It was then agreed that Wycombe would be asked for permission to talk to Matt to understand his level of interest, and that having been received, Gary and recruitment team met him over the weekend and the Board convened on Sunday afternoon to meet and interview him and enjoy his presentation.

The process has broadly been the same with our previous four appointments, so comparisons could be made. For what it's worth I found the presentation compelling and educational, and compared very favourably to the previous experiences.

The rest of the Board was similarly impressed by that and the getting-toknow-you and questionand-answer sessions.

Matt left the room and there was a discussion, which resulted in a unanimous decision to immediately offer Matt the position. Matt accepted enthusiastically so we welcomed him to Luton Town.

Alongside this Gary and his team had to establish

which members of Matt's team he wanted to bring with him, and as a result, we welcome Richard Thomas, Lee Harrison and Ben Cirne.

The speed and professionalism of this process has been extraordinary and, apart from congratulating our team of Gary, Mick, James Mooney, Phil Chapple, Jay Socik and Yousuf Sajjad, we should express our gratitude to Wycombe for enabling a smooth transfer.

We all enjoyed meeting Matt and are excited to see how his ideas refresh our style and improve our results. Matt and his team met the players and staff on Tuesday morning and took their first training session soon after.

You will probably have seen some of the media that Matt has done, which shows clearly what his philosophy is and how confident he is that he can be the breath of fresh air we need. The feedback we have had so far from those who have met him is very positive and quite exciting.

We were delighted to announce the appointment of Matt Bloomfield as our new manager this week.

The board complied with all compensation requests from Wycombe Wanderers to bring the 40-year-old to Kenilworth Road, along with his assistant Richard Thomas, first team coach Lee Harrison and senior analyst Ben Cirne.

Bloomfield has put pen to paper on a three-and-ahalf-year contract.

The new boss, who made over 500 appearances as a midfielder for Wycombe over a 19-year period. arrives in Bedfordshire having worked wonders at Adams Park.

He departed the Buckinghamshire club having guided them to second place in the third tier, while also leading them into the FA Cup fourth round.

Town CEO Gary Sweet said: "It is with great pleasure and excitement that we are able to announce Matt's appointment on a longterm contract.

"Before anything else, I would like to thank Wycombe for their cooperation in ensuring a swift and smooth transition. It may be flattering to be on the receiving end, it's never pleasant, but we have made sure that we've gone above and beyond to compensate

Wycombe to secure his services, along with his trusted coaching team.

"Over the years in which we as a club have risen up the EFL, we encountered Matt at every step as a respected captain of his team, and together they have always shared our hunger and desire to improve and get to the next level.

"Since returning to Wycombe as manager we have been hugely impressed with his work in leading them back towards the top of League One, and especially in how they have done it in such an entertaining way, forging a reputation for frontfooted attacking football. "We identified Matt's personal and teambuilding qualities as the outstanding candidate to fit in with the culture we have long established here at Luton Town, and I'm sure every supporter will join me in welcoming him, along with Richard, Lee and Ben to Kenilworth Road.

"Finally, I'd just like to thank the immense amount of work and attention to detail our recruitment team have put into identifying the best candidate and impressing him in meetings, along with the fantastic, as ever, and unanimous support of the board in arriving at a quick decision after interviewing Matt."

Matt Bloomfield has become the ninth different permanent manager of the Hatters since Luton Town 2020 took control of the club in 2008.

Born in Felixstowe, Suffolk, Bloomfield began his career as a trainee with Ipswich in 2001. Despite representing England at under-18, under-19, and under-20 levels, he struggled for opportunities in a crowded midfield and made just one first-team appearance before joining Wycombe Wanderers in December 2003.

Bloomfield, then 19, made his debut for the Chairboys in a 2-0 loss to Rushden & Diamonds and scored his first goal for the club against Queens Park Rangers in March 2004.

He skippered Gareth Ainsworth's side to promotion from League Two alongside the Hatters in 2017/18, having already played in two Wanderers sides that went up from the third tier – first under Peter Taylor in 2008/09 and then under Gary Waddock in 2010/11.

Club captain at Adams
Park for almost a decade,
Bloomfield then led his
team out at Wembley
on the occasion of his
biggest achievement,
when Wycombe won
promotion to the
Championship in the
Covid-interrupted
2019/20 campaign.

By the time of his retirement, following a concussion injury suffered in his first and only outing of the 2021/22 season in a League Cup tie at Exeter, Bloomfield had already moved onto the coaching staff at the Buckinghamshire club having made 558

appearances and scoring 42 goals – fourth in the Chairboys' all-time appearance list.

It was then, in September 2022, that Bloomfield took his first steps in management when appointed head coach at Colchester United.

With the Essex side just two places above the League 2 dropzone, he helped stave off the threat of relegation and won the January 2023 manager of the month award with four wins and one draw from six games.

A month later, following Gareth Ainsworth's departure to QPR, Wycombe were on the lookout for a new manager and they knew exactly who to turn to and the lure of a return to familiar territory proved too strong.

Wycombe finished ninth that season and

10th last term, but their form since New Year's Day 2024 has been promotion-winning stuff.

Collecting 91 points from 48 matches in that period is a promotion-challenging return, and this season the Chairboys have topped the League One table for several weeks, their 18-game unbeaten run in the league only coming to a halt in between Christmas and New Year.

With Bloomfield having completed his UEFA Pro Licence qualification in the summer and leaves behind a side second in League One.



LAMINE FANNE

Highly-rated midfielder Lamine, who was born in Senegal before moving to Spain as a child, has now joined from Swedish top-flight club AIK.

After passing a medical, putting pen to paper and meeting his new teammates at The Brache back in August, the 20-year-old defensive midfielder returned to Sweden where he finished the season in November.

He returned to full training for the Hatters shortly before Christmas and was given his debut at Queens Park Rangers earlier this month.

ISAIAH JONES

Right-sided attacker Jones, 25, arrives at Kenilworth Road after spending five successful seasons with Middlesbrough.

Lambeth-born Jones started his career with Tooting & Mitcham United before moving to Boro in 2019, eventually breaking into Boro's first team in the 2021/22 campaign.

Jones contributed nine assists in 47 games in a season that saw them finish seventh in the Championship and reach the quarter-finals of the FA Cup.

The following season, Jones scored three league goals and laid on five more, helping Boro reach the Championship play-offs the season the Hatters won promotion to the Premier League.

Last term Isaiah enjoyed his best goal-scoring season to date, hitting nine goals and contributing five assists in all competitions as Boro finished eighth in the second tier and reached the semi-finals of the League Cup.

This season Jones, who was called up for international duty for Guyana last summer for the first time, started eight times and made 12 appearances as a substitute for Michael Carrick's side.

CHRIST MAKOSSO

Centre-half Makosso, 20, who has already won three caps for his native Congo, joins us from Belgian second division outfit RWD Molenbeek.

Makosso has spent a year in Belgium having joined his previous club from French side Sochaux in January last year.

He joined Sochaux in 2023 having been scouted in the Congo, making his debut in France's second tier in 2022/23.

His performances led to him being called up by his country for the first time in November 2023, and he has since gone on to be a regular in their squad. His last cap came in an African Cup of Nations qualifier against South Africa in October.

Fellow frontman **Joe Taylor**, meanwhile, has joined Huddersfield permanently for an undisclosed fee.

Joe arrived at Kenilworth Road from Peterborough in January 2023 and went on to make six appearances that season, including in the Championship play-off final where he converted a crucial penalty in the shootout victory over Coventry.

After enjoying two loan spells at Colchester and Lincoln last season, Joe appeared in 13 of our 26 Championship fixtures this term.

He hated playing at the Kenny as a player but now the new boss can't wait to be in the Town dugout!

The heritage and history of Luton Town played a major role in persuading Matt Bloomfield to sign a three-and-a-half-year contract to become our

The 40-year-old played five times for former club Wycombe at the Kenny in three different divisions, scoring once in the Chairboys' 3-1 defeat to the Hatters in September 2016.

And now after watching the Town's journey from non-league to the Premier League, Bloomfield can't wait to be on the 'right' side of things from the dugout.

"I think the heritage of the football club was one of the things that interested me," said the new boss.

"I've had some real big battles here over the years, especially against Nathan Jones's team.

"I absolutely hated coming here as a player. I genuinely hated coming here because the atmosphere was fierce and the pitch was tight. We had some real tough moments here.

"So that kind of feeds into that - wanting to be on the other side, wanting to join the football club and have those fans back me rather than against me. It's really exciting for me

to have those guys on my side.

"The atmosphere that they create and the togetherness that this club stands for, the hard work, the work rate and the team ethics that Luton Town stands for really resonates with me.

"All those bits that go together and the longterm project are really exciting. To have the

Bloomfield brings coaches Richard Thomas and Lee Harrison and analyst Ben Cirne with him to Kenilworth Road.

But Bloomfield is looking forward to working alongside members of the Hatters' existing staff, including coaches Kevin Pilkington and Kevin Foley and analysts Simon Dunn and Chloe Golding.

"I want to embrace the staff that we've already got and integrate ourselves with them," said Bloomfield.

"It's not about us being a separate entity. It's about the football club as a whole. It sounds a little bit cliché, and I apologise for that, but it takes a whole football club to win football matches.

"It's not just something that 11 players can go out on a pitch and do. It takes a whole football club, board of directors, chief exec, staff, fans, players. "Everybody around the football club have to build into it and buy into it and move the place forward and that's something I love doing. I love people. I love people working with people and collaborating and building a strong unit.

"That's what really gets my juices going so I'm really looking forward to doing that here."

The new Hatters boss also explained what he expects from the group on and off the field while praising the work of former manager Rob Edwards.



With Mick Harford, Paul Trollope and Richie Kyle in temporary charge, the Hatters side showed one change to the team that lost at QPR on Monday with new signing Izzy Jones given his debut after signing from Middlesbrough.

Forest created the game's first big chance only for Taiwo Awoniyi to drag his shot wide of the target when free inside the box on 17 minutes.

But back came the Town, and Walsh's fine drive from outside the box looked destined for the top corner but Forest goalkeeper Carlos Miguel flew away to his left to turn away the shot with an excellent stop.

On 22 minutes the Hatters crossbar was shaking after Ryan Yates' effort from 25 yards kissed the woodwork with Thomas Kaminski beaten as Forest upped the ante. As half-chances came the way of both sides it was the hosts that finally broke the deadlock five minutes before half-time. Ramon Sosa delivered an enticing cross from the left and Yates buried a header into the bottom corner

After the restart Awoniyi spurned a great chance to double the home side's lead just three minutes into the second period.

Goalmouth action was at a premium, however, and it wasn't until the 68th minute that Forest doubled their lead. Jota Silva hared down the right flank and delivered a low pinpoint cross into the path of Sosa who swept home from close range.

Holmes saw a back-post header cleared off the line by the hosts' Morato on 71 minutes before substitute Jacob Brown saw his low shot saved by Miguel.

Forest made a quadruple substitution with 13 minutes remaining and one of those, Callum Hudson-Odoi, wasn't far away from adding a third with a run and shot that flew narrowly over the bar.

Carlton Morris' header was stopped by Miguel with seven minutes left before the Town captain was crowded out with the goal at his mercy in stoppage time.

Recently, the Lilywhites have had some bumpy form and have won two, drawn two and lost two in their last six. Most recently, they drew 1-1 at home against Oxford.

The Heckingbottom era at Preston began against the Hatters back in August when the former Sheffield United boss was unveiled as new manager at the start of the match. Preston went on to win 1-0 at Deepdale.

In recent weeks Preston ensured a torrid winless streak of 10 games before finally beating Cardiff in December to end this run.

However, last time on the road, Heckingbottom's side were defeated 3-1 away at West Brom. A brace from Josh Maja and a goal from Callum Styles was enough for the Baggies to win.

Since the Hatters were promoted back to the Football League in 2014, the Town have won two of their four home games against Preston.

3-0 and 4-0 wins in December 2020 and March 2022 respectively sandwich a 1-1 draw in June 2020 in Nathan Jones' first game back in charge following the resumption of football during Covid.

And most recently Preston secured all three points when an acrobatic strike from Dan Potts earned North End victory on their last visit to Kenilworth Road in August 2022.

A FOOT IN BOTH



GRAHAM ALEXANDER

Signed for the Town from Scunthorpe in the summer of 1995 and four seasons as a regular saw him score 17 times in 183 times before he moved to Deepdale in 1999. He went onto make 400 appearances for Preston, helping the club to promotion in 2000, before ending his playing career at Burnley. His managerial career began as caretaker at Deepdale and is now at the helm at Bradford.

LILYWHITES CULT HERO

Known for his nononsense style, tough tackling and commanding presence, **Sean Gregan** embodied the gritty determination that Preston fans adored during his time at Deepdale.

A vocal leader on the pitch, his passion for the game resonated with Preston fans during his six-year spell at the club.

Gregan joined in 1996 from Darlington and quickly established himself as a cornerstone of the team as a midfielder (and sometimes a defender), with his physical presence, work rate and ability to dictate play. As captain his leadership saw Preston enjoy a period of success that saw them win promotion to the First Division (now the Championship) in 2000, before he played an instrumental role in helping the club reach the Championship play-offs in 2000/01, narrowly missing out on promotion to the Premier League.

His appearance in the play-off final defeat to Bolton was his 251st and final appearance for the club before he moved to West Brom and then Leeds, Oldham and Fleetwood.



FIXTURE FLASHBACK

TOWN 4-0 PRESTON 6TH MARCH 2022

The Town climbed into the Championship play-off places with a resounding victory win over North End.

A brace from Luke Berry and one from Fred Onyedinma had the Hatters 3-0 ahead by half-time before Bambo Diaby put into his own net after the interval.

Victory was the Town's seventh win in their last

10 games as Nathan Jones' side continued their rise towards reaching the play-offs.

The Hatters led in the ninth minute when Berry struck first and shortly before the half-hour mark Onyedinma doubled the lead when finishing James Bree's cross.

Berry's second arrived just before half-time when he back-heeled

Harry Cornick's cross and the game was well and truly over on 59 minutes when Amari'i Bell's shot was saved by the keeper but rebounded in off Diaby.





Any Park Street click and collect orders will be moved to the stadium shop.



Preserving and appreciating the heritage and history of Luton Town Football Club

BUD AHERNE. AN APPRECIATION.

The quiet, humble Irishman working as a welder at Vauxhall in the 1960s and 70s had an interesting past.

Not long before, Bud Aherne had been one of the finest full-backs on either side of the Irish Sea. He'd played for the old Belfast Celtic side in his younger days, and though 30 when he moved to England, had established himself in his adopted hometown as a First Division footballer. He was christened as Thomas, but everyone called him Bud.

If they did manage to get him talking about his playing days he might have revealed that he was particularly proud of keeping Stanley Matthews quiet when they faced each other. He may even have spoken about the remarkable game in August 1956 against Wolves, when the Hatters went toeto-toe with one of the great sides of the era at Molineux and were unlucky to lose 5-4. Or how Charles Jeves forked out £8,000 to sign him from Ireland, a notable sum for an older player. It proved money well spent. Aherne was born in Limerick in 1919. A move north after leaving the army saw him join Belfast Celtic before a riot at Windsor Park in 1949 led to the closing of the club. It was then he received his call from Jeves and made the move to Bedfordshire, becoming a regular in the side for the next six years and being part of the Hatters team that won promotion to the top-flight for the first time. He was a fast and mobile defender and known as one of the game's best volleyers.

He was 40 by the time Town reached the FA Cup final but missed out due to injury. He was capped by both Northern and the Republic of Ireland during his time at Kenilworth Road and spent a short time on the coaching staff after retiring as a player.

In later life, Aherne was heavily involved with the St Joseph's club, who he helped become one of the top teams in the area, and he could often be found on the bowling greens or golf clubs of the town.

A packed St Joseph's church for his funeral in January 2000 attested to his popularity. It was attended by many Town

DID YOU KNOW?

Bud failed to score for Luton in his 288 games. Of outfield players, only fellow Irishman Seamus Dunne (326) played more times without scoring.

ON THIS DAY

We go back in time on this day in the Hatters' history books



In this rearranged FA Cup third round tie, both sides knew the prize for the victor would be a fourth-round trip to Premier League Newcastle.

Under the lights at Kenilworth Road, visitors Southend came out of the traps intent on earning a moneyspinning visit to St James' Park.

The Shrimpers pulverised the Town defence in the first period and squandered three good chances.

Gary Jones ran onto a defencesplitting pass from John Hunt but shot wide of the post before Jason Lee's header dropped wide following Ricky Otto's cross.

However, it was a different story after the break and Paul Telfer showed the Essex outfit how to do it shortly after the break, when he hit a cross from Ceri Hughes on the run that flew into the top corner of the net on 51 minutes.

It was a goal worthy of winning any cup tie and Southend boss, Peter Taylor, had no excuses afterwards when asked how his side did not win.

The Hatters went on to earn a draw against Newcastle in the next round, winning the replay 2-0 on a night to remember at the Kenny.

David Pleat's side would then go on to reach the semi-final at Wembley, eventually losing to Chelsea.

Matches involving the Hatters on this day began in 1908 with a goalless draw at Kenilworth Road against Plymouth... The Town saw off local rivals Watford here in 1930, winning 2-0... The Hatters would then beat Villa again 28 years later, with goals from Mike Newell and Brian Stein earning a 2-0 win... Champions!

So many club league records were tumbled during a momentous campaign which was even more remarkable considering that the summer of 2003 saw the arrival of new 'owner' John Gurney and his crackpot ideas, which ultimately led to the Hatters needing to enter administrative receivership, with all its problems, to get rid of him. Club historian Roger Wash tells the story of a season to remember.

2004/05 **history**

Following the defeat by bogey side Brentford in the FA Cup the Town could now concentrate on the League and regain the top spot in the table which they had given up two weeks before.

Before the home clash with bottom club Stockport, a report had been published highlighting the amount paid by Football League clubs to agents. Naturally, Luton manager Mike Newell, never backward in coming forward, vented his spleen on one of his favourite subjects.

"I just don't see the need for agents and I don't see how £5 million can be paid out by Football League clubs to them. If a player wants an agent he should pay for them himself, not the clubs.

"If we want to move house and use an estate agent then we pay for them ourselves so why can't it be the same for football agents?"

Back to the topversus-bottom clash at Kenilworth Road, lowly Stockport had the first chance which was blasted wide by Rickie Lambert. The Town soon started to put pressure on County's defence with both Steve Howard and Chris Coyne going close before Steve Robinson's 28th-minute corner caused havoc with Curtis Davies and Kevin Nicholls seeing efforts cleared off the line

leaving Coyne to smack in the second rebound.

Ahmet Brkovic crossed for Howard to poke home from close range nine minutes after the interval before Stockport skipper Jim Goodwin handled in the area leaving Nicholls to blast home from the spot and secure the three points that saw the Town regain top spot on goal difference.

What seemed on paper to be a comfortable victory was not echoed by Newell. "It was always going to be a tricky one because when you're playing the side that's bottom of the league, people expect you to just roll them over.

"We created plenty of chances and on another day it could have been six. But at the same time they had chances too which I wasn't happy with."

Next up was a trip to Layer Road, Colchester to meet a side that had only won once at home since August and, after being early table-toppers, were now hovering just above the relegation zone.

That being said, Colchester had fully

deserved their point at Luton over the Christmas period, so the Town were not looking at an easy ride. And so it proved as Colchester made things extremely difficult for a full-strength Hatters side.


There is no doubt that the Town were below par and Colchester raised their game but the team struggled to give 36-yearold Aiden Davison in the U's goal much to do all afternoon. It was fortunate that Colchester's best chances fell to their midfielders rather than their forwards but even then it took a couple of brilliant saves from Marlon Beresford to keep a clean sheet and retain a vital point.

"It was a difficult game and you have to give Colchester credit because they came at us and played some decent stuff at times," said Newell afterwards.

"I'm not too unhappy with the point because Marlon made an outstanding save at the death to keep us in it. It's not always going to be a win and the law of averages says you have to have a 0-0 draw at some stage and this is only our second of the season.

"Colchester have a threat up front and I'm surprised they've lost six games at home. I felt it was a good point against them last time and it's the same this time around." Colchester boss Phil Parkinson said afterwards: "It was a very tight game and yet we created the best two or three chances. Their keeper saved well from Neil Danns and Kevin Watson but we couldn't quite get the breakthrough. "I thought we won our individual battles out there. That's the second time we have proved ourselves to be better than Luton during the last month."

Town shirt collector, David Foxen, aka @lutontownkits, goes through his selection of shirts in orange, white, blue - and all colours in between.

Today we're featuring another shirt that divides opinion. Some say it is one of the best we've ever had, others argue that the design and colours are actually one of the worst!

Personally, I absolutely love this design and shirt. The template was used across two seasons between 1992 and 1994 seasons on both the home, away and super rare third shirt and was manufactured by DMF Sportswear. DMF took over from the iconic Umbro collaboration, so had big shoes to fill!

And boy, they did a great job with this shirt. We

are focusing on the blue away version used from the 1992/1993 season to the 1993/94 season. It's a lighter blue than we are used to for Luton Town shirts and features horizontal white stripes with an orange outline. This goes all the way across the body, and onto the sleeves. There is the same collar style as the home shirt, this time white and orange instead of navy and orange.

A popper keeps the collar together and also draws your eyes to the orange stipes going down either side of the collar itself. This is replicated on the back of the shirt too. If you look closely, you can see the embossed DMF logo and the Luton Town badge woven into the fabric of the shirt.

Speaking of the fabric, this shirt is really thin and light to wear. The DMF logo and Luton Town badge (which doesn't even say "Luton Town Football Club" and just bares the Luton coat of arms part of the badge) are embroidered on, and the shirt also features the Universal Salvage Auctions sponsorship logo too. You could get the unsponsored version at the time, too.

This shirt has so many details, you seem to find something new each time you look at it.

Over the course of the two seasons wearing this shirt, we had away wins at Brentford, Peterborough, Wolves, **Notts County and Cardiff** as we finished in 19th and 20th in the "New" Division One. We also reached the semi-final of the FA Cup in 1993/94.

Players such as Julian James, John Hartson, Mark Pembridge, Treavor Peake, Paul Telfer, Scott Oakes and the legendary David Preece all wore this beautiful shirt during its service for us!

RICHARD HARVEY

England schoolboy and youth international, Richard worked his way up through the ranks at Kenilworth Road before making his League debut as a 17-year-old in November 1986 in a 1-0 home win over Queens Park Rangers.

A strong, fast left-back or left-sided player with a powerful shot, Richard eventually became a regular member of the Hatters top-flight side.

While with the England Under-21s, he made appearances with the team in Rio de Janeiro's Maracanã stadium, Berlin's Olympic Stadium and at Wembley.

Richard then began to have appalling luck with injuries which left him missing the best part of three seasons before he fought his way back into contention with the Town now drifting down through the divisions.

Despite this, Harvey still went on to play 192 times, scoring five times in Luton colours before eventually leaving the Hatters to join Aylesbury in 1998, his last appearance coming in a 2-1 defeat at Wrexham in February that year.

He later became a postman in his home town of Letchworth.







It wasn't supposed to end as it did, but invariably in football it always does. Very few times does a manager depart amid flags and fanfares. They either get fired or snapped up by someone else. In the case of Rob Edwards it was mutual consent... a mutual feeling that despite best efforts, and more time than would normally be afforded, it isn't working. But given the magnitude of what was achieved, the word "sacking" won't cross our lips.

Writing this in the aftermath of an FA Cup third round weekend which, despite Tamworth's best efforts, largely waved the white flag to the Premier League, it would be hard to disagree with the notion that there's no sentiment in football. But affording someone

such dignity in departure showed sentiment and sensitivity which the decision demanded. Because this was different.

I haven't cried over a football match since Leeds United lost the 1975 European Cup Final a month after my ninth birthday. But I did at Wembley in May 2023 both for personal and professional reasons. And it wasn't just myself and my colleague Justin Dealey being overcome by the moment. Our emotions resonated with so many of you because you were doing the same either at Wembley or listening or watching at home. Others felt the emotion two days later in St George's Square; or at Brighton on the opening day; or the first win at Everton; or when Tahith Chong scored against Liverpool; or the win

over Newcastle seven days after Tom Lockyer's collapse; or maybe much later at West Ham.

This season's disappointments had clouded those memories but having been reminded of them once again in a highlights package played out on 3CR following Rob's departure, I remarked to a colleague that those moments were exactly why it was such a difficult decision to make. We weren't changing energy supplier or deciding to try a different brand of tea. We were cutting ties with perhaps the greatest occasion this club will ever see.

Some of you probably think it should have happened post-Middlesbrough. Others might think it still shouldn't have happened, and Rob should still be here. In the weeks after that interview on Teesside I have recalled many times the timing of the decision to part company with John Still maintaining his standing at the club after gaining promotion back into the Football League. The same had to happen with Rob, so he can take his place with John in a parade of former managers when we say goodbye to this place, or kick-off at Power Court... or both.

But now we move on with a new manager in charge today. Matt Bloomfield had already impressed my BBC colleagues with his calm authority at Wycombe, and his comments this week seem to have gone down well with all of you.

Time to board the next rollercoaster.
