

Good afternoon everyone and a very warm welcome to Kenilworth Road.

Our visitors today are Sheffield United, who are very much in the mix for automatic promotion. It looks as though the two sides relegated with us last season, along with Leeds United and Sunderland, are favourites as there is a gap developing to the chasing pack.

It promises to be an interesting final third of the season and I'm sure there will be some surprises ahead. Leeds are probably the best side we have faced so far and having missed out so often recently will be even more determined to join the elite where they were so at home in the past.

We can't hide our disappointment that we have not fulfilled our expectations as we were one of the favourites to regain our place in the Premier League before the season started. Everyone has their own views as to the reasons behind our underperformance, but there is no doubt that, having not had a relegation from the Premier League before, that the causes and effect of the hangover have been much more challenging than expected. There is a huge difference not just in finances, but also the style of play, and clearly we were not able to adapt as quickly as those who had previous experience.

I write this after just witnessing another frustrating performance at Sunderland. The Black Cats are a good side which has been put together at some expense and they are strong contenders for an automatic promotion place. We were a very young team on the night and it was good to see Matt give our youngsters a chance. It is very early days and this experience will have done them no harm. Both Matt and the players will have learned

a lot in what is still work in progress.

Whilst on this subject, thank you on behalf of us all to those of you who spent good money and much time going all that way on a miserable cold Wednesday evening without much to cheer about. It really is appreciated.

Happily, the transfer window is now closed. It is notoriously difficult, and normally the less business done the better. However, it became clear that fresh faces were needed and

the recruitment team alongside the football management should be applauded for their efforts. The team work tirelessly throughout the year to develop lists of players who might be available within the board-approved budget. It has always seemed to me rather odd that recruitment is squeezed into two relatively short windows. It would seem fairer to either have one in the close season or none at all. There is no doubt that the January window is, or can be, distracting.

Having said this, we believe we've had a good window and we have welcomed eight new players into the squad. They are an exciting mix of age and talent and we look forward to seeing them develop under Matt and his team's guidance.

We welcome back Kal Naismith, who left us for Bristol City in 2022 after being player of the season. We are really pleased to see him back here on loan and hope he can continue with the form he was in when he left.

I'm sure quite a few of us remember Thelo Aasgaard for the two goals he scored for Wigan against us. He is a highly talented attacking midfielder with a knack of scoring goals.

Millenic Alli is a strong attacking forward from Exeter who has also shown that he has an eye for goal and Lamine Fanne has already shown signs of his ability to drive through midfield whilst playing for AlK in Sweden. He signed last summer, but has only been available to us since January.

Isaiah Jones, who signed from Middlesbrough, is a

quick winger that many of you will have seen playing for Boro in the Championship.

Christ Makosso is a young central defender from Belgium, and has already impressed with our under-21s, helping us make it through to the knockout rounds of the Premier League Cup for the first time. Congratulations to Alex Lawless and his squad on that achievement.

Josh Bowler has joined on loan from Nottingham Forest and you may remember him playing against us for the likes of Blackpool, Cardiff and Preston.

Centre forward Lasse Nordås was our final recruit. Lasse has joined us from Norwegian club Tromso where he caught the eye of a few clubs across Europe, and he came on for his debut late on Wednesday night.

The exciting thing about this recruitment is that, with the exception of Kal, who has a mass of experience, they are all young with plenty of opportunity for development.

We wish them all a happy and successful time with us and trust you will all join us to welcome them into our club.

Whilst time isn't a luxury we have much of in our push for league survival, naturally, all players need a period of time to adapt, settle and make an impact – indeed, some more than others. However, we're confident most will contribute positively this season.

Of course, the other side of the coin is that when someone joins someone has to leave. >>

We will miss his character terribly, but it's good to see that he's getting what he wanted, playing 90 minutes for Rotherham in his first game. Much more will be said and done for Pelly and we look forward to seeing him back here at the end of the season.

What we need most evidently is a return of some of the Luton grit, steel and determination to our performances and for our stalwarts to show the fresh faces the way in this regard.

I was sorry to miss Tommy Hodgson's family at the last home game with Millwall. Tommy was my first contact with the Luton management as I would visit his pub, the Old Bell in Harpenden, most nights on my way home from work. He would entertain me by telling me about the goings on at the club. If my memory serves me right, the majority of those stories featured Graham French! Tommy was a lovely man who uniquely served the club as player, captain, director, chairman and president and we hope to see his family again at Kenilworth Road in the future.

Finally, I have been privileged to have seen many of the greats of the game live over the years.

This week saw the funeral of Denis Law, which reminded me of the time in 1961 when, playing for Manchester City in a cup tie against us here at the Kenny, he scored six goals before the game was abandoned for a waterlogged pitch. The game was replayed the following Wednesday and we won 3-1, Law scoring the only goal. If that wasn't memorable enough I was caned at school the next morning for skiving off to watch the match.



WINTER TRANSFER WINDOW



As the winter transfer window has now closed, we take a look back at the squad changes that we have made throughout the month.

With Lamine Fanne ending the Allsvenskan season on a high with AlK, he joined up with his Town teammates at the turn of the year, while we also announced the signing of Congolese international Christ Makosso on New Year's Eve.

Guyana international Isaiah Jones was the next signing in the door at Kenilworth Road, who joined on 10th January from fellow Championship side Middlesbrough for an undisclosed fee.

As we welcomed manager Matt Bloomfield to the club four days later, the boss explained: "We're trying to get what we believe is right and what we know is right to complement the players we already have here."

Bim Pepple, Jameson Horlick and Oli Lynch went back out on loan to Chesterfield, Bedford Town and Hemel Hempstead Town respectively, while Jacob Pinnington and Aidan Francis-Clarke both joined Braintree Town on loan until the end of the season. Erik Pieters and Josh Odell-Bature both left the club after their contracts expired.

Huddersfield Town signed striker Joe Taylor for an undisclosed fee, while Allan Campbell also departed the club, heading back north of the border and joining Dundee United.

We said goodbye to German midfielder Tom Krauß, whose seasonlong loan from Mainz was terminated due to personal reasons.

Five new recruits then arrived at Kenilworth Road during the final week of the window, starting with the reintroduction of Kal Naismith, joining on loan from Bristol City until the end of the season.

We made it two signings in one day when Thelo Aasgaard was announced late on Tuesday 28th January, coming in for an undisclosed fee from Wigan Athletic and played 87 minutes in our draw against Sheffield Wednesday at Hillsborough last Saturday.

Another addition was forward Millenic Alli, who signed from Exeter City and made his debut off the bench at Hillsborough alongside Josh Bowler, who arrived less than 24 hours after Alli on loan from Nottingham Forest.

Finally on Deadline Day, we landed Aasgaard's Norwegian Under-21 teammate Lasse Nordås from Tromsø, with Pelly Ruddock Mpanzu, Tom Holmes and Cauley Woodrow all securing late loans to Rotherham United, Dender EH and Blackburn Rovers respectively.



A resolute second half rearguard performance helped the Hatters end their run of 11 straight Championship defeats away from home as Matt Bloomfield's side earned a 1-1 draw at Sheffield Wednesday.

Ahead at half-time thanks to a superb strike from Alfie Doughty, the Town were hanging on at times in the second half after Wednesday had levelled through Michael Smith's penalty on the hour.

But a combination of brave defending, good goalkeeping and bad finishing ensured the Hatters could pick up a first point on the road since winning 1-0 Smith shot straight at Kaminski on 65 minutes before at Millwall in September. Windass skied the rebound high into the home end.

Doughty's goal – his first of the season – came shortly after the half-hour mark in a first half that saw both sides create few clear-cut chances.

The Town, showing four changes to the team that lost to Millwall at Kenilworth Road last time out, began positively with new signing Thelo Aasgaard bright in attack.

The goal when it came was a beauty. Lamine Fanne drove forward from midfield and fed Jacob Brown on the right. The forward flashed a cross into the feet of Carlton Morris and the captain held the ball up strongly before laying the ball off to Doughty. With nobody around him and from 22 yards, the wing-back looked up and arrowed a wonderful left-foot drive into the top corner.

Wednesday's equaliser when it arrived came from the spot. Djeidi Gassama's mazy run upfield took him past half-a-dozen men in orange shirts but his progress was halted by Lamine Fanne's challenge and referee Ben Toner pointed to the spot. Thomas Kaminski guessed right but Smith's penalty was well-hit and the hosts were level.

Bloomfield reacted by bringing on Josh Bowler for his debut but a two-minute period after his introduction saw the Hatters fortunate to stay on level terms.

Smith shot straight at Kaminski on 65 minutes before Windass skied the rebound high into the home end. Less than 60 seconds later, Josh Windass' firm low drive was turned away by Kaminski with the hosts then unable to turn the loose ball home from close range.

But the Hatters rode that storm and Bloomfield sent on Millenic Alli on for his debut for goalscorer Doughty with 18 minutes remaining.

Back came the Town, Bowler scuffing a shot wide when first to react to a blocked shot from Alli on 79 minutes as the Hatters sensed a late winner against the run of play.

However, as time ticked down, the Hatters withstood heavy Wednesday pressure in the closing stages to hold out for their first point on the road in 141 days.

Alfie Doughty is confident we can avoid relegation from the Championship after he helped the Hatters to a 1-1 draw at Sheffield Wednesday.

The wing-back struck a fine opening goal at Hillsborough - his first of the season - to earn the Town their first point on their travels since the win at Millwall back in September.

"I think we've got a really good squad and the signings that we made came on and made a really big impact, so I'm looking forward to it and I think everyone else is as well," he said.

"I'm very confident with the squad that we've got. The fans see the things on the football pitch, but they don't see it on the training pitch and I have full confidence in

the gaffer and all these players around me.

"We might have been going through a bad spell, but the gaffer's been with us for two weeks, we can already see an improvement with the way that we play. Now we need to get this win, it's going to happen at some point."

After being pegged back from the penalty spot on the hour the Hatters had to dig in as a number of last-ditch tackles and blocks preserved the point.

"That's what we've been missing, we haven't had that fight recently," said Doughty.

"They all know it, but now it's time to really kick on by showing that aggression again that we did when we got promoted, and even last year, we showed that fight again.

"Once we get that back I don't think we've got anything to be worried about. I think it's just happening. Before we were very naive, saying that we were never going to go down, we were never going to go down, but we're here now, we're in that relegation battle.

"We need to get out of it, so I think now people are starting to realise that we need to start fighting again.

"We need to show that fight as quickly as possible and today was one of those situations. It is difficult, but hopefully now we've got that fight back in us and that gameplan, I think we've got nothing to worry about."

Doughty has used further up the pitch since Matt Bloomfield's arrival and the 25-year-old is

relishing his new found freedom in attack as was evident by his great strike from the edge of the box.


"I don't really find myself in those positions really, so it was quite unusual, but I'm happy to be there," he said.

"Again, I haven't played left wing in years really, so for me, it was quite nice to have that opportunity to be there.

"I like shooting and luckily enough that it came off. The thing is their keeper is very good, I know him personally, and he's a big keeper. The fact he's got hands on it I thought, 'oh', but then when it went in the back of the net I was very happy."

The Town slipped to the bottom of the Championship and their wait for Matt Bloomfield's first win in charge continued with defeat at Sunderland.

The Hatters almost fell behind after four minutes when Wilson Isidor sent a shot the wrong side of the post from 10 yards after being found by Patrick Roberts' cross.

Six minutes later the Town needed Mark McGuinness' defensive nous to bravely get in the way of a shot from Dan Neil from close range as the hosts pushed for an opener.

However, the home side – unbeaten at the Stadium of Light this season – didn't need to wait long for the lead as on 13 minutes Enzo Le Fee cut inside from the left flank and found the far corner of the net with a curling effort from the edge of the box.

Behind the Town rallied and on 32 minutes they came close to a leveller. Joe Johnson's cross from the right was headed goalwards by Carlton Morris but Anthony Patterson in the Sunderland goal turned the ball onto the post.

Back came Sunderland and Thomas Kaminski needed to be alert to palm away a fierce drive from Chris Rigg moments later.

After the restart the Town came close once more when the ball fell at the feet of Zack Nelson on 49 minutes.

However, the midfielder's shot from 10 yards was blocked by Trai Hume.

But any hope of a Hatters comeback took a turn shortly before the hour when the hosts doubled their lead. Lamine Fanne's attempted clearance to cut-out a cross from Le Fee fell invitingly at the feet of Isidor who swept a confident finish past Kaminski.

Bloomfield rang the changes, introducing four substitutes in the space of four minutes with Josh Bowler, Elijah Adebayo, Kal Naismith and Jacob Brown all sent on.

The woodwork saved the Town on 74 minutes when Roberts' shot came back off the upright before Brown wasn't far away from reducing arrears, flashing a first-time effort just over the bar - but that was as good as it got for the Town in the second half.


Lasse Nordås was brought on for his debut with eight minutes to go but as time ticked down half chances fell for Sunderland as they looked for a late third, with Kaminski doing well to turn away a goal-bound flick from Jobe Bellingham with the faintest of fingertips with two minutes left.

That would prove to be the final chance as the Town slipped to another defeat on Wearside – not since 1973 have the Hatters tasted victory in this part of the world.

Sunderland and back to West Ham before the curtain came down on his career at Kenilworth Road in 2008.

BLADES CULT HERO

Widely regarded as a cult hero at Bramall Lane due to his unwavering commitment, fierce loyalty, and uncompromising style of play during his tenure at the club, **Chris Morgan** was a rugged and old-fashioned centre-back who epitomised the grit and determination of the steel city.

Morgan joined the Blades in 2003 from Barnsley and quickly established himself as a leader on and off the pitch, winning the player of the year award in his first season.

His no-nonsense defending and ability to

command the backline made him a key figure in the club's promotion to the Premier League in 2005/06. Despite the challenges of top-flight football, Morgan consistently gave his all, earning the admiration of fans who respected his passion and work ethic.

Captaining the side for much of his time at Bramall Lane, Morgan embodied the fighting spirit of the club. He played through injuries and setbacks, often putting the team ahead of personal concerns, which endeared him even further to the United faithful throughout his 279 appearances in the red and white stripes.

Carlton Morris' hot run of form continued as the Hatters recorded a huge win in the Championship promotion race at Sheffield United.




The Hatters kept the Blades at bay as the hosts pushed for an equaliser, but the Town held on to record a huge win.

There's a 12-point gap between fourth and fifth

with Blackburn in fifth winning 1-0 at West Brom on Wednesday, leapfrogging the Baggies in the process.

A queue is forming behind Albion outside the play-off spots with Bristol City jumping into seventh place after their home win over Stoke. The Robins are joined on 45 points – and two points off the play-offs – with Sheffield Wednesday, who beat Swansea in the week.

At the other end of the table, Plymouth leapt off the bottom thanks to a 5-1 win at home to Millwall. The Town replaced the Pilgrims in

the division's final place, but only two points separate the Hatters and Derby in 21st spot after their draw with Oxford.

The Rams travelled to QPR last night while today Plymouth go to Blackburn, Hull host Norwich and Cardiff entertain Bristol City in today's early kick-off.

Arguably the biggest game of the week comes on Monday when Leeds face Sunderland at Elland Road, while on Saturday there's a Lancashire derby as Burnley go to Preston.



Preserving and appreciating the heritage and history of Luton Town Football Club

A TALE OF TWO STEINS

The Hatters take on Sheffield United today and although there haven't been many high-profile meetings between the two clubs, other than locking horns in the Premier League last season, this fixture does mark a significance for the beginning and the return of a Luton Town legend.

Brian Stein, a youngster recommended to the club and snapped up by then reserve coach David Pleat, had dazzled down the M1 at Edgware Town as an amateur.

He had previously spent his days working in administration for the local health authority but that was to change and, after signing for Luton Town, he made his debut on 9th November 1977 in the third round of the League Cup against Manchester City.

However, just five games later Brian announced himself to the Hatters faithful by bagging his first goals for the Town with a brace against Sheffield United at Kenilworth Road on 27th December 1977, alongside goals from Ron Futcher and Lil Fuccillo.

This was a special occasion – not just because Luton Town had failed to score more than one goal at home in over three months – but

because the fans were unaware they had just seen the first two goals of the 154 that Stein would go on to score for the Hatters.

Fast forward to the 22nd February 1992 and the Town are taking on Sheffield United as they are trying to cling on to top-flight football.

Brian had departed the club following the Littlewoods Cup final win against Arsenal in 1988 and after a successful time in France had returned to Kenilworth Road in the summer of 1991.

The game against the Blades saw Brian score his first goal since the Littlewoods Cup Final and the first upon his return as he helped seal a 2-1 victory.

Yes, it took longer to happen, with this being his 29th game rather than his sixth, like 15 years prior. Yes, the electric pace was no longer part of his game and yes, it was a rather fortunate goal to score coming from a goalkeeping error but his first goals in both of his stints with us against Sheffield United are poetic, and a rather neat bit of knowledge and will forever be part of the fabric of Luton Town Football Club.



ON THIS DAY

We go back in time on this day in the Hatters' history books

A stupendous six second-half goals helped the Hatters to a stunning 7-0 victory over Hereford to go nine points clear at the top of the Conference table on this day in 2014.



Andre Gray's first of the afternoon on 12 minutes had the Hatters in front before the Town turned on the style in the second period to record their 11th consecutive home league win and also extend their unbeaten run to an astonishing 22 games.

The first of six goals after the break arrived on 49 minutes when Paul Benson stole in to nod home from two yards out.

Two became three seven minutes later when Jake Howells struck from the spot after Pelly Ruddock Mpanzu was fouled in the box.

On the hour it was 4-0 when Mpanzu scored his first senior goal by smashing a shot in off the crossbar after a fine-flowing move involving Luke Guttridge and Benson.

Benson then tracked back in his own half to pinch the Bulls of the ball and feed Guttridge on 68 minutes, and his pass then sent Gray racing away and the in-form striker made no mistake with a confident finish to make it 5-0. It was four goals in a devastating 15 minutes for the Town.

Five became six on 82 minutes when Gray netted his treble. Alex Lawless wriggled down the left flank to cut the ball back into the penalty area and Gray was there to side-foot home powerfully.

The scoring was then complete in the final minute when Lawless touched home from the goal-line after the Hereford keeper had parried Matt Robinson's vicious free-kick.

So many club league records were tumbled during a momentous campaign which was even more remarkable considering that the summer of 2003 saw the arrival of new 'owner' John Gurney and his crackpot ideas, which ultimately led to the Hatters needing to enter administrative receivership, with all its problems, to get rid of him. Club historian Roger Wash tells the story of a season to remember.



2004/05 history


The Town players did not have much time to dwell on the disappointment in conceding a last-minute equaliser at Huddersfield as next up was the game that they and the fans had been looking forward to - Hull at home.

The Hatters were in top spot with Hull one point and one place behind and a sell-out crowd of 9,500 gathered in the hope that they could extend their lead and also gain revenge for a 3-0 thumping on Humberside earlier in the season.

Leading scorer Steve
Howard would be missing
after picking up his 10th
yellow card of the season,
harshly dished out at
Huddersfield, but on the
plus side central defender
Chris Coyne returned to
the side following his own
suspension. Alan Neilson
stepped into defence in
place of Keith Keane.

Also keeping his place in the side was Marlon Beresford.
The goalkeeper had been charged with verbally abusing the referee following the Huddersfield clash but had been cleared at a meeting of the FA Disciplinary Panel during the week.

The Town were back to their early season form during the first half against the Tigers but could not put the ball into the net. Shots and headers rained in



on Boaz Myhill in the Hull goal together with efforts that went narrowly wide.

Hull improved after the break, although the Town remained in the ascendency but, as the clock ticked towards 90 minutes, a scoreless draw looked the likely outcome.

Step forward Ahmet Brkovic the 'Croatian Sensation'. Taking a gamble on a near post run he got on the end of a Steve Robinson cross to rocket a header past Myhill and seal the win. The roof certainly came off!

A more than pleased Mike Newell said afterwards: "I am absolutely delighted especially after last week at Huddersfield. It was the best we've played in weeks, and it was a fantastic time to score."

Full of praise for the match-winner, Newell went on, "Brkovic has good technique and he's a good header of the ball. He played really well although ironically, we were thinking of taking him off as he looked tired late on.

"Hull can have no arguments – we were by far the better team. The players are all delighted in the changing room, but I'm not getting carried away. It's another three points in a tight league."

Newell's opposite number, Peter Taylor, conceded that the

2004/05 history



Hartlepool pulled another goal back in stoppage time, but it was too little too late as the Town went seven points clear at the top.

Reflecting on the game, Newell said: "We came off the back of a great performance and great win against Hull but I knew it was always going to be tough at Hartlepool.

"Being knocked off the top for a week in January hurt the lads. They're comfortable at the top and are now sensing what can be achieved here."

Hatters were now favourites for the title.


The Town players did not have long to rest on their laurels as they faced a long midweek trip to fifth-placed Hartlepool, who had yet to lose at home in the league that season. Although never publicly admitting it, Newell had particular interest in that game as he had left Victoria Park in acrimonious circumstances after guiding them to promotion in May 2003.

Retaining the same side that had beaten Hull, the Town were under the cosh for a while at the start but weathered the storm and eventually took the lead on 21 minutes when Coyne strode forward from the half-way line and swept past two half-hearted challenges before firing low and hard

from 20 yards past the Pools goalkeeper.

Hartlepool went close a couple of times before Enoch Showunmi fired just wide and then missed a sitter with a free header. The striker made amends on 58 minutes though, taking advantage of Hartlepool defenders arguing with the referee to sneak in behind them and taking a through ball in his stride and slotting home from 18 yards.

Pools pulled a goal back on 62 minutes after a mix-up in the Luton defence led to Sol Davis misdirecting a header past Beresford. The two goal lead was restored soon after when a clever pass from Rowan Vine was taken on by Kevin Foley to dink the ball over the goalkeeper from 12 yards.

Town shirt collector, David Foxen, aka @lutontownkits, goes through his selection of shirts in orange, white, blue – and all colours in between.

It was 9th May, 1994.
The 1993/94 season had finished a few weeks earlier, but there was still football to be played!
Inside Wembley Stadium, there was a five-a-side tournament called the "London Fives."

London Fives started way back in 1954, and eventually became the known as Evening Standard London five-aside, after the newspaper sponsored the event. It was originally only meant for the old First and Second Division teams, and was seen as a "competitive" but friendly exhibition tournament.

It finished in 1995 and was the year that the

Hatters made it to the final against Wycombe Wanderers. It ended in a penalty shootout that we unfortunately lost. It was the only final we ever made.

Back to the 1994 tournament though, and we were drawn against Spurs in the first round. A team consisting of Jurgen Sommer, Des Linton, Julian James, Paul Telfer, David Preece, Ceri Hughes and Scott Oakes were powerless against Spurs, and fell at the first hurdle. Frustratingly, there are no videos or pictures from that game.

What didn't fall at the first hurdle was this unique shirt that we wore for the tournament. Back in 1994, the club ran a competition to design a new away shirt with this the eventual winner. Made by DMF, who also made our home and away shirts for the season, this shirt features a unique colour combination of a deep purple combined with a light salmon pink, harking back to the club's original colours in the 1880s.

Universal Salvage
Auctions also sponsored
this shirt, and we had
a unique, one-off
badge that has never
been on a shirt since!
The coat of arms of Luton
remains, but instead of
the curled 'Luton Town
Football Club', we have

horizontal blue and orange rectangles to the side which contains our name.

The pop collar remains which adds to the smart feel of that era. Like the home and away shirts, the manufacturer logo and crest are embossed into the material of the shirt, further adding to the uniqueness of the shirt.

It's certainly a one-off, and a bit of a cult classic amongst Luton shirt collectors. The story behind it just adds to the uniqueness and collectability, so if you have one, keep it safe and look after it! It's a beauty!

TIM BREACKER

Tim joined Luton from school in St Neots and made his Hatters debut in a 3-0 defeat at Ipswich in March 1984 while still only 18.

A fast and strong full-back who loved to overlap, Tim soon made the right-back position his own, as well as picking up England under-21 caps, and was the only player to turn out in all 58 league and cup games in the momentous 1987/88 season which ended with the Hatters lifting the Littlewoods Cup.

Finances dictated that a reluctant Tim was sold to West Ham for £600,000 in September 1990, but he enjoyed eight years at Upton Park before finishing his career at QPR where he joined the coaching staff.

Overall Tim made 262 appearances in Town colours, scoring just three goals. One of these was particularly memorable - a 35-yard piledriver to open the scoring away to Derby when the Town needed to win to avoid relegation from the top flight on the final day of the 1989/90 season.

Subsequently, Tim became assistant manager at Leicester under Ian Holloway before following Phil Parkinson to Charlton, Bradford City and Bolton.

Children's Mental Health Week



For Children's Mental Health Week, Hatters players Kal Naismith and Thelo Aasgaard visited Stopsley Community Primary School to take part in a mental health workshop with year 6 pupils as part of our Premier League Primary Stars programme.

The programme supports pupils in the classroom, the playground and on the sports field with the aim to inspire children to be active, look after their wellbeing and develop important life skills.

Each week throughout the academic year, the Trust delivers wide range of interventions at local schools to build pupils confidence in key areas - including PSHE, physical education, maths and English educational assemblies and workshops; girlsonly extra-curricular football sessions: teacher mentoring in PE; social action projects; competitions and many more.

Kal and Thelo joined pupils in the classroom, taking part in activities about mental health, followed by a Q&A and then joining in a football session in the school hall. The Hatters duo were also joined by 17-year-old Hatters fan Aidan, who is the BBC East Young Reporter of the Year for 2024 and a former pupil at Stopsley Community Primary School.

Aidan, who lives with dyspraxia and has an atrial septal defect, now attends Weatherfield Academy in Dunstable and is determined to help other people with special educational needs who want a specific career. Aidan was invited to interview Kal and Thelo, and his insightful chat with the players is available on LTFC+ and the club's social media channels.

"It was great to sit with the youngsters today and share some of the ways in which we can all help each other have healthy minds," said Kal. "As we get older more stress comes on us, and there's more life stuff, but it's important to know how to deal with the emotions of things, and have mechanisms that you can use."

Thelo added: "I've loved the football side of my first few days as a Luton player, but coming into the community today and seeing the great work that goes on is something I've really enjoyed.

"In football it's such a rollercoaster that you are going to feel extremes, there are so many emotions. Coming into a school, it's not exactly our line of work, but if we can translate our skills to the children in a way that they can understand, then hopefully they can take it on into their lives and into their school work."

And what advice would he give to the children?


"One of the main things is to speak to people, even if you are someone who is enclosed or keep yourself to yourself," said Thelo.





It will be a big night under the lights on Wednesday when the Town face another crucial Championship clash here at Kenilworth Road when Plymouth Argyle are the visitors.

The rearranged game with the Pilgrims is a relegation six-pointer with both clubs in need of the points given their situation at the bottom end of the secondtier table.

As we went to press, Plymouth had just pulled off one of the shocks of the season following their 1-0 win over Liverpool in the FA Cup thanks to Ryan Hardie's penalty.

It was another good

result for Argyle under new manager Miron Muslic who had masterminded a comeback victory over West Brom two weeks ago.

That win ended a run of 15 Championship games without a win, a sequence which saw Wayne Rooney dismissed on New Year's Eve after a 2-0 defeat to Oxford.

Following their promotion to the second tier as League One champions in 2022/23, last season saw Plymouth avoid relegation by one point as they finished one place above the

dropzone as the fight for survival went down to the final day.

This season has been a struggle for Argyle – as their league position testifies, however, as was evident last weekend, they rise to the challenge in the big games – with victories coming over Sunderland and Blackburn in the Championship at Home Park, where they have lost just four times.

It is on their travels where the Pilgrims have struggled though, and on Wednesday they will make the trip to Kenilworth Road looking for their first away win of the season. Argyle have

just four draws to their name in 15 matches and scored five goals.

The Plymouth faithful making the trip from Devon will arrive in Bedfordshire with fond recent memories as the Pilgrims have won three of their last six visits – their last coming in a League 2 meeting in October 2015.

But the Town will be hoping for a repeat of Plymouth's last visit here that saw Nathan Jones' side run out 5-1 winners on their way to the League 1 title in 2018/19. That afternoon saw James Collins grab a hat-trick with Elliot Lee and James Justin also on target.



One of many highlights last season occurred in the penultimate home match against Fulham.

Pelly Ruddock Mpanzu had been introduced as a substitute in the second half. He got into a number of decent positions around the opposition penalty area and had opportunities to shoot. It led to chants from the home fans at the Kenny.

"If Pelly scores we're on the pitch".

Sadly it didn't happen, and whether there would've been a pitch invasion is probably unlikely but it kind of summed up the affection Luton had, and have, for Mpanzu.

He was a youngster when John Still initially took him on loan back in 2013 from West Ham. Wily old John told me in the old training ground portacabin at Ely Way he had initially seen Mpanzu play for Boreham Wood and liked the look of him. In his first match he started at centre back but then he soon moved into midfield in that National League season and helped the Hatters finally get out of non-league football.

He converted to League Two comfortably. Following promotion from that division the questions began about whether he could step up to League One level – and the answer was emphatic. It may have been his best season in

a Luton Town shirt. He was a pivotal player in the team and scored his fair share of goals.

So into the Championship and that question again: could he step up again? The answer was positive once more. Like others it took him a bit of time, but he got there in the end and played a big part in promotion to the top level to finally complete the set and become the first player to go from non-league to Premier League with the same club - which he duly did.

He may have played more of a substitute role last season and didn't get that goal but he was still a key figure at the club and in the squad. His character and personality was one of the reasons for his longevity. His underrated ability on the pitch was another. He played under a number of Hatters managers who all saw the benefits of having Mpanzu in the squad. For his box-to-box ability, his work ethic and his mobility in the midfield engine room.

I've interviewed Pelly many times over the 11 years. He's always been humble but always had an inner belief in his own ability.

He leaves Luton a Hatters legend but will be back for one more game when we'll see that big, beaming smile once again at Kenilworth Road.
