

I can assure you all that we care deeply about the football club and want to deliver for you. What does every supporter want in difficult moments? For people to show character and fight, and stand up? Or hide and shy away from it?


We intend to fight and stand up, and hopefully you can do that with us and we can all be united, because we all want the same thing.

# BOARDROOM GARY SWEET

Good afternoon and welcome back to the home comforts of Kenilworth Road for a rare but very welcome 3pm Saturday league match.



Today we host Hull City, who started the season with high hopes under their new manager, Tim Walter, but find themselves on the same number of points in the lower reaches of the Championship table as ourselves with 15 games played.

We welcome everyone who has travelled from the north-east or further afield, including the travelling Tigers support and their full-backs Cody Drameh and Ryan Giles, who we thank for their contribution to our 2022/23 promotion, in Cody's case during his loan spell from Leeds, and to our Premier League campaign, in Ryan's.

Indeed, all players on both sides today will harbour ambitions for their clubs to return to the Premier League and when a short run of wins in this crazy division can take you from the verge of the relegation zone to the periphery of the playoffs, anything is possible.

Encouragingly, it's at Kenilworth Road where our recent performances have shown promising signs of steady improvement and consistency, springboarded by that demonstrable derby day win.

Arguably, our recent home performances have been more consistent than our results. Sometimes you don't get what you deserve, so we certainly hope that our fortune evens out over the course of the season.

However, to acknowledge that we're finding our feet at home is only half the battle. We all know that it's our away record that has been less than satisfactory, since our single-goal victory at Millwall following the first international break in September, culminating in the humbling defeat at Middlesbrough.

Our unsatisfactory away performances and results is a topic which we'll certainly not hide from. Indeed, with the current Championship season having more than two thirds still to run, entering the international break presented us with an opportunity to take a deep, collective breath before reflecting upon our current situation - to fully understand why we're not firing on the requisite number of cylinders that should be seeing us challenging at the other end of the table.

While I could wax lyrical about the specific reasons why I feel we are where we are, I believe it would be far more constructive to explain that this last fortnight has felt like a defining period where, collectively, we have delved in detail and searched our souls to identify how we can gain much more consistency.

Suffice to say though, it is apparent that our Club's culture has been under attack over the last few months. Not by any dastardly enemy, or by

Leagues, Associations (or even referees!), and not by our opposition; but brought on by ourselves.

The pride we have all felt over recent years has been amazing, as we have all enjoyed our unparalleled rise, ticking off four consecutive promotions while upholding the 'Lutonway' by keeping to our principles on and off the pitch and even maintaining a financial sustainability at the envy of many other clubs. A rise which resulted in us arriving at the promised land, with many believing that we had 'reached our destination!

So, it shouldn't be a shock when, upon hitting our first big bump in the road – our first relegation for 15 years – it had more of a seismic effect than perhaps a minor impact of a flat tyre.

There have been many factors at play here too. Pretty much everything we've been through over the last 18 months has been untrod territory for all of us. Despite our experience (and perhaps age), we are still learning. Indeed, many of our supporters won't have been old enough to have experienced or remember what a relegation feels like. We are **all** learning.

Thankfully, our captain Locks is well on his way to full recovery and fitness, but those events that unfolded last December have, quite naturally, had a long-lasting effect on us, but often consciously



forgotten. The summer transfer window was a huge education for everyone involved as we saw unscrupulous agent after unscrupulous agent take pop at selling many of our players an unrealistic fantasy which was a somewhat unplanned and hard to navigate disruption.

Along with a number of other obstacles enroute, I can't deny that we've all been tested over recent months. It's rather obvious that our rise couldn't simply keep continuing – a stall at some point was more than inevitable – but it was always about how we recover from the impact.

The duty to protect our club culture doesn't just fall on those representing us on the pitch or others at the Club. Your willing contribution is also

important. Arguably, too many of us were guilty of high expectations, as a former Premier League club, to continue the level of our performances almost seamlessly.

External factors will always come into play and are often impossible to proactively avoid and, what I would urge everyone to be willing to accept is the submission that this is a process that has needed to run its course, but for us, collectively, to battle on and uphold the 'Lutonway'. This is our own battle, and we are determined to overcome it.

After an inspiring coming of minds over the last few days, we are motivated by the head-strong determination from everyone which we hope will reveal itself today and, more pertinently, at

Leeds and Norwich in the coming days.

This has been a good break for more reasons too, as we've seen as many as eight players go away to represent their country, with Mark McGuinness becoming the latest Luton Town player to be capped at full international level by the Republic of Ireland in their Nations League visit to Wembley last Sunday.

Mark will acknowledge that, whilst possibly the proudest, it possibly wasn't the easiest 90 minutes of his career, coming up against an England side buoyed not only by their 3-0 win in Greece four days earlier, but by a penalty awarded together with a red card for one of his centre-half partners with the score at 0-0.



A bullet header from Jacob Brown was the difference as the Town returned to winning ways with a narrow victory against in-form Cardiff.

The forward netted his second goal of the season to give the Hatters their first win in three games to lift them out of the Championship relegation zone.

Brown rose highest in a crowded penalty area to nod home Alfie Doughty's left-wing corner shortly before the hour to seal the Town's first win since beating Watford last month.

In truth, it was the highlight of a game low on goalmouth action. The closest the Town came in the opening 45 minutes was a Carlton Morris header that flashed over the bar following Doughty's left-wing cross.

Morris and his teammates were convinced the Town should have had a penalty when Callum Chambers handled in the box – only for referee Matt Dononue to wave away the appeals and book Morris for his protests.

Cardiff had showed glimpses of why they arrived in Bedfordshire as one of the Championship's form teams in the first half, and seven minutes after the start of the second half the Bluebirds came close to taking the lead. The Town needed the fine agility of Thomas Kaminski to turn away a top-corner bound diving header from substitute Yakou Meite.

But five minutes later the Hatters were in front. Morris won a corner down the left which was swung in dangerously by Doughty. Brown lost his marker in the penalty area to thump a header past Jak Alnwick in the visitors' goal.

Immediately from the restart Kaminski was needed once more, springing away with a fine fingertip save to prevent David Turnbull's audacious effort from finding the corner.

But that would prove to be the last time the Town keeper was called into action as the Hatters ended the game strongly.


Substitute Elijah Adebayo almost flicked home Morris' cross on 69 minutes and Mark McGuinness, strong in defence all night against his former club, saw a header from a Doughty corner stopped by Alnwick six minutes later.

As time ticked down the Town held firm and despite a late injury to Doughty that saw 10 minutes of added time played.

Cardiff pushed for the latest of levellers but were off wildly off target with two tame efforts and the Hatters were able to celebrate a deserved win.

The Hatters suffered a fourth successive away defeat as high-flying Middlesbrough won 5-1 at the Riverside Stadium.

Manager Rob Edwards made five changes to the side that beat Cardiff 1-0 at Kenilworth Road three days earlier, but his team were broken by four goals in 24 minutes either side of half-time, with Delano Burgzorg and Finn Azaz both netting two, and Emmanuel Latte Lath <u>also on target</u>.

Substitute Jordan Clark netted his third goal of the season with 13 minutes left to reduce the arrears, but it was the hosts who went soaring back into the play-off places.

The Hatters had started well, although it was Boro who had the game's first attempts on goal, Hayden Hackney and Luke Ayling both firing over the bar.

Cauley Woodrow, making his first start of the season, had the Hatters' first shot on target - a 25-yarder from the right side of the area that Seny Dieng punched clear - before Walsh dragged an effort wide.

But Boro took the lead on the half-hour, Burgzorg running onto a loose ball just inside the Town area after a well-worked corner routine from the right.

The hosts took complete control of the game two minutes before half-time when Latte Lath controlled Azaz's chipped pass on his chest, turned and placed a left-footed finish into the bottom corner.

Edwards made one change at the interval, with Victor Moses on in place of captain Amari'i Bell, and Daiki Hashioka switching to left wing-back, with the ex-Chelsea man on the right.

But before they knew it, the Town were three and then four down. First, Hackney set Doak clear and the Scotland international cut back for Azaz to curl into the top corner five minutes after the restart.

In a rare glimpse of attacking intent, Chong set up Woodrow for a shot that was saved by Dieng.

But within seconds, Boro went straight up the other end and made it 4-0 with Burgzorg netting his second after Latte Lath had won the ball ahead of McGuinness, who was the last defender, and played the Dutch forward in for an open goal.

The Town boss made four more changes, immediately introducing Tom Krauß and captain Carlton Morris for Baptiste and Woodrow, before adding Clark and Marvelous Nakamba to the fray just before the hour, in place of Adebayo and Walsh.


The arrears were reduced on 77 minutes when Krauß set up fellow sub Clark to fire past Dieng.

Azaz curled in the goal of the game from the edge of the box, however, and the Hatters brilliant travelling support of almost 700 headed home disappointed.

The Tigers are in town this week and take on the Hatters in what is a big match for both sides.

Hull currently sit in 19th place on 15 points, the same amount as Luton currently have, with the Hatters two places below on goal difference.

Hull started the season poorly and had to wait until late September for their first win, a brilliant 3-1 away victory over Stoke City. This win was followed by back-to-back victories against Cardiff and QPR before things took a turn again.

The 3-1 away win against QPR was followed by a 4-0 defeat to Norwich City at Carrow Road, which started a tough run of results. A 1-0 loss at home to Sunderland before three 1-1 draws in a row saw the Tigers tumble back down the table.

Another two defeats going into the international break has left Hull on 15 points from 15 games. However, Tim Walter will be looking for his side to turn this around with a big run of games to come.

A warm welcome to Kenilworth Road to all those associated with Hull City, especially former Hatters Cody Drameh and Ryan Giles.

He scored ten goals in 132 appearances for us, before leaving in to become player-manager at Hull in June 1984, leading the Tigers to Third Division promotion in his first season. He retired from playing in 1986 after 46 City appearances, and

## **TIGERS HERO**

Scorer of the only goal in that 2007/08 Championship play-off final win over Bristol City, Dean Windass etched his name deeper into Tigers history with that sumptuous volley from the edge of the Wembley box.

Then 38, the forward was in his second spell with his hometown club, who had initially released him as a youngster. Determined to prove them wrong, Windass eventually earned a contract at Boothferry

Park and scored 64 goals

in 205 appearances before his sale to Aberdeen in 1995 helped save City from going bust.

After fruitful spells with Oxford, Middlesbrough, Sheffield United and two at Bradford, he returned to Hull in 2007 initially on loan to help save them from relegation to League One with eight goals in 18 games.

The following year he helped create history with that first promotion to the top-flight, before netting an equaliser against Portsmouth the following season to become the Tigers' oldest-ever scorer at the age of 39.

## FIXTURE FLASHBACK

TIGERS 0-1 TOWN 18TH JULY 2020

The Hatters were staring Championship relegation in the face when football resumed following the Covid lockdown in June 2020 with Nathan Jones reinstalled for a nine-game mini-season, to be played behind-closed-doors.

After winning two, drawing four and losing one of their first seven, Town knew that defeat at drop rivals Hull

on July 18th would almost certainly see them fall through the trapdoor, with a draw not much good for either side

With five minutes left and everyone set for stalemate that would leave Town and Hull level on 46 points, two adrift of fourth-bottom Charlton. Kazenga LuaLua cut inside from the right and

fizzed a low left-footed strike into the bottom corner from 25 yards.

Cue Kaz's trademark somersaults and non social-distancing celebrations from staff and players, who would then pull off the Great Escape by beating Blackburn 3-2 at Kenilworth Road three days later.



Mark McGuinness stressed the importance of gaining three points in the 1-0 win over his former club Cardiff City in the last home game at Kenilworth Road before the international break.

The 23-year-old centreback turned in a solid performance against his previous employers, and speaking to the press afterwards he said: "I think it's really important for us.

## INTERNATIONAL HATTERS

Daiki Hashioka was involved in Japan's two World Cup qualifier wins away at Indonesia and China as we roundup how our international Hatters fared on duty in November.

The 25-year-old started and played the full 90 in the 4-0 drubbing against Indonesia in Jakarta, with former Liverpool wide-man Takumi Minamino and current Southampton defender Yukinari Sugawara on the scoresheet.

Hashi came off the bench in the final 15 minutes in Xiamen to help the Samurai Blue hold out for the win away at rivals China and now stretch to nine points clear at the top of Group C.

Mark McGuinness earned his first international cap for the Republic of Ireland against England at Wembley Stadium last Sunday. The centre-half was an unused substitute in the win against Finland in Dublin before he started his first international game against his native country.

After the game, Mark took to Instagram and said: "Mixed emotions tonight. But a special night for me and my family to make my debut."

Zimbabwe captain Marvelous Nakamba helped guide the Warriors to qualification for the 2025 Africa Cup of Nations by sharing the points with Kenya last week.

Marv got 180 minutes under his belt to secure second place in Group J before the Warriors finished qualifying with defeat to the group winners Cameroon.

Another player that represented their country

across two full games is Amari'i Bell, who did not advance to the CONCACAF Nations League semi-finals after a two-legged defeat to the USA.

The Reggae Boyz lost by one goal to the Americans in Kingston before the tie run away from the Jamaicans in St. Louis, conceding three without reply before halftime of the second leg.

Moving on to the agegroup internationals, Teden Mengi was a second half substitute in both of England U21s' stalemates abroad against Spain and the Netherlands.

Zack Nelson played 85 minutes in England U20s 4-0 thrashing of Germany as the Young Lions momentarily moved away from their German counterparts at the top of the Elite League.

Meanwhile, Joe Johnson was a key component as England U19s topped their Euro U19 qualification group and will move on to the elite round in spring 2025.

JJ played both of England's wins in full against Lithuania and Bulgaria before he was rested for the final group game against Belgium.


The opponents for JJ and the Young Lions in the elite round will be revealed on Thursday 5th December.

They lost to Denmark and Israel, before beating Albania 1-0 in this last international break.

#### **HOWARD EARNS HIS STRIPES**

Cast your minds back to April 6th 2002. Luton Town are battling with Plymouth Argyle at the top of Division 3 (League 2 in new money), and the war of words are whizzing back and forth between the late, great Joe Kinnear and Argyle manager Paul Sturrock.

It's getting to the business end of the season, Luton Town have played 44 games, Plymouth 43, and both clubs are light years ahead of the chasing pack of Cheltenham, Mansfield, Rochdale and Rushden & Diamonds.

Luton Town rock up at Boothferry Park, the then home of early season title favourites Hull City, who were now managed by former Liverpool and Denmark midfielder Jan Molby.

When the two clubs had crossed swords earlier in the season at Kenilworth Road, Rob Matthews, who famously relegated Luton Town from the old First Division back in the 91/92 season, on his professional debut, before joining Luton briefly in 95, was back once again to haunt his

former club, scoring the only goal in a 1-0 victory for the Tigers.

However, the two clubs that locked horns on the 6th April 2002, were two very different beasts.

Luton Town were coming into this game off the back of 11 consecutive wins, having beaten promotion rivals Mansfield Town 5-3 just five days earlier, and by the end of the day Town had made history, winning 12 consecutive games and finishing the game week top of the Division, with Plymouth having drawn against Southend.

The Hatters won 4-0 with Steve Howard helping himself to a hat trick and Dean Crowe grabbing the second goal of the day.

The 12 consecutive wins remains a club record to this day, the 2001/02 season lives on in the minds of all Hatters who were around to witness it, because after nearly a decade of downs this season was the first sustained success fans who started going in the 90s had seen.

The team from that season was simply levels above Division 3 as shown by the players who stepped on the pitch at Boothferry Park.

Putting aside the enigmatic Frenchman Jean-Louis Valois, Emmerson Boyce, Matty Taylor (who provided three assists), Matthew Spring and Steve Howard all would go on to play in the top flight.

It was quite simply a wonderful season to be a Hatter, with Big Fat Joe taking the Town up.



## ON THIS DAY

We go back in time on this day in the Hatters' history books



Back on this day in 1985, the Hatters recorded a 2-1 derby win at Watford with Mitchell Thomas scoring his first goal for the club, and a Steve Terry OG securing the points.


With England manager Bobby Robson among a crowd of 16,197 at Vicarage Road, keeping an eye on Hatters hopefuls Mick Harford, Brian Stein and Ricky Hill, it was full-back Thomas – also on his radar – who opened the scoring just before the half-hour.

When David Preece found Stein, the forward's shot was saved by Tony Coton, but Thomas raced in to find the back of the net with a fierce angled drive.

Robson would also have been checking on the Hornets' winger John Barnes, but when the future Liverpool star missed the ball completely with eight minutes left, midfielder Brian Talbot was there to spare his blushes and grab their equaliser.

It looked as though the Hertfordshire hosts' unbeaten home record would remain intact, but unfortunately for them, centre-half Terry hacked a cross from Stein into his own net to give David Pleat's side the win that lifted them up to eight in the top-flight table.


23RD NOVEMBER...

## Champions!

Over the course of the season we'll be looking back 20 years to the glorious League One championship winning season of 2004/05.

So many club league records were tumbled during a momentous campaign which was even more remarkable considering that the summer of 2003 saw the arrival of new 'owner' John Gurney and his crackpot ideas, which ultimately led to the Hatters needing to enter administrative receivership, with all its problems, to get rid of him. Club historian Roger Wash tells the story of a season to remember.



## **2004/05 history**

After scoring 12 goals in their last three games the table-topping Hatters were now due to make the short trip to Milton Keynes to take on the recently relegated and struggling Dons.

The pairing of the two sides was certainly not without its controversy. The stated aim of MK Dons owner Pete Winkleman was "to make the region catch fire for football", but this meant infiltrating the Hatters heartland by formalising links with schools and junior clubs.

The strength of feeling ran high with a boycott urged and Luton Town Supporters Club running coaches to see AFC Wimbledon take on Dulwich Hamlet on the same day as the Hatters were playing in Milton Keynes. Town supporter Gary Sweet was guoted in the Luton News: "The biggest issue is Town fans tend to be too apathetic. Last year, a handful of decent fans pulled together to save the club and succeeded. Within months, Luton fans sell out the 3,300 allocation at MK and in the process fund what is morally a threat to football and Luton Town."

On the day of the game a peaceful demonstration was organised for midday outside the National Hockey Stadium, on what became known as 'Ricky's Hill,' in an attempt to highlight the protest against the franchising of football in this country.

Welcoming back goalkeeper Marlon Beresford, after a twomonth absence with groin problems, as well as skipper Kevin Nicholls following his three-game ban, the Town soon got used to the National Hockey Stadium which was a strange place to host football.

The Hatters started well and went ahead in the eighth minute when Rowan Vine blasted the ball home from distance. The Town did not have it all their own way though, as MK put in a spirited performance and threatened the Luton defence on more occasions than was comfortable.

The Town doubled their lead just before the interval when Steve Howard was on hand to tuck the ball home after a Chris Covne header came back off the bar. Two up and seemingly comfortable, the Town seemed to switch off and almost from the re-start MK pulled a goal back when a Gary Smith freekick caused havoc in the Luton box, leaving Wade Small to blast the ball past Beresford.

Expecting a second half onslaught that did not materialise the Hatters regained their two-goal advantage on 66 minutes when a beautifully flighted cross from Kevin Foley was headed in by Howard. The scoreline was then given a slightly flattering look with seven minutes left when Howard claimed the match ball with a shot into the corner of the net after being set up by Vine.

Manager Mike Newell was quite a relieved man despite the margin of victory. "It was never easy and we had to work for it," he said. "They got a goal at a crucial time just before the interval and to be fair to them. they created quite a few chances before that. From our point of view it was important we went about the job in the second-half in the same way as the first and the lads did that."

Also getting a dig in afterwards he said: "It's a local derby but for us it will never replace Watford; there is a history to that which is what football is all about."

Before the next fixture, at home to Doncaster, a rumour spread around the Town that Rowan Vine was to be recalled by parent club Portsmouth due to an injury crisis at Fratton Park. Luckily, the rumour was soon knocked on the head by Pompey boss Harry Redknapp.

A far bigger worry was a bid put in for top-scorer Steve Howard by ex-Town


boss Joe Kinnear, who was now at Nottingham Forest with Mick Harford as his number two. The Luton board stood strong and said firmly that Howard was happy at Luton and was staying.

After being free-scoring in recent weeks the Town met an immovable object in a Doncaster side that shut up shop from minute one. The Hatters huffed and puffed in a one-sided first half, but when they broke through on goal found that Rovers keeper Andy Warrington was in breathtaking form.

The breakthrough did eventually arrive on the hour mark when Kevin Nicholls curled in a superb 20 yard free-kick and that, we thought, was that. Rovers then came out of their shell and netted an equaliser in the 82nd minute with Neil Roberts taking advantage of a quick break from defence.

Back came the Town with a barrage of efforts on goal. Warrington was throwing himself all over the place and probably deserved his luck when Curtis Davies hit the crossbar and substitute Peter Holmes smacked a long-range shot against a post.

"It shows how far we have come that we're saying we're disappointed with a draw," said Newell afterwards.

Town shirt collector, David Foxen, aka @lutontownkits, goes through his selection of shirts in orange, white, blue – and all colours in between.

The 1958/59 season remains historic in our long history as it was the only year we made the FA Cup Final. It was also a much simpler time in terms of football shirts, designs, materials and fit - vastly different from today's standards.

The shirt was white with a V-neck collar. It featured the embroidered badge from the 50s and 60s era and had a black, stitched number on the back. That was it, it was honestly that simple.

But it looks class! There have been many reproductions of these over the years with originals being super rare and museum pieces.

Allan Brown's shirt sold in December 2023 for £3,800. Sadly, not to me...!

We started in the third round, thumping Leeds United at home 5-1 in front of a mere 18,500 fans, which was quite low back then due to the terracing. We needed a replay to beat Leicester City after a 1-1 draw at their place, before bringing them back to the Kenny for a 4-1 home win.

The Hatters were goal hungry in the FA Cup, putting another five past Ipswich Town in round five, winning 5-2 to set up a sixth round tie with Blackpool. A draw in Lancashire setup another home replay, in which we won 1-0 thanks to Brown, this time in front of 30,000 fans. Imagine that at Kenilworth Road, incredible!

This meant we had made it to the semi-final, when we beat Norwich City at St Andrews in a replay to set up a Wembley date with Nottingham Forest.

Two goals in the first 15 minutes put Forest 2-0 up, before Dave Pacey scored to make it 2-1. Sadly, the game was disrupted a lot due to injuries and we just could not find the equaliser.

Still, the likes of Ron Baynham, Ken Hawkes, Syd Owen, Dave Pacey, Billy Bingham, Bob Morton etc go down in history as the first, and (currently) only Hatters team to appear in an FA Cup final!



# HE'S ONE OF OUR OWNI

#### **MARK PEMBRIDGE**

Mark was one of a procession of players who was spotted by Luton Town's South Wales scout Cyril Beach and went on to join the Hatters, signing professional forms in July 1989.

A left sided midfielder with a vicious shot, Mark made his League debut on New Year's Day 1991 and from then on was ever present in the Town's Division One side, scoring some spectacular goals along the way.

Following relegation, a £1.25 million bid from Derby was reluctantly accepted and he left Kenilworth Road having scored six times in 70 appearances in all competitions.

The Merthyr Tydfil-born player then went on to carve out a long career for himself at the Baseball Ground, then Sheffield Wednesday, Benfica, Everton and, lastly, Fulham, while also winning 54 caps for Wales between 1991 and 2004, finding the net on six occasions.

After retiring from playing, Mark took on a youth coaching role at Craven Cottage, which he did in various positions for over 14 years before leaving the west London club in 2021.

Last season Mark was a visitor to Kenilworth Road in a media capacity, co-commentating for the BBC Radio Merseyside on the Town's match against Everton, as well as attending some matches away matches as a supporter with his family.

## **EFL Week of Action**

This week is the EFL
Week of Action, a

significant contributions
football clubs make to
their communities.

At Luton Town FC Community Trust, we are proud to showcase the impactful projects and programmes we deliver to support our local area.

From promoting health and happiness to enhancing education, fostering social connections, and enhancing employability opportunities, the difference we make is truly inspiring.

Throughout the week, we have highlighted the fantastic work being undertaken here at Luton Town Community Trust.

On Tuesday, 19th November, we were delighted to host a mental health workshop in collaboration with CHUMS. The workshop was open to students from Denbigh High School, where we deliver a variety of group and 1:1 football-based interventions to inspire pupils to be active, look after their wellbeing and develop important life skills.

Some examples include:

- We run a breakfast club aimed at pupils who struggle with attending the school (most pupils' attendance is now 100%)
- We provide 1:1 mentoring support to pupils who struggle with self-esteem and confidence
- We run a club aimed at pupils who have shown commitment to improve their academic studies
- We support PE lessons which includes mentoring PE teachers

The mental health workshop was led by CHUMS, a local mental health and emotional wellbeing service, emphasising the importance of self-care and providing practical guidance on accessing the tools and services available to address mental health concerns.

Head of Behaviour at the school, Mr Gully, said: "It's had a massive impact. Our attendance in the morning has improved, we've got a massive engagement with pupils who maybe struggle to come into school in the mornings,

getting themselves in a bit earlier, that's a great start to the day for them. They have really enjoyed that, and across the week we have seen a huge improvement in our behaviour, with pupils working towards the rewards of turning up on the Thursday sessions and Bradley has done a phenomenal job of working with those pupils, picking them up and just making sure that if they haven't had such a good week, how can they improve? We've seen a massive improvement in a lot of our pupils."

The students were also fortunate to enjoy a surprise visit from Mick Harford, Elijah Adebayo, and Pelly Ruddock Mpanzu. Each shared personal insights into how football has positively impacted their mental health and how they have dealt with challenges along the way.

Mick also spoke about his role as an ambassador for CHUMS and highlighted the vital work the organisation does within the community.

Elijah and Pelly further engaged with the students during a Q&A session, answering questions and offering advice on tackling challenges.

Mr Gully continued:
"There were lots of
hands up in the session
so the pupils were
absolutely buzzing for
the opportunity today,
and the wider community
links are just huge. This
is going to be a day
that they are going to
remember for a long time.

"The things that I like the most that Mick, Elijah and Pelly spoke about are having those difficult moments, and how to overcome it. I think our pupils are really good at recognising when things



haven't gone as well, but knowing it is going to get better, and how to improve.

"I think working with Bradley in the sessions they have, checking in with him, and him talking them through it, giving them extra strategies and having that different voice coming in, has been really important.

"But hearing from players that have had tough times and are now achieving at the very top level is incredible, a really good experience."

We were also thrilled to welcome Alfie Doughty to our Ability Counts session on Friday 22nd November. Alfie joined us at Inspire Sports Village, where he had the opportunity to watch the participants train and later enjoyed an exciting match showcasing their skills and teamwork.

During the visit, participants had the

fantastic opportunity to ask Alfie a variety of questions about his football career so far and his time at Luton Town. Alfie's insights and experiences were both inspiring and motivational, creating a memorable session for everyone involved.

Ability Counts is our inclusive football programme designed for players aged 18 and above with disabilities. Sessions take place every Friday from 12pm-2pm at Inspire Sports Village, moving to an outdoor venue in the warmer months.

The programme provides a supportive environment for players to develop their football skills, stay active, and build social connections.

## MY FAVOURITE GOAL...

It's a balmy summer's evening in September 1968, Luton are on fire having stormed back as champions from Division Four the previous season, and play host to fellow promotion contenders Mansfield Town.

Kenilworth Road is packed with its biggest gate for years of 19,315 and the terraces are buzzing. The adrenaline is off the scale, fuelled by what might happen on the pitch that night. As a 15-year-old I was hooked by the magic of Kenilworth Road. Its sheer beauty under floodlights was mesmerising then. I stood at the very front on the open end of what is now the David Preece Stand.

The match exceeded every expectation of drama; two players sent off including a young Bruce Rioch after only three minutes in front of an Oak Road in uproar, bookings galore, injuries including legendary skipper Terry Branston and fellow defensive stalwart John Moore, six goals, a penalty despatched by 'thunder thighs' Mike Harrison, and after reeling from a Mansfield comeback, the team showed incredible fight and determination to take the points for the Hatters to maintain our 100 per cent home record. But, best of all was a moment of incredible skill, cheek and truly a goal of such beauty, the like of which I have never seen in the 56 years since. In the 78th minute, with Luton legs tiring and the team desperately trying to cling on to a 3-1 lead under growing Mansfield pressure, Graham French, Luton's tempestuous former

youth international winger, is defending the Alamo of our own penalty area in front of the Oak Road.

He retrieves the ball and instead of booting it out or holding it up, what does the cheeky winger decide to do? Nothing less than set off solo towards the 9,000 souls standing on the open Kenilworth terrace. He never once looks up for a team mate to pass to – he's on a one-man mission to destroy Mansfield.


In the next 30 seconds he takes on and beats what seems to me the entire Mansfield team, but in reality is probably three or four players, all left in his wake. He then rounds the keeper and the ground erupts as the net bulges with the thump of his shot.

Sadly there's no TV record of his goal, but among the many stories told is one I love to believe - after he'd rounded their keeper he'd considered doing it a second time just for bravado, but decided against it knowing the roasting he'd get from manager Allan Brown!

I will forever count myself blessed to have witnessed that piece of footballing heaven. Shine on, you crazy diamond 'Frenchie.'



Five minutes later, Luton scored again, this time

With just 23 minutes on the clock, the Hatters had a fourth. Liz Mulvaney set off on a mazy run and played an inch-perfect through ball to Leighton, who slotted the ball into the back of the net for her second of the afternoon.

Ten minutes before half-time, 18-year-old Leighton completed her hat-trick. It was from another great pass, this time from Shianne Swarres, that Leighton was put through on goal and she finished in an almost identical way to her second.

Elly Wade scored Luton's sixth goal of the afternoon five minutes after the break. A free kick from the half-way line was directed into the box from Buttigieg, and a Haringey player got an unfortunate touch on the ball, gifting Luton's captain a tap in.

With 15 to play, Haringey got their consolation. A rare mix-up at the back allowed Nia Garwood to be through on goal, and she put the ball past Sarah Hudson.

The rout was completed when Luton were awarded a penalty with eight minutes remaining. Gabriella Spillman, who was proving to be a handful, was taken out in the box and Fensome stepped up and slotted the ball into the bottom right corner.

Another three points for the Ladies see them close the gap on league leaders Royston to just three points with a game in hand.

## LET'S GO



We're back on the road on Wednesday when the Hatters make another long trip north to take on last season's beaten Championship play-off finalists Leeds United.

Daniel Farke's side suffered the heartbreak of Wembley defeat to Southampton in May as they looked to bounce back into the Premier League at the first attempt, following their relegation in 2022/23.

Farke took charge that summer claiming he wouldn't have returned to English football for any other Championship club than Leeds, having twice won promotion with his former club Norwich City.

But the Whites became the first second-tier side to accumulate 90 points and not go up automatically since Sunderland in 1997-98, finishing fourth with Adam Armstrong's solitary goal seeing the Saints return to the top-flight at the first time of asking instead.

This season the Yorkshire outfit have started in similar fashion, heading into the international break in third place behind leaders Sunderland and Sheffield United.

Farke's side have won eight, drawn five and lost two of their first 15 matches, with 29 points seeing them just two adrift of the joint leaders, two above fourth placed Burnley and five above Middlesbrough, who occupy the spot just outside of the play-off places.

Their recent form has been excellent, with a 1-0 defeat away at Millwall their sole set-back in the last ten games since Burnley inflicted their only home reversal of the campaign on 14th September.

They have won their last five home games, with Watford the only side to score against them at Elland Road since that day, with Coventry beaten 3-0, Sheffield United seen off 2-0, the Hornets beaten 2-1 before a 3-0 win over Plymouth and a 2-0 v QPR last time out.


Before that, they had opened the campaign with a 3-3 home draw

with Portsmouth and a 2-0 win over Hull City before August was out.

Their top scorer is former Swansea striker Joel Piroe, with six goals so far, closely followed by USA international Brenden Aaronson on four and Belgium U21 winger Largie Ramazani, who has three goals in six starts since his August move from Spanish second-tier side Almeria.

The only season the Hatters have played Leeds in the Championship since winning promotion in 2019 came in that first Covid-interrupted campaign, when Marcelo Bielsa's side won 2-1 at Kenilworth Road, before Town picked up a valuable point in the fight for survival following the restart.

Harry Cornick netted the Hatters' goal of the season in the 1-1 draw played behind closed doors in June 2020, with Stuart Dallas hitting Leeds' leveller on a night that only slightly held them up on the road to winning the title.

It may not have been the full 60-plus squad that completed the annual Prostate United challenge in October this year, as was the case three years ago when we used Mick Harford's recent diagnosis with the disease as inspiration to cycle, run or walk every day.

But I was proud to have played a part, together with Alex Lawless, our catering manager, Cristhiano da Silva, HR executive Sarah Denmark and my colleagues on the media team, Andrew Barringer and Luke Gregory, in helping Prostate Cancer UK past the £1 million mark in funds raised since Prostate United was created by then Rotherham United colleagues Stephen Gilpin and Ross Burbeary in 2018.

For our sins – and shin splints – Laws, Cris, Sarah, Andrew, Luke and I clocked up the miles across Herts, Beds, France and Italy by running or walking every day during the month, and still have the blisters to show for it.

Thanks to everyone who donated to the £2,000-plus we raised towards this season's overall total of £375,000 – which is a record – and please remember the most important figures from the month:

- 1 in 8 men in the UK will get prostate cancer in their lifetime
- That increases to 1 in 4 black men
- Around 490,000 men are living with and after prostate cancer
- One man dies every 45 minutes from the disease
- That's more than 12,000 men every year

Often there aren't any symptoms, as you'll have heard Sir Chris Hoy speak about in recent weeks, as well as Big Mick for several years now.
