Good afternoon and welcome back to you all for this important Championship game with Swansea City.

I would like to extend that welcome to those who have made the journey from Swansea, including their manager Luke Williams and his staff and players. They are, like all clubs at this level, a talented team capable of producing excellent results and recently ran Leeds close.

It seems a while ago since we were last here at the Kenny when we beat Hull. That was a good afternoon for us when the lads showed great character and determination to earn us victory to make it back-to-back home wins.

Since that win, however, we've endured two tough

BOARDROOM DAVID WILKINSON



Good afternoon everyone and a very warm welcome to Kenilworth Road.

Today's visitors are Swansea City, who we last played towards the end of our last Championship season winning 1-0 here at the Kenny. We first played each other in Division Three (South) in 1920 since which time we have met 58 times winning 25 and drawing 12.

One of their most notable achievements was their rapid rise from the lower reaches of League Two to the Premier League between 2004 and 2011 and winning the League Cup two years later by the biggest-ever margin. The Swans were relegated in 2018 and today sit in the middle of the table.

Sometimes these notes are easy to write, in fact there haven't been many occasions in the last 16 years that the message has been anything but positive and joyous. Alas not today, because we have been struggling a bit of late. I've been coming here for 66 years and have seen us all the way to the top and bottom of the Football League three times and sometimes it's easy to forget that many of you have only seen us go one way until last year's relegation.

In a way, we should not have been too surprised or disappointed that it happened because we have out-performed our budget since being promoted from League One, but we did so well and made so many friends for the way we played that it just felt worse.

We are not a typical club in today's game and I would say a rarity in the top three leagues. Most clubs are owned by investors whose principal aim is profit, whereas we are locally owned, locally run and locally funded with the aim of securing the long-term future of the club we love in the town we care about.

We all have to remember what the 2020 vision that Gary brought to us was: the Championship, a new stadium and a self-sustainable club so when that's all been achieved we don't have to rely on outside investors or continually having to sell our best players. However, we have to be

realistic. We may never be as big as a Leeds. Gary pointed out last week that their crowd against us at Elland Road was bigger than we have ever had at the Kenny, or most likely will have at Power Court – and they're owned by the San Francisco 49ers!

This isn't to say we are not ambitious and I believe that because of what and who we are we can continue to out-perform.

We can all see that we have suffered a Premier League hangover. We lost at least one player, who in my opinion is irreplaceable and learned

to accept defeat. On the other hand, many of the players who got us there had a chance to play in the Premier League.

Plus we have a highly skilled and talented team looking after our squad from medical and sports science, data analytics and recruitment to management and coaching, and the efforts put in behind the scenes are impressive and encouraging.

So much sport is played in the head, something I know well as a somewhat errant golfer. However good you are in whatever role, confidence and momentum play a major part and, in this instance, it falls upon all of us to do what we can to regain our mojo.

"A great King summoned his most learned men to find words that when he was happy would make him sad and when he was sad would make him happy. After much consideration, they returned to the king with the words 'THIS TOO SHALL PASS."

It sums up the cyclical nature of football I think. Would anyone have put money on Manchester City not winning for seven games in a row? On a lighter note a mention for our academy. On Tuesday our under-21s beat Notts County 13-2 and our under-17s beat Northampton 6-0 in the Premier Development Cup. It has been difficult at times for Alex Lawless as he is rarely able to select his best players for the under-21s due to loans out and others training with the first team squad. It is pleasing that they are getting some good recent results, which hopefully will continue into next year when the secretary of state permits we'll be a category 2 academy and part of the games programme.

The Hatters will travel to Nottingham Forest in the third round of the FA Cup following last Monday's draw.

The two sides played out two draws in the Premier League last term, including a 2-2 draw at the City Ground, with the tie a replay of the 1959 final that Forest won at Wembley.

It will be the fifth time the two clubs have met

in the competition's history, with the Hatters winning the last meeting, a 1-0 second round tie at Kenilworth Road in December 2007 with Calvin Andrew's strike earning a third round tie with Liverpool.

This season's tie will take place over the weekend of 11-12th January. Full date and ticket information will be announced in due course.

Meanwhile the Town Under-18s will host Crewe Alexandra in the FA Youth Cup at Kenilworth Road next Friday, 13th December, with kick-off at 7pm.

Tickets will be on sale from Tuesday 3rd December with admission £5 for adults and £3 for seniors over 65 and-17s.

The Hatters showed spirit and togetherness to record a fourth home win in their last seven at Kenilworth Road as Mark McGuinness' first goal in Town colours earned victory over Hull.

As Rob Edwards alluded to post-match, it was a response that gave him heart as the Town dug deep as they were made to work for their three points as Hull spurned a series of good chances to take a point.

Hull started the brighter and almost took an early lead inside three minutes only for Teden Mengi to clear inside the six-yard box with the goal gaping – but soon the Town found their feet.

A succession of corners from Shandon Baptiste got the visitors on the back foot but in truth, in difficult conditions as the rain poured on a grey day, it was a scrappy affair.

However, those set-pieces from Baptiste were causing the Tigers a problem and on 33 minutes they proved particularly problematic as the Town led from one. To end a week in which he celebrated making his international debut against England at Wembley, McGuinness got on the end of the corner brilliantly, volleying a low finish home for his first goal in Luton colours.

Ahead, the Town breathed a sigh of relief shortly before the break when the visitors' Joao Pedro's glancing header missed the target when well-placed from close range. The second half was only seconds old when Tom Holmes' superb cross from the right picked out Elijah Adebayo but the striker couldn't make a clean connection with a header inside the penalty area.

Back came Hull and on 52 minutes the Town survived after Regan Slater's low cross was poked onto the post by Pedro from close range.

Mengi was then in the right place at the right time once more just after the hour mark to thwart Pedro after a pacey counter attack.

With 14 minutes to go Thomas Kaminski was called into action for the first time to paw away a low fizzing effort from Kasey Palmer and as the game entered closing stages the Town put everything on the line to keep their lead intact.

With 60 seconds left of the 90 Hull spurned another glorious chance to level with substitute Chris Bedia flicked wide at the near post with the goal at his mercy when it seemed harder to miss.

Six minutes were added by the officials and a minute into the additional time Kaminski came to the Town's rescue to keep it 1-0. Palmer's shot from the edge of the box cannoned off McGuinness but with the ball diverting goalwards, Kaminski's knee thankfully saved the day and the Town could celebrate victory.

The Hatters slipped to a fifth consecutive defeat away from Kenilworth Road as they were comfortably beaten by league leaders Leeds.

It took the hosts just 10 minutes to break the deadlock. Manor Solomon's left-wing cross found Sam Byram in the six-yard box and, after seeing his initial shot blocked, the Leeds full-back was quickest to the loose ball to finish past Thomas Kaminski.

The Hatters' first foray forward into the hosts' half almost resulted in an equaliser. Victor Moses took Jordan Clark's pass, bursting into the box. The former Chelsea man clipped a deft left-foot effort past Leeds goalkeeper Illan Meslier but with the crowd expecting the net to bulge, home skipper Pascal Struijk acrobatically cleared the ball off the line.

It should have been 2-0 on 29 minutes only for Wilfried Gnonto to side-foot straight at Kaminski. However, the Hatters then spurned another great opportunity to level three minutes before the break. Carlton Morris' curling cross from the left found Reece Burke unmarked at the back-post but the defender could not guide his header on target.

On the stroke of half-time the hosts doubled their lead. From Joe Rothwell's left-wing corner, Kaminski parried away as the ball bounced goalwards but Joel Piroe was quickest to the loose ball and the forward slammed home from two yards out.

On the hour Edwards made a double change in attack, introducing Joe Taylor and Elijah Adebayo for Morris and Brown, but Leeds' pressure continued and Piroe wasn't far away with a free-kick from the edge of the box that was deflected over the bar with 14 minutes left.

For all the home possession the Town weren't still totally out of it at 2-0 and on 72 minutes Teden Mengi saw a shot blocked from distance before Adebayo nodded over when well-placed on 76 minutes when rising to meet Clark's corner.

But on 81 minutes Leeds made the game safe when Jayden Bogle's fine pass released Dan James and he clipped a cool finish over Kaminski.


Kaminski then needed to be alert to prevent Mateo Joseph's header from creeping home but, as the final moments ticked down, the Hatters continued to force half-chances. Shandon Baptiste's fine low drive from the edge of the box was turned away well by Meslier before the Leeds keeper then pawed away a pot-shot from Clark in the third minute of time added on.

Kaminski kept out a fourth with the last action but it mattered not as the hosts were able to celebrate victory seconds later with the three points taking them back to the top of the Championship.

The Town went down to another defeat away from home as two goals in the final 10 minutes earned Norwich all three points at Carrow Road.

The Town took the lead on 19 minutes when Jordan Clark's press rushed Anis Slimane into a poor pass and Elijah Adebayo was onto the loose ball in a flash. The forward made no mistake with the finish for his third goal of the season.

Sadly the Hatters' lead did not last. Four minutes later the Canaries were level. The Town could not clear a Norwich set-play with Thomas Kaminski's attempted punch landing at the feet of Ante Crnac who took a couple of tidy touches before slamming home from eight yards.

All of a sudden it was all Norwich and on 33 minutes the Hatters' lead had evaporated. Tahith Chong allowed former Town man Jack Stacey to cross from the byline and Crnac was free to turn home in the penalty area for his second.

The Hatters then had Kaminski to thank for a superb fingertip save to turn Shane Duffy's goal-bound header around the post two minutes before the break.

But the Town would go in at the break rueing a big chance for 2-2 when neither Adebayo or Carlton Morris could apply a finishing touch with the goal at their mercy following Jacob Brown's inviting low cross.

Yet the Hatters came out fighting after the restart and Jacob Brown hit the equaliser on 48 minutes. Shandon Baptiste's left-wing corner caused panic in the Norwich penalty area with the ball eventually falling at the feet of Brown who hooked an effort home for his third of the campaign.


Level, the Town were in the ascendancy and twice came close to taking the lead shortly before the hour only for Morris to have a shot blocked and Brown and Adebayo off target with headers.



Today the Hatters welcome Swansea City to Kenilworth Road for yet another big Championship fixture. Luke Williams' side currently sit in 13th place and will be looking to continue climbing the table.

Last week, the Swans came from 2-0 down at home to Portsmouth to grab a 2-2 draw. However, Swansea will feel they should have won the game, but they struggled to convert their chances.

Prior to this, the Swans beat Derby 2-1 away from home. Two early goals were enough to see out the win for Williams' side.

Also recently, Swansea played out a seven-goal thriller at home to Leeds. It was a back-and-forth game with plenty of goals at both ends. However, Leeds won the match 4-3 thanks to a late Willy Gnonto winner.

Swansea have won three of their last six games and are beginning to hit some decent form after a period of scoring no goals in five games beforehand.

The Town have a strong overall record against Swansea down the years, stretching back to our first meeting in Southern League Division 2 in 1913. However the Swans have won three of their last five visits, and came from three goals down to earn a draw here in 2021.

On their last trip here, however, a Carlton Morris goal sealed all three points from the Town in September 2021.

SWANSEA CULT HERO

Think Swansea in the Premier League and one man's name springs to mind: Michu.

The Spaniard is widely regarded as a Premier League cult hero, celebrated for his remarkable 22-goal debut season in South Wales in 2012/13.

Michu joined from Rayo Vallecano in the summer of 2012 for just £2m and he quickly announced himself, scoring six goals in his first eight matches. It led to half the country hastily adding him to their Fantasy Football teams.

Helping the Swans on their way to winning the League Cup scoring two goals against Bradford in the final - he was soon being linked to some of the world's biggest clubs.

However, injuries halted his progress and he netted just twice in the following season before moving back to Spain in 2015.

We approached the club to ask if we could formally recognise Wayne's outstanding bravery at one of their up-and-coming games. The club, in their true community spirit, were more than happy to support and suggested it form part of the game where they would be working with the British Heart Foundation to mark the first anniversary of Tom Lockyer's cardiac arrest at the Bournemouth game.

We are delighted to be part of today's event, where we shine a light on the importance of CPR, recognise the fantastic heroes in our community, and, of course, grateful that it has saved the lives of so many. Unfortunately, cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of death in Luton, accounting for nearly one-third of all deaths, so it is more important than ever that people are trained in CPR and actively follow a healthy lifestyle.

Love Luton has held a strong partnership with the club since its formation back in 2010. We have been very fortunate to have the club's management and staff take part in RunFest, with Rob Edwards joining us in 2023. This year, we welcomed Mick Harford, David Wilkinson, and many LTFC staff. The club and Love Luton are part of the town's DNA; we always come back bigger and stronger and are one of the most resilient places in the country. A big part of Luton's transformation is centred

around Power Court, which will reimagine our town centre and put Luton back in the spotlight.

Love Luton celebrates its 15th anniversary next year, and we would love to welcome all the **Luton Town Club fans** to participate. Preserving and appreciating the heritage and history of Luton Town Football Club

Today we swing back to 1983. Luton Town are in the top flight for the first time in nearly a decade, and this would be a memorable season.

Spoiler alert, it ended with "ANTIC!" and a fancy beige suit and loafer sporting David Pleat, jigging on the pitch at Maine Road. But prior to that famous escape, Luton Town were putting in the hard yards to be in a position for that final day survival.

Starting in April with a tight 1-0 loss to Norwich at home and then an absolute horror show down the M1, losing 5-2 to Watford, the tide began to turn.

Aston Villa and
Birmingham arrived at
Kenilworth Road, with
the Town beating them
2-1 and 3-1, respectively,
when they should
have just stayed in the
Midlands. A 1-1 draw at
Notts County followed
before, on 23rd April 1983,
the Town beat fellow
struggler Swansea City
3-1 at Kenilworth Road.

The highlight of this victory was the hat-trick scored by a player who had been brought to Luton by David Pleat for the princely sum of £400,000 from Charlton

at the start of the season – Paul Walsh.

Paul was a spectacular footballer, as shown by his PFA Young Player of the Year win in 1984 whilst still with the Hatters.

He had already announced himself to the Luton faithful with a string of sublime performances, grabbing a hat-trick against Notts County in a 5-3 victory earlier in the season, scoring a screamer against Stoke City and tying future teammate Mark Lawrenson in knots at Anfield.

However, his hat-trick against the Swans at Kenilworth Road was his re-announcement to the Kenilworth Road faithful, with these goals being scored off the back of a 13-game dry spell.

David Pleat knew exactly what Paul Walsh was about, describing him as having "a touch of Jimmy Greaves". Regardless of the performance, against a Swansea side that sat back to try not to concede but then have Walsh dismantle them, it was just the tonic required in the perpetual battle to survive in the First Division during the 1982/83 season. Together with the 2-2 draw away at Southampton a week later, it turned an April that started as a nightmare into an absolute dream and a perfect platform to fight for survival.

Older supporters all remember the man who

scored the goal that kept us up on that iconic day at Maine Road, with that moment not only written into Kenilworth Road folklore but in the annals of football history, but it was the extreme performances of unsung heroes like Paul Walsh, throughout the 1982/83 season, that built the platform for a truly great escape.

We still see his goals dotted around social media, but for the younger fans like myself, not only Walsh's impact but the likes of Horton, Donaghy, Moss, Hill and Stein all need to be remembered and celebrated.

ON THIS DAY

We go back in time on this day in the Hatters' history books



The Hatters produced a stunning performance to equal their biggest victory away from Kenilworth Road when they put five past Alfreton in the Conference on this day in 2013.

We deservedly took the lead on 10 minutes with a lovely goal. Luke Guttridge was the creator, bursting forward from the left flank to thread a perfect pass through to Andre Gray and his finish exhumed confidence, a low shot that flew past Ross Atkins.

It got better for the Hatters two minutes later when Paul Benson doubled the lead. This time Gray and Guttridge combined to feed Benson and the former Dagenham striker clipped a wonderfully cool finish over the advance Atkins for his seventh goal of the campaign.

Incredibly the Hatters made it 3-0 on 14 minutes as Gray got his second when Benson squared to his strike partner to tap home inside the sixyard box for his 12th goal in 11 starts.

The Town looked dangerous every time they attacked and, unbelievably, it was 4-0 on 18 minutes. A high ball into the air was controlled by Guttridge and the midfielder rounded Atkins.

After the break Alfreton rallied but failed to test Mark Tyler. Ronnie Henry blocked a goal-bound free-kick from Bradley Wood on 55 minutes but after weathering that storm the Town made it five on 67 minutes when Gray released Alex Lawless and he did the rest, finding the corner of the net.

The Town went down to Chelsea at Stamford Bridge in 1974 but beat Newcastle 2-0 thanks to goals from Mick Harford and Mark North in 1985 here at Kenilworth Road... and the Town were victorious in their last game on this day as late goals from Callum McManaman and George



Champions!

Over the course of the season we'll be looking back 20 years to the glorious League One championship winning season of 2004/05.

So many club league records were tumbled during a momentous campaign which was even more remarkable considering that the summer of 2003 saw the arrival of new 'owner' John Gurney and his crackpot ideas, which ultimately led to the Hatters needing to enter administrative receivership, with all its problems, to get rid of him. Club historian Roger Wash tells the story of a season to remember.



2004/05 **history**

Still sitting four points clear at the top of League One, the Town needed to divert their attention to the FA Cup where the second round draw took them to Wycombe, who were safely placed mid-table in the division below.

The Hatters had never lost at Wycombe (and still haven't!) but took nothing to chance and retained the same side that had drawn with Doncaster the week before apart from Keith Keane replacing the injured Kevin Foley.

Wycombe had John Gorman in charge for the first time and his new players, no doubt out to impress, set about the Town from the start but were undone on 20 minutes when top scorer Steve Howard, possibly in an offside position, opened the scoring. An Ahmet Brkovic cross saw Howard send in a looping header over the advancing Wycombe goalkeeper Frank Talia which nestled into the net.

Despite a few scares brought about by the speed of Wycombe's Nathan Tyson, the Hatters went further ahead through the boot of skipper Kevin Nicholls now fully back to his best in the side following his dismissal at Hull, and subsequent ban. On 70 minutes the skipper fired home from 20 yards and more or less put the game to bed.


The icing on the cake of a fully professional performance came with 10 minutes to go when Howard rose to net another Brkovic cross with a textbook header.

"With them getting a new manager you never know what is going to happen, but the lads controlled it really well and got the result we wanted," said manager Mike Newell afterwards. "Fortunately, we got the second goal at a crucial time. They were starting to get a bit more pressure on the ball, but we contained them well.

"It's all about getting into the next round and we have done that. It would nice to have a home draw now. I have had 11 out of 13 away since I have been here. If I can't have that then either Manchester United or Liverpool away – I'm not fussy."

There was no time to think about the cup draw as the Town were due to play at Brentford, in a return to League action, on the following Tuesday. Driving home from watching Brentford play Hinckley in a televised Cup tie, Newell and his assistant Brian Stein heard the draw for the next round – Brentford at home!

The Town remained unchanged from the Wycombe game and were forced to go on the back foot from the start as the Bees forced the issue. Home skipper

The game turned on an incident in the 18th minute when talisman Steve Howard was dismissed. After having a penalty claim turned down when Sam Sodje climbed all over him in the area, the incensed Howard appeared to throw out an arm and caught Bees defender Michael Turner in the face during an aerial challenge on the halfway line.

Turner went down as if struck by a sniper leaving referee Andy D'Urso no option but to send off the big striker which then left the 10 men to face a

spirited side who were up for it.

Although the Town battled gamely, the Bees made their extra man count and took the lead just before the interval when Deon Burton turned both Keith Keane and Curtis Davies in one movement and fired home past Beresford.


The second half was pretty much one-way traffic with the Bees hitting the woodwork and seeing Beresford pull off three outstanding saves before Kevin O'Connor crossed from the right to allow May to tap in from close range. The Hatters were left well beaten.

A disappointed Newell reflected following the disappointing defeat and



Town shirt collector, David Foxen, aka @lutontownkits, goes through his selection of shirts in orange, white, blue – and all colours in between.

The Luton Town 1987-1989 home shirt, produced by Adidas, is an all-time classic, and the most important shirt in our history.

It is a classic and understated design. The base white is accentuated with the 1980s Adidas logo, and that <u>80s/early 90s</u> raised (embroidered on match shirts) Luton badge. It has that dark navy V-neck collar, and the famous Adidas three stripes down both sleeves. The long-sleeve version of this even trumps the shortsleeves, those stripes go on and on!

During this period, the Hatters competed in the First Division, the top tier of English football. This era in our history is notable for our solid performances in the top division, where we more than held their own against more financially powerful clubs.

It is also remembered for the 1988 Littlewoods Cup Final, our first major trophy. 24th April 1988 was sadly before my time, but hearing the stories and watching the videos of that immense day makes you really appreciate what that final, and win meant to the club, supporters but also the town.

This shirt was seen around the world as the mighty Hatters came back from 2-1 down against Arsenal, only for "who put the ball in the Arsenal net? Bruno, Bruno Stein," to bag a 90th-minute winner and cue wild scenes at Wemblev from the Luton faithful. Danny Wilson started the comeback though, with an 82ndminute equaliser to set up a frantic final 10 minutes.

Watch it on YouTube, it's an amazing match. We also must mention that penalty save from Andy Dibble, even if he was wearing a yellow goalkeeper shirt!

Other heroes who wore this shirt in the league or cup include Tim Breaker, Rob Johnson, Ricky Hill, Steve Foster, David Preece, Kingsley Black, Ashley Grimes and Mal Donaghy.

But the biggest legend of all, Mick Harford, also wore this classic shirt many, many times in the league and Littlewoods Cup!

A classic, a beauty, an icon. Is this the ultimate Luton shirt? I cannot think of many that would beat this...

Picked up by the Hatters from school football in Aylesbury, Marvin was moved into defence for the youth side before signing professional forms in October 1986.

With an established partnership of Steve Foster and Mal Donaghy in the Town's top-flight defence at the time, Marvin had to bide his time but once he established himself in the side he was difficult to budge and went on to make 373 League appearances for his only club before hanging up his boots in 2002.

A true one-club man, 'Marv' made a total of 439 appearances – scoring 10 times – with his last appearance coming in a Football League Trophy tie at Stevenage in 2002. Only six players in our history have played more games than him.

Showing whole hearted effort and a penchant for spectacular own goals, Marvin was a crowd favourite at Kenilworth Road and it was no surprise when he was offered a coaching position with the club when he stopped playing, moving into youth development after a year shadowing the legendary John Moore. Marvin took over the mantle of head of youth development, overseeing the talent and integration into the first team of players like Kevin Foley, Leon Barnett and Keith Keane.

Marvin subsequently took on a coaching role near Washington DC in addition to writing a book and starting up his own clothing line Marvelous LLC.

MY FAVOURITE GOAL...

Town fan Mike Simpson looks back on some of the memorable goals he's witnessed

There are a couple of standout candidates for the best performance by a player in a Luton shirt, both of which culminated in the scoring of a hat-trick on the way to a 3-2 victory.

In more recent times was Scott Oakes' masterclass against West Ham United in a FA Cup sixth round replay in March 1994, but for me, even that display is trumped by that of an 18-year-old Ron Futcher on his home debut against Wolves in December 1974.

The Town could barely buy a win at the time, and Harry Haslam's old guard, rooted at the bottom of the first division, was about to be overhauled with the introduction of young players such as Andy King and Steve Buckley as well as the Futcher brothers, Two days earlier Ron had scored the winner at league leaders Ipswich in the dying minutes of the game, but very few of us knew what to expect of the player who, it was commonly believed, was signed to keep his twin brother, Paul, company.

The first goal, equalising Wolves' opener, followed a long ball out of defence by Paul – a combination we witnessed on many occasions during their time at the club – which

was taken on the chest with back to goal and, after a smart turn, the ball was slotted beyond Phil Parkes. Ron made it 2-1 with a header from a John Aston cross shortly before half-time, but the visitors squared things up in the second half and with time running out it looked like we'd get a point. However, with just minutes remaining, a ball in from Alan West was headed home from, if memory serves correctly, around the penalty spot and suddenly we had a new hero.

It was one of few highlights in what was generally a disappointing season, and it is tempting to wonder what may have happened if the young guns had been given their opportunities sooner. From being stranded at the foot of the division at Christmas, the Town finished the campaign going very close to surviving, with relegation being confirmed at White Hart Lane when Leeds United fielded a very weakened team at Tottenham, who needed a point to send the Town back to Division Two.

Despite the relegation, those of us who were at the Kenny will remember the day Ron Futcher became a Hatters hero.



Ladies progress after incredible shootout

Goalkeeper Sarah Hudson was the Hatters' hero as her two saves booked the Town's place in the third round of the FA Cup at the end of an epic penalty shootout against Stevenage last weekend.

The Hertfordshire side got off to a quick start when they opened the scoring after just five minutes when the ball deflected off multiple players in the box wrongfooting Hudson.

Twelve minutes later the Hatters were level through a rocket by Amber Leighton. The inform midfielder picked up the ball outside the area, took a touch and fired the ball into the back of the net for her sixth goal in four games.

After the equaliser neither side managed to create any real goalscoring opportunities with Tasha Fensome coming closest with five minutes of the first-half to play when her outside of the boot shot glanced off the post.

Just after the break Hudson made a big save when Stevenage were played in one-on-one, but the Town keeper got down low to make a vital save.

Resilient defending from the hosts, kept the Hatters away from goal and the biggest moment of the second-half came in the 88th minute when the ball appeared to have struck the hand of a Stevenage player in the box – but neither the referee or the linesman saw enough to award a penalty.

With the game level after 90 minutes, the tie went to penalties. Each side both converted their first 10 spot kicks, with Fensome, Jess McKay, Leyah Maddix, Shanice Lewis, Shianne Swarres, Liz Mulvaney, Gabriella Spillman, Elly Wade, Fiona Buttigieg and Hudson putting the ball in the back of the net.

The Hatters' 11th penalty saw Tanya Blacksley see her effort saved, meaning if Stevenage had scored their next penalty, they would have progressed, but Hudson made a great save, to her right hand side, keeping the Town in it.

Fensome, McKay,
Maddix, Lewis and
Swarres all scored their
second penalties. Then
on the 32nd penalty of
the afternoon, Hudson
made the decisive
penalty save, again to her
right-hand side to win the
Hatters an astonishing
penalty shootout and a
place in the third round
of the FA Cup away to
Portsmouth.





It was an odd situation watching the FA Cup third round draw on Monday evening and keeping everything crossed that ball number 21 would come out after Salford, Harrogate or Bromley.

In the near 15 years of doing this job, starting out when Town were drawn in the fourth qualifying round of the competition, an Amari Morgan-Smith hat-trick seeing off St Albans City to earn a trip to Corby Town in the first round proper, it would have been all about hoping and praying that the Hatters would get a trip to a Premier League side, or back then, even a Championship outfit.

In fact that first season, having got past the Steelmen following a replay, it led to a visit to Charlton Athletic and the excitement of covering Town at a Football League ground, Luton holding their own to draw 2-2 at the Valley,

defeated on home soil in their second crack at the Addicks.

From then, there were trips to Cambridge United and Nuneaton Town, before the 2012/13 campaign and a match that all fans will never forget – Norwich City, Scott Rendell and Luton making history.

Although matters on the pitch were truly memorable, off the pitch it was that case too, with the Luton press getting pre-game and half-time food, sausage rolls, hot as well, and coffee from memory.

It wasn't just that either, but Carrow Road having a proper press area with desks and plugs, something that hadn't always been the case when Town were on the road, plus an seated interview area to chat with both Chris Hughton and Paul Buckle afterwards, again, unheard of when schlepping round the Conference.

As Town started their climb up the footballing echelon, third round draw day was still exciting, peaking with Newcastle away in 2018, where there was actual waitress service in the press room. Madness.

However, with Luton reaching the highest tier of English football last term, heading to the best grounds in the country on almost weekly basis, there wasn't quite the same desire for Town head to Old Trafford or Anfield when Mark **Hughes and Dion** Dublin got to down the pulling the balls out on Monday, thoughts turning instead to trying to get what would be another tick on the list of stadiums visited.

With three of the four required still in at the time, AFC Wimbledon, who are now plying their trade at Plough Lane, having gone out, then it was all on the trio mentioned in the opening paragraph.

Unfortunately, it wasn't to be, which could be the end of that dream for another season, as Town were paired with Nottingham Forest. Rewind a decade, that tie would have been cheered to the rafters, rather than the feeling of acceptance this time, especially as it isn't a million miles away. As we are trundling through the old days, it's worth mentioning today is the 11-year anniversary of a game that is definitely in the top 10 of Luton matches attended: the 5-0 triumph at Alfreton.

With Luke Guttridge, Andre Gray and co. scoring with every chance in the opening 18 minutes as Town went 4-0 up, it was a case of sheer disbelief, which turned into pure hilarity at what we were witnessing and is still a fixture talked about to this very day.

Great times indeed.
