ON THIS DAY

We go back in time on this day in the Hatters' history books



Back on this day in 1982 the Hatters fought back from two goals down to earn a point in a pulsating 2-2 draw with Arsenal at Kenilworth Road.

In the first half the Town had goalkeeper Jake Findlay to thank in the first half to keep the Gunners at bay but was powerless to see the London side race into a two-goal lead shortly after the restart.

Graham Rix opened the scoring on 53 minutes and two minutes later Brian Talbot doubled the Gunners' advantage.

Yet back came the Town with a two-goal burst of their own to earn a share of the spoils. First David Moss raced onto Brian Horton's clearance to chip Arsenal goalkeeper George Wood with a delightful finish.

Five minutes later we were level when a move involving Moss, Horton and Ricky Hill led to Paul Walsh finding space in behind the Gunners defence to drive a shot goalwards that took a deflection off David O'Leary.



Champions!

Over the course of the season we'll be looking back 20 years to the glorious League One championship winning season of 2004/05.

So many club league records were tumbled during a momentous campaign which was even more remarkable considering that the summer of 2003 saw the arrival of new 'owner' John Gurney and his crackpot ideas, which ultimately led to the Hatters needing to enter administrative receivership, with all its problems, to get rid of him. Club historian Roger Wash tells the story of a season to remember.



2004/05 history

After the resounding 4-0 home win over Bradford City all was well again at Kenilworth Road but as so often happens in the life of a Hatter someone spins a googly to throw you off track.

As the Town prepared for the visit of Wrexham, the Hatters Director of Football, Mick Harford, announced that he was off to Nottingham Forest as assistant to his old friend Joe Kinnear.

Nobody at Kenilworth Road let on that Mick's departure would be anything other than a huge miss and instead concentrated on the job in hand – beating a Wrexham side who faced a winding up order over an unpaid £900,000 Inland Revenue hill

Typical of the man, Mick left a message on a flipchart in the home dressing room saying: "I believe this dressing room is full of champions – go and do it."

Keeping the same side that beat the Bantams the previous week the Town had an early let-off when former Tottenham striker Chris Armstrong missed a sitter. Undeterred by this the Hatters swarmed forward and took the lead on 13 minutes when Steve Howard headed a cross from Kevin Foley to the waiting Ahmet Brkovic who nodded in from ten yards.

Four minutes later came a goal that took the roof off. Full-back Sol Davis had never netted in professional football but that all changed when he accepted a chip from Brkovic before blasting the ball past Matt Baker, who was deputising for ex-Luton hero Andy Dibble in the Wrexham goal.

Stephen O'Leary then bagged his first goal of the season when he fired in a cross from Rowan Vine before top scorer Howard got in on the act, heading in Foley centre a minute before the break.

In the second half the Town continued to press and the fifth goal duly arrived when Brkovic took advantage of a goalkeeper flap and headed the ball into an unguarded net. The clean sheet the Hatters craved did not materialise as Wrexham's Hector Sam scrambled in a consolation with 17 minutes to go.

Manager Mike Newell was particularly pleased with the first-half performance. "The goals were the icing on the cake but we played some decent stuff," he said.

"It sends out a message and people will be in fear when they come here. I want it to be a fortress here and for us to give teams a good hiding and we've done that two weeks in a row now."

Six points clear at the top the Town could now forget about League football for two weeks and instead concentrate on the FA Cup and a pairing with League Two Southend at Roots Hall.


The tie caught the imagination to such an extent that the Sky cameras chose the game for live broadcasting in the

The lead was doubled three minutes later with a goal of real class. Vine broke down the wing and cleverly held the ball up before playing a delightful pass to Howard who blasted home from just inside the penalty area.

Two became three on 33 minutes when Vine again played a clever pass to Brkovic who rounded Bart Griemink in the Southend goal before coolly slotting home.

The second half was played at the Town's pace and long before the end the Sky representatives realised that there was no likelihood whatsoever that a upset was on the cards.

Again, Mike Newell was more than content with the performance. "It's all about getting through to the next round and we did that with a fully professional performance, particularly in the first half," he sadid.

"We were winning all the first and second balls all over the place in the first half and the goals were a bonus. The second and third goals especially were really good footballing goals."

The draw for the second round pitched the Town away to Wycombe but before that could take place there was the little issue of a trip to Milton Keynes!

Town shirt collector, David Foxen, aka @lutontownkits, goes through his selection of shirts in orange, white, blue – and all colours in between.

As this shirt is now over 20 years old, can we now call it a classic? It certainly deserves to be called as such.

Today, we are focusing on the lovely 2002/03 third shirt, made by Xara. This was a lovely navy blue colour with orange stripes down both sides and orange accents on the sleeves and collar. This shirt is so nice, you still see at least one fan wearing this on a match day at Kenilworth Road.

That might be due to the sheer weight and thickness of this shirt. It has certainly been able to stand the test of time. It was so thick and heavy to wear and was a material that was not kind in the summer months or for the players when they sweat (or when it rained!).

The old Nationwide oval sleeve patches are on the sleeves for those match-worn or issued to the players, and the name set was in white with a silver outline. The colour combinations make this shirt look superb.

What wasn't superb was this shirt's only appearance; a 5-2 defeat on the road to Blackpool in August 2002. We actually went 3-0 down and got back to 3-2 thanks to Steve Howard and Tony Thorpe, before Blackpool scored two late goals.

We have trawled through Hatters Heritage and YouTube and cannot find another competitive game that this shirt was worn in! Surely a shirt with one of the fewest appearances for one of our home, away or third shirts!

Still, despite only one competitive appearance, the likes of Matthew Spring, Chris Coyne, Ahmet Brkovic, Kevin Nicolls and Howard wore this shirt during that

game at Bloomfield Road.

And, of course, we had two-time FA and League Cup semi-finalist, a left-back who made over 200 appearances in the Premier League and made over 580 career appearances, 12 of those with the Hatters yes, Alan Kimble played in that game, wearing that shirt.

With a weekend without a fixture in the Youth Alliance, the Town **Under-18s performed** with credit as they went down 2-1 to Tottenham Hotspur last week.

The opening 20 minutes saw few clear-cut opportunities for either side as Spurs dominated the ball.

However, on 25 minutes Tottenham took the lead. Having conceded possession high up the pitch, the Town were suddenly on the back foot and Spurs broke at pace and one pass in behind left the Tottenham striker free to plant a fine finish past Charlie Booth in the Town goal.

In truth, it was the

first time Spurs had threatened the Hatters goal and Joe Deeney's side responded brilliantly as, two minutes later, they were level. Harry Fox swung in a dangerous free-kick from the right and Christian Chigozie was first to meet the delivery to power a header past the Tottenham keeper.

It was no more than the Town deserved and as half-time approached, Deeney's side were in the ascendancy. The Hatters' pressing game was causing Spurs no end of problems and that resulted in a number of half-chances for Zach Ioannides and Archie Shepherd.

Level at the break the

Town continued where they left off at the start of the second half as the Hatters kept their shape with admirable discipline as Tottenham remained patient with the ball.

The Hatters continued to enjoy good moments going forward but midway through the second period Spurs took the lead when a cross flashed into the box was volleyed home to make it 2-1.

Buoyed by the goal, Tottenham pressed for a third only to be denied by two superb fingertip saves from Booth.

Shepherd came close to equalising when forcing the Spurs keeper into a decent save with a drilled

Born in Aldershot but raised in Luton, Bruce made his League debut as a 17-year-old for the Hatters in November 1964.

He soon had the scouts flocking to Kenilworth Road where they admired his pace, power and fierce shooting.

After helping the Town to the championship of Division Four in 1968 and seeing his colleagues narrowly miss out the following year, Bruce accepted a record fee move to Aston Villa.

Further big money moves to Derby and Everton followed as well as the honour of skippering Scotland, the country of his father.

Bruce then entered into a second career managing, amongst others, Middlesbrough, Bolton, Arsenal - where he signed Dennis Bergkamp among others - and Norwich with some success followed by a spell with Odense.

Bruce hit 52 goals in 167 games for the Hatters not bad from a kid from Stopsley!

Dear Sirs,

I should have written this thank you note a long time ago, but I guess better late than never.

Back in May 2022, you held a blood test session at Luton Town Football Club, and I attended. My Dad had died of prostate cancer because he avoided the issue – and that was not going to happen to me. I'd had a test at my doctors and was told I had an enlarged prostate – but nothing to worry about apparently.

Since that test, I had not had a repeat and had moved house and doctors surgery – I fell off the watch list.

The results from the Luton Town Football Club test came back at 3.5 - an amber warning notice result for my age at that time and I took the results along to my new GP. He gave me a test and re-did the blood tests. I was referred to Luton & Dunstable hospital and for my 60th birthday received a biopsy! Joy! But not my best present, but my best present too as it happens.

A very blunt surgeon told me in no uncertain terms I had aggressive prostate cancer and that they would be referring me for surgery. I was Gleason 8 and at Stage 2. Bonus! Surgery. That happened in November 2022. Up until just recently, I was getting great PSA test results, but they are starting to climb again, and it looks like I shall be having further treatment in the not too distant future.

If I had not had that test at the Club, I may not be saying how lucky I've been. If I'd not had that test, the outcome could have been so much worse.

I'd no idea how lucky I was that your organisation did what it does until I started to ask about. I am incredibly grateful. My wife is also incredibly grateful.

Please keep up the good work. Please keep banging the drum.

I've supported Luton for more than 35 years so I have been privileged enough to see so many great players wear the white or orange shirts of our beloved football club.

I am often asked either by friends or in interviews of various kinds who my favourite player has been in my time as a Luton supporter with many expecting the usual answer of Ricky Hill, Mick Harford, Kevin Nicholls or more recently Ross Barkley.

Of course I enjoyed watching all of those fine men strut their stuff for us and appreciated every time I got to see all of them play but one player left a lasting impression on me, as much for his character as anything he did on the pitch.

Don't get me wrong, Jonathan Smith could play. He wasn't the best player in the team but he was the one player our team needed at the time and when he arrived from York in our time of need in the Conference I was delighted.

I had seen him play against us for York and he was part of a good Swindon side which I had seen too. I have always been a fan of midfielders who do the ugly work and don't necessarily get noticed and Smith was that, although he had a goal in him from time to time.

What made him stand out to me was his

positive attitude, a seeming refusal to believe something was impossible. He was an out and out winner and that came across on the pitch and off it.

He was a part of some of my favourite memories as a Town fan, not least that great day at Carrow Road in January 2013 and of course the Conference winning season, albeit one in which his impact was less than it should have been due to that horrific broken leg he suffered at Barnet on Boxing Day. It was poetic that he scored at Wycombe exactly 12 months later.

The way he refused to let that injury stop him and worked so hard to come back at Hyde was admirable and that anything can be achieved. His attitude rubbed off on me in my life and made me push myself harder to achieve things I wouldn't have had the confidence to attempt previously.

In my role as media officer of the Trust, I am fortunate enough to have met Jonathan at club functions and other situations on many occasions and have interviewed him a few times, which was a privilege each and every time.

There is a saying that you should never meet your heroes. I'm glad I met mine, a great player and huge role model.



Ladies complete comeback to progress in FA Cup

Luton Ladies travelled to Essex on Sunday afternoon to take on lower league opposition Hutton Women.

Hutton started off on the front foot and took a shock early lead just three minutes into the game. The goal meant that the Hatters conceded for the first time since the beginning of September.

Tasha Fensome looked to get Luton level just after the 10 minute mark but her effort from just inside the area was well watched and held by the keeper.

On 14 minutes Hutton doubled their lead when they managed to poke the ball past Sarah Hudson in the Town goal.

But less than 10 minutes later, Luton halved the deficit. Fiona Buttigieg whipped in a corner towards Elly Wade whose shot, despite a touch from the keeper, hit the back of the net.

The Hatters came close to an equaliser on the half-hour when Fensome picked up the ball on the right-hand side and her well disguised shot went narrowly wide of the post.

Chances were few and far between for Luton in the first half. The last chance of the half came from Shianne Swarres, her effort from distance was held by the keeper.

Despite a high intensity start to the second half, Luton had to wait until the 53rd minute for their first half-chance when Buttigieg picked out Liz Mulvaney, but she was quickly closed down, with a defender blocking her shot instantly.

However, just before the hour, the Town equalised. Shanice Lewis' shot was blocked, meaning the ball fell to Amber Leighton who managed to poke the ball past the keeper. In the aftermath of the

goal, Hutton was shown a red card for dissent.

The Hatters clearly benefited from the player advantage and this showed when Tasha Fensome completed the comeback. Quick feet from Buttigieg on the lefthand side created space for her to put an inchperfect ball in towards the back-post where the ball met the head of Fensome, who made no mistake from yards out.

We're back at it on Saturday when the Town make the long – and early! – trip north to Middlesbrough.

Michael Carrick's Boro have had an inconsistent start to the campaign, winning five, losing five and drawing three of their 13 games so far this term.

They go into this midweek round of fixtures and ahead of their game away at QPR last night in 11th place in the table.

A run of one win in their last five games has slightly tempered expectations at the Riverside Stadium that had seen Boro rise to sixth in the Championship and just four points off the summit.

However, you only have to look at the results in these past five games to truly realise how the Championship is one of the most unpredictable leagues in the world

Having won at West Brom they led at Watford, only to concede twice in the last 15 minutes to lose 2-1 at Vicarage Road. Two weeks later their unbeaten home record was ended by Bristol City.

Carrick's side then became the second team to defeat Sheffield United when winning 1-0 at the Riverside two weeks ago.

Boro then seemed set to make it back-to-back wins when they led 3-1 at Norwich. Unfortunately Tommy Conway missed a penalty which would have made it 4-1. Norwich then fought back to earn a point and it ended 3-3.

And just when you thought things couldn't get any worse, last weekend Hayden Hackey was sent-off just 22 minutes into Boro's next game against Coventry. Mark Robins' side took full advantage and ran out comfortable 3-0 winners. So it will remain to be seen which Middlesbrough side turn up at the Riverside this coming weekend.

Since the Town were


promoted to the Championship in 2019, Boro hold the edge in the head-to-head meetings winning three of the four meetings played on Teeside including the last three.

The Hatters came out on top in February 2020 with Ryan Tunnicliffe hitting the winner for Graeme Jones' side on our first visit to Boro's new home after we had played in the final league game at Ayresome Park in 1995.

The following season James Collins' penalty was ruled out after his standing foot touched the ball as he slipped in a game Boro went on to win 1-0.

In March 2022, despite a Harry Cornick goal, the Town went down 2-1 at the Riverside and that was the same scoreline on our last visit in December 2022.

In what was Rob Edwards' first game in charge a wonderful strike from Jordan Clark put the Hatters in front. Boro levelled before half-time through Chuba Akpom but Amari'i Bell's dismissal for a second yellow card allowed the hosts to come to win it in the last minute through Matt Crooks.


