THE BOSS

Good evening and welcome back to Kenilworth Road to you all as we host Derby County in the Championship.

I would like to welcome Paul Warne and his staff and players, including Sonny Bradley and James Collins – two players who have made significant contributions to this club's success in the past. A big welcome to them as well the supporters of the Rams who have made the trip south this evening.

Tonight's game represents our final home game of 2024 in which we have experienced the highs and lows of football. The year started with wins over Bolton and Everton in the FA Cup, including a last-minute winner at Goodison and, in one of our last home games of the year, it has ended with a last-minute winner thanks to Elijah's goal against Stoke.

Over the past decade or so, this club has

always been on an upward trajectory. Now we're facing the first challenge we've had in a really long time – dealing with inconsistent performances and results. It's something we're frustrated with and working hard to improve in order to move forward again.

January is on the horizon, a month in which we'll be able to make one or two adjustments that we're going to need. It's clear we've had a lot of challenges through injuries, including some really unexpected ones, including Locks.

As I mentioned in my press conference yesterday, he has suffered a serious and innocuous injury in training just when he was on the cusp of a return for us.

This incident, as well as what happened to Locks at Bournemouth, together with a couple of serious injuries, have meant we've really missed some key personnel. In the summer we worked hard to keep the players we wanted and, yes, we lost some too, but we're aiming to rediscover the kind of form that led to success over the past couple of years.

At our home last home game the lads showed great character to bounce back from conceding an early goal to beat Stoke. In the first half I thought we played some excellent football and in the second half we dug in, defended well and deservedly secured the points late on.

We challenged the lads to follow that victory up with a positive performance at Blackburn. Once again, however, consistency eluded us, and we were left to reflect on a defeat against an in-form opponent. Other than the two goals I felt there wasn't much in the game but we were hugely disappointed in the manner of the goals we conceded.

A big thank you to those supporters who made

the long trip to Blackburn and to everyone who has backed us home and away throughout 2024.

Have an amazing Christmas with your family, friends and loved ones. Let's look forward to an exciting year. Life is never dull at this football club so let's get ready to back each other and go again in 2025.

I wish those travelling to Bristol and Swansea safe travels before we look forward to welcoming you back here on New Year's Day against Norwich.

Enjoy the game and bring the noise.

An incident at our home game against Swansea a couple of weeks ago saw one of our own fans need CPR to save his life after suffering a cardiac arrest. Therefore, I will continue to plead to anyone who does not know how to administer it: learn it -you don't know when you might need to step up and save someone's life.

to frustrate us. It's something we're obviously looking to rectify but I wish it was as straightforward as finding a solution but unfortunately, it isn't. On a positive note, our home form has been good, and we will be hoping for that to continue tonight.

Derby are a good side, still carrying momentum from promotion last season. They enjoyed a thumping 4-0 win over Portsmouth on the telly last week so we know how dangerous they can be. We'll have to be on top of our game but, with your support behind us, I know we can maintain our solid form here at Kenilworth Road.

On a personal note, sadly I must inform you of a setback I've suffered in my bid to return to football. First of all, let me make this clear: mv cardiac rehab is totally fine. However, in training I suffered an absolute freak injury and I've had to have an operation on the subsequent ligament damage. So I'm now on crutches and it means I'm out for a few more weeks.

It's unfortunate, and I'm not going to lie, it's been hard. I had got into a position to be so close to returning so it's been really tough for me. But there's nothing I can do now, just work hard and get back fit as soon as possible.

Tonight's game is the final game before Christmas and the last home match before 2025 rolls around. So with that, I'd like to wish you all a happy Christmas and a happy New Year. I hope you enjoy time with those who matter most to you.

Thank you for your support throughout the past year, not just towards the lads, but to me personally – your messages of encouragement mean the world.

Get behind the team this evening and enjoy the game.

BOARDROOM GARY SWEET

Good evening and a warm, festive welcome to our final fixture at Kenilworth Road before Christmas and the final fixture of 2024.



In true Luton fashion, 2024 has witnessed many ups and downs. The rollercoaster rides of football - and, in particular, Luton Town - are what truly grips us, isn't it? Without the emotional highs and lows of the beautiful game, I'm confident I and many others would all be watching another sport. Typically, just last week, in the space of three days, we endured disappointment and elation.

But, without doubt, our biggest victory of the year was played out on a Monday night fixture at the Town Hall, in front of a crowd of dignitaries, resulting in a massive home win for the Town but without a ball being kicked.

All of us present in the Council's chambers, along with the many Hatters watching the live stream, were thrilled that our detailed planning application for a long-awaited new home at Power Court was given the final green light by Luton Borough Council marking the end of formalities on our new stadium journey as we celebrate the fact that no further permissions are required.

It's another defining milestone in the delivery of our long-held plans for a new stadium against our seemingly disappointing season in the Premier League. In an ironic and bittersweet way, it was last season's short visit to the top table which provided the resources for the redesigned bigger, more ambitious stadium which will provide the foundations for a longer Premier League visit next time.

First and foremost, we would like to thank everyone at the Council – councillors, planning officers, executive officers and the leader – who have all been amazingly supportive during the challenging but enjoyable

process – to all of those who supported the applications.

I'd also like to take this opportunity to thank all of you for your patience and support in enduring this long, extended process. Personally, I consider myself to be a patient person, but as we battled through the numerous challenges since the conception of our original plan, I've had to learn to put my eagerness and frustrations to one side. Patience truly is a virtue when you know you're on the right track (on and off the pitch!).

And this presents the ideal opportunity for

me to briefly elaborate on what comes next now we have no formal incumbrances.

Alas, whilst many may expect piling and brick-building to start immediately, there are still a few agenda items we need to tick off which we can only do when our decision notice is awarded.

Of course, in terms of physical constraints, we do have the small matters of relocating a sub-station and the diversion of the river before we can begin the physical work, which will just take a few months. The latter is more within our control but whilst we are forced to pay for the new sub-

station, we are beholden to UKPN for its installation, switch-over and removal of the old one.

Meanwhile, as this work continues, we have an intensive period of appointing a master contractor - where I can inform you that the selection process has excitedly begun with the initial response being very positive.

Our core focus is structuring the necessary cashflow funding to help pay for the construction of the stadium itself until such a time that the residential development has been completed a few years later and, in particular, we are in dialogue with public bodies for some financial support for the site-wide infrastructure which is key to the town's wider regeneration.

Working with the appointed contractor, we will also need to deal with the many conditions in the planning consent, section 106 agreements and, of course, to meet the numerous compliances set out by the various authorities.

At the same time, we will also be resubmitting new plans for the wider Power Court site - for the residential development - so we can establish a phased construction plan, starting of course with the stadium itself. The work for this masterplan has already been done and these will be made public in the not-toodistant future.

Anyway, enough of this detail, I hear you cry. The plan is to have 'spades in the ground' within about six months. From then we're looking at approximately a twoyear build, as long as we don't experience any further unforeseen obstacles. Now, whilst this may suggest a potential 2027/28 season start, even after fitout and the necessary test events - which is indeed our ideal target - history would suggest that we may be prudent to hope for this but expect the season after. Nevertheless, it's a relief, and long time coming, that we have been given the goahead and through the excitement of the news comes the realisation that Kenilworth Road's days are, sadly, numbered. Indeed, we may be down to fewer than 60 matches remaining in our old girl - and maybe fewer than 15-20 under the lights.

That's why making the most of nights, and occasions, like tonight makes it all the more

important to cherish. It's also why, as part of Power Court's designs, we intend to transport the intricacies and uniqueness of Kenilworth Road to our new home.

We all love her and have looked after her well, but last season showed us why we need to move on. We put up a fantastic fight against clubs boasting far superior facilities and associated funds in an attempt to keep ourselves alive at that level. When we rejoin the Premier League, despite the odds, we have to stay there and Power Court - even the construction of it - will help enormously. I can't stress enough how the new stadium will give us long-term sustainability as a Club, which has always been the priority for us.

On the pitch, this season has not gone as we had predicted - there's simply no hiding from that. But as the players and staff, focus on finding consistency - especially in taking our home form away - in the camp, we do feel as though we have turned a corner, which would be more evident to all if it wasn't for further injuries.

Indeed, if it wasn't also for mind-bogaling actions that lead to absence through repeated suspensions! This is certainly not the Luton way - at a time when all of our talent is needed the most. I won't defend Liam for his actions last Saturday, and I can confirm he will be issued the maximum >>

Before I conclude, may I just thank Jenn Smith for her notes in the last programme versus Stoke and, by contributing, she became the first female Finally, tonight – as is tradition – we welcome the brass band from the Salvation Army, who will supply a festive soundtrack to our matchday atmosphere. There will be a collection outside the ground, so please donate if you're able to.

So that's almost a wrap for 2024. Thank you for your unwavering support through good times and difficult periods over the past 12 months, it means the world to us supporters on the board who cannot always shout encouragement for the team around the country.

Please join me one last time before the new year in getting behind Rob, his team and the players, and remember to drink in the atmosphere that only Kenilworth Road can give.

A last-minute goal from Elijah Adebayo earned the Town a dramatic but deserved victory over Stoke to maintain their good form at Kenilworth Road.

Trailing to Tom Cannon's early goal the Hatters fought back to claim their fifth win in nine home games with Carlton Morris' header levelling midway through the first half.

Both sides had chances in the second half but the Town finished the stronger and, as time ticked into the 90th minute, Adebayo reacted first to Tom Krauß's blocked shot to guide home his fifth goal in his last nine starts to spark scenes of celebration and lift the Hatters further up the Championship table.

Cannon's opener came in the sixth minute, finishing well after speeding clear of the Town defence and beating an exposed Thomas Kaminski.

But as the game settled, so did the Hatters as they grew into the game. Their first big chance arrived in the 13th minute when former Stoke man Jacob Brown – in from the start – slipped Adebayo in behind the Potters defence but his low shot was charged down visiting keeper Viktor Johansson.

However, the Town continued to press and their efforts were rewarded in the 24th minute when Jordan Clark's superb right-wing corner was met by the head of Morris, and his glancing header flew beyond Johannson for his fifth goal of the season.

Level the Hatters then came mighty close to taking the lead on the half-hour in a goalmouth scramble that somehow saw Stoke survive. Clark's corner caused the chaos with a Morris header saved and an Adebayo shot cleared off the line by Ben Wilmot.

The Town started the second half how they ended the first, on the front foot, with Clark's corners continuing to cause panic in the Stoke penalty area.

The Potters rode that storm and enjoyed a decent spell. Kaminski came to the Town's rescue on 56 minutes with a flying save to turn away Lewis Koumas' stinging effort and the same visiting player then spurned a good chance when well-placed moments later.

But, as the game entered the final 15 minutes, the Town found a second wind. Clark shot wide from distance before Morris side-footed a great chance wide of the post from close range after being found by Krauß's cut-back.


Then, with eight minutes left, another clearance off the line denied the Hatters when Adebayo's shot following a right-wing corner was hacked to safety by Cannon.

With time ticking the Hatters continued to push for a winner and in the final minute it came. A left-wing free-kick was half-cleared by Stoke to the feet of Krauß on the edge of the box. His shot was deflected into the path of Adebayo and he reacted quickest to sweep a first-time finish into the top corner.

Rovers had looked threatening in the opening exchanges with Amario Cozier-Duberry a menace on the right flank – and it was the on-loan winger who opened the scoring just after the half-hour mark. Makhtar Gueye was the creator, bursting into the box to lay the ball off to Cozier-Duberry whose low shot crept into the bottom corner.

The Hatters' response to going behind was excellent and within two minutes of trailing they came close to a leveller. Firstly Elijah Adebayo's low shot was parried away by Aynsley Pears in the Rovers goal and the home goalkeeper then kept out Tahith Chong's on-target follow-up.

But just when the Town sensed an equaliser, Blackburn doubled their lead five minutes before the break. Joe Rankin-Costello raced down the right and his cross seemed set to be converted by Gueye with the goal at his mercy. The Rovers striker completely fluffed a gilt-edged chance from six yards but the ball spun kindly into the path of Owen Beck who thundered a finish past Thomas Kaminski.

The Hatters number one stopped Rankin-Costello's shot on 43 minutes and Harry Pickering flicked an

effort inches wide in first-half stoppage time as the hosts ended the half in the ascendency.

Behind at the break the Town started the second half well, and Carlton Morris wasn't far away with a looping header five minutes after the restart following Jordan Clark's right-wing deep cross.

Jacob Brown then sent a low shot on the turn wide of the mark on 51 minutes as the Hatters continued to search for a way back into the game.

As the Town pressed in a bid to halve the deficit, Morris came mighty close to making it 2-1 shortly after the hour when turning brilliantly in the box and sending a shot on the turn millimetres wide of the post.

But the Hatters' hopes of mounting a comeback looked bleak on 73 minutes when Liam Walsh was red-carded for a late, rash challenge on Rovers' Yuki Ohashi.

As time ticked down Rovers ended the stronger with former Rovers stopper Kaminski having to repel efforts from substitutes Ryan Hedges and Harry Leonard and prevent a third.

But the Walsh red card knocked the stuffing out of the Town and the final whistle signalled a seventh straight away defeat. 19

Experienced wing-back Victor Moses on helping the Hatters

Victor Moses is determined to use his vast experience to help the Town move up the Championship table.

The former Chelsea, Liverpool and Inter Milan star joined the Hatters in September and put in a man-of-thematch display to help the Hatters earn three points against Stoke in our last match here at Kenilworth Road.

Despite the challenges the Hatters have faced since his arrival, Moses, who celebrated his 34th birthday last week, is bringing leadership and wisdom to the squad.

Reflecting on his role, the veteran wingback emphasised the importance of focus and discipline.

"I've told the lads to stay grounded and avoid overcomplicating things," he said. "We need to stick together and trust in our abilities."

"We just need to try and win as many games as

possible as I've been in a position like this before.

"We have a great manager here, who's been trying to encourage us every training session. If we make mistakes in a game he's trying to get us running again and trying to make sure we're doing things right, but we just need to enjoy football, just enjoy it, don't try and complicate the game, just do the basics stuff and things will come round."

The Hatters' 2-1 win over Stoke - recorded thanks to Elijah Adebayo's lastminute winner - extended the Town's fine home form which has seen them lose once in their last nine games at Kenilworth Road.

"I'm buzzing, very happy, we needed this win, it's very important because it's been a frustrating few weeks but we just needed to take our time," he said.

"We knew the time would come and scoring a late-minute goal from Eli was very important for the team. I was actually buzzing about it as I

know the fans are and everybody at the club were. It's very important to get the three points, but we need to put that to one side now."

Since arriving on a free transfer, Moses has been used in a variety of positions by Rob Edwards but being the player with the 'utility' tag is not something new for the 34-year-old.

"I'm a player that can play in any position. I'm happy to help the team anywhere the managers ask me to play. I'm willing to do it for the team," he said.

"I've always been that kind of player to switch position at any team, just to cover any player to help the team, I've always done that throughout my career and I want to keep on doing it.

"The most important thing is I want to keep on playing football and I want to keep on enjoying it and I did that. I want to keep on doing it consistently and try to help the team as much as possible to win more games."

CLICKER QUICK FIX NEEDED ON THE ROAD

The Hatters were defeated on the road once more last weekend at Blackburn and Jordan Clark says the Town need to get to the bottom of why results have been hard to come by away from Kenilworth Road.

"It's just the story of the season so far, and we've got to fix it quickly," Clark said after the 2-0 reverse at Ewood Park.

"I feel sorry for the fans, obviously, travelling all these miles all the time, and we're not giving any points and anything to cheer about. "I thought we turned the corner a little bit against Norwich. I thought the performance was really good, but just basic errors that cost us.

"I didn't think there was much in the game in the first half. I thought it was comfortable. And then, just basic errors have cost us. The ball in behind, there's a throwin and the next thing you know, he's shot through three players and you're wondering how it's gone in. Somehow no-one's blocked the ball.

"So it's just basic errors and accountability from

certain players. Like I said, we've got to fix it quick."

The Town go into tonight's game with Derby aiming to continue their good form on home soil that has seen us lose just once in nine games.

"We said in the dressing room that we know what we're going to get at home and that's the annoying thing," he said. "That's the worrying thing because we're at it at home.

"Sometimes our performance is not the

best but we're getting points and we've got a decent home record.

"But just coming away from home and I don't know what's wrong. It's something we've got to fix and look at ourselves in the mirror and look at ourselves as a squad and sort it quickly because half of the season's gone and there's a lot of points to get.

"We don't want to be down the bottom. We want to be pushing up. But it's one of them things, it's just disappointing again."

A FOOT IN BOTH



STEVE HOWARD

Big, strong target man with plenty of skill to boot, Steve scored goals wherever he went.

He was surprisingly allowed to move to Luton for £50,000 in 2001 and went on to become our third-highest post-war goalscorer and top-scored in each of his five seasons.

After helping the Town to two promotions, in 2002 and 2005, the Hatters accepted a £1 million bid from Derby in 2006 who he then won promotion to the Premier League with in 2007.

RAMS CULT HERO

Igor Štimac joined the Rams in 1995 under manager Jim Smith and quickly became a fans' favourite due to his commanding defensive performances, leadership and charismatic personality.

The Croatian international played a pivotal role in helping Derby secure promotion to the Premier League during the 1995/96 season but what made Štimac stand out was not just his defensive prowess but his passion

and connection with the fans. His style of play - tough, committed, and technically sound

and technically soundmade him a huge hit with the Derby fans.

During his time at the club, Štimac captained the side and made over 80 appearances but even after leaving Derby, his legacy remained intact, as fans continued to view him as a symbol of that exciting era under Smith, which included the move to Pride Park.



FIXTURE FLASHBACK

TOWN 3-2 DERBY 28th JANUARY 2020

The Hatters came from behind to secure a memorable 3-2 victory over the Rams to end a run of eight Championship matches without a win.

Wayne Rooney had put the Rams ahead in the 63rd minute but Pelly Ruddock Mpanzu levelled proceedings four minutes later on the sixth anniversary of him signing permanently for the club.

Substitute Donervon Daniels scored his first goal for the Hatters in the 73rd minute but Chris Martin pegged Town back once again with five minutes to play. The drama continued as the Hatters regained the lead 60 seconds later with Harry Cornick's shot going in off Jayden Bogle.

Derby's Max Lowe was sent-off by referee Andy Davies in the dying embers and the Hatters stayed strong to record a first victory since December.

Preserving and appreciating the heritage and history of Luton Town Football Club

Almost 50 years ago to the day the Hatters entertained Derby in a first top-flight meeting between the sides.

Luton headed into the match bottom of the table and with only one win, a 3-1 victory over fellow Division 1 new boys Carlisle all the way back on 28th September.

Derby were another reminder of the tough task faced by Harry Haslam's men. Though arriving in a mid-table position, they had been champions as recently as 1972 and had finished third the previous year. Th Rams boasted a very familiar face in the form of ex-Town favourite, and Stopsley boy, Bruce Rioch, as well as future Hatter Colin Todd, though it would be a full ten years before the England

international would arrive in Bedfordshire in an attempt to add experience to David Pleat's side.

For Luton, a home league debut was handed to Paul Futcher, a £100,000 signing from Chester in the summer whose only appearance at Kenilworth Road to date had been in the Texaco Cup, while during the game an 18-year-old from Bedford, 'Lil' Fuccillo, would come on to make his debut and begin a long association with his local side.

Off the pitch the big news was the appointment of Len Hawkins as club chairman. A Lutonian and fan through and through, at seven he carried Fred Hawkes' bag into the ground to ensure himself a good view of a game and some believe he prompted Joe

Payne's conversion to centre-forward. The sonin-law of legendary Town chairman Charles Jeves, he was noted as being a tremendously hard worker, though his time in charge was an unhappy one, having to deal with powerful directors and a period of financial turmoil which might have finished the club for good but for Peter Anderson's sale to Royal Antwerp in 1975, which Len himself arranged. He died, not long after, on Boxing Day of 1978.

The game was not of great note. The form of Steve Buckley on Luton's left was a high point, and matters were decided

10 minutes from the end when he sent Peter Spiring, later discovered to be playing with a broken toe, surging down the left, where he was hacked down by Colin Todd in the area. The penalty decision so angered one Derby fan that he ran onto the pitch to remonstrate. However, Jimmy Ryan stepped up, and showing characteristic calmness, slotted home the only goal of the game.

It would start a minirevival of Town's fortunes, winning the next two games and setting up a better 1975, in which safety was so nearly secured.



ON THIS DAY

However, it's poor fayre for the fans in a game where the result is far more important than the performance.

A shot by Chris Kamara from outside the box is blocked and the ball runs to Mick Harford, who scores the only goal of the match with a right-foot drive.


The Hatters made it a hattrick of festive home wins by following this up with victories over Arsenal and Chelsea at Kenilworth Road.

However, it would prove to be a false dawn as David Pleat's side would win just five matches of their following matches in the next five months that saw them relegated to the second tier.



Champions!

Over the course of the season we'll be looking back 20 years to the glorious League One championship winning season of 2004/05.

So many club league records were tumbled during a momentous campaign which was even more remarkable considering that the summer of 2003 saw the arrival of new 'owner' John Gurney and his crackpot ideas, which ultimately led to the Hatters needing to enter administrative receivership, with all its problems, to get rid of him. Club historian Roger Wash tells the story of a season to remember.



2004/05 history

After the excellent lastgasp 2-1 win at Bristol City on 18th December the Town knew that whatever happened they would still remain top over Christmas seeing that they enjoyed a fourpoint cushion over the second-placed club.

Boxing Day took the Hatters to Chesterfield who remained unbeaten at home that season and sat in sixth spot. The task was likely to be doubly difficult as the Town were to be without top scorer Steve Howard, his strike partner Rowan Vine and young defender Curtis Davies.

Howard was finishing his three-game ban following his dismissal at Brentford while Vine and Davies picked up their fifth booking of the season at Bristol City meaning they would be missing for one match.

Peter Holmes retained his place in the side for his second start of the season as did Enoch Showunmi. Coming in to replace Vine was Calvin Andrew who had been suffering from flu in the week leading up to the game. Finally, Russell Perrett returned to the side in defence for his first start after an injury-ridden 2004.

Despite fielding a below full-strength side, the Hatters were rarely troubled and but for some heroics by Spireites goalkeeper Carl Muggleton and some desperate goal-line clearances, the result would have been in the bag long before the end.

As it was, the Town again left it late again to secure all three points. With three minutes to go a miscued volley from Holmes fell invitingly on to the head of Showunmi who nodded home from six yards.

Chesterfield boss Roy McFarland was full of praise for the Town and said they were streets ahead of anyone they had played that season. He also predicted they would go up automatically.

An elated Luton manager Mike Newell said: "I'm absolutely delighted. We would have taken a point before the game. This is a difficult place to come to as results here show. But we said that if we want to achieve anything we must compete and win at places like this and we did that. We competed but also played some good football.

"We've now got 51 points and at the start of the season if I had been offered that by Christmas of course I would have taken it. We are only halfway through the season and haven't achieved anything yet but we are well on the way."

Two days later the Hatters welcomed Colchester United to Kenilworth Road. Tickets were on sale in part of the Oak Road end for the first time since 1991 and so a best of the season crowd, at that point of 8,806 was there in

anticipation of witnessing the table-toppers cruise to another victory.

Howard, Vine and Davies returned to the side while Steve Robinson, only weeks after a hernia operation, was included in place of Paul Underwood who had a thigh strain.

The Town started by far the brighter with Sol Davis seeing a 20-yard effort deflected over the bar by the head of Colchester's Wayne Brown, Vine hit a fierce shot narrowly wide and skipper Kevin Nicholls seeing a left foot drive drilled just over the crossbar.

Vine then hit the bar from only four yards out after a wild spell in the penalty area with the ball pinging about and begging to be smacked home.

Despite all this pressure on their defence,
Colchester took a surprise lead on 34 minutes.
Craig Fagan found space on the left to send in a dangerous cross which was challenged by Robinson and Richard Garcia with the ball somehow squeezing past Marlon Beresford in the Luton goal.

Undeterred, the Town were level three minutes later when a Peter Holmes shot was deflected into the path of Vine who, this time, made no mistake from close in.

Stung by a half-time 'chat' with Mike Newell the players re-doubled their efforts and took the lead three minutes after the restart when, after a quick one-two in the area with Howard, skipper Nicholls saw his shot blocked by a combination of goalkeeper Aidan Davison and Liam Chilvers with the ball falling invitingly to the alert Vine who made no mistake.

The Town continued to attack to perhaps gain a third goal to make the game safe but Colchester became increasingly dangerous as the Luton players visibly tired and played some sloppy passes which gave the away side the confidence to look for an unlikely equaliser.


The equaliser did eventually come on

62 minutes when a route one clearance by Davison eventually bounced invitingly for Colchester's Greg Halford to loop a header over the advancing Beresford with the ball going over the line in slow motion.

The Town then added to their firepower with Enoch Showunmi joining the fray but a resolute Colchester defence held firm. Indeed, Colchester continued to attack dangerously on the break leaving the Town probably grateful for a point at the end.

Mike Newell blamed tiredness from having to play two games in three days whereas Colchester had not.

Town shirt collector, David Foxen, aka @lutontownkits, goes through his selection of shirts in orange, white, blue – and all colours in between.

On 27th November 2021 the Hatters wore a special one-off shirt in support of our legendary former player and manager, Mick Harford.

After his diagnosis with prostate cancer, the club teamed up with Prostate Cancer UK to have their logo on the front of our shirts for the game against Cardiff City.

Based on the 2021/22 home shirt, the Prostate Cancer UK logo replaced JB Developments. This was a straight swap – no printing over the old sponsor but instead a complete removal and re-addition which honestly makes all the difference.

The logo really pops in white against our lovely orange shirts, which gives the charity more spotlight for all the amazing work they do.

This shirt had a lovely horizontal pattern on it too, a homage to our historic relationship with the town's hat making history.

The game against Cardiff City, a Championship fixture, was a case of 'what could have been! The Hatters had 12 shots at goal, with only one on target compared to Cardiff's four shots on target.

And our only shot on target went in! Jordan Clark scored in the 64th minute to put us back on level terms at 1-1 after Rubin Colwill put the visitors in front. The lead lasted just over 10 minutes, however, as Sean Morrison scored the winner for the Bluebirds.

Wearing this shirt were the likes of Tom Lockyer, Sonny Bradley, Glen Rea, Pelly Ruddock Mpanzu, Harry Cornick and Danny Hylton. Former Hatter James
Collins played for Cardiff,
and future Luton signing
Ryan Giles started
too. Who would have
imagined Giles would
be signing for us a few
years later, with us a
Premier League club?!

The result doesn't matter on this occasion, it is more the meaning behind this shirt. Support for a legend and promotion for a wonderful charity. These shirts were never auctioned off or sold, so are super rare if you are ever lucky enough to find one.

SHOOTOUT HEARTACHE FOR UNDER-18s

The Hatters Under-18s fell to an agonising penalty shootout defeat to Crewe Alexandra in the FA Youth Cup at Kenilworth Road last week.

Dylan Stitt and Christian Chigozie saw their spotkicks saved by visiting keeper Mikolaj Lenarcik after both sides played out an entertaining 2-2 draw after 120 minutes under the lights.

Crewe took the lead in the 20th minute when Luca Moore found space on the edge of the box and his low shot crept into the bottom corner.

The Hatters responded well to going behind and were level at the interval

when Charlie Trustram lashed home an emphatic finish inside the penalty area on 40 minutes.

Both teams had chances in an end-to-end second half as Lenarcik saved efforts from Chigozie and Tate Xavier-Jones.

Stitt missed a great chance with a backpost header following a Trustram cross on 73 minutes and Jamie Odegah flashed a shot across goal two minutes later.

Jordan Hodkin spurned a glorious opportunity to restore the visitors' lead with 11 minutes left on the clock, firing over from six yards out and, as the game ticked into

As the game entered 30 minutes of extra-time, the visitors led for the second time on the night when Patrick Mlynarski thundered home.

After the restart the Hatters pushed for an equaliser and on 113 minutes it was 2-2 when a shot from the edge of the box from Xavier-Jones deflected past Lenarcik.

Substitute Michael Takawira saw a shot flash wide moments later before Odegah was denied by Lenarcik as the Town sensed a late winner.

But Crewe almost snatched victory at the death as the Hatters had goalkeeper Charlie Booth to thank for a full-length stop to deny Owen Taylor's shot. With the penalties taken at the Kenilworth Road end, Stitt saw the Hatters' first penalty saved by Lenarcik.

Xavier-Jones, Harry Fox and Charlie Trustram scored for the Hatters, but Crewe found the target with each of their four penalties.

And Lenarcik had the last word of the night when stopping captain Chigozie's effort and it was Crewe who celebrated reaching the fourth round.

HE'S ONE OF OUR OWN

MATTHEW TAYLOR

Rejected by his home town club Oxford United for apparently carrying too much weight, Matthew joined Luton as a youth trainee before making his League debut for the Hatters on the opening day of the 1999/00 season at Notts County.

With the Town in receivership at the time, promising young talent needed to be pitched in perhaps before they were ready but 17-year-old Matthew looked like he had been playing in the first-team for years such was his maturity.

A left-sided midfielder or attacking full-back Matthew possessed both pace and a fierce shot and quickly picked up a host of 'Player of the Year' awards at Kenilworth Road.

After helping the Hatters to promotion in 2002 it came as no real surprise when Portsmouth stepped in with a bid.

Under Harry Redknapp, Pompey and Taylor won promotion at the first attempt in 2002 and the young full-back would go on and become a regular in the Premier League.

After over 200 appearances for Portsmouth, Matt joined Bolton where he spent three years before spells at West Ham and Burnley.

Still late into his thirties, Taylor was turning out in League One for Northampton and League Two for Swindon where he took on his first managerial role.

He left the County Ground in 2018, moving to coach Totteham's Under-18s before stepping back into management with Walsall and Shrewsbury.

Matt departed New Meadow in January this year but was back in management in May, taking charge of Wealdstone in the National League.



MADDIX REFLECTS ON SEASON SO FAR

The Hatters are on the road this Christmas as they make the trip to Ashton Gate on Boxing Day to face a Bristol City side experiencing a season of mixed fortunes in the EFL Championship.

Under the management of Liam Manning, who took over in November 2023, the team has shown periods of promise interspersed with inconsistency.

City sit in a mid-table position, reflecting a balance of wins, draws, and losses. Their recent form has been characterised by a series of draws and narrow victories, indicating resilience but also highlighting challenges in securing decisive outcomes. Their goal difference of zero sums this up perfectly.

Manning's Robins face West Brom this coming Sunday having won three of their last 11 matches in the third tier, drawing the last two 1-1, at Sunderland and at home to OPR.

City's campaign has been bolstered by standout performances from Anis Mehmeti, their leading scorer whose clinical finishing has been vital. Nahki Wells, who has five goals, adds experience and versatility, contributing crucial goals and assists, while Max Bird anchors the midfield with his vision and passing, linking defence and attack effectively. Together, they form the core of a team striving for greater consistency under Manning.

The Hatters will be hoping to continue our fine recent record against City which has seen us win 10 of the last 12 meetings, losing twice. One of those defeats came on our last trip to Ashton Gate in April 2022 and the Town's last win on the red side of Bristol came thanks to a second-

half comeback in April 2021 with goals from James Collins, Elijah Adebayo and Harry Cornick.

Cornick will be one of two familiar faces that could be on duty for the Robins against us next week.
Cornick left Kenilworth Road midway through the 2022/23 campaign after 235 appearances while Kal Naismith departed at the end of the 2021/22 season. However, both players have struggled to hold down a place so far this season.

The Town's overall record on Boxing Day is good, especially in recent seasons. The Town have won seven of their last 12 matches on 26th December, including the last two. A late Cauley Woodrow goal gave us a 2-1 win over Norwich here in 2022 while last season two own goals and an Alfie Doughty strike earned us a 3-2 victory at Sheffield United in the Premier League.



It's the final home match of 2024 and what a 12 months it's been. As usual there have been highs and lows - that's what football is like - and most Luton fans have been through it all before.

In what has been an overall tough year, I'm going to concentrate on the positives in the early part of the year. Luton were producing some of the best football we've seen here for decades including the 4-0 win over Brighton at the end of January.

The highlight for me wasn't actually a win but the enthralling draw at Newcastle United in February. It was a pinch-yourself moment when Luton went 4-2 up at St James' Park. Chiedozie Ogbene was running riot down the right flank and Ross Barkley was pulling the strings in central midfield.

The Magpie fans couldn't believe what was going on and one of my memories that day was my summariser JJ O'Donnell screaming in astonishment every time Luton scored surrounded by Newcastle fans who were giving him Paddington Bear hard stares. Newcastle did level eventually but it was a magical afternoon.

Yes, there were plenty of defeats as well earlier in the year but they were brave ones against the likes of Liverpool, Manchester United and Tottenham. I always felt Luton wouldn't have quite enough to survive but they gave it a damn good go and entertained us until the end of the season.

One player has stood out this year – and it's pretty easy to guess who. Barkley was a majestic player and it was a privilege to watch him wear the Luton shirt. I spoke to a Hatters fan recently who admitted he was upset that he didn't watch as many Premier League games as he would've liked just because he missed out on seeing Barkley in the flesh more.

Think of any adjective to describe Barkley and it wouldn't be enough. He did things on the pitch I have never seen a Luton player do in the 25 years I've been watching them. His ability to glide past three or four players in tight situations in total control is my abiding memory. He was levels above.

Luton weren't a oneman team last season but Barkley lifted the Hatters to a level they would never have got close to. This season Luton have inevitably suffered without him and I'm convinced it's one of the biggest reasons why they have struggled. Which is why the January transfer window could be so important for the club. They can't replace Barkley but it's clear new talent is needed.

Power Court has, rightly, been the priority with the Premier League money and that is a sound long-term strategy. It's great news this week that it has been given the final green light. Once it has been built Luton should still be in a good place ready for a second wave of attack on the top-flight in a shiny, modern purpose-built stadium.

Here's to 2025... and the future.
