

# BOSS

Good evening and welcome back to Kenilworth Road for the second time in the space of a few days following the weekend draw with Swansea.

A warm welcome to everyone from Stoke, including Narcís Pèlach and his staff and players plus the supporters from the Potters who have made this midweek trip to Bedfordshire.

I'd like to start these notes by saying a huge thank you to the supporters, staff and paramedics whose quick actions before kick-off helped save the life of one of our fans in the Kenny end. It was a worrying and distressing moment and my best wishes go to the supporter involved, who, thankfully, left the ground for hospital in a stable condition.

The game was a challenging one against a possession-based team

in the shape of Swansea and I felt there was a lot to like about aspects of the performance but showed plenty of room for improvement.

Reviewing it back in the cold light of day I thought out of possession we were great and our pressing was equally as good. We forced Swansea into loads of turnovers, winning the ball back multiple times.

They were the encouraging things. Our issues, however, came in the final third and when we got the ball in our possession. Having done the hard work of winning the ball we then needed to be quicker and smarter with it at our feet. It meant we didn't get into the opposition box enough and that, of course, means there are less chances for us to create goalscoring opportunities.

Occasionally we would take too many touches,

or turn and go backwards when opportunities were there to take someone on or make a forward pass. But I get it, I think you can see there is a lack of confidence right now. We need that to change and I know it can.

But nobody else is going to change that other than ourselves and the message to the players is simple: be brave and try and take more risks with the ball, especially in the final third. That is the place for us to be that little bit braver, taking opponents on in wide areas and in the box.


Saturday's game saw us lose Amari'i Bell late in the second half and in the lead-up to the game we also found out that we will be without Teden Mengi for some considerable time after having a knee operation. It means that the defence will be stretched but opportunities will now come for others to stake a claim in the side.

Thank you for your backing of the teams on Saturday. Storm Darragh certainly did not make Kenilworth Road the most comfortable place to be but despite the cold, wet and wind your support was excellent and we'll need that once more tonight under the lights.

Please continue to get behind the players and enjoy the game.

Good evening everyone, I hope you're all well and looking forward to another important Championship game as we entertain Stoke.

My notes in Saturday's programme were dominated about the importance of learning and knowing CPR as the game saw us welcome members from the British Heart Foundation who were around the ground giving information on how to save someone's life if they are having a cardiac arrest.

So you can imagine our collective shock when one of our supporters collapsed with a suspected cardiac arrest inside the Kenny shortly before kick-off. On behalf of everyone here I'd like to thank the St John's and East of England Ambulance services, plus stewards, police and fire and rescue services who were involved in the treatment and evacuation of our supporter from the ground.

I'm also informed that our supporters were involved from the start, including helping hold up privacy screens while the treatment was being administered. Thank you so much for that. It was great news to hear the fan was in a stable condition in hospital.

So a huge, huge shout out to everyone for their swift response that ultimately helped save a life. That is now two cardiac arrests that have taken place in or around the ground since mine, so while I am thankful both supporters are okay, it goes to show that this is a common issue, so if you haven't learned CPR yet, please don't wait for another reminder to realise how important it is.

Don't be selfish thinking that 15 minutes of your time is more important than saving someone's life. Chances are it is likely to be someone that you know and love. Just think about that for a second. So if you are yet to know what to do in this situation, scan the QR code on this page to direct you to the BHF's RevivR tool.

Matters on the pitch have been frustrating in recent weeks, but we earned a point on Saturday in conditions that were hardly ideal. The lads battled and Eli tucked home another goal after doing what he does best – scaring opposition defences.

We couldn't hold onto the lead but it's a point and we move on and go into tonight's game aiming to maintain our decent home form. We've lost once in seven here, and even in that one game against Sunderland our performance was excellent, so we need to take encouragement from that into this evening.

With games coming thick and fast as the festive period approaches, please continue your great support of the lads. We're not going to pretend everything's rosy as the table doesn't lie, but with the quality we have in the squad I know that this group is well capable of stringing together a run of positive results.

Bring the noise and join me in getting behind the boys tonight. Come on Luton.

We'd like to extend a special welcome to those who have travelled from Stoke to join us this evening.

Following Saturday's game against Swansea, the Club would like to express our heartfelt thoughts to the Luton supporter who was taken unwell before kick-off. A big thank you goes out to those who acted swiftly, including our club staff and the match officials.

I am pleased to confirm that the fan is in a stable condition in hospital after an operation. The fact the incident happened on the day of our match to promote the great work of the British Heart Foundation serves as a reminder to us all to learn CPR. The swift reactions

of those around the supporter helped save a life. If you don't already know how to administer CPR, please check out the BHF's website and RevivR tool. It only takes 15 minutes.

As you know, boardroom programme notes are shared amongst the board of investors – with David and Gary carrying the bulk – and, occasionally, amongst the executive board. Hence, this is my scheduled turn.

As I sat down to write these notes ahead of tonight's match, I couldn't help but feel a mix of nerves and excitement. For one, this is my very first attempt at writing boardroom notes, and secondly, there's something nostalgic about today's fixture. My first-ever Luton Town game was also against Stoke City, back in November 2021. We won't mention the result, but here's hoping for a more favourable

outcome on the pitch this time!

Before I dive in, let me take a moment to introduce myself. I'm Jenn Smith, and I have the privilege of serving as HR Director here at Kenilworth Road. My role is all about people – recruiting, developing and supporting the individuals who work tirelessly behind the scenes to keep this club thriving. While writing these notes is new for

#### LIFE-SAVERS RECOGNISED

With the first anniversary of our captain Tom Lockyer suffering a cardiac arrest on the pitch at Bournemouth approaching this weekend, Saturday's match against Swansea was dedicated to the British Heart Foundation and the importance of learning CPR.

At half-time two presentations were made by chairman David Wilkinson to Luton Town supporters who in recent months have saved lives with their knowledge of CPR.

Firstly, you may have seen the story of Paul Rodell (pictured above, left), who collapsed on his way up Kenilworth Road to the stadium for the Chelsea match last season. Walking closely behind was, luckily, was Sue Collins who performed CPR and used a defibrillator to save Paul's life.

Secondly, at the recent Love Luton Runfest, when one of the runners suddenly collapsed, suffering a cardiac arrest just by the finish line, a local nurse, Wayne Pavey (above right), quickly stepped in to perform CPR. His swift action saved a life and the runner is recovering well. 13

The points were shared at Kenilworth Road, as a goal by Elijah Adebayo, who pounced on a mistake by Swansea defender Ben Cabango in the first half, was levelled by a well worked corner routine by Swansea midfielder Matt Grimes.

Under the swirling rain and winds of Luton, Adebayo opened the scoring in the 17th minute, pouncing on an under hit back pass by Cabango and then taking it round the goalkeeper Lawrence Vigouroux and finishing from an acute angle to put the Town 1-0 up.

The visitors then instantly almost hit back with Thomas Kaminski pulling off a strong save to deny Josh Tymon from close range.

Kaminski was then once again called into action as Tymon found himself completely free at the back post and met Grimes' cross into the box, but his header was weak and went straight into the arms of Luton's number 24.

Shortly before half-time, from a set piece, Jordan Clark whipped in a dangerous ball which Adebayo couldn't quite make the right connection with and just headed wide.

The Hatters remained firm in defence for the rest of the half to hold the visitors and go in 1-0 up at half-time.

After the restart the Town came close to making it 2-0 when Adebayo's fine shot, after taking a pass from Daiki Hashioka, was turned around the post by Vigouroux.

Early into the second half, Goncalo Franco struck well from the edge of the box, destined to find the back of the net, but Kaminski once again pulled off a wonder save with his fingertips to push the ball wide.

Minutes later, Swansea equalised through Grimes who was unmarked at the edge of the box and met a cut back from a corner and smashed into the top left corner of the net.


At around the 70th minute mark Luton had a positive attack through Carlton Morris who squared it across the box, but no one was there to knock the ball in.

Around five minutes later, Kaminski once again came to the rescue as he saved a low driven shot by Florian Bianchini for Swansea.

In the closing stages, Swansea had another great chance to win it when substitute Jisung Eom got his header all wrong from close range as he met a leftwing cross by Bianchini.

The Hatters held on however, and fought out for the 1-1 draw against a battling Swansea side in the stormy conditions at Kenilworth Road.

## ELIJAH TAKING THE POSITIVES

Goalscorer Elijah Adebayo took the positives from Saturday's "ugly" point gained in the 1-1 draw with Swansea City at Kenilworth Road.

In a match severely hampered by Storm Daragh, Adebayo gave the Hatters an early lead before Swans captain Matt Grimes squared things up after the break.

The 26-year-old expressed his disappointment at not being able to hold onto that advantage, but saw it as another point added to the Town total as we look to climb the Championship table.

"It was a difficult game with the conditions, of course," said the striker. "We knew it was going to be that type of game, we knew it was going to be ugly, we essentially said that we'd have to win ugly and it takes that in this league to climb up the table.

"Unfortunately, for a lapse in concentration from our point, we conceded at a set piece, which obviously we pride ourselves on, so we are very disappointed to come away with a draw.

"It could have gone either way. We have to be honest and take that, they had a few opportunities, but the main thing is that it's a point on the board and we just have to go again on Tuesday."

For his fourth goal of the season, and second in as many matches, the former Fulham and Walsall man pounced on a short back-pass to round City keeper Lawrence Vigouroux and slot home from a narrowing angle.

"Again, with the conditions there are bound to be mistakes, and you almost have to sniff it out as any good centre-forward would, to try and capitalise on any errors," he said.

"Hard work and chasing down defenders and goalkeepers is something that everyone knows that I do, so to get my reward from it was great. It was a tight angle, but I managed to squeeze it in."



Elijah also stressed the importance of using his second goal in as many matches as a springboard for the rest of the season.


The frontman said: "Yes, it's a good confidence boost but I want more, we want more, the staff are demanding more and we know that we need to start putting some points on the board and some good performances for the fans, because they come home and away, and we understand it's tough – it's cold, it's windy, it's wet and for us as players, when we cross that white line we need to be able to give them something to get behind.


"They were once we got the goal, and then we obviously just fell away a little bit. We've been a little bit guilty of that over a large amount of games.

"I understand it's tough and yes, conditions play a part, but as the players, we've got to be focussed for 90-odd minutes, or however long it is." 19

had an up and down start to the
season and sit in 15th place in the
Championship standings.

The Potters are currently five games without a win after a run of difficult games. Draws against Millwall, QPR and Preston were followed by losses to Burnley and Sunderland.

Prior to this run, Stoke were doing well and picked up big wins against Derby County and Blackburn Rovers. The 2-0 away win against Blackburn in particular was an impressive one.

Notably, the Potters got one of the most comprehensive wins in the division so far this season when they beat Portsmouth 6-1. Striker Tom Cannon scored four goals in the demolition all within the space of a few minutes.

Last time out, Stoke lost 2-1 away at Sunderland in a tough game at the Stadium of Light. A brace from Tom Watson saw the home side come from behind to win.

The Town won on Stoke's last visit to Kenilworth Road in February 2023 when a solitary strike from Pelly Ruddock Mpanzu earned us all three points.

That was the first time a Luton side had beaten Stoke at Kenilworth Road in seven previous winless attempts (D3, L4).

Since the start of the 1995/96 the Potters have enjoyed the upper hand over us, winning 13 of the 21 meetings in that time.

A warm welcome to Kenilworth Road to all those associated with Stoke City.

Black and green stripes with a British beer sponsor? It's not something you see (or write for that matter) very often. This Stoke offering for their away shirts in the mid-90s gave the Potters faithful something more exciting to wear rather than the age-old traditional red and white stripes.

#### A FOOT IN BOTH



#### CAMERON JEROME

Plenty of big names have served both so it's hard to pick one but Cameron Jerome made significant contributions for the Town and the Potters. After spells at Cardiff and Birmingham he joined Stoke in 2011/12 and went onto score seven times in the Premier League. The striker's career took him to the Kenny in 2021/22 where his experience was vital across two seasons as we twice reached the play-offs.

#### **POTTERS CULT HERO**

A cult hero at the Britannia Stadium for his unparalleled contribution to the club's success during their Premier League years, primarily through his iconic long throws, **Rory Delap** signed from Sunderland in 2006.

He initially seemed like a solid but unspectacular midfielder, however, his ability to hurl the ball into the penalty box with remarkable accuracy and velocity turned him into a game-changer for Tony Pulis' Potters.

The long throws were effectively set pieces



in themselves, often wreaking havoc in opposition defences. These not only led to countless goals but also defined Stoke's physical, direct style of play under Pulis. For Stoke fans, his throws embodied the team's gritty ethos

and ability to punch above their weight in the Premier League with his contributions instrumental in Stoke's promotion to the top flight in 2008 and subsequent survival in the top-flight.

Beyond his throws,
Delap was a tireless
worker in midfield,
embodying commitment
and professionalism.
He endeared himself
to the fans through his
humility, work ethic, and
loyalty, spending six
years at the club during
a transformative period
in Stoke's history.

#### FIXTURE FLASHBACK

**TOWN 6-2 STOKE 23rd NOVEMBER 1993** 

A hat-trick from Kerry Dixon inspired the Hatters to hit Stoke for six and become the first Luton player to score a league treble at Kenilworth Road in five years.

The Town found themselves two goals behind to the Potters after just 20 minutes as a Dave Regis strike and a Des Linton own goal had City 2-0 up. But the Hatters stormed back. Dixon's 25-yard curler got one back before a 35-yard rocket from Ceri Hughes brought the Town level.

Scott Oakes then completed the turnaround, putting the Town in front seven minutes before the break.

And the goals continued after the interval as Dixon made it four and

five with two goals in the space of eight minutes.

The coup de gras was then added in the final moments when John Hartson made it six in injury time to seal an afternoon to remember.


Stoke, however, would go on and enjoy the majority of the 24 meetings that followed as the Town would win in only five of those



Preserving and appreciating the heritage and history of Luton Town Football Club

On the 13th of January 1954 a 38-year-old outside right prepared to make his first competitive appearance at Kenilworth Road.

The game was an FA
Cup third round replay
between Blackpool and
Luton, after a 1-1 draw at
Bloomfield Road four days
previously. Just 8 months
earlier he'd played in the
FA Cup Final, perhaps the
most famous final of all
time, one still named for
him. He was, of course,
Stanley Matthews.

The teams would need four matches to be separated before Dally Duncan's side finally fell to the holders with a 2-0 loss at Molineux. Despite his age Matthews played in all four games and his meetings with the Hatters were only just starting. He took part in four league matches following Town's promotion to the top flight in 1955, of which he won two and lost two.

He was on the pitch for perhaps the most famous game in Kenilworth Road's long history, one which will now forever hold the attendance record of 30,069. It was an FA Cup replay once more and the schools of Luton had emptied to watch Allan Brown's 74th-minute goal send Luton into a

first FA Cup semi-final.

Blackpool's defeat was in spite of their legendary player. "It's Matthews everywhere...at left back, inside left and even outside left, and slowly he inspired Blackpool back into command," it's noted in the match report.

Remarkably, he was 44 years old.

He had returned to Stoke City by the time of his last game against the Town, played on the final day of the 1962/63 season. He marked the occasion with a goal, his only one in 12 meetings against the Hatters and the 80th and very last Football League strike of his 697 games, which had been played over an incredible 34 years.

Born in Hanley, one of the six towns of Stoke, and forever linked with the Potters and Blackpool, Matthews actually grew up a Port Vale fan and it was with the Valiants that he, now Sir Stanley Matthews, made his only visit to Kenilworth Road as a manager, a Fourth Division game in March 1968 which Luton won 2-0 thanks to goals from lan Buxton and Bruce Rioch.

Vale were in a financial mess, fined by the FA due to 'financial irregularities' and threatened with expulsion from the Football League. It's said that only the pleadings from Matthews, and the sheer weight of his name, kept them in.



Life certainly is never dull in the rollercoaster existence of Luton Town.




Elijah Adebayo heads in the opener against Manchester City last season



## Champions!

Over the course of the season we'll be looking back 20 years to the glorious League One championship winning season of 2004/05.

So many club league records were tumbled during a momentous campaign which was even more remarkable considering that the summer of 2003 saw the arrival of new 'owner' John Gurney and his crackpot ideas, which ultimately led to the Hatters needing to enter administrative receivership, with all its problems, to get rid of him. Club historian Roger Wash tells the story of a season to remember.

## 2004/05 **history**

Following the 2-0 physical battering at Brentford the previous Tuesday the Town were now back on home soil where lower mid-table Port Vale were the visitors.

A surprise choice to replace the suspended Steve Howard was 17-year-old Calvin Andrew who was preferred to Enoch Showunmi.

The Valiants were forced to name two YTS youngsters on the bench, as well as youth team manager Andy Porter who had not played a game for two years. As predicted, Vale defended in depth from the start which was going to make a for a long and frustrating afternoon.

Andrew went close with a header that was cleared off the line while skipper Kevin Nicholls forced Vale keeper Jonny Brain into a fingertip save from a 25-yard effort but the Town could not force their way through with the frustration on the pitch seeping onto the terraces.

Both Chris Coyne and Rowan Vine picked up silly bookings for late challenges as things began to boil over but the introduction of Showunmi for Andrew gave everyone a lift as the Town continued to plug away.

After Stephen O'Leary volleyed against the crossbar, the

breakthrough came on 84 minutes in spectacular fashion. Kevin Foley sent over a cross from the right and despite a crowded penalty area, Ahmet Brkovic found space to control the ball on his chest before executing a perfect overhead kick that flew into the net. A goal worthy of winning any game.

A relieved manager Mike Newell said afterwards: "Sometimes you have to grind out results. They set their stall out to snatch a point and this win is as important a three points as we've got all season. We know there will be off days but as long as the players keep giving their all as they have today I'm happy."

A week later the Town were on the road again, this time to Ashton Gate, Bristol where they had not won since 1973. Showunmi kept his place for his first start of the season after 14 substitute appearances, while midfielder Peter Holmes also made his first start replacing flu-sufferer Stephen O'Leary.

Bristol City were just outside the play-off spots and started the game well but the Hatters were soon on the front foot with both skipper Kevin Nicholls and Paul Underwood forcing saves from Robins goalkeeper Steve Phillips.

The goal the Town deserved for their first-

## **2004/05 history**

half play came in the 34th minute when Chris Coyne, still upfield following a free-kick, rose unopposed to head in a cross from Paul Underwood.

Soon afterwards Coyne was on the receiving end of a flailing arm from City's Steve Brooker, similar to the one that saw Steve Howard dismissed at Brentford. Coyne needed to change shirts such was the amount of blood loss from his nose but Brooker merely received a caution.

Just before the interval the Town had a stonewall penalty appeal turned down after a clever piece of skill saw Underwood through on goal only to be upended. The referee waved away the appeals and instead awarded the Town a corner even

though Underwood was the last man to touch the ball!

Early in the second period City player-manager Brian Tinnion made a triple change, including himself, to try to salvage something from the game. Reenergised, City took the game to the Town and levelled on 66 minutes when Leroy Lita somehow adjusted his body to send in a brilliant scissors kick which flashed into the net.


That was as good as it got for the Robins though as it was the Hatters who controlled the rest of the game with both Holmes and Underwood going close. The deserved winner came rather late as there was only a minute left on the clock when

Underwood sent in a low cross for Showunmi to poke the ball home at the near post. Cue delirium among the Luton faithful behind the goal.


"It's always a difficult place to come to, but I think on the first half performance we deserved to be in front. We took the sting out of the game and our passing was good

although until we scored we didn't seem to have an end product," said a contented Mike Newell at the end.

"We are missing Steve Howard and need to get goals from somewhere else while he is suspended but we're not a one-man team. We came here today with a patched up side and got a terrific victory."



The Luton Town 1982-1984 home shirt is a classic piece of Luton Town football shirt history and represents a vibrant period in the club's history with two seasons in the top-flight.

Renowned for its distinctive design and colours, this shirt is one of the most popular designs within our history, reproduced many times and often considered one of the best.

Manufactured during our legendary collaboration with Adidas, the shirt features the club's traditional colours of orange, white and navy blue. This design was somewhat ahead of its time, introducing a dash of flair and style to the English football leagues, where plainer designs were more common.

The body is our traditional white, with the iconic Bedford Trucks sponsor and that lovely 80s Luton Town badge on the chest. The sleeves are blocks of orange, with the famous Adidas stripes going down the sleeves. It also has a lovely orange neckline, that just brings the whole shirt together.

This shirt holds a special place in the hearts of Luton Town supporters, representing a period of both top division success and wonderful memories of mixing it with the big boys. It also represents an era where football shirts started to become a fashion – with designers starting to think a bit more about what will sell and therefore having a more creative freedom that the historic, traditional shirts.

Its debut season saw us survive on the last day of the season in that famous away win at Manchester City, but that was in the orange away shirt, so we'll save that for another article!

In 1982/83, key matches in this shirt included

a 3-3 away draw at Liverpool, beating Brighton 5-0 at home thanks to a Brian Stein hat-trick, another draw with Manchester United at Kenilworth Road (1-1), and beating Watford 1-0 thanks to a Clive Goodyear goal.

The following campaign saw us finish an improved 16th in the table to retain our topflight status. Wonderful players like Raddy Antic, Mal Donaghy, Brian Stein, Paul Walsh, Kirk Stephens, Brian Horton and Ricky Hill adorned this iconic shirt. What a classic!

## MY FAVOURITE PLAYER...

## Chris Johnson pays homage to his favourite player to have worn the town shirt

I could have picked a lot of players for my favourite in my time supporting Luton but when I had to narrow it down to just one I chose the man who lifted silverware for the club on two different occasions in Kevin Nicholls.

My dad started taking me to Luton games in the early 90s and for the first part of my Luton Town supporting career we did not have a lot of success (with the possible exception of the 1996/97 season when a Tony Thorpe inspired Town finished third in the old Division 2 (now League One) before losing to Crewe in the play-off semi-finals, despite beating them 6-0 earlier on that season, (typical Luton!).

Then in 2001 we got relegated to the old Division 3. I remember Joe Kinnear making lots of signings that summer, players that would go on to become some of Luton's better players in recent memory such as Chris Coyne, Steve Howard and Ahmet Brkovic to name a few, but it was Nicholls who was always my favourite.

I loved his tackling, his leadership, his eye for a pass and his penalties. I once remember him screaming at Dean Morgan when we were in the Championship for not clearing the ball, and I remember how the crowd would 'ooh' at some of his slide tackles.

His penalty against Plymouth in the home 2-0 win while we were chasing them in the 2001/02 season, the long range goal at Doncaster in the final game of our League One title success in 2005 and his penalty against Liverpool in the 5-3 FA Cup game the next season were also stand out moments. I loved how he drove his team mates on.

I remember being in Australia when I got news of him signing for Leeds. I was gutted, and spent the whole day grumpy.

Although he was not as good when he re-signed, I was there in 2009 in the JPT final where he rolled back the years with a great performance and lifted the trophy. Great memories! I now have a couple of his signed shirts in pride of place in my house.



The Town almost replied instantly, Tasha Fensome's attempted lob sailed just over the bar.

On 10 minutes, Hudson made another great save. Portsmouth squared the ball in the box and looked certain to score, but Luton's number 1 got down low to make another great save.

As Pompey pressed, Nicole Farmer produced a great bit of defending, sliding in to halt a promising looking Portsmouth counter attack.

Back came the Hatters and a free-kick, just inside Portsmouth's half, was swung in by Fiona Buttigieg but Portsmouth were able to head clear at the back post.

Hudson produced more incredible goalkeeping, she made a reaction save at her near post as the Hatters were unable to clear and Portsmouth created another chance, which was then held by last weekend's FA Cup hero.

On the half hour mark, Portsmouth doubled their lead when Sophie Quirk netted from close range after a pinpoint delivery from Rolf.

Just before the break it was 3-0 as Quirk scored her second and Portsmouth's third. The ball fell to Quirk after a goalmouth scramble and she rifled the ball into the roof of the net.

The Town dealt with everything Portsmouth threw at them in the opening 15 of the second half. The Hatters broke free on the left hand side after some blistering pace from Gabriella Spillman, which saw her fly past the Portsmouth right back, who eventually dragged her down.

With 20 minutes played in the second half Portsmouth scored their fourth when Quirk secured her hat-trick with a smart finish into the bottom right corner of the net.

Georgie Freeland then bagged Portsmouth's fifth with five minutes left, arriving at the end of a cross to head the ball home.



Blackburn Rovers will pose a challenging opponent for the Town this Saturday, with recent form suggesting they are on an upward trajectory in the 2024/25 Championship season.

After a mixed start,
Rovers have stabilised,
securing three
consecutive wins
against Leeds, Hull City
and Middlesbrough,
all by narrow margins.
These victories
demonstrate their
ability to grind out
results, particularly
in tight matches and
sit sixth place in the
Championship table.

Their recent matches reflect a defensively solid and opportunistic approach. Their 1-0 wins against Leeds and Hull highlight a resolute backline and efficiency in front of goal. Key players such as Todd Cantwell, who scored a decisive penalty against Leeds, and Dominic Hyam, a reliable presence in defence,

have been instrumental in their success

Manager John Eustace appears to favour a compact setup, prioritising defensive organisation and swift transitions. Their ability to absorb pressure and exploit counterattacking opportunities will likely be central to their strategy against us at the weekend.

Blackburn's squad this season has seen minimal additions. reflecting a focus on continuity rather than major overhaul. Notable summer arrivals include Owen Beck, on loan from Liverpool, who has added depth to their defensive options, and Balázs Tóth, a Hungarian goalkeeper brought in to bolster competition for the number one spot. Danny Batth, a seasoned defender signed from Norwich, has brought valuable experience

Despite limited activity in the transfer market, Rovers' reliance on young talent from their academy, alongside experienced heads, has created a balanced squad capable of competing against the league's stronger sides.

The Town will be aiming to continue their good recent form against Rovers. Since our promotion back to the second tier in 2019, we have lost just once in eight meetings, that coming at Ewood Park in January 2021 in a 1-0 defeat.

Our last trip to this corner of Lancashire saw a Tom Lockyer goal give the Hatters a point in a 1-1 draw in May 2023 shortly before the play-offs that we went on to win. The Town won 2-1 at Ewood Park in September 2019 thanks to goals from James Collins and Matty Pearson while two late goals from Luke Berry earned a point in a dramatic 2-2 draw in September 2021.





move it from side to side, and that's us waving goodbye to consideration to the travelling supporter. The new TV schedule has thrown up some shockers but the FA Cup third round has taken it to a new level.

We've had our fair share with the Friday night in Plymouth and the 12.30 at Middlesbrough, not to mention a variety of home kick offs which can be just as annoying.

Our other 3CR clubs have also been affected. Watford also had a Friday night in Plymouth, and have a 12.30 at Sunderland to look forward to. At least common sense prevailed for their trip to Cardiff on Saturday with a postponement on Friday afternoon. MK weren't so lucky with Barrow waiting until 10.30 on Saturday morning.

The FA Cup schedule has rightly been criticised for having similar disregard for fans. We've been spared with 3pm on Saturday for the trip to Forest. Others haven't been so lucky as the lengthy list of TV commitments is ticked off

The game provoking most anger is Peterborough's trip to Everton being moved to a Thursday night. The reason is Liverpool also having a home tie, but Sunday is available.

Thursday night will rule out the trip for many Posh fans, especially families who might have been attracted by likely reduced admission prices. Many Evertonians might also miss out on what might be the last FA Cup match at Goodison Park.

Put altogether, with various ownership issues up and down the country, and throw in to the mix Manchester United increasing concession tickets to £66, and you can see why the government is preparing to step in.

We have our own concerns closer to home of course. I enjoyed the reminiscing about the trip to Alfreton in Saturday's programme. Eleven years have flown by since that pivotal moment in the Conference title winning season and reminds us how much has been achieved. That said there can be no doubt that this season is not living up to expectations.

Councillors are expected to approve the revised Power Court plans next Monday night as we move closer to the stadium we have needed for so long. The announcement about Vauxhall only reinforces the importance of the football club to the town. Longer term and shorter term there is much to consider.
