Saturday's performance against Sheffield United was the best we have played in a long, long time and while it was disappointing we couldn't turn that into a result, there were lots of positives to take from it.

It was also heartening to see a number of the new lads make their debuts at the Kenny and I think the excellent atmosphere you created will have helped them settle. It was particularly good to see Kal back in a Luton shirt. We will need to be careful with his fitness but his display at the back was incredibly reassuring, and the defensive aspect of Saturday was one of the platforms for such an improved display.

But for all the positives we can't shy away from the fact we had nothing to show for it. It was a classic top-versusbottom clash. You can see why they are where they are and why we are at the opposite end of the table. We had the better, more clear-cut chances and couldn't take them while they had one and took it. They know how to win games at the moment and we are, at the minute, finding a way to lose.

On a personal level, I've had a second surgery on my ankle after the first one hadn't quite done the trick. That's my season done sadly, so my focus now is to return fit for preseason. There's no rush for me to get back so it's important after having this set-back to concentrate on making sure I come back without any issues for the summer.

Of course having been so close, and just three days away from a return to being back on a football pitch, I'm gutted but that's the way football goes sometimes.

Back to tonight. It's a huge game and we'll

need you to be behind us from the first whistle until the last. On Saturday your noise levels were fantastic and the boys certainly responded.

I don't think we've played as well since the win over Watford back in October but we need more of those kinds of days if we're to get out of tr<u>ouble.</u>

After tonight there's the small matter of the derby at Vicarage Road on Sunday afternoon. All the lads know how much the game means to you – and if the new lads don't yet, they will certainly be reminded by myself and the rest of the senior lads.

I will always be in awe of the dedication of football fans. Just look at the 370 of our supporters who made the 500-mile round trip to Sunderland last Wednesday night. our staff are equals. There's no internal hierarchy that dictates behaviours or relationships – Matt and his team were part of the same induction process as all of our club staff, something we feel is really key to becoming engrained in Luton culture early on.

A highlight of which was Matt and his team meeting all club staff at the Club HQ for a quick welcome meeting before they sat down for an important recruitment session.

As you can imagine, the appointment of a new manager, as with any change of leadership, can create uncertainty, but I am proud of how our people deal with change. Their resilience is appreciated, as is their ability to keep secrets when new faces are wandering around the place!

As transfer deadline day came and went – with its usual signal of a broken coffee machine – I want to acknowledge the hard work that goes into those exciting announcements of new players (unless of course, you spot them in Tesco...!)

There is an unimaginable amount of work that goes in, from early identification to discussions with agents, medical assessments, more paperwork than you can imagine, content creation and work to ensure that our new signings are made to feel welcomed and settled.

There's an avalanche of unseen hard work put in to ensure the team's ambitions for the short and long-term are met and particularly so for this transfer window, as we conducted the biggest January in over a decade by strengthening the squad in every target area ready for a big 10-week push.

While change has been a theme on the pitch and behind the scenes, one thing that remains constant is our commitment to inclusivity and community. A big part of my role at the club involves overseeing the equality, diversity and inclusion strategy. This means managing processes for both mental health and reports of discrimination.

We look at those behaviours not just on a match day, but also on social media, and it would be remiss of me to not use this opportunity to ask you to be mindful of these behaviours – we want everyone to feel welcome at Kenilworth Road, and discrimination of any kind will not be tolerated. Bring the noise, show your support – but there is never a need to use discriminatory terms to show support for Our Club.

It is as good a time as any to reflect that Saturday's game with Sheffield United saw us champion the EFL's 'Together Against Homophobia' campaign, where the league's rainbow ball was used. Activations like this, whilst set by the EFL, are all strongly supported internally by our Club >>>

The Town's wait for a first win under Matt Bloomfield continues but the Hatters can be encouraged by their performance despite a narrow defeat to promotion-chasing Sheffield United.

The result means the Hatters stay bottom of the table following Anel Ahmedhodzic's goal 11 minutes from time – a goal that sent the Blades top of the Championship.

It was hard on the Town who looked anything but a side sitting in the relegation places after creating a number of chances – especially in a first half in which they dominated.

Showing seven changes to the side that lost at Sunderland in midweek the Hatters started well and on eight minutes Elijah Adebayo planted a header wide from close range after being found by Thelo Aasgaard's cross.

The Town, roared on by the Kenilworth Road faithful, were playing some eye-catching football and on 15 minutes they went close again when the lively Aasgaard turned on the edge of the box and curled a shot onto the Blades' crossbar with a superb effort.

It was all the Hatters, playing with confidence and energy, and as they continued to press the Town should have led on 36 minutes when Aasgaard's teasing cross from the left was volleyed over at the back-post by Adebayo.

Aasgaard, everywhere, shot low into Michael Cooper's gloves moments later before Liam Walsh shot wide as half-time approached.

Thomas Kaminski had been a virtual spectator in the first half but the Town number one was called into the action just before the break when turning away Tyrese Campbell's shot.

You always felt the Hatters needed to take advantage of their superiority in the first half and at half-time visiting boss Chris Wilder made two changes in a bid to quell the Town's play.

And it had the desired effect as the visitors offered more of a threat going forward.

Four minutes after the restart – just after Carlton Morris' header was stopped by Cooper – the Blades came mighty close to taking the lead when Ben Brereton-Diaz slid home at the back-post but his shot rebounded off the post.

It was a warning for the Hatters as the visitors upped the ante and on 69 minutes Brereton-Diaz swept a shot just over the bar from close range.


Back came the Town and Morris' back-post header from Alfie Doughty's free-kick was kept out by Cooper with 13 minutes as the Hatters looked to break the deadlock.

However, moments later the visitors struck. Kaminski kept out a bullet header from Vini Souza and the Town couldn't clear their lines. Callum O'Hare helped the ball into the box and into Ahmedhodzic's path and the defender made no mistake from close range.

Behind, the Hatters rallied but the visitors showed the kind of nous in the closing stages that often is the sign of teams gunning for promotion.

Five added minutes came and went as the Blades held on to condemn the Town to a 10th league game in the Championship without victory. 15

DISAPPOINTMENT BUT ENCOURAGEMENT FOR MATT

Town boss Matt **Bloomfield had** mixed emotions after Saturday's 1-0 home defeat to Sheffield United.

The Hatters dominated the first half and came close to breaking the deadlock on numerous occasions only to be foiled by the in-form visitors.

Defeat meant the Town stayed bottom of the Championship table but the boss was encouraged by a number of the performances of a number of his players.

"It's really disappointing but I've been told by some of the guys that have been here all season that the first 45 was the best that it's been all season," said the manager.

"That is pleasing on one hand but disappointing on the other as we want to win games, we want to win football matches and we haven't.

"So we're disappointed, but that's the minimum performance that we


need to provide for the rest of the season.


"It's about performances, we can't just hope for results without putting performances in. Eventually, good performances pay you back, there's no doubt about that and that's the level that we need to attain for the rest of the season.


"There were some really good individual performances that went into the collective. I thought all over the pitch there was good energy, so there's loads and loads of positives and we have to be very balanced in what we do, we have to be consistent.

"We've spoken about that a lot. We can't get too carried away with the disappointing performances like against Sunderland - we all understood that.

"We analysed it and tried to do something different today and I thought the boys responded well."

Walsh, who was selected as match sponsors' player of the match, said: "That's the harsh reality. We've put in our best performance in a while and come away with no points again.

"Where we are in the table, that's given us a big boost to go on and perform like that against a top side. We know that that's the lowest level of performance that we've got to put in to go and get on with the rest of the season, and I think if we are putting in performances like that, results will come.

"You can feel it yourself on the pitch. It felt like today that everyone was doing their jobs down to a man, we were defending solidly, with the ball we were winning first contacts, winning second balls, if you didn't win the first.

"At half-time, there wasn't much going on - there wasn't much to talk about because we just knew that we had to follow that first half up, which we did. It was just a little 30-second moment, and it shows what teams at the top of the league can do to you. We've come away unlucky today, but we know that that's our level now."

Asked if the performance had spread optimism through the dressing room, the 27-year-old replied: "I think so, looking at the Sunderland result and past performances over the last month or so, we know where

we are at with today's performance. If we can build on that, I don't see why we can't pick up points."

The former Swansea midfielder believes "one hundred per cent" that the eight new arrivals during the January transfer window have freshened the outlook of the squad.

"A lot of those players will come on at some point, or start games and freshen it up a bit. I think Thelo has probably played the most out of all of them and he's been brilliant today. He gives us that little spark in the middle, but all the lads are expecting big performances from now until the end of the season, it's what we deserve for each other."

Walsh also thanked the supporters for their reception at the end, when the Town players were applauded off the pitch despite being beaten.

"Everything is for the fans and we knew today that past performances weren't good enough for the fans," said Walsh. "Me personally, seeing them travel up to Sunderland on a Wednesday night, it's heartbreaking for them to see the 2-0 loss like that, the way we did.

"We just want to repay the fans with performances and seeing them clap us off like that at the end, even though we've lost again, it's a big boost for us."

Promising pair Christian Chigozie and Benny Benagr put pen to paper on their first professional contracts last week



We are excited to announce that two of Luton Town's finest prospects have signed their first professional contracts with the Club.

Local boys Christian Chigozie and Benny Benagr have put pen to paper after turning 17 recently, as a reward for their impressive performances at both Under-18 and 21 level as first-year scholars.

Centre-back Christian was named on the bench twice in the Premier League last season, featuring on the teamsheet for the away games at Arsenal and Manchester City while still studying for his GCSEs at Chiltern Academy.

He has been included three times this season, with left-back or wing-back Benny also named in the squad for the first time at home to Sunderland after impressing in the preseason friendly at Port Vale.

Christian was born in Spain, but moved to England at the age of six and like Benny, joined his local club as an Under-7 in the Luton Town Community Trust's Pre-Academy programme, before signing for the main academy two years

They have progressed through the ranks together and this season have played key roles in the youth team's current 16-match unbeaten run that has taken them to the top of the EFL Youth Alliance South-East table and the quarter-finals of the League Cup.

They have also contributed significantly

to the Under-21s' qualification from the Premier League Cup group stage for the first time, with Town's development squad set to visit Nottingham Forest next month in the last 16.

Academy manager Paul Benson said: "Christian has been in the academy since an under nine and throughout the time he's been with us he has shown solid development year on year.

"A 6ft 2in centre-back, Christian's main strengths are his athleticism and character. He's a proper

Miron Muslic's side have been in good form lately and will come to Kenilworth Road full of confidence.

Up until the appointment of Muslic as manager, Argyle were struggling under Wayne Rooney. However, since Muslic has come in, he has improved league form and pulled off a win which will be forever remembered by the Argyle fans.

This win was a 1-0 victory at Home Park against Liverpool in what will be remembered in the history books as a true upset. A Ryan Hardie penalty was enough to beat the current Premier League leaders.

In the league, form has improved as well but this isn't without the odd blip. Wins against Millwall, West Brom and a big draw away at Sunderland also came with defeats to Burnley, QPR and Blackburn.

While the Pilgrims have recorded a number of good results at Home Park this season, it is on their travels where they have struggled. The Argyle faithful have yet to see their side win on their travels in the Championship and only scored five times in 16 away fixtures.

Plymouth will be hoping for a better result here than their last visit to Kenilworth Road. Back in 2018/19 the Town ran out 5-1 winners on their way to the League One title with James Collins hitting a hat-trick.

DWIGHT MARSHALL

Dwight joined Plymouth in 1991 and finished top scorer in his first season. A £150,000 move to Luton in 1994 saw the lightning-quick striker top score once more but a badly broken ankle at Sunderland in 1996 was blamed for the Hatters sinking to relegation. Dwight would leave Kenilworth Road in 1998 after scoring 38 times in 155 games and eventually rejoined Argyle.

PILGRIMS CULT HERO

As Argyle legends go it's hard not to look past **Mickey Evans**. A local talent, he debuted at 17 in 1990 and played his final game nearly 16 years later. He first scored in 1991 and became crucial during Argyle's 1993/94 playoff push, netting seven goals in nine games.

After leading Argyle back from relegation in 1996, he moved to Southampton for a clubrecord £650,000, but a managerial change saw him sidelined, leading to moves to West Brom and Bristol Rovers, where injuries and poor form stalled his career.

In 2001, he returned to Argyle, becoming the heart of Paul Sturrock's side. His strength and selflessness helped drive the club up the divisions, though his goal tally didn't reflect his importance to the Greens.

His Argyle career would end poetically in 2006 with a memorable winning goal against Ipswich. A brief stint at Torquay followed before he retired but the Home Park faithful will never forget his tireless and unselfish work in attack – not forgetting his part in three promotions.



FIXTURE FLASHBACK

TOWN 2-0 PLYMOUTH - DIVISION THREE 2nd FEBRUARY 2002

The Town and Argyle were fighting for promotion from the fourth tier in 2001/02 with the Pilgrims the more consistent and miserly in defence.

Joe Kinnear's Hatters, on the other hand, were free-scoring but were prone to the occasional lapse so when the two sides met in February at Kenilworth Road it was the visitors who led the way at the top of the table.

In what was the first full house at the Old Girl in eight years, a pulsating top-of-the-table tussle ensued.

With Argyle happy to sit back and play for a point, the Town struggled to break down the resolute Plymouth defence.

However, the game turned 10 minutes from time when Matthew Taylor was brought down in the penalty area and Kevin Nicholls thumped home the resultant penalty.

There was only one winner after that and Steve Howard brought the house down with a close range header to seal the points in the closing stages.

For the visitors it would be a minor blip on their way to the Third Division title, finishing five points ahead of the Town on 102 points.


















































Preserving and appreciating the heritage and history of Luton Town Football Club

A HOME AWAY FROM HOME

It's widely known that Plymouth took part in the first competitive match at Kenilworth Road in 1905, but we also have a long history with Argyle's Home Park, playing there 51 times to date.

In fact, only Loftus Road (54) and Griffin Park (53) have been visited more often.

The first game was on the 3rd October 1903 during Plymouth's inaugural season in the Southern League.

On a day of brilliant sunshine 10,000 lined the ropes of the ground, and though the game was to turn into a fairly turgid 0-0 draw, the crowd were treated to the sight of two players who would become legendary figures for both clubs.

Fred Hawkes was born on 17th April 1881 in Luton. He was a schoolboy football star in the town, winning medals while playing for the Christ Church School team and going on to make his first team debut in a Football League match against Loughborough in March 1900.

He'd be a mainstay of the team for the next 20 years, appearing in an incredible 625 out of the 715 games the Hatters played in that period, a tally which makes him Town's record appearance holder.

Often part of a muchfeared half-back line with fellow club legends Fred White and Bob Hawkes (no relation), he was an excellent passer of the ball with good anticipation, and was never afraid to put in a strong challenge. A hat stapler by trade and a Lutonian through and through, he died in 1953.

Fred was facing up against Bob Jack. Hailing from Alloa, Bob had moved south to Bolton where he spent six seasons and established a reputation as one of the game's fastest wingers, one who might have gone onto even greater fame but for a nasty ankle injury.

He would make 105 appearances for Argyle, but it was as manager and general secretary where he'd leave his greatest mark on the club.

After a brief spell as player-manager he returned to Home Park in 1910 and was in charge when the club moved into the Football League in 1920.

In a remarkable spell, he led Plymouth to six second-place finishes in the Division Three South, before finally achieving promotion in the 1929/1930 season.

In charge for an incredible 28 years, he will surely forever remain Argyle's longest-serving manager. It's no surprise, therefore, that when Bob died in 1943, his ashes were scattered at Home Park.

DID YOU KNOW?

Thanks in large part to Fred and Bob, Hawkes is by far the most common surname to appear in Town lineups (1,158 times). Johnson is the next on the list (683).

ON THIS DAY

We go back in time on this day in the Hatters' history books

Second-half goals from Cameron Jerome and Allan Campbell earned the Town a comfortable home win over West Brom in the Championship on this day three years ago.



The game's first chance on goal came to the Hatters when Elijah Adebayo and Tom Lockyer combined well, with the Welshman delivering the ball into the box to Admiral Muskwe, whose audacious flick was straight at Sam Johnstone.

West Brom were next to see an effort on goal. Andy Carroll won the ball back from a Jed Steer goal kick, and played through Karlan Grant, who saw his short parried wide for a corner.

Five minutes before half-time, Town almost handed the lead to the Baggies. Kal Naismith's attempted switch was intercepted by Grant, who forced Steer in the Town goal into a smart stop.


The let-off seemed to spark the Hatters into life, as they broke well from a West Brom attack. Campbell surged forward and fed Jerome, whose effort looked destined for the far corner, but the ball came back out off the post.

However, 10 minutes into the second half, Town took the lead. Amari'i Bell was fouled by Carroll, and from the resulting free-kick, Jerome rose highest from Naismith's cross to head beyond Johnstone.

The three points were safe seven minutes from time. Campbell was given too much time and space on the edge of the West Brom area and the Scotsman found the top corner with a brilliant effort.

The Town were victorious on their first outing on this day, beating Newcastle United 3-1 in a Division Two fixture back in 1898... Our first away win on this day came in 1910 with a 3-2 win at Croydon Common in the Southern League... That would be the Town's last win on this day until 1953 when two goals from Jesse Pye earned a 2-1 win at Notts County... It was a 22-year wait for the next win on 19th February when two goals from Ron Futcher (below) secured a 2-0 win over Charlton at Kenilworth Road in 1977... The Town have won three of the last four on this day, beating Bristol Rovers 3-0 in 2002, Bradford in 2005 and West Brom in 2022.


Seven points clear at the top, the Town's next game was a trip to Bradford City, who sat just outside the playoffs, where manager Mike Newell picked the same side that had won at Hartlepool in midweek apart from Steve Howard replacing Enoch Showunmi.

The Bantams had not won a home game for four months and so recruited 'Jake the performing dog' to Valley Parade given that his antics had inspired Reading, Swindon, Torquay and Yeovil to end barren home runs.

In a frantic opening spell, the Hatters might have scored three times in the first 10 minutes. Firstly, Ahmet Brkovic was upended in the box by City's goalkeeper Paul Henderson who complained long and hard and was surprisingly not booked for his histrionics while the innocent Brkovic was carded along with future Hatter Lewis Emanuel.

Normally deadly from the spot, skipper Kevin Nicholls saw his penalty kick saved by Henderson with a tremendous dive which was bettered a couple of minutes later when he pushed a rasping shot from Rowan Vine around a post.

From the subsequent corner, City failed to clear their lines properly leaving Chris Coyne to tee up Rowan Vine who fired in off the post from 22 yards.

From then until the interval the excitement dropped considerably as the sides cancelled each other out but in the second period City came more into the game where the Luton defence and in particular goalkeeper Marlon Beresford stood firm.

The closest the Bantams came to scoring was in the 88th minute when Steven Schumacher smacked a shot against the post. The effort was similar to Vine's but as Mike Newell said afterwards, "This is the sort of thing that happens when one side is at the top of the table and the other one isn't."

Newell also said: "We're delighted with the result of course but we're not happy with the performance. We've gone from one

extreme to the other in a few days. We were really pleased with the way we played at Hartlepool but we looked leggy here and rode our luck at times.

"We started off well enough and took it to them in the first 15 minutes but lost it after that. We didn't get the ball down or keep possession anywhere near as well as we did the other night. We couldn't pass it or get close to anybody, and I thought it was a poor game.

"But it's all about results at the end of the day and we're delighted with the win."

Next up came a visit from Walsall who sat in mid-table. Mindful of the runaround the Saddlers had given them earlier in the season, the Town kept the same eleven that started at Bradford City and were extremely pleased to see playermanager Paul Merson, who ran the show at the Bescot, on the bench rather than starting.

Once again, the Hatters were quickly out of the blocks but did not have their shooting boots on. Shots from Robinson, Howard, Coyne and Brkovic whistled past the post while an effort from Vine was well fielded by Joe Murphy in the Walsall goal.

The one-way traffic continued until the interval, but the game became scrappy in the second half as the Town battled against a resolute Saddlers defence. That is until the two minutes from time when Walsall's

Neil Emblen pushed Coyne in the area for a nailed-on penalty.

If skipper Nicholls was worried about the spot kick following his miss at Bradford it did not show as he calmly sent Day the wrong way to secure another valuable three points.

A relieved Mike Newell reflecting on the game said: "We can't play well in every game, but we've picked up maximum points in the last four matches and have gone 14 without defeat which is the longest run we've had all season. We're hard to beat and that's why we are where we are.

"We've got 12 cup finals left and the aim is to keep the unbeaten run going to the end of the season."

"There's only one Micky Harford!" were the cries ringing around Kenilworth Road on 4th May 2019.

We went on to beat Oxford on the final day of the season to clinch, and then lift, the League One championship trophy.

It marked the end of a fantastic season, one that saw the highs of that pre-Christmas run that made us believe promotion could be on the cards, to the lows of our manager leaving halfway through the season. We needn't have worried though, Mick came in and did a

wonderful job to secure us the league.

It may be those winning memories that make me see this shirt through rose-tinted glasses. I love this shirt!

Made by Puma, this was a significant upgrade from the previous season's design. We had a slight two-tone block orange stripe effect going on, with black trim around the neckline and down the sleeves. Indigo Residential replaced SsangYong as our sponsor too.

The shade of orange (slightly darker than the

previous years) and the black trim really works, as does the white Puma logo on the sleeves. Puma certainly knew how to make their logo stand out!

There are so many players and key moments that remind me of this shirt. Andrew Shinnie running things in midfield, constantly pinging the ball to either Jack Stacey or James Justin who were steaming down the flanks.

George Moncur scoring THAT free-kick against Portsmouth on a freezing January midweek evening, James Collins' hat-tricks against Peterborough and Plymouth, and the 86th-minute equaliser from Jason Cummings at home to Blackpool all spring to mind.

It also made me remember one of the more iconic centre-back pairings we've had in a while; one wore a magic hat, and the other had questionable tattoos – Matty Pearson and former captain, Sonny Bradley. What a defence we had that season!

A lovely shirt that evokes so many wonderful memories.

HE'S ONE OF OUR OWN

HERBERT MOODY

One of Luton's famous sons, Herbert 'Bert' Moody was born in the town in 1880 and came to prominence as a maker and taker of goals at schoolboy level before joining Luton Stanley.

With clubs sniffing around, the Town took the unusual, for the time, decision to award him a contract in 1897 and then let him learn his trade with the reserve side.

He eventually made his first team debut in February 1902 and after a slow start came to the fore and by the following campaign was one of the first names on the teamsheet becoming a regular scorer.

Bigger clubs took an interest leading to Bert joining Leicester Fosse in 1905 to play alongside his former teammates Jimmy Blessington and Jimmy Durrant. He enjoyed his first season at Filbert Street but not so much his second, with Blessington and Durrant departed and was glad to come home in 1907.

Finishing top scorer in four of the next five seasons he became a real terrace favourite with the fans disappointed when, following the Town's relegation to Southern League Division Two in 1912, he decided to move to Millwall where he was to spend the next eight years before hanging up his boots at the age of 40.

After retiring, Bert worked as an Inspector in the Vauxhall Motors engineering department and passed away in Luton in 1959.

Bert is currently fifth on our list of all-time leading goalscorers with 106 goals in 266 games.



For many young people who participate in our Premier League Kicks sessions across Bedfordshire, Shipaar Miah is an inspirational figure.

In his role as Inclusion Officer for the Luton Town Community Trust, Shipaar co-ordinates and leads the delivery of our Premier League Kicks programme.

In recognition of his commitment and contribution to our local communities, Shipaar received our nomination as the Premier League Community Captain.

Premier League Kicks creates opportunities for young people at risk of anti-social behaviour, youth violence and/ or from high-need areas to regularly engage in football, sport, mentoring and personal development opportunities.

The Trust delivers seven free and inclusive Premier League Kicks sessions for children and young people aged 8-18 across Luton, Houghton Regis and Bedford with an average of 175 young people participating per week. Shipaar has been instrumental in a fifty per cent expansion of PL Kicks sessions over a two-season period.

Shipaar celebrated his achievement with a presentation of the Community Captain armband, pennant and shirt at The Brache by Matt Bloomfield and Carlton Morris. Shipaar was given a guided tour of the training ground and met many of the men's first team players and Club colleagues.


Of Premier League Kicks, Shipaar says: "When I was growing up, we didn't have Premier League Kicks sessions or have people to talk to if we were having problems at home, school or in the community, it was either your teachers or parents and sometimes young people want to hear a different voice.

"A lot of boys I went to school with were tempted

down the wrong path and ended up in prison and with criminal records. These community-based interventions are so important in providing alternatives to crime and anti-social behaviour for our future generations and the support provided by the Premier League to enable this great work is vital."

In the final minute of the 90, a rocket from

Leighton added a fifth for Luton. The ball broke free on the edge of the area and Leighton fired her first time shot into the top right corner of the goal.

The Ladies' reward will be a meeting against Real Bedford in the Bedfordshire County Cup final. The date and venue will be announced in due course.

The Hatters go behind enemy lines on Sunday for the 128th Luton versus Watford derby.

Over the years the Town have held the upper hand over the Hornets, winning 58 times compared to the Hertfordshire side's 39 victories. 30 of the meetings have ended all square.

But it's been a long wait for the Hatters' last victory at Vicarage Road. Not since goals from Matthew Spring (yes, that one) and Steve Howard earned us a 2-1 League Cup win in 2002 have we had the joy of returning up the M1 with smiles on our faces.

For taking league points from our near neighbours' backyard you have to go back even further – 31 years in fact. Back in 1994 David Pleat's side won 4-2 in what now is the Championship thanks two goals from Paul Telfer and one each from Scott Oakes and Kerry Dixon.

Since being reacquainted with the Hornets following our reascent up the divisions, the Town have lost both meetings at Vicarage Road, going down 1-0 behind-closed-doors in September 2020 before a forgettable 4-0 loss in October 2022.

Both seasons saw the Town record wins at Kenilworth Road, meaning the bragging rights were shared. A James Collins penalty doing the business here in April 2021 before the 2-0 victory in April 2023 with Gabe Osho and Allan Campbell on target.

The Hatters were once again on the winning side this term thanks to a 3-0 win back in October meaning the Town will head south on Sunday aiming to be the first Luton team to complete the league double over the Hornets since the 1987/88 season.

Watford have blown hot and cold this season with inconsistency frustrating Tom Cleverley's side. As we went to print the Hornets lay in 10th place in the Championship having won 1-0 at

Middlesbrough at the weekend.

That victory was just their fourth win in their last 16 in the Championship, a stark contrast to the 11 wins in the first 22 that had seen Cleverley's men among the top six.

Given the nature of the Championship, Saturday's win on Teesside leaves them three points off the play-offs and, having been beaten by the Hatters earlier in the campaign, they are likely to be dangerous opponents.

However, with a soldout away end for Matt Bloomfield's first taste of a Luton-Watford derby, it has all the ingredients of another hugely anticipated trip to Vicarage Road.


