I thought the red card came at a time when we were in the ascendancy against a very good Swansea team. The boys hung on well and gave everything but just when we thought we might hold out we didn't track a runner and our hopes of a point evaporated. At the moment our mistakes are getting punished and we are working hard to ensure we rectify that, especially on our travels.

Finally, thank you for all of your backing of myself, the staff and the players over the past 12 months, it really means a lot. I was privileged to pass the 100-game mark in charge of this wonderful club and I wish to thank everyone for their support during this time. We've had that one unbelievable high. followed by countless memorable moments in that time and I will continue to strive

towards achieving more of those while I'm at the helm.

Please keep up your magnificent support once more this afternoon and let's kick-off the new year in style.


So, while the past 12 months have not been the kindest to us, today represents us with the chance to begin 2025 in the best possible way.

Good afternoon, everyone, and a very warm welcome to Kenilworth Boad.

Can I take this opportunity to wish you all a very happy, healthy and successful New Year.

Our visitors today are Norwich City. It's only a month since we went to Carrow Road and came away with a disappointing 4-2 defeat. Let's hope we can avenge that today and kick start the new year in style.

Reviewing 2024 can be somewhat of a bittersweet exercise. From certain times in our Premier League experience, which gave me some of the most glorious moments I've witnessed as a supporter, to this unexpected current slump in the Championship. Last year ended with the fantastic news that the council approved planning permission for our new stadium at Power Court, ending years of negotiations, land purchases, planning and design. Gary and Michael deserve enormous credit for assembling a brilliant team who have overcome all the obstacles they've encountered since we first became involved. and have succeeded in

achieving the toughest task against all odds. This is the second major plank of our original plan when we first got together and invested in the club.

The importance of it cannot be stressed strongly enough. We bought the club from the administrator. A club that had been bust three times in 10 years, which evidenced its inability to compete fairly at anywhere near the top

level. Most periods of success on the pitch have been followed by financial difficulty and we have fought tooth and nail to ensure that this is not repeated.

It's also worth remembering that before our stadium was sold to the council the away team got a share of the home gate, but since then nothing. So, Kenilworth Road being the smallest ground in most divisions

we've competed in is a major disadvantage, and goes some way to explaining our patchy financial history.

By way of an example, we lost in excess of £10m getting back into the Football League as well as losing academy players for a pittance to higher placed clubs.

Our ambition-led strategy for this club has always been to play the long game. In order to compete, we simply must have a state-of-the-art stadium with the ability of generating significantly more revenue.

Another key component has been, and is to, expand and improve the Academy. It is important that we can find and develop players because it's unlikely that we will ever be able to compete with the gigantic transfer fees and salaries ruling in the Premier League. Therefore scouting, coaching and trading become even more important and rebuilding an academy, literally, takes a generation.

After years of hard work on this front, it's such a joy when you see homegrown talent given a chance and deserving it, just as Joe Johnson, Zack Nelson and Josh Phillips did at Bristol. These guys and those like them are our future.

2024 on the pitch has been surreal and incredibly disappointing.

As the last year ended, we had just been narrowly beaten 3-2 here at the Kenny by a very good Chelsea team and were just ahead of our best result and performance of the Premier League season where we beat Brighton 4-0 having lost 4-1 at the Amex in the first game of the season.

As we are seeing again this year it is tough for promoted clubs to survive in the Premier League and almost impossible without a big pot of money to put alongside the funds received from central funds.

We are proud that we earned respect and impressed so many by the way we played and entertained, but being plucky, gallant losers is not what we are here for. A lot has been said about the effect of relegation and the added difficulty of having had a brief foray in the top division, but both going there and coming back down throw up problems we have never experienced before.

Expectations and attitudes can be so sensitive and everything affects everything else. There is no doubt that all of us expected better this year, after all the majority of last season's squad are still with us. Yes, we lost the Premier League quality of Ross and Sambi, who I would argue are impossible to replace, but I'd love to be proved wrong.

Two goals in the game's final manic moments from Pelly Ruddock Mpanzu – or Tom Holmes, you decide – and Carlton Morris earned the Town a dramatic comeback victory over Derby at Kenilworth Road.

Trailing to Kayden Jackson's 58th-minute header, the Town needed a wonderful stop from Thomas Kaminski on 74 minutes to prevent the Rams doubling their lead.

But with time almost up, Mpanzu's volley from the edge of the area deflected off Holmes' back to bring the Town level with a minute of normal time remaining and then Hatters won it in the second minute of stoppage time thanks to Morris' deflected strike.

The late drama might not have been necessary had the Hatters led in the sixth minute when Morris' fine header flew just wide.

But the Town began playing some decent football. Morris was just crowded out on 18 minutes and from the loose ball Jacob Widell Zetterstrom in the Derby goal pawed away Tahith Chong's drive.

Kaminski was called into action for the first time of the night seven minutes after the restart when saving Jackson's low effort but, on 54 minutes, the Hatters came close to breaking the deadlock when Elijah Adebayo's towering header from Tom Krauß's fine cross just missed the target. But Derby went in front shortly before the hour when Kane Wilson's deep right-wing cross was met by Jackson who guided a back-post header into the far corner of the net.

The Town responded well to going behind and, on 62 minutes, Zetterstrom produced an incredible save to deny Morris' superb header following Jordan Clark's corner.

Two minutes later the Hatters had Kaminski to thank for a stunning save to somehow keep out a low first-time drive from Kenzo Goudmijn. It would prove to be a crucial moment.

But try as they might, it looked as though the Town had run out of ideas as Derby's defence protected the lead.

However, Mpanzu and Holmes had other ideas. A corner was half-cleared to Mpanzu on the edge of the box and he sent the ball back goalwards with intent. The ball took a decisive touch off Holmes before nestling into the back of the net. 1-1.

And two minutes into stoppage time the Hatters won it when Adebayo's shot was turned away by Zetterstrom but only into the path of Morris. He composed himself before taking a touch and fired a shot that took a deflection and flew, unbelievably, into the top corner.

PELLY'S PUSHING FOR MORE

Midfielder reflects on last-gasp win the last time we were on home soil.

Pelly Ruddock Mpanzu highlighted the Hatters squad's desire to mount a post-Christmas push towards the play-off spots after helping spark another come-frombehind home win against Derby County.

The Hatters trailed to a visitors' goal but, just as they have previously this season against Sheffield Wednesday and Stoke City, our boys found a way to get back into it and take all three points with two late strikes.

On as a second-half substitute in his first outing of December, Mpanzu hit the 88thminute volley which deflected off team-mate Tom Holmes' backside for the leveller, before Carlton Morris hit an injury-time winner, also diverted via a Rams defender.

"I'm feeling good," said the 30-year-old. "It was nice to get back out on the pitch and help the boys get a win. Three points is what we needed.

"We know we've been good at home, so that is going to put us in good stead hopefully over the Christmas period, and we can climb the table as quickly as possible.

"We know we are strong at home, so getting points at home is really important. Our away form hasn't been great, so we've got to try and rectify that. "Hopefully we can put ourselves in a good position to go ahead and get points away from home, because that's going to also help us go and make our goal at the end of the season, which is promotion or if not, go through the play-offs. That's still our aim this season and hopefully we can still achieve that."

Most people in the ground would have credited the DR Congo midfielder with the goal, which would have been his first since his brace against Blackpool at Easter of our promotion winning campaign, but officially it went down as Holmes' first goal for the club since signing from Reading.

"I think it hit someone
- I think it hit Holmesy,

and he's been credited with the goal, but listen, everyone is saying it's his goal, so I'll let him have it," said Mpanzu.


"But edge of the box, strike, if it goes in how it goes in, it gets us back in the game and thankfully Carlton - think that was going wide, his one - but it ended up in the goal, so yeah, 2-1 win, it's a good result for everyone."

He added: "It's been a tough season for everyone, I think we were expected to do a lot better than what we are right now, than what the table says.

"We'll take any goal right now and thankfully the deflections went in, so we'll take the three points as they come." 15 |

In an otherwise poor spectacle low on chances, the Hatters' fate was sealed by a moment of brilliance from Bristol City forward Scott Twine whose blast from the edge of the box 90 seconds into the second half gave the home side all three points.

A leveller almost came with the last chance of the game when Cauley Woodrow's well-struck effort was stopped by home goalkeeper Max O'Leary.

Defeat left the Town without a point on their travels since the win at Millwall in September but in truth a point a piece would have been fair after this 90 minutes at Ashton Gate.

Hatters' favour.

That included 19-year-old Josh Phillips, a winger who at Ashton Gate.

Clear-cut opportunities for both sides were a real premium in a first half that City started the brighter.

But as the half wore on, the Town grew into the game, pushing the hosts on the backfoot. On 38 minutes Elijah Adebayo used his pace and power to motor past Luke McNally and into the box. However his cut-back was swept wide of the target by Tom Krauß.

As half-time approached, Jordan Clark's long-range curler was held by O'Leary and Twine tested Kaminski with a direct free-kick in stoppage time.

However, at the start of the second half, Twine got the better of Kaminski with an emphatic finish. City played a quick free-kick down the right and fed Twine on the edge of the box. The forward, known for his ability from range, took a touch before firing an unstoppable effort into the top corner to give the Robins the lead.

It was a goal that lit up Ashton Gate and the forward thought he should have had a penalty with 22 minutes left when going down under Tom Holmes' challenge.

Chances in either penalty area continued to be at a premium as Rob Edwards made a number of substitutions in a bid to swing momentum into the Hatters' favour.

That included 19-year-old Josh Phillips, a winger who scored a double hat-trick for the development squad before Christmas. And the youngster almost conjured an equaliser in the fourth minute of added time when his dangerous left-wing cross was desperately cleared by the home side.


As time ticked into the sixth and final minute of added time the Hatters had one final chance. The Town moved it patiently and accurately from the right into the path of Woodrow on the edge of the box. The forward hit a sweet effort goalwards but O'Leary was there to paw the ball away to safety.

There was late heartbreak for 10-man Town as a late injury-time winner condemned the Hatters to a ninth successive away defeat in the Championship.

Swansea substitute Myles Peart-Harris' header in the 91st-minute was cruel on Rob Edwards' men who had battled at 1-1 having played the final 22 minutes a man light following Joe Johnson's harsh red card for a second bookable offence.

It had started so brightly for the Hatters in the final game of 2024 with Carlton Morris firing the Town in front after just five minutes. Swans keeper Lawrence Vigouroux's poor clearance landed at the feet of the Hatters captain and he made no mistake when volleying home from 10 yards for his seventh of the season.

Jisung Eom toed a shot against the post on 13 minutes while a Liam Cullen header diverted a header wide shortly before the half-hour as the hosts pushed for a leveller.

The pressure continued. Thomas Kaminski produced a fine save to paw away a drive from Ronald on 35 minutes but the Town's luck ran out on 38 minutes when the hosts levelled. Kaminski somehow kept out an effort from Ronald from point-blank range but Goncalo Franco was on hand to tap-home the rebound.

After a lack of attacking threat after the goal, the Town had the ball in the Swansea box 15 minutes after the break when Marvelous Nakamba won the ball but neither Morris or Elijah Adebayo could make the most of the opportunity.

Kaminski came to the Hatters' rescue moments later as the game swung from end-to-end, the keeper acrobatically turning away Harry Darling's header from eight yards.


In truth the Town were looking more of an attacking force in the second period but any hopes of pinching three points were dealt a blow on 68 minutes when Johnson received his marching orders for the second of two soft bookings.

With 20 minutes remaining and a man down, it was backs to the wall for the Town. Former Cardiff man Mark McGuinness threw himself in front of everything as the Hatters desperately tried to hold onto a point.

But, in the first of seven added minutes, Swansea's pressure paid off. A ball lofted into the Town penalty area was headed back across goal by Darling and Peart-Harris was on hand at the back post to guide a header into the top corner to shatter the Hatters.

Edwards' side couldn't muster a response to going behind and the hosts almost grabbed a late third when Zan Viptonik's close range effort was magnificently blocked by Kaminski.

The Canaries arrive at Kenilworth Road for a big New Year's Day clash as both sides aim to start the new year in winning form after what has been an inconsistent season so far in the Championship.

Johannes Hoff Thorup's side have had an up and down start to the season and look to push away from mid-table.

Norwich began the season by appointing their new Danish manager and they began the season well and were looking strong, especially at Carrow Road.

Borja Sainz in particular has been standout for Norwich and has been one of the best players in the league this season, as his 15 goals (before Sunday's games) making him the division's top goalscorer.

In the last meeting between the two sides, the Canaries ran out 4-2 winners at Carrow Road. It was a topsy turvy game as both teams were leading at various points but two goals in the last 10 minutes were enough for Norwich.

However, since then, Norwich have hit a bad run of form and followed that game up with a winless run of four. This was ended with a 2-1 win against Millwall on Boxing Day.

It was a festive affair the last time the Canaries set foot in Bedfordshire and the Town will be hoping for a similar outcome to the Boxing Day triumph in December 2022 that saw Cauley Woodrow earn Rob Edwards his first win in charge.

A warm welcome to Kenilworth Road to all those associated with Norwich City and wish everyone at Carrow Road the best for 2025.

A FOOT IN BOTH



CHRIS MARTIN

A product of the Canaries' academy, striker Chris Martin was loaned to the Town in our ill-fated -30 season in 2008/09. However, he hit 13 goals in 51 games including the first in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final win over Scunthorpe. He then scored 23 goals the following season for Norwich in League One, before spells at Derby, Bristol City and QPR.

CANARIES CULT HERO

Beginning his football journey at his hometown club, Carlisle United, rising through their youth system, Grant Holt went on to play for Halifax, Sorrento in Australia, Sengkang Marine in Singapore, Barrow, Sheffield Wednesday, and Rochdale, even working part-time in a factory to support himself during the early stages of his career.

In 2006, Holt joined Nottingham Forest, but it was after a season with Shrewsbury that he found his greatest success at Norwich, where he played from

2009 to 2013. During this period, Holt was pivotal in Norwich's resurgence. He helped the Canaries win the League One title in 2009/10 and achieve back-toback promotions, culminating in a return to the Premier League as Championship runners-up.

Holt's standout Premier League campaign came in 2011/12, when he scored 15 goals, earning him Norwich's Player of the Year award for the third consecutive season. In total the striker netted 78 times in 168 games for the Canaries.



FIXTURE FLASHBACK

NORWICH 0-1 TOWN 26th JANUARY 2014 FA CUP THIRD ROUND

The Hatters created history and earned a place in the fifth round of the FA Cup after a sensational, deserving 1-0 win over Premier League Norwich 12 years ago later this month.

The Town, then in the Conference, rode their luck at times and had bovhood Canaries fan Mark Tyler to thank for a string of great saves throughout the afternoon.

The defining moment came with 10 minutes left Premier League club out on the clock when three substitutes combined. Stuart Fleetwood sent JJ O'Donnell away down the left flank and his low cross was met at the near post by Scott Rendell who made no mistake with an unerring finish.

The goal ensured the Town made history by becoming the first nonleague team to knock a of the competition.

"We know we can get Luton Town back to the Football League. It will happen, and it won't be long before we're back playing at more places like Carrow Road," said manager Paul Buckle afterwards.



Stepping Stones is a Luton-based organisation, initially established as a small CIC (Community Interest Company) in 2008 before becoming registered as a charity in 2015, dedicated to helping women and their children create happier, healthier lives.

The charity supports women to overcome the difficulties associated with one or a combination of the following circumstances: being victims of domestic abuse, involvement with the Criminal Justice System, involvement with Children's Services, suffering from substance misuse/addiction and/or mental health issues.

Stepping Stones supports around 250-300 women each year, but with a lengthy waiting list is hoping to build capacity to help more women from Luton and Central Bedfordshire by providing hope and the skills and resources to make positive life choices.

Charlie Lockley, Stepping Stones CEO, said: "We are really excited about this partnership. Luton Town Football Club has a very positive image in the community and is a football club that really promotes right from wrong.

"We know that there is unfortunately a correlation between football matches and domestic abuse, and that abuse will increase during tournaments, so it's a really positive connection that we can make.

"If Luton Town can speak up about domestic abuse

and how wrong it is, then we believe that is going to help our women, help raise awareness and maybe help people call each other out on it. If we can just stop one fan going home and being abusive to his partner, then that's got to be a good thing.

"One in four women suffer abuse at some point in their lives, and one in six men. If we can do something to make people more aware of that, along with the red flags and the things that might give rise to it, and also empower them with some tools and techniques to get their lives back, that's got to be a good thing."

A group from the club, including captain Carlton Morris and Ladies skipper Elly Wade visited Stepping Stones' headquarters in George Street West to see some of the fantastic work the staff there undertake – as shown in these photos.





Preserving and appreciating the heritage and history of Luton Town Football Club

THE LIFE AND TIMES OF PUNCH MCEWEN

James 'Punch' McEwen already had coaching experience with his home town team Bootle when he signed for **Luton Town in the** summer of 1894.

Signed from Liverpool South End, Punch was offered £2 per week and a £5 signing on fee. Although only 5ft. 6in tall, Punch was widely described as "the best professional full-back in the South of England." Powerful, dashing, making few errors, he possessed a terrific kick which was an essential attribute for a back at the time.

Punch met, and married, a Luton lass, Lizzie Nash Scott in late 1896. They had a son, James William in 1897 and a business in the town and seemed settled, However, club financial woes meant Punch was sold to Glossop North End in 1898. A move to Bury followed. The 1901 census shows him, Lizzie and young James living in Bury with Punch described as a "Professional footballer and general dock labourer".

It was an inspired move as he was to help Bury to their second FA Cup win in 1903 over the hot favourites, Derby

County. Reviewing past FA Cup finals, Leslie Knighton, the Arsenal manager in 1920, said "Punch McEwen, now my assistant here, played the outstanding game of the day at right-back."

It was a shock to most that he came back to Luton in 1903, Lizzie was homesick and they still had their business. However, after 69 games in his second spell, Punch moved on in 1905, this time to Norwich City. Punch was made captain and then player/manager for the 1907/08 season. His playing ability at last led to recognition of sorts when he was chosen to play in a North v South international trial match. He was considered the best full-back never to play for England.

A knee injury in September 1909 sadly ended his playing career. Punch went to coach Fulham and, after a spell managing Glossop North End, he became Arsenal manager in April 1915. In 1919 he stepped down to assistant manager and later served as coach and scout.

Punch played a minor role in the 1939 film The Arsenal Stadium Mystery. A newspaper review said that "the real 'discovery' of the picture was 66-year-old Punch McEwen." It continued, "Punch was so good that they wanted to feature him as a comedian, but his wife wanted to

go on their holiday to Southend, so - they went to Southend."





ON THIS DAY

We go back in time on this day in the Hatters' history books



And in the downpour, we told Barnet to calm it...

It was on this day in 2014 that the Hatters splashed their way to a seventh straight victory in all competitions to extend their lead at the top the National League with a 2-1 win in sodden conditions against Barnet.

Both sets of players battled through 90 minutes on a drenched afternoon at Kenilworth Road and goals from strikers Andre Gray and Paul Benson proved to be the difference.

The pitch passed an inspection 15 minutes before the game but, with the Town leading 2-0, the match looked as though it had run its course on the hour when referee Kevin Johnson called over the captains of both teams for a discussion. However, the match went on, and Barnet pulled a goal back from Jake Hyde to set-up a nervy final 20 minutes.

But, roared on by 7,500 Luton voices, the Town dug in, slipping and sliding around to secure yet another victory – their 11th straight victory on home soil in all competitions. The final whistle was greeted with one of the loudest cheers of the season.

Champions!

Over the course of the season we'll be looking back 20 years to the glorious League One championship winning season of 2004/05.

So many club league records were tumbled during a momentous campaign which was even more remarkable considering that the summer of 2003 saw the arrival of new 'owner' John Gurney and his crackpot ideas, which ultimately led to the Hatters needing to enter administrative receivership, with all its problems, to get rid of him. Club historian Roger Wash tells the story of a season to remember.



2004/05 history

Following a reasonable Christmas, where four points were won, the Town still led the table – although Hull City were hot on their heels.

Next up for the Hatters was the visit of Sheffield Wednesday, who had been rejuvenated following the appointment of Paul Sturrock as manager and now sat in the play-off positions.

The best home crowd for three years of 9,500 gathered for the New Year's Day clash and saw the Hatters turn out in their orange away strip to avoid a clash with Wednesday's all grey away colours.

In windy conditions both sides had first-half chances but it was the Owls who took the lead just before the interval when Marlon Beresford and Curtis Davies allowed a long ball to bounce between them leaving Kenwyne Jones to take advantage of the hesitancy to slot home.

The Town levelled straight after the break when Steve Howard nodded in from close range after a Steve Robinson shot had come back off the woodwork. From then on the game remained end-to-end without any more scoring to bring about a draw which was probably fair.


Wednesday boss Sturrock said afterwards: "It's a difficult place to come because Kenilworth Road is a fortress as far as Luton are concerned with the style of play they have built up here over the last two or three seasons. We had chances to win it but so did they and I think the draw was probably the fair result."

Mike Newell was not too downhearted adding: "We gifted them a goal by letting the ball bounce, which we haven't been doing so far this season. It wasn't a great day for football with the wind swirling around, but we never gave up and I'm not too disappointed with the result."

Two days later the Hatters made the short trip to Peterborough. In order to protect some players from the fourth game in eight days, Newell rested Ahmet Brkovic and Chris Coyne and relegated Rowan Vine and Steve Robinson to the bench.

Peterborough, battling against the drop, played an extreme long-ball game and looked to pump balls into the Luton box at every opportunity, and, as a result made it a first half to forget as far as the Town were concerned.

Both Vine and Robinson were introduced to the side in the 52nd minute and shortly afterwards the Town took the lead when skipper Kevin Nicholls powered in a 25-yard free-kick.

Despite this, Posh continued to put the Luton defence under an aerial bombardment and finally made a breakthrough when Calum Willock headed home on 73 minutes. He then doubled his personal tally nine minutes later heading in an Andy Legg long throw.

It was left to top scorer Steve Howard to rescue a point with five minutes to go when he headed in a Paul Underwood leftwing cross.

A rueful Newell said afterwards: "We made a few changes, perhaps too many, but it's difficult when you are playing four games in eight days. It's ridiculous to expect athletes – because that's what footballers are these days – to perform to the best of their abilities in these circumstances. The people who decide these fixtures are obviously not athletes."

Posh boss and selfconfessed Hatters fan Barry Fry merely said "Luton were lucky."

The dropped points meant that the Town were off top spot for the first time since mid-August. They were replaced by a Hull side who had won eight games in a row but there was no way the Hatters could bounce back for two weeks as an FA Cup third round clash at home to Brentford was next on the calendar.

Mindful of their feisty clash at Griffin Park a couple of months before, the Town put out a fullstrength side against the Bees but were then subjected to another onslaught of niggly fouls, time-wasting and the feigning of injury all orchestrated by the touchline antics of their manager Martin Allen.

The Town had a perfectly good goal by Howard, which would have opened the game up, chalked off by the referee, so frustratingly the Luton players continued to allow the Brentford tactics to get to them – leaving the inevitable two goals on the break to settle the tie in the away team's favour to mean the Town had lost twice already against the Bees.

Town shirt collector, David Foxen, aka @lutontownkits, goes through his selection of shirts in orange, white, blue – and all colours in between.

We only had Pony for two design cycles in the late 1990s, but they did a great job in creating some iconic (and infamous!) Luton Town shirts. The lovely home shirts, THAT yellow shirt, and then there is this - the 1998/99 away shirt.

At the time, Pony were a big sportswear manufacturer. Along with Luton, they had West Ham, Spurs, Norwich City and even Colo Colo in Chile. They had a big presence in the NFL and NBA too, and even sponsored Pele at one point. They now seem to focus on shoes and general t-shirts, but are

not well known in the UK anymore.

The 1998/99 away shirt is a beautiful mixture of orange and blue, with a unique, slightly elasticated v-neck collar! The blue travels down both side panels and on the top of the back of the shirt. It also features blue cuffs on the long sleeve version.

Match-worn shirts featured the retro, blue Nationwide Football League patches, and a felt-style number on the back. Certainly not like the numbers we have today.

Back to that unique collar. It is striped with a mixture

of white and orange. It doesn't really match the rest of the shirt in my opinion, but I personally love it! The elastic feel could be quite itchy when playing though.

This was also the last year we saw USA (Universal Salvage Auctions) sponsor our shirts. They had adorned the front of our kits since the 1991/92 season, so nearly made it 10 years!

We finished 12th in what is now League One in 1998/99 wearing this shirt. It made its debut on the opening day of the season, a match we won 1-0 at Wycombe Wanderers with Steve

Davis being the first goal scorer in this shirt thanks to a wonderful free-kick... not bad for a centre-back!

Further wins occurred at Oxford United, Wigan, Fulham (Davis once again on the scoresheet) and Burnley. An injuryhit Hatters also wore this away at Maine Road against Manchester City, but lost 2-0. I wonder what happened to them?

We had a young Matthew Spring, legend Marvin Johnson, Mitchell Thomas, Stuart Douglas and Phil Gray wearing this shirt, along Landry Zahana-Oni - a name only the purists will remember!

Aylesbury-born Emmerson was one of the many players to come through our schools and youth development programme prior to signing YTS forms in the summer of 1995.

He made his debut in a 3-0 home defeat to Walsall in an Auto Windscreen Shield tie that saw Herve Bacque miss a penalty on a dour evening but better things were to come for the youngster.

Boyce's breakthrough into the Hatters' league side came at home to Lincoln in April 1999 before becoming a regular and crowd favourite during the following season in a young team that included several academy graduates including Matthew Taylor, Matthew Spring, Stuart Douglas, Stuart Fraser, Gary Doherty and Liam George.

A fast and reliable overlapping right back, 'Boycie' saw an offer from Premier League Crystal Palace in the summer of 2004 as too good to turn down and where he found himself catapulted into the first team earlier than expected following a series of injuries to established regulars, a place he held on to.

Emmerson made a big money move to Wigan in 2006 and skippered the side to the 2013 FA Cup final win over Manchester City.

Capped at international level for Barbados, Boyce joined Blackpool on a short-term deal before rejoining Wigan as an academy coach.

He retired having made 613 senior appearances, scoring 24 goals and the summer just passed he took control as the manager of Wigan Athletic Women.

month encapsulates the intensity and media frenzy of the Premier League. It's a frame of Rob at the Etihad, surrounded by a sea of cameras, each lens focused on him. The image, covered to black and white, adds a layer

My favourite shot from this of mood and drama. The conversion enhances the contrast between the player and the media storm around him, making it not just a photograph, but a visual statement on the spotlight these Premier League players and staff live under every week.



As the Premier League season neared its end, the away match against West Ham was a deeply emotional one, marking a moment that all but sealed the Hatters' relegation. My favourite shot captures a powerful moment when one of the iconic West Ham bubbles bursting on Rob. The frame felt like a metaphor for the trials and tribulations of the season.

JUNE

After a brief break, the players were back at training, and it's always exciting to capture that first day as they get back to work. My favourite shot comes from one of the fitness tests, with Tahith in mid-air. I got low to the ground for this one to really highlight his leap, and love result. There's something special about the way Tahith is flying through the air, but what really makes this shot is the smile on his face. It's a perfect blend of athleticism and personality, and it really stands out for me.



YEAR IN REVIEW

My favourite shot from July was captured during Shandon Baptiste's signing photo shoot. Every signing is a new opportunity to try something fresh, and this one was no exception. I experimented with lighting to create a moody, almost cinematic atmosphere that drew all the attention to Shandon's face. The black-and-white conversion really took it to another level, adding depth and intensity to his expression. It's one of those moments where everything clicks – the lighting, the mood, the moment – and I was really pleased with how it came together.





My favourite shot from August captures a moment at Fratton Park that perfectly blends atmosphere and action. Using a remote camera, I managed to freeze James in midair as he comes out to collect a high ball in the penalty area. The timing couldn't have been better, and I love how everything else in the frame comes together – the vivid blue sky, the packed crowd and the stand in the background.

SEPTEME

This shot captures Carlton's celebration after his 87th-minute winner against Sheffield Wednesday. The emotion as he sprints toward the corner where I was sitting is made even sweeter by the contrast in the frame – the Sheffield Wednesday players slumped on the turf in defeat.



While the celebration shots were fantastic, one image stood out above the rest — a remote camera capture from behind the goal - the outstretched keeper frozen mid-dive, helpless to stop the shot from nestling into the net.

Luton Town Ladies in 2024: A year-in-review

2024 was a year of success, change and improvement for Luton Town Ladies.

The year started off with one of the biggest games in the club's history, a historic fourth round FA Cup tie against WSL side, Brighton and Hove Albion. Although the Hatters fell to defeat, it is a day that everyone associated with the club will never forget.

March saw current comanagers Myles Maddix and Fadi Mazloum take charge after the exit of Rob Burton. Their first win came at the end of March, with a 2-0 away victory over Wroxham.

April saw the Ladies achieve some remarkable victories, first an 11-0 win over struggling King's Lynn and then an emphatic 7-1 away victory over local rivals Dunstable Town.

May kicked off with another memorable victory, a 3-0 victory over league champions Real Bedford, with the Ladies becoming the only team to keep a clean sheet against the Pirates in the 2023/24 season. King's Lynn were victims of another immense victory from the Hatters, who recorded a 14-0 away win. The penultimate game of the season saw the Hatters thrash Bowers & Pitsea 6-1 here at Kenilworth Road.

The new campaign kicked off in August, where the injury-hit Hatters fell to a narrow 3-2 defeat at title rivals Royston Town.

The Town then went on an incredible run from August until December, winning every single game, keeping eight clean sheets in the process. The run kicked off at Barton, with a 1-0 victory over Stevenage.

September was kickstarted by an impressive 4-1 away victory over Haringey Borough, which was followed up by two 5-0 wins over Needham Market and Dussindale & Hellesdon Rovers respectively as well as an 11-0 victory over Chigwell in the FA Cup.

October saw three more wins and three more clean sheets. A hard-fought 1-0 victory over Enfield kept the pressure on Royston. The Hatters then reached the first round of the FA Cup after a 2-0 victory over St Albans, rounding

the month of with another 5-0 victory, this time over Hertford Town.

November was a month to remember. An incredible come back from two goals down to win 4-2 against Hutton saw the Hatters enter the second round of the FA Cup. Then the biggest game of the season came against Royston at home. The Ladies came out 1-0 victors against the league leaders, who dropped points for the first time this season.

December was all FA Cup action. Firstly, an incredible penalty shootout where 32 penalties were taken. Goalkeeper Sarah Hudson saved the 32nd, meaning the Hatters reached the third round of the FA Cup, 15-14 on penalties. The year closed with a 5-0 defeat to Championship side, Portsmouth, but it was another cup run to be proud of.

The Ladies scored 116 goals and conceded 32 in just 31 games across all competitions in 2024 and, going into 2025, the Hatters still have three trophies to fight for, so get down to Barton Rovers and cheer them on! COYH!

Frontman reflects on Boxing Day reverse

Striker Cauley Woodrow was disappointed not to be able to grab the Hatters a late point at Bristol City on Boxing Day - but saw positives to take forward into the second half of the season.

Woodrow appeared as a second-half substitute and although he had the Town's best chance to level the scores, he couldn't quite have the same impact he had in the 2-1 win over Derby five days earlier when his set pieces led to both goals.

"The other day it was good against Derby, the win, but today it wasn't to be," said the 30-year-old.

"I had a chance at the end that I could have scored, but we're massively disappointed because I felt like we deserved something from the game. "They scored a wonder goal, but we had some good chances. We had a header, my chance and a chance in the first half when the game was quite tight, so to come away with nothing, we're disappointed."

On his injury-time chance, created by Joe Taylor's low cross from the right but turned away by Robins keeper Max O'Leary diving to his right, Woodrow said: "To be honest I wanted to go the other side, but there were a few bodies in the way.

"I think that's probably what helped the keeper as well. He knew I could go the only way that I went, so it was a good save.
On another day it goes in and we come away with a draw, but that's football."

Like manager Rob Edwards, the former Fulham and Barnsley forward could see positives from the performance at the club with whom he made 15 appearances on loan from the Cottagers in 2017/18.

"I think at times we played well," he added.
"The gaffer said in there, it seems like away from home we go a goal down and then we kind of liven up a bit, but it shouldn't be like that.

"We need to start with the same enthusiasm, start with that same fire.

"At home we're picking up points all the time, we've been playing well there but away from home we need to try and swing things in our favour, and that's from starting games with the same energy we seem to finish them."



think it's safe to say that manager Rob Edwards and most fans of a Luton persuasion will be quite happy to see the end of the year that was 2024.

Yes, it did start with the Hatters going up against the big boys in the Premier League and not doing too badly at all, drawing with Burnley and then hammering Brighton & Hove Albion 4-0 on home soil, before earning a thrilling 4-4 draw at Newcastle United. That was easily the game of the season.

They did also make their way through the early rounds of the FA Cup by beating Everton and Bolton Wanderers, going six games unbeaten at one point, before being

beaten 3-1 at home by Sheffield United - beginning what eventually became a downward spiral that, try as they might, the Hatters just couldn't reverse.

With injuries hitting and continuing to hit, Edwards had to try and plot enough victories to remain in the top-flight with a squad that was bereft of up to double figures of first team players at times, often having to put two goalkeepers and a host of teenagers on the bench.

Unsurprisingly it was to prove beyond him and his squad, as they dropped down to the Championship, and you don't need me to tell you that it's been

nowhere near the kind of campaign anyone around Kenilworth Road had wanted or anticipated so far.

Home form, if not quite all the performances, has been good, but it's on the road where things have taken a worryingly dramatic turn with the defeat at Swansea on Sunday making it nine straight losses outside of Bedfordshire.

It's clear that Edwards, if he makes New Year's resolutions, will have sorting that stat out at the very top of them, as Town will find themselves dragged into a battle to stay up should it continue, something they definitely don't want to be dealing with.

The manager will also hope there are a few belated Christmas presents left under the tree too in the shape of new signings.

Lamine Fanne is already on board, but Town's squad needs a refresh and no doubt everyone behind the scenes will be working incredibly hard to make that happen.

Festive games with Norwich have good memories for Edwards though, as it was two years ago that Cauley Woodrow struck late on to give him his first victory as Hatters manager.

How he would love to be able to celebrate a repeat of that outcome at full-time today.
