FROM THE TOP



Tonight we face one of our most important matches this season. A win tonight will put us on the national stage and in the third round against one of the big boys. Although we always have to remember that the most important thing this season is what we do in Division Three it is a big night for us. A third round tie at Fulham is something for the players and the fans to look forward to and will also bring in more money which works towards easing our financial situation.

The FA Cup is very different to the league and I thought we did enough at Luton to have won at the first time of asking. Tonight we will be going all out to get through. You, the supporters, have been terrific this season and the backing you give the lads really makes a difference. Keep it up!

Saturday's game against Rochdale was disappointing but in the end I thought a draw was a fair result and looking on the bright side of things it extended our unbeaten run to four matches. We have got to build up unbeaten runs like this if

I thought we created enough chances but Rochdale also had their opportunities to score particularly late in the game so in the end I was satisfied. To have an off day and still get a point was an achievement. The last two occasions when we have performed in a similar way, at Mansfield and Torquay, we have lost heavily.

Unfortunately our injury problems, which are now at epidemic proportions, continued. Paul Miller is the latest victim suffering a calf injury on Saturday which may well keep him out of tonight's game. The treatment room remains the busiest place at the club with nine players now out and several others playing on with injuries. I'm desperate to get bodies back and hope the situation will finally to start to improve over the next few weeks.

RESERVES



After their run of three consecutive victories the Imps reserve team have had a two week break from action in the Pontin's League division one before resuming tomorrow night with a visit to Shrewsbury Town.

The wins over Scunthorpe, Rotherham and Wrexham mean the Imps' second string have now lost just one in their last six matches and they have climbed up into a top three position.

The table is, however, very tight with City having played a game more than most teams and five other clubs immediately behind the Imps all level on 11 points.

Assistant manager Phil Stant, at the age of 37 now a veteran as a player, heads the reserves scoring list with four goals after also topping the scoring chart last season.

City visit Burnley for a League Cup match next week and their next home match in the competition is on Monday 13th December, brought forward from the reserves usual match day of Wednesday, when they face bottom of the table Scarborough with a 2 pm kick off.

That will be the last scheduled reserve fixture of the year with matches due to resume after the Millennium Bank Holiday when Notts County are due to visit Sincil Bank on Wednesday 5 January.







IN OPPOSITION

AT SINCIL BANK TODAY LUTON TOWN

Despite all their off the field problems Luton made an excellent start to the season and at the end of September were in the top three of Division Two. Success defeats at Wigan (0-1) and Oldham (1-2) saw them fall down the table but then came a win at home to Gillingham (3-1), a home draw with Wycombe (1-1) and a win at Oxford (1-0). Since the start of November their only victory to date has been over Burnley (2-1) with league defeats at Millwall, Cambridge United and Bristol Rovers and at home to Preston North End. They currently lie in 10th place with 27 points from their 19 games. In the FA Cup they knocked out Conference club Kingstonian in the first round with a 4-2 victory at Kenilworth Road. Phil Gray, Liam George, Matthew Spring and Matthew Taylor got the goals. The second round clash against the Imps saw Gary Doherty score two second half goals to earn the Hatters tonight's replay after they twice fell behind to City. Liam George is leading scorer with 10 league goals plus one in the FA Cup.

GOALKEEPERS

NATHAN ABBEY - SQUAD NO 1 - Joined the club as a YT player and after progressing through the youth team spent two years as understudy to England Under 21 keeper Kelvin Davis. He left at the end of last season to join a club in Antwerp but the deal went wrong and when Davis was sold by the receivers to Wimbledon Abbey returned to Kenilworth Road as first choice keeper.

SCOTT WARD - SQUAD NO 24 - 18 year old Brent-born keeper who has been on the subs bench this season as second string to Abbey.

DEFENDERS



EMMERSTON BOYCE - SQUAD NO 17 - One of many players to come through the club's schools and youth development programme. Signed as a YT in the summer of 1995 and graduated into the first team squad at the start of the year after making his debut in an Auto Windscreen Shield match. He has started three league matches so far this season.

GARY DOHERTY - SQUAD NO 12 - A big, brave centre half who can also operate up front. He was a member of the Luton youth team which won the South East Counties League championship last season but was used as an emergency striker for the first team scoring for the Hatters in their visit to Sincil Bank 12 months ago. Netted another two against the Imps in the first match at Kenilworth Road. Capped by the Republic of Ireland at youth level and has been on the bench for a senior international.

STUART FRASER - SQUAD NO 13 - A stylish defender who captained the youth team last season and has progressed to winning a regular place in the right back slot this season. Regarded by the Luton coaching staff as an outstanding prospect.

MARVIN JOHNSON - SQUAD NO 6 - A versatile defender who normally plays at centre half but can fill in on the flanks or in midfield. He is the club's longest serving player and now in his 12th season with the Hatters as a first team regular completing over 300 league appearances.

GAVIN MCGOWAN - SQUAD NO 2 - Right back who has not featured in the first team. Signed on a free transfer from Arsenal in June 1998 after two spells on loan at Kenilworth Road and had made 50 first team appearances up to the start of this season.

LUTON TOWN



EFETOBORE SODJE - SQUAD NO 3 - Central defender who was brought up in Nigeria before arriving back in England in 1994 seeking a professional club. He tried his luck at Luton but David Pleat advised him to go to Stevenage Borough and he has not looked back. He helped Stevenage win the Conference title and then moved to Macclesfield for a £30,000 fee. He played a major role for the Silkmen as they won promotion from Division Three at the first attempt but left in the summer after the club was relegated. He joined Luton on a one year contract but missed the start of the season through suspension and has since found it difficult to get into the starting line-up.

JULIAN WATTS - SQUAD NO 40 - Central defender with experience at Rotherham United, Sheffield Wednesday and Leicester City before joining Bristol City but lost his place at Ashton Gate when manager John Ward left the club. He had a spell on loan at Sincil Bank last season deputising for Kevin Austin in a couple of matches but went back to Bristol. Moved to Luton at the start of the season and has since held down a regular place in the heart of the defence.

ALAN WHITE - SQUAD NO 5 - First signed by manager Lennie Lawrence when he was in charge at Middlesbrough but found the competition for places difficult at the Premiership club and rejoined Lawrence at Kenilworth Road in September 1997 for a £40,000 fee.

MIDFIELDERS

MICHAEL McINDOE - SQUAD NO 10 - Joined Luton as a YT player on leaving school and has since progressed through the youth and reserve teams before making his debut last season. He plays in the wide left position but has mainly been restricted to appearances off the subs bench this season.

PAUL McLAREN - SQUAD NO 8 - Played for Luton's youth team as a schoolboy and after joining on YT forms became a full pro while still only 17. Forceful and always ready to back up his attack he has been a regular since making his debut in 1994.

ANDRE SCARLETT - SQUAD NO 21 - Winger who made his league debut as an 18 year old last October but was red-carded within a few minutes of coming off the subs bench. Went on to make eight appearances last season scoring one goal.

MATTHEW SPRING - SQUAD NO 4 - A competitive midfielder who was the driving force behind the Luton team which reached the FA Youth Cup semi finals in 1997. Given his league debut as a 17 year old and has recently attracted attention of scouts from a number of big clubs.



MATTHEW TAYLOR - SQUAD NO 15 - A 17 year old who was promoted straight from the youth team to the first team in pre-season making his league debut in the opening match at Notts County. Has since kept his place in the starting line-up.

LANDRY ZAHANI-ONI - SQUAD NO 16 - An old fashioned left winger. A French national who spent six years with Le Havre before setting out to make it in British football. He had eight months at Stirling Albion before joining Rymans League club Bromley. Luton paid a £25,000 fee for him in January.

Has since been hit by a succession of injuries but has recovered his form well enough to get back into the Northern Ireland international squad.





PETER IN CONVERSATION WITH GAIN

City player Peter Gain has started to establish himself as a regular in the Imps first team squad after arriving from Premiership Tottenham at the end of last year.

Initially the 22 year old came to Sincil Bank under the extended loan scheme with the aim of getting some Football League experience after finding it difficult to ever get on the subs bench at White Hart Lane.

He made his first team debut for City in the Auto Windscreens Shield tie at Hartlepool playing in midfield but more often than not has filled in at left back in his appearances since then.

Saturday's goal against Rochdale was his first in competitive football for City although he did get one of the goals in the pre-season friendly against Leicester City when the Imps went down 9-2.

The youngster said " I joined Tottenham at 16 and worked my way through the youth teams and into the reserves. Last season I managed to get onto the subs bench a couple of times against West Ham and Sheffield Wednesday but it was always going to be difficult to break into the team. There are so many foreign players there that the youngsters coming through the

ranks don't really get given a chance.

"I came to Lincoln to get some experience and to have the chance of playing first team football. It's taken time to get used to it. The football is faster than I was used to in reserve team football and the ball tends to be in the air more than on the ground. I was a bit nervous when I first got into the team but I'm beginning to settle in.

"After I'd been here a few weeks the chairman spoke to me and asked if I was interested in coming here on a permanent basis and I decided to sign after being offered a two year contract.

"Things have been going well playing in the reserves and I've enjoyed my games in the first team. I've played at left back when Stuart Bimson was out but when I was at Tottenham I was on the left side of midfield and that's my best position.

"At the moment I've been in the team in midfield because Lee Philpott has been injured and it'll be difficult for me to keep my place when



he's fit because he's the best player at the club. "I'm still gaining experience. In the first half hour against York I was very nervous but in the second half I was more involved and helped set up two of the goals. I played in the first match at Luton which was a good game and then at Brighton which was just a battle right from the start although we came away with a good result. I'm now looking to build on what I've learned since I came here."

LOOKING BACK AT



ALAN PILGRIM

Alan Pilgrim was a versatile defender who spent six seasons on the Imps books as a part time professional in the 1960s and early 1970s. Alan was educated at Carres Grammar School in Sleaford and on leaving began work as a clerk at the old Kesteven County Council. He played football for Billingborough in the Grantham League Premier Division showing sufficient promise to attract attention from Nottingham Forest and had a brief spell playing for their A team. He then signed amateur forms for the Imps making his club debut in a reserve game at Skegness in the Midland League. Alan had his first experience of league football as an 18 year old when he came on as a substitute at Crewe. He recalls "We were 7-0 down with only about 15 minutes to go and the manager decided to give me a run out." However he had to wait until the following October before he got his first start when he was one of several players drafted into the team for the visit of Exeter City which was Ron Gray's first match as manager of the Imps. Gray restored pride at Sincil Bank after almost a decade of doom and gloom and took the Imps to the fourth round of the League Cup in 1967-68 before going out 3-0 at home to Derby County in a replay.

After that match Gray re-organised the team with Alan becoming a regular at left half over the next few months with Jim Grummett switching to play up front. It was during this period that Alan netted his only goal for City scoring in the home match against tonight's visitors Luton Town in November 1967 when the Hatters won 3-2.

He remembers "I scored quite a lot for the reserves but only that one goal for the first team. I remember the goal well. There was a half clearance out of their defence and I hit it across the keeper. It struck the far post and then the near post and then rolled in." Alan stayed on the Imps books for another three and a half seasons and was a member of the reserve team which won the North Midlands League championship in 1969-70. But after David Herd was appointed manager in March 1971 the part-timers were mostly phased out with Alan, Tom Brooks and Rod Fletcher all moving on leaving just John

Kennedy.

In December 1971 Alan signed for Boston United, then managed by Jim Smith, with one of his first matches being an FA Cup third round tie which saw the Pilgrims go down to a narrow defeat at the hands of Portsmouth in front of 11,000 fans packed into York Street. He enjoyed a successful time in his two seasons at United with the club finishing as runners-up and then champions of the Northern Premier League.

He then had spells with Holbeach United and Skegness Town before moving to work in the West Midlands where he turned out for Worcestershire Premier League team County Sports Association until his playing career finally ended in 1992 at the age of 45. For most of his time at Sincil Bank Alan was employed in the Town Clerk's office at Lincoln City Council. In 1979 he moved to work for Redditch Borough Council where he became Head of Democratic and Legal Services. He has taken early retirement and now carries out election work on a consultancy basis for Wyre Forest Council.

An all-round sportsman he enjoyed golf, squash, table tennis and cricket appearing for the Hartsholme club in Lincoln and the Old Elizabethans in Worcester.

LINCOLN CITY F.C. CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE

The final Sunday of Football League scheduled Centres matches before the mid-winter break saw the young Imps Centre of Excellence teams hoping to repeat their clean sweep of victories earlier in the season when they once again confronted their counterparts from Chesterfield. The day started well with the Under 13s, on the road, winning by 4-1 after dominating their game. Little more information is available from the team management other than the scorers for Lincoln City who were Jack Taylor, Kyle Cassar, Ben Freeman and trialist Scott Waite.

The Under 14s, at Ravendale Drive, were quickly off the mark with a magnificent 20-yard driven goal by midfielder Thomas Wilkinson in the fourth minute. A rampant young Imps completed the first third of the match with a 4-0 scoreline on board. However with Chesterfield showing more initiative in the second period, and with the home team changing down to cruise mode, the scoreline remained static by the end of the middle phase. Lincoln City once again raised their game during the final third adding three more goals for a 7-0 victory. The tally was completed by Johnny Bell (4), Lee Johnson and Lee Frecklington following Tom Wilkinson's early strike.

The Under 15s added to their four wins and five draws in 11 outings when they won their contest at Chesterfield by 1-0. Had it not been for the woodwork that scoreline would have been trebled. In addition the young Imps so dominated that they went very close on a number of other occasions. With Charlie Trout and Scott Stancill prominent in midfield and Gareth Campion making early inroads into the Chesterfield defence, the young Imps were quickly on song. It was Craig Stancill who got the only goal of the game, success coming via a shot across the keeper into the far corner of the net. With Chesterfield's use of the long ball to undermine the visiting defence coming to nought against centre backs Michael Miles and Ben Gavin, Lincoln City continued to dominate matters. On two occasions Adam Kerley struck the woodwork with fierce headers only to see them rebound to safety. Outstanding in a fine team performance were


Michael Miles, Donovan Lawrence, Charlie Trout and Adam Kerley.

The Under 16s made it a clean sweep on the day when they defeated their visitors from Chesterfield by 4-3, after leading 4-0 at the end of the second period. Although the young Imps opened tentatively they soon settled into their passing game. The opening goal came when a well-directed David Rew corner kick flew into the Chesterfield net. The second period saw the young Imps well on top. Robert Cook's skills and persistence on the right raised the scoreline to 2-0. Branston-based trialist, Giovanni Carchedi, recently released after a long spell at Nottingham Forest, scored twice on his debut to make it 4-0. The third and final period again saw the Under 16s becoming tentative and nervy as they let their lead slip back to 4-3. However, they were able to hang on for a victory well-deserved on their showing in the first two periods.


